

THE PREVIEW

Magic Round is back and it starts off with two sides coming off narrow victories as the Canberra Raiders take on the Canterbury Bulldogs to kick off the double header on Friday night at Suncorp Stadium.

High expectations lead Bulldogs fans to a promising 2023 but the football gods haven't been kind to the Belmore Boys with an injury crisis and some poor performances hampering their efforts across the opening nine rounds seeing them sit in 13th spot with four wins and five losses so far and yet to have the bye.

Last weekend though, the Canterbury Bulldogs showed that they aren't a side that gives up easily as they were able to hold-off a charging St George Illawarra Dragons side in Wollongong last week with an 18-16 victory. The resilience of the Blue and White was on show when they came under considerable pressure in the second half especially when trailing by just two points, they had to play with just 12 men for a period. The Bulldogs held on for the victory last Sunday 18-16 despite the immense pressure they came under.

The Bulldogs have had a mixed week team wise with some injury forced changes but some positive news to go with these forced changes. Canterbury have lost winger Braidon Burns through a knee injury after a brave performance last week against the Dragons. The positive though is that Jacob Kiraz returns from his knee injury suffered a few weeks back against Parramatta. The Bulldogs also welcome back Max King from a rib injury back into the front row.

Controversy follows the Canberra Raiders wherever they go and it's been the case in their up and down season so far in 2023 as they head into Magic Round sitting in 11th spot with four wins and four losses including a massive upset over the Broncos and a huge loss to the Penrith Panthers.

A week of headlines plagued the Raiders and they followed their 31-30 Golden Point victory over the Dolphins in Wagga Wagga. The Canberrans started the game strongly but were almost run down by the Redcliffe based side. The win for the Raiders came off a controversial set restart call that put Canberra deep into attack despite a knock-on being missed from Hudson Young in the lead up.

Raiders coach Ricky Stuart has only made the one change to his starting side with Xavier Savage returning to the NRL side after biding his time in recent weeks in the NSW Cup. His return back to the Raiders NRL side comes in the place of Albert Hopoate who is out of the squad completely. One other change for the Raiders sees Ata Mariota return to the bench after injury with Corey Harawira-Naera dropping to the reserves.

WHO TO WATCH: Returning to the starting side, Josh Reynolds is a fan favourite but has found himself under pressure with his short fuse attracting attention of even the CEO of the NRL Andrew Abdo after last weekend. Reynolds has to play a big part especially with his experience and in the key position of five-eighth he has to take a leadership role in controlling the play.

It's probably like a broken record, but Jack Wighton is the player to watch and not necessarily because of the contract dramas of the past few weeks, but the leadership that he needs to show to get the Raiders a fourth straight win. Now without the pressure of representative selection, Wighton can lead the charge up the ladder for the Raiders.

FAVOURITE. The Raiders are strong favourites with three straight victories including a win over league leaders the Brisbane Broncos.

MY TIP: On paper the Raiders should be winning this game based on recent form. However, there is just something about the Bulldogs that makes me want to tip them this week. The Bulldogs can pull something out of the bag and with the return of Jacob Kiraz and Max King, the spark can come back to the Doggies. Bulldogs by 8

THE PREVIEW

We are officially a third of the way through the home-and-away season, and it's now time for the annual Manly Sea Eagles clash with the Brisbane Broncos for a home game at Suncorp Stadium. A match that began as a double-header but is now a round of 'magic' at Brisbane.

Manly suffered a 26-10 loss at home at the hand of the Titans last week, where they only scored one try compared to Gold Coast with five. Having only lost two other games this season the Sea Eagles have had quite a start to the season and will be looking to claim another win this Friday.

Brisbane had quite an impressive start to the season, boasting five wins in a row. However, they have lost two games, most recently where they beaten by the Rabbitohs in a 32-6 game, exposing some weak spots in the side. Much like Manly they will be looking to rebound after the loss and keep the top of the ladder to themselves.

The Sea Eagles have a drastically changed side from the team who took a loss last week. Tom Trbojevic returns to the side after suffering a minor adductor injury, although his brother Jake Trbojevic will be missing out on the clash due to a calf injury with Sean Keppie replacing him. Reuben Garrick returns to his place on

the wing as both Manly centres return after both suffering knee injuries. Ben Trbojevic and Toafofoa Sipley join Aaron Woods on the bench after facing injury and suspension respectively.

Brisbane have minimal changes to their side besides the return of Ezra Mam to five-eighth and Payne Haas to their forward pack, after they both missed the loss against South Sydney due to suspension. Due their respective returns it means that Jock Madden is dropped, and Keenan Palasia starts on the bench.

WHO TO WATCH: Reuben Garrick has scored three tries so far in the 2023 season and has a good try scoring record at Suncorp, where he has scored five tries in his last five games at the ground. I would love to see him score a try on Friday and add to his 2023 total points count with both conversions and four-pointers.

Payne Haas has been lurking around the top of the Dally M leaderboard over the course of the season, and it was proven in the Broncos' loss to the Rabbitohs that Haas is such an asset to their side. I'm looking forward to his return to the team after his one-week suspension and seeing his injection into the game again, where he is leading in the NRL in post-contact metres with a total of 593.

FAVOURITE: Broncos are significantly favoured to add another win to their 2023 count.

MV TIP: Although boasting several wins, I believe Manly won't have the strength in both attack and defence to win, and with the Broncos coming off an embarrassing loss they will be looking for victory again. Broncos by 16.

Magic Round on Saturday kicks off with this very intriguing and vitally important top 8 clash between the defending Premiers Penrith and the hugely improved Warriors. On paper it doesn't appear to be that close of a contest given the Panthers are comfortably the best defensive team in the competition while the Warriors are ranked a solid 7th. Interestingly though, the Warriors attack is ranked 12th and the Panthers is ranked

The Warriors come into this game with their red hot form of the opening 5 rounds significantly cooled. After wins over the Knights, Cowboys, Bulldogs and Sharks and a solitary loss by 8 points to the Roosters, the Warriors were riding high in third place on the ladder. But then a 10 point loss to the Knights, an 8 point win over the underperforming Cowboys and back-to-back losses against the Storm and the Roosters has seen them slide down to 8th on the ladder.

The Warriors have a very high completion rate, equal best with the Cowboys at 81%. They are also very strong at breaking tackles and breaking through the line, but these great areas are seemingly nullified due to their inability, on unwillingness to offload the ball. The Warriors have very little second phase play in their game compared to the rest of the competition and is an area that they need to be at their best if they are to capitalise on the limited opportunities that the Panthers defence will provide.

The Panthers started the season steadily, with a 6 point victory over Souths between a pair of 1 point losses to the Broncos and Eels. They then looked like the kicked into gear as they delivered a thumping 53-12 win

over Canberra and a 44-12 win over Manly in successive weeks, before struggling against the lowly Knights, winning by 1 point. They had a 2 point loss to the very strong Souths side before last weekends shock 12-8 loss to the last placed and winless Wests Tigers.

Last weeks loss highlighted a few issues for the Panthers - a lack of intelligence in their kicking game, an over-reliance on Nathan Cleary at halfback, the lack of creativity out of dummy half and a hint of panic in attack. Statistically they are very similar to the Warriors, playing low risk football for the most part but it's not providing consistency in results. Despite all that, they are still the best defensive team in the comp and still in the top 8.

WHO TO WATCH: Tohu Harris is always a key player for opposition sides to target. His combination of ball running, line engagement, ability to draw in the second defender while running on the edge of the ruck and his very strong defence, means he is always a vital link between the Warriors attack in the ability being able to link and create space with their outside backs. He returns to the side this weekend after missing last weekend.

Jarome Luai had a very quiet game last weekend and was barely used in attack, especially his kicking game and ball running game. Don't be surprised if the ball finds its way into his hands more often at the end of the set this weekend than it did in the Panthers loss to the Tigers last weekend. And that will be a good thing as it will mean the Panthers attack will be less one dimensional which will help to make Nathan Cleary more effective in attack.

FAVOURITE: Despite their shaky form and shock loss last weekend, Penrith will still be the favourites to win this game.

MY TIP: Penrith to get the win here by 12 points

Suncorp prepares for underwater encounter

The Cronulla Sharks will be looking to continue their winning ways on Saturday evening when they host the Dolphins during the league's annual Magic Round.

Riding a wave of momentum with three consecutive wins to sit in second position on the ladder, the Cronulla Sharks could finish the round in first position for only the second time since winning their maiden premiership with victory.

Recording their biggest win under coach Craig Fitzgibbon with a 44-6 demolition of North Queensland last Thursday, veteran forward Dale Finucane will return from suspension in place of Braden Hamlin-Uele as part of a reshuffle that sees Royce Hunt start and Cameron McInnes revert to the bench.

Claiming victory over the Titans in the very first match held at Magic Round four years ago, the Sharks have lost their past two appearances during the annual pilgrimage to Brisbane against the Rabbitohs (2021) and Raiders (2022).

Producing an ultimately futile comeback in Wagga Wagga last weekend, the Dolphins will be eager to arrest a worrying trend of conceding big leads early in matches.

Managing to claw back an 18-point deficit before going down to the Raiders 31-30 in golden point last Saturday, coach Wayne Bennett has responded by promoting Tesi Niu, Anthony Milford and Mason Teague into the side in place of Robert Jennings, Kurt Donoghoe and Ray Stone.

Aiming to become only the second Queensland club to claim victory in their Magic Round debut, the ninthplaced Dolphins could finish the weekend inside the top four if results prove favourable.

WHO TO WATCH: Enjoying a blockbusting start to the season with the most try-assists of any non-spine player, Cronulla centre Siosifa Talakai will be aiming to remind selectors of his impact ahead of the representative season. Producing nine try assists and 26 tackle breaks to go with 169 running metres on average, the 26-year-old crossed for his first try of the season in last week's big win over North Queensland. Forming a potent combination on the left edge after resurrecting his career with Cronulla as a middle forward, Talakai can expect to see plenty of ball on Saturday evening.

Playing beyond his years as the Dolphins primary playmaker at just 18 years of age, Isaiya Katoa will face one of his toughest challenges to date during Magic Round. Earning a surprise call up in the opening round as a five-eighth before taking on the responsibility of wearing the number seven jersey due to injuries, the former Penrith junior has produced five forced drop outs and five try assists while missing just one game to date. Set to oppose the reigning Dally M winner in a key personal duel, Katoa will be out to test himself and lift the Dolphins back into the top eight.

FAVOURITE. Despite winning just one of their past six visits to Suncorp Stadium, the Sharks are expected to make it four in a row on Saturday evening.

MYTIP. Enjoying a strong return to form after collapsing at home a month ago, the Sharks should have too much class for the Dolphins to contend with. Sharks by 14.

Storm looking to bring the Magic against a resurgent Souths

Melbourne were fresh off their first bye of the season last weekend and an alarming stat has emerged following a bye week in 2023, with only two sides failing to win coming off the bye this season. However, the Storm had to do it the hard way against the Warriors in their previous encounter.

Their forwards were outplayed the second Nelson Asofa-Solomona left the match and quite frankly, their bench forwards left a lot to be desired. However, Nick Meaney is proving to be a more then capable number 1 and with Ryan Papenhuyzen admitting he's a long way off from returning to play. Meaney could find himself with the number 1 jumper for the season.

Going against Souths, their pack will have to go up against a Souths pack which is getting better with every passing game. With the aforementioned bench problems the Storm have had, it's an issue they have to address quick smart. Their backs probably have a slight points victory over their opposition, but will need Cameron Munster and Jahrome Hughes to carry the attacking weight.

Craig Bellamy as opted for just one change. Eli Katoa has been named after suffering a head knock on Anzac Day but will need to pass protocols. Tom Eisenhuth (hip) listed on the interchange to make a return replacing Tyran Wishart.

For South Sydney, they are coming into this match in red hot form. Winning their last four matches on the trot after their loss to Melbourne in Round 5. Last start, they were ruthless against the top of the ladder Broncos. After enduring an early sin-bin, they were able to rally and grind out a well earnt victory. Campbell Graham

is inching closer to an Origin birth with every passing game but also their forward pack has been immense.

Tevita Tatola and Tom Burgess have been powerful in a unique punch off the bench which rattled a Brisbane side that was facing a lot of defence over a sustained period of the match.

Coming against the Storm. They need to write the wrongs of their last clash and it was simple. Execution left a lot to be desired for the cardinal and myrtle. The Rabbitohs completed at 77% and left two late scoring opportunities off the board with some miraculous cover defence denying the Bunnies. If execution is improved then the upset is on in Brisbane where Souths have had a good record in recent history.

For Souths. Davvy Moale's time in the side has come to an abrupt end. Liam Knight returns after making his comeback from a horror knee injury in NSW Cup. Tevita Tatola and Hame Sele go back to their original roles after swapping places last week before kick-off with a possible repeat from Jason Demetriou on the cards again in Magic Round.

WHO TO WATCH: For the Storm. My focus is on QLD's number 9 Harry Grant. Grant has had a "quiet" start to the season by his standards, with just the two tries. However, he's had to take on a second play maker role with Hughes and Munster missing time during the year. Grant has forced 5 dropouts, 5 try assists and 5 linebreak assists. In their last meeting, Grant exposed a tiring Souths side and was huge defensively. Look for that continue in this one.

With a NSW jersey getting closer to his name, Campbell Graham will be looking for consistency if he's going to be Brad Fittler's answer at centre. There's no denying that Graham has had a great 2023, scoring a season high of 11 tries, breaking 28 tackles. Defensively has been his "strongest asset" according to NSW fans, and with a tackling efficiency of 86% your probably right. But I've seen some defensive miscues in recent weeks (11 misses in 3 weeks) that might be enough to give QLD fans some hope. Look for Graham to tighten up his defence in a dominant display.

FAVOURITE: Souths are favourites as they look to continue their unbeaten run in Magic Round.

MY TIP: It's a real toss of the coin game and it really depends on which Souths side rocks up to Suncorp on Saturday night. If we get the lethal one, it's going to be a long night. If we don't, then Melbourne will get under Cody Walker's skin just enough. I think it will be the best game of the weekend and to go down to the wire. Souths by 1.

THE PREVIEW

What a difference one win can make.

Previously the most under-pressure team in the league, the Wests Tigers are now free of that unwanted tag after pulling off a stunning 12-8 upset win over the Panthers. Luke Brooks enjoyed his best outing in recent memory, cleverly directing the Tigers around the park with a pinpoint and simplified kicking game for the wet conditions. Rookie fullback Jahream Bula also starred in the win with a try assist to put winger David Nofoaluma over in the corner while later pulling off a try-saving tackle to force an error from Panthers halfback Nathan Cleary. The win snapped a 12-game losing streak for the Tigers, although their attack still remains a concern, with Tim Sheens' side still averaging the most tackles (36) inside the opposition 20 while taking the most plays to score.

Nonetheless, the Tigers will take any win at this rate and did not make any unforced changes this week, with suspension and injury otherwise forcing a slight reshuffle. A three-match ban for Brent Naden sees Tommy Talau return in the centres while Asu Kepaoa is back from an illness and has been named on the interchange.

Funnily enough it is their opposition this week who enter Magic Round as the new team under the pump with Dragons coach Anthony Griffin's immediate future at the club in doubt. The Dragons fell just short against an injury-ravaged Bulldogs side 18-16 last week, adding to an unfortunate trend which has seen the Red V drop four-straight games by six points or less. Griffin's side have been thereabouts in all four games. In fact, they have scored the same or even more tries than their opponents in each of the matches too. Goal-kicking has proven a constant issue and perhaps a change there could help the Dragons snag an extra win or two, with centre Zac Lomax dropped and Max Feagai shifting from the wing to replace him.

With Lomax out, the Dragons are on the lookout for a new goal-kicker, with Moses Mbye, Ben Hunt and Jack Bird all options who have previous NRL goal-kicking experience under their belt. All three have a career goal-kicking rate of under 70 per cent though, as does Jayden Sullivan who has kicked 10 of 15 goals this season in NSW Cup. Sullivan has been named on the bench in a shake-up for the Dragons which sees Mbye start at hooker in place of the axed Jacob Liddle.

However, the Illawarra Mercury reported on Wednesday that Hunt in fact could line up at hooker after exclusively training at the position, with Sullivan to join the starting side at halfback. That would see the Dragons get a look at their potential future halves pairing of Sullivan and Talatau Amone, with suggestions Hunt could move on if Griffin is sacked as coach.

Focussing on this week's game though, other team changes see Jaydn Su'A return from a shoulder injury in the second row with Billy Burns also recalled on the edge. That sees Jack Bird move to lock while Jack de Belin starts in the front row.

The Dragons will be hoping to put aside worrying recent form north of the border, having won just one game from their past 15 games in Queensland. The Tigers have also struggled though, with the one victory from their past eight matches in the northern state.

WHO TO WATCH: How good was it to see Luke Brooks smiling last week. It has been a rough stretch for the Tigers halfback but he was a clear standout in Saturday's impressive win over Penrith. The unfortunate reality for Brooks though is that he has shown these flashes throughout his career and struggled to back it up with any real consistency. Having aimed up against the defending premiers, the challenge for Brooks – and the Tigers as a whole – will be to maintain the same intensity against the lowly Dragons. The Tigers simplified their game plan in rainy conditions last week, kicking to corners early and prioritising ball control. The forecast for Brisbane this weekend is all sunshine so it will be interesting to see if Brooks and the Tigers shift from that approach or continue to try punch through the middle.

While it is looking increasingly likely that Griffin will be moved on, the current Dragons coach will get a look at what the Dragons' potential long-term spine this weekend. It will be particularly intriguing to see how Ben Hunt fares at hooker, having impressed in the position at Origin. Hunt is set to run out for his 299th NRL game this weekend and should he make the positional switch it will be the first time he has played dummy-half at club level in three years. The 33-year-old's strong running game and instinctive passing should make it not too much of an adjustment while Hunt's high work rate also means the extra tackling won't be an issue either.

FAVOURITE: The Dragons are favourites but there is not much in it.

MYTIP: St George Illawarra has been close for a number of weeks now but you get the sense this could be the loss that really tips things over the edge when it comes to Griffin's future. A bad loss here and the Dragons may have no choice but to head in a new direction immediately. Off the back of last week's win, look for a confident Tigers team to score back-to-back victories for the first time since April 2022. Tigers by 10.

Two sides struggling to live up to expectations meet at Magic Round

The Sydney Roosters will 'host' the North Queensland Cowboys at Brisbane's Suncorp Stadiumin the middle game of Magic Round's final day. Despite 11 spots differentiating the two teams onthe ladder, only two wins split the sides, so expect a closer tussle than you might initially think.

The Roosters have been suffering from an underwhelming opening period to their 2023 season, but the past two weeks have shown that they might be on the brink of finding their form. A toughone point win on ANZAC Day against a determined Dragons team, followed by last weekend's 14 point victory over the over-performing Warriors, have put them in a good position to make itthree on the trot this weekend.

A big negative out of the Warriors victory for the Roosters though was a neck injury to their Kiwiinternational hooker Brandon Smith. Smith was hospitalised with a neck injury, however he hasbeen named at hooker yet again for Easts as he looks to continue his perfect streak of startingat number nine for all Roosters games in 2023 so far.

Drew Hutchinson is back in the centres due to a shoulder injury sustained by Paul Momirovski, Jared Warea-Hargraeves returns to the 17, with Matt Lodge shifting to the bench and FletcherBaker to 18th man as a result. Jake Turpin is the final face making up the bench. The Cowboys are in a horrible position early in 2023. After last season saw the club pullthemselves out of the competition's bottom-half and into premiership contention, hopes werehigh that coach Todd Payten could lift the North Queensland side into the top four once again. But things have very much not gone to plan, with the Cowboys languishing down in 16th spotafter nine rounds, and they enter this game off the back of a humiliating effort against Cronullalast round.

The club's large casualty ward is also almost certainly a factor in the Cowboys' early seasonstruggles. Tom

Chester looks to be the new face facing an extended sideline stint after possiblydoing an ACL against the Sharks. Griffin Neama and Jason Taumalolo are still a while awayfrom returning, and a suspension to Jeremiah Nanai sees him ruled out for the coming month.

Despite being under an injury cloud, halfback Chad Townsend has been named to face theRoosters on Sunday. Helium Luki slots back into the side following a hamstring injury, andKulikefu Finefeuiaki looks set to make his NRL debut off the bench for North Queensland.

The Sydney Roosters have won their past five games against the Cowboys, including their onlyprevious clash at Brisbane's Suncorp Stadium in 2021. Easts' engine room will be confident ofbeing able to run straight over the Cowboys' depleted forward pack, and lay a good platform fortheir halves pairing to put a large score on the Cowboys at Magic Round.

WHO TO WATCH: Joseph Manu has had a successful past two rounds after being thrown into the halves. Roosters coach Trent Robinson made the decision to drop Sam Walker in favour of Manumoving to five-eighth from centre to partner Luke Keary. Manu has definitely shown Robinsonwhy that was the correct decision, but Walker will definitely be keeping Manu on his toes intraining. Another win to extend his halves winning streak in 2023 to 3 would be massive for Manu and for his club.

Experienced North Queensland winger Kyle Feldt has experienced the highs and lows of life asa Cowboy. After winning both his clubs' and his own first premiership in 2015 - something thatwould not have happened if not for his last second try to level the game - he has stuck with the Cowboys for his decade-long career so far. Some troubled seasons following their 2017 grandfinal appearance were endured, before he bounced back with the club to finish 3rd in 2022. Thisseason has been tough for North Queensland, but Feldt has the experience to help his team getthrough it.

FAVOURITE: The Sydney Roosters are the strong favourites to trump the struggling Cowboys, and to do so fairly comfortably.

MYTIP: The Cowboys have looked nothing like their 2022 selves, but the Roosters have plentyof struggles of their own. That being said, I don't think the Cowboys will be up for this one. Roosters by 10.

Titans, Eels Look to Build on Dominant Displays in Magic Round

Both the Titans and the Eels went into last week with serious question marks over them. The Eels had just been given a reality check by a superior Broncos side, while the Titans equalled the record for largest blown lead in the NRL era, somehow choking what was at one point a 26-0 advantage.

Going into this week, both sides will be feeling much more satisfied with their recent accounts of themselves, the Eels dominating from start to finish against a poor Knights side, while the Titans built on their strong record in Brookvale to score a convincing upset win over Manly.

The main positive to be taken out of the Titans' performance last week is that they were able to go on with the job after a strong first half. The Gold Coast are currently sitting at 4 wins and 4 losses on the season, a record which has them in 10th place, but their ceiling is much higher than that.

In their four defeats, the Titans have led at half time in 3 of them and conceded two tries in the final four minutes of the first half in the remaining one. Of the 199 points they've conceded this season, a whopping 125 of them have come in the second halves of matches. These stats point to a team that has talent and potential, but lacks a backbone and resilience when things start going against them.

Against Manly, the Titans took a big lead into the break once again, but conceded a try within the first 10 minutes of the second half. Instead of folding like they usually do, the Titans dug in, turned momentum back in their favour, and scored two late tries of their own to win convincingly. Whether this is an anomaly or the new norm for the Gold Coast remains to be seen.

After nine rounds, the Eels sit in twelfth place with a lacklustre 4-5 record. Fans will be quick to point to the rough draw they've had, which granted has made things difficult for the 2022 grand finalists, but eventually

they simply have to start winning games. Last week against the Knights, their blistering was once again on full display, scoring 30 first half points to effectively end the game before the break.

Parramatta's issue this season has never been their attack though. They've scored the third most points of anyone in the competition, yet their defence, particularly in the outside backs, has been nothing short of pitiful and is a large reason they are where they are on the table. Despite the big win last week, Brad Arthur has dropped centre Sean Russell to be replaced by Bailey Simonsson. The Titans edge attack is among the most lethal in the competition, so the Eels outside men will need to be up for the task if they are to prevent a

WHO TO WATCH: Despite what you may hear in the media, David Fifita is consistently one of the Titans top performers and has been for some time. Last week he produced another vintage performance and was the best on ground in his sides big win, finishing with numbers of 19 runs for 185 metres (62 post contact), a line break, line break assist and try assist, 5 tackle breaks, 29 tackles for only 1 miss as well as a try of his own early when the game was still in the balance. What stands out in those stats in particular is the try assist; Fifita is known for his ability to break tackles and score tries from anywhere, but this season he's developed a neat passing game close to the line, which has allowed him to take advantage of the extra defensive attention he receives in those goal line situations. Against an Eels side which has struggled against players a few tiers below Fifita, expect another top-class performance from the big fella.

For the Eels, halfback Mitchell Moses enjoyed one of his best performances of the season against the Knights, making 3 line breaks, assisting a line break and a try, making 10 tackle breaks while also scoring a try of his own and nailing 7 conversions from 7 attempts. Moses has one of the best long kicking games in the competition, often providing the Eels with good defensive field position and setting the record for most ever kick metres in a match earlier in the year, but when the Eels are on the front foot, his running game can be deadly. Against Newcastle, he made 12 runs for 170 metres and looked a threat every time he took the line on. Considering neither of these two teams are renowned for their defence, it won't be surprising if a high scoring affair ensues, and those are the kind of games where Moses shines.

FAVOURITE: The Eels are 7.5 point favourites at the time of writing.

MY TIP: I think this will probably be the most entertaining game of the week. Lock it in for a high scoring affair and an upset to conclude a weekend of magic. Titans by 4.

The Newcastle Knights started the match in disastrous fashion. A poor Kurt Mann pass was put down by Mat Croker which gave the Parramatta side an early chance to strike. On their first chance in the red zone. The Eels were electric and struck with force. Dylan Brown showed and goes past three defenders to cross for the first try of the evening. Mitch Moses converted to give Parramatta an early 6-0 lead. Five minutes later, Newcastle hit back almost immediately after earning two set restarts and placing pressure on the Eels line. The Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs have embraced an attacking style of football to see themselves score an upset win over the St George Illawarra Dragons, beating the joint venture by a score of 18 points to 16 on Sunday Afternoon.

The Bulldogs did well to hold out an early attacking raid as the Dragons were gifted good field position from a penalty. As soon as they got the ball for the first time in the 4th minute, they made their intentions clear. By throwing the ball around from sideline to sideline, the Bulldogs got themselves on the front foot, and took full advantage when Josh Reynolds sprinted down a short-side before putting Corey Waddell into space. The big back-rower reached deep into his bag of tricks when he saw the green grass ahead of him, putting the ball onto the toe for a grubber, which he re-gathered over the line to open the scoring. The Bulldogs would be the dominant side for the next 15 minutes or so and looked poised to cash in when an early kick from Josh Reynolds forced a dropout. An errant Tevita Pangai offload was picked off by Lomax, who ran for 50 odd metres before throwing a perfect right-to-left cutout pass on the run to Mat Feagai, who won the race to the try-line, making the score 6-4 in favour of the visitors. While the scoreboard may have told a story of a closely fought encounter, the play on the field was anything but, the Bulldogs butchering multiple try scoring opportunities. On one occasion, Burton went straight through the line before linking up with Mahoney on the inside. He then threw a ball back inside to Burton who was in the clear, but he dropped the ball cold. On another, Burton, Mahoney and Reynolds combined for a slick outside inside play, only for the ball to be put down by the latter. After looking likely on so many attacking sets, it was a yardage carry that would ignite for the Dogs to score their second. The ball was thrown wide to find Jake Averillo inside his own 20 metre zone when the centre turned on the jets to get around the Dragons frontline defenders and then, impressively, burn Dragons fullback Tyrell Sloan on his way to the line. That's where the scoring would end in the first half, the Bulldogs enjoying a six-point cushion ahead of the second 40.

Canterbury appeared to pick up right where they left off, rolling down the field with ease early in the second half which allowed Burton plenty of time to put up a signature bomb. The Dragons wanted nothing to do with it, which ended up working in their favour as Braidon Burns' second kick sailed dead to give the Dragons 7 tackles. It proved a fatal error from Burns, with Ben Hunt staying upright long enough to get an offload away to Toby Couchman at the other end, the young forward going over for his first career try to even things up again. Couchman went from hero to zero shortly after though, penalised for a high shot on Preston which allowed the Bulldogs to take the lead right back through a penalty goal. Five minutes later, the Dogs would streak even further ahead, with Jake Averillo receiving the ball in his own half and again making something out of nothing, speeding his way past Feagai and again burning Sloan to touch down for his second impressive try. The score was 18-10 to Canterbury and the Dragons were out on their feet, but they received a second wind when Corey Waddell was sent to the sin bin for a professional foul in the 59th minute. They were quick to take advantage, spreading the ball right to Max Feagai, who joined his brother on the score sheet after going over in the corner. Lomas's conversion was good, narrowing the gap to two points with 62 minutes to go.
