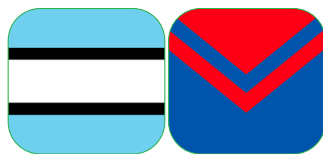

THE PREVIEW

When the Broncos upset the Panthers back in round one, it was viewed through the lens of being somewhat of an early wake-up call for the defending premiers.

In reality, considering Brisbane's form since that point, it ended up saying a whole lot more about just how good the Broncos would be this season than speaking to any potential demise at Penrith.

Although heading into Thursday night's clash between two early competition frontrunners, the absence of Adam Reynolds means we may not get a true indication for how these two sides stack up against each other.

Reynolds suffered a head knock in last week's loss to Melbourne and has subsequently been ruled out this week, with former Tigers halfback Tyson Gamble to take his spot in the starting side.

It is a setback for the Broncos, who have heavily relied on Reynolds for his long-range kicking game and experience in general.

Although Brisbane can take plenty of confidence from its performance without Reynolds against the Storm, putting in a resilient defensive effort to only go down 24-16 in the end.

Now the Broncos return home with an opportunity to make their biggest statement yet but it won't come easy against a Panthers side that put in their most complete performance of the year last week.

Coming off an unconvincing victory against the Warriors the round prior, Penrith returned to its destructive best in a 48-4 routing of the Roosters at BlueBet Stadium.

The maligned Jarome Luai was particularly impressive, recording three try assists and three linebreak assists

to go with a try as he answered his critics in emphatic style.

Of course, the challenge now for Luai – and the Panthers as a whole – will be to back it up on Thursday night.

Penrith has made a habit of losing close games this season, falling to Brisbane and Parramatta by one point while going down to South Sydney and the Tigers by two and four points respectively.

Unless the Broncos are uncharacteristically off their game on Thursday, the Panthers will be in for another tightly-contested game.

Penrith is unchanged for its trip to Suncorp Stadium, with former Bronco Zac Hosking good to go after passing a head injury assessment despite not returning to the field last week against the Roosters.

WHO TO WATCH: Losing Reynolds is obviously a blow for Brisbane but it means it will only be more important that the Broncos find ways to dominate field position without his kicking game. Tacklebusting runs from barnstorming front rower Payne Haas will be one way to do just that. Haas is averaging the most run metres (171), runs of eight-plus metres (13) and tackle busts (four) of any forward in the competition. The Broncos would be well-served running Haas at Panthers hooker Mitch Kenny, who has to get through plenty of work and could tire quickly, forcing Ivan Cleary to bring on Soni Luke earlier than anticipated.

As for Penrith, look for ex-Brisbane second rower Zac Hosking to show his former side what they are missing out on. Hosking has made an immediate impact for Penrith as an absolute workhorse in defence, averaging 35 tackles (second-most in the NRL among second rowers) and a tackle efficiency of 94 per cent which, again, ranks him second-best at his position in the league. In attack though Hosking has really helped the Panthers fill the hole left behind by Vilijame Kikau, running incisive lines. It may have been Scott Sorensen stealing the show last week but look for the 26-year-old Hosking to get over the line at least once on Thursday.

FAVOURITE: Reynolds' absence tips this one in favour of Penrith.

MY TIP: The Broncos will definitely keep this one close for the first 60 minutes or so but look for the class of Nathan Cleary to prove the difference in the end. Panthers by 14.

Dragons looking for a post Hook click against the Chooks

Less than 48 hours after the dismissal of Anthony Griffin. The St George Illawarra Dragons will look to put that behind them when they take on the Sydney Roosters at Kogarah's Jubilee Oval on the land of the Bidjigal people.

For the Dragons, it's been an eventful week with the ousting of coach Anthony Griffin after 2 and a bit years of agonising football. However, it's time put Hook behind us and focus on the present. St George this year with the exception of three matches (where they've lost 13+), have been in every match including 5 losses by under 6 points or less. This shows that the Dragons can be one competitive football side, however execution has left a lot to be desired.

Against the Roosters, the opposition's noticeable struggle in the effort department could be the signal to get the victory to turn their 2023 season around. Ben Hunt will give 100% no matter what and with the support of Jack De Belin searching for an unlikely Origin recall. St George Illawarra could strike with the new coach hype and surprise the Roosters. Elsewhere, interim coach Ryan Carr will need to find a way to inject Jayden Sullivan into the contest, his impact has been noticeable in recent weeks in the energiser bunny role.

For the Dragons. Zac Lomax replaces Max Feagai. Jacob Liddle starts at hooker and Toby Couchman earns a recall to the bench. Jayden Sullivan goes back to the bench and Moses Mbye drops out of the side all together.

For the Roosters. Where do we begin to analyse the poor football we've seen in the last fortnight. Losing their last two games by a combined score of 68-10 has left a lot of fans (including yours truly) and "experts" searching for answers. It's clear after watching the Roosters that there is a clear lack of effort and ability to get up for their opposition. When Billy Smith is coming back from injury and showing the way forward with the calibre of opposition around him, that's alarm bells that things aren't working out.

Against the Dragons. Their spine will again be different. Drew Hutchison will provide support to Luke Keary

who has had to carry the bulk of kicking since Sam Walker's demotion to NSW Cup. Also, the effort and attitude will have to life significantly. The Dragons will be up for it after a week in the doldrums, which makes this game the mother of all trap games for the red, white, and blue. The experienced forwards will have to lift in order to get victory and be supported by a combined effort through the backs coming out of yardage. If there's the same lack of effort, the Dragons are in this contest.

Onto the team-list. Joey Manu is out with an ankle ligament injury. Drew Hutchison will start at 5/8. Elsewhere, Jared Waerea-Hargraves has been named despite suffering a pectoral strain in the 48-4 massacre. Egan Butcher returns from concussion protocols in the run on side pushing Angus Crichton to the bench and Fletcher Baker to the reserves. Sitili Tupouniua is back in the starting back-row swapping with Nat Butcher.

WHO TO WATCH It was mentioned earlier that Jayden Sullivan would have to be more involved in the Dragons attack if on-field results were to desperately improve. Sullivan has been the shining light of what has been one bleak tunnel in the 2023 season. After starting the year in the halves, he was demoted in favour of Talatau Amone. Sullivan's strong performances in reserve grade meant he had to be picked and has looked damaging in his last two matches, although he was unlucky to be sin-binned against the Cowboys. Look for Sullivan to again be the difference.

If there is one player that has been polarising to Roosters fans that has escaped the media rath. It is Victor Radley. While he might be a victim of his own reputation as the game's hit-man. Radley's 2023 season has been quite disappointing by comparison. His season has so far consisted of a try, line break, 2 line break assists, 3 sin bins and only one game running over 100m. THE PREVIEW with Lachy MacCORQUODALE

The South Sydney Rabbitohs are on top of the competition ladder for the first time in 2023 after a 20-0 victory over the Wests Tigers whilst the Brisbane Broncos slipped up against the Melbourne Storm last Thursday.

This leads to the Rabbitohs Indigenous Round clash with the Parramatta Eels on Friday night at Allianz Stadium in Sydney, the home of the Gadigal and Bidjigal peoples.

The Rabbitohs continue to push their premiership credentials becoming the first team to win six games in a row in 2023. The streak includes impressive victories over the Broncos, Penrith Panthers and the Melbourne Storm, all who are considered amongst the better teams in the competition.

Their attack has been excellent in 2023, especially during the winning streak, scoring 20 or more points in each of the six games but it's been their defence that has been most impressive. During the streak the Rabbitohs have kept every team to under 20 points, and for the entire season, just once has a team scored 20 points against the bunnies. Souths' defence ranks second in the competition behind Penrith, and their attack ranks fourth behind the Broncos, Eels and Sharks.

The form of players such as Campbell Graham and Latrell Mitchell have been pivotal to the Rabbitohs success so far, with both players expected to be called up to the New South Wales squad, it's important that they cash in on their form and extend their streak to seven wins on Friday night before those players alongside others depart for representative duties. They face a Parramatta side that has been inconsistent at best this season, possessing a defence that has been leaky. Souths' attack will be licking their lips at the opportunity of taking on the Eels defence in the aim of sending another message to the competition about their intent for the 2023 season.

That shaky defence has been costly for the Eels in 2023. In seven of their 11 games, the Eels have conceded over 20 points which has hampered their ability to move upwards on the ladder after one win from their first five games, albeit against tough opposition. Despite their record of 4-7, the Eels haven't lost a game by more than 10 points and are generally in the game for the duration of the 80 minutes.

The return of Mitchell Moses will hopefully bring some attacking spark back to the team after their eight-point loss to the Canberra Raiders last weekend, but it's their defence that has been the main issue. Conceding 20 plus points makes it incredibly difficult to win, especially when coming up against a defence like the Rabbitohs that

has been brilliant at shutting down opposition attacks this year.

To win this, it'll require the Eels best performance of the year and given their record over the past month, this doesn't seem likely. However, Brad Arthur will have his team up for this match as the Eels can similarly send a message to the competition by knocking off the lead leaders, shouting in the process "We're coming for you!"

The only change for the Rabbitohs for Friday night's clash is the omission of Jed Cartwright who won't be available under concussion protocols, and is replaced by Daniel Suluka-Fifta on the bench. The Eels welcome back Mitchell Moses after returning from the same protocol, pushing Jake Arthur out of the side. The other two changes see Sean Russell come in for Haze Dunster on the wing, whilst Shaun Lane sits out with a hamstring injury, pushing Bryce Cartwright into the starting team and Makenesi Makatoa onto the bench.

WHO TO WATCH: Campbell Graham and Latrell Mitchell have been two players at the forefront of the Rabbitohs success in 2023. Firstly, Graham has been a machine this season, scoring 11 tries from the same number of games and is having the best season of his career to date. 146 metres and 16 tackles per game highlights his output from centre and as now one of the best attacking and defensive centres in the game, he is poised for an Origin debut. Secondly, Mitchell has once again been outstanding for the Rabbitohs. The fullback has scored all nine of his tries in his last six games and has assisted a further six throughout the season. He is one of the most dangerous players in the game and will be keen to demonstrate this again on Friday night.

For the Eels, the halves pairing of Mitchell Moses and Dylan Brown are going to have to conjure up something special in attack if they're to offset the points they're likely to concede. Moses, returning from concussion, has scored four tries and assisted seven this season, and he'll have to add to those tallies on Friday night if the Eels are to win. His kicking game will be a focal point for the Eels and with seven forced drop outs, you can see why they'll look to use that to their advantage. Brown has had a relatively quiet season, despite running for a career-high 145 metres per game. After scoring 11 tries last season, the five-eighth has scored just a sole four-pointer in 2023 but has assisted 11 so far. Brown will have to be more threatening to the Rabbitohs line in this clash.

FAVOURITE: Souths are the favourite for this clash and it's easy to see why. They've won their last six games in relatively convincing fashion and are sitting on top of the table with eight wins from 11 games. Parramatta have struggled defensively this season and it'll be hard to turn that around against the brilliant Souths attack.

MY TIP: Souths have won their last six matches against the Eels, and none of them have been close. The smallest margin of victory came in the 2020 finals where Souths won by 14 points. In fact, the Eels have won only one of their last nine against the Rabbitohs, dating back to the start of the 2018 season. Souths should be too strong defensively to lose this one. Souths by 12 points.

Knights Look to Climb into Top 8 Against Sharks Side Thirsty for Blood

Aside from a shock blowout loss against the Dolphins a couple of weeks ago, the Sharks have been one of the most in-form teams in the competition in recent weeks, while the Knights snapped a 3-game losing streak with an emphatic victory against a hot Titans team.

Playing in a hostile environment against Manly last week, the Sharks were a few tiers above their opposition, streaking out to an 18-point lead with over half an hour left in the match. Looking at the final scoreline of 20-14, one could easily assume Cronulla suffered a mini 2nd half collapse, but in reality, their showing late in the match showed a tremendous step forward defensively.

In that second half, Manly enjoyed a 61% share of possession which brought with it 34 tackles in the opposition 20 compared to just 5 for the Sharks. To hold on to win the match with those lopsided stats is the kind of effort the Sharks will need every week if they are to be considered a genuine threat; they are averaging 29.75 points conceded in games they've lost.

The Knights attack in their win against the Titans was the best it's been since their Round 6 steamrolling of the Warriors, with Kalyn Ponga's return to form unsurprisingly a huge catalyst.

Newcastle have shown this year that on their day their attack is up there with the best in the competition, but what would've pleased Adam O'Brien was the way they piled on the points after going down early in the second half. After the Titans scored a long range try in the 44th minute, Newcastle scored four unanswered tries of their own, effectively ending the game with 10 minutes to go.

With both sides possessing a dynamic attack that can score points from anywhere on the paddock, this game

could end up being one of the more entertaining ones of the round. If it does become a shootout, both sides will be well prepared; between the two of them there has been 7 games where 55 or more points were scored.

In team news, Oregon Kaufusi is back for Cronulla and will start in the front row replacing Cam McInnes, who is out with a thumb injury. The Knights are unchanged from the 17 that beat the Gold Coast last week.

WHO TO WATCH: A huge reason for the Sharks dynamic attack this season has been the step forward taken by edge forward Briton Nikora. Through 11 rounds of footy, Nikora leads all back-rowers in total line breaks and line breaks per game with 9 and 0.9 respectively. His threat in attack has also helped open up the field for Nicho Hynes when attacking on the edges, often able to utilise his cut-out passing game to put his outside backs in open space due to the defensive attention drawn by Nikora. Last week, he produced another standout performance, finishing with a line break, try assist, 3 tackle breaks, an offload as well as 40 tackles with only 2 misses. His try assist involved burning Tom Trbojevic, which is admittedly not the claim it would've been two seasons ago but was still no mean feat.

For the Knights, all eyes will rightfully be on Kalyn Ponga. The polarising five-eighth put in a performance last week that went a long way to silencing the doubters who don't think he should be picked in Queensland's state of origin 17 (despite being their best player in the historic game 3 victory less than 12 months ago), finishing with the outstanding stats of 15 runs for 188 metres, a line break, two line break assist, 3 try assists, two tackle breaks and two offloads. With the game in the balance about 5 minutes into the second half, Ponga took the game by the scruff of the neck in a reminder of what he's capable of in attack when he's in the right condition both physically and mentally. Despite all this, it was not the perfect game by any means. Ponga finished with 8 tackles made to go with 6 misses, a number which doesn't indicate improvement from the pathetic showing against Parramatta a few weeks ago. It's an area he simply has to address and address quickly if the Knights are going to upset the Sharks; it's no good scoring 30 points if you're going to concede 40.

FAVOURITE: The Sharks are 9.5-point favourites at the time of writing.

MY TIP: It'll be a dry track at Pointsbet Stadium for this one. I think the Knights will keep it close for 65 minutes or so before the Sharks snag a couple of late tries to take the win. Sharks by 8.

Milestone match sees rivals reunite on Wanngal land

Luke Brooks will become the fifth player to reach 200 first grade appearances for the Wests Tigers when the joint venture hosts the North Queensland Cowboys at Leichhardt Oval on Saturday evening.

Coming into the match on the bottom of the ladder and boasting the worst attacking record in the league, the Wests Tigers will be hoping the sense of occasion inspires a positive reaction at their spiritual home.

Going down gallantly to the top of the table Rabbitohs 20-0 last week, coach Tim Sheens has resisted the urge to make changes for the clash opposite their 2005 grand final foes.

Luke Brooks will join Chris Heighington, Robbie Farah, Benji Marshall and Chris Lawrence in reaching 200 first grade appearances for the joint venture, while underrated outside back Starford To'a will play his 50th first grade match.

Winning three of their past ten Indigenous Round matches, the Tigers have lost their past four matches on the lands of the Wanngal people.

Returning to form with back-to-back wins over the past fortnight, the North Queensland Cowboys will be aiming to continue their winning ways south of the border.

Posting their largest score of the season with a 42-22 victory over the Dragons last Saturday, the Cowboys will be looking to defy precedent at a venue where they have managed two wins from 12 visits historically.

Recording three wins from their past four matches against the Tigers, coach Todd Payten will welcome back Riley Price in place of Jamayne Taunoa-Brown, while mid-season acquisition Sam McIntyre is part of the extended squad.

The Cowboys have lost six of their past ten Indigenous Round matches, including a 20-12 defeat at the hands of the Tigers at Leichhardt Oval five years ago.

WHO TO WATCH: Providing plenty of punch through the middle of the field, experienced front-rower David Klemmer will be looking to make one final push for a representative recall. Playing every game for the joint venture this season with an average of 160 running metres in just under 51 minutes of on-field action, the 29-year-old could force his way back into the Origin arena for the first time in four years given the dearth of experienced and injury-free middle forwards. Renown as one of the most intimidating players at the height of his career, Klemmer will have a point to prove as the Tigers strive to bounce back at home.

Emerging as a breakout star at all levels last season, a strong showing from Reuben Cotter could see the hard-working forward earn a Maroon jumper. Coming into grade as one of several players vying to play hooker, the 24-year-old has fashioned a reputation for doing the hard yards through the middle of the field. Debuting for Queensland in the opening match of last season only to miss the rest of the series through injury, a strong showing on Saturday could see Cotter beat out a host of rivals for a place in Billy Slater's squad.

FAVOURITE: Coming into the contest off the back of consecutive victories, the Cowboys are expected to play spoilers and claim a rare victory at Leichhardt

MY TIP: While the final margin failed to reflect the closeness of the Tigers' defensive effort last Saturday, the attacking prowess of the Cowboys should prove decisive at the end of 80 minutes. Cowboys by 10.

Sunday afternoon Rugby League heads to the outer-inner west of Sydney as the Canterbury Bulldogs play host to the Gold Coast Titans at Accor Stadium.

Despite all the talk and promise of a much-improved season, the Canterbury Bulldogs have had a challenging season so far in 2023. Despite showing flashes of promise, the Bulldogs have only managed four wins so far this season putting them down in 15th position winning just one of their last five matches.

Last weekend, the Canterbury Bulldogs fell to their fourth loss in the past five matches following their 24-12 defeat to the New Zealand Warriors at Accor Stadium. The Bulldogs were outplayed completely by the Warriors in last week's game. The loss is a major concern for the Dogs given that most of the stats heavily favoured them but they couldn't take advantage of a high possession rate as well as 22 fewer missed tackles.

The Bulldogs welcome back Josh Addo-Carr who was expected to return last weekend following his ankle injury. The return of the Fox, this sees winger Blake Wilson drop back to the reserves. Bulldogs coach Cameron Ciraldo has also rotated his halves with Josh Reynolds dropping back to the bench with Karl Olopau coming back into the starting side. Another change has seen Sam Hughes added to the bench in place of Franklin Pele who drops out of the side.

The Gold Coast Titans are a side that has always shown a lot of promise but yet again has somehow both overdelivered at times as well as underdelivering significantly. The Titans come into the contest sitting in 9th spot having 5 wins and 5 losses from their ten matches.

A second half collapse from the Titans saw them capitulate badly up in Newcastle when they fell to a 46-26 defeat against the Knights. Despite leading at one point in the second half 18-12, the Titans had fallen into a hole quite badly conceding 22 points in just 15 minutes to fall behind before needing to play catch-up football. The loss was disappointing for the Titans because they looked nothing like the side that was able to beat the Eels the week before.

Only one change for the Titans from last week's defeat with Erin Clark returning onto the bench after missing last week due to a finger injury. The return of Clark sees Iszac Fa'asumaleaui drop back to the reserves bench.

WHO TO WATCH: There is a massive boom around Bulldogs five-eighth Karl Olopau and for the first time the 18-year-old rookie gets to start in the Blue and White. The move into the starting side is a big opportunity for the youngster to put his stamp on the game and the side in a must win game. Canterbury will be needing Olopau to deliver on his promise to help them out of the form-slump.

At the complete opposite end of his career, Kieran Foran is playing almost the best football of his career as he notches over 270 games. A fortnight ago against Parramatta, Foran scored a double and looked strong and for parts of the contest last week he looked good again. The Titans need his experience and poise amongst a young side that can lose the plot at times if they want to beat the Bulldogs.

FAVOURITE: Based on form and recent performances, the Gold Coast Titans are slight favourites heading into the contest.

MY TIP: The Titans have shown that they are a team that can match anyone on the day but their lack of consistency can hurt them a lot and it has this season. If they can put at least a 70-minute performance in they should have enough to get past the Bulldogs. Titans by 8.

Struggling Sea Eagles travel to Canberra to face in-form Raiders

Manly and Canberra are set to round out Indigenous Round on Sunday afternoon at GIO Stadium, on Ngunnawal Land. The home side have been showing great form of late, having snuck out to a five game winning streak, and as a result have climbed to 7th on the ladder. On the other hand, Manly's promising start to the season has fallen away, and they find themselves sitting 12th.

Canberra are coming off an important eight point victory over Parramatta last week. It was a hard fought game, with the Raiders having to contend with the sin-binning of their forward Corey Horsburgh in the 22nd minute. With the scores tied at the half-time break, Canberra showed a certain maturity that hadn't been displayed in the earlier rounds of 2023 to take home the two points with a 26-18 full time scoreline.

Tom Starling finds himself in the starting hooker role, with Zac Woolford out through concussion. Danny Levi is set to make a timely return from a broken jaw, and has been named on the bench.

Manly are heading into this weekend on a three game losing streak that will only become tougher and tougher to break each round. They need to stop digging their own hole deeper, and do whatever it takes to record a win against the Raiders on Sunday. If they can't, they're running the very real risk of their season running down the drain very quickly.

Last week they faced off against Cronulla at their own home ground in Brookvale. Down 20 to zip with just 30 minutes remaining on the clock, things looked like they could be about to get ugly for the home team.

To Manly's credit though, they managed a miniature fightback, drawing the scoreline to within touching distance by full-time - a 20-14 loss.

In big news for Manly and the NSW Blues, Jake Trbojevic has been named to make a slightly earlier than planned return from injury this weekend. Josh Schuster is also back into the side, and he is set to partner Daly Cherry-Evans in the halves. Injuries to Josh Aloiai and Kelma Tuilagi means that Ben Trbojevic will be the third Trbojevic in Manly's starting 13, while Samuela Fainu and Ben Condon join the interchange.

Canberra haven't won six straight games since 2016, so a win this round would no doubt be significant for the club.

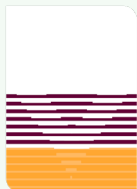
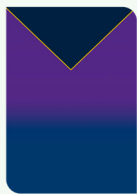
WHO TO WATCH: Danny Levi will be a key factor in Sunday's game for Canberra. Returning from a broken jaw, the 27 year old will be inserted into the game off the bench, presumably as a replacement for Tom Starling in the hooker role. Having made just three NRL appearances this year, Levi will be keen to take advantage of this game with Zac Woolford out of the picture. Woolford, Levi, and Starling have been locked in an enthralling battle for minutes at hooker for Canberra throughout this season, so you can expect Levi to stake a claim to the starting number nine jersey long-term, in his return from injury.

As Manly's Lachlan Croker closes in on 100 NRL games, he can be proud of his efforts that have secured him the role of first choice hooker at the Sea Eagles for the 2023 season. The 26 year old has appeared in every game since round five, and has played a minimum of fifty minutes in each. Despite coming from a halves background, Croker has now well and truly established himself as an NRL hooker - this is his 6th year with Manly. Croker made his NRL debut with the Raiders back in 2016, so he will want to make a statement against his former club.

FAVOURITE: Ricky's Raiders are the solid favourites to win this Sunday at home.

MY TIP: Canberra should extend their winning streak against a disappointing Manly side. Raiders by 12.

MELBOURNE TOP RESILIENT BRISBANE SIDE IN OUTLANDISH THURSDAY NIGHT CLASH

The Melbourne Storm have pulled off a confidence-boosting 24-16 victory over top of the table Brisbane to open Round 11. Played in front of over 16,000 fans at AAMI Park, it was an at times hectic, and at all times entertaining, eighty minutes of football.

Brisbane were winning the battle of territory in the opening sets, but couldn't make significant use of their good field position. Melbourne would get their first real attacking opportunity at just past the ten minute mark, and it was their five-eighth Cameron Munster who opened the scoring in the 13th minute. It was a very straightforward try under the posts, and with Meaney slotting the conversion, the gap became six.

Justin Olam went close just a few minutes later, but Reece Walsh was there to save the day in cover. In Brisbane's subsequent set, a six again call invited them downfield, before Walsh again showed his talent. Seeing space through the middle, he took off, before offloading into Farnworth's knee. With the ball still live and in the in-goal, Harry Grant was ruled to have impeded Farnworth from scoring, and so it was a penalty try which opened Brisbane's account in the 17th minute.

Adam Reynolds left the field due to a neck injury in worrying scenes at the time - Brisbane would have to do it without their halfback from here. In his absence, Walsh yet again stepped up, providing a superb right to left pass for his winger Jesse Arthars. Arthars had work to do to ground it, but he did well, and so the scoreline read 10-6 at the 26th minute mark.

With a bit of emotion coming into the game, things were poised perfectly for a classic. Brisbane looked set to hold their four point lead into the break, but in the 38th minute Herbie

Farnworth got sent for 10 for impeding a Melbourne kick chaser. Will Warbrick promptly crossed on the right edge for the Storm just a minute later to tie the scores at ten for the half-time break.

Warbrick looked to have crossed for a double in the 45th, before the bunker took it off him for a chaser being in-front of the kicker. Even so, Melbourne looked well on top in the early stages of the second half, and they looked certain to take the lead in the 51st minute when Jahrome Hughes sliced through the line and found Eliesa Katoa backing up - but a last ditch try-saving effort from Ezra Mam kept the scores tied.

A few minutes later, Brisbane were hit with another challenge. Pat Carrigan forced to sit out for ten minutes due to a hip drop tackle - Melbourne yet again with the one man advantage. A Meaney penalty goal took the score to 12-10, but it looked like Brisbane wouldn't have to wait long to take the lead off the Storm. Walsh was awarded a try in the 60th minute, before the bunker overruled due to a two in the tackle strip involved in the play.

So Melbourne went right back down the other end, and scored their own. Justin Olam made the score 16-10 in the 61st minute, before his fullback Nick Meaney kicked a penalty goal a few minutes later to make the margin larger than a converted try. Warbrick would then go on to seal the game in the 75th minute - finally getting his two try haul.

The last five minutes seemed to go forever, with pushing and shoving, a captain's challenge, a length of the field no try that should've been awarded, and two sin bins (Aaron Pene, Thomas Flegler). Corey Paix also crossed for a consolation in the 78th, bringing the full time score to 24-16.

WARRIORS HOLD ON FOR GUTSY WIN

The Warriors have secured a well earned two points before their bye week, outclassing the Canterbury-Bankstown 24-12 at Accor Stadium on Friday.

On the Warriors first possession they received a penalty, with young Bulldogs winger Blake Wilson tackling Dallin Watene-Zelezniak in the air. The home side survived that attacking raid, but a few minutes later Shaun Johnson would put in an early grubber kick for Josh Curran, who had no Bulldogs player within 10 metres of him when he scored the try.

The game would become an arm wrestle for the next 15 minutes or so, with either halfback doing their best to gain the upper hand for their side through the long kicking game. Hayze Perham would give the Warriors the advantage when he threw a terrible pass at Max King, who put the ball down.

On the ensuing set, it was as if the Bulldogs were giving Addin Fonua-Blake a guard of honour as the big man strolled pass the defence courtesy of a sublime pass from Dylan Walker. It was AFB's 5th try of the season, a number that has him sitting atop the list of try-scorers for New Zealand.

When the Bulldogs got a penalty off the next set, things were looking up for them. The crowd was into the game and a try to set up a grandstand finish seemed inevitable. Corey Waddell would then make a mess of the play the ball and let the Warriors off the hook.

The result was put beyond doubt in the 67th minute, when young five-eighth Ronald Volkman made something out of nothing, grubbering through to himself on the last tackle before putting a step on Perham and diving over for his first career try in the top grade.

The Bulldogs would score a consolation try with 5 minutes to go through Jayden Okunbor, making the final score 24-12 in favour of New Zealand.

PLENTY OF HEAT IN THE CANBERRA COLD AS RAIDERS GO FIVE STRAIGHT

The Canberra Raiders have notched up an unlikely fifth straight victory with a 26-18 victory over the Parramatta Eels at GIO Stadium in front of 17,414 home fans.

It might have been a cold night in the nation's capital but the action was anything but with both sides fired up with big hits and even some push and shove that went further than legal.

The opening points for both sides came via the boots of Jarrod Croker and Clint Gutherson respectively with Canberra adding a penalty goal in the 7th minute and the Eels replying in the 15th minute.

Things got unsettled around the 25 minute mark when Ryan Matterson and Corey Horsburgh came together and saw the Raiders enforce sin binned by referee Grant Atkins for throwing a punch.

It took right until the end of the ten-minute period for the Eels to take advantage of the extra man and it came off a kick from Ryan Matterson that ricocheted off the upright and sat in the in-goal for J'maine Hopgood to get there first and ground the ball.

The home side then levelled scores just shy of the half-time mark when the Raiders kept the ball alive and spread the ball wide for Albert Hopoate to use his strength to get

over in the corner.

It took plenty of time for the Raiders to get points in the first half but it didn't take long in the second half as Hudson Young chased through a kick from dummy half from Josh Starling to score with ease. If the first try of the half was easy, then second one was just as easy if not easier when Sebastian Kris went straight through almost no defence chasing through a last tackle grubber from Jamal Fogarty to score uncontested.

Things were looking to head one-way but for the Eels a piece of luck and brilliance from Will Pensini set up an attacking raid for Parramatta as they went down the other end and a couple of plays later Bailey Simonsson got on the board.

A penalty goal to Jarrod Croker with fifteen minutes to go pushed the gap to 10 points and it made a difference when the Eels closed the gap to four points when Maika Sivo used his strength to fight his way over the try line.

The Eels were creating enough opportunities but ill-discipline hurt them as errors and penalties continued to cost them field position. A piece of Jordan Rapana magic to fly over the top of Maika Sivo and tap the ball back for Matt Timoko to score sealed the victory for the Raiders.

HUNT HEROICS NOT ENOUGH IN MILESTONE MATCH

Ben Hunt did all he could but - as has been the case for so long now - it was not enough as the North Queensland Cowboys stormed to a 42-22 win over the St George Illawarra Dragons on Saturday night.

Hunt had three try assists and just as many linebreak assists in the win as the 33-year-old did his best to inspire the Dragons to victory in his 300th game. Instead, yet another loss leaves the Dragons with just two wins near the bottom of the ladder alongside the Tigers, while the Cowboys now sit just two points outside of the top eight.

Despite the eventual scoreline, it was actually the Dragons who started Saturday night's game the better of the two sides. Cowboys fullback Scott Drinkwater coughed up the ball early to give the visitors an immediate shot at their line and they capitalized, with Hunt starting his milestone match in style. The halfback-turned-hooker schemed out of dummy-half and squared it up for a charging Jack de Belin who stormed over to score, with Jayden Sullivan adding the extras to make it 6-0. That was just three minutes into the game and a penalty against Peta Hiku moments later allowed the Dragons to march up the field with a chance to add even more points. There was some controversy though as Tom Dearden appeared to impede Tyrell Sloan as the Dragons fullback chased after a Talatau Amone kick. The referee though allowed play to continue and the contentious decisions just kept coming as the Dragons fell apart to trail 24-6 at the break.

First, Jordan McLean sent Chad Townsend steaming through a hole before the halfback summed up the situation well to put in a kick for Kyle Feldt in the eighth minute. That saw the scores levelled before a contentious call to sin bin Sullivan turned the game on its head, with the referee deeming the halfback had held down Feldt after a linebreak. Of course, right call or not, the onus was on the Dragons to aim up in the face of adversity and unfortunately for Anthony Griffin his side completely wilted. Jack Gosiewski was first to score as Drinkwater made up for his early error by beating a few defenders with his speed before popping a late offload for the second rower. It was former Dragon Reece Robson who was next to get the Townsville faithful on its feet, bursting through a

hole and passing to McLean, who then found Townsend backing up in support. The Cowboys halfback was pulled up just short though, with the Dragons' defence shot to bits on the left but North Queensland went right and seemingly squandered the try-scoring opportunity. But a brilliant one-on-one effort from Heilum Luki saw the Cowboys forward surge over in the corner, with Valentine Holmes missing his first conversion of the night to leave the score at 16-6 after 30 minutes. It didn't take long for North Queensland to find the try-line again though as Drinkwater turned it back on an angle for Holmes, who then found Dearden backing up to stroll over and score. A late Holmes two-point field goal iced what was a dominant first half for North Queensland, who took a 24-6 lead into the sheds.

The Cowboys quickly extended the buffer by another six points after Luki scored his second of the night in the 50th minute, this time beating a poor attempted tackle from Max Feagai. The Dragons eventually hit back a few minutes later with Hunt involved again, on this occasion putting a kick through for Jaydn Su'A who beat Drinkwater to it. The visitors had a few chances to creep back into the contest but lacked execution and direction in attack, only really looking threatening when they punched it right through the middle. Of course, an opposition error also helps as a Holmes mistake saw Mikaele Ravalawa race away and fend off Drinkwater to score and reduce the deficit to 30-16 with 10 minutes left. But again, speaking of poor execution, a Jack Bird as the Dragons tried to shift it deep inside their own half saw the game well and truly put to bed as Feldt pounced and ran away to score North Queensland's sixth of the night. That saw the Cowboys' lead pushed out to 36-16, with Hunt adding one more try assist to his tally as he put Suli over for what appeared to be the final try of the night.

Another error though directly led to points as Suli coughed it up, with Dearden on the spot to score the final try of the night, leaving the score at 42-22. Dragons forward Toby Couchman could be in trouble after being placed on report for a hip-drop tackle in the 36th minute but strangely was not sent to the sin bin.

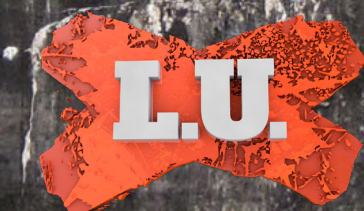
