Dragons Look to Continue Smooth Carr-ride on the Road Against Dolphins

The Dragons, fresh off the hook from having Griffin as their coach, made a statement with a thrilling last second victory over the Roosters last week, while the Dolphins produced yet another second half comeback but ultimately fell short against a Melbourne team that started fast.

These two sides last met in round 5, and it was a blowout win for the Dragons, however Thursday night's clash will be under much different circumstances. The disastrous Anthony Griffin era has finally ended for the red-v, with Ryan Carr no doubt looking to make the most of his opportunity, while the Dolphins have come back to the pack since their 3-1 start but are still vastly exceeding expectations.

Given it is the week before State of Origin, neither side will be at full strength, with arguably the most important spine players from both teams headed into Maroons camp. How the Dolphins and Dragons go about replacing the output of Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow and Ben Hunt respectively will go a long way to determining the outcome of the match, while Tom Gilbert is also going to be missed by the hosts.

What should be of concern to the Dragons is the nature that they let the Roosters back into the contest last week. Up 14-0 with just over 30 minutes to play, the Saints conceded 3 tries in the space of 11 minutes to surrender their lead in a flash.

This issue is amplified by the fact the Dolphins have become known for their second half comebacks in 2023. Their rally from 26-0 down a month ago won't be forgotten anytime soon, while also erasing deficits against the Raiders (twice actually, winning one and losing one). They've also come close to stealing wins with 2nd

half surges against the Broncos and Storm.

With no Ben Hunt to steer the ship, the Dragons will have a hard enough time building a lead to begin with, let alone sustaining it against the Dolphins.

WHO TO WATCH: Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow has been one of the Dolphins' best this year and has been deservedly rewarded with a Maroons jumper for his efforts. Stepping in to replace him at fullback this week is none other than Mr Fix-it Kodi Nikorima. Nikorima is primarily a half but started 3 games in the custodian role for the Rabbitohs last season, and with all due there is a reason that number isn't higher. While many of his red-zone attacking skills are transferrable to the number 1 jersey, Nikorima is a liability under the high ball and lacks kick returning ability, averaging just 7.4 metres per run in those aforementioned fullback starts for Souths. If Nikorima can get through the game without making an ill-timed error that puts his side under pressure, it'll be a success.


While Ben Hunt is clearly an irreplaceable player, Dragons fans will see a silver lining to his origin-related absence in that young gun Jayden Sullivan should get a chance to play 80 minutes in the halves for the first time since Round 4. In his magic round return against the Tigers, Sullivan looked like a threat almost every time he had the ball in the opposition half, scoring a superb individual try double that almost saved the game for the Saints. In the two games since, Sullivan was bizarrely benched in the first half by the now departed Griffin and only played a minute role off the bench in the win over Sydney. No-one expects Sullivan to control the game and build constant pressure on the opposition like Ben Hunt would, but he has the talent to make a game-breaking play at any moment from anywhere on the field, and doing so would go a long way to the Dragons causing an upset.

FAVOURITE: The Dolphins are 6-point favourites at the time of writing.

MY TIP: There's no reason this game shouldn't be in the balance with 15 minutes to go. Either side could win, but the home ground advantage and extra experience in key positions makes me lean slightly the way of the Dolphins. Dolphins by 2.

This Friday the Parramatta Eels play host to the North QLD Cowboys, both of which are missing several players, many due to the upcoming State of Origin Game I.

The Eels are fresh off a red-hot win against the Rabbitohs, where they beat them by a convincing 20-point margin. This marks the 5th win for Parramatta this season, with them having lost all other matches by ten or less points.

On the other side of this match, the Cowboys are coming off one of their worst games to date, where they were decimated by the Wests Tigers in a 66-18 game. Unlike last year, the Cowboys have really struggled this season, with a mix of poor attack and defence time and time again, however despite this they have still managed to string together 5 wins so far.

With Junior Paulo joining the NSW Blues camp, new Parramatta signing Joe Ofahengaue will slot into the starting side in his place. Both Ryan Matterson and Andrew Davey are out of the game due to respective calf and head knock injuries, with Matt Doorey returning to the side alongside Luca Moretti making his NRL debut.

Val Holmes, Murray Taulagi, Reuben Cotter and Tom Dearden are all on QLD Maroons honours this round and will be missing out on this important bounce-back clash for the Cowboys. NRL debutants Zac Laybutt and Robert Derby will respectively be playing in place of Holmes and Taulagi, with Ben Hampton slotting in as five-eighth and Jake Granville as lock. Griffin Neame and Jamayne Taunoa-Brown also rejoin the Cowboys bench after suffering injuries.

The Eels and Cowboys sit right next to each other on the ladder, in positions 13th and 14th correspondingly. However, the quality and confidence that these two teams have in comparison is worlds apart.

WHO TO WATCH: Maiko Sivo is a force to be reckoned with, leading the NRL in tries scored, he has already made the total 14, including four doubles and one hat trick. A definite fan favourite, it'll be interesting to see just how many tries he might score against North QLD.

New faces in Napier

A rested and rejuvenated New Zealand Warriors will make their first premiership appearance in Napier against an Origin-depleted Brisbane Broncos on Saturday evening.

Coming into the representative period fresh off a bye and without a single player involved in the interstate series, the New Zealand Warriors will be aiming to capitalise on their weakened opponents in a bid to remain inside the top eight.

Welcoming back Jackson Ford and Demitric Sifakula as part of a reshuffle that sees Wayde Egan and Dylan Walker out of the squad, coach Andrew Webster has named speedster Luke Metcalf to make his club debut at five-eighth after recovering from a hamstring injury sustained during the pre-season.

The Warriors have won five of their past nine Origin-affected matches over the past decade; Saturday will be the first time a pre-Origin fixture has been held in New Zealand since 2017, where the Warriors incidentally defeated the Broncos.

Heading across the Tasman without five of their representative stars, the Brisbane Broncos will be out to halt a poor run of form over the past month.

Losing three of their past four matches, including a 15-4 defeat at the hands of the Panthers last Thursday, coach Kevin Walters has been forced to draw upon his side's depth to cover for Origin quintet Reece Walsh, Selwyn Cobbo, Thomas Flegler, Payne Haas and Patrick Carrigan.

Handing Deine Mariner, Xavier Willison and Brendan Piakura their first starts of the year, along with recalling Keenan Palasia up front, former Dragons utility Tristan Sailor will play his first match in nearly three years at fullback after working his way back from legal issues with Souths Logan over the past 13 months.

Matches between the two sides have been closely fought during the last decade with the Warriors holding a slender advantage of eight wins and a draw from 15 clashes.

WHO TO WATCH: Announcing himself as one of the breakout stars of the trials only to be cruelly cut down by injury, Warriors fans will be salivating at the prospect of seeing Luke Metcalf on the field. Boasting scintillating pace capable of turning a missed tackle into a length-of-the field effort, the 24-year-old utility will become the fourth player to line up alongside Shaun Johnson in the halves this season. Playing seven matches with Cronulla predominantly off the bench over the past two years, expect Metcalf to cause plenty of havoc on Saturday evening.

Making a timely return after missing last week's loss through injury, the Broncos will be relying upon Adam Reynolds to mastermind an upset across the ditch. Producing ten try-assists and eight forced drop-outs in 11 appearances this season, the 32-year-old has been surprisingly off target with a goal kicking rate (73%) well below his career average (82%). Boasting more first grade experience than his entire backline combined, Reynolds will be crucially important if the Broncos are to improve upon their 50% record in pre-Origin matches over the past decade.

FAVOURITE. New Zealand are expected to prevail in the first premiership match held in Napier since Melbourne defeated St George Illawarra in 2015.

MYTIP: While much has been made over who is unavailable for the Broncos, the strike and experience of Staggs, Farnworth, Reynolds, Capewell and Taupau could pave the way for a win against the odds. Broncos by 2

Rabbitohs and Raiders raring to recover from wreckage

Sydney Olympic Park provides the backdrop for this Saturday night's clash between the South Sydney Rabbitohs and the Canberra Raiders in round 13. Both teams are coming off shocking performances - and not in a good way, either. They'll both be keen to get their seasons back on track with a win. Canberra will enjoy the advantage of only having one player out due to State of Origin duties - less than their opponents the Rabbitohs.

South Sydney have been shaping not just as premiership contenders, but as premiership favourites, in the early days of NRL 2023. Stringing together an impressive six game long winning streak and beating teams such as Penrith, Brisbane, and Melbourne along the way, Souths won their way into first position on the table. But last weekend they came crashing back down to Earth.

Up against the struggling Parramatta Eels at Moore Park last Friday, the Rabbitohs were expected to sweep the Eels to one side and continue on their winning streak. However, this wasn't to be, with South Sydney falling to a 36-16 defeat in front of over 27,000 fans. They now sit in second on the ladder, behind defending premiers Penrith, and equal on points with a whopping four (yep, you read that right) other teams.

Campbell Graham has been named to play for Souths despite withdrawing from the NSW Blues side with a sternum injury. With Cameron Murray and Latrell Mitchell out on Origin duty, Liam Knight will start at lock, and Blake Taaffe is the fullback.

Canberra have a similar storyline to their opponents heading into this clash. After a shaky start to their campaign, the Raiders got a roll on, winning their way to a five game streak. The streak, defined by a victory over the high-flying Broncos, saw Canberra lifted into the top eight after round 11 for the first time in 2023.

However, last week saw their streak grind to a halt.

Raiders played host to Manly in Canberra on Sunday to close out the round. The Sea Eagles had been lacking form, and with Canberra surging up the ladder, the Raiders were expected to win at home. But Manly had come to play, and despite the home team scoring the first try, the Raiders lost 42-14. They now enter round 13 in 8th place on the ladder - although this is only one win away from first place due to a stunningly close competition table.

With Hudson Young called up to Origin, and with Elliott Whitehead suspended, the Raiders forward pack has had to reshuffle a little. Corey Harawira-Naera has been named in the second row, with Joe Tapine shifting to lock, and Pasami Saulo starting in the front row. Nick Cotric looks set to return from injury, being named on the bench, while Zac Woolford claims the number nine jersey, forcing Danny Levi to the reserves.

These two sides have not met at Sydney Olympic Park since 2017, when Canberra triumphed by 14 points.

WHO TO WATCH: Blake Taaffe has found his way back into the NRL fold over the past few weeks for the Rabbitohs. After spending much of season 2023 in NSW Cup, Taaffe has won back a bench spot over the past two rounds, and now with star fullback Mitchell out through higher duties, this is the perfect opportunity for Taaffe to shine. Once touted as Adam Reynolds' replacement at Souths, Taaffe has plenty of talent, but it remains to be seen whether he will be showcasing that in the NRL or in NSW Cup for the remainder of the season, not to mention the years going forward.

Ata Mariota has enjoyed a solid start to his NRL career. The Raiders forward has only a handful of first grade games to his name, and despite suffering an injury set-back earlier in season 2023, Mariota has managed to hold down his spot in the side. The 21 year old Apia-born prop is contracted to Canberra until the end of 2024, and with Hudson Young missing from the side, coach Stuart will be hoping that Mariota can help fill the gap.

FAVOURITE: Somewhat surprisingly, the bookmakers have Canberra as the narrow favourites to get the victory.

MY TIP. Despite Rabbitohs losing some Origin stars, I think they will bounce back into form against the Raiders. South Sydney by 8.

Elsewhere, Toafofoa Sipley starts at prop with Sean Keppie shifting to lock and Samuela Fainu joins the run-on side at second row.

Christian Tuipulotu is the new face on the bench, offering cover for the backline.

WHO TO WATCH: While Ponga is the obvious pick here fresh of being dropped from Queensland's Origin team, this writer is keen to see how Adam Elliott goes after being promoted to the starting team. Elliott had an injury-interrupted start to the season but has started to build up his minutes in recent weeks and could add some much-needed starch and aggression to Newcastle's forward pack. Manly's understrength middles punched above their weight last week but look for Elliott to lead from the front in a much tougher test against a Newcastle side with plenty to prove.

Josh Schuster had his best game of the season last week against Canberra, silencing some of his critics in the process. Speaking to media on Tuesday, Schuster said that it "hurts" every time he reads negative commitments questioning his fitness or commitment to the team. "But you know if you are doing the work behind the scenes you're going to shut them up real quick," Schuster added. Now fitter and more focused than ever before, Schuster recorded three try assists, three linebreak assists and a try in last Sunday's win over Canberra. It was impressive stuff but won't mean much if he can't back it up. Sure, no one is expecting those kinds of numbers without Cherry-Evans and the Trbojevic boys this week. But Manly fans will be wanting to see the same kind of effort and attitude from Schuster irrespective of the scoreline.

FAVOURITE: The Knights are expected to bounce back against an understrength Manly outfit.

MY TIP: Newcastle was dreadful last week but in front of a home crowd and with Ponga and Gagai having a point to prove to selectors, look for the Knights to do this relatively comfortably. Knights by 16.

Stage set for a vital series

Well, it's back. State of Origin is here everyone and it promises to be quite the series with so many storylines to follow and track. The 2023 State of Origin series gets underway when New South Wales take on Queensland from Adelaide Oval in Adelaide.

New South Wales have had a mixed Origin record of recent times. After winning his first two series in charge, Brad Fittler has only won one subsequent series since and even that was due to their success in the PVL rule changes of 2021. However, the Blues come into this campaign determined to write the wrongs of last year's horror decider with a strong series opener in the city of Churches.

Onto the part of the series that gets everyone talking, and that is team selection. Fittler has gone with an experienced side but some bolters thrown in for good measure. Josh Addo-Carr wins a recall after his surprise omission last year. After a strong performance against Canberra, Tommy Turbo is deemed ready for take-off, as is Panthers half Jarome Luai and Souths gun Latrell Mitchell (the latter missing last year's series). Api Koroisau wins his chance at hooker over Damien Cook. Tevita Pangai Jr makes his Origin debut as he is parachuted straight into the run on team, starting with Payne Haas. Hudson Young and Tyson Frizell are the surprise winners of starting edge spots with Cam Murray and Liam Martin reverting to the bench along with Nicho Hynes and Junior Paulo.

This backline is the exact same as the side that won in 2021, with it's distinctive qualities of having metre eaters out of yardage as well as the flare that can finish off attacking opportunities. NSW fell short in that area hard, Fittler will be hoping a return of continuity will spark the Blues. However, where this side falls short for me, is their forward stocks. The absence of Jake Tribojevic is a big blow after his strong defensive efforts so it's up to the newcomers to capitalise on their opportunities. TPJ is an interesting pick considering his explosive temper, when it's used well he's a game breaker, but if QLD get under his skin, then he might be sitting the game in the sheds.

Onto last year's victors in the Sunshine State with Billy Slater returning after a victorious first series as QLD coach. The Maroons have thrived under the radar as the Blues have been overwhelming favourites in the Origin arena, this year is a little difference with a higher expectation on them after last year's shock series victory.

Onto the team selection. Slater has earnt the right to back his judgement in the wake of the series win last year and he's made some big selection calls. Kalyn Ponga and Dane Gagai have been sacrificed for the in-form Reece Walsh and Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow. Ponga's omission was a surprise considering his strong Origin form last year, but after yet another concussion scare on the weekend, Slater is taking no chances. Ben Hunt starts with Harry Grant being the energiser bunny on the bench. Felise Kaufusi's suspension forces a start for Tom Gilbert on the edge which is surprising as he's played in the middle all year for the expansion club, while David Fifita replaces an injured Kurt Capewell. QLD have opted for the power game with Tino, Arrow and Cotter on the bench joining Tom Flegler and Lindsay Collins starting.

Queensland's obvious strength in the forwards is nullified by a perceived weakness in the backs. Their main challenge is keeping Latrell and Tommy at bay for the full 80. There's no doubt that they'll get good consistent early football in the red-zone, so a lot of pressure will be on the QLD edges in defence. Elsewhere, QLD have the strength of having two hookers where the Blues have opted for having Hynes as the Mr Fix It. Grant will be a perfect foil and tire out an already weakened NSW pack.

WHO TO WATCH: Having had to work harder then ever to win his NSW jersey, all pressure is on Penrith's Jarome Luai heading into the Origin opener. Despite a quiet opening to 2023, Luai has bounced back in the last fortnight with match winning efforts against contenders like the Roosters and Broncos. Setting up three tries and scoring one of his own, Luai's slick foot work will create all sorts of problems for QLD's pack of forwards. His combinations from 2021 will also be key to watch in this Origin opener.

Turning attention to QLD, the focus is on the man that beat KP for the 1 jumper. Reece Walsh burst out of the gates with a strong start to 2023. Walsh's attacking creativity cannot be understated with 4 tries and 13 try assists. With so much effort needed to stop DCE and Munster, Walsh could slip through the cracks and cause all sorts of problems, like Ponga did in the 2022 series.

FAVOURITE: NSW are slight favourites with the bookies. Last time Origin was in Adelaide, QLD won 18-14.

TIP: I think this one is contrasting fortunes, both sides have clear positional wins over the other. But the side that is most complete and out-performs the other will come out with the victory. Origin has a knack of bringing out the unexpected, so ANYTHING could happen. On the neutral turf of Adelaide, it has the making of a great Origin opener. Heart says NSW, but my head has a narrow QLD victory. QLD by 2.

PENRITH GET REVENGE IN DEFENSIVE DUEL WITH THE BRONCOS

Six minutes later, the Panthers thought they had their second try of the contest. Cleary broke through and found Moses Leota, but the big forward was laissez-faire and was dislodged of possession by Kurt Capewell. Fortunately, Penrith was able to get some points for their sustained control down the other end when Cleary knocked over a penalty goal for an 8-0 cushion.

It's arguable the Panthers could've led by more at the break with two tries revoked from the Bunker. Brisbane were able to work their way back into the game and five minutes later they thought they had their first try. There was some Penrith defence who just stopped in the line and allowed Madden to go through and link up with Walsh to score. However, the Bunker intervened when they spotted a kneek on

However, five minutes later the Broncos got their reward. A clever cross-field grubber from Reece Walsh found Selwyn Cobbo and the flying winger got his side on the board. However, the Bunker was again in the spotlight for all the wrong reasons. Kotoni Staggs thought he got his side to within four points when he crossed. The Bunker initially cleared interference before Adam Gee intervened and told Ashley Klein "It doesn't look right to me, Ash." That intervention gave Klein a second look and overturned his initial call of interference and enraged the Suncorp Stadium crowd.

The rest of the second half was a slugfest with Penrith dominating possession down the other end of the field and doing enough to win the match. Cleary knocked over a disrespectful field goal at the end of the game to seal a 15-4 verifict

Penrith wasn't at their best and had several tries taken off the board, but they dug deep for each other and earnt a vital win before their Origin bye week. For the Broncos, their attack missed Adam Reynolds significantly, and although Jock Madden tried his heart out, the difference was clear without their general controlling the show.

DRAGONS LEAVE IT LATE IN VICTORY FOR THE AGES

The St George Illawarra Dragons have capped a turbulent week with a last-second victory to defeat the Sydney Roosters 24-22 in Indigenous Round.

Breaking a six-match losing run which saw Anthony Griffin sacked three days before kick-off, the Dragons produced a try for the ages through Mat Feagai to level the scores before recalled centre Zac Lomax slotted the decisive conversion to the delight of 9,007 supporters at Kogarah.

Hitting the front for the first time after Keary (61st minute) fooled his opposite number with a show-and-go, the Dragons returned fire with Jadyn Su'a (72nd minute) getting the green light from the bunker after outmuscling Tedesco close to the line

The Roosters appeared to deliver the knock out blow after Tedesco (75th minute) stripped the ball from Suli's grasp to claim his second of the night, however the Dragons refused to let another match slip away at the death.

Running the ball on the last tackle before Hunt hoisted a bomb into the air, the Dragons managed to bat the ball back to Tyrell Sloan, who seized the moment with a chip kick that bounced into the arms of Feagai (80th minute) to level the scores at 22-all.

Having been dropped for diminishing form, including a below standard goal-kicking rate, Lomax slotted the conversion from close range to give the Dragons a memorable two-point victory.


