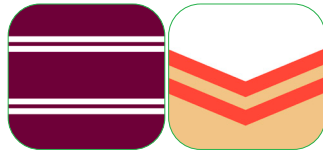

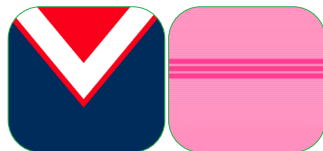

When you think of Thursday night blockbusters, Titans v Tigers isn't necessarily the clash that comes to mind - especially after last year's debacle of a contest in Round 4 - but here we go again, as two sides looking to get back into the winners circle battle it out.

If games were played for 40 minutes instead of 80 minutes, the Gold Coast Titans would be sitting comfortably at the top ladder with some strong performances in the first halves of matches so far. Sadly for them, Rugby League is played over 80 minutes and their inability to replicate their form in the second half of matches has seen the Titans slip to sit 13th on the NRL ladder just five wins from their 13 games this season.

Last weekend, it was another second half fadeout as they took a strong start and squandered it completely, conceding 30 unanswered points to South Sydney, before a late consolation try to go from a 22-16 led to a 46-28 defeat. The Titans started strongly, controlling the game and looking strong through the first forty, but errors then cost them dearly, giving up possession cheaply and defensive lapses added to the hurt.

There's a shake-up for the Titans this week with the loss of key players but the return of others. AJ Brimson is a welcome inclusion, returning at fullback. The positive of his return is outweighed by the big loss of David Fifita who suffered delayed concussion symptoms. They've also lost Chris Randall to suspension after a Hip-Drop tackle last week. Sam Verrills moves back into the starting lineup at hooker for him, whilst Kruiise Leeming is added to the bench.

Sometimes a win-loss record doesn't tell the full story of a team's fortune and that is the story of the Wests Tigers who have had 3 wins from their 12 games but their wins have been important with victories over the Panthers, Dragons and their history making victory over the Cowboys in Round 12.

Off the back of putting 66 points past the Cowboys, the Tigers were coming off the bar, but put in an average performance last weekend against the Raiders. Despite only losing by a point, they never reached any great heights - falling 18-0 behind until a ten-minute period where the Raiders lost a player to the sin bin and they got themselves back into the game. Taking a 19-18 lead late, a piece of foul play from Isaiah Papali'i gave the Raiders a match winning penalty goal and the final score read 19-20, another loss for the merged club.

Wests Tigers coach Tim Sheens has named the same squad that he took into the game against the Raiders. The only change that is expected to be made is the return of Api Korosau to the starting side after starting from the bench last week after playing in Origin 1 just two nights prior to their last match.

WHO TO WATCH: The return of AJ Brimson is a big one for the Titans in the fullback role, where he steadies and control the ship from the back. The x-factor that Brimson tends to bring will be a big benefit for the Gold Coast, having lost David Fifita this week.

The opposing number one, Jahream Bula has made a big impact in just a handful of NRL games so far this season. The Tigers youngster came into the NRL with big wraps and hasn't disappointed with a strong defensive game along with a big impact in attack.

FAVOURITE: A home-field advantage is giving the Titans the favouritism.

MY TIP: This is a game that you could pick 22 times and probably end up with different results of what would happen every time. Neither side has found any true consistency at all this season and the Titans can start fast which could blow the Tigers off the park but the second half is going to be key because if Titans start fast they need to back it up in the second forty because the Tigers won't disappear.

The Titans should just have enough but it will be a tight contest that hinges more on the second half than what happens in the first. Titans by 4.

Canberra celebrates goal (kicker) of the (triple) century

Jarrold Croker will become only the second man to play 300 first grade games for the Canberra Raiders on Friday evening against the New Zealand Warriors.

Celebrating the historic milestone at home after the veteran centre was rested last week, the Canberra Raiders will be looking to continue an impressive run over the past two months that has yielded seven wins from their past eight matches.

Holding off a fast-finishing Tigers side to clinch a 20-19 victory at Campbelltown last Friday, Croker's return at centre sees Nick Cotric revert to the bench and Sebastian Kris come back into the backline in place of Harley Smith-Shields.

Holding a 50 per cent record from 18 meetings against the Warriors during Ricky Stuart's tenure at the club, the Raiders could finish the round as high as third heading into their second bye of the season.

Sitting in seventh position following their biggest victory of the season, the New Zealand Warriors will be looking to play spoilers and record back-to-back wins for the first time in two months.

Dominating the Dolphins in the second half last Saturday to run out 30-8 winners in Auckland, coach Andrew Webster will blood debutant Ali Leiataua in the centres with Rocco Berry ruled out with concussion.

Defying a poor historical precedent in Canberra by winning three of their past five visits, Addin Fonua-Blake and Marcelo Montoya will play their 50th games for the club, while Josh Curran will make his 50th career appearance.

WHO TO WATCH: Set to join exclusive company as only the 48th player in Australian rugby league history to reach 300 first grade appearances, Jarrod Croker will be determined to put the team first in his milestone match. Debuting in 2009 as an 18-year-old before going on to become the highest point-scorer and try-scorer in Raiders history, the 32-year-old centre has fought back from a wretched run with injury in recent years to join Jason Croker as just the second player to reach the triple century for Canberra. Winning his 100th and 200th milestone matches by narrow margins, Croker will be hoping to cap his triple century with a similar result on home soil.

Returning to Canberra for the first time since an emotional departure at the end of last season, Charnze Nicoll-Klokstad will be looking to steal the spotlight on Friday evening. Averaging 187 running metres to go with 44 tackle breaks and two tries in 11 matches to date, the 27-year-old New Zealand representative has re-established himself as a first-choice fullback after two seasons disrupted by injury and falling out of favour in the nation's capital. Providing the Warriors with plenty of punch as a ball runner and support players, look for Nicoll-Klokstad to be heavily involved as the Warriors strive to consolidate a place in the top eight.

FAVOURITE: The Raiders are expected to rise to the occasion and maintain their 70 per cent record in matches contested against the Warriors at GIO Stadium.

MY TIP: Jarrod Croker should get a result befitting his reputation if the Raiders can handle the hype leading into one of the most monumental regular season fixtures in their history. Raiders by 8.

The consistently inconsistent Dolphins come into this game with their form of the last 9 games showing no back-to-back wins or losses (or byes even). Last week they were poor as they went down against a strong Warriors performance, 30-8. So with their recent form suggesting a win here, it's worth noting that Queensland based clubs have been dominating at 4 Pines Park in recent times too. From 2015-2023, they have won 8 of their 10 games at Manly's supposed fortress.

Manly have been producing the much more traditional form of inconsistency, looking solid in their opening 4 games, then got belted by an out of form Panthers outfit, before dominating the Storm, struggling to beat the winless Wests Tigers, then losing 3 straight games, before belting the Raiders in Canberra and then the following week, playing poorly as they lost to a struggling Knights side 28-18.

Manly had their second bye last week, so they will be fresh. Their last bye was in Round 2 and they won at home the week after against the Eels, which is about all the good form they have to hang their hat on coming into this vital clash.

The form of star Manly fullback Tom Trbojevic has been unusually erratic to say the least. He's had 20 handling errors in 10 games, making him one of the worst in the NRL in this category. The rest of his stats are marginally down on his usual performances, but not by any alarming amount. What is noticeable though is that he doesn't look to be as fast or as powerful with his running game. Perhaps he's playing safer to prevent injuries, or maybe, he's carrying a niggling injury. A few weeks ago, he almost immediately gave up on chasing back rower Briton Nikora as he made a break, which was most unusual.

Manly are struggling to break through opposition defensive lines, ranking last for tackle breaks and kick return metres, second last for line breaks and 5th last for post contact metres. This ineffectiveness to

bend the line is a sign that the running game of Manly is not utilizing enough variance or power. This leads automatically to their playmakers, typically Daly Cherry-Evans, to try and engineer scoring opportunities from chance plays, mostly kicks.

The Dolphins have been struggling in defence, ranking as one of the 5 worst sides currently for missed tackles. But they are the best in the NRL when it comes to ball security and 2nd best for Completion rates. This means they will not provide Manly with too many free opportunities to get into good field position, Manly will have to earn it, something they've been struggling to do this year, especially in recent weeks.

WHO TO WATCH: Jamayne Isaako is still worrying teams with his running game, as he is one of the best in the game currently for post contact metres, tackle breaks, line breaks, kick return metres and scoring tries. The Dolphins will be targeting him in their attacking plays and Manly would be wise to kick well away from him all game.

Jeremy Marshall-King will return this weekend where his energy out of dummy half has been a real asset to the Dolphins go-forward all season. He's one of the best in the NRL for dummy half runs and with Manly's forwards working so hard in attack to bend the line, expect him to exploit them when they get tired later in each half.

Daly Cherry-Evans is the biggest star in this game and has an amazing ability to control everything in attack while rarely ever getting shut down. No side can afford to give him too much space.

Haumole Olakau'atu is the big x-factor in the Manly pack and has been solid all season. Don't be surprised if you find he has a license to run wider of the ruck than usual in this match, to try and get himself lined up against young Dolphins half Isaiya Katoa, who has been a target in the Dolphins defensive line, contributing to him having one of the highest missed tackle stats in the game.

FAVOURITE: Manly are starting as favourites, largely due to them being on home soil.

MY TIP: Dolphins to get the win here by 6 points.

Rabbitohs Look to Continue Resurgence Against Defiant Dragons

After following their last-minute victory over the Panthers with demolitions of the Broncos and Storm, the South Sydney Rabbitohs appeared to be the clear cut favourites for the premiership.

Since then however, they have conceded over 32 points per game and gone 1-2 against the Eels, Raiders and Titans. Granted, they have been affected by State of Origin, and their attack has still been among the most threatening in the competition. But defence is the backbone of how premierships are won, and Souths are going to need to improve that area by a significant margin if they are to go one step further than they have in years past.

For the Dragons, their season is over. Sitting in outright last place on the table with an abysmal 3-10 record and multiple off-field dramas causing distractions for a roster that is already among the weakest in the NRL, it's hard to see much light at the end of the tunnel for the joint venture in the short term.

Despite all this, the Dragons were a punchers chance of staging one of the boilovers of the season last week against defending premiers the Panthers. Tied up at 18-all with 10 minutes to go, class ultimately prevailed as Penrith scored a converted try and added a penalty goal late to win by 8, but St George Illawarra vastly exceeded expectations.

Back at Kogarah this week, the Red and White faithful will be hoping for a repeat of the last time they were at home, winning in the literal final seconds against the Roosters.

In team news, Jack de Belin is out for the Dragons after suffering a concussion against Penrith. He is replaced

at lock by Ben Murdoch-Masila, while Zane Musgrove comes in on the bench to round out the 17.

For the Rabbitohs, superstar fullback Latrell Mitchell will sit out another week as he continues to recover from a calf injury, meaning the backline is unchanged from last start against the Titans. Jai Arrow picked up an ankle injury in that game and will be out for 6 weeks, he is replaced at lock by Shaquai Mitchell. Cam Murray is also out with a groin injury. The new faces on the bench for Souths are Jed Cartwright and Siliva Havili.

WHO TO WATCH: Much has been made of his form drop-off in recent years, but since Anthony Griffin was given his marching orders, Zac Lomax has gone from strength to strength and was a huge reason why the Dragons almost pulled off the impossible in Penrith last week. Lomax finished with the stats of 19 runs for 150 metres (60 post-contact), a line-break assist, try-assist, 3 tackle breaks and 12 tackles with none missed. He also leapt right over the top of Panthers centre Izack Tago to score the match-leveilling try. The last time these two sides met, the Dragons raced out to a 32-0 lead within the first 30 minutes, with Lomax having a hand in two of the tries. Against a Souths backline which has struggled to contain their opposite numbers the last few weeks, he will be fancying his chances at another impactful performance on Saturday Afternoon.

For the Rabbitohs, back-rower Keaton Koloamatangi has not missed a trick since returning from injury. In his first game back against the Raiders, he made his usual impact but lacked a bit of the flare that sets him apart from others in his position, but last week against the Titans he was back to his brilliant best. Koloamatangi finished with the stats of 15 runs for 142 metres, a line break, line break assist, try assist, 5 tackle breaks, an offload and 27 tackles for only two misses. He also ran over the top of Jayden Campbell and was too strong for 3 other Titans defenders to score the Rabbitohs first try last Saturday. Before he got injured, Koloamatangi was well within the NSW origin conversations, and Brad Fittler is known for both his left-field forward selections as well as making mass changes after a loss. With another dominant performance on Saturday, who knows, Koloamatangi could be the latest in a long line of Blues debutants.

FAVOURITE: The Rabbitohs are 7.5 point favourites at the time of writing.

MY TIP: The Rabbitohs are missing a whole lot of strength in the front row, while the absence of Latrell Mitchell cannot be understated. Dragons by 2 in another extremely high scoring one.

This forces Jesse Arthurs out of the starting 17, where he has been named as 18th man. Besides from this, the Broncos name a side that has claimed victory over many teams this season.

For the Knights, Tyson Frizell is welcomed back into the side after representing NSW in Origin Game 1, leaving Jack Johns to be dropped from the side. Utility Kurt Mann joins their bench, forcing Lachlan Miller out.

Newcastle came out with a win over the Gold Coast Titans in Round 11 after their Round 10 bye, and they will

be looking to replicate this against Brisbane this coming Saturday. However, the Broncos are one strong side, leading the competition in tackle breaks, post-contact metres, and overall run metres, and have shown their strength through their high win count.

Both teams are chasing milestone wins this weekend, the Knights looking to find their 400th overall club win, whilst the Broncos are looking to claim their 200th win at Suncorp Stadium.

WHO TO WATCH: One of the Broncos most improved players from 2022 to this year (in my opinion) is Jordan Riki. He has scored 5 tries so far this year, already surpassing the total for each year preceding 2023. Riki was an outstanding player for the side against the Sharks last weekend, where he made the most tackles for the Broncos (39). He also ran for 153 metres within 12 runs, which included where he jumped on a loose ball and ran from 80 metres, breaking free, for Kotoni Staggs to finish off the set and score a try. Riki is constantly growing, and I'm looking forward to seeing both his offensive and defensive measures this coming Saturday night.

Deciding to step away from Origin and make himself unavailable for the rest of the series, Kalyn Ponga is an integral player to the Knights side and has made some impressive plays in their recent games. Struggling with concussion injuries during the start of the season, Ponga has been back since Round 8, starting his return on the bench before continuing back into his position as five-eighth, however he played fullback against Manly in R13 and will be playing in number 1 spot this upcoming match. Totalling four try assists along with two tries himself the past month, I'm hoping to see the Knights captain continue to steer the team into a winning side during this back half of the season.

FAVOURITE: Brisbane are heavily favoured to make in three wins in a row this Saturday night.

MY TIP: The Broncos have had an outstanding season so far, dominating particularly in attack, and I cannot see the Knights having any chance to stop them, with Brisbane continuing to build confidence as the year continues. Newcastle have only won one of their past six games against the Broncos at Suncorp Stadium, and I don't see the count going in their favour. Brisbane by 16.

THE PREVIEW with Andrew JACKSON

Things change quickly in rugby league. Take this Saturday's game between the Roosters and Panthers as proof.

It was just four weeks ago that these two sides met, with Penrith running away 48-4 winners on that occasion to send an ominous warning to the rest of the league while exposing serious issues at what was supposed to be a title threat. Instead, the Roosters looked more like a team fighting to avoid the wooden spoon, a far cry from the lofty hopes for the Trent Robinson-led outfit in the past few years.

Fast-forward to Saturday night and there are still question marks over the Tricolours, who were hardly convincing as they scraped home 25-24 against the Bulldogs courtesy of a Luke Keary field goal.

The Panthers, meanwhile, have not dropped a game since that 48-4 victory to cement their spot at the top of the ladder. In that sense, some things are still the same. But all it took was one injury - in this case to halfback Nathan Cleary - to threaten to bring Penrith back to the pack and present the Roosters with a golden opportunity to exact revenge. Jack Cogger had already been named on the interchange bench for his club debut in Penrith's 26-18 win over the Dragons last week but was quickly thrust into the action after Cleary pulled up sore in defence.

It would later be confirmed that the NSW Blues halfback suffered a grade two hamstring tear, meaning Cogger will be steering the ship for the next six weeks. It is not a huge deal for the Panthers, who have a bye in between now and Cleary's return while they were already set to be without their star halfback for next week's trip to North Queensland.

More than anything though, even if they are not favourites to win Saturday's game, the injury to Cleary gifts the Roosters a chance to really make a statement against a competition heavyweight. Even without Cleary, the Panthers are easily the best defensive team in the league and will be tough to crack.

This should be a fairly even contest that will give Penrith fans a good idea of just how the team may handle the Origin period without its captain.

In team news, Cogger joins the starting team as expected to replace Cleary with Jaeman Salmon taking his spot on the bench.

Interestingly, Soni Luke remains out of the side and has instead been named in the reserves.

While Luke has played big minutes at times during the season in NSW Cup to increase his match fitness, Penrith could do with his ball-playing and spark in attack to offset Cleary's absence.

Elsewhere, the Roosters are without Joseph Suaalii (suspended) with Corey Allan moving to the centres while Daniel Tupou is back from a hamstring injury on the wing.

WHO TO WATCH: James Tedesco may have been the standout in last week's close win over the Bulldogs, but another one of the Roosters' stars was surprisingly quiet. Joey Manu has often excelled at the five-eighth position, benefiting from the increased freedom to roam while using his combination of strength and finesse to challenge the opposition defence. But Manu didn't have much of an impact against the Bulldogs. Look for the five-eighth to get heavily involved early, with his game-breaking ability key against a resolute Penrith defence.

With Cleary sidelined, more responsibility is going to fall on halves partner Jarome Luai's shoulders. The Panthers have plenty of experience playing without Cleary now given his involvement with the Blues in State of Origin, while the Penrith halfback also missed time last year with a shoulder injury. But Luai was partnering Sean O'Sullivan for much of last season when Cleary was unavailable. Cogger showed glimpses of his potential last week, finding winger Brian To'o with a clever kick just before halftime and generally having a solid first outing in Panthers colours. The former Bulldogs playmaker will need time though to adjust to playing in first grade again, meaning Luai will need to be more vocal in organizing the attack. That will be particularly important given Apisai Koroisau is no longer at the club, leaving an even bigger void in the spine.

FAVOURITE: No Cleary but the bookmakers are still backing Penrith to get the job done.

MY TIP: If the Panthers are going to get it done without Cleary it will be on the back of their competition-best defence. However, if the Roosters aim up in defence and play with physicality up front, they may just have enough points in them to cause an upset. The Roosters have more to prove at this point and that could be enough to see them put in the better overall effort. More than anything, they need to win this to re-establish themselves as genuine finals threats. Roosters by 8.

Storm desperate for redemption as Hynes presses rep claims

The Melbourne Storm will desperate to atone a 25 point thrashing when they return home to take on the Cronulla Sharks in the lone Sunday match at AAMI Park. Melbourne have had a roller-coaster style season and last week was definitely the descent into chaos. A side known for defensive prowess conceded 45 points to a Cowboys side who conceded 90 points in the last fortnight. They were torn apart on their edges, especially their right which became a heavy target after Justin Olam's failed HIA and Grant Anderson's fill in stint at centre.

However, they lacked significant umph in their forward battle which allowed the Cowboys to secure the KO victory. Against a Cronulla pack who are in a similar position, they'll need to lift to new heights to secure victory. Cam Munster had a poor game by his standards and will be looking for a big one to lead into QLD Origin camp. Elsewhere, expect a big showing from Harry Grant who's been quieter in recent matches as well as fullback Nick Meaney who's firming for that 1 jersey for the year, as we are still awaiting ANY update from Storm HQ in regard to Ryan Papenhuyzen. With wins in this period at a premium, expect the Storm to come out all guns blazing before they have to play without their Origin stars.

With Justin Olam being declared to have suffered a category 1 concussion, he is automatically ruled out of this contest. Grant Anderson again takes his place as he did in the second half last Sunday. Tariq Sims is the new face on the bench.

For Cronulla, it's the tale of what might've been in all of their losses this season. They dominated possession and attacking opportunities, but were unable to dominate a Brisbane side that has been on the up. Completions and defensive miscues were at the heart of their problems on Saturday and coming into what's been a horror venue in recent seasons, it presents a big problem for the Sharks.

The Storm have won five of their past six games against the Sharks, while the Sharks have not won at AAMI Park since 2018. So there up against history that's for sure. However, I look at Nicho Hynes and think he's in for another blinder. With the chance to snap up the NSW 7 jumper, that's a scenario that will see everyone expecting nothing but the best from the Dally M Medallist. Also, Will Kennedy has delivered with a strong year at the back and could help dominate on the edges by creating the extra man on the sweep plays.

Cameron McInnes is named to return from a hand injury in the only likely change for Cronulla. This sends Tom Hazelton back to the reserves.

WHO TO WATCH: Melbourne are a strong side when Harry Grant is running out of hooker and causing the defence problems. Outside of the first month of the season, the running game of Grant has come to the speed of the NSW train network (code for not good). Grant is at a career low of 62 metres a game including 5 games under 50 metres. Look for Grant to get out of dummy half a lot and create the second phase chances against a sometimes vulnerable Sharks middle.

All eyes will be on Nicho Hynes as he presses for a NSW starting spot. After being the sacrificial lamb thrown out to the abattoir in Game 1. Hynes was well contained last start for the first time this season, however that only the second side to effectively shut him down (Dolphins in Magic Round). Hynes' ability to engage the line (second in the NRL with 107 line engages) is something that makes him one of the biggest attacking threats in the game and with the Storm's defence looking as vulnerable as they are. This is one big performance for Hynes in the making.

FAVOURITE: Melbourne are favourites in this contest and with good reason. Their form at AAMI Park has been good (only losing once there in 2023) and have an imposing record against the Sharks as was mentioned.

MY TIP: Going to keep it short and sweet. I think both sides bounce back significantly on their previous performances. Melbourne conceded their highest points total since 2012 (40) and will be out to atone for their defensive disaster, while Cronulla will look for sharper red-zone efficiency. It has the makings of a great contest, but the Melbourne home crowd should be enough to get them home. Storm by 6.

Bulldogs to face rested Eels side to round off Round 15

Canterbury-Bankstown will host the Parramatta on Monday afternoon at Sydney Olympic Park in the final game of the round. With both sides struggling in the bottom half of the ladder, and with only two points separating them, both teams will see this match as a chance for some much needed competition points.

Almost exactly one year ago, the Bulldogs came away with a surprise 34-4 victory against Parramatta in the Queen's Birthday game. Now the King's Birthday, this public holiday fixture will rightfully give Canterbury hope of another upset win, although Bulldogs fans shouldn't expect anything that high-scoring. Of Canterbury's five wins this season, only one has been by a margin of more than four.

Last weekend, the Bulldogs travelled North along the coast to meet the Sydney Roosters in Gosford. They sprung out of the blocks, with the opening two tries of the early afternoon fixture awarded to Canterbury-Bankstown. But the Roosters were quick to strike back, and what followed was an entertaining eighty minutes of football, in which the Bulldogs suffered some bad luck in a heartbreaking 25-24 loss.

Reed Mahoney has been named to play despite suffering a diagnosed concussion on Sunday, with his fate now in the hands of the NRL's 'independent neurological expert'. Jacob Kiraz returns from injury onto the wing, forcing Blake Wilson out of the side. Harrison Edwards has been handed the number 13, moving Chris Patolo to the bench, and Ryan Sutton out.

Parramatta have strung together some much needed back-to-back wins for the second time this season as they aim to rise from the low-middle of the ladder. A strong twenty point win against the Rabbitohs, followed by an eight point win against a low on confidence Cowboys outfit, might just be the catalyst they need to finally unlock their potential this season.

The Eels enjoyed a bye last week, so will head into this game largely rested. It was a far from uneventful bye week for Parramatta though, with their star five-eighth Dylan Brown making headlines for the wrong reasons. He has been named to play for now, as the NRL decides where his situation sits in regard to the No-Fault Stand Down Policy.

Reagan Campbell-Gillard returns from his groin injury in a massive in for Parramatta's forward pack. Andrew Davey is also back, which means Matt Doorey shifts to the bench and Luca Moretti misses out on the 17.

These sides met just under two months ago, back in round seven, with the Eels triumphing 30-4 at home. Will the Bulldogs be able to use their home advantage to turn the tables, or can Parramatta make it two from two against Canterbury-Bankstown in 2023?

WHO TO WATCH: After getting through the hard work of breaking into the NRL, Jayden Okunbor lost all his momentum due to the highly publicised scandal involving him at the beginning of 2020. After spending a few seasons almost exclusively in NSW Cup, Okunbor seems to have found his role in the NRL 13 - and it isn't on the wing. The 26 year old looks to have made a permanent shift into the back row, where he will line up for Canterbury-Bankstown this weekend.

With star NSW Blues halfback Nathan Cleary out for the remainder of Origin, Parramatta number seven Mitchell Moses has emerged as a surprise candidate for the NSW game two squad. Moses has made just one previous appearance for the Blues, although his representative resume also includes just under ten appearances for the Cedars. He will want to make a play for that NSW jersey this weekend.

FAVOURITE: The Eels are the comfortable favourites to record the victory this weekend.

MY TIP: Parramatta have found a little bit of form, but whether that carries through to after their bye round remains to be seen. The Bulldogs have a good chance of a surprise attack - just as they famously did at the same venue on the Queen's Birthday Monday last year against the Eels. Still, I think Parra should win. Eels by 14.

FOGARTY PILOTS RAIDERS HOME IN THRILLER OVER FAST-FINISHING TIGERS

Canberra has held off a fast-finishing Wests Tigers side to scrape home by 20-19 in a thrilling match at Campbelltown Sports Stadium this evening.

The Green Machine dominated the majority of the match, before a Tom Starling Sin Bin led to a dramatic collapse for the Raiders late in the game, which engaged the Tigers into scoring three tries in a stunning five minutes of free-flowing football. Raiders half Jamal Fogarty sealed victory following a controversial late penalty, which saw Tigers backrower Isaiah Papalii penalised for a reckless charge down attempt. The twists continued as the field goal attempt missed but the Raiders were given a late reprieve, when they were awarded a penalty in front. Off the scrum win, NSW spread it left, with Emma Tonegato doing well to create space for Chapman, who brought the lead down to 10.

Those were the last points of the evening for either side, with Queensland doing enough to hold on while also being helped out by numerous errors by their opposition.

As the series is decided on aggregate, NSW will need to win game 2 by nine points or more if they are to retain the shield.
