



# THE PREVIEW

The top of the table Panthers travel to Townsville to take on the Cowboys, who's season is holding on by a thread.

This win would be valuable to both sides, with the Panthers being able to consolidate their number one position on the ladder and the Cowboys looking to inch their way out of the bottom eight.

Ten players total are missing out on this clash due to Origin Game II, so the team depths will be tested, and seeing what they can do under the pressure.

North QLD are fresh off a bye, following arguably their best win of the season so far against the Storm, where they won 45-20. However, they will be missing star players from this match due to Origin duties, Valentine Holmes, Murray Taulagi and Reece Robson, who between them made 428 run metres and 46 tackles.

Jason Taumalolo is returning to the side after suffering a knee injury and a few false starts, bringing some relief to the Cowboys who are missing Valentine Holmes, Reuben Cotter, Murray Taulagi, Jeremiah Nanai and Reece Robson due to Origin. The bench includes Kuliketu Finefeuiaki along with mid-season signing Sam McIntyre, who is making his North QLD club debut on Friday night. To cover the Origin gaps, Jake Granville is starting hooker, Zac Laybutt in the centre and Kyle Feldt returning to the wing after being 18th man last time they played.

Penrith have had an outstanding season so far, sitting in equal first place alongside the Broncos, with the only thing currently setting them apart is the Panthers stellar defence. They most recently defeated the Roosters, and although missing star halfback Nathan Cleary they managed to outplay and outperform the tricolours to make it an easy win, despite two failed HIA's and a 72nd minute sin bin.

Much like the Cowboys, the Panthers are missing a plethora of players due to NSW Blues duties, with Jarome

Luai, Stephen Crichton, Liam Martin, Isaah Yeo and Brian To'o being named. Jaeman Salmon will be playing in the halves alongside Jack Cogger, with Tyrone Peachey in the centre, Thomas Jenkins on the wing and Matthew Eisenhuth as starting prop. Luke Garner plays his first game of NRL since Round 4 on the bench, as well as Zac Hosking returning after being rested in R15. After the results of last weeks Roosters' clash, Moses Leota has been named after failing a HIA and later being deemed a Category 2; Spencer Leniu took an early plea to the judiciary, accepting a monetary fine and no match suspension.

North QLD do not have a good record against Penrith, with the Panthers winning four of their past five matchups. However, the Cowboys have had mostly good performances at home this season, only losing two matches out of seven, those being against the Warriors in Round 3 and Dolphins in Round 6.

This Friday night match will present a challenge to the Cowboys, being one of the lower ranked defensive teams in the competition where they have conceded 351 points, 200 more than the Panthers. Penrith have had excellent defence as of the past five rounds, where they have only conceded seven tries, so North QLD will have to fight a strong defensive wall in order to get some points on the board.

**WHO TO WATCH:** With numerous of the Cowboys attacking players missing out of the game, this is a chance for many players to step up and show their worth. I'm interested to see the efforts of Tom Dearden, who was left out as Maroons 18th man due to the Cowboys club commitments. Dearden has scored 4 tries this year and Friday night will be a chance for him to step up in the team and maybe make some magic.

One of Penrith's best players, Dylan Edwards, has scored eight tries this year, which includes four against Manly in Round 6. With the Panthers missing key members of their spine along with centres, wingers and forwards they are facing the Cowboys with a side lacking depth, and Edwards will have to step up and fill in these gaps. It'll be intriguing to see what he does in attack with a younger side surrounding him.

**FAVOURITE:** Penrith are favoured to take the two competition points and retain their position on the ladder for another week.

**MY TIP:** Both sides are lacking depth due to injury and Origin duties, with the Panthers especially not boasting a side that we are used to watching. I think the Cowboys have a fighting chance to win if they make smart attacking decisions and play with strong defence. In my opinion the game could go either way, but I'm backing the Cowboys to really turn up and give Penrith a good go. Cowboys by 4.

# THE PREVIEW with Adam HUXTABLE

### Rotten Roosters Look to Get Back on Track Against Brave Knights

There have been very few teams in Rugby League that have promised as much and delivered as little as the 2023 Sydney Roosters. Coming off a strong finish in 2022, many tipped that the side would be a top 4 contender with the amount of representative talent in the ranks, with the ability to compete for the premiership determined by how much the promising young talent coming through kicked on.

It seems unfathomable, then, that after 15 rounds of football, the Roosters sit dead last in points per game, and comfortably at that, more than 1 full point per game behind the Bulldogs who sit in 16th for the same metric. For weeks, there has been lingering goodwill left over from the pre-season, with many thinking the Roosters are close to getting it together, however that finally seems to be fading as the Knights start deserved favourites in the matchup this week.

Newcastle themselves have been inconsistent but on the whole impressive so far in 2023. Despite a 5-7-1 record, they have been a chance of winning late in every game bar two that they've played this season, and Adam O'Brien deserves credit for the job he's been able to do so far. Last week, they appeared to be on their way to an unlikely upset against the ladder leading Broncos away from home, leading by 8 points with less than 15 minutes to go, however ultimately the class of Brisbane was too much for Newcastle as they romped home to win by 4.

The challenge now for the Knights is to back up from a game that would've been mentally draining, especially after not getting the reward of the two competition points. Over the last six weeks or so they have no doubt been a better side than the Roosters, and there's no reason they can't win this game in front of their home crowd, but they have struggled backing up their good performances so far this year.

In team news, Greg Marzhev is out for disciplinary reasons, replaced on the wing for the Knights by Enari Tuala. Lachlan Fitzgibbon is back and replaces NSW Blue Tyson Frizell in the back row in the only other change for Newcastle.

For the Roosters, James Tedesco is out on origin duty, meaning Joey Manu will play his first game in a while

in a position he feels comfortable in at fullback. Billy Smith is back in at centre, moving Drew Hutchison to the bench, while Sandon Smith gets his first start in the top grade at halfback. Nat Butcher starts at prop for Queensland Maroon Lindsay Collins, while Sitili Tupouniua moves to the back row and Naufahu Whyte gets a long overdue start at lock. Matt Lodge has been dropped from the bench for Terrell May in other welcome news.

**WHO TO WATCH:** Queensland were eventually vindicated in his non-selection, however long-time origin centre Dane Gagai has done himself no harm with his performances since being left out of the Maroons origin squad. Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow plays a different position week to week so it's hard to compare statistics, but when looking at Gagai's numbers compared to Valentine Holmes, Gagai has more try assists and tackle breaks in less games, a much higher tackle efficiency rate and only average 7 less running metres per game. The game isn't played on paper and obviously stats aren't everything, but it's hard to say Gagai's form so far this season warranted the selection snubbing. He was again great in last week's narrow loss to the Broncos, running for 148 metres and notching up 3-line break assists, 2 try assists, 6 tackle breaks and two offloads. Matched up against another former Queensland legend in Corey Allan, Gagai will be looking forward to the opportunity to put on another impactful performance.

For the Roosters, it is a wonder why it has taken Trent Robinson so long to include young lock Naufahu Whyte in the team. He has been putting up consistently great numbers in the New South Wales cup, averaging a whopping 218 metres per game while also notching up 33 tackle breaks in the 10 matches he's played so far. He also has an extraordinary motor and consistently playing big minutes, reaching 80 in six of those 10 games. In the limited opportunity he's had in first grade so far this season he has also impressed, averaging just under 2.5 run metres per minute, roughly on par with what he's been doing in reserve grade, meaning there's no reason to suggest the strong form won't carry over into the top grade. It will be interesting to see how Trent Robinson plans to use him this week after naming him in the starting lock role; in his only other start against the Warriors earlier in the year he played 40 minutes and ended up with 2 tackle breaks, 109 running metres and 18 tackles for only 1 miss. It will be a tough job on Saturday against a Knights pack spearheaded by Daniel Saifiti with a point to prove after missing origin selection, and it's about time we find out if Whyte is up to the task.

**FAVOURITE:** The Knights are 4.5 point favourites in this one at the time of writing.

**MY TIP:** The changes to the Roosters team list are indeed promising, but I'm going to need to see it from them this season before I can believe it. Knights by 10.

Manly and Parra battle to consolidate respective big wins

Saturday evening in Parramatta sees the Manly Sea Eagles travel west to meet the Parramatta Eels in round 16. It's a battle on the edge of the eight, with Manly (8th) a solitary point ahead of the Eels (9th) on the competition ladder. Manly has a minor advantage heading into this one due to a significant three day longer turnaround, after the Eels took part in Public Holiday football on Monday last round.

Just five days prior to their upcoming meeting with Manly, Parramatta put on a superb display on the King's Birthday to run away with the victory against the Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs. Playing at Olympic Park, King Gutho led from the front, scoring a first half hat-trick to help bag the 34-12 win. The Eels will want to carry their performance over into this game against the Sea Eagles.

The Eels will be without their halfback Mitchell Moses this week, as he heads into NSW Blues camp. Since back-up half Jake Arthur left the club recently, Jake's father Brad has a real conundrum on his hands. On Tuesday, he named regular second row forward Ryan Matterson to partner Daejarn Asi in the halves in his return from injury. Junior Paulo is also missing from the side due to Origin duty, so Ofahiki Ogden will start in the pack. Recent Tigers recruit Joe Ofahengaue joins the bench.

Manly have been dealing with a mixed bag of a season so far, but a massive win last week will have instilled some confidence in the side. Playing the Dolphins at home in Brookvale, Manly charged out of the blocks and never looked back, piling on 58 points in a thrashing. It was the highest score of their season so far, so they'll

want to carry that momentum into this match.

With DCE and Moses lining up as opposing halfbacks in a different game, it's former Eel Jake Arthur who slots in at halfback for Manly. Kaeo Weekes is set to replace Tom Trbojevic at fullback.

Parramatta and Manly have already met this season, back in Round 3. It was the Sea Eagles who came away with the result that time in an incredibly even match, in which both sides crossed the stripe six times. The Eels will be fired up to get one back on Manly this Saturday.

**WHO TO WATCH:** Ryan Matterson is set to return from injury for Parramatta in his first game since round twelve, however it won't be in the second row. With Dylan Brown and Mitch Moses both out of action, Matterson has been named to start his first game at five-eighth in the NRL since May 2019 for the Wests Tigers against the Roosters. He has started in a total of eleven NRL games in the halves, with the majority of those coming for the Roosters in 2016. The big forward's ball playing is set to be tested - so will he be up for the challenge?

Just a month ago Jake Arthur was playing in the blue and gold - now he'll be playing against them as the starting halfback for Manly. Not only will he be playing against his old club - the club whose fan base vehemently rejected him - but he will also be up against his father, Brad Arthur, Eels head coach. It will be just his second first grade appearance for Manly, and he will be under pressure to perform, with his job to replace Queensland Origin half Daly Cherry-Evans certainly a tough one.

**FAVOURITE:** Parramatta are the favourites to use the home crowd to their advantage and leapfrog Manly on ladder.

**MY TIP:** With both sides backing up from confidence-boosting wins, this should be an interesting clash. I think Parramatta have the edge in a close one. Eels by 4.

Points in demand with both teams undermanned

The Wests Tigers and the Melbourne Storm will be eyeing off two valuable competition points on Saturday evening as part of an Origin-impacted fixture at Campbelltown Sports Stadium.

Returning to their Western Suburbs home out of form and without their two primary playmakers, the Wests Tigers will be aiming to defy history in a bid to cause an upset.

Producing a dismal showing last Thursday on the Gold Coast, coach Tim Sheens has been forced to reshape his spine after Apisai Koroisau (jaw) and Luke Brooks (hamstring) both sustained long-term injuries during the 28-12 loss to the Titans.

Naming Starford To'a at five-eighth, Jake Simpkin at starting hooker and debutant Tallyn Da Silva as the interchange utility, Brent Naden and Asu Kepaoa will form a new look centre pairing while Alex Seyfarth joins the bench with Stefano Utoikamanu named to make his New South Wales debut.

Losing their past seven matches at Campbelltown and all three clashes against the Storm at the venue, the Tigers hold a poor record in matches leading into Origin with four wins from 14 fixtures over the past decade.

Rebounding with a big win at home last Sunday, the Melbourne Storm will be looking to consolidate a place in the top four amid a host of closely-ranked rivals set to receive points from the bye this weekend.

Crossing for nine tries in a 54-10 rout against the Sharks at home, the Storm will be without Queensland trio Cameron Munster, Harry Grant and Xavier Coates, along with captain Christian Welch due to a suspension incurred for dangerous contact.

Elevating Jonah Pezet, Bronson Garlick and George Jennings into the starting side with Alec MacDonald and Aaron Pene joining the bench, Tariq Sims will start in place of injured forward Eliesa Katoa in the second-row.

Winning 14 out of 31 matches prior to Origin during Craig Bellamy's two decade tenure at the club, the Storm hold a stronger record without their representative stars in recent seasons with three wins from four matches.

The Tigers and Storm have played twice before in Origin-impacted fixtures; the Storm prevailed 14-12 in 2009, while the Tigers responded with a 10-6 victory in 2012.

**WHO TO WATCH:** Set to take on the responsibility of directing the Tigers across the field as the most experienced genuine playmaker left standing at the club, Saturday evening shapes as a pivotal game in Brandon Wakeham's career. Stringing together six consecutive matches in the halves for the first time in first grade, the 24-year-old Fijian international has shown touches of class in the number six jersey after struggling for opportunities with Canterbury. Out of contract at season's end, a strong showing could see Wakeham solve the club's long-term playmaking woes.

Coming to the Storm with plenty of hype following an acclaimed career spanning more than a decade, Tariq Sims has yet to fulfil expectations in the Victorian capital. Going from a starting forward with NSW to spending time in reserve grade in the space of a year, the 33-year-old has struggled to make an impression in a mere six appearances so far this season. Coming off a club best performance with more than 100 running metres and 20 tackles for the first time in a purple jersey, the Storm will need Sims have a similar impact on Saturday evening.

**FAVOURITE:** The Storm are expected to get the job done off the back of winning their past five matches against the Tigers.

**MY TIP:** With the Tigers naming one of the weakest spines fielded all season, the Storm should have the class to finish on top at the end of 80 minutes. Storm by 18.

Sides look to bounce back from mediocre fortnight

The Cronulla Sharks will be looking for revenge after a horrific trip to Melbourne when they take on the Canterbury Bulldogs at Pointsbet Stadium.

Well, the Sharks were looking like a certain top 4 side a couple of weeks ago. But, a streak of recent losses has put that predicament seemingly on a knives edge. A 54-10 defeat to Melbourne is the last straw on their season, but the question will be how the playing group responds as their minds looked elsewhere for the duration of the 80 minutes. Nicho Hynes' Origin audition was a write-off from the kick-off, but it serves as a good thing for the Sharks as they have his services for what is a crunch match in their season.

Elsewhere, their forwards with the exception of Jack Williams were out enthused by a Storm pack that was itself humiliated by the Cowboys a mere week earlier. Their backs tried hard, however their enthusiastic ball playing came back to bite. Matt Moylan was another to bomb hard, replaced with two minutes to go and in big doubt to keep his spot with Braydon Trindall carving up the NSW Cup. If the Sharks can simplify their game plan and play the football we know that they are capable of, then their season has a chance of getting back on track.

Despite the thumping at the hands of the Storm, coach Craig Fitzgibbon has resisted swinging the selection axe. The only change to his 17 is a forced one (cue Sharks twitter handling the rage of their supporters). Royce Hunt is out after suffering an ankle injury in Round 15 which requires surgery. Rookie Thomas Hazelton comes back into the squad on the bench and Oregon Kaufusi moves into the starting side to partner Braden Hamlin-Uele in the front row.

Canterbury were a play away from beating the Roosters a fortnight ago. However, they took some steps

backward in their game against the Eels. Tevita Pangai Jr ruined any chance of reclaiming his NSW jumper with some horrible defensive reads which led to Parramatta tries. Elsewhere, they were stuck in neutral in attack hoping and praying that Josh Addo-Carr and Matt Burton had answers to an attacking jigsaw that was running out of pieces that fit.

That being said, there were some good signs in Karl Oloapu having his best game in grade, setting up Matt Burton's try with a determined effort and offload. Jacob Preston continues to impress on the edge and has been a real find for Cam Ciraldo. To beat the Sharks, they need to get on top physically early. Every side that's beaten the Sharks this year has won that physical battle early and sustained it throughout the 80 minutes, this signals to me that TPJ will want to bounce back with vengeance.

On the team front. After scoring a hat trick in his return from injury in reserve grade in Round 15, Braidon Burns comes in on the wing for Blues flyer Josh Addo-Carr. Chris Patolo is named to start at prop after being a late inclusion in the run-on side last Monday against the Eels.

**WHO TO WATCH:** All eyes are on Nicho Hynes for one ginormous bounce back game. The unfortunate loser of the NSW halfback battle, Hynes unfortunately blew his opportunity with a disappointing performance last round, but it'll serve as motivation for the 2022 Dally M Medalist. His kicking game was null and void in Melbourne and will be on display at NRL's Bermuda Triangle on Sunday. Watch for Nicho to show Brad Fittler that he made one gigantic mistake.

After arriving on a \$500,000 transfer fee. The expectations on young half Karl Oloapu have been massive and in many ways unfair. However, Oloapu has been slowly warming into the 5/8 jumper, the 18 year old has been impressive in the 3 games starting at 5/8. He's helped out Matt Burton in the kicking game and has been running the football more in the red-zone. Watch for Oloapu to shine in this one.

**FAVOURITE:** Cronulla are heavy favourites for this clash with the Bulldogs. Cronulla won the corresponding match at Shark Park, and the early match at Accor Stadium.

**MY TIP:** Last week was an absolute disaster for the boys from the Shire. Anything less than a rousing bounce back victory will be a painful pill to swallow for Sharks fans. While for Canterbury, they will just want to see effort from their young chargers and a strong showing. Sharks by 18.

# THE PREVIEW

with Lachy MacCORQUODALE

The New South Wales Blues face the daunting prospect of heading to Suncorp Stadium in an attempt to level the series after losing to the Queensland Maroons by eight points in Game I in Adelaide.

It's a venue where the Blues have won just seven times in the 27 Origin games that Suncorp Stadium has hosted since its redevelopment in the early 2000s. This record, combined with the improvements that New South Wales must make before Game II results in this being on of the greatest challenges the state will ever face in the Origin arena.

In Game I, the Blues were stale in attack and poor defensively, hardly the recipe to winning games of football. They dominated possession for large periods throughout the match, yet failed to turn it into points, just like their opponents did so successfully with their creative ad-lib style of footy. Not only this, but the Blues missed a chance in the final 10 minutes when Thomas Flegler was sent to the sin-bin, as Queensland scored two tries against the run of play to run away with a historic victory.

As a result, the Blues have been required to make some changes to their team. Nicho Hynes, Stephen Crichton and Tevita Pangai Junior have been dropped from the 17, whilst Apisai Koroisau and Nathan Cleary miss out with injuries. Their replacements, Reece Robson (debut), Latrell Mitchell, Stefano Utoikamanu (debut), Damien Cook and Mitchell Moses have plenty of work to do before arguably the biggest game of their respective careers. The addition of Moses and Cook in stead for Cleary and Koroisau may force the Blues to move away from their Penrith-centric style of play which could work in their favour.

This is how they've addressed Origin football in recent times, and it has become all too predictable for the Queensland defence, as seen in Game I. The two will bring something different to the Blues style of play, however, it'll be a highly pressurised environment, especially for Moses who has only represented New South Wales on one previous occasion.

Robson and Utoikamanu will make their debuts in the toughest of situations. Robson has been excellent for the Cowboys ever since joining the club in 2020 and Utoikamanu has had his best season to date with the Wests Tigers, averaging 114 run metres per game.

On the Maroon side of things, Queensland will look to emulate the grit and determination that won them the opening game of the series, and with a vocal crowd behind them in Brisbane, they'll be confident they can do so.

The halves pairing of Daly Cherry-Evans and Cameron Munster will thrive in the conditions and will look to close out the series before heading down to Sydney for Game III. They were both influential in Queensland's ability to conjure tries from nothing in Game I and they were the more potent side by a long way. Not only that, but the defence of the Queenslanders was outstanding, with multiple try saving tackles keeping them in the contest.

Queensland would've liked to have taken the same side in, but injuries to Jai Arrow, Selwyn Cobbo and Tom Gilbert have forced their hand. However, their replacements are no schmucks. Moeaki Fotuauka, Xavier Coates and Jeremiah Nanai come into the side, all three with prior Origin experience.

Billy Slater will have his side trying to replicate their performance from last year's decider, a 10-point win, and the best way to do that is to channel the Queensland crowd into their football on the field. It would be more than delight for the Maroons to win a successive series against the Blues in Brisbane.

**WHO TO WATCH:** I think it's worth looking at two players who will go a long way to deciding how this game will turn out. For New South Wales, the inclusion of Latrell Mitchell after his absence from Game I with a calf injury, will be immense. Mitchell has been tremendous for the Rabbitohs this season, scoring nine tries and assisting another nine in 12 appearances. He has been a massive reason behind the success of the 'bunnies' so far this season. It'll be his first Origin appearance since Game III in 2021, an arena which he thrives in. In his seven Origin matches, Mitchell has scored six tries and was very close to being named the player of the series in 2021 with four tries, two try assists and 452 run metres in three games. His electricity on the ball will add another dimension to the Blues attack and will no doubt require plenty of attention from the Queensland defence.

For Queensland, it's none other than Cameron Munster, who started the play for their go-ahead try in the opening game of the series. For the Storm this season, Munster has scored six, assisted eight tries and has featured in every Storm win this season, they haven't won without him this year. The 2020 Wally Lewis Medallist is built for the Origin arena and has that incredible knack of create something out of absolutely nothing. Twice has the five-eighth been named a State of Origin man of the match winner and if Queensland seal the series, he won't be far from another. After missing Game III last year with COVID-19, the 28-year-old will be licking his lips at the prospect of playing in front of a Queensland crowd for the first time in two years.

**FAVOURITE:** Queensland are the favourites for this clash and it's not surprising one bit. Firstly, they knocked off the Blues in Game I despite defending on their own line for majority of the game. Secondly, they have a tremendous record at Suncorp Stadium, having won five of the last six Origin matches at the ground and finally, the Blues have only won one deciding match at the venue since it's redevelopment, and that day they had Andrew Johns wearing the seven.

**TIP:** The Blues face the toughest task in rugby league and whilst the changes may make a difference, facing Queensland in Brisbane with the series on the line is something the state has only succeed at once in the last 20 years. The Queensland crowd will be buzzing and so will the players. Queensland by four points.

## EAGLE ROCK AS MANLY THRASH THE DOLPHINS
