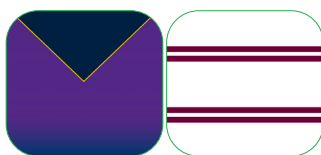

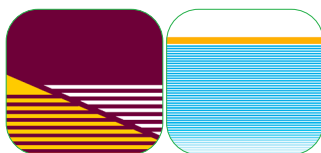

# THE PREVIEW

All eyes of the Rugby League world will be focussed upon the Sunshine Coast Stadium as Queensland and New South Wales battle it out for the Women's State of Origin title on Friday night.

Dominating the Women's interstate challenge, the Queenslanders had to wait until the third year of the current iteration of State Of Origin to take their first victory after New South Wales took victory for the first two editions held at North Sydney Oval.

In the 2020 edition, the Queenslanders were able to take a 24-18 victory after an explosive start to the second half that saw the Maroons quickly go from 6-6 at half time to leading 24-6 with ten minutes to go until full time. The Maroons were given a scare as the NSW Blues came home with a wet sail scoring three tries to close the gap to 24-18 with goal kicking haunting New South Wales with just 1 conversion for the match.

The Queenslanders head into the contest with 14 of their 19-player squad having appeared in the contest last year whilst coach Tahnee Norris has named a potential 5 debutants in her squad. These debutants include teenagers Tiana Raftstrand-Smith and Destiny Brill with Brill set to take on the all-important number 9 role inheriting the role from veteran Brittany Breayley. Just like last year, Ali Brigginsshaw has been named at lock with Nellie Doherty Medallist Tarryn Aitken and Zahara Temara holding onto their halves role.

New South Wales have arguably their best squad in the competition with many key players set to return after

missing the previous origin through injury and other circumstances. The Blues have recalled Maddie Studdon to the halves after being dropped for poor form during the NRLW season last year. The Blues have just two debutants likely to line-up with NRLW stars Kennedy Cherrington and Keeley Davis named in the 17 after being in the extended squad for 2020.

**WHO TO WATCH:** Last year's Nellie Doherty Medallist, Tarryn Aitken continued her superb NRLW form in State of Origin dominating yet again for Queensland. Aitken's form helped the Maroons significantly during their second half blitz which saw Aitken cause all sorts of issues for NSW and it was that performance that Queensland will be looking for this year if Queensland want to go back-to-back.

One of the biggest names in the NRLW, Maddie Studdon has falling well short of expectations that were put upon her at the beginning of the competition. The poor form of the Jillaroo international, saw her dropped from the NSW side for last year's contest. Earning a recall by coach Kylie Hilder, New South Wales will need Maddie Studdon to find form up against a Queensland side that will definitely be on form and is packed with stars.

**FAVOURITE:** Queensland are the favourites for the contest. The form of the Queenslanders coming out of last year's contest as well as playing the game on home soil.

**TIP:** It's going to be a tough game but I'm giving a slight edge to Queensland but only a small edge to the Maroons. The performance of the Queensland halves which is supported by having Ali Brigginsshaw at lock is also an important part of the balance of their side and gives them an extra attacking option. NSW will need to make sure everything goes right in their game and need to commit for the full 70 minutes if they want to win. QLD by 2

Dragons, Warriors face off on a winter's night in Wollongong

The St George Illawarra Dragons will be looking to leave behind a week of off-field turmoil when they host the New Zealand Warriors in Wollongong on Friday evening.

Coming into the opening match of Round 17 stunned by the news of captain Ben Hunt requesting a release due to disillusionment with club management, the St George Illawarra Dragons will be hoping for much needed respite on the playing field.

Chasing consecutive wins for the first time this season following a high-scoring victory over South Sydney prior to last week's bye, interim coach Ryan Carr will welcome back Jack Bird in place of Jayden Hunt, while Jack de Belin will return for his 200th appearance after Josh Kerr was granted an immediate release to join the Dolphins.

The Dragons have won six of their past seven matches at WIN Stadium, along with their past three matches against the Warriors at all venues.

Sitting inside the top eight with back-to-back victories before resting up with a bye last weekend, the New Zealand Warriors will be hoping to overcome a dismal record in the Illawarra.

Winning two out of 13 visits to WIN Stadium dating back to the days of the Steelers, coach Andrew Webster

has named Dylan Walker to make his return in place of suspended forward Mitchell Barnett, while Rocco Berry returns at the expense of Ali Leiataua in the centres.

Interchange forward Josh Curran will play his 50th game for the club.

Positioned within striking distance of the top four while equally close to dropping out of the top eight due to a highly congested ladder, the Warriors will be hoping to post 30 points in three consecutive matches for the first time since 2007 and only the seventh time in the club's history.

**WHO TO WATCH:** If the Dragons are to come away with two competition points at the end of 80 minutes on Friday evening, Tyrell Sloan will need to be at his attacking best with the ball in hand. Starting in the number one jersey in all 14 matches so far this season, the 21-year-old fullback has provided glimmers of hope under challenging circumstances. Crossing for four tries, setting up six and making 44 tackle-breaks, a strong showing from Sloan will be paramount if the Red V are to back up their last performance.

Enjoying a breakout campaign as a starting forward across the ditch, Jackson Ford will have a point to prove in his Illawarra homecoming. Becoming a regular fixture with the Warriors after playing predominantly off the bench in four seasons with the Dragons, the 25-year-old Gerringong junior has provided tremendous value with 96 running metres and 33 tackles on average in 12 starts this season. Benefitting from newfound confidence provided by a change of scenery, Ford will relish the opportunity to get one over his former teammates on Friday evening.

**FAVOURITE:** The Warriors are expected to continue their winning ways at the expense of the besieged joint venture.

**MY TIP:** With their attack gaining in confidence and defence ranking second in the league, the Warriors should post a third consecutive victory on Australian soil for the first time since 2019. Warriors by 12.

### Eels Look To Continue Surge Against Faltering Phins

The Dolphins enjoyed a fairy-tale start to their time in first grade and have been the feel good story of the year, but after 3 losses in their last 4 games, including two floggings, it's fair to ask whether the bubble has burst on the expansion side.

The Eels, so far, have been the exact inverse of the Dolphins. Last year's Grand Finalists were tipped to go close again, but after a poor start results wise it seemed as though Parramatta had perhaps already reached their ceiling. Since losing to the Raiders in Canberra, the Eels have put together four straight wins, three of which were decided by 20+.

Both sides last matchup was against Manly, with the Dolphins losing by 40 and the Eels winning by 30, results which accurately portray their respective form lines. The Dolphins were clearly outmatched from the opening whistle, while the Eels ran up the score in the first half and spent the second strangling Manly out of the contest.

If there is an argument to be made for the Dolphins in this one, it's that they haven't yet lost a home game played outside of Suncorp Stadium, as well as the fact Wayne Bennett is their coach. Expectations for them are the lowest they've been since the pre-season, and it's the exact kind of environment that teams coached by the master thrive in.

In team news, Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow has been named to back up from Origin for the Dolphins, while Brenko Lee (leg) and Tesi Niu (form) are both outs, replaced at centre and on the wing by Valynce Te Whare and Brayden McGrady respectively. Herman Ese'ese starts at prop, while Felise Kaufusi is back from injury and will start in the back row, pushing Connolly Lemuelu to the bench. Ray Stone will start at lock against his former club, while Josh Kerr comes straight in on the bench after switching mid-season from the Dragons.

For the Eels, Mitch Moses and Junior Paulo have been named to back up from Origin, pushing Ryan Matterson and Ofahiki Ogdan back to the bench. Josh Hodgson continues to recover from a neck injury, meaning Brendan Hands remains as the starting hooker, while Luca Moretti and Matt Doorey drop back to the reserves.

**WHO TO WATCH:** After an underwhelming few years with the Broncos and an unsuccessful mis-year switch to the Titans last season, it seemed as though Jamayne Isaako's days as an effective NRL winger were over. So far this season however, much like his team, he has defied all expectation, and currently sits as the top point-scorer in the NRL through 16 rounds and has gotten back to the form that had him talked about as one of the best wingers in the game in 2018, a year that he was unsurprisingly also coached by Wayne Bennett. Along with being the top point-scorer, Isaako is also fourth in the NRL for line-breaks with 18, and in a well beaten side against Manly was still able to get on the outside of his opposite man to score a beauty of a try. It's clear that Isaako is a player who needs quality coaching to thrive, and it's been great to see him doing just that under Wayne Bennett so far this year.

For the Eels, the form of captain Clinton Gutherson is paramount to how they perform as a team, and it isn't a surprise that Parramatta putting a few wins together has coincided with Gutherson playing arguably some of the best football of his career. It isn't just his strong kick returns and deft touch in the attacking 20 that elevate the team, the Eels as a collective always seem to mirror the attitude of their captain, and when he is on the front foot they are nearly impossible to beat. Last week against Manly was a prime example. With the other 3 Eels spine players unavailable for selection, Gutherson came out with a chip on his shoulder against his old team and finished with the numbers of 17 runs for 141 metres, 1 line break, 2 line break assists, 2 try assists, 7 tackle breaks and an offload, as well as a try that came from a barge-over out of dummy half that was a clear case of him just wanting it more than the opposition. When he's on, Gutherson is one of the best players in the game, however when he doesn't play to his full potential it can be disastrous to the Eels due to the huge effect he has on them. This is a clear trap game for Parramatta, and Gutherson will need to bring his A-game once again to ensure they take care of business.

**FAVOURITE:** The Eels are 6.5-point favourites at the time of writing.

**MY TIP:** The Dolphins will come out firing, but the gap in class between the two line-ups is simply too large. Eels by 18.

Consistency key as Melbourne and Manly meet

The Melbourne Storm will host the Manly Sea Eagles in round seventeen action this Saturday night. While Manly are suffering down in lowly 12th on the ladder, Melbourne are enjoying a return to the peak, sitting 3rd - only two points off the Broncos in first.

The Storm have three straight wins well within their sights, having dealt effectively with challenges from the Cronulla Sharks and the Wests Tigers over the past two weeks. Melbourne backed up their thrashing of Cronulla with a confident 28-6 victory over the Tigers at Campbelltown last weekend - the game that will forever be associated with Alex Twal.

Melbourne have three players set to represent the Maroons on the Wednesday prior to this weekend's fixtures, with all of them initially named to back up in club footy on Saturday night. Melbourne fans will be hoping that Cameron Munster, Harry Grant, and Xavier Coates pull through Game 2 without any significant hiccups.

In other team news for the Storm, Justin Olam is back into the side, meaning Marion Seve loses his spot in the 17. Tom Eisenhuth and Christian Welch make up the new front row, with Nelson Asofa-Solomona named at second row, and Tui Kamikamica not named.

Manly failed to build on their 40 point thrashing of The Dolphins two weeks ago when they faced Parramatta

The 2021 Dally M Winger of the Year is a mainstay at Brookvale, and now has over 100 NRL games of experience to his name. The 25 year old is in charge of the kicking duties, and if this game gets close, his conversion success rate will undoubtedly prove to be important.

**FAVOURITE:** The Melbourne Storm are the strong favourites to get the job done in front of their home crowd.

Battle for the South East as Titans hit go on their season

It's a South East Queensland derby as the Brisbane Broncos play host to the Gold Coast Titans in a rare home afternoon game for the Broncos to kick start a triple header on NRL Sunday.

Brisbane have flown highly in season 2023 and after their first bye of the season (yes finally) they are primed for the run into September football. They have played high octane attacking football but have also been quite strong defensively in matches. In recent times, they've had a habit of allowing teams back into the contest with the Warriors and Knights nearly pipping them at certain points in the season. However, with their Origin contingent expected to back up, the Broncos look primed for a statement victory.

To beat the Titans, the home side need to simply play a full 80 minute game as they're opposition this year have simply forgotten to come out of the sheds in the second 40. All jokes aside, they need to win the physical battle and maintain the rage against Tino, Fotuika and Fifita for the duration of the contest. Their backs will get a chance to shine and with Adam Reynolds' productive kicking game, it should be enough to escape with the competition points.

On the team front, all Origin stars will back up and they'll get Selwyn Cobbo back following a few weeks rest after sustaining a hip pointer injury. Kurt Capewell won't join festivities though, he's sidelined with a quad tendon injury. Brendan Piakura gets his chance in the starting back row alongside Jordan Riki. To beat Brisbane, they need to look at the good things they did early in the season. The Titans frustrated their opposition early in the forward battle and went to the sheds with a lead. But, like most half-time leads they've held it went away faster than you can say Tino Fa'asuamaleaui. Along with Fifita, Tino Fa'asuamaleaui and Moeaki Fotuika are named to back up, while AJ Brimson is expected to be good to go after serving as Queensland's 18th man.

**WHO TO WATCH:** On the Broncos, Adam Reynolds has to figure for a strong performance. He has been back to vintage Reynolds which saw him represent the Blues and win the 2014 Grand Final this season setting up 12 tries, forcing 10 drop outs and kicking his side to victory on a number of occasions. Reynolds' control this season has been a big reason for the Broncos' strong start to season 2023 and if that continues with an afternoon of glorious football, then the Broncos look the goods.

Onto the Titans, the focus is going to be on Sam Verrills. His first season in the glitter strip has been one interrupted by injury and poor fortune. But, he was looking back to his best against a Tigers side as he was able to patrol and control the ruck and give a solid platform to Tino and Fotuika to run over what was an improved Tigers pack. Watch for Sammy to dictate terms in this S-E QLD Derby.

**FAVOURITE:** Brisbane are heavy favourites. When these teams last played in the afternoon at Suncorp Stadium, the Titans ran away with their last victory of 2019 downing the big brother 26-18.

**MY TIP:** Brisbane are coming off their first bye of the season feeling refreshed and this should lead to a convincing home victory. With their Origin contingent backing up, it should be a slam dunk for the home side, but I have a feeling the Titans will be keen to atone for their second half fadeaways and keep it close. Brisbane by 4.

Both NSW Origin reps, Cam Murray and Damien Cook, have been named to back up and play.

North QLD had a tough game last week, but they ended up claiming victory over the "baby" Panthers after 88 gruelling minutes. Scott Drinkwater and Tom Dearden majorly stepped up in a game where they were missing five of their star players due to Origin, and they managed to finally outplay Penrith in golden point after an unexpected game.

The Cowboys have named all their Origin reps as reserves for the side, with their starting 17 the same as their win against Penrith last week, aside from a forced change. With Heilum Luki suffering a facial fracture it sees Jack Gosiewski join the bench and --Kulikefu Finefeuiaki start, along with Jason Taumalolo set to start after

making his post-injury comeback from the bench last round. This starting side could change come kick-off but for now it is expected that all Origin players will be rested pending the outcomes from Game II.

Having scored three of his own tries and assisting with seven over the past four games, he is becoming one of the Cowboys' many star players when they produce a good game. Hopefully he will continue his powerful runs and attack into this match on Sunday.

**FAVOURITE:** South Sydney are favoured to get back into the winning circle and add another two points to their count, and allow them to cement a top four position for another round.

**MY TIP:** I feel as if the Rabbitohs are a hot and cold team, and without Mitchell if the Cowboys manage to shut down Walker, they have a better chance at claiming victory. Although the Cowboys are set to be missing a plethora of players due to Origin, they showed last week that they are capable of still stringing together a good game. # THE PREVIEW

with Andrew FERGUSON

The Roosters are in poor form right now, despite their win last week and the fact they've won 2 of their last 3 games.

Looking deeper into that recent success, in Round 14 they beat a 14th placed Bulldogs by just 1 point, 25-24, the week after losing to the second last Dragons 24-22. They were then beaten by a Nathan Cleary depleted Panthers side 30-6. Last weekend they overcame that loss with an 18-16 victory of the 13th placed Newcastle Knights. Even looking through the whole season, there has been very little for the Roosters to crow about.

The Roosters have the worst attack in the NRL and are one of just 3 sides averaging less than 3 tries per game (Wests Tigers and Bulldogs 2.9, Roosters 2.7) and there's a bunch of reasons behind this. They have the worst possession percentage at 47.4%, the next worst is at 48.7% while the Panthers are the best at 53.1%, they are second last for completions at 74.5% with the Sharks at 74.4% performing worse.

The Roosters are one of the worst 4 sides in the areas of line engagement, line breaks, post contact metres, decoy runs, metres gained and errors. They are playing for fast play the balls, but are not shifting the opposition defensive line around enough, nor are their ruck runs getting the opposition defensive line on the back foot. This means they are constantly faced with an intact defensive line which is forcing them to take low percentage plays to try and score points, such as kicks.

Their inability to build pressure and repeat sets means they are also constantly defending, which only serves to further dampen any attacking spark they might have.

The Raiders come into this match having won 7 of their last 9 games, but are 2 wins from their last 4 games,

which suggests their form is still solid, but cooling somewhat. They have been playing very forward-heavy attacks, which has produced the seemingly contradictory matter of having strong post contact metres while also being one of the poorest performing sides when it comes to tackle breaks and line breaks.

The Raiders are also one of the weaker sides when it comes to kick return metres. They do create plenty of second phase play and that will likely be where they build their momentum from and could well be the point of difference between the two outfits.

**WHO TO WATCH:** Corey Horsburgh has been varying his line running more this year, running wider at times and getting plenty of post contact metres and play-the-balls, while also doing some of the heavy lifting in the middle as well. He's been much better at choosing which lines to run and his offloads are more frequent and better delivered, which has in turn seen him playing the best football of his career, giving the Raiders options on the edge of the ruck on both sides, with Elliott Whitehead on the other side.

Joseph Tapine has been powerful in his carries all season thus far, so much so, that he is ranking third in the NRL for post contact metres, averaging 67 per game. Josh Papali'i has also been immense through the middle for the whole season.

Jared Waerea-Hargreaves has been huge all season for the Roosters, for the most part being the Roosters best forward and on many occasions, their best player. He loves a big challenge up front and against the Raiders pack, he will get precisely that.

Victor Radley has all the skills and abilities to be an absolute game winner, but too often this year he has been way below par for his capabilities. He needs to knuckle down, play tough but within the rules, play through the line and he could well play a major role in helping the Roosters turn this ship around.

**FAVOURITE:** The Roosters will come into this game as the favourite, because....reasons?

**MY TIP:** Raiders to win a tough contest in the middle, 24-14

## DRINKWATER MAGIC SPARKS COWBOYS OVER BABY PANTHERS

A Scott Drinkwater try in the second period of Golden Point has sparked the North Queensland Cowboys to a 27-23 victory over an understrength Penrith Panthers to kick start Round 16.

With both sides missing several stars due to Origin commitments, it was the new faces in the sides that were keen to leave a lasting impression on their respective coaches.

Penrith had the early field position starving the Cowboys of possession in the early exchanges. An early penalty against Chad Townsend set Penrith up with the first scoring chance. Tyrone Peachey breathed a sigh of relief for blowing an overlap scoring opportunity when Jack Cogger landed an inch perfect kick. The kick was bobbed by Zac Laybutt and Izack Tago was on the spot to cross for the first try of the contest. Cogger converted for a 6-0 lead.

Off the back of a strong run from Scott Drinkwater, Tom Dearden showed and goed exposing some poor edge defence from Penrith, he was able to link up with Drinkwater to get a much needed try. Townsend's conversion left us level at 6-6. Semi Valemei was at the centre of controversy when his knee came into contact with Sunia Turuva's head and the Panthers rookie left for a HIA. Off the back of ill-discipline, a great shift from Dearden found Laybutt who got a great offload away to Kyle Feldt who found space. Feldt kicked back in-field for Dearden and the home side hit the lead by 12-6. However, it didn't last long thanks to some poor kick defusals from Kyle Feldt. Like clockwork, Penrith were able to connect from a scrum play as Tago crossed for his second try thanks to some great ball-playing from Dylan Edwards and Jaeman Salmon.

The Cowboys strong first half was undone when Valemei lost the ball coming out of yardage, from there, their goal-line defence was paper-thin and Salmon ran right by Townsend to retake the lead and a 16-12 advantage. It was quickly added to in the shadow of half-time when Tom Jenkins crossed for his first NRL try after strong lead-up work from Salmon and Edwards for an 8 point lead at the change of ends.

After a strong start to the second half which saw Cogger land a penalty goal for a 10 point lead. Penrith made a foolish mistake and invited the home side into attacking field position and the first try for the second half. Scott Sorensen was pinned for a late shot on Townsend and it was the young rookie Kulikefu Finefeuiaki crashing over off a good short ball from Jake Granville. This reduced the margin to 4 points. More poor discipline and handling let the Cowboys level the scores when Dearden and Laybutt combined with Feldt to cross in the corner to tie it up at 22-22. Both sides engaged in trying to kick their side home but a determined Penrith effort appeared to come back to bite. A charge down saw the ball scatter when Sorensen was ruled to have knocked on. On the ensuing set, Townsend kicked the field goal with 90 seconds remaining. A fourth try eluded Will Warbrick when he knocked on in-goal but it was only a short wait for that fourth one to come when the Tigers defence was torn apart by the Melbourne right-side attack and Warbrick strolled over for his fourth.

The Storm then finally put their left side over when the ball was missed by George Jennings initially but like a seagull on a chip, Kane Bradley was able to pounce on it first and get over in the corner. Nick Meaney finally got his best strike on the conversion attempt from out wide to put the score to 28-6.

Neither side could manage a final try and the Storm held onto a hard-fought victory.
