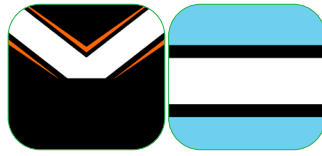

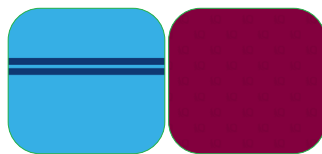

A complete mismatch is on the cards as the Cronulla Sharks face the Wests Tigers in what shapes, at least on paper, as one-way traffic on Thursday night.

Cronulla is coming off a dominant 52-16 win over the Dragons and what would have impressed coach Craig Fitzgibbon the most is the way his side really kicked on in the second half after an unconvincing start to the game.

Equally pleasing would have been his team's ball-handling, with the Sharks completing 89 per cent of sets and making just five errors even as they cruised to a comfortable victory.

It would have been all too easy - and forgivable in a lot of ways - for Cronulla to have a few lapses in concentration or even push an unnecessary pass or two.

The Sharks will need to have a similar attitude on Thursday as they prepare to face a Tigers team coming off the back of a 74-0 drubbing at the hands of the Cowboys.

The only major change for Cronulla sees the suspended Dale Finucane drop out with Cameron McInnes taking his place at lock while Jesse Colquhoun joins the bench.

As for the Tigers, David Nofoaluma and Brent Naden are both sidelined through injury while Alex Twal has been wiped out one game for a hip-drop tackle.

Tommy Talau and Asu Kepaoa are the new names in the backline while Aitasi James joins the bench.

Elsewhere, Shawn Blore has moved back to the bench with Fonua Pole starting at lock for John Bateman, who shifts to the edge presumably in an adjustment to shore up the team's defence.

It was a change that certainly needed to be made after they were torn apart out wide last week against a ruthless Cowboys team that avenged a 66-18 drubbing at the hands of the Tigers earlier in the season.

WHO TO WATCH. If the Tigers are any hope of causing an upset on Thursday they need to first match the Sharks up front and John Bateman is a tone-setter in that regard. Moving Bateman back to the edge should help address some of the defensive deficiencies that saw the Tigers get carved up last week. With the ball in hand though, Bateman does offer variety and an offloading threat that makes him hard to defend. The only problem, however, is when his teammates don't know what is coming or aren't pushing up in support to make the most of his off-the-cuff style. Either way, the Tigers need someone to be a leader in the wake of last Saturday's shocker and Bateman looms at the likeliest option to fill that void.

Given his name has been in the headlines all week, this is just yet another chance for Nicho Hynes to show the Blues what they are missing. Sure, playing the Maroons in the State of Origin arena is a completely different challenge and it's not like there's another game in the series for Hynes to push for selection in. But there is little doubting Hynes was hard done by to not get another look-in even with Nathan Cleary and Jarome Luai now out of the picture. Hynes tore apart the Dragons last week, finishing with three try assists, just as many linebreak assists and a try. If the Tigers don't aim up in defence they could be in for another long night.

FAVOURITE. The Sharks are obviously well-backed to only add to the Tigers' woes.

MY TIP: This one will blow out eventually but complacency may keep it close early at least, with the Sharks leaving it until the second half to really gain ascendancy. Sharks by 28.

The Gong is about to get smashed as the sole focus of Friday night Rugby League heads to Wollongong where the hapless Dragons have to play host to the Canberra Raiders.

Sitting down in 16th spot, The Dragons have had a season to totally forget yet again with poor performances mixing with off-field drama to cause the perfect storm of chaos for the Red 'V'. The season has been a total write-off and blame cannot be put on the reason Ben Hunt dramas because the issues have been around long before then. The Dragons have managed just four wins this season although picking up the scalps of the Roosters and Souths.

Last weekend, things looked promising for the Dragons with a fast start against the Sharks and holding an early lead but they folded quicker than Superman on laundry day. The collapse for the Dragons wasn't at all shocking but how soft their defence was very frightening indeed as they ultimately fell to a very heavy 52-16 defeat.

The Dragons have lost Ben Hunt to Origin selection meaning their woes could continue significantly as has the loss of fullback Tyrell Sloan. Paul Turner comes in for his first game of the season. The halves picture sees Jayden Sullivan in the 7 with Talatau Aione in the 6.

The Canberra Raiders have delivered a season that has sort of become expected of them as they get further

into the Ricky Stuart era, blinding brilliance then horrible inconsistencies as they sit fifth just two points behind the top two but have a significantly worse point differential than the rest of the top 8.

Last weekend, the Raiders narrowly scraped past the Gold Coast Titans with a 26-22 win at home. The Green Machine started fast taking a 6-0 inside 3 minutes before extending it to 12-0 after 17 minutes. The Titans hit back but the Raiders were strong enough to survive a late scare to hold on.

The Raiders have had a mixed outcome with Origin selection with Corey Horsburgh selected for Queensland in Game 3 but there is a boost with Hudson Young's non-selection for NSW. Horsburgh's absence sees Ata Mariota move from prop to lock with Emre Guler added to the starting side.

WHO TO WATCH: Whilst most of the team has been disappointing for the Dragons this season, one player who has not has been Jacob Liddle. The Dragons no.9 has provided strong service out of dummy half and can take on more of a leadership role in the absence of Ben Hunt.

Raiders half-back Jamal Fogarty took his time to find his feet in Canberra both in 2022 and to start 2023 but he has quickly become the shining light for the Raiders. His patience and poise in attack has been strong for the Raiders. This will help the Raiders go a long way.

FAVOURITE: The Raiders are heavy Favourites and understandably so given the two sides differing form.

MY TIP: It's hard to go past the Raiders winning by a margin. The Dragons have been woeful and losing their best player aren't signs of winning next week. The Raiders have too much punch for the Dragons who could see themselves setting up camp behind their tryline. Raiders by 24.

Many men (wish to celebrate milestones)

Saturday evening will be a night of many milestones when the Parramatta Eels and the New Zealand Warriors face off at Commbank Stadium.

Returning home rejuvenated following five wins in succession prior to last week's bye, the Parramatta Eels will have their depth tested with Mitchell Moses, Reagan Campbell-Gillard and Clinton Gutherson all selected for the third State of Origin fixture.

Regaining the services of demoted NSW representative Junior Paulo up front, Daejarn Asi and Ryan Matterson will reunite in the halves with Isaac Lumelume returning to the backline for the first time since the opening round as part of a backline reshuffle which sees Sean Russell start at fullback.

Second-rower Shaun Lane will make his return from injury off the bench after missing the past two months with a hamstring injury.

Fan favourite Maika Sivo will make his 100th appearance in first grade, while Will Penisini will play his 50th game for the club.

Holding an above average record against the Warriors throughout Brad Arthur's tenure with seven wins from 12 clashes, the Eels have thrived in Origin-affected matches with 14 wins from 16 fixtures during the same period.

Determined to bounce back from a disappointing last-start performance on home soil, the New Zealand Warriors will cross the ditch in pursuit of their first Origin-affected win in four years.

Falling away late during last Friday's 28-6 loss to South Sydney, coach Andrew Webster will have his unchanged team primed to perform with four players celebrating major milestones on Saturday evening.

Shaun Johnson will become the fifth player to reach 200 first grade appearances for the Warriors, while Dylan Walker, Addin Fonua-Blake and Wayde Egan will play their 200th, 150th, and 100th career games respectively.

The Warriors have lost their past four matches against the Eels and have never won at Commbank Stadium from three previous visits.

WHO TO WATCH: Tasked with enormous responsibility as the side's primary playmaker on Saturday evening, the Eels will need Daejarn Asi to make a statement in order to stand a chance of going six in a row for the first time in six years. Reuniting with Ryan Matterson once again following a dominant performance over Manly prior to the second Origin, the 22-year-old playmaker has produced four try-assists, four repeat sets and two line-breaks in three appearances with the blue and golds. Set to remain in first grade for an extended period with Dylan Brown sidelined for another month, a strong showing from Asi will go a long way towards solidifying the Eels place in the top eight along with his own place in the team.

Joining the likes of Stacey Jones, Simon Mannering, Manu Vatuvei and Ben Matulino in reaching 200 first grade appearances for the club, Warriors halfback Shaun Johnson will be determined to cap his latest career milestone with a win. Producing outstanding form this season with 16 try-assists, 14 forced restarts and a 79% goal kicking record, the 32-year-old halfback has been instrumental in elevating the Warriors to their best season in five years.

FAVOURITE: The Warriors are expected to get the better of the understrength Eels.

MY TIP: The Warriors will never have a better chance to beat the Eels given the absence of Clinton Gutherson and Mitchell Moses.

For context:

- Clinton Gutherson has played 136 out of a possible 137 matches since returning from injury in the early rounds of the 2018 season.
- Mitchell Moses has played 145 out of a possible 158 matches since joining Parramatta midway through 2017.
- The Eels lost on the one occasion both players didn't play in the final round of the 2021 season.

If the Warriors are serious about playing finals football in 2023, they should capitalise on the Eels missing both their first-choice fullback and halfback for only the second time in six seasons. Warriors by 13.

Understrength Rabbitohs Look to Continue Building Against Underperforming Bulldogs

After losing four out of their last five matches and conceding a shocking 32.8 points per game in that stretch, many were questioning whether the Rabbitohs were truly the genuine contenders they were pencilled in as after a strong start to the year. There's still a long way to go before we truly find out the answer to that question, but a convincing win against an in-form Warriors side away from home in terrible conditions has no doubt eased some concerns that had started creeping in for Souths fans. It's a movie we've seen before with the Rabbitohs. Currently they are sitting at 10-7, the exact same record they had after 17 games last year where they were unable to string together a run of wins to make the top four.

With many key players appearing to have found their best form or something close to it, the Rabbitohs are primed to climb into the four and guarantee themselves a spot in at least week two of the finals and potentially a home prelim. Their run home involves five games against bottom eight sides and the remaining two against the Broncos and Sharks, two sides they have already beaten this season. With Latrell nearing a return, the ceiling of this side is sky high, but they first need to overcome a plethora of outs against the struggling Bulldogs.

Actually, simply calling the Bulldogs "struggling" may be the understatement of the century. This was a side that was meant to be on the up this season after supposedly hitting rock bottom in the Barrett era. Their 66-point beatdown at the hands of the Knights, a team they were equal with on wins before kick-off, was made even more embarrassing by the fact they were at full strength apart from Kikau and Luke Thompson. Their "defence" would've embarrassed a volunteer coach of an under 16s side, and it's been that way for some time.

The fact their coach came in as an apparent defensive specialist makes these performances all the more concerning, never-mind the fact he signed a five-year contract. Nothing the Dogs have shown in the past month suggests they're capable of being competitive in a first-grade game, but the unavailability of several Souths stars gives them a much better chance of doing so.

Canterbury have made just three unforced changes, with Ciraldo dropping Hayze Perham, Khaled Rajab and Paul Alamoti, while Josh Addo-Carr is out on origin duty. Jake Averillo moves to fullback, Jackson Topine into the centres and new recruit Toby Sexton has been parachuted into the halfback role.

For the Rabbitohs, Isaiah Tass returns at centre, pushing Tyrone Munro to the wing and Richie Kenner out of the side. Dean Hawkins will fill NSW five-eighth Cody Walker's shoes, while Peter Mamouzelos replaces Damien Cook and will share the hooking role with Siliva Havili. Koloamatangi and Murray are out for Origin, replaced in the back row and at lock by Ben Lovett and Shaq Mitchell respectively. Tallis Duncan is the new face on the bench.

If the Bulldogs can't at least keep it close with this Souths side, things are even worse than any of us can currently imagine.

WHO TO WATCH: Lachlan Ilias is often a beacon for criticism among Rabbitohs fans and sometimes deservedly so. Against the Cowboys he played probably the worst game of his career, so it was nice to see him back it up with one of his best against the Warriors. It looked and felt as if Cody Walker playing more of a game managing role, and doing so effectively, took some of the pressure off Ilias and allowed him to chime in when necessary, without trying to force plays that weren't on. He was able to put his stamp on the game in the 66th minute with a great kick close to the line to set up Tyrone Munro for his first ever try to just about put the match beyond doubt. With so many outs for Souths, it'll be Ilias' responsibility to step up and steer his side home against a poor Bulldogs outfit.

For the Bulldogs, it's hard to find any silver linings coming off a 66-point shoutout loss against the 2023 Newcastle Knights, but Jacob Preston was one of the only blokes out there who had something resembling a dig in the demolition. He has been a superb find for Canterbury this season, providing them with a consistently reliable attacking threat close to the line whilst also being solid defensively. Last week, he made 43 tackles (just about equalling the tally for the rest of the team combined) and missed just 1, while also mustering a tackle break. Coming up against a Souths side with uncertainty in their defensive combinations, Preston will again be one of the Dogs top attacking options, while a strong defensive performance from the rookie will be one of the few things you can rely on.

FAVOURITE: Souths are 6-point favourites in this one at the time of writing.

MY TIP: You just can't tip the Bulldogs against anyone at the moment. Souths by 20.

Finals hopefuls in a battle for survival

The Gold Coast Titans will be looking to rebound after a controversial narrow loss to Canberra when they take on the Dolphins to conclude the final Origin affected round of the 2023 season.

For Gold Coast, the Jim Lenihan era has begun rather promisingly with a win over big brother the Broncos, before a narrow loss to Canberra last week which they concede they should've won. However, it'll be up to the playing group to see how they deal with the challenge as they look to atone for their 26-0 blown lead against this opposition earlier in the season.

To beat the Dolphins, it's about a full 80 minute performance for the Titans. They've competed for periods of matches this season, but have rarely consistently completed a full 80 performance. Some of the unsung members of their forward pack will need to consistently lift as well in the absence of some of their senior players to Origin duty. If they can give their speedy backs room to move against the Dolphins, then their season will continue to be alive.

The challenge grows harder with the loss of three big men from their pack in Tino Fa'asuamaleaui, David Fifita and Mo Fotuauka. These men have been the big achievers up front this season and will be sorely missed. The loss of AJ Brimson is offset somewhat by the return of energiser bunny Jayden Campbell to the fullback jumper. Winger Phil Sami returns after being a late withdrawal from the Raiders game with a hamstring complaint so Jojo Fifita goes to the bench. Klese Haas, Iszac Fa'asuamaleaui and Jaimin Jolliffe join the starting pack in place of Origin stars Tino Fa'asuamaleaui, Moeaki Fotuauka and David Fifita. PNG forward Jacob Alick has been named to make his NRL debut off the bench.

For the Dolphins, they are starting to hit the wall as far as the weekly grind of NRL football. Two big thrashings followed by a somewhat spirited showing in the Battle of Brisbane has their season in survival mode.

On 18 points and only one further bye in play, wins are going to have to come at a premium if they want to collect a maiden finals birth this season. They need to forget about the last few weeks and focus back to the good football they were playing at the start of 2023. That saw the Dolphins open up to a hot start and were very much in the finals picture.

If they can get back to that explosive style of footy without some of their more senior players, it'll make their return a lot smoother and a clearer path to finals footy and it starts with a Sunday victory.

Euan Aitken moves to the centres with Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow on Origin duty and Kodi Nikorima lines up at fullback again as he did in Round 18. Hooker Jeremy Marshall-King has been named despite battling an ongoing shoulder problem but veteran forward Felise Kaufusi (head knock) is out

Jarrold Wallace and Anthony Milford both make their return from suspension on the bench while Herman Ese'eese moves into the starting side.

WHO TO WATCH: It's now or never for Tanah Boyd. With rumours rumbling of Ben Hunt arriving in Surfers Paradise next year and with the club already clearing Toby Sexton from their books, it's clear that Boyd needs to step up if he's to feature in Des Hasler's 2024 plans. Boyd is a solid playmaker and has had a good season, but needs to be more effective in his kicking game and pin the Dolphins back to make it easier for their new look forward pack to shine.

In the Dolphins camp, the focus similarly goes onto Isaiya Katoa. After a good start to his rookie season, it appears he's hit a wall in his first season in the big time. After being toyed around at hooker and the halves a fortnight ago, Katoa seemed to struggle to make an impact with his veteran halves partner SOS returning. Look for Katoa to prove us wrong and revitalise the Dolphins season.

FAVOURITE: Titans open up as slight favourites.

MY TIP: Even with the lack of stars playing due to the Titans heavy Origin commitments. I still expect them to get the chocolates in this one. After proving they aren't here to make up the numbers in the wake of Justin Holbrook's dismissal, they'll be looking to try and solidify a top 8 birth. The Dolphins will try all afternoon long, but will just fall short in a fun Sunday arvo game. Titans by 6.

The Queensland Maroons already won the 2023 series with a Game II 32-6 victory against the New South Wales Blues at Suncorp Stadium and are now pursuing a clean sweep for the first time in 13 years.

The Maroons have claimed victory at Adelaide Oval and Suncorp Stadium during this 2023 series and are now looking upon securing another win at the Blues' home ground, Accor Stadium. NSW hold the record for wins at Accor Stadium, with a total of 19 wins out of 30 games. However, the Blues have a lot to work on if they wish to avoid a QLD whitewash and claim a win at their home ground.

Throughout the series the Blues have lacked any coherent attack, and lost several battles through the middle, where the Maroons just continued to decimate. During both Game I and Game II NSW won the battle of possession, however they failed to turn this into points which is one of most important parts of the game. Overall, the Blues had poor execution, and could not come up with creative plays to outsmart the Queensland side who continued to show up with smart plays and strong defence.

The NSW side have made several changes in order to attempt to repair these deficits they possess, which includes two debutants along with four Origin-arena recalls. Jarome Luai, Hudson Young, Stefano Utoikamanu, Junior Paulo and Tyson Frizell who all played in Game II have been dropped from the team, whilst Payne Haas and Tom Trbojevic were unable to be selected due to respective ankle and pectoral injuries. Cody Walker comes in at five-eighth, Bradman Best (debut) at left centre with Jake Trbojevic, Reagan Campbell-Gillard and Keaon Koloamatangi (debut) joining the forward pack. Clint Gutherson and Jacob Saifiti make their Origin return through the bench, along with Scott Drinkwater and Spencer Leniu joining the squad as 18th and 19th man.

In total, the Blues have made a total of seven player changes along with several positional changes, with some players moved to the starting side after playing off the bench in Game II, including the swap of Damien Cook and Reece Robson (hooker) along with Cameron Murray and Isaac Yeo (lock).

Cody Walker and Mitchell Moses are the third halves pairing that the Blues have utilised this series, with Walker making his fifth Origin appearance after most recently playing in all 2020 games. The NSW side has lacked execution and attack, and Fittler is hoping that with the inclusion of Walker there may be the opportunity for better execution and more tries for his side.

On the other side, the QLD Maroons have made minimal changes, with their changes pushed due to suspension and injury. With Reece Walsh unavailable for selection due to suspension, Titans fullback AJ Brimson will take his place after being 18th man for Game II. Corey Horsburgh is also making his Origin debut

off the bench, after Thomas Flegler suffered a foot injury and is unable to play. Tom Dearden rejoins the squad as 18th man, along with J'maine Hoggood as 19th man, marking his first extended Maroons squad selection. QLD are unchanged besides these inclusions, along with Harry Grant starting as hooker and Ben Hunt playing off the bench.

The spine of QLD has excelled all series, and they will want to continue this excellence into the third game, even though they are playing with Brimson at fullback instead Walsh. For QLD, the series isn't over even though they will already be lifting the shield at the end of the night of Game III. They will be looking to emulate the passion and determination that they have shown during the first two games and continue to improve upon their performance and rise to an even higher level of footy. Billy Slater was a part of the team who claimed victory against the NSW Blues in a series clean sweep in 2010, and he is now part of a new history with QLD where he has currently won four of the five games coached and is looking to take his first Origin clean sweep series as Maroons head coach.

WHO TO WATCH: Damien Cook was poorly utilised during the second game and was not given the opportunity to perform in the areas he excels at at club footy level, and I really think that playing back in the hooker role will be at advantage for both him and the Blues. At club level Cook is an extremely good defender, leading the competition with 749 tackles, and through this and his speed it will be an asset to the NSW side, where he is coming up against several fast and smart players in the QLD side. He was also the Blues' sole try scorer in Game II, meaning that he adds a level of execution and playing flare, that alongside his Souths player, Cody Walker, can lead to more points on the board.

Captaining the Maroons side since 2019, veteran halfback, Daly Cherry-Evans, has made such an impact to the QLD team, and continues to put on immense performances throughout the past few series'. Throughout the 2023 NRL season, DCE has scored 7 tries and made 11 try assists along with 2 try assists within the Origin arena. Cherry-Evans is playing some of his best footy at both club and representative level, where he continues to make impressive plays in both attack and defence, with one that won't be forgotten by maroons anytime soon, where he chased down Stephen Crichton in Origin II and denied the Blues on a try. DCE is an important part of the Maroons team, and it will be exciting to see his leadership and playing skills on show, where QLD have the chance to make it a 3-0 series.

FAVOURITE: Queensland are favoured to win this game to make it a clean series sweep and based on their performance during the first two games it doesn't come as a surprise. The Maroons have managed to outplay the Blues in attack, and continuously defend their line right until the end.

TIP: The battered and bruised Blues are trying to find a sliver of hope to stop the Maroons from making the 2023 series a clean sweep, but I just don't think they have it in them to defeat the QLD side. The Maroons have a strong side with a cohesive spine who have trained and played alongside each other for majority of the 2023 series, they are determinate, passionate and not content with a 2-1 series win. They are looking to create a special opportunity, to make it a clean series sweep, something that doesn't come all too often. Queensland by 14.

SHARKS RUTHLESS AS THEY PUNISH DISMAL DRAGONS

A brutal second-half massacre has given the Cronulla Sharks a convincing 52-16 victory over arch-rivals St George Illawarra to reclaim the Monty Porter Cup.

It was going to be a tough and strong affair despite these sides' places on the competition ladder. An early dual was in the offerings when St George Illawarra was strong in their line speed and forced an early error. This led to the opening try of the first half when Jacob Liddle summed up the situation perfectly and found a rampaging Mikaele Ravalawa to give his side an early 6-0 advantage.

However, some poor discipline by the visitors gave the Sharks a sniff and off the back of some brilliant set play. Nicho Hynes slid through some paper-thin defence and into a yawning gap for the equalising try. After the early strikes, the game stabilised for a moment before the Dragons retook the lead. Tautau Moga capitalised on some ball playing from Ben Hunt and Tyrell Sloan who reached out to score and beat the cover tacklers for a 10-6 lead.

However, it was all the Sharks in the final 15 minutes of the first half, crossing for three tries for a commanding half-time lead. In the final fifteen minutes, a short ball from Hynes saw Briton Nikora cross for the home side and with the conversion from the 2022 Dally M Medallist, the Sharks retook the lead and didn't look back. Seven minutes later, a clever cross-field kick from Matt Moylan found a flying Jesse Ramien who was cleared for takeoff and gave the Sharks a two-possession game. In the shadows of the break, cult hero Tom Hazelton crashed over after a wave of Sharks possession and it meant Cronulla's margin ballooned to 14 points.

The second half began in comedic fashion with the Dragons failing to find touch on the first penalty of the half. However, the Sharks were lackadaisical in their attacking style with many kicks leading to poor end of sets. This came back to bite when Ben Hunt and Tyrell Sloan combined to send the young fullback on a 90-metre solo effort to get the Dragons back into the contest.

That would be as close as the Dragons got with the Sharks turning on the accelerator racing in four second-half tries to all but blow the visitors out of the contest. Five minutes after Sloan's individual effort, the eagerness from the Dragons cost them when Moylan and Wade Graham to find Ronaldo Multalo who got it down spectacularly in the corner. Three minutes later, Will Kennedy tore through some abysmal edge defence who fooled Sloan by having Hynes on the inside but Kennedy is too smart to cross.

It was déjà vu for Melbourne early in the second half when they received another penalty courtesy of Jarome Luai to provide Meaney with another gift two points which was gladly cashed in.

Penrith then pulled away when Tago crashed through the Storm defence to score his second try and was then involved in another try minutes later when he got a desperate kick away on the last. The ball was charged upon by interchange forward Zac Hosking, who picked up the scraps to score next to the posts to give the Panthers a commanding lead.

Jarome Luai then put a cherry on top late, when he bounced away from two Storm would be defenders to deliver a clever kick in goal to find a flying Brian To'o who scored to give his side a huge confidence boost as they head into next week's bye round.

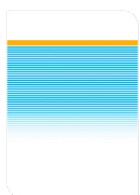

RAIDERS HOLD OUT TENACIOUS TITANS

Canberra fired back at 50 minutes with a bizarre passage of play. An offload from Nat Butcher allowed James Tedesco (32nd minute) to put the visitors back in front, however the lead was short lived as Cherry-Evans (37th minute) intercepted a pass from Keary to send the Sea Eagles to the sheds up 12-10.

Taking advantage of a Manly error shortly after the resumption, Manu (45th minute) powered his way to the line to put the visitor back in front.

In a dogged second half which saw points hard to come by for both teams, Josh Schuster delivered a terrific short pass that saw Ben Trbojevic (70th minute) level the scores at 16-all; Garrick's successful conversion proved decisive as the home side took a two-point lead into the final stages.

The Roosters managed to go the length of the field and force an error to have a final chance of snatching victory, however the Sea Eagles stood tall with one-time Rooster Tuipulotu holding his nerve on the final play to clinch the 18-16 result.
