Tigers Playing for Pride as Knights Look To Continue Strong Form

The Newcastle Knights and Wests Tigers are both around the bottom of the table and will almost certainly not feature in finals football, but their recent form could not be more different, with the Tigers coming off two beltings in a row, including an NRL era record, while the Knights last game before their bye was among their best in at least a decade, hammering the Bulldogs by 66-points.

When looking at the Knights playing roster, it's easy to understand why they're sitting in 14th place with a record of 6-9-1, but the way they've played so far this season has been so much better than their win total would suggest. They've endured losses by 6 or less against top eight calibre opposition such as the Panthers, Broncos and Cowboys and could've easily jagged another couple of wins against the Sea Eagles and Warriors earlier in the year if things had gone their way. Being involved in the demolition job against Canterbury will do a lot of their inexperienced players a world of good, and there is no doubt that this is a team on the rise.

For the Tigers, things are looking dire to say the least at the moment. The same issues that have plagued the club for years are running as rampant as ever and there seems to be little sign of any genuine change that may put the club back on the right track. Injuries to players in key positions haven't helped them, but there is no excuse for some of the football they've played in recent weeks, however they did show some heart to remain competitive with the Sharks for 55-odd minutes last week.

On paper, the Tigers probably have an advantage in the forward pack over the Knights, the return of representative hooker Api Koroisau a huge inclusion for the visitors. Newcastle have been playing good footy

though and have been able to keep largely the same 17 together over the past couple of months, the benefits of doing so becoming apparent in their last game against the Bulldogs.

For the Tigers to have any chance of causing the upset, their forwards will need to dominate from the outset and beat the Knights into submission, as the hosts simply have too much firepower out wide to go down in a shootout. It's certainly not an impossible task for Wests, but with the difference of form both sides are in, it's hard to see Newcastle being troubled.

WHO TO WATCH: Since being overlooked to the Queensland fullback role earlier this season, Kalyn Ponga has gone from strength to strength, playing the kind of football that has reminded the NRL world why the Knights have invested so much in him as their long-term fullback and captain. Since shifting back to the custodian role, Ponga has been heavily involved in the Knights attack, tearing edge defences to pieces down short-sides with his blistering speed as well as his sneaky good passing game. You'd struggle to find a Newcastle player without an impressive stat-line from the Bulldogs game, and Ponga's was as dazzling as you'd expect, finishing with 2-line breaks, 3-line break assists, 3 try assists and 9 tackle breaks. Against a Tigers side that has struggled defensively all season, expect another huge performance from the Knights marquee man.

It's no coincidence that the Tigers brief rise this season ended abruptly as soon as Api Koroisau got injured against the Titans. Koroisau is pretty much the only player on the Tigers capable of bringing anything resembling an attacking structure or gameplan to the side when close to the opposition try-line, and while they have struggled to score points all season, they've averaged just 6 per game in the three full matches he's missed since the injury, a sharp drop off from the 26 averaged in the four game beforehand (granted, a slightly inflated figure due to the 66 point drubbing of the Cowboys). Koroisau won't be able to do it all himself against Newcastle, but if his forward pack can give him a decent platform to work off, he may just be able to manufacture enough points for the Tigers to defend themselves to victory.

FAVOURITE: The Knights are 12-point favourites in this one at the time of writing.

MY TIP: The Knights are at home and in much better form, easy tip this one. Knights by 18.

The Broncos travel down south looking to continue to consolidate a top four position, whilst the Bulldogs are doing everything to stay out of last place.

After an embarrassing Round 18 loss to the Knights, the Bulldogs managed to string together an upset win against the depleted South Sydney side last week, which lifted them four points/two wins clear of the wooden spoon position.

Josh Addo-Carr is named to back up from Origin, however he has been named on the left wing so that rookie winger Blake Wilson can hold his place on the right wing after scoring three tries against the Rabbitohs last week. This change sees Jacob Kiraz being moved to centre, forcing Ethan Quai-Ward out of the starting 17 after making his NRL debut just last week. Due to his neck injury last round Ryan Sutton will not be playing, with Raymond Faitala-Mariner taking his place and Corey Waddell moving into the lock position.

Brisbane are fresh off of their second bye of the season, after coming away from a good win against the Dolphins in the second "Battle of Brisbane". They will be looking to continue to keep the heat on Penrith, where both teams are currently even on the same number of wins, with for/against the only thing keeping them apart.

The Broncos have named forward leader Pat Carrigan among the reserves, waiting to see whether he will be fit after playing Game III of Origin, as of right now Kobe Hethrington has been named to take his place on the starting side. Payne Haas is still out due to his ankle injury, which sees Corey Jensen move into the starting side and Jesse Arthurs join the bench. Kurt Capewell also makes his return after missing two games due to a quad injury.

THINGS TO KNOW

- This will be Corey OATES' 200th NRL game
- Kotoni STAGGS has 48 NRL goals
- Since returning to Belmore in 2015, the Bulldogs have won just 3 of 11 games at the venue.
- Brisbane's last loss at Belmore was in Round 10, 1992. They've won all 3 times they've played there since.

The Bulldogs do not have history on their side for this match, with the Broncos winning their past four matchups and the Bulldogs also having only won two of their last ten games at Belmore.

Canterbury have conceded 180 points in their last four games, and if they wish to have any chance against Brisbane, they will have to intensify their defence. The Broncos also lead the competition in tackle breaks sitting at 685, whilst the Bulldogs come in at spot 14 with 494, which highlights the difference in level of attack of both these teams who sit at opposite ends of the ladder.

WHO TO WATCH: Matt Burton had one of his best games of the season last week, where he made 13 runs for 161 metres, along with two try assists. Playing his first game for the season since Round 7 at five-eighth, as well as playing alongside new Bulldogs signing, Toby Sexton, Burton has had the opportunity to regain some confidence in himself and his playing game. I'm excited to see what he brings to the table Saturday afternoon, it being his second game in the halves combination with Sexton.

Having scored 14 tries in 15 games so far this season, including two hat tricks and a double, Selwyn Cobbo is a superstar who is just getting his career started. Although Cobbo is often a freak in attack for the Broncos, he is quite often a contributor to negative plays, so as he continues to learn and play, I would love to see a reduction in these plays both for himself and for the Broncos side. Hopefully, we'll see him score another try or two in this Saturday afternoon clash.

FAVOURITE: Brisbane are favoured to claim victory against the Bulldogs, to cement them in their top two position for another round.

MY TIP: The Broncos have had some struggles in both attack and defence recently, alongside varying injuries, suspensions and Origin duties. However, I believe that although Canterbury had a resurgence and good game last week, it won't be enough to cause an upset to the Broncos side, especially with the high number of points they have leaked over the past month. Brisbane will manage to add another win to their tally, although I do think it won't be a blowout score line. Brisbane by 16.

Two points for two hopefuls heading towards September

Two teams on the cusp of the top eight will vie for two valuable competition points on Saturday evening when the Manly Sea Eagles host the North Queensland Cowboys at 4 Pines Park.

Sitting in tenth position, one point adrift of the top eight, with a -24 for-and-against differential, the Manly Sea Eagles will be to chasing back-to-back victories for only the third time this season.

Handing Dean Matterson a first grade debut in place of Ben Trbojevic in the only change from the team that outlasted the Roosters (18-16) a fortnight ago, coach Anthony Seibold has named Daly Cherry-Evans and Jake Trbojevic on the presumption the representative duo will back up 72 hours after Origin III with mid-season recruit Jake Arthur listed on an extended bench.

Winning five of their past seven matches against North Queensland, the Sea Eagles have performed strongly following each of their byes this season with wins at home over the Eels (34-30) and the Dolphins (58-18).

Surging up the table during the middle-third of the season to sit outside the top eight on points differential, the North Queensland Cowboys will be aiming to continue a surprising record on the northern beaches over the past two decades.

Coming off a club record victory over the Tigers (74-0) in their last appearance, coach Todd Payten has gone with the same squad, including all seven players involved in Origin III in the starting side.

Winning six of their eight visits to 4 Pines Park in the years since Manly re-emerged in the league as a stand-alone club, the Cowboys memorably conjured a comeback for the ages with three tries in the final eight minutes to snatch a 28-26 victory at the venue last season.

WHO TO WATCH: Coming up against some of the most impressive back-rowers emerging in the league, Haumole Olakau'atu will have a point to prove in the run towards September. Beginning the year in destructive form off the back of five tries in his first seven matches, the 24-year-old has been a victim of Manly's mid-year malaise with one try since May to go from Origin contender to missing the series in its entirety. Remaining a solid contributor with 119 running metres and 28 tackles on average, a return to form from Olakau'atu will be invaluable if the Sea Eagles are to feature in finals football.

Enjoying a golden run of form since making the move up north mid-season, former Canberra outside back Semi Valemei will be aiming to continue his unbeaten run in Cowboys colours. Averaging 163 running metres since coming into the side at the expense of Kyle Feldt last month, the 24-year-old Fijian flyer has delivered with five tries and 17 tackle breaks in four matches. Contracted to the club until the end of next season, Valemei could prove to be one the best buys of the season if recent form is indicative of things to come.

FAVOURITE: North Queensland are favoured to make it five in a row at the time of writing prior to Origin III.

MY TIP: North Queensland will fancy their chances of achieving a post-Origin hat-trick following emphatic performances over Melbourne and South Sydney earlier this season. Cowboys by 14.

Turning for home - who's on the path to September?

For the best part of half a decade, when the Roosters and Storm faced off, both teams were perched high on the ladder, a win for either side vital to ensure they were looking to advance their case for a top eight berth - or better.

Fast forward to 2023 and sadly, the Tricolours appear a shadow of their former selves. Backed by many to be a premiership force before the season kicked off, the boys from Bondi are languishing in the chasing pack and their finals chances are quickly evaporating with every below-par performance.

This week they head to the SCG for the first time since they "farewelled" the venue last August - forced next door from their new Allianz Stadium home ground due to the restrictions placed by the FIFA Women's World Cup which is just days from commencing.

Melbourne have sensationally managed to keep themselves in the top four most of the season in spite of a mounting injury toll, and the complete absence of livewire fullback Ryan Papenhuyzen - who has been missing since this time last season.

Crunch match as both sides eye September footy

competition's three lowest ranked teams in their past three matches. The tag of flat-track bullies has a strong ring to it with this Sharks line-up.

After looking at the video of their capitulation against the Warriors in April. The most obvious thing for the Sharks is to play a full 80 minutes this time around. But, they need to be on their toes if they shoot out to an early lead. Cronulla are a side that have a tendency to switch off in games, they let the Tigers back into the contest last week, and good sides will punish that in droves. So it's up to the likes of Nicho Hynes, Matt Moylan and Will Kennedy to prevent another capitulation.

On the team front, Braden Hamlin-Uele has been named among the reserves and could be a chance of returning. Lock Dale Finucane is serving the final week of his suspension so Cameron McInnes looks set to start at lock again.

WHO TO WATCH: After leaving for a chance at regular first grade footy. It's been a long slog for Luke Metcalf in 2023. After starring in the trials, a hamstring injury appeared to derail his chance. However, he's taken his chance in the last few matches. After a quiet game against Souths, Metcalf showed his worth against Parramatta by scoring two tries, setting up a further one and two linebreak assists. If this form is the regular, Metcalf could keep Te Marie Martin out of the full strength side going forward.

For the Sharks, the focus goes onto Siosifa Talakai. It might be hard to fathom, but Talakai is one of the leading try creators in the competition setting up 13 tries so far this season. Although he has pace and defensive deficiencies at times, his ability to create chances purely on his size alone backs Craig Fitzgibbon's decision to pick him on the edge. Look for him to give Rocco Berry some nightmares on Sunday.

FAVOURITE: Cronulla are slight favourites in this clash. The Sharks boasting 10 wins from their last 13 meetings with the Warriors. The Warriors won their last clash in NZ, winning 19-18 in Wellington.

MY TIP: In one of the better match-ups of the weekend. It's a match that can go right down to the wire. With a sunny day expected, the conditions play into the Warriors hands as they've struggled in the rain this season. I just think Cronulla will have to produce a big win against a top 8 contender sooner rather than later to build into the run home. Sharks by 4.

The Penrith Panthers could be bolstered by the return of superstar halfback Nathan Cleary as they prepare to face Wayne Bennett's Dolphins on Sunday afternoon.

Having already named all of its Origin contingent to back up from Wednesday's final game of the series, Penrith also included Cleary in its extended squad for the trip up north.

Cleary has been sidelined since injuring his hamstring in Round 14 against the Dragons, although the Panthers went on the job without him on that night - taking a 26-18 win.

Jack Cogger was a fortunate late inclusion on the bench for that clash and has since stepped up in Cleary's absence as Penrith won three of its next four games without the Blues halfback.

The only loss was a heartbreaking 27-23 one to North Queensland in golden point, so it has been a successful Origin period for the Panthers all things considered as they still sit on top of the ladder.

Coach Ivan Cleary told reporters on Wednesday that son Nathan is a "pretty good chance" of playing and "tracking really well" to make his return alongside axed Blues five-eighth Jarome Luai.

Should that happen, look for Cleary to be a straight swap for Cogger with no other changes to the line-up named on Tuesday.

The Panthers are well-rested off the bye, having flexed their premiership muscles the week prior with a dominant 34-16 win over the Storm away from home.

The Dolphins, meanwhile, scraped home in a 23-21 thriller against the Titans to remain in the hunt for a top eight spot.

Now though the NRL's newest franchise faces its biggest test against the league's back-to-back defending

premiers and if its performance against Parramatta last month is anything to go by.

The Dolphins crumbled to a 42-4 halftime deficit on that afternoon and will need a much-improved defensive effort to stand any chance against Penrith.

In team news, Felise Kaufusi (concussion) returns in the second row seeing Kenny Bromwich shift to prop and Mark Nicholls drops back to the bench, with Josh Kerr 18th Man.

Elsewhere, a notable change sees Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow named to back up from Origin in the centres with Kodi Nikorima given the nod at fullback and the popular Valynce Te Whare out of the team.

Hooker Jeremy Marshall-King, meanwhile, (shoulder) remains unavailable which means Harrison Graham gets the nod again.

WHO TO WATCH: For the Dolphins, they will need eventually little bit of individual brilliance they can get to crack the competition's best defensive unit. That means it will only be even more important than usual that Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow backs up from Origin with plenty of energy still left in the tank. The Dolphins could be onto something shifting the Queensland speedster to the centres, provided they get Tabuai-Fidow clean, early ball to breaks the line like he did in Origin I. It is one way the Dolphins could stretch Penrith's usually resolute defence, with Tabuai-Fidow boasting seven linebreaks and 47 tackle busts this season.

Elsewhere, while all eyes will be on Cleary if he returns it will also be particularly interesting to see how halves partner Jarome Luai responds to his Origin omission. Luai actually played pretty well in the first two games of the series but it also makes sense for NSW to see what they have elsewhere, especially with Cleary unavailable. For Luai though being out of the Origin spotlight may be the best thing for the Panthers playmaker, who was under immense pressure and subject to - at times - unfair criticism. Luai has been guilty of drifting in and out of games this year, struggling to really elevate his game to a consistent enough level to get Penrith's attack firing on the left edge. With Cleary injured though Luai has really stepped up and lifted his involvement and if his teammate returns this week the Samoan international can't just revert to old habits.

FAVOURITE: The Panthers are well-backed to get the job done.

MY TIP: Cleary's likely return is a welcome boost for the Panthers but they can't fall into the trap of thinking everything will fall into place against a Dolphins team that has sprung an upset or two this year. Look for Penrith to take the two points but it may not necessarily be one-way traffic like many expect. Panthers by 13.

HAT-TRICK HERO AS SHARKS POWER PAST PLUCKY TIGERS

Sione Katoa was the hat-trick hero as the Cronulla Sharks overcame a plucky Wests Tigers outfit to run away 36-12 winners in front of just over 9,000 fans at CommBank Stadium on Thursday night.

The Tigers answered the challenge early in defence on Thursday night, repelling a few Sharks raids to keep the visitors tryless after 15 minutes as Cronulla instead settled for a single penalty goal. Eventually though the Sharks were destined to break the Tigers open, having already done just that through the middle of the ruck but struggled to capitalise. The first try of the night came in the 16th minute went right and Will Kennedy held up the ball, passing it to Jesse Ramien who shoveled the ball to Katoa in the corner. The winger then barged over, although Nicho Hynes missed the conversion from the sideline to leave the score at 6-0 after that earlier penalty goal.

It didn't take long for Cronulla to extend its lead, with a Hynes bomb dropped by Asu Kepaoa and the Sharks quickly taking advantage as their halfback double-pumped it for a rampaging Siosifa Talakai. Hynes added the extras to make it 12-0 after 22 minutes and despite their promising start, things threatened to unravel like they had the week prior against North Queensland.

Instead, the Tigers rallied to score the next two tries of the game and level it up at 12-all by halftime. First a bit of second-phase play, sparked first by an Alex Seyfarth offload, ended with Tommy Talau reaching out to score in the 27th minute.

Seyfarth was at it again just before halftime, with the Tigers gifted field position after Ronaldo Mulitalo spilt a Brandon Wakeham bomb. On this occasion the interchange forward played it short to deceive the Cronulla defence and send Shawn Blore steaming over under the posts, with both tries converted.

The Tigers needed to carry that momentum into the second half or quickly risk falling behind against a Sharks team that was sure to get more clinical in attack the longer the game dragged on. Unfortunately for the home side an early Isaiah Papali'i error saw the Sharks go on the attack right away and Cronulla threatened to re-establish its lead twice - only to be just denied.

First, Hynes took it right up to the line and passed short to Briton Nikora who was stopped just short of the line before Blayke Brailey put in a deft kick for Wade Graham which looked destined to produce points. A late Jahream Bula hand though batted it dead, showing the exact kind of desperation in defence the Tigers had been lacking in last week's 74-0 loss.

The Brailey dropout and extended pressure eventually led to Cronulla's third try of the night though, with a well-worked play and runners in motion seeing Katoa pick up his second. Hynes then slotted the conversion to make it 18-12 as the Sharks looked in a solid position to push on for the kind of comprehensive victory many were expecting.

Poor ball handling and general ill-discipline from Cronulla though continually presented the Tigers with opportunities to level the game once again, and they went close on two occasions. First, Wakeham spotted space in the corner and kicked on the third tackle for a flying Junior Tupou only for a late bounce to fool the Tigers winger. Then Talau looked to have scored his second after coming down with a Wakeham bomb, but replays showed he didn't have control of it as the ball went forward into the arms of Hynes. Two tries went begging as the Sharks then went down the other end of the field and made those close calls even harder to take, with Ramien scoring off a Hynes kick.

Hynes hit the posts but the score still had pushed out to 22-12, with luck hardly on the Tigers' side on Thursday night.
