

Sea Eagles to play for season, Roosters for pride...

The 14th placed Roosters and 10th placed Sea Eagles will contest the 2nd ever Gotcha4life cup with both sides in contrasting form.

In a season that has had many surprises, the Sydney Roosters paltry form has arguably been the most surprising.

Despite possessing one of the most star studded and established rosters in the competition, for some reason, they have not been able to click as a side with coach Trent Robinson having one of his most challenging seasons yet.

Their biggest problem, which continues to be under the microscope is their attack, with the Bondi club placing second last in terms of points scored, only above the last placed Wests Tigers.

Languishing in 14th on the NRL ladder, they will look to bounce back from last week's heavy 10-32 defeat to the Broncos at the Gabba and topple a manly team that has won back-to-back matches.

Although those wins (against the Sharks and Dragons) were very unconvincing, Anthony Seibold's side will go into this clash in the better form.

The Sea Eagles have been a mystery all year to say the least, after starting the season with back-to-back wins, they have been very up and down with their form.

After star fullback Tom Trbojevic was ruled out for the rest of the season in origin II, many wrote them off with experts and fans adamant, they would not be a top 8 team.

Since his injury, they have actually won 3/5 games with two of those being away from the home and one in

Wollongong where the side broke a 20-year hoodoo at the ground.

In terms of injury and team news, the Roosters have been forced to make one change with Siva Wong coming in for the injured Egan Butcher and have also decided to bring Drew Hutchinson in for Jake Turpin as the utility on the bench.

Manly have also made a few changes, with Raymond Tuimaolo-Vaega coming in for Christian Tuipoulotu on the wing and Ben Trbojevic returning in place of forward Sean Keppie.

WHO TO WATCH: Someone who needs to, (and I believe will), stand up for the Roosters in this clash is embattled five-eighth Luke Keary. The 2018 Clive Churchill Medallist has been below his best this year in terms of general play kicking, but also running the ball.

Despite him being into the latter part of his career, he can still be so dangerous when he runs the ball (eg Rd 12 game v Dragons) so I am expecting that he bounces back with a solid performance.

For Manly, they haven't had an absolute standout player across the last five weeks will all players contributing to their performances.

However, in saying that, I believe this contest will come down to how much involvement captain Daly Cherry-Evans and hooker Lachlan Croker have.

They have been in terrific form this year, with both players pushing themselves to the limits to potentially give their side a chance at playing in the back end of the competition.

Croker in particular has been a standout as he has established himself as one of the most consistent and reliable hookers in the competition after originally only being a makeshift one a few years ago.

FAVOURITE: Interestingly, the Roosters are actually the favourites across the board in regards to the bookmakers, with most having them as around \$1.60 favourites.

MY TIP: I think the Sea Eagles will win in a game that will be up and down for 65 minutes. I believe they have too much to play for and will continue their charge towards September with Reuben Garrick getting a try. Manly by 10

Warriors will look to continue top four charge when they travel to the Gold Coast

The Gold Coast Titans will play host to the New Zealand Warriors on Friday evening in a clash between two teams in very different situations. While the Warriors are enjoying what has so far been an unexpectedly successful season, the Gold Coast are still managing to keep hopes alive for an unlikely finals finish.

Sitting in 12th, four points off the eight, the Titans have work to do in the final month of regular season footy if they want to stay alive into September. However they enter this game off the back of a confidence-boosting win against the Cowboys - one of the teams they'll need to chase down in order to make the finals. The 22-13 victory in front of 16,000 home fans should hopefully boost attendance for this weekend back at Robina.

Fullback AJ Brimson was under an injury cloud at the start of the week, but he has been named to play regardless. Jojo Fifita is out with an ankle injury, so Aaron Schoupp takes his spot in the centres. Big Tino still has one more game left on his suspension before he can return to prop up his sides' forward pack.

The New Zealand Warriors are in a very strong position to secure their first top four regular season finish since 2007. In third position currently, level on points with Melbourne, they haven't lost consecutive games since round ten, and are on a three game winning streak heading into this clash. They are fresh off a bye, and prior to that managed to sneak a golden point win over a fast-finishing Canberra Raiders side in Auckland.

The same 17 as round 21 are set to take to the field, with Marata Niukore named despite suffering a head knock in their most recent game. Jazz Tevaga makes the squad at 18th man with his long-awaited return from injury incoming, although most likely not this weekend.

The Gold Coast have won their past three meetings against the Warriors.

WHO TO WATCH: 27 year old Gold Coast centre Brian Kelly is nearing 150 NRL appearances. Now in his fifth year with the Titans, Kelly has been a consistent centre option throughout the entirety of that. Kelly has been locked down long-term by the Gold Coast, contracted all the way through until 2026. As he moves into the middle stages of his NRL career, both himself and the club will want to get as much out of that contract as possible.

Mitchell Barnett was one of the big name signings for New Zealand this year, with the big forward joining on a three year deal until the end of 2025. Unfortunately for both Barnett and the Warriors, he has only been able to take to the field on nine occasions due to an early season neck injury which saw him sidelined for some time. Now firmly a part of the Warriors starting pack, himself and Addin Fonua-Blake are a formidable pair of props for any club to come up against.

FAVOURITE: The Warriors are favourites to extend their winning streak, and in doing so all but end the Titans' finals dream.

MY TIP: Gold Coast showed last week, as they have at numerous points throughout this season, that they can perform. Why they chose last week to pull an upset is anyone's guess, so which version of the Titans will get this week is even tougher to tell. Either way, I think the Warriors will be too strong. New Zealand by 16.

Premiership heavyweights meet in crunch match

Two competition heavyweights in Penrith and Melbourne go head to head in a vital Round 23 match at the foot of the mountains on Friday night.

Penrith have been the form side of the last three seasons and are well on their way for a third straight premiership. Only an act of god or a spectacular demise will see the Panthers fail to lift the trophy come the first Sunday of October. Their premiership credentials were confirmed with a shutout of the Sharks on home turf last start with Nathan Cleary showing his class with a perfect kicking game.

Their start against Melbourne a few weeks ago left a lot to be desired and it took a herculean comeback to taste victory. A strong all-round performance will be required for the critics to firmly get on the Panther Express bound for Accor Stadium. Dylan Edwards will be ultra-consistent at the back while Isack Tago will return after show a great run of form since his return from a pec injury. Their forwards have been consistent with James Fisher-Harris, Moses Leota and Scott Sorenson leaving teams in their wake.

Zac Hosking has been named to replace the suspended Tyrone Peachey at centre although Tago has been named among the reserves and could come into the side later in the week. Jaeman Salmon is the new man on the bench.

Melbourne have had a mixed season. They've had moments where they've looked like they can compete for the premiership, and then the next they look like a side struggling to even make the top 4 and get that critical double chance. Their run into the finals is strong and it begins with Penrith on a cold, slippery Friday night. A

task that has haunted so many in recent times.

For a victory against Penrith, they need to take a leaf out of what they did well against Penrith a few weeks ago at Marvel Stadium. They had the upper hand for the first half of that game until the final 10 minutes where they let their guard down and Penrith ran away with victory. Melbourne need to dominate the forward exchanges and reduce their back 5 out of yardage. That's all before stopping the potent Cleary around the ruck. Their attack needs to be on point with Munster, Hughes and Grant needing another 10/10 performance for victory.

Nelson Asofa-Solomona's return from a finger injury pushes Tom Eisenhuth to the bench and Tyran Wishart to 18th Man. Asofa-Solomona played on the edge when Eli Katoa was out with an eye injury but will most likely find himself back in the middle with Katoa having returned last week.

WHO TO WATCH: For Penrith, it's the man that just celebrated his 100 games at the NRL level in Scott Sorensen. Capping off an exceptional year with a fresh contract, Sorensen has caused all sorts of problems for opposition edges this year and will again be looking to cause nightmares for a Melbourne edge that has had it's fair share of problems in 2023. If given early ball down that side of the field, it's curtains for the Storm.

Onto the Melbourne side, it's Nick Meaney that has my focus. With the impending return of Ryan Papenhuyzen in a few weeks, it's likely Meaney will be playing for his Storm future. Having impressed so many with his year at the back, he'll be looking to continue what's been a breakout 2023 for the fullback with his damaging running game causing problems for all sides this season.

FAVOURITE: Home ground advantage and a rich vein of form has the premiers as favourites.

MY TIP: It's hard to tip against the back to back premiers when their in this run of form. I do expect Melbourne to give Penrith a good run for their money at home though so it doesn't appear to be as cut and dry as it seems on the surface. The kicking battle of the halves will decide the outcome of the game as the field position battle appears absolutely critical. Penrith by 7.

Queensland Rivals to Face Off in Potential Finals Preview

The recent history between the North Queensland Cowboys and Brisbane Broncos has been retold many a time over the years, and for good reason; whenever these two sides meet a close and exciting contest usually ensues.

With that being said, it's been a while (by their standards) since the Broncos and Cowboys produced a genuine thriller. Brisbane won 28-16 earlier this year to take care of business in a game that was more lopsided than the scoreboard would indicate, while the three matchups before that were all decided by 14-points or more.

Had the Cowboys not had an off day against the Titans last week, there would be a fair argument to be made that these two are the form teams in the competition; Brisbane haven't put a foot wrong since their bye three weeks ago and North Queensland have won 6 out of their last 7. Despite the 6 straight wins that preceded it, the Cowboys would be extremely disappointed in themselves for laying an egg against the Gold Coast last week, giving up a great chance to solidify their spot in the top eight by doing so. Their defence was as bad as it's been since their slow start to the year, conceding 6 line-breaks and missing 47 tackles, and their attack wasn't close to being good enough to bail them out.

After expectedly undergoing a bit of a form slump during the state of origin period, the Broncos are close to being back at full strength and have been scoring points for fun in their three most recent outings. In that period, they've averaged a league high 34 points per game, with key players Reece Walsh and Adam Reynolds regaining the form they had to start the season 7-1. If there has been a knock on the Broncos recently, it's been their edge defence; all 5 tries conceded in the past two weeks have been outside the numbers. Their big men will have a job to do against a dynamic Cowboys forward pack, and the likes of Scott Drinkwater and Tom Dearden will be ready to capitalise on any opportunities they are presented with.

In team news, Valentine Holmes is out for the Cowboys after being suspended on Tuesday night. Zac Laybutt has replaced him in the centres on other occasions this year but hasn't been named in the extended squad, so it remains to be seen what Todd Payten will do. In other changes, Taumalolo will start at prop, pushing Coen Hess to the edge and Kulikefu Finefeuiaki out of the side. Griffin Neame and Heilum Luki are the new faces on the bench.

For the Broncos, Jesse Arthurs is back, replacing Deine Mariner on the wing, while Brendan Piakura is in the back row, allowing Pat Carrigan to return to his preferred position of lock. Piakura's inclusion also forces Keenan Palasia to the bench and Xavier Willison out of the side.

It's a huge game in the context of both team's seasons. The Broncos have a tough run home and could easily fall out of the top two with a couple of losses, while the Cowboys are now firmly in amongst the 7-team fight for the last four spots in the top eight.

WHO TO WATCH: Cowboys coach Todd Payten's use of star forward Jason Taumalolo has been the cause of a lot of controversy ever since he took the job in Townsville, and it appears there'll be another change to the Tongan enforcer's role come Saturday afternoon. In the first 7 weeks of the season, Taumalolo started at lock and averaged 53 minutes per game. The Cowboys went 2-5 in this stretch and Taumalolo was poor by his standards, only cracking 200 metres twice and missing roughly 3 tackles per game before getting injured. Since he's been back, Taumalolo has exclusively come off the bench and produced some of his best football in years while doing so, cutting down on the missed tackles while matching his early season output but doing so more efficiently. His performance against the Titans was probably his worst since returning though, missing 6 tackles and only running 119 metres without a tackle break. It'll be the big man's 250th game on Saturday, but his first start at prop, and it will be interesting to see how Payten's use of him differs to what he's done previously.

For the Broncos, young five-eighth Ezra Mam has undergone a period of poor form, which is to be expected at some stage for any playmaker who stars immediately after coming into the league. Last week against the Roosters was a huge step in the right direction for Mam, rediscovering something close to his best form, which will be the standard he has to continue playing at if the Broncos are to make a charge for the premiership. He bagged a try double, the first coming after he chased a Reece Walsh kick and won the race to the ball, the second coming in garbage time after he scooped up an ill-advised kick from Billy Smith to run 80 metres and score untouched. He also had two tackle busts and a line-break assist, while making 18 tackles for only two misses throughout the night. It's clear that Adam Reynolds and Reece Walsh are the two main playmakers for the Broncos, but if Mam can continue playing his role, backing-up in support and occasionally chiming in with moments of individual brilliance, all of which he's capable of, it'll go a long way to helping the Broncos make a deep charge into late September or early October.

FAVOURITE: The Broncos are 4-point favourites over the Cowboys at the time of writing.

MY TIP: The Broncos, in my opinion, are clearly the better side and are coming off an extra three days of rest. While being back at home will definitely be an advantage for the Cowboys, I don't think it'll be enough to get them over the line. Broncos by 8.

Win in the west to stay in the finals fight

As September approaches and the race for the finals intensifies, the Dolphins and the Newcastle Knights will head west as part of a double header set to have major ramifications on the make-up of the top eight.

Contesting the first NRL fixture at Perth's Optus Stadium since the opening round double header five years ago, both side's - currently sitting outside the top eight - will be treating Saturday night as a must-win encounter with five matches remaining in the regular season.

Coming into the round four points adrift of the top eight after an agonising last start defeat, a loss on Saturday evening will effectively end the Dolphins' hopes of featuring beyond the regular season.

Snatching defeat from the jaws of victory with a wayward conversion proving the difference in last Sunday's 23-22 loss to the Bulldogs in Bundaberg, coach Wayne Bennett has been forced into changes with Kodi Nikorima replacing Euan Aitken (knee) in the centres, Anthony Milford coming into the halves and Isaiya Katoa joining the bench.

Facing off against the Roosters, Tigers, Cowboys and Warriors over the closing weeks of their inaugural campaign, a poor middle-third to the season has seen the Dolphins fall from fourth to 13th with just two wins from their past nine matches.

Going from also-rans to genuine top eight hopefuls with an unbeaten run throughout July, the Newcastle Knights could finish the weekend inside the top eight with a win on the west coast.

Taking the Raiders apart during a controlled 28-6 victory last Saturday, coach Adam O'Brien has stuck solid

with the same squad that got the job done in Canberra with prop Daniel Saifiti (quad) still a few weeks away from returning to the field.

Eyeing off five straight wins for only the fourth time in two decades, the Knights have previously played in Perth during the short-lived existence of the Western Reds, emerging with a win and a loss from two appearances at the WACA during the mid-1990s.

Playing their next three matches at home against the Bulldogs, Rabbitohs and Sharks before a final round clash on the road opposite the Dragons, a win on Saturday could see the Knights in contention to not only qualify for the top eight but host a home final for the first time since 2006.

WHO TO WATCH: Snaring his first career hat-trick against Newcastle earlier this season, Tesi Niu has experienced a campaign emblematic of the Dolphins on the whole. Beginning in fine form before struggling with injury and crossing for a paltry two tries since March, the 21-year-old outside back will be looking to rediscover his attacking best over the closing rounds. Averaging 135 running metres each week to go with seven line breaks and 34 tackle breaks for the year, Niu will return to Optus Stadium for the first time since bursting onto the scene with the Tongan 9s team just months after turning 18 four years ago.

Playing every game to date in his first season as Newcastle player #336, Jackson Hastings has been instrumental in instilling a renewed competitive streak throughout the Knights playing group. Having a hand in seven try assists, ten forced drop outs and snaring three tries of his own, the 27-year-old journeyman produced a controlled kicking game last week that saw the Knights take control early and rarely relent. Making the number seven jersey his own after a conflicted return to the NRL with the Tigers last season, a strong showing from Hastings could see the red and blue finish the round inside the top eight for the first time in 2023.

FAVOURITE: Surging into favouritism off the back of four straight wins heading towards the business end of the season, the Knights are expected to emerge with two competition points in the west.

MY TIP: Momentum is one of the hardest things to overcome in rugby league and at the moment Newcastle have it in spades. Knights by 7.

Rabbitohs take the Sharks to Perth for a home game away from home, where both teams are fighting to stay in the eight during the last five rounds towards the race to finals.

After enduring a loss to the Broncos in Round 21, the Rabbitohs bounced back last week to beat the Wests Tigers in a 32-18 victory, fuelled by an Alex Johnston hat-trick. South Sydney experienced a rough representative period of footy, but the return of Latrell Mitchell has provided a spark, and they are now ready for the run to the finals and attempt to stay in the top eight.

Thomas Burgess and Michael Chee Kam come into the starting side, forcing Jacob Host to drop out and Hame Sele missing out due to injury. Tallis Duncan also joins the team from the bench. The Bunnies are now fronting with a full-strength side, with minimal players missing out due to injury or representative duties, giving them a much needed boost at this pointy end of the season.

The Sharks' season is on life support, where they have now lost three games on the trot, conceded a total of 102 points within these last three games and were July's biggest sliders in the top eight. Last week, Cronulla fronted Penrith, where they leaked 28 points and could not crack the zero score line, they struggled with both attack and defence, which is a worrying sign coming into the do-or-die end of the season.

After suffering a hamstring injury against the Panthers, Will Kennedy is sidelined, with Connor Tracey moving to fullback. Ronaldo Mulitalo and Jesse Colquhoun return to the squad after a respective jaw injury and suspension. Oregon Kaufusi is also forced out from the squad.

History is on the side of the Rabbitohs, with the Sharks only winning two out of their seven previous matches.

With the Sharks conceding over 100 points in their last three matches, they will have to step up defensively if they wish to have any chance at beating this full strength Rabbitohs side. The Rabbitohs are a strong side in attack where lead the competition in tries (total of 89) and try assists (79) and are equal total lines breaks with Cronulla where they are both on 118.

WHO TO WATCH: Campbell Graham has scored 15 tries in his 17 appearances this season, along with five try assists and 19 line breaks, he is having an excellent season. He is such a weapon on the Bunnies right edge and having scored five tries in five games against the Sharks, surely, he'll pull another one out come Saturday night.

After winning Dally M Player of the Year in 2022, and having an excellent start to the 2023 season, it seems that Nicho Hynes has hit a mid to end season slump and it's starting to cost the Sharks. Hynes' is an important spine player for Cronulla, and despite his best efforts and confidence, even he admits he could be playing better, and a late season turnaround is what both he and the Sharks need in the close race to finals, where the Sharks are desperately trying to improve their form.

FAVOURITE: Rabbitohs are favoured to add another two points to their count in Perth, and inch their way up the ladder and solidify themselves into the top eight.

MY TIP: Both sides have something to prove and fight for come Saturday night, however an injury depleted Sharks are coming up against a full-strength Rabbitohs. The Sharks are struggling with form and are without their fullback for the backend of the season, and I don't believe they have it in them to turn it around especially against such a strong team, South Sydney. Although the ladder says otherwise, it won't be a close game, and I think the Rabbitohs could give a death blow to the Sharks and put on too many points to make a recovery. Rabbitohs by 32.

Two teams desperate for two very different reasons clash on Sunday night as the Parramatta Eels and St George Illawarra Dragons face off.

For the Eels, they have dropped outside of the top eight and simply have to win this game against the lowly Dragons given their tough run home.

For context, Parramatta closes out its season with games against the Broncos, Roosters and Panthers before pocketing two points courtesy of its third and final bye.

Brisbane and Penrith will obviously present a stern challenge as the league's two frontrunners this season, while the Roosters could even pose a problem if they string a few wins together.

It makes this Sunday's game even more important given it is one Parramatta is expected to win regardless of its recent struggles, highlighted by last week's heavy 46-16 defeat to Melbourne.

The Eels are bolstered by the return of five-eighth Dylan Brown, who pleaded guilty to two charges of sexual touching back in July.

He bumps Daejarn Asi out of the side while another change sees Waqa Blake dropped in place of Isaac Lumelume while Joey Lussick starts at hooker, bumping rookie Brendan Hands out of the 17.

Elsewhere, the Dragons will be without star forward Jack de Belin after he failed to have a dangerous contact charge downgraded at the NRL Judiciary on Tuesday night.

Jack Bird has been named on the extended bench and could be called in to replace de Belin at lock forward, although the versatile 28-year-old has been hampered by an ongoing knee injury recently.

The Dragons have shown flashes of life in recent weeks, toppling the Tigers before going down to the Sea Eagles 24-18 in a tight tussle last Saturday.

Recent head-to-head history between the Dragons and Eels is a cause for concern though, with the Red V losing 10 of their last 13 games against Parramatta.

The Dragons are also yet to win a game away from home this year and now face a daunting trip to CommBank Stadium.

WHO TO WATCH: has to be Dylan Brown for the home side. Eels coach Brad Arthur said after last week's loss to Melbourne that Brown knows he needs to repay his teammates. With Parramatta's finals hopes fast fading away, that needs to come this weekend. Brown is a physical five-eighth with smart, quick decision-making and he should immediately shore up Parramatta's edge defence and that has to be just the start of the impact he makes on Sunday.

If the Dragons are any hope on the weekend they need a strong performance from Blake Lawrie. Even slightly under-strength, Parramatta's forward pack looks far better on paper than that of the Dragons, particularly with de Belin out of the picture. It means the Red V's starting pack, led by Lawrie, will need to try outmuscle the Eels' big men early or risk letting Parramatta getting on a roll. Lawrie has run for over 100 metres in each of his past three games and will need to continue laying a strong platform on Sunday.

FAVOURITE: Despite poor recent form it is the Eels who are expected to take the win.

MY TIP: With Brown back in the mix and a far superior forward pack, look for the Eels to rebound from last week's reality check against the Storm in style. Parramatta by 30.

THE PREVIEW

After two losses in a row, the Canberra Raiders will be aiming to return to their winning ways when they host the last-placed Wests Tigers at GIO Stadium on Sunday afternoon.

The fifth placed Raiders have shot up the competition ladder after losing four of their opening five games. Since, they've won 10 of 14, including a run of five straight wins back in April and May. However, their losses to the Warriors and Newcastle over the last two weeks have left them in a perilous position as only three points separates the Raiders in fifth and the Manly-Warringah Sea Eagles in 10th.

Now comes their best opportunity to return to their winning ways, and in the process, establish themselves as a top eight side with five weeks left in the competition. Their opponents, the Tigers, haven't won since their 48-point victory over the North Queensland Cowboys in Round 12, and have lost their last eight matches.

They've come close over the past two weeks, but in the end, they couldn't do enough to walk away with the two points against St. George and the South Sydney Rabbitohs. The joint venture welcomed Luke Brooks back into the fold last week, after missing multiple weeks with a hamstring injury, and looked a much better outfit than they previously had.

As they field a near full strength team, they may give the Raiders a run for their money (like they did in Round 14), as the combination of Brooks, Api Koroisau and Jahream Bula grows stronger with each appearance. However, their defence will need some improving if they're to walk away with the two points this weekend.

The Tigers haven't conceded less than 20 points since their victory over the Cowboys and have conceded 30 or more in four of their last five outings, which included a whopping 74 points in the Cowboys return fixture.

Given the Raiders are an attacking force at their best, it leaves the chances of a Tigers victory looking slim. After scoring a mere six points against the Knights, the Raiders will be looking to pore on the points against a struggling Tigers side on Sunday.

A win for the Raiders would come at a crucial time, as they face Melbourne and Brisbane during the run home,

fixtures that may be difficult to win, so they'll have to grab any victory that they can if they want to remain in the top eight.

In team news, the Raiders have made a few changes. Jordan Rapana has been named at fullback, pushing Seb Kris into the centres and Nick Cotric returns on the wing as Jarrod Croker is left out of the side. Adrian Trevilyan comes onto the bench at the expense of Tom Starling. For the Tigers, Stefano Utoikamanu and Shawn Blore are out with concussion, Alex Twal starts at prop, as a result, Justin Matamua and Asu Kepaoa have been added to the bench. In their last change, Will Smith has been dropped from the bench for Jake Simpkin.

WHO TO WATCH: For the Raiders, the players to keep an eye on are stalwarts of the club. Firstly, Jack Wighton, in his final year at the club, has been dangerous in attack. The five-eighth has scored seven tries, his highest tally since 2020 and has run for over 100 metres in five of his last six appearances. He had a relatively quiet night against the Tigers earlier in the year, but with so much to play for, he'll be up for the fight. Secondly, his prop forward, Joseph Tapine has continued his electric form that began last season. The 29-year-old is averaging 161 run metres per game in 2023 and is a workhorse in defence, regularly making upwards of 30 tackles a night. He comes up against Stefano Utoikamanu and David Klemmer on Sunday, which will be a fantastic battle to witness.

For the Tigers, skipper Api Koroisau has arguably been their best player this season, and if not, their most impactful. The 30-year-old has scored five tries in 16 appearances this year, and has assisted a further five as he tried his hardest to improve the Tigers chances of victory each week. The dummy-half was exceptional against the Rabbitohs last week, scoring and assisting a try as well as making 47 tackles. Each week, Koroisau's combination with Jahream Bula improves ten-fold, as the 21-year-old fullback finds his feet in his first season of NRL football. Since debuting against Manly in Round 8, Bula has been a mainstay at fullback, showing an immense talent and skillset that should benefit the Tigers for years to come. In his rookie season, the fullback has scored five tries in 13 games, assisted a further four, broken 51 tackles and averaged 170 run metres per game. A pretty nice return for a rookie in the NRL.

FAVOURITE: Given their ladder position and their superior form compared to the Tigers in 2023, the Raiders enter Sunday afternoon's contest as the favourites. The Raiders have a sort of curse over the Tigers, having won their last six matches against the joint-venture, which extends to 10 wins from their last 11 meetings. The Raiders love scoring points against the Tigers, surpassing 46 points in four of those 11 matches

MY TIP: Expect the Tigers to be competitive, as they were in Round 14, though, the Raiders should be too strong for them, and a win may be crucial to their final standing within the top eight. Raiders by eight points.

KNIGHTS GO FOUR-IN-A-ROW TO LEAVE RAIDERS FLOUNDERING

A controlled display has seen the Newcastle Knights post their fourth win in succession with a 28-6 rout over the Canberra Raiders at GIO Stadium.

Recording their first victory in the nation's capital in five years to move within one point of the top eight, the Knights stood tall with and without the ball in a performance that saw Kalyn Ponga enhance his reputation as one of the superstars of the game.

Coming out of the blocks with attacking intentions after a superb kick return from Ponga inside the opening two minutes, the Knights struck first with Jackson Hastings sending Lachlan Fitzgibbon into space, who linked with Ponga (6th minute) in support to open the scoring.

Adding a penalty goal from in front after Jordan Rapana failed to complete a line drop out inside the designated kick clock, the Raiders woes went from bad to worse when Josh Papalii threw a woeful pass on the last tackle that put the Knights on the attacking front foot.

Taking immediate advantage of the field position gifted by their opponents, a cut-out pass from Hastings allowed Greg Marzhev (19th minute) to stroll over in the corner.

Managing to repel multiple attacking raids from the Raiders on their own line, the Knights completed a stellar first half with Dominic Young (32nd minute) managing to get the ball down inside the corner post for his 20th try of the season to take a 20-0 lead to the sheds.

Making the Raiders pay for another poor last tackle option which saw interchange prop Emre Guler hoist a bomb toward the heavens, a subsequent raid down the right side from Dane Gagai saw Tyson Gamble (42nd minute) race away to score.

The Knights appeared to go further in front through Bradman Best following a comedy of errors from the Raiders, only for the bunker to find an infringement against Gamble for tackling Albert Hopoate in the air.

Stemming the one-way flow of points through Rapana (51st minute) midway through the second half, Canberra fullback Seb Kris was placed on report minutes later for taking out Ponga's legs while the Newcastle fullback contested a high ball.

Taking the score out to 28-6 via a penalty goal, Ponga was forced from the field for a HIA after collecting Rapana's knee while falling after passing the ball, before being cleared to return with the result beyond doubt.

A well-placed chip kick from Hastings saw Young touch down late in the contest, however closer inspection from the bunker found the English winger to have put a foot on the sideline before grounding.

FIRST HALF FIELD GOAL GETS THE BULLDOGS 'HOME'

left on the clock gave the hosts an unlikely 11-8 halftime advantage.

Squandering an early opportunity to extend their lead after Averillo dropped a pass from Jacob Preston with the try line in sight, Averillo (53rd minute) atoned for his earlier blemish with a try against his future teammates.

Responding to the one-way flow of points by injecting Anthony Milford into the game, the Dolphins got the desired response with Aitken splitting the Bulldogs through the middle of the field, allowing Milford (57th minute) to take advantage of the retreating defence from close range.

In a sliding doors moments which saw Tevita Pangai Jr denied by the bunker at one end of the field for a double movement, the Dolphins returned fire with Valynce Te Whare (64th minute) charging over to give the visitors a one-point lead.

In a thrilling finale which saw a potential match-clinching try to Isaako pulled up for an obstruction, a cut-out pass from Toby Sexton enabled Blake Wilson (69th minute) to touch down to take a five-point lead following Burton's successful sideline conversion.

Felise Kaufusi provided the Dolphins with a late opportunity to claim victory with a tackle that forced a turnover, however, despite the best efforts of Milford (78th minute) to score his second of the afternoon, Isaako's wayward conversion allowed the Bulldogs to hold on for a one-point win.

NRLW R3 PREVIEWS

ROOSTERS V DRAGONS, THURSDAY

Thursday night NRLW action heads to the Sydney Cricket Ground as the Sydney Roosters are looking to bounce back from a shock loss against the Canberra Raiders when they play host to the St George Illawarra Dragons. The two performances from the Roosters this season have been a polarising contrast between each other with a very impressive win to start the season but then were concerningly outplayed and out-enthused by the Canberra Raiders last weekend. Coming up against the Raiders in their first ever home game was always going to be tough for the Tricolours but their performance was pretty

poor even considering the opposition. The early dominance without points for the Roosters would be the concern as they dominated territory without getting on the board. The Roosters then went down 18-0 midway through the second half as they made a minor comeback attempt before the Raiders held on. The Roosters will be boosted by the expected return of Jess Sergis who was a late withdrawal due to a hamstring issue last week. The Roosters have lost Mya Hill-Moana after a head knock last week with Teuila Fotu-Moala coming into the starting side and former Australian Rugby International Grace Hamilton on the bench. The St George Illawarra Dragons like their opponents come into round 3 with a 1-1 record following last week's impressive 38-12 win over the Parramatta Eels to find some form

after being outplayed by the defending premiers in Round 1. Starting fast, the Dragons scored inside the first two minutes of the game as the changes made by Red 'V' coach Jamie Soward worked with a debutant scoring so early. After things evened up for a while, things clicked for the Dragons as they were able to score consistently five tries in the space of half an hour to put the game quickly beyond doubt. Dragons coach Jamie Soward has made one change to his team with Renee Targett ruled out of the side after playing in the hooker role. Kaarla Cowan will come into the side whilst Sophie Clancy comes onto the bench.

Player To Watch: Roosters centre and captain Isabelle Kelly is one of the best players in the NRLW and is a key part of the Tricolours attack. Kelly was

slightly disappointing last week and the Roosters will need her to improve her performance from last week and lead the Roosters to victory. Former Rooster Raecene McGregor controlled the show last week for the Dragons and coming up against her old side could be an advantage for the Red 'V'. McGregor was impressive against the Eels and to pull off a major upset against the Roosters and put the Dragons forward in the competition.

TIP: The Roosters should be able to bounce back and win this game to make a statement that there aren't bigger issues at play. The performance last week from the Tricolours was poor and they want to show that they won't be easy beats or could be out-enthused by a Dragons side who will come in with confidence. **Roosters by 10.**

COWBOYS V BRONCOS, SATURDAY

North QLD are heading into their Round 3 clash fresh off their first ever win as an NRLW team, where they fought their way to a historical win against the reigning premiers in Belmore last Sunday. The Cowboys were in a 20-20 deadlock with the Knights halfway through the second half, which was broken by co-captain Kirra Dibb where

she kicked a field goal and then went on to set up two of the last three tries, to make the final score line 31-20. Autumn-Rain Stephens Daly is named to make her first appearance in 2023 on the wing after a false start during Round 2 (knee complaint), this forces Jetaya Faifua to drop out of the side after playing in the front row during Round 2. China Polata is also named on the bench for the team. After a poor 2022 season, Brisbane have still not managed to have a much-needed good start, losing their second game of the season to the Gold Coast. The Broncos let the Titans slip through, with 40+ missed tackles and a 69 per cent completion rate, where they ultimately fell during extra time to a

Lauren Brown field goal. Jasmine Forgavini is named on the bench after previously playing on the wing, with Toni Hunt replacing her. Brianna Clark joins the starting side, after playing 23 minutes from the bench during her first game of 2023 last week. Filomina Hanisi joins the team, with Lavinia Gould and Breanna Eales out of the starting 17.

Player To Watch: Steering her side to their first NRLW win, Cowboys co-captain Kirra Dibb is an upcoming playmaker and important player who will only continue to grow with time. In the 2023 season, she leads kick metres with a total of 703, along with kicking a 40/20 and field goal. Former New Zealand rugby sevens player, Gayle

Broughton, has started to settle in at her debut season with the Broncos. Despite scoring her own four-pointer against the Titans and being an excellent and experienced playmaker, she cost the team a chance to win against the Titans in golden point and needs to remember the simple and basic plays.

TIP: Both sides will be out for a win on Saturday afternoon, with the Broncos looking to wrong some rights and the Cowboys wanting to get a one-up against Brisbane for the first time ever. The game could go either way, but my Broncos supporter heart can't go past my own girls. **Broncos by 4.**

SHARKS V TITANS, SATURDAY

Sharks look to end undefeated run for Titans The Cronulla Sharks will be looking to end the undefeated start to the year for the Gold Coast Titans when they go head to head at Pointsbet Stadium. Cronulla were bitterly disappointing in their 10-0 defeat against the Tigers at Belmore last Sunday and coach Tony Herman will be looking for a fast turnaround in front of their home faithful for the second time this season. Although they did miss Jada Taylor who was a late scratching, the Sharks looked out of sync for the full 70 minutes against a side that was simply more hungrier for the win. To beat the Titans, they need to contain Evania Pelite. She's been the metre-eater of the tournament thus far and has been a nightmare to tackle. Elsewhere, their forwards have been immense up front all year

and Cronulla's pack was bullied against the Tigers so it's important to see how they turn it around especially in front of their home faithful. Ellie Johnston's battle with Shannon Mato will be one to watch. For now Andie Robinson is again the fullback and Cassie Staples named on the wing with Taylor named in the reserves. In the absence of Harata Butler, who was suspended after Sunday's loss to the Wests Tigers, Chloe Saunders starts at prop and Fiona Jahnke joins the 17 on the bench. The side is otherwise unchanged from Round 2. For the Titans, after finishing with the wooden spoon last year, not much was expected with the diluted player talent this season. However, they are one of two undefeated sides so far this season with some open and enterprising footy with a sense of resilience not seen under Karyn Murphy last season. In both matches, they've had to come from behind to taste victory including a rare win over big sister,

the Broncos in golden point. To beat Cronulla, they need to shut down their edges particularly the left edge, Wests did that to great effect last week and shut down their attacking chances brilliantly. Also, they need Pelitie to continue her strong start to the season and win her positional battle. Lauren Brown is named to start at hooker but could drop back to the bench in a swap with Brittany Breayley-Nati prior to kick-off, which was the case last week.

Player To Watch: Looking at Tiana Penitani's start to 2023 and there's some rust since arriving at the Sharks. Her numbers are well down on previous seasons with just one try and 5 tackle breaks so far.

With more chances to possess possession, expect Penitani to dominate against a Titans edge that was vulnerable last week and conceded quickly early on against the Broncos at the GABBA. Shannon Mato has had a strong start to the season. Mato had a breakout game with a 245 metre effort against the Broncos, constantly causing the opposition grief throughout the epic encounter. With a strong work ethic, it's no wonder why she's become an important piece of the Titans puzzle for the 2023 NRLW season. **TIP:** After the Sharks poor performance last week, I expect a bounce-back vibe from them in this clash. However, I do see the Gold Coast not giving up without a fight and will be competing and tasting victory at the final siren in another epic arm-wrestle showcasing how close this competition will be.

Sunday afternoon NRLW action returns to Parramatta as the Parramatta Eels will be looking to turn their fortunes around as they take on the defending premiers the Newcastle Knights in a Grand Final rematch. The Parramatta Eels are far from the team that they were at the end of 2023 as they come into Round 3 staring down the barrel of a 0-3 start to the season especially after they were again beaten heavily in Round 2 going down 38-12 to the Dragons. Last weekend, the Eels were on the backfoot from the beginning in Wollongong as they conceded a try inside two minutes and then it went downhill from there for the Blue and Gold. The loss

of Rachael Pearson and Elsie Albert was on show again for the Eels who have just lacked go forward and it showed as they could mount a strong attack nor in defence their fragilities were exploited big time by the Red 'V'. The Eels could be boosted by a potential return from Elsie Albert who missed the first two rounds with a calf injury but Rachael Pearson is still out with her injury. The line-up for the Eels is otherwise unchanged coming into Round 3. Another shock loser in Round 2, the Newcastle Knights were poor by their regular standards in their 31-20 loss to the North Queensland Cowboys at Belmore last Sunday afternoon. The Novocastrians looked good early as they were able to open a 10-0 lead after as many minutes before the Cowboys were able to hit back in the lead-up to the half time

The energy that Cherrington brings can have a big impact on what the Eels can

do for the season and pull off a big upset. Already a superstar in Women's Rugby League, English international Georgia Roche makes her NRLW debut for the Knights this week and could make a big impact straight away. Slotting into a successful side, Roche's attacking skill can get the Knights back onto the right track after their shock loss last week.

TIP: The Knights should have more than enough for the Eels and although we've seen plenty of upsets in the NRLW so far this season, this game shouldn't be one of them and the Knights could improve significantly after last week with a strong side on paper and key players being added. The Eels need to improve a lot to get to a better level but are unlikely to get close to the Knights here **Knights by 20.**

Picking up one of the biggest upsets in the competition last weekend, the Canberra Raiders showed they aren't making up the numbers in the competition following their 24-14 victory over the Sydney Roosters last Saturday afternoon. The Raiders had their first home game and they fed off the passion of the parochial Canberra crowd as they were able to see off the dominance of possession and territory from the Roosters before being able to take a 6-0

lead into half-time. The Canberrans extend their lead out to 18-0 and were able to keep their nerve when the Roosters were looking to hit back late in the contest before sealing the win in the dying minutes. Unsurprisingly, Raiders coach Darrin Borthwick has made no changes to the 17 that took to the field and no changes to the reserves from last week's game. Player To Watch: Raiders centre Cheyelle Robins-Reti was a star for Canberra last week as she dominated the running metres stats running for 198m and picking up a four pointer as well. The Raiders will be hoping that Robins-Reti can repeat that performance to get a strong Tigers defence on the backfoot. Tigers winger Jakiya Whitfield put in

one of the most impeccable NRLW performances that has been seen as she ran for nearly 300m and picked up her own four pointer. Whitfield is an underrated star of the competition and she can put the fear through her opposition if she has a strong day. The Tigers get a repeat of that performance and they can be confident of upsetting the Raiders.

TIP: It's hard to look past the Raiders here, the Tigers have been excellent in two games but being in Canberra, the Raiders looked to have a 14th player on the field last week with the crowd and the way they fed off that will boost them significantly. There is plenty of argument for the Tigers to win as well with what they've delivered but just the home crowd factor should get Canberra home.
