Grand Final Re-Match sees Eels look for an electric edge
The first grand final re-match and Battle of the West sees two sides come into this Round 4 opener in contrasting fortunes.

Parramatta have lost every match by four points so far and could easily be undefeated if it weren't for their unique ability to get in their own way. The Eels have been ok but unspectacular to start 2023 with those narrow losses, but what would be of major concern is the 64 points they've leaked in the last fortnight. For a side that was so resilient at times last season, the cracks need to be tidied up sooner rather than later as they come up against the premiers.

There hasn't been a more spoken about defensive edge than Parramatta's right. The combination of Waqa Blake and Bailey Simonsson gets one last chance to prove themselves, if it goes pear-shaped then they're gone. Elsewhere in this side, Parramatta need to get their interchange balance right. Playing Paulo and RCG for the minutes they are at the moment is unsustainable in the long run, coach Brad Arthur needs to trust his bench forwards to carry the load.

Against Penrith, their task of avoiding an 0-4 start to the season is a big challenge. Penrith brutally exposed the Eels back 3 last year with Nathan Cleary's kicking game giving Blake and Simonsson nightmares to this day. However, they need to match the forward intensity from the outset.

If Hopgood, Cartwright and Matterson can't give RCG and Paulo the support they need, then it's set to be a big night for Penrith's middle.

As eluded to before, Ryan Matterson returns from suspension taking the immediate place of Matt Doorey who moves to the bench after being cleared of a knee injury. Jirah Momoisea has been demoted with former Penrith junior Brendan Hands set to make his first grade debut on the interchange bench.

Penrith on the other hand have had a 1-1 start to 2023 enjoying an early bye week. The Panthers were spending the week in Kiama for an in season camp. Over the first fortnight, the Panthers have been clunky and it's with good reason. You simply do not replace Api Koroisau and Viliame Kikau overnight, it's been a trying two weeks as Ivan Cleary tries to find the balance in the Mitch Kenny/Soni Luke era.

As a result, their attack has looked clunky with Cleary and Luai struggling to adapt to the new hooker. The camp away would've worked wonders for the spine to build that combination and fresh off this inconsistent start to the season, Parramatta has to be worried heading into this Thursday night blockbuster. You'll see a different Penrith side to what we saw in the opening fortnight, a side that looks more confident in their attacking shapes and combinations on both sides of the footy.

On the team front for the Panthers it's business as usual with only one change. Scott Sorensen returns for Matt Eisenhuth. One thing to note, Zac Hosking has played NSW Cup on the left edge (where Luke Garner is playing), so it is something to monitor in the coming weeks should Garner's form not

pick up.

WHO TO WATCH: Coming from the other side of the west, Parramatta lock forward J'maine Hopgood certainly had little expectations after playing his trade in the NSW Cup for the majority of the last two seasons. However, since coming into grade, Hopgood has been immense averaging 140 running metres and making 134 tackles across his three maiden starting matches in the blue and gold. There have been some moments under fatigue which shows that he is raw at the NRL level, but that will come with time (if Brad Arthur uses him right).

One of the game's biggest improvers last year was Dylan Edwards. Now in the upper echelon of fullbacks in our game, Edwards has proven the doubters wrong and has had a strong start to 2023. Edwards has averaged 220 running metres across his first two matches and is a critical part of Penrith's attack. He has also had 16 tackle breaks showing his unique ability as one of the game's best runners of the football. Look for Edwards to continue his strong start to 2023 with a big game against the arch-rivals.

FAVOURITE: To the shock of no-one, Penrith are overwhelming favourites for this rematch. However, at CommBank last year, Parramatta were the victors 34-10 with Nathan Cleary sent off.

MY TIP: It's hard to ignore Penrith in this one. I see the bye week making a big impact on Penrith and their combinations which will bring out the best in Cleary and Luai on their respective edges. Parramatta will continue to try, but I think their edge defence on the right against Penrith's lethal left edge is raising major red flags for me. Penrith by 10.

Friday night sees the Wests Tigers travel south to meet the Melbourne Storm at AAMI Park in what will be a desperate round four clash between two struggling teams.

Melbourne will be looking to snap out of their terrible season start. Dealt horrible injury blows and facing challenges at every turn, the once unbeatable Storm have lost two games on the trot.

From Craig Bellamy's perspective, it makes it much worse that those two losses were against Canterbury and the Gold Coast.

Playing in stifling conditions in Robina last Saturday, the Storm led the Titans into the halftime break. They couldn't hold back a strong Gold Coast comeback though, eventually going down 38-34 in a points scoring extravaganza. Their defence is something that will need extra work this week in training, especially with the unpredictable (albeit terrible) Wests Tigers attack that they'll be facing on Friday. Cameron Munster is the big in for Melbourne, with him set to

return to his number six jersey. A question mark hangs over Jahrome Hughes, as he attempts to have charges downgraded at the judiciary on Tuesday night. If successful, he will partner Munster in the halves, but Jonah Pezet is waiting in the wings if Hughes finds himself suspended.

The Wests Tigers are deservedly 0-3 to start their 2023 season. After so much pre-season hype, the Tigers have done a great job of reminding everyone of their true colours. Three straight losses, two of those in front of their home fans at the supposed fortress that is Leichhardt Oval, have meant that the Tigers have quickly slipped to wooden spoon favourites.

Last weekend in front of a sold out Belmore Sports Ground, a changed Tigers line-up failed to show any signs of life until late in the piece. Tim Sheens pulled David Nofoaluma, moved Staines to the wing, Doueihi to fullback, and Wakeham off the bench to partner Luke Brooks in the halves. The shuffle led to a handful of tries in quick succession - positive signs even if they still fell short of the win 26-22.

Doueihi will start from fullback, with Charlie Staines back onto the wing. Daine Laurie has taken a bench spot, but how Sheens uses him during the game remains to be seen. Wakeham gets his reward for a great stint last round, partnering Luke Brooks in the halves. Joe Ofahengaue and Jake Simpkin miss out.

WHO TO WATCH: Cameron Munster will make his return for Melbourne this Friday following a nasty finger injury suffered in round one. The Queensland Maroon is an important piece of the Storm spine, and his inclusion will hopefully cause a spark in his struggling team.

With over 150 NRL games to his name, he comes into the 2023 season as a Rugby League World Cup champion after lifting the trophy with the Kangaroos in the off-season.

John Bateman will line-up in the second row for his second game at the Wests Tigers. After taking his time acclimatising from English winter,

Bateman made his Tigers debut last weekend as a late inclusion in jersey twenty. The former Raiders star is back in the NRL following a stint in his home country at Wigan, and he'll want to leave his mark.

FAVOURITE: With one team bound to break their string of losses, it's the Melbourne Storm who are strongly favoured to get their season back on track despite injury issues.

MY TIP: The Storm aren't used to losing, and I think they're a bit rattled down in Melbourne at the moment. Still, they should be able to see off the Tigers. Storm by 6.

Titans Look to Keep Momentum Going Against Desperate Cowboys

The time has finally come. When the draw was released, a fair chunk of Rugby League fans immediately scanned ahead and saw that the much-anticipated Queensland rivalry was taking place in Round 4, and that anyone who was to be taken seriously as a Maroon would be either at the ground or glued to their TVs for this historic encounter.

I speak of course of the Saturday night clash between the Cowboys and the Titans at QCB Stadium (is there another game between two Queensland teams on this weekend?). The Cowboys have not looked good at all in 2023 aside from a first half against Canberra in which they had 72% of possession. Their defensive issues which reared their ugly head at the back end of 2022 have reared their ugly head again, playing a huge part in their underwhelming 1-2 start to the season.

The Titans in 2023 have been promising so far, but still have a lot to work on. In round one against the Tigers, their goal line defence was rock solid, however events since then point to that showing being an anomaly largely brought on by the ineptitude of their opposition. Despite a good win against an admittedly underhanded Storm side last week, they conceded 34 points, which is not the recipe for sustained success in the NRL.

On form, the Cowboys are one of the worst teams in the

competition at the moment. At the back end of last year, their defence wasn't good, but their attack was dynamic enough that it meant they could concede 24+ points and still scrape by with a win on occasion. This year, it hasn't been the case. Their 3 tries in Round 1 all came in a first half that they had over 70% of possession in, while the two tries per game they've had since then is an accurate indicator of how poor they've looked with ball in hand.

If there's any team the Cowboys would want to come up against to play their attack back into form, it's the Titans. They've conceded the third most points through three rounds, including 32 to the unfancied Dragons and 34 to an undermanned Storm team at home. The Titans edge defence is extremely susceptible to shifts, and their middle is not well equipped to handle broken field situations, with many of the Melbourne's tries last week being scored off plays originating over 10 metres away from the Titans' line.

In team news, the Cowboys are still without star fullback Scott Drinkwater, meaning Tom Chester is back for another week. Reuben Cotter is out until round 6 with a knee injury, meaning Griffin Neame will start in the front row and James Tamou will come onto the bench.

For the Titans, Justin Holbrook is rolling with an unchanged 17 from the side that beat the Storm last week.

WHO TO WATCH: Fresh off signing a huge 900k per year extension, Cowboys second rower Jeremiah Nanai has been virtually non-existent in 2023 so far. In the first 3 games, he has made 14 runs for 117 running metres. Those aren't his stats for last week, those are his stats for the entire season combined so far. Along with providing almost no impact with ball in hand, Nanai has been a turnstile in defence, currently sitting 2nd in the competition for total missed tackles with 15. This trend should be of huge concern for the Cowboys

considering they have just forked out premium coin to secure his services until the end of 2027. Granted, it's a small sample size, but the numbers paint a picture of player who just isn't interested in doing the hard yards for his team, and Todd Payten's number 1 priority this week should be doing everything he can to get Nanai's production back to what it was last season. One can only wonder what the headlines would be if he hadn't scored two tries in the loss against Brisbane (probably similar to what we've seen for the young highly paid back-rower on the other team).

For the Titans, AJ Brimson is relishing life at fullback so far this season after spending 2022 bouncing around other spine positions and the bench utility role. Last week he was integral in the Titans winning the shootout against Melbourne, notching up two try assists, two tackle breaks and an offload, while also being heavily involved in their final try which sealed the game, positioning himself to catch the bat-back and then getting the ball out to the edge for Aaron Schoupp to score. His inside ball to Khan-Pereira for the first try was also class; many lesser players would've found a way to butcher the play in that situation. His kicking game close to the line also came in clutch, putting in a perfect grubber on the stroke of halftime for Brian Kelly to cut the lead in half. Against the Cowboys suspect defence, expect Brimson to have another standout performance if the Titans are to get the victory.

FAVOURITE: The Cowboys are favoured by 6.5 points at the time of writing.

MY TIP: This one is quite simple for me, the Cowboys so far have shown they can't attack or defend, while the Titans have shown they can't defend but are pretty good in attack. With that in mind, give me the Titans by 10 in a high scoring affair.

Sattler's spirit lives on at South Sydney

The South Sydney Rabbitohs will pay tribute to a club legend on Saturday evening when they host the Manly Sea Eagles at Accor Stadium.

The match will serve as a tribute to South Sydney legend John Sattler, who passed away earlier this week, aged 80.

Sattler made 195 appearances for the Rabbitohs in first grade between 1963 and 1972, where he captained the side to victory in four grand finals.

He was revered in rugby league folklore for his performance in the 1970 grand final, which saw him lead the side to victory over Manly despite playing through the pain of a broken jaw.

Coming off back-to-back losses to sit outside the top eight approaching the end of the opening month of the season, the South Sydney Rabbitohs will be looking to continue a recent run of dominance over their weekend opponents.

Winning their past six matches against the Sea Eagles dating back to 2019, the Rabbitohs fell narrowly short against their foundation rivals, the Roosters, (20-18) last Friday.

Coach Jason Demetriou has recalled Daniel Suluka-Fifita after Hame Sele was required to stand down as part of the league's new concussion protocols, while Jacob Host will make his first appearance in the NRL since last year's Magic Round.

Yet to taste defeat in 2023 following two wins and a bye from their opening three matches, the Manly Sea Eagles will be hoping to begin a season with three straight wins for only their third time in the NRL era.

Getting the better of the Eels (34-30) in a match lacking defensive rigour last Thursday, coach Anthony Seibold has retained the same squad for the side's first away trip of the season.

The Sea Eagles hold a dismal record at Accor Stadium, winning one of their past 13 matches at the venue, over the past decade.

WHO TO WATCH: Returning to the bench after making the most of his opportunity in the starting side over the opening rounds, Michael Chee Kam shapes as an attacking point of difference for the home side. Capable of game-breaking pieces of play, as evidenced by his time with the Tigers, the 31-year-old has been productive with and without the ball during the first three weeks with 38 tackles and 90 running metres on average. Debuting with the Sea Eagles nearly a

decade ago, look for Chee Kam to showcase his attacking flair as the season progresses.

Making a dazzling return to the NRL after missing much of last season through injury, Tom Trbojevic has been at the forefront of Manly's positive start to 2023. Scoring three tries, setting up a further two, breaking 15 tackles and averaging 188 running metres in two matches, the 26-year-old Mona Vale junior will need to maintain those figures if the Sea Eagles hope to remain unbeaten. Considered one of the best players of his generation when fully fit, the one-time Dally M medallist will relish his personal duel opposite Latrell Mitchell on Saturday evening.

FAVOURITE: The Rabbitohs have been installed as favourites despite going down in their past two matches.

MY TIP: With so much emotion surrounding the club in the lead up to Saturday's fixture, the Rabbitohs will need to stay focused on the task at hand in order to come away with two valuable premiership points. Rabbitohs by 6.

THE PREVIEW

After a surprising and confidence building victory over the North Queensland Cowboys on the weekend, the Warriors return home to New Zealand, welcoming the 2-1 Canterbury Bankstown Bulldogs to Mt Smart Stadium.

It's the Warriors first outing at Mt Smart this season after winning their opening game of the season in Wellington and they take some nice form into this clash. They've won two of their three games so far with their only loss coming against the Sydney Roosters as they fought valiantly in an eight-point loss.

In their most recent outing, the Warriors fought back from an early deficit to win by 14-points in Townsville thanks to a Te Maire Martin masterclass as the 27-year-old contributed with two try assists and three line break assists. He'll be crucial once again this weekend against the Bulldogs and his combination with Shaun Johnson will only get better with each match they play together.

It showed on the weekend as they moved this side around the park to show to the rest of the competition that the Warriors aren't push overs this season. Led by Tohu Harris, playing his 200th game, the Warriors completed 80 percent of their sets and fell just short of 2000 run metres as they looked dangerous in attack.

If they can bring this attacking output into Sunday's clash, they'll give the Bulldogs a run for their money. However, the Warriors will be without hooker Wayde Egan who misses the match after a head knock on the weekend and his absence will be felt, having played an effective role out of dummy-half.

It'll be up to his replacement, Freddy Lussick, to bring the Warriors forwards onto the ball which will be needed after

the Bulldogs forward pack put together an impressive performance against the Wests Tigers.

The Bulldogs pack played immensely on Sunday, especially in the first half, moving the ball down the middle of the field with ease and preventing the Tigers forwards from doing the same. Max King and Jacob Preston in particular were excellent, both eclipsing 130 metres in their four-point victory.

Five-Eighth Matt Burton was superb on Sunday and his combination with new recruit Vilame Kikau is only getting better with each match, this is a duo to watch out for. Kikau is starting to find his feet in Belmore, breaking four tackles, running for 84 metres and generally attracting a lot of attention from opposition defences.

Although, the most impressive aspect of the Bulldogs has been their back five. They all hit the triple figure mark on the weekend and whenever they are given space to work with, they look incredibly dangerous. It's where they did most of their damage against the Melbourne Storm two weeks ago.

The Warriors need to reduce the impact of this back five. They're heavily used in returning the ball for the Bulldogs and a good kicking performance from Martin and Johnson can reduce the impact they have. The next step is to limit their impact if the ball is shifted early in the tackle count, the Bulldogs utilised this well against Melbourne and they'll no doubt look to it this weekend. So the Warriors back five have a big matchup ahead of them.

The home side can strike with their own weapons in the back five and all focus will be on Marcelo Montoya after his mammoth performance on the weekend. A double, 246 metres, three line breaks and six tackle breaks for winger and he'll be looking to give it to his former club.

A bonus for the Warriors back five is the return of Charnze Nicoll-Klokstad who returns from a head injury, taking the place of youngsters Taine Tuapiki. Jackson Ford bolsters their forward pack as he also returns from a head injury and Mitch Barnett drops out with a neck injury.

The Bulldogs have named the same 17 from their victory over the Wests Tigers on Sunday.

WHO TO WATCH: After an impressive performance on the weekend, Te Maire Martin will draw close attention from the Dogs. It's good to see the five-eighth back and enjoying his footy after a tough few years and he'll be looking for more try assists this weekend. Winger Marcelo Montoya is one to keep an eye on after arguably his best performance of his career. Montoya is averaging 204 metres per game this season and that sort of yardage will be incredibly important for the Warriors on Sunday. Tohu Harris had his usual workmanlike performance in his 200th game, finishing with 142 metres and 41 tackles. His other performances this season have yielded 145 and 144 metres and 51 and 60 tackles.

19-year-old Paul Alamoti has made an impressive start to his NRL career and is hardly showing his age as he impresses with each performance. He was outstanding against the Storm and the Tigers with three try assists and 381 metres combined in those outings. The man outside him, Josh Addo-Carr, has benefitted massively with his two tries against the Tigers coming from Alamoti but 'the fox' is looking dangerous as ever, already with 17 tackle breaks this season. World Cup winner, Matt Burton, was quiet in his first two outings, but turned it on against the Tigers with a try, five tackle breaks and 141 metres. He will no doubt be sending some massive torpedos towards the Warriors kick returners and their ability to defuse these will have a massive impact on the game.

FAVOURITE: This is a fairly even matchup given the form of both sides and the home ground advantage in the Warriors favour. That probably gives them the slight edge in terms of favouritism, and they also have won four straight against the Dogs dating back to 2019.

MY TIP: I really don't know which way this one will go, I can see either team coming away with the victory. The Warriors have performed well in all three of their matches, the Bulldogs in two, however, those two were quite convincing. I have to go with the home side in a one point thriller. Warriors by one point.

Two of the bigger unknown quantities in 2023 clash on Sunday afternoon when Newcastle plays host to Canberra.

For the Knights, it was always going to be a challenge to match the Dolphins without Kalyn Ponga, who remains sidelined this week after suffering a concussion against the Tigers.

But Newcastle was actually able to stay in touch with the NRL's newest franchise before falling away late, even after Dolphins second rower Felise Kaufusi was sent to the sin bin.

Errors proved costly down the stretch, with winger Dominic Young one of the worst culprits and the tough night under the high ball ended up costing the 21-year-old his spot in the starting side.

It sees former Titans powerhouse Greg Marzhev take his spot on the wing in one of a few changes for the home team, with Jayden Brailey returning at hooker from a head knock in a boost.

Jack Johns is also back from an ankle injury while Daniel Saifiti has been named despite suffering a shoulder injury in last week's loss against the Dolphins.

Knights coach Adam O'Brien did not seem too optimistic about Saifiti's chances of playing Sunday's game, so there is every chance the representative forward is a late scratching.

Should that be the case, either Dylan Lucas or Thomas Cant could be added to the bench for what would be their second NRL game with Jack Hetherington an option to come into the starting side.

Tyson Frizell has also been named on the extended bench as he looks to make a return from an ankle injury in a reshuffle that would likely see Johns drop out of the team and send Brodie Jones back to the interchange.

While it is hard to get a read on just how good the Knights are this year, they were always expected to be battling at the bottom of the ladder.

The Raiders though appear the bigger mystery earlier in the season, proving they can still take it to the best in the league last week when they took down the Sharks 24-20.

Canberra had been thereabouts in the opening fortnight of the season, going down in close games to North Queensland and the Dolphins.

But that has been an issue for the Raiders since they made it all the way to the grand final in 2019.

Ricky Stuart's side hasn't been bad - certainly not bad enough to be in the conversation for the wooden spoon.

But they haven't been great either - certainly not great enough to be genuine title contenders, seemingly resigned to being also-rans who are always hovering around the top eight.

Canberra's opening three games this year seem to suggest that is not going to change in 2023, although a comprehensive win over Newcastle would be a step in the right direction.

Prop Josh Papali'i plays his first game of the year after recovering from a calf injury while Zac Woolford replaces the injured Danny Levi (broken jaw) at hooker in team news.

WHO TO WATCH: If the Knights are any hope of causing an upset on Sunday it is going to come from individual brilliance, like that fullback Lachlan Miller showed last week in the defeat to the Dolphins. Newcastle made a play for Miller to help facilitate Ponga's move to the halves and while the Knights may be without their most dangerous attacking weapon, the former rugby sevens star helped fill the void last Friday. Miller's support play was excellent and helped him score two tries to go with 212 run metres, two linebreaks and six tackle busts. If Miller continues to push up and Newcastle's forwards get the second-phase play going, there may be opportunities to poke holes in Canberra's defence.

As for Canberra, the clear advantage this weekend is up front and a refreshed Josh Papali'i is someone to fear. Papali'i was sidelined for the opening three games of the season with a calf injury but has been named to start in Sunday's game and is expected to quickly make up for lost time. If Newcastle is not able to contain Papali'i early, the home side could find itself on the wrong end of a lopsided scoreline before halftime. The Knights have one of the most passionate and loyal supporter bases in the league but that means little in a one-sided game.

FAVOURITE: The Raiders are expected to make it two wins on the trot.

MY TIP: It's always a lottery when Canberra travels away from the nation's capital but the Raiders have been close in every game this season and have the superior forward pack to do this comfortably. Canberra by 14.

THE PREVIEW

The conclusion of Round 4 sees yet another local derby as the St George Illawarra Dragons play host to their local rivals Cronulla, with both sides looking to bounce back from losses in Round 3.

St George Illawarra come into the game with a win and a loss from their opening two matches of the season, after starting the year with a Round 1 bye.

They were well and truly in the contest for 70 minutes last weekend at Suncorp Stadium before a capitulation saw the Broncos put four tries past the Red V in the final ten, to consign them to a 40-18 defeat.

A strong performance in their first game - a home win over the Titans - was a big confidence boost for the Dragons who struggled in the pre-season challenge and then last week they looked good for a long period of the contest before they fell victim to Brisbane's scintillating attack.

Coming up against the Sharks, they will have confidence that they can match their opponents for a long period - especially given Cronulla's patchy form - something the visitors need to improve on.

The Red V have one change to their side with rookie Toby Couchman returning on the bench after missing last week's game through concussion management protocols. The return of Couchman sees Michael Molo drop to the reserves in what is an otherwise unchanged lineup.

Cronulla have been inconsistent over the opening three weeks and, despite some good looking and strong football at times, they've also looked very soft occasionally. They will want to improve on their 1-2 start to the season. Last weekend, they went down to Canberra 24-20 in a game that saw the scoreboard flatter them.

All up, they have shown that they can match any team with impressive moments - against Souths in Round 1 they looked good before falling into a heap - just like their opponents this coming Sunday.

In Round 2, the Sharks got a victory over Parramatta, though having to come from behind and then hold off a fast-finishing Eels outfit. In Sunday's loss against the Raiders, they were poor - and lucky to stay in the contest.

The teamsheet holds a massive boost for them though, in the shape of Nicho Hynes returning to the side for the first time in 2023 after recovering from a niggling calf injury.

This sees Braydon Trindall (who has arguably been the best player for Cronulla this season) moving to the bench and Jack Williams to 18th man.

WHO TO WATCH: After being under pressure in the fullback role last season, Tyrell Sloan has had a good start to the season. Coming up against the Sharks, his position is going to be the focus especially with the way that the Sharks play. The last few minutes of last week's game will put the Dragons custodian under big pressure.

Returning from injury, Hynes is going to make a big impact for the Sharks but the question is whether he is 100% fit. The team from the Shire have played mixed football and naturally the return of the Dally M winner is going to have an impact, but it's whether the rest of the Cronulla team can step up with him as well.

FAVOURITE: The Sharks are the favourites with a stronger line up.

MY TIP: It is hard to go past the Sharks, they have a better line up on paper and the return of Nicho Hynes proves a bigger boost.

The overall quality of football is better from the Sharks in the past few weeks and the capitulation at the end from the Dragons last week was poor.

The key factor will be the performance of Nicho Hynes which is how I think Cronulla step up. Sharks by 10.

Manly have opened their season being undefeated after three rounds for the first time since 2007, despite a determined Eels side that engaged in a flurry of point scoring in the final ten minutes of the game - finishing 34-30 winners at Brookvale.

With 10 minutes remaining in the game, Manly held a narrow 22-16 lead in what had been, up to that point, a reasonably strong performance from both outfits defensively. But then a switch flicked and everything went haywire. Josh Schuster placed a shallow bomb towards the Eel's posts and found Haumole Olakau'atu who caught the ball cleanly before falling over the line for a try. Reuben Garrick converted and Manly lead 28-16 with 8 minutes remaining. Maika Sivo capped a nice left side movement with a try in the corner which Mitch Moses failed to convert. The Eels trailed by 8 with 6 minutes remaining. Parramatta refused to go away, employing some second phase play in the middle of the field, and after 3 offloads, the ball finally made it to Josh Hodgson, who dummed, shaped to kick and then dashed through a yawning gap to race 40 metres to score. Moses converted to reduce Manly's lead to 2 points with 3 minutes remaining. From the restart, J'maine Hopgood tried to continue the second phase play, but his pushed offload was intercepted by Olakau'atu who ran 25 metres to score. Garrick added the extras and extended Manly's lead to 34-26 with just under 3 minutes remaining. From the ensuing set, Parramatta marched downfield and on their last tackle, sent Sivo in for his second try in the space of just four minutes. Moses again failed to convert. Manly then settled down with 90 seconds on the clock and held on for a tight 4 point victory.

Earlier in the match, Manly got off to a great start with an 8th minute try to Garrick to bulldozed his way through Clint Gutherson. Garrick converted his try and then kicked a penalty goal 11 minutes later. Tom Trbojevic playing like his older brother, stormed onto a short ball from the dummy half after a strong Schuster run on the previous tackle, and barged his way over to score a strong try. Garrick again converted. Five minutes before halftime, Gutherson got his side on the board when he swept around the back on the left side, threw several dummies before slicing through the edge defence to score a good solo try. Moses converted. Parramatta scored again less than 3 minutes later when Matt Doorey barged onto a crash ball and smashed his way over the line. Moses was unable to add the extras. At halftime, Manly's 14-0 lead had been whittled down to 14-10.

Parramatta continued where they left off when play resumed when Gutherson shrugged out of a tackle and then ran through the vacant space in front of him to score another good solo try. Moses converted from in front to give the Eels a 16-14 lead after 45 minutes. Manly hit back two quickfire tries in 4 minutes, first to Tom Trbojevic who pounced on a crafty little chip by Schuster and then by Brad Parker who dived on a loose ball in the Parramatta in-goal to score a well-deserved try in his 100th NRL game. The Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs have recorded a rare victory at Belmore after accounting for the Wests Tigers 26-22 on Sunday afternoon.

Adding a further try to send a chill down the spine of the Belmore faithful, Brooks broke through the Bulldogs defence with a dummy and found Charlie Staines (70th minute) in support to narrow the margin to four points.
