THE PREVIEW with Lachy MacCorquodale

Fresh off the bye, the Sydney Roosters return to action this Thursday night as they host the Parramatta Eels at Allianz Stadium.

The Roosters took some solid form into their bye after victories over the Warriors and South Sydney Rabbitohs in the two games prior. Despite no football over the weekend, the Roosters were a big topic of conversation with the announcement that Joseph Suaalii will sign on with Rugby Australia when his contract with the Roosters concludes at the end of 2024. However, don't expect that news to distract Suaalii and the Roosters who look to secure their third win of the season against an Eels side that has just knocked off the defending premiers. Winning on Thursday night will send a message to the competition that the Roosters are going to be right in contention for a top four spot, something that they've failed to do in recent seasons.

Their forward pack will be rested and ready to go with the likes of Jared Waerea-Hargreaves, Brandon Smith and Victor Radley the most likely to bring aggression towards a good Parramatta forward pack. They'll aim to lay the platform for Luke Keary and Sam Walker who will utilise the Roosters dangerous backline to create attacking opportunities for the tricolours. They did this so well against the Rabbitohs a fortnight ago where they scored four tries in the space of 30 minutes to take the lead. Keary, Walker and James Tedesco will look to attack Parramatta on the edges, where they look their weakest but if the Eels played like they did against the Penrith Panthers last Thursday, it may be hard to do so. The Eels landed their first win of the season in that outing, knocking off the defending premiers in a Grand Final rematch by a point. Mitchell Moses' field goal in golden point was a moment of justification, hours after reports of his resigning with club surfaced. The halfback was instrumental, kicking for 1,006 metres as they forced the Panthers to start from their own 20 all night. They were excellent at this and a similar tactic against the Roosters could produce similar results. However, this was dependent on a completion rate of 95 percent which is utterly absurd and will be hard to replicate. Their forward pack was a big contributor to this with all five starting forwards running for over 140 metres including monster efforts from Reagan Campbell-Gillard (255 metres) and Junior Paulo (244 metres).

This pack has another tough challenge ahead of them, facing a fresh and aggressive Roosters pack that was excellent against the Rabbitohs a fortnight ago. Paulo is out for the clash through suspension and Wiremu Greig will get his first start of the season after limited opportunity from the bench.

Parramatta have been handed a tough draw to start the season and it has resulted in the 2022 runners-up starting 1-3 through their first four games and they'll be desperate to turn that one into a two.

Paulo is the only omission for Parramatta which allows for Jack Murchie to return to the bench after missing Round four with a concussion.

The Sydney Roosters had made two changes to their side from two weeks ago with Joseph Manu spending a week on the sidelines for his high tackle on Isaiah Tass. Drew Hutchinson gets the start in the centres whilst Corey Allen joins the bench. The other change is Naufahu White coming in for Terrell May. WHO TO WATCH: There's plenty of big names lining up for another cracker of Thursday night footy. The Roosters fullback and Australian captain, James Tedesco is obviously one of the best players in the competition, let alone this match. The New South Wales fullback is yet to score a try in 2023 but he has assisted one in each of their three outings whilst averaging 168 metres and 4.3 tackle breaks per game. In his forward pack is 34-year-old Jared Waerea-Hargreaves who was exceptional coming off the bench in his first game of the year against the Rabbitohs. In 38 minutes, the New Zealand international ran for 174 metres and made 23 tackles.

In the blue and gold, it's the man of the moment from last Thursday, Mitchell Moses who was outstanding against the Panthers. Two tries and two try assists to begin the season is a solid start for the Parramatta halfback, but he'll be kicking himself that they've only won the one game to start the season. There's another two points available on Thursday and he'll be dying to take it. His front-rower Reagan Campbell-Gillard was outstanding last week and has had massive performances throughout the season. Campbell-Gillard is averaging 191 metres per game this year and just shy of 30 tackles, highlighting the mountain of work he gets through.

FAVOURITE: The Roosters are the favourites heading into this fixture given their form and the week off to rest their bodies. This contest is a two apiece in their last four outings with each side winning one last year.

MY TIP: It'll be tough for Parramatta to back up from last week's efforts, especially against a rested Roosters side, I think that may be enough to get the Roosters over the line in a tight affair. Roosters by two points.

Defending Premiers Penrith travel to Canberra looking to bounce back.

The Canberra Raiders will host the Penrith Panthers on Friday evening, with both teams coming off shock previous round losses.

Ricky's Raiders are facing an uphill battle if they want to play finals this season. Sitting in 16th currently and with just one win against their name, they need to get their season back on track, and they need to do it quickly. Last week they faced the Knights away in front of over 15,000 fans and were ambushed, going down 24-14 at the final siren.

With no Wighton this week, it's Matt Frawley and Jamal Fogarty who pair up in the halves for the Green Machine. James Schiller misses out with experienced winger Jordan Rapana making his return from suspension.

The Penrith Panthers have not had the breezy season start that some may have expected from the back-toback premiers. With one win from three games, they find themselves in 7th with some help from the bye.

Both of their losses have been by just one point, so Panthers fans will be hoping to not have their hearts broken at the death yet again this Friday.

Despite the loss at Parramatta last weekend, it was their star halfback's clutch two point field goal to level the game in the last play of regular time which caught all the headlines.

But it wasn't to be for the Panthers, going down 17-16 early into golden point. It was a hard fought battle for both clubs, with the sides tied at two tries a piece in the grand final rematch.

FAVOURITE: The Penrith Panthers are the strong favourites to get the victory away from home.

MY TIP: The Panthers will be looking to prove a point after their dramatic loss to Parramatta, and the defending premiers will be too much for Canberra to deal with. Panthers by 14.

Manly look to bounce back v rejuvenated Knights

The Manly Warringah Sea Eagles will be looking to bounce back following their first loss of the season when they take on the Newcastle Knights at Glen Willow Regional Stadium in Mudgee.

Manly were very unfortunate to go down last start against South Sydney after they were left to rue a controversial forward pass call that went against the Sea Eagles. However, they can take a lot away from this golden point heartbreaker which leaves the Manly side better off as the season continues on.

Heading into this clash with the Knights, there are weaknesses that I believe can be explored. The impact Tommy Turbo can have in the red-zone. South Sydney were able to nullify Turbo last week and his ability to get on the ball wasn't at the same levels it was against Parramatta. I expect Anthony Seibold to get him involved more on set plays.

Elsewhere, Josh Schuster needs to be more involved in the attacking phase of play. Schuster gave many fans a front row seat to his highs and lows last season and if his first two games are any indication, it could be a bumpy ride if his touches in the red-zone drop away.

On the teams front, Tolu Koula is out for the next 6-8 weeks with an MCL injury which is a blow to that right edge of Manly which has looked on shaky ground recently. It's going to get shakier with Morgan Harper replacing him. Lachie Croker does return with Lawton dropping to the reserves.

Newcastle have shown some improvement in year 4 of the Adam O'Brien era. Already having to use players outside his top 30, the Knights boss must be commended for the way he has rallied the troops to a surprising 2-2 start to the season.

Last start against Canberra was another example of this with Lachie Miller finding his feet as the number two playmaking option while Kalyn Ponga is in Canada getting advice on his playing future. Also to impress was new buy Greg Marzhew. While criticised for his defensive reads, his attacking phase makes him one of the better wingers in the competition. Elsewhere, the forwards lifted in the continued absence of Jacob Saifiti with Jack Hethrington and Mat Croker making their desired impact.

To beat Manly, the Knights need to target the right of Manly. As mentioned, that edge defensively is an accident waiting to happen. Bradman Best was able to exploit the Raiders a couple of times down that side of the field and with Manly looking suspect, it's the perfect time to strike. Elsewhere, Manly's middle lacked punch when their rotation kicked into gear and it's yet another opportunity for guys like Hethrington and Croker to show their worth.

On the teams front, you don't change a winning formula unless forced to. Adam O'Brien has named a near identical lineup. The only change is Kurt Mann is out with concussion and Jack Johns replaces him. WHO TO WATCH: I'm going to go a little deeper on Josh Schuster. A lot was made about his weight loss and his move to 5/8 and his first game back saw some changes. But, Manly went away from getting Schuster involved against Souths for some reason and it brought dire consequences.

A Schuster without the footy is a disinterested one, and at times he looked it against Souths. Look for Seibold to allow Schuster to get good quality ball in this one.

As mentioned before, the swap deal to bring Lachlan Miller to the Knights might become one of Adam O'Brien's big legacy marks on Newcastle. Miller is getting more and more comfortable with every passing week and with his confidence building, the Knights will be a better side.

His start to the season was a little slow, but in the last two weeks, his attacking skills are showing rapidly and it's why he's the man to inspire Newcastle to victory on Saturday.

FAVOURITE: On the markets, Manly start slight favourites here. Manly have also won their last two games in Mudgee by 13 points or more.

MY TIP: It's hard to tip this one, as it's a match that could easily go either way. However, I see Manly rising to the occasion in Mudgee in front of the country fans to redeem themselves for last week's loss. But I will concede it will be closer than Manly's other matches in the regional city. Manly by 6.

A return to Wollongong will be something that the Dragons hope that can re-spark their start to the season as an injury hit Dolphins sides heads to the NSW South Coast to keep their strong start to their inaugural season going.

The Dragons showed so much promise in their opening match of the season in Round 2 against the Titans where they looked as if they had turned the corner of previous seasons as they were super strong.

The past fortnight though has seen that there isn't a full tank of fire for the Dragon as in both their loss to the Broncos and Sharks, the Red 'V' have collapsed faster than the Berlin Wall coming down.

Last weekend, the Dragons looked extremely sharp during the first half of their game against the Cronulla Sharks where they were matching and surpassing the Sharks at times during the opening forty minutes with some swift plays and a high completion rate. The second half was a total 'dogs breakfast' for the Red V with basic handling errors coming out of trouble and defence that just didn't look interested at all as the Sharks sensed blood in the water and took advantage putting 28 unanswered points on the Dragons. Belin tipped to return from a calf injury despite only being named in the reserves. The main 1-17 is unchanged as named last week by coach Anthony Griffin.

The "Redcliffe" Dolphins tasted defeat for the first time in the NRL last weekend as they were far from disgraced in their 18-12 loss to table toppers the Brisbane Broncos. The Dolphins have been impressive across the opening four rounds as many people didn't give them much chance but a strong team dynamic has helped them significantly.

Outside of Round 1, the Broncos proved the biggest test for the Dolphins so far in 2023 and they were far from as they were able to come from 8-0 down at one state to lead 12-8 mid-way through the second half. The lead wasn't to be as the Broncos came back to win but the proof was there that even key outs and bumps in the game plan the Dolphins can match it with the best teams in the comp.

The Dolphins have been forced into a major change with halfback Sean O'Sullivan disappointingly suffering a torn pectoral muscle an hour into last week's game. Anthony Milford is moved into the halfback role after replacing Isaiya Katoa at five-eighth when the ex-Panther was ruled out last week.

Katoa returns into the six jersey whilst the Dolphins have also lost Tesi Niu to a knee injury. Jack Bostock is expected to make his debut and Jeremy Marshall-King returns to the hooker role with Mason Teague heading to the bench. WHO TO WATCH: After some pretty brash words about his sides efforts last week, there is going to be a lot of focus on the performance of Ben Hunt who was about the only player to put his hand up for the entire 80 minutes last week. Hunt is a world class performer but he has struggled at times and it's down to the lack of quality around him. Hunt needs to ensure that the Dragons are on the same page if they want to get past the Dolphins.

An individual match winner, Isaiya Katoa has a calm head on his shoulders as seen during the 2022 Jersey Flegg grand final, but the pressure has stepped up from that effort for the Panthers to the NRL which in his 3 games he has handled well but without the dominant leader Sean O'Sullivan there, Katoa will need to play a controlling game. The poise and footballing smarts of Katoa are going to be important for the Dolphins this week and right through the season without O'Sullivan there to do most of the work. Katoa needs to be the dominant half if the Dolphins are to win.

FAVOURITE: The Dragons have been put as favourites for the contest but it's not by a huge margin and with a lack of past head to head football, it's hard to make a judgment on the teams against each other.

MY TIP: It's a coin flip of a game, it could go in about four different directions with the Dragons firing and running up a score or they could make their fans want to jump into the Wollongong Ocean (as called by Paul Vautin once) next to the hill. The loss of Sean O'Sullivan puts the game into the Dragons favour but I can't see this game being that big of a blowout. Dragons by 2.

First plays last in 'joke' of a fixture

A clash of contrasting fortune awaits on Saturday evening as the first-placed Brisbane Broncos host the last-placed Wests Tigers at Suncorp Stadium.

Sitting atop the premiership ladder as the only undefeated side after the opening month of the season, the Brisbane Broncos will come into the clash as overwhelming favourites.

Rallying from a second half deficit to record an 18-12 victory over the Dolphins in the inaugural battle of Brisbane last Friday, coach Kevin Walters will be hoping his side can become the first Broncos outfit to open a season with five consecutive victories since 1998.

Retaining the same squad that prevailed on home soil last

week, edge forward Jordan Riki will make his 50th first grade appearance after debuting with the club during the ill-fated 2020 campaign.

Languishing at the bottom of the ladder as the only club without a win so far this season, the Wests Tigers will be hoping a strong recent record against their weekend opponents continues.

Unable to claw back a halftime deficit during last Friday's 24-12 loss to the Storm in Melbourne, coach Tim Sheens has once again altered his line up by naming Jake Simpkin, Justin Matamua and Starford To'a on the bench in place of Daine Laurie, Shawn Blore and Alex Seyfarth.

While the Tigers hold a poor overall record against the Broncos with nine wins from 31 previous encounters, the joint venture has won the past four clashes between the two sides in succession.

WHO TO WATCH: Patrick Carrigan will be out to make amends after incurring a season-derailing suspension when the two sides faced off late last season. Spending four weeks on the sidelines which coincided with the side spiralling from fourth all the way out of the top eight by season's end,

the 25-year-old has been in fine form this season averaging 165 running metres and 36 tackles each week. Making his first grade debut against the Tigers back in 2019, Carrigan will be hoping to capitalise on the lowly opposition and claim his first try in the top grade.

Enjoying the best form of his career since beginning the transition from the backline to the forwards, Asu Kepaoa has been a rare shining light in trying times for the joint venture. Beginning his time in the NRL on the wing before spending time in the centres last season, the Auckland-born 23-year-old has offered a much-needed point of difference in attack this season, especially as an edge back-rower. Named in the backline once again after snaring a try in last week's loss to the Storm, look for Kepaoa to create havoc with the ball in hand.

FAVOURITE: It should come as no surprise to see the Broncos installed as overwhelming favourites to extend their winning run to five in a row.

MY TIP: Saturday may be April Fools' Day but it will be no laughing matter at the end of 80 minutes for the visitors. Broncos by 28.

Finally, a Sunday afternoon Free-To-Air game that lives up to the hype.

After Round 1's exciting Sunday afternoon clash between the Dolphins and Roosters, we've had a pretty lean run of Sunday 4:05pm matches, if we're being honest. With respect to the Knights, Tigers, Raiders and Bulldogs, none are high-flying sides, nor could you describe any of the contests involving the four clubs over the last three Sundays as high quality.

And so it is that we arrive at Pointsbet Stadium on Sunday with a clash between two teams who are in a solid run of form.

Cronulla appear to have hit their stride after a shaky opening month, Nicho Hynes' return at half helping them put the cleaners through local rivals St George Illawarra on Sunday night at Kogarah.

The Warriors are in a rich vein of form themselves. Andrew Webster's side has stayed in every battle this season, losing only to the Roosters at Allianz Stadium in Round 2. At times, veteran halfback Shaun Johnson has turned back the clock, with his class most evident in last weekend's nail-biting win over Canterbury at Mt Smart Stadium. Both sides had different key strengths in their Round 4 contests - the Sharks-Dragons contest was relatively scrappy in terms of handling, with both sides only completing at 75%, but Cronulla's running metres were off the charts, outpacing their opposition by some 500+ metres across the evening.

The Warriors topped the Bulldogs in those statistic areas last week themselves - albeit by a much smaller margin. Where the NZ side excelled was in completion rates, 88% with 37 from 42 completed.

Cronulla are further boosted ahead of this contest by the return of Braydon Trindall, who missed last Sunday's clash due to an ankle injury. He replaces Oregon Kaufusi on the interchange.

The news isn't as good for the travelling side. Te Maire Martin (concussion) is out, which offers Ronald Volkman a chance in the halves alongside Johnson. There is some joy further down the teamlist with Wayde Egan returning at hooker, pushing Freddy Lussick out of the 17, and Tohu Harris is named in the initial teamlist despite suffering an uglylooking knee injury in Sunday's win over Canterbury.

A quick look back over the recent history between these sides shows Cronulla exerting dominance - they won both clashes in 2022 quite comfortably - with the Warriors only managing two wins from the last twelve clashes dating back to 2015. In fact, when it comes to Sunday's venue - Pointsbet Stadium - the New Zealand-based side has only recorded 5 wins from 19 clashes at the venue. WHO TO WATCH: The man who replaced Shaun Johnson hasn't done too badly for himself.

Nicho Hynes picked up the Dally M player of the year award in 2022, an outstanding addition to the Sharks side last year after his departure from Melbourne.

In last week's win over the Dragons he was pivotal as always, with three try assists and five line-break assists, as well as booting five of the side's six goals as they cruised to a decisive victory over their neighbours.

For many, the jury is still out on the 'return of the prodigal son'. Shaun Johnson returned to the Auckland-based outfit after three seasons at Cronulla, but it didn't result in any kind of acceleration up the table. Of his 25 games since returning to the Warriors, he's only seen victory on 8 occasions - three of those being this season.

While early indications are that the Warriors looks like they're on the up, he'll need to maintain that positive form to give the side a chance of finals action.

FAVOURITE: Home ground advantage, Nicho in the side and injuries aplenty for the visitors = Cronulla strong favourites.

MV TIP: This will be another low scoring grind for mine, but unlike previous weeks, the Warriors won't have the petrol in the tank. Cronulla are on the up and will win this one. Sharks by 6.

Two sides with high expectations but struggling for consistency battle on Sunday night

For both the Bulldogs and Cowboys, 2023 promised bigger and better things.

Sure, there was no guarantee of a top-eight finish for Canterbury-Bankstown but a star-studded recruitment drive and the hiring of coach Cameron Ciraldo gave fans reason to believe.

As for North Queensland, having fallen just one game short of the grand final last season, it was expected that another year of experience could see Todd Payten's side go one better.

It's too early to put a line through either team so far but it's also just incredibly hard to get a read on both the Bulldogs and Cowboys as the competition enters April.

The Bulldogs flashed their enormous potential in a comprehensive win over the Storm but last week's 16-14 loss to the Warriors showed there is also still plenty of room for improvement.

The Cowboys, meanwhile, snapped a two-game losing

skid last week but were hardly convincing as they took advantage of a depleted Titans team 24-12.

In team news, fan favourite Josh Reynolds returns in his first game for the club in six years as the utility replaces Fa'amanu Brown (dislocated elbow) on the bench.

Meanwhile, Franklin Pele also joins the bench with Jayden Tanner pushing to the reserves but there is still no Tevita Pangai Junior, with the dynamic forward sidelined by a calf injury.

There are plenty of changes for North Queensland too, with winger Murray Taulagi (knee) and centre Gehamat Shibasaki (hamstring) both unavailable, causing a reshuffle.

It sees Peta Hiku return from suspension to fill the void left by Shibasaki while Brendan Elliott is the man to line up on the wing in Taulagi's place.

Jeremiah Nanai is also sidelined after being suspended for a dangerous throw, with Heilum Luki joining the starting side and Mitch Dunn coming onto the bench for his first game of the season.

Meanwhile, Riley Price - son of Queensland and Australian prop Steve and nephew of Cowboys great Brent Tate, makes his NRL debut off the bench.

WHO TO WATCH: After a relatively quiet outing against the Warriors, look for star Bulldogs recruit Viliame Kikau to really explode on the Bulldogs' left edge. How big a night Kikau has could depend on how North Queensland lines up on its right side, with Nanai and Shibasaki both unavailable and causing a reshuffle on that edge this weekend.

While both Hiku and Luki are both solid individual players, any indecisiveness in defence could see Bulldogs five-eighth Matt Burton capitalize by giving the hulking Kikau early ball. Kikau didn't have a single tackle bust last week but look for that to change on Sunday.

As for North Queensland, this is the sort of game where Chad Townsend's calming influence and leadership needs to come to the fore. The Cowboys halfback also plays on that new-look right edge and so it will be on him to get the attack rolling and try simplify the game a touch so as to not overcomplicate things unnecessarily.

Otherwise, Payten's side risks gifting the Bulldogs field position like the Storm did earlier this season – and we all know how that ended. Burton and halves partner Kyle Flanagan are still finding their feet in the NRL and Townsend – and the Cowboys by extension – have a clear advantage there.

FAVOURITE: Home ground advantage may be just enough to see the Bulldogs installed as slight favourites.

MY TIP: This is definitely a close one to call but the Cowboys' omissions will have a bigger impact and tip the scales in favour of the home side. Bulldogs by 8.

The 2022 NRL Grand Final rematch took place on Thursday night and produced a stunning contest that went into Golden Point before a Mitch Moses field goal handed the Eels a hard fought first victory for 2023.

The match began being fought predominantly through the middle and it wasn't until the 14th minute that the scoreboard attendant was required to do some work. Parramatta shifted the ball left to Dylan Brown who put in a grubber behind the Panthers line where Bryce Cartwright following through regathered and scored a clever try. Mitch Moses converted. Across the next 15 minutes, the Eels dominated both possession and field position, but the Panthers defence were equal to the task, none moreso than fullback Dylan Edwards, who diffused a number of clever attacking kicks from Moses, as did fellow Panthers winger Sunia Turuva. After Izack Tago tapped one of Moses' grubbers dead, Nathan Cleary attempted a short drop out, but it didn't travel the minimum 10 metres. Mitch Moses then landed a penalty goal to give his side an 8-0 lead. A rare attacking set by the Panthers began on halfway when Isaah Yeo stepped back off his left foot, straightened his run and then broke through the Eels middle defence, offloaded to Scott Sorenson who then passed back inside to Edwards in support, who ran 30 metres to score under the posts. Cleary converted. This try spurred the Panthers attack and defence and the momentum started to finally swing their way to end the half. A high tackle allowed Nathan Cleary to level the scores with a penalty goal right on halftime.

The second half started much the same like the first, with points being hard to come by as both sides struggled to get the upper hand, but it was the Panthers who were the stronger. But in the 58th minute Parramatta sent the ball right with players standing in tackles and getting passes away before debutant Brendan Hands got the ball in space and he raced 30 metres to score a good team try. Moses again converted. 7 minutes later, Moses Leota was penalised for a late challenge on Moses after he kicked and Moses kicked another penalty goal. The Panthers reduced the margin to just 2 points in the 72nd minute when Cleary, on the last tackle, dished a short ball to the lead runner Zac Hosking, who pushed through the line and scored under the posts. Cleary converted. With just 30 seconds left in the game Junior Paulo was sin binned for a high tackle, 40 metres from the Panthers line. Cleary kicked for touch and the Panthers started their set 10m inside the Eels half, with just 12 seconds left in the game. From the tap, the ball went to Cleary who landed an astonishing 45 metre, 2 point field goal to level the scores again as the half ends, sending the game into golden point. Inside the first minute of golden point, Mitch Kenny was penalised and sin binned for a high tackle and in the ensuing set, Parramatta went deep into the Panthers half where Moses calmly potted the match winning field goal. It was a quiet start to the second half, but eventually the Wests Tigers made hay while the sun shone at the 55yh minute, Koroisau grubbering for himself and scoring, reducing the margin to ten points following Doueihi's conversion. It was a win for big brother, as the Broncos defeated the Dolphins by 18-12 in a thrilling Battle of Brisbane derby in front of 51,047 fans at Suncorp Stadium tonight.

It was a scrappy first half from both sides with plenty of dropped ball in humid conditions, before the second half saw some entertaining tries with only a Kotoni Staggs length of the field try at the death sealing the first of what will be a long and fierce rivalry between the sides. The loss for Wayne Bennett's men was further soured with news that halfback Sean O'Sullivan suffered what is being reported as a torn pectoral injury, which could see the plucky number seven miss the rest of the season. The city of Brisbane had been waiting for this moment for a long time and a vocal crowd welcomed both sides to the Cauldron. It was Broncos winger Jesse Arthars who scored the first try after he latched onto the end of a slick backline play involving Reece Walsh and Herbie Farnworth. Adam Reynolds missed from the touchline and it was 4-0 early lead to Brisbane. Brisbane continued to dominate possession in the first half, but multiple handling errors cost them from extending their lead before halftime. The Dolphins also had their chances and went with in a whisker of evening up the game when winger Jamayne Isaako just couldn't get the ball grounded inside the corner post just before the break. Brisbane struck first in the second half, when winger Selwyn Cobbo scored in the corner following a sublime cut-out ball from Reece Walsh. Reynolds again missed the conversion from out wide and Brisbane led 8-0. The Phins needed some luck and they received some off a bizarre error from Brisbane winger Cobbo, who initially baulked at catching a kick on the last, with the Queensland winger then soccering the ball into touch like he was avoiding a corner. That was the chance the home side needed, when unlikely hero Jarrod Wallace scored off a crash ball close to the line, carrying three Broncos defenders over with him. Isaako converted to narrow the lead to 8-6. Cobbo then looked to have redeemed himself moments later, when he leapt over the tryline, only for Dolphins front rower Mark Nicholls managing to strip the ball at the last moment to save a certain try. Redcliffe then brought the sold-out crowd to their feet, when Anthony Milford put in a neat kick on the last for Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow who came from the clouds to get the ball down and give his side the lead for the first time in the match. Broncos skipper Adam Reynolds then put Kurt Capewell into a huge gap and the backrower charged towards the corner to score a superb try and lock up the scores. Reynolds then nailed the conversion to give his side a 14-12 lead with ten minutes remaining. The New Zealand Warriors have fought back from multiple 8-point deficits to outlast the Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs, winning 16 points to 14 in a hard fought encounter in Auckland.

A few minutes later, the Warriors would finally get over, finding an overlap and sending Marcelo Montoya over in the corner. Johnson missed the kick, keeping it 14-10 to the Dogs. The Warriors defence was tested multiple times in the second half, but as has been the case so far in 2023 they held firm every time. They forced Reed Mahoney into a grubber that ended up going dead, and would score off the resultant 7 tackle set, Shaun Johnson dummying his way over the line. The try also had a touch of controversy about it, with Addin Fonua-Blake appearing to deny Reed Mahoney a chance to make a play at Johnson. It was confirmed by the bunker though and the Warriors had their first lead of the match. The Bulldogs would get a penalty on their next possession and would launch an attacking raid on the Warriors, but once again they showed how much their defence has improved, turning Canterbury away for 12 straight plays.
