Dolphins host South Sydney to open round seven

The South Sydney Rabbitohs are facing a tough trip North to Lang Park for a clash against a surprisingly successful Dolphins franchise in front of what is sure to be a stellar crowd. The Thursday night fixture holds plenty of importance for both sides, with the home team sitting six spots above their opposition on the ladder, something that perhaps nobody could've predicted before the season kicked off.

The Dolphins shot out of the blocks in the early rounds, going undefeated in their first three matches. Some injuries to key players hurt their efforts against the Dragons a fortnight ago, and they suffered a massively disappointing loss. It seemed that the fairytale was over just as soon as it had begun, with The Dolphins seemingly reminded that they had no business winning matches in their first NRL season. But they ignored the doubters.

A hugely important win last week against the Cowboys has reignited the 'Phins up' hype. Triumphant 32-22 away from home in Townsville, the win lifted them back into the NRL top four. They started strong, going up five tries to one in just over half an hour. But The Dolphins had to fight off a quick finishing North Queensland team who very nearly stole the two points in the final ten minutes.

Jesse Bromwich is back on deck for the home side in a massive inclusion after he missed last week's win due to sickness. Edrick Lee drops to the reserves with Wayne Bennett favouring Robert Jennings on the wing. Jarrod Wallace will miss out due to a Category One concussion that he sustained against the Cowboys, so JJ Collins joins the bench.

Meanwhile, the Rabbitohs have experienced a mixed bag of results to start 2023. Their past three matches in a row in Homebush have seen a nail biting victory over Manly and an eight point loss to a depleted Storm side. Last week they played away against the Bulldogs (at the home ground they share), and put on a 50 point showcase. The performance has sparked plenty of excitement, and they'll be looking to build on that this week.

Latrell Mitchell bounced back into form against the Bulldogs, running in a hat trick to silence the Canterbury-Bankstown crowd. He also racked up two try assists, a line break assist, and nearly 200 running metres. Mitchell will want to use that performance to kick-start what has been an at times difficult start to 2023 for the fullback.

Jai Arrow returns from injury, and replaces Tevita Tatola in the 17 named on Tuesday. Alex Johnston returns on the wing after missing last week's clash for Souths, with Isaac Tu'itupou Thompson on the other wing. Taane Milne has been named as 18th man.

This game is the first of three at Lang Park for Souths over the next four rounds, so they'll want to begin to feel at home in Brisbane. This Thursday is also their first game outside of Sydney in 2023.

WHO TO WATCH: Jamayne Isaako has had a mixed few years. Spending a lot of time in the Queensland Cup last year while signed with the Gold Coast, he jumped ship to join the Dolphins for 2023. He has played in every match so far for the Redcliffe-based side, and has made plenty of positive contributions, scoring a hat trick to help his side over the line last week against the Cowboys.

He'll need to keep the good performances up though if he wants to cement his NRL spot - there are plenty of wingers in the Dolphins set-up vying for his #2 jersey.

Despite breaking numerous records in our game, Souths winger Alex Johnston has never played for the NSW Blues. The one club man has donned international jerseys for both Australia and Papua New Guinea, as well as making representative appearances for the Australian Indigenous All Stars.

With 200 NRL games rapidly approaching, Johnston is one of the most experienced wingers in the sport, and he's going to be finishing tries for many years to come.

FAVOURITE: Despite the vaguely Brisbane/Queensland Dolphins starting their inaugural season in a strong manner, the Rabbitohs are the strong favourites to topple them this Thursday

MY TIP: The Dolphins have shown that they are not just a one hit wonder. They've managed to bounce back from some injury and suspension woes, as well as a disheartening defeat to the Dragons. Why can't they win again? Dolphins by 4.

THE PREVIEW

Two contenders in search of consistency face off for the 100th time in premiership history.

Both the Sharks and Roosters were expected to be title contenders this season, although like many other teams in the league right now it is hard to get a read on either side after six rounds.

Cronulla flashed its enormous potential with halfback Nicho Hynes steering the ship in a dominant win over the Dragons and looked set to back that effort up after racing out to a 20-point lead against the Warriors.

Instead, the Sharks crumbled under pressure to suffer a tight loss to their fast-improving trans-Tasman rivals and come into this week's game well-rested off the bye.

As for the Roosters, they took down the Eels a fortnight ago in a tight contest and were expected to give the Storm a serious shake at AAMI Park last week.

Instead, what first appeared an early contender for game of the year failed to deliver as Melbourne ran away comfortable winners.

For Cronulla, Wade Graham (suspension) and Oregon Kaufusi (concussion) return to offset the losses of Toby Rudolf (foot) and Dale Finucane (suspension).

Both Graham and Kaufusi have been named to come off the bench with Royce Hunt and Cameron McInnes promoted to the starting side.

Braydon Trindall, meanwhile, is out of the 17 entirely with Thomas Hazelton set to play his first game of the season.

There is plenty of positive team news for the Roosters this week and that extends to the NSW Cup forward pack, with Angus Crichton, Dylan Napa, Sitali Tupouniua and Nathan Brown all set to feature in reserve grade.

Centre Billy Smith, meanwhile, is also expected to run out for what would be his first game as he looks to force his way back into the NRL picture after suffering an ACL tear last season.

As for the NRL side, James Tedesco is back in action after missing a week due to concussion, seeing Joey Manu move back to the centres with Drew Hutchison joining the bench and Jake Turpin missing out.

WHO TO WATCH: As will be touched on again later, if the Sharks are to pull off the win this weekend it will come off the back of another man-of-the-match performance from Nicho Hynes. Both Luke Keary and Sam Walker are exciting playmakers and instinctive ball-runners who can lift the Roosters' attack on an individual level but chemistry and cohesion has broken down at times this season.

Hynes, on the other hand, immediately is able to lift Cronulla's standards as the kind of player who makes everyone around him better. Should the Sharks force a few early dropouts and build pressure, look for Hynes to really start to pull apart the Roosters' defence.

Going to the Roosters, a lot of their success - and at times failure - starts up front. You only have to look at a guy like Jared Waerea-Hagreaves, who ran for just under 90 metres in last week's loss to Melbourne. That is despite playing just 50 minutes and yet it's not all great news for the Roosters up front. Sure, the return of the injured brigade may help.

But it seems like sometimes the Roosters' big men can at times become susceptible to buying too much into the emotional, rivalry or personal battles in games. That in turn can lead to errors or ill-discipline. Waerea-Hagreaves though over time has come to emerge as a genuine leader in the Roosters' pack, aware of his role in the squad as someone who helps set the tone. Waerea-Hagreaves will do just that against Cronulla this week.

FAVOURITE: There is very little separating the two teams but the Roosters are slight favourites.

MY TIP: A tough one to pick and the returning troops should give the Roosters a boost but this is the kind of game where having a halfback like Nicho Hynes could prove especially important. Sharks by 4.

Often overlooked in the game due to equally amazing teammates, Grant has averaged 72 running metres and 121 kicking metres so far this season, also kicking a 40-20 last week against the Roosters. He always creates something out of nothing, and I'm looking forward to what he'll bring against the Sea Eagles.

FAVOURITE: Melbourne is favoured to add another 2 points to the ladder away from home.

Last start losers look for redemption.

The New Zealand Warriors will be looking to atone a last start loss to the Newcastle Knights when they go head to head against fellow Round 6 losers in the North Queensland Cowboys at Mt Smart Stadium.

If there's one word to sum up the Warriors in 2023. It's brave. Every week, these guys have to go through a mid game injury to a role player and no matter what they keep on fighting for each-other. It's something Andrew Webster must get credit for instilling a never say die attitude which has been missing from the Warriors in recent seasons.

Last start against the Knights was no different. Losing both Te Marie Martin and Wayde Egan to injuries which look set to sideline the duo for a while. Martin with a fibula injury and Egan with his second CAT 1 concussion for the season. However, despite the obvious lack of troops. The New Zealanders continued to fight for each-other, taking the game down to the wire before falling short.

Going up against the Cowboys this week presents a big challenge for the Aucklanders. Their opposition has been inconsistent this season, but they'll be better for it with Scott Drinkwater easing back into the spine after his return from suspension last week. This makes the Cowboys a scary opposition, so they'll need to be weary. Shaun Johnson has looked great to start the season and he'll have to lead the side even more with the absence of Martin and Egan.

On the team front. It's a doctors surgery on the spine. Martin and Egan are out with Dylan Walker and Freddy Lussick to replace them, respectively. Tohu Harris returns at lock while Taine Tuapiki remains the utility.

For the Cowboys, it's been an inconsistent start to 2023. No one predicted this side to be sitting in the bottom eight with a 2-3 record on the young season. But remember, they were in this exact spot last season so there's no panic for the Cowboys faithful at the moment. However, their inconsistency presents more problems than solutions at the moment.

Good Friday was the perfect example of their inconsistency. Some poor middle defence and equally worse edge defence saw the Cowboys trail early and were never able to get back into the contest against the Dolphins. Although they fought back well to make the game close in the second half, the completion rate of 67% was never going to be enough to secure victory.

Going up against the Warriors this week, there's one clear focus. Holding the football. WHO TO WATCH: With a renewed energy in 2023. Shaun Johnson is looking like the player that left the Warriors in controversial circumstances in 2018. After breaking the 1000 point barrier against the Knights, Johnson will have to take on the bulk of attacking responsibility with Martin and Egan out. So far, he's shown he can do that with 6 try assists, 7 linebreak assists and 5 forced dropouts. He was great against the Cowboys in Townsville and back at home I expect that continue.

For the Cowboys. The focus is going to be on Reece Robson. With his name coming up in Origin discussion. It's time for the Cowboys rake to show the critics that he's worthy of being there. He's had a great start to 2023 in an inconsistent Cowboys side. The 24 year old has crossed the stripe, set up a try and a linebreak as well as force a dropout. After a quiet game by his standards against the Dolphins, it's time for Robson to step up.

FAVOURITE: The Warriors are slight favourites in this encounter with the bookies. North Queensland will also need to overcome a horror record in Auckland with the Cowboys only winning 7 of the 19 clashes at Mt Smart, last tasting success in 2019 winning 17-10.

MY TIP: I expect the Cowboys to click at some point, and this looks like the week for it to happen. With the Warriors undermanned and the Cowboys getting troops back on deck. It's the week where the Cowboys are set to emerge as premiership contenders in season 2023. It won't be easy with Andrew Webster's men fighting for every minute in this contest. Cowboys by 6.

Two sides with matching win-loss records and a penchant for scoring points, but with differing fortunes so far in 2023 battle it out in the Hunter, as the Knights play host to the Panthers on Saturday evening.

Newcastle come into the contest in good form with a three-match unbeaten streak - two wins sandwiching a draw a fortnight ago. Their performances so far have been mixed with some poor showings mixed with some strong efforts, including their last three matches against Canberra, Manly and the Warriors respectively.

Last weekend, they were impressive but yet again unable to put in an 80-minute performance as they ran out 34-24 victors over the Warriors. The Novocastrians started fast - and whilst never under any major threat, they did look to clock off during the middle stages as the Warriors sought to make a comeback, before a late finish from the hosts ensured they held onto for victory.

Sadly the Knights suffered a major blow with Jayden Brailey sustaining a season-ending ACL injury last Sunday. This has seen Phoenix Crossland move into the number 9 jersey with the returning Tyson Gamble moving back into five-eighth. The club is also confident that Mat Croker will overcome a leg injury he copped last week.

With a chance to go to the top of the ladder for the first time in 2023, the Penrith Panthers have had one of their more interesting seasons in recent memory, with three losses in competitive games this season (including the World Club Challenge) by a combined margin of just three points. Since then, the reigning champs have racked up nearly 100 points across their last two matches and appear to have hit a purple patch of form.

Facing Manly last Saturday, the Mountain Men picked up where they left off in Canberra a fortnight ago, running up a big first half score and reminding the competition of the raw power they can possess in attack. The Panthers split the Sea Eagles' defence to pieces right across the field as they racked up a 32-0 first half lead, including a hat-trick to Dylan Edwards. Edwards would add one more in the second half for a haul of four, as the Panthers ran out 44-12 winners.

Dual premiership-winning coach Ivan Cleary has stuck with the same 17 that did the job for Penrith last weekend though there is hope that Origin representative Liam Martin - named in the reserves - could return from injury, which may see some reshuffling in the forward pack or interchange bench.

WHO TO WATCH: Coming up against arguably the best halfback in the game, a lot of the responsibility for the Knights will land on the shoulders of Jackson Hastings to get the Knights into strong attacking positions. Despite their strong attack, Penrith's biggest asset is their defence, and it's going to need to be a commanding effort from Hastings to be able to control the game and help his team crack the Panthers' defensive line.

There hasn't been too much that you can say that Ivan Cleary has done wrong at the Panthers across the past three seasons (though one or two journalists do seem intent on disagreeing), but one decision that has proven to be a mistake was the late introduction to new recruit Zac Hosking into the side. In three matches in 2023, Hosking has been a weapon for the Panthers scoring two tries and having three line breaks. Hosking has played a major part in the Penrith attack and will be a big key to their performance this week. One can only imagine how his presence might have turned Penrith's early losses into potential wins earlier in the season.

FAVOURITE: The Panthers are heavy favourites for the clash and it's not really hard to understand why, given their hot form over the past two games and their recent strong record both in the Hunter and over the Knights.

MY TIP: It's hard not to see Penrith putting on a score again this coming weekend. Whilst the Knights have scored 66 points across their past two games, the Penrith defence is a different kettle of fish to what Manly and the Warriors put up. Having conceded over 50 points in that fortnight, defence is clearly a big issue for the Knights. Panthers by 24.

The All-Queensland encounters between these side have tended to be largely lop-sided in favour of the Broncos, but this weekend is a little different.

This will be just the fifth time that these two sides have met while both placed inside the top 6 on the ladder. 3 of those games were played at Cbus Super Stadium, with the Titans winning two of them. Those 3 games were also decided by 8 points or less. History is telling us clearly, that this will be a tight encounter.

However there are two glaring issues for the Titans. First is their attack. There are 5 teams lower than them on the ladder who are averaging more points per game. 10 of the Titans 18 tries so far have come through 3 players - outside backs Alofiana Khan-Pereira (5), Phillip Sami (3) and Aaron Schoupp (2). If the Broncos edge defence continues to number up strongly in defence as it has done for the majority of the season thus far, as well as providing good kick pressure, the Titans may very well struggle to even get across the stripe.

The Titans also struggle to get a good share of the ball, averaging 46.3% possession, which is the worst in the NRL at present. Their post contact metres are also very low, averaging 225 metres less per game than the Broncos, which is far too wide a gap.

Second is their defence. There are also 5 teams lower than them on the ladder who are conceding less points per game than they are. The Titans average 37 missed tackles per game, the worst in the NRL and 10 per game more than the Broncos. It gets worse though. They average 21.7 Ineffective Tackles per game, an immense 13 more than the Broncos.

Their discipline is also a problem, conceding an average of 7.3 penalties per game compared to the Broncos 5.7, while the number of handling errors per game is 3 more than the Broncos.

Simply put, those figures are atrocious and they need to rectify all those areas immediately if they are to remain in the top 8.

Last week, the Raiders showed it was possible to beat the Broncos through sheer might and power through the middle. It took an 80 minute effort for the Raiders to get the job done.

This Titans side has yet to show that it has the starch and mettle in the middle to replicate that Raiders performance, especially against a Broncos side coming off their first loss of the season and will be itching to get back to winning as quickly and as emphatically as possible.

WHO TO WATCH: Payne Haas met his match last week in Josh Papali'i and was largely nullified by a committed Raiders middle defensive squad. He looked to get a bit too sideways at times and moved away from his powerful direct running that had been so devastating in the opening 5 games. Watch for him to run much straighter and mixing it up with runs in the middle and just on the edge of the ruck. He'll also be looking to get offloads away regularly to his fullback Reece Walsh, who has very quickly formed a nice combination with the big man.

Ezra Mam has been choosing his run times really well and looks dangerous every time he touches the ball. He will be looking to link up better with his outside men this week after the Raiders defence largely kept him in check last week.

David Fifita is running the ball much more frequently and straighter than in his past few seasons. Expect him to make a beeline for the Broncos centres and also to run inside angles back towards Adam Reynolds as frequently as possible to try and nullify the impact of the Broncos halfback. Fifita is also likely to be bearing down on Reynolds kicks all game.

FAVOURITE: Despite stumbling to Canberra last week, Brisbane are best backed to overcome 'little brother'.

MY TIP: The Broncos weren't atrocious in their loss last week but they have slipped in form over the past two weeks. Plenty of broken down plays and poor handling ruined several chances to either build pressure through repeat sets or scoring opportunities. Expect that to be righted largely in this game. Broncos by 16.

Raiders look to keep the wins coming in Canberra

The Canberra Raiders will be looking to go back-to-back on Sunday afternoon when they host the St George Illawarra Dragons at GIO Stadium.

Recording a stirring victory against the odds in Brisbane last week, the Canberra Raiders will be out to prove they can be equally effective playing as favourites on home soil.

Stunning the undefeated Broncos with a resilient 20-14 victory last Saturday, coach Ricky Stuart will welcome back a trio of experienced campaigners with Nick Cotric, Jack Wightan and Joseph Tapine coming into the side in place of Jordan Rapana, Brad Schneider and Peter Hoha.

Holding a below average record of six wins from 13 meetings against the joint venture during Stuart's tenure at the club, both matches between the two sides were decided by just two points last season.

Enduring the elation of apparent victory quickly followed by the dagger of defeat last week, the St George Illawarra Dragons will be hoping for a change of luck in the nation's capital.

Conceding a try with minutes remaining in a 20-18 defeat to the Titans last Sunday, coach Anthony Griffin has been forced into changes through injury and suspension.

Handing journeyman Tautau Moga his first start of the season in place of Mikaele Ravalawa, representative

forward Francis Molo will miss the next three matches in a reshuffle which sees Zane Musgrove recalled into the starting pack.

Last tasting victory in the ACT way back in 2015, the Dragons have won just four of their 18 visits to Canberra, including their first ever win as a merged entity in the early rounds of 1999.

WHO TO WATCH: Returning to GIO Stadium for the first time in close to a year, club veteran Jarrod Croker will be determined to make an impression in front of the Canberra faithful. Enduring a tragic run with injury over the past two seasons, the 32-year-old centre made an immediate impact in his return to the top grade last week with his experience coming to the fore in the shock win over the Broncos.

Edging closer to becoming only the second player to appear in 300 first grade matches for the Raiders, another strong performance from Croker may be the circuit-breaker the Green Machine need to kick-start their top eight hopes.

Only one current player remains from the last Dragons team to prevail in the nation's capital: Jack de Belin. Coming off the bench during the early rounds after returning from a calf injury sustained during the pre season, the 30-year-old forward has struggled to recapture the form that saw him represent New South Wales at the peak of his power.

Capable of much more with the ball than simply making metres, a strong showing from de Belin will go a long way towards revitalising the side's stilled attack.

FAVOURITE: The buoyant Raiders are expected to continue the strides made last week with a win on home soil.

MY TIP: Time will tell whether last week was an off night for the Broncos or the start of better things for the Raiders. Coming off a win and with the home ground advantage the latter seems more likely. Raiders by 12.

Eels Look to Climb Up Ladder Against Wounded Bulldogs

It has been a mixed start to season 2023 for both the Eels and the Bulldogs. Parramatta, fresh off a Grand Final appearance, lost three games by four points each to start the season and have since gone 2-1 in an unconvincing stretch of football, leaving them sitting in 14th place on the ladder and with some work to do to get back to the heights of 2022.

There have been enough positive signs so far for the Bulldogs to justify the new direction taken by the club in the post Trent Barrett era. They've won 3 games so far - more than half the amount they managed in Barrett's disastrous reign - and have, in small patches, looked like a very good football team.

Last week provided a reality check for where both teams are at. The Eels, despite their poor win/loss record, haven't been too far off the pace and, had individual 50-50 moments gone the other way could easily have been sitting at the top end of the table. Their game against the Tigers however shows that their defensive issues are very real and will in their current form stop them from consistently competing with the competitions' elite. They missed 39 tackles and allowed the Tigers to outgain them by 500 more metres. They were bailed out by some Mitch Moses individual brilliance but will need to find a much more sustainable formula for success going forward.

While it is true the Bulldogs have been crippled by injuries in recent weeks, some of their defensive efforts last week against South Sydney were not up to standard and an indicator that this team still has a fair way to go before they become a competition heavyweight. In their last two games they had defended well, conceding 16 and 14 against the Warriors and Cowboys respectively, but had that streak blown out of the water by an admittedly class Rabbitohs outfit. What will cause the most concern for coach Ciraldo is the timing of when the tries were conceded. The Bulldogs did have phases where they would turn the Rabbitohs away and were in a close game for 30 minutes. Souths would then score 3 tries in 7 minutes to effectively end the game before half time. Lightning would strike twice in the second half as the Dogs held firm for the first 20 minutes before conceding another 3 tries in the space of 5 minutes this time. This trend is indicative of

an inexperienced team that drops its head at the first sign of adversity. It is critical that the Bulldogs fix this if they want to have any chance against the Eels, who are as good as any team in the competition at scoring rapid fire long range tries with the offloading talent they possess up front.

Fortunately for the Bulldogs, they will regain vital experience with Kikau, Pangai and Faitala-Mariner coming back into the 17. Braidon Burns has been named as the replacement for the injured Josh Addo-Carr.

For the Eels, Junior Paulo is back and starting in the front row, pushing Wiremu Grieg to the bench and Jack Murchie to the reserves.

WHO TO WATCH: Parramatta halfback Mitchell Moses has been unfairly maligned for much of his career, but in recent years has done more than enough to show that he is one of the game's elite number 7's. The value Moses provides to the Eels was on full display last week against his old club the Tigers. His team was dominated across the park, registering fewer running metres, line breaks, tackle breaks, offloads and forced dropouts than the joint venture, all while unsurprisingly being dominated in possession 57%-43%. Despite this, Moses was able to use his first class kicking and passing game to come up with four try assists with the Eels very limited attacking opportunities, while also hitting a sideline conversion to all but seal the victory in the 76th minute. The primary key to victory for the Bulldogs will be to shut down the dynamic halfback, which is a lot easier said than done.

If the Eels didn't already consider losing hooker Reed Mahoney last season a mistake, his performances for his new club the Bulldogs so far in 2023 would certainly be hammering the point home. Mahoney has been a standout in every single game so far for the Dogs, consistently being one of the better players on the park for either side and bringing a much-needed sense of composure in attack to a young spine. He leads the league in 40/20s kicked with 3 in 6 games so far, and has recorded a try assist in each of his last two starts. He has also been a rock defensively for the Bulldogs, making 50 tackles against the Rabbitohs last week. What's been impressive is how quickly he has developed a trusted connection with back-rower Jacob Preston, the rookie being Mahoney's go to player when attacking close to the line, and with how bad the Eels edge defence has looked recently don't be surprised if this is an avenue he looks to go down again.

FAVOURITE: The Eels are 7.5 point favourites in this one at the time of writing.

MY TIP: With how both sides defended last week, there could be 70 points scored in this one. I don't have much confidence tipping the winner, so I'll go with the home team and say Eels by 6.
