THE PREVIEW

 with Lachy MacCORQUODALE

Another Thursday night, another blockbuster game of footy. This week, the South Sydney Rabbitohs host the Penrith Panthers for their second meeting of the season, this time at Accor Stadium.

The hosts are in some excellent attacking form, having scored 86 points over the past two weekends largely helped by Campbell Graham and Latrell Mitchell who have score a combined nine tries in those outings. Their attack is just beginning to click and as a result, are playing some of the most exciting footy in the competition.

However, this Thursday they face the NRL's best defence by a million miles. The Panthers have only conceded 79 points in their six games, the next best defence is the Rabbitohs, conceding 114 points in seven games.

Conceding on average 13 points per game will go a long way to realising Penrith's dream of a hat-trick of premierships and with the way they're going, it's a real possibility. Their defence has been incredibly consistent regardless of who the opposition is. Their points conceded spread is 10 to 17 points which is a remarkable effort.

The only hindrance on their season after six weeks is the fact that they've only scored more than 20 points on two occasions. 53 against Canberra and 44 against Manly set the tone for what many expected to be a rampaging Penrith attack now that they had finally clicked. But they only managed to escape in Newcastle by a point after scoring just 16.

The Panthers scored 16 points in their last clash against the Rabbitohs and they'll be aiming to improve on that mark. A comprehensive attacking performance against a fellow premiership contender will cement their position as competition favourites and give Ivan Cleary and his team the belief that they can score points against the best teams in the competition.

Their opposition have been quite similar in terms of defensive consistency. The Rabbitohs points conceded spread is 12 to 20 points but it hasn't been enough against the better teams in the competition when their attack stutters. Souths scored 10, 18 and 10 against Penrith, Sydney and Melbourne with all three matches resulting in a loss.

The Rabbitohs weren't in the best of attacking form during those performances and the point scoring madness of the last two weekends should provide them with confidence heading into this important fixture.

THINGS TO KNOW

- Penrith have won 11 of their last 13 games against Souths, including the last 5 straight.
- This will be Souths 200th game at Accor Stadium. They've had 115 wins, 83 losses and 1 draw at the venue.
- Penrith's only loss at this ground in their last 9 visits was the 2020 Grand Final.
- Brian TO'O has 48 NRL tries
- Latrell MITCHELL has 98 goals for South Sydney
- Scott SORESENSEN's next Penrith game will be his 50th for the club.

Mitchell and Graham are going to be important factors in this match after demonstrating that the Rabbitohs right edge can be as potent as their left which hasn't fired to the same capacity as it did in 2022. The Panthers will be well aware of this and given their defensive output so far, they'll be confident in handling those two players.

To add another layer of difficulty for the Rabbitohs when it comes to executing their attack, Keoan Koloamatangi is out of the team with an injury and is replaced by Michael Chee-kam whilst Izaac Tu'itupou Thompson returns from injury, pushing Taane Milne to 18th man.

Penrith will be without Origin forward Liam Martin who continues to struggle with hamstring issues. Scott Sorensen moves into the starting side with Lindsay Smith included on the bench.

WHO TO WATCH: As mentioned, the home side have been exceptional in attack over the past two weekends with Latrell Mitchell and Campbell Graham being the main beneficiaries. Mitchell has scored all four of his tries in the past two games and has assisted a further three. That takes his try assist tally to six for the season and his having an exceptional season as a ball-runner averaging 142 metres per game and 4.9 tackle breaks. Graham has been on the receiving end of some of those assists and now have seven tries to his name in 2023. The 23-year-old has been solid as ever averaging 144 metres per game whilst being solid in defence.

For Penrith, it could be no other than Nathan Cleary who kicked his second game-winning field goal on Saturday against the Knights. The Australian halfback has five try assists so far and is proving to be a threat with the ball in hand, averaging 119 metres per game. The most influential aspect of Cleary's game is his ability to control and win games late in the contest. It could be needed on Thursday night and there's no man you'd want more in a game deciding moment than Cleary. Stephen Crichton scored 'that' runaway intercept try to secure the Panthers 2021 premiership against the Rabbitohs. The centre enjoys playing Souths, scoring eight tries in 11 outings, including one in their round two clash. Given the weapons that Penrith possess, it isn't necessary for the 22-year-old to be the best player on the field every week, but he seems to get up for these matches against the Rabbitohs.

FAVOURITE: Penrith are the favourite for Thursday night's clash and for good reason. They boast the competition's best defence, and they have an incredible record against Souths. Five wins in a row and 10 of their last 11 for the Panthers against the Rabbitohs, including eliminating them from the competition in three straight seasons.

MY TIP: It's hard to go past Penrith especially given their record against Souths. The boys from the west enjoy this battle and they'll be up for the clash. Penrith's defence is too good whilst the Rabbitohs stutter with the ball in hand against the best teams. Penrith by four points.

THE PREVIEW with Andrew JACKSON

Are the Eels really back as genuine premiership contenders? Or did two-straight games against lesser opposition paper over what are still concerning signs for Brad Arthur at Parramatta?

The answer may just come on Friday night as the Eels prepare to test their title credentials against the surprise ladder leaders Brisbane.

The Broncos themselves, despite enjoying a 6-1 start to the season, have hardly looked convincing at times and often relied on the sheer brilliance of Reece Walsh or a late flurry of points to get home.

That was on full display last week against the Gold Coast as Brisbane overcame a 14-6 halftime deficit to race away 43-26, with a Tino Fa'asuamaleaui sin bin proving crucial in that final result.

It was the kind of win the Broncos needed after a disappointing loss to Canberra the week prior but still did little to suggest Kevin Walters' side is truly capable of an 80-minute performance.

Of course, that is if you are looking for ways to poke holes in Brisbane's status as a legitimate title change this year. Parramatta's early season form is proof everyone is far from perfect at this point.

The Eels built on a nervy win over the Tigers last week when they dismantled the undermanned Bulldogs 30-4.

At least they did it comprehensively but it is still too early to declare Parramatta is back as a premiership force.

The Eels were always going to be finals hopefuls irrespective of their opening round results, such was the tight nature of all their losses.

But if they wanted to back up the kind of statement they made in a golden-point win over Penrith, it has to come this Friday in Darwin - the very same place Parramatta crumbled last year.

The Eels melted in the top end in Round 8, on the wrong end of a 35-4 demolition job at the hands of North

Queensland. They will be hoping for a very different result this time around.

The Eels won the last meeting between these two teams in Darwin (46-6) and have emerged victorious in six of their past seven games against the Broncos.

There are minimal changes for Parramatta as Josh Hodgson returns, having missed last week's game due to illness. It sees Brendan Hands drop to the bench in place of Makahesi Makatoa.

WHO TO WATCH: In a surprise to no one, humid conditions are expected in Darwin on Friday night with the temperature expected to be hovering around 28 degrees by kick-off. In the testing conditions, both forward packs will tire early and the smart play may be to kick long and early to tire out of the opposition. Moses proved himself capable of doing just that earlier this year when he kicked for over 1,000 metres in Parramatta's thrilling win over Penrith. Look for him to do similar on Friday.

The same obviously goes for Adam Reynolds and Brisbane but for something different, let's look at something different for the Broncos. As much as the kicking game could decide Friday's game, it could also come down to which forward pack is the fitter of the two. And from what we've seen so far this season, barnstorming Broncos prop Payne Haas can burst through for a game-breaking run regardless of how many minutes he has played. Of course, the conditions will mean it will be particularly important that Brisbane manages his minutes and the entire forward rotation well. But Kevin Walters needs to be especially diligent with when he brings Haas on as the Blues front rower has the tackle-busting ability to blow a close contest wide-open.

FAVOURITE: The Broncos are slight favourites for Friday's game.

MY TIP: This is a huge opportunity for Parramatta to make a real statement after a slow start to the year. The biggest concern has to be the inexperienced edge combination of Russell and Dunster, who will be targeted defensively. If Brisbane's lethal outside backs get early ball, they could rack up a score. It's a tough one to predict but this game should mean more for the Eels and if they can't lift for this one, serious questions need to be asked of their premiership credentials. Eels by 7.

THE PREVIEW

The injury plagued Canterbury Bulldogs will be looking to end a two game losing streak when they go up against the Cronulla Sharks at Accor Stadium as part of ANZAC Round.

What can you say with the Bulldogs. They have been royally hurt in the injury world with crippling injuries to a number of stars and their forward stocks have also taken a hit. There's now 10 Bulldogs sitting in the casualty ward after Jacob Kiraz's knee injury and Andrew Davey's finger injury Centre Jake Averillo, meanwhile, has prepatellar bursitis and partial tear in his left knee. Bulldogs GM Phil Gould tweeted (for those that aren't blocked) that Averillo will be off his feet for four days and that there is risk of re-injury as the tendon is "definitely part of the problem".

Despite this, the Bulldogs continued to try their guts out and their resilience stopped a 30-4 score-line getting more out of hand against the Eels. This shows the never say die attitude that the Bulldogs fans have wanted to see from their team all season.

For this match against the Sharks, more focus needs to be on the spine. Matt Burton needs to take more control of the team's attack. He's easily the most dangerous player with ball in hand and with less than half the touches Kyle Flanagan had. His effort on the ball will be critical for the Dogs this week. Also, the ability of Max King and Tevita Pangai Jr to win their forward battle will also be paramount for success in the Bulldogs side.

The knee injury to winger Jacob Kiraz sees Declan Casey come into the side while Braidon Burns returns from an ankle injury on the other wing. Centre Jake Averillo (knee) and bench forward Andrew Davey (finger) have been named to play despite suffering injuries against the Eels. Jayden Okunbor has gone from the wing to the bench and Jackson Topine goes to the reserves list.

For Cronulla, they were impressive against an ill-disciplined and out of sync Roosters side. They will be happy with the defensive resilience they had to show on their line for a number of sets. But both tries came off poor defensive reads. On the attacking front, they had a bulk of the possession thanks to a 14-4 penalty count in their favour. They only produced 4 tries but they still caused a number of defensive problems for the Roosters.

Against a depleted Dogs side, one word comes to mind that has haunted the Sharks in the past. Complacency. In the past, the Sharks have played down to competition and lost in awful fashion just like they did in their match in 2021. But this Sharks side is different with Will Kennedy impressing with every passing match and Nicho Hynes getting back to his dominant best it screams a big night for the black, white and blue.

On the team front, Fitzgibbon has stuck with the same side that ran away with the second half against the Roosters.

WHO TO WATCH: One shining light for the Dogs has been the continued emergence of Max King. King has been a great purchase since his 2022 arrival playing in all 31 matches (24 in 2021 and 7 thus far this year). Thus far this season, he's averaging 144 metres with the footy in hand playing on average 60 minutes a week. King has been a quiet achiever in the middle and is now starting to get the recognition he deserves, and I dare say he could be a bolter for NSW at Origin time.

For the Sharks, the focus is on Blayke Brailey. Sharks fans were critical of the little number 9 at the end of last season and to start this season. But last week, he proved the critics wrong with a strong performance. Making on average 45 tackles a game and already running at a higher volume than previous seasons. Brailey is fast becoming a lock in the 17 each week for Craig Fitzgibbon.

FAVOURITE: To the shock of no-body. The Sharks are heavy favourites with the bookies in this one. The Bulldogs have only won two of their past eleven matches against the Sharks.

MY TIP: The Bulldogs are struck with the voodoo curse that left the Roosters (must've diverted to Belmore). The Sharks will take a lot of confidence from their win last start, they just have a bit too much over their opposition in this one. Sharks by 12.

Dolphins and Titans meet with both sides looking to bounce back from losses

The Gold Coast Titans will travel up the road to meet The Dolphins in Brisbane on Sunday afternoon ANZAC Round football. The two teams both have eight competition points to their name, and with just two spots separating them on the ladder, this is sure to be an enthralling Queensland derby.

The Dolphins head into this game off the back of a mixed performance at their home ground against the South Sydney Rabbitohs. With the weight of possession and territory falling firmly in their favour in the opening stanza, they struggled to stay in the game in the second forty minutes. A sin bin didn't help their cause, and the Rabbitohs ran away 36-14 victors.

Kenny Bromwich will miss this week after taking an early guilty plea when faced with the dangerous contact charge that got him sin binned last round. He has lined up in every game so far for his new club, so how The Dolphins fare without him remains to be seen. Luckily for The Dolphins, his suspension lines up perfectly with the return of Felise Kaufusi from his own suspension.

Jarrold Wallace will make his return after sitting out last week with a concussion, and that has pushed JJ Collins to 18th man.

The Gold Coast Titans are aiming to bounce back from a similar performance to that of their opposition's. Despite taking an early lead against their 'Big Brother' Brisbane, and holding that lead into the half-time break, they were well and truly played off the park in the second half. Going down 43-26 in a high-scoring encounter in front of nearly 27,000 home fans, the Titans will have to put up a better showing defensively this Sunday.

The Titans will hold some confidence, whether misplaced or not, heading into this game. The Gold Coast toppled The Dolphins back in the inaugural Pre-Season Challenge, winning 40-16 at Redcliffe. In that game, it was a standout four try haul for the then-yet-to-debut winger Alofiana Khan-Pereira which proved a big difference. This Sunday will be Khan-Pereira's 7th straight appearance in the NRL this season after making his debut in Round One.

Aaron Schoupp drops out of the Titans' 17, with Philip Sami shifting off the wing into the centres to cover him. Young outside back Jojo Fifita has been named on the wing, while star fullback AJ Brimson has been named among the reserves with his return from injury beckoning. Thomas Mikaele has returned from the Super League and will make his Titans' debut off the bench, with Kleese Haas named alongside him. Joe Vuna and Iszac Fa'asuamaleau drop out.

The Titans have won just nine of 33 matches they've played at Lang Park.

WHO TO WATCH: Isaiya Katoa has been turning heads in his rookie NRL season. In fact, he'd been doing it quite a few years before he signed with The Dolphins. So familiar was his name to the rugby league community that when he took to the field for his NRL debut in round one, I could've sworn he'd already made plenty of first class appearances. We forget that Katoa is just a handful of games into what will hopefully be a long and successful career in Rugby League. And if he can taste success under challenging circumstances in a new club, then he can taste success anywhere.

Thomas Mikaele makes his return to the NRL following a brief stint with the Warrington Wolves in the Super League. The former Tigers forward will be looking to revive his NRL career and make a statement in his comeback game, with Gold Coast fans hoping that he will make an impact off the bench. If he can re-adapt quickly back to the pace of the NRL then he can change the outcome of this game.

FAVOURITE: The Dolphins are the narrow favourites to bounce back and win the two points at home this Sunday

MY TIP: The Dolphins continued to show great signs even in defeat against South Sydney last week, and I think they can get back into the winner's circle this round. Dolphins by 8.

Winless Tigers look for a breakthrough after the bye

Rugby League returns to Campbelltown on Sunday afternoon with the Wests Tigers chasing their first win of the season against the Manly Sea Eagles.

Coming into the ANZAC Round rested following a bye, the Wests Tigers will be out to arrest a run of six straight losses and ease the relentless scrutiny directed towards the club on and off the field.

Producing a much-improved performance in defeat against Parramatta (22-28) most recently, coach Tim Sheens has named Brandon Wakeham to fill the void left by Adam Doueithi, who sustained a season-ending injury on Easter Monday.

Naming debutant Jahream Bula at fullback in yet another spine reshuffle, Charlie Staines takes the place of Brent Naden on the wing, while Daine Laurie and Tommy Talau come onto the bench in place of Jake Simpkin and Shawn Blore.

The Tigers have lost their past five matches at Campbelltown in succession; the joint venture last prevailed at the venue in 2020.

Sitting at the bottom of the ladder with six losses and a bye after the opening seven rounds, the Tigers rank last in attack and 13th in defence, yet surprisingly boast the most offloads (88) of any club in the league.

Heading to the western suburbs rejuvenated after a bounce back victory last Friday, the Manly Sea Eagles will be aiming to extend a run of dominance over the joint venture.

Edging out archrivals Melbourne (18-8) in a fiery affair last Friday, coach Anthony Seibold will welcome back

Josh Schuster and Reuben Garrick at five-eighth and wing respectively, while Samuela Fainu will make his first grade debut off the bench.

Former Wests Tigers forward Kelma Tuilagi will miss the match through concussion protocols in a move that sees Ethan Bullemor start in the second-row and Sean Keepie earn a recall on the bench.

Winning their past four clashes against the Tigers, including a comprehensive victory at Campbelltown last season, the Sea Eagles have won 11 of their 14 visits to Campbelltown against all sides dating back to the days of the Magpies.

Coming into the weekend in fourth position with three wins, a bye, a draw and two losses, the Sea Eagles rank 10th in attack and seventh in defence after the first seven rounds.

WHO TO WATCH: Taking an opportunity and thriving in the top grade during the opening rounds of the season, young winger Junior Tupou has been a rare bright spot for the joint venture. Staking a claim to make the left wing spot his own by averaging 151 running metres each week, the 20-year-old has produced 21 tackle breaks and six line breaks in four appearances this season. Contracted until the next year after playing lower grades with the Raiders and Brumbies in Canberra, look for Tupou to be a key contributor if the Tigers are to break through for their maiden win of the season.

Regaining his place in the starting pack after managing less than half of last season in first grade, Taniela Paseka will be out to continue a strong start to 2023. Originally coming through the lower grades with the Tigers before making the switch to the northern beaches culminating in a first grade debut five years ago, the 25-year-old front-rower has averaged 139 running metres and 23 tackles each week in the number eight jersey. Currently contracted until the end of next season, another strong showing from Paseka could see the Sea Eagles finish the round as high as second.

FAVOURITE: The Sea Eagles are heavily favoured to post back-to-back victories despite inconsistent form to start the season.

MY TIP: For as hard as the Tigers are trying under difficult circumstances, the class of a side boasting the likes of Trbojevic and Cherry-Evans should keep the misery coming for the home side. Sea Eagles by 16.

An out-of-sorts Roosters side will take on the struggling Dragons in what poses to be either a thriller or a dour slog in their now traditional ANZAC Day clash on Tuesday afternoon.

The Roosters dropped their opening game of the season to the Dolphins in a shock loss, but bounced with consecutive victories against the Warriors, rivals Souths and 2022 Grand Finalists Parramatta, before back-to-back timid performances against Melbourne and Cronulla, losing both games.

The once impressive Roosters attack has disappeared, as they are averaging just 17.67 points per game, better than only the bottom 4 teams on the ladder. Defensively they are still very good, which is a very important and key attribute from which to work from.

Every statistical area that the Roosters are struggling in though, so too are the Dragons, thus it makes sense that the two sides are struggling and outside the top 8 and not far away from each other on the ladder.

The Dragons season began in Round 2 where they produced a strong win against the Titans, before copping back-to-back hidings from the Broncos (40-18) and the Sharks (40-8) before dishing one out themselves when they beat the Dolphins 38-12. Their two games since have been disappointing to say the least, losing by 2 points to the Titans and by 6 points to the lowly Raiders.

Both sides have low error and handling error counts and reasonably higher completion rates, which in simple terms suggests that they are playing low risk football.

With both sides being among the 4 worst performing clubs regarding Post Contact Metres, All run metres, total runs and decoy runs, shows that both sides are not doing enough to make vital metres through the middle, or to try and break up the man-on-man defensive line.

The Roosters have, on paper, the more skilful side in the spine, yet there seems to be very little creativity or variation coming from them, which would be a key reason behind coach Trent Robinson making some changes in halves to try and get out of the rut and shakes things up a little.

The Dragons for the most part appear to be overachieving somewhat, however recent pressure on their coach may cause him to respond with some new approaches and style of play. All-in-all, we should be in line for a close contest, if it may be at times, a bit sloppy.

WHO TO WATCH: Joseph Manu has been moved to five-eighth and Luke Keary shifts from five-eighth to halfback, in what seems like a better role for Keary, while Manu will become a ball running weapon. Angus Crichton and Paul Momirovski are also back for their first games of the year, both also providing strong line running options on the edge which should provide some alternatives for Keary to work with.

Ben Hunt is always a danger to any side. His kicking game and overall organisation of his side has seen him ensure that this Dragons team is never the write-off that many pundits believe they are. Ben Murdoch-Masila returns to the side, replacing Jaydn Su'A in the back row. He will have the job of trying to contain and possibly exploit the returning Angus Crichton.

FAVOURITE: The Roosters will be the favourites here, especially given how much stronger their side looks on paper, however this could very well be a closely fought battle.

MY TIP: Keary back at 7, Crichton returning, Manu a menace at 6. Roosters to win by 8.

Johnson now sits on 17 Dally M points, sitting just 3 points behind the ladder leaders. Johnson has been excelling in try assists, kick metres and linebreak assists for the start of the season, and I'm hoping he will only add to these numbers on Tuesday night.

FAVOURITE: The Storm is favoured to take home this annual victory, to make it 14 wins against the Warriors in a row.

MY TIP: I think it'll be a tough game and won't be anything like the 70-10 win we watched Melbourne bring home last year. The Warriors have had an outstanding start to their season, and Melbourne are still struggling in some areas. However, after last week's embarrassment I believe that the Storm will step up and want to claim victory once again. Melbourne by 2.

The South Sydney Rabbitohs have recorded an important 36-14 win in a game consisting very much of two halves, up against The Dolphins in front of 23,280 fans at Suncorp Stadium to open Round Seven.

The Dolphins started fast in front of their home fans, running in the first try of the night in just the 3rd minute. It was great work from Kodi Nikorima to set up the try, initially through the kick that forced a Taane Milne error, and then through the cut-out ball for Euan Aitken on the left edge in the following play. Jamayne Isaako nailed the conversion attempt from the left sideline to give The Dolphins an early 6-0 lead. The next 15 minutes were dominated by The Dolphins, with the Rabbitohs barely seeing their opposition's half. But an accidental offside penalty conceded by the home side gave South Sydney their first attacking opportunity in the 22nd minute, and they certainly made use of it. Just a few minutes later, Cody Walker gave his side the lead back with one of the most bizarre tries of the season. It all started with an Alex Johnston run on the left edge, before his offload bounced off two Dolphins players and fell perfectly for Walker to ground in the in-goal. Mitchell's conversion took the scorecard to 18-14 Bunnies way in the 51st minute. With the game now very much under South Sydney's control, a Dolphins sin bin only made everything worse for the home side. Kenny Bromwich hit Taane Milne very early while chasing through a kick, and found himself on the sidelines for ten minutes. Just a minute later, Isaiah Tass extended the lead for the away side, before Latrell Mitchell took the game out of reach with another 4-pointer in the 65th minute.

Alex Johnston crossed for the final points of the night in the 68th minute to take the scoreline to 36-14. The Rabbitohs will be happy to record back-to-back wins, with the victory lifting them all the way up into third on the ladder for now. They'll face the Panthers in Homebush next Thursday.
