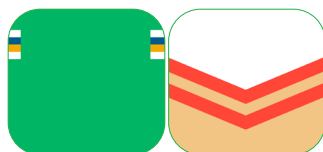

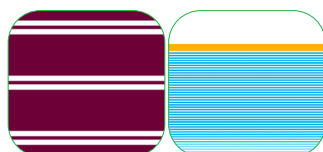

THE PREVIEW

The Cowboys travel down to Cronulla to take on the Sharks on what is now a special and emotional Thursday night, where they play in the inaugural Paul Green medal match. The two teams have united to celebrate and honour Paul Green's life and career, and the coach of the winning team will name the best player of the match to receive the Paul Green Medal.

Cronulla are comfortably sitting in 5th place on the ladder, having won four games and already had one of their three byes for the season. The Sharks came away with their first back-to-back win of the season after beating the Bulldogs in a 33-20 game, with many players showing their offensive and defensive powers.

North Queensland have had a rough season so far, with extremely poor attack and defence, currently sitting with a win record of 3/8. However, they came away with a crucial win last week, defeating the Newcastle Knights in a two-point game, 18-16.

The Sharks will be facing the Cowboys with the same 19 player team that defeated the Bulldogs, with no changes named.

Much like the Sharks, the Cowboys also have an unchanged side from the previous round. Reuben Cotter is named on the starting side, however he may switch with Jake Granville on game day as shown in their victory the Knights. Although sin binned in the match, Murray Taulagi did not receive a suspension for his late tackle and will be playing in this Thursday night clash.

WHO TO WATCH: Already scoring 9 tries this season, including two season hat-tricks, Will Kennedy is a force to be reckoned with. Let's see if he can make his try count hit double digits in Round 9, making him the second player to reach 10+ tries in the 2023 season so far.

Valentine Holmes dominated in the Cowboys win against the Knights, where he made most run metres (254) and made one try assist. Holmes is an important part of the North QLD side, and I'm looking to see him inject himself into the game a little bit more than what we have seen to start the season.

FAVOURITE: Cronulla are majorly favoured to claim victory against the North Queensland Cowboys at home, to make it three wins a row.

MY TIP: It'll be a tough game and could go either way in my opinion. Both teams have had their share of wins and losses this year, and I think the outcome of this game will come down to each teams' discipline and defence. Sharks by 2.

THE PREVIEW with Andrew JACKSON

If history is anything to go by, the Parramatta Eels are going to find it hard to force their way into the top eight, even if it is early in the season.

Brad Arthur's side has just three wins from their first eight games to open its 2023 campaign. The last five times Parramatta has recorded three or fewer wins in an eight-game period to start the season, it has missed out on the finals. Of course, the most recent exception was the 2009 season, where the Eels charged up the ladder in the latter stages of the year and made it all the way to the grand final. But this year's Parramatta outfit looks a far cry from the one that went to the decider last season against Penrith.

A slow start was to blame for last week's 26-16 loss to Brisbane in Darwin, something which coach Arthur said is becoming a concerning trend for his team.

"The second half was alright," Arthur said after the game.

"We're fighting hard as a team but we're leaving too much to do in second halves. Our start wasn't good enough, they just rolled straight through the middle.

"They got into good field position to have easy kicks with no pressure. We've got to harden up at the start of games."

That may be harder now though with front rower and State of Origin hopeful Reagan Campbell-Gillard sidelined with a groin injury for at least eight weeks. It sees Wiremu Greig join the starting team in his place while Makahesi Makatoa comes onto the bench. Bailey Simonsson is also sidelined after suffering a head knock last week, with Sean Russell moving to the centres to replace him and Haze Dunster recalled.

As for the Knights, for a second-straight week they showed plenty of grit and steel but didn't go home with the two points after a tight loss to North Queensland. Newcastle got through plenty of work in defence, something it has had to do most of the season, having conceded the most run metres per game and made the most errors inside their own half. That in turn has resulted in the Knights also making the equal second-most tackles inside their own 20 but resilient defence like that they showed against the Panthers a fortnight ago will continue to keep them in games.

THINGS TO KNOW

- The Knights last 30 games has seen them produce 7 wins, 1 draw and 22 losses and an average losing margin of 11 points.
- The last time the Eels spent this long outside of the top 8 was in 2018.
- Eels have won their last 5 games against the Knights
- Ryan MATTERSON's next NRL game will be his 150th.
- Clint GUTHERSON has 98 NRL goals
- Jackson HASTINGS has 47 NRL goals

If there was one shining light to come out of that game though it was the successful return of five-eighth Kalyn Ponga from a lengthy concussion lay-off. Ponga immediately added an extra element to Newcastle's attack and did not look afraid to take the line on, with 10 runs for 88 metres. The 25-year-old was eased in off the bench but has been named to start on Friday in an otherwise unchanged line-up for the Knights.

Newcastle will be looking to reverse a string of losses against Parramatta, having gone down in five-straight games against the Eels. In fact, the Eels have held the Knights to four points or fewer in three of their past four games, including a 39-2 thumping in their last meeting in 2022.

WHO TO WATCH: All eyes will be on Parramatta hooker Josh Hodgson as he looks to step up his involvement after a disappointing opening to 2023. Losing Reed Mahoney was always going to be a setback for the Eels, but they could do little about it given how much the Bulldogs had offered him. What Parramatta did have more control over though was who it brought in to replace him and Hodgson's experience and crafty ball-playing made him an intriguing option. Unfortunately for Hodgson, at 33 years old and coming off a serious knee injury, he also came to Parramatta with plenty of red flags. Currently, Hodgson is being found out in defence and over-complicating what should be a simple power game up front for Parramatta. He is also averaging the fewest dummy-half runs in the league this season at just 1.1 compared to 4.0 for now Bulldog Mahoney. If Hodgson isn't going to run the football, his service from dummy-half needs to be top-notch to make up for it.

Speaking of hookers not offering a whole lot in attack, the Knights desperately need spark from dummy-half and Phoenix Crossland isn't exactly delivering it. With Jayden Brailey sidelined for the season, the versatile Crossland has been given the starting gig and, to be fair, is only just a few weeks into the role. Crossland is a strong defender and gets through plenty of work but he just isn't taking the space in front of him. While obviously quickly shovelling it on to a front rower or winger like Greg Marzhev makes sense, there have been times in the past fortnight that Crossland has had space to run out of dummy-half but just opted for the pass. Potentially that is a result of adjusting to the new role, bigger minutes and workload which sees him expend energy that could otherwise be used to attack more. Plus, with Ponga now back, it's not as if Newcastle necessarily needs Crossland's creative output. It's more just picking up those easy metres and even catching out offside defenders that Newcastle's new first-choice hooker could improve at.

FAVOURITE: The Eels are well-backed to respond from last week's defeat.

MY TIP: The Knights would be the pick if this was at Newcastle. You just know what you're going to get from them this year and can trust the Knights to at least put in the effort. Away from home though, you have to give the slight edge to the Eels. It'll be close though. Eels by 8.

Pretenders or contenders clash in Brisbane

Two of the best performing sides over the first third of the season will press their premiership credentials on Friday evening as the Brisbane Broncos and South Sydney Rabbitohs face off at Suncorp Stadium.

Sitting atop the premiership ladder following their best start to a season in seven years, the Brisbane Broncos will be forced to contend with a change in personnel brought on by injury and suspension.

Losing Corey Oates, Payne Haas and Ezra Mam from the team that defeated Parramatta 26-16 in Darwin last Friday, Jesse Arthars and Kennan Palasia will come back into the squad alongside club debutant Jock Madden in the number six jersey.

Winning both matches against the Rabbitohs last season, coach Kevin Walters has overseen the longest run in first position enjoyed by a Brisbane side since Wayne Bennett returned to the club in 2015.

Causing a major upset to stun the premiers at the death last week, the South Sydney Rabbitohs will be hoping to continue their winning ways with another major scalp.

Coming from behind to outlast Penrith 20-18 last Thursday on home soil, the Rabbitohs will welcome back

Tevita Tatola in a forward reshuffle that sees Daniel Suluka-Fifita revert to extended bench.

Holding a poor historical record at Suncorp with six wins from 19 clashes against the Broncos, the Rabbitohs will be chasing four consecutive wins for the second time during Jason Demetriou's tenure.

WHO TO WATCH: Having spent the early part of his career with the league's perennial underachievers, Jock Madden will be out to impress in his maiden appearance for the competition front-runners. Coming into the halves following a one-match ban handed down to Ezra Mam for a hip drop tackle, the 23-year-old will be aiming to make the most of his opportunity and lock down a permanent place in Brisbane's best 17 going forward. Playing 17 games with the Tigers over the course of two seasons prior to making the move north, the opportunity to contribute to a side brimming with confidence could see Madden reach heights never seen in his first-grade career to date.

Enjoying a stellar start to the season with eight tries in as many appearances, Campbell Graham will be looking to press his credentials as a centre of representative calibre. Coming into calculations for an Origin call up following the representative retirement of future club teammate Jack Wighton, the 23-year-old equipped himself with distinction during the group stage at the World Cup last October. Producing 21 tackle breaks, ten line breaks and 141 running metres on average, the Rabbitohs will be looking for Graham to have a similar impact on Friday evening.

FAVOURITE: While both sides have won three matches apiece in the six meetings since the onset of the pandemic, the Rabbitohs are slightly favoured to edge out the absentee-affected Broncos.

MY TIP: Brisbane have been incredibly fortunate to field a very consistent team over the opening two months of the season. With their star front-rower and exciting playmaker watching on from the sidelines, the Broncos will be hoping the home ground advantage can get them over the line. Broncos by 2.

The Manly Warringah Sea Eagles will look to soar to three wins on the trot when they go up against the Gold Coast Titans at 4 Pines Park on Saturday night.

Manly come into this clash following two hard fought victories over the Melbourne Storm and Wests Tigers. They were made to work for their two competition points last start dealing with in game injuries which forced a reshuffled backline. However, they were able to weather the storm of the Tigers in the second half and run away with the two competition points.

Coming into this clash with the Titans. They'll need to hold the fort in defence. Gold Coast have shown this season with sustained possession they can run up points in a matter of minutes. Manly's edge defence has also been suspect at times this season, so if they don't aim up out wide. It will be another big comeback they'll have to perform. Look for DCE and Schuster to try and dictate terms early with their kicking game and game management as the Titans have shown their ability to fold faster than origami.

The big concern this week has been the fitness of Tom Trbojevic. Turbo was pulled with 15 minutes to go, but will take his place barring any late flare-ups of an abductor strain. Christian Tuipulotu returns from a knee injury on the wing and Reuben Garrick moves into the centres to replace Brad Parker. Cooper Johns takes over from Josh Schuster at five-eighth with a quad injury. Kelma Tuilagi returns from concussion in the back row so Ethan Bullemor reverts to the bench while Karl Lawton (shoulder) has also been named to return, Aaron Woods is 18th man.

The Titans. Well, this is getting awfully familiar now and not for the right reasons. For the fourth time in recent memory, they have blown a 20+ point lead to get run down with their effort going into NRL history for

the wrong reasons with a blown 26-0 lead. It's hard to get behind the Titans when they take their fans and NRL neutrals on a heart palpitation on a weekly basis.

Onto Manly, they can take the confidence that their attack has been flawless... for 40 minutes almost every match this season. AJ Brimson looked confident back in the fullback jumper, but there was no one else willing to pull their sleeves up in the second stanza to run with Tino Fa'asuamaleaui and Mo Fotuauka and that's a significant concern moving forward. If they dictate their attack consistently down Manly's right edge and not fold at the first sign of trouble defensively. Then they are set to give the Manly side a shake.

Justin Holbrook has made some changes to the side that collapsed. Phil Sami moves to wing while Jojo Fifita goes to centre. Klese Haas and Joe Vuna have been added to the bench at the expense of Kruike Leeming and Thomas Mikaele.

WHO TO WATCH: For Manly, the focus needs to be on Cooper Johns. Johns comes into the side to replace the injured Josh Schuster and has been a joy to watch in the number 6 jersey for the Eagles this season. In his three appearances at 6, Johns has been great, forcing two dropouts and being the foil in behind DCE. All he needs to do is stay consistent, and Manly are on their way.

For the Titans. The focus comes on the man that Schuster replaced. Kieran Foran has had a mixed start to life as a Titan. While his experience has brought much needed resolve to the Titans. He's only set up one try, forced one dropout and set up four line-breaks. Gold Coast need more from their big season acquisition and against his old club, it's the perfect story of revenge.

FAVOURITE: The Manly side start deserving favourites for this clash. Gold Coast have a good recent record at Brookvale Oval only losing twice at the venue since 2013.

MY TIP: With Turbo running at 80% it's easy to see why many are going to go against Manly. However, can people trust the Titans after their 26-0 capitulation... It's a real tipsters nightmare this match-up but the mind is telling me that Manly will have enough reserve to weather the Titans. Manly by 8.

NRL to return to Bathurst with Penrith hosting the Wests Tigers.

Carrington Park is the backdrop for a clash between two clubs with very different records over the past few years. The reigning premiers and current 3rd place team Penrith Panthers will face off against the still winless Wests Tigers, who find themselves four points adrift at the bottom of the table. The Saturday night kick-off will hopefully lead to a big turn out from rugby league fans across the Blue Mountains.

The Panthers are not enjoying the same success of their past few seasons so far in 2023. Sitting in third on the competition ladder with just four wins to their three losses, a surprise loss this week could see them drop all the way down to 7th as there are plenty of teams right on their heels. They'll need to be very cautious against the Tigers to not head into the game cocky or expecting to win - otherwise they could find themselves in a bad predicament early on in their title charge.

Penrith are coming off a heartbreaking loss to South Sydney at Homebush on Thursday night. The game looked wrapped up in the 70th minute with Penrith holding a 18-10 lead, however two quick tries by the Bunnies stole the two points and saw the final score read 20-18. Stephen Crichton was the star performer in the losing side, racking up all 18 of his side's points thanks to a hat-trick of tries and three successful goal kicks.

Izack Tago has not been named due to a pectoral injury, so Tyrone Peachey will start in the centres for Penrith in the sole change to their 17.

Surely it's only up from here for the Wests Tigers. The club is suffering, and has been for a long time, but their first win of 2023 has been itching closer week by week - although Penrith will definitely be a challenge. There

is still plenty of bad blood between the Tigers' fans and Penrith coach Ivan Cleary, who was the head coach of the Wests Tigers before leaving in 2018 in unsavoury circumstances, so expect a fiery clash.

Last week saw the Tigers return from the bye with a six point loss to the second placed Manly Sea Eagles. In their return to Campbelltown Sports Stadium, Wests found themselves trailing early on, but fought back to take the lead of the match in the final 20 minutes. It wasn't enough though, with a Jason Saab try and Garrick penalty goal securing the 22-16 Manly victory.

David Nofoaluma returns to the NRL set-up, filling in the gap left by Charlie Staines, who has just undergone surgery. Brent Naden is another in for the outside back for the Tigers, but Asu Kepaia is out with tonsillitis.

Penrith have won nine of their past eleven games against the Wests Tigers.

WHO TO WATCH: With Api Koroisau gone to the Tigers, Penrith hooker Soni Luke has cemented a bench spot in the NRL side after toiling away since 2017 in reserve grade at both the Panthers and the Magpies. The 27 year old has just ten first grade games to his name, so he is considerably lacking in experience in comparison to Penrith's starting hooker, Mitch Kenny (67 games). However, Luke broke through into the Tongan international side for the World Cup last year, and gained valuable experience on the big stage that he has since taken back to the Penrith set-up in 2023. He'll be looking to make an impact off the bench this weekend.

Jahreem Bula made his NRL debut last week in the Tigers' loss to the Sea Eagles. The young fullback has beaten out the established NRL players Daine Laurie and Charlie Staines to the number one jersey for the second week running, and he'll want to show Tim Sheens that he deserves that position. The 21 year old has only made three reserve grade appearances ever (all of them for the Magpies earlier in the season), but what he lacks in experience he makes up for in raw talent.

FAVOURITE: Penrith Panthers are the nearly unbackable favourites to triumph in round nine.

MY TIP: Penrith will be keen to get back into the winner's circle, and they have a prime opportunity against the terrible Tigers that they can pounce on. Panthers by 14.

It's a bit tricky to determine which of the Warriors and Sydney Roosters are in better form after last weekends performances by both teams.

The Roosters two game losing run ended with a much improved yet still unconvincing victory over the Dragons 27-26. The Roosters were looking very strong early in their match against the Dragons before allowing their opponents back into the game, and then they took the game back after the halftime break, before allowing the Dragons to again get back into the game, conceding 3 tries in 9 minutes. This constant phasing in and out of games has been the clubs biggest issue all season.

Their rather limited attacking range, prior to last weekend had been an issue too. They've seemingly been focussing heavily on completing their sets and hit ups. Last weekend though, they executed some width and variation in their attack and looked vastly better for it. Their defence was mostly solid, but their left edge was exposed several times for poor reads.

The Warriors in contrast lost to the somewhat erratic Storm (compared to the traditionally exceptional Storm performances) 30-22, despite leading 18-12 at halftime, but a mounting injury toll in the second half allowed the Storm to claim the lead and the victory. Yet, despite injuries to forwards Jazz Tevaga, Tohu Harris

and Bayley Sironen as well as fullback Charnze Nicoll-Klokstad, the Warriors still kept themselves in the game and in with a chance until the dying stages in a brave and committed performance.

The Warriors performances in both attack and defence this year have been markedly and impressively better than in previous seasons and it took a multitude of injuries, for arguably the best side of the last decade, to record a narrow victory over them.

WHO TO WATCH: Shaun Johnson has been reborn in 2023 and playing some of his best football in years. His organising and direction at halfback has been at its best, racking up 8 try assists, just 1 behind the best in the NRL, while he is also second for Line Break involvements and third for line break assists. In short, the Warriors are not just scoring points through Johnson, but they are also getting through the opposition defences courtesy of him as well.

Luke Keary looked much more comfortable and the Roosters attack looked far more dangerous with him at halfback. More impressively, he did it despite much assistance, playmaking wise, from his five-eighth Joey Manu and hooker Brandon Smith. Both men played strong games, but were playing very direct football and barely involved in the creative side of the attack. Expect that to change in this game somewhat, which will see the Roosters attack throw even more shape and variation at the Warriors defences.

FAVOURITE: The Roosters will start this match as favourites, based largely on the fact they are coming off a win and they have won their last 6 games against the Warriors. Add to the mix the Warriors injury toll as well.

MY TIP: Roosters by 14.

THE PREVIEW

Struggling sides look to put some distance between themselves and bottom part of ladder

After an offseason filled with hype and promise of greener pastures, the Bulldogs are currently sitting in 2nd last on the NRL ladder after 8 rounds of football. The only thing preventing their opponents this week the Dragons from slipping down below them on the official table is the two points they received for the bye in Round 1.

Fair to say, it hasn't been the start either side were hoping for, with major reasons for both sets of struggles coming from factors outside of the playing groups control. The Dragons have had to deal with constant speculation surrounding the future of head coach Anthony Griffin, who's days at the helm appear numbered, while the Bulldogs injury toll has been among the worst in the league, making it even harder for a side that already hadn't had much experience together to gel on the field.

Last week, the Dragons were every chance of pulling off an ANZAC day upset against their more fancied opponents the Roosters, dominating the second half but having their hearts broken by a late Luke Keary field goal. They'll be hoping to harness the form that saw them rolling up the field with ease by spreading the ball early in sets into this week against a Bulldogs side with injuries in the outside backs.

For the Bulldogs, it was another convincing loss, but one that fans will probably see as a positive in the grand scheme of things. Despite the long injury list, they were able to score their highest number of points since round 3, and did so against a Sharks side coming off their best defensive performance of the season. They would've enjoyed the win had they been able to pull it off, but the fact they were even in the game so late is a sign that things are on the improve.

In team news, Max Feagay joins his brother Matt on the wing in his first NRL appearance since Round 11, 2021,

replacing the injured Tautau Moga. There are no other changes to the Dragons 17 that went down against the Roosters.

For the Bulldogs, Kyle Flanagan has been dropped to reserve grade, replacing him at five-eighth is a familiar face in Josh Reynolds, who has come off the bench multiple times this season but is starting in the halves for the Bulldogs for the first time since Round 26, 2017, a game which the Bulldogs won to deny the Dragons a spot in the finals. Kurtis Morrin comes onto the bench as a result, while Sam Hughes takes the spot of Andrew Davey.

WHO TO WATCH: Tyrell Sloan at the start of the season was only given another chance at playing fullback because of an unfortunate injury, and so far has been making the best of his opportunity. Highly touted coming out of the Dragons juniors system, Sloan showed that he still had a lot of work to do if he wanted to be a consistent first grader in his stint as custodian last season, and if his recent performances are anything to go by, he's been doing said work and then some. Against the Roosters he had 15 runs for 142 metres as well as a line break assist, try assist, five tackle busts, two offloads and a try of his own in which he demonstrated excellent support play and agility. One area that needs more improvement is his defence, namely tackling; last week he only made one tackle but missed three.

There have been a lot of wraps on Bulldogs rookie centre Paul Alamoti so far in 2023, and he has looked very promising with ball in hand, however on the defensive side he has been a weakness for the Bulldogs. Last week against the Sharks he made only 8 tackles while missing 7, a couple of which led to major breaks that cost his side momentum. Two weeks prior to that against Souths, he made 6 tackles while again missing 7 in a game that was over in the blink of an eye due to the Rabbitohs having success down his edge. Obviously Alamoti is only a rookie and he has an age to fix these issues, and his attacking presence is certainly worth keeping him in the side, but against a Dragons team who last week were most dangerous when attacking the edges, he will need to produce a better defensive performance.

FAVOURITE: The Dragons are 3.5 point favourites at the time of writing.

MY TIP: The Dragons had the much better performance last week and are playing at WIN Stadium, where they have won their last 6 matches. That's enough for me, Dragons by 10.

Off the back of a couple of cheap set restarts, Damien Cook took advantage of the Penrith ruck and broke out of the tackle of Matt Eisenhuth and Moses Leota to collect the first try of the evening. Latrell Mitchell added the conversion to give the Rabbitohs a 6-0 lead. Souths had a number of great attacking opportunities to build upon their 6-0 lead, but the Penrith defence was able to hold firm with Sunia Turuva defending magnificently on the left edge for the Panthers. Broncos skipper Adam Reynolds was terrific for his side, scoring a try and producing a masterful kicking display in humid conditions which kept the Broncos knocking on the door of the Eels defensive line time after time. The Eels missed over 40 tackles in the match and were a shadow of the side last week that racked up a big score against the Bulldogs.
