NRL ROUND 15 WRAP

LAST GASP HEROICS NOT ENOUGH AS DOLPHINS ESCAPE WITH WIN OVER SHARKS

After an opening period where both teams fired body shots, the Dolphins broke the game open when Kenny Bromwich gave Max Plath a golden offload to open the scoring. After that it became the Kodi Nikorima show, with the five-eighth recording try assists to Herbie Farnworth, Jack Bostock and Jake Averillo in quick succession to set up a 22-0 lead.

But the Sharks fought back, first scoring through a powerful carry from Royce Hunt. Then Briton Nikora powered his way past Isaiya Katoa to cut the lead back to 10 points. The Dolphins had one more chance before the break but couldn't capitalise, and the teams went in at 22-12.

The Sharks continued the second half where they finished the first, and tries to Ronaldo Mulitalo and Will Kennedy suddenly have them a 24-22 lead. They were dominating possession and looked like they would continue their trend of poor first halves leading to comeback wins.

But cometh the hour, cometh the Hammer. Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow caught a kick on his own 10 metre line, ran back towards his goal line in a bid to shake off Braydon Trindall, and then proceeded to burn every single Cronulla player in a 100 metre sprint to the line. The Dolphins took back the lead, which was pushed out to 30-24 after a Jamayne Isaako penalty goal.

But the Sharks refused to quit, and in the last play of the game they pushed the ball from sideline to sideline which led to Katoa finding space and scoring to bring the game to two points on the siren. But alas, Nicho Hynes' conversion attempt stayed too far to the right, and the Dolphins emerged with their first ever win in Sydney in the clubs history.

The win is the Dolphins' 8th, as many as they had in 2023. Meanwhile it's a 3rd loss in 4 games for the Sharks as they now threaten to slide down the table.

COWBOYS CORRAL CRUMMY CANBERRA IN THE CAPITAL

The Cowboys have comfortably dented the Raiders' form line tonight with a surprising 34-16 win at GIO Stadium in front of more than 9,000 fans.

When Canberra hosted North Queensland on a chilly Friday night, most were expecting them to win comfortably to supercharge their push for a top four spot. Ultimately, this could not have been further from reality, with the Cowboys putting up a stellar attacking display to win comfortably in the nations capital.

They stormed out of the blocks to take a 6-0 lead in only the ninth minute, through a Kyle Feldt try where Kasey Badger in the bunker had a lot to look at, but ultimately gave the all clear. Their next would come only five minutes later, but this time it was soft and uncontroversial, with second rower Heilum Luki breaking through a tackle and finding a hole in some week Raiders defence.

The onslaught from the boys up north continued, with halfback Chad Townsend coming up with a pinpoint kick to silence the critics and the home crowd as Jeremiah Nanai reminded everyone why he's Billy Slater's go to man come Origin by pouncing on the bouncing ball and making no mistake with the grounding. 20 minutes in, North Queensland were 18-0 up and racing the clock in what was a shock to everyone.

Although Canberra served up a tenacious ten-minute period to try and hold the Cowboys out, it was Kyle Feldt crossing for his second try of the match with a miraculous put down in the corner to further flatten the hopes of Ricky Stuart's men. With only a minute to go before the halftime break, Valentine Holmes tried for a two point field goal to make it a 24-0 lead, but the shot went wide as the half time buzzer sounded.

It was the visitors yet again who took the lead after the break with Chad Townsend serving up another nice kick for marquee centre Valentine Holmes. It was 28-0 with only half an hour left to play, but Canberra responded in emphatic style with Jordan Rapana crossing to score only two minutes later, and dominated the proceeding 10 minute period with field position.

Despite their stronghold, Reece Robson came up with a line break inside his own half and after putting Scott Drinkwater away on the same play, got hit with a short ball and clear run to the line to score the try of the night against the run of play.

With nothing to lose, Canberra tried for a short drop out which proved successful, and the deal was only sweetened when a determined piece of play from Sebastian Kris put his winger in space to run and score. The Xavier Savage try made it 34-10 with 13 minutes

to play, but Elliot Whitehead came up with a barnstorming run only three minutes later where he shrugged off Valentine Holmes to score.

The last 10 minutes was relatively uneventful, with the Raiders squandering numerous attacking chances and a Chad Townsend field goal attempt hitting the post and bouncing back into the field of play. Ultimately, it was the Cowboys who held on to win 34-16 in a relatively convincing display that will undoubtedly fill them with confidence.

RABBITOHS SHOCK BRONCOS TO MAKE IT THREE IN A ROW

South Sydney have upset a fast-finishing Brisbane by 22-12 at a wet Accor Stadium tonight. The win gives the Bunnies their third win on the trot under the tutelage of coach Ben Hornby and raises hopes that the Rabbitohs can make a late run for the Top 8 following a shocking start to the year for the Redfern based club.

The match was built up as a final audition for Rabbitohs superstar Latrell Mitchell and he certainly was involved with a try, try assist, some towering bombs and a stint in the Sin Bin to remind Blues coach Michael Maguire that he has the X-Factor to challenge the Maroons at the MCG in Origin II.

Mitchell wasn't on his own though with forwards Keon Koloamatangi and skipper Cameron Murray also putting themselves in the Blues selection discussion. Halfback Cody Walker was also solid once again following his recent move from five-eighth.

Brisbane on the other hand are now officially in a form slump and face the possibility of slipping out of the Top 8 this weekend if results don't go their way. Coach Kevin Walters will be hoping his representative players get through next Wednesday so the cavalry can return to strengthen their position on the ladder sooner rather than later.

Coming into the game off back-to-back wins, the Rabbitohs threw the ball around with confidence early. Brisbane managed to repel them several times before Damien Cook raced out of dummy half to score the first try of the night after 12 minutes.

With Blues selection a possibility for Latrell Mitchell and Cody Walker, it was Walker with a deft kick towards the upright which saw Keon Koloamatangi come down with the ball to score the home side's second try, before Mitchell made his presence felt minutes later crashing over close to the line to make it 18-0 with just 23 minutes on the clock.

Brisbane needed something to go their way, and it appeared to be happening when Souths centre Richie Kennar found himself in the Sin Bin for a high tackle on Selwyn Cobbo.

Brisbane then quickly set about getting on the scoreboard with the one-man advantage when fullback Tristan Sailor threw a flick pass for Ezra Mam to score, but the pass is ruled forward and the Rabbitohs held on to their 18-0 lead a halftime.

The Blues audition continued to go well for Latrell Mitchell after the break, this time with a superb cut out pass for Alex Johnston to score his side's fourth try of the night and it was all the Bunnies at 22-0.

With 23 minutes remaining, the game hit a flashpoint when returning Rabbitohs skipper Cameron Murray was taken out without the ball by Jordan Riki in an ugly tackle. Mitchell

then objected and ran a mile towards Riki to demonstrate his dissatisfaction. The referee then sent both players to the Sin Bin, while Murray left the field for a head injury assessment.

Following both players return, the Broncos scored their first try of the night when Deine Mariner slid over in the corner to narrow the score to 22-6 following the sideline conversion from Kotoni Staggs.

Mariner then had a double late in the match following a superb kick by Ezra Mam but it was merely a consolation, as the Broncos low completion rate never had them in the game and South Sydney came away with a deserved victory.

TIGERS LIVE IT UP AT LEICHHARDT

The Wests Tigers have recorded their third win of the season with a come-from-behind performance to down the Gold Coast Titans 18-10 at Leichhardt Oval.

A day after \$40 million was pledged to upgrade the iconic ground, courtesy of joint funding provided by the Federal Government, State Government and Inner West Council, the joint venture rallied to win consecutive matches in the same season at Leichhardt Oval for the first time since 2019.

Enduring a wretched run of nine straight losses and an injury toll that saw a further two players - Jordan Miller and Heath Mason - debuted in first grade, the Tigers defied expectations to the delight of a hearty group of 8,147 supporters braving the conditions.

The Titans shot out of the gate with two rampaging runs from Jojo Fifita and a 40/20 from Jayden Campbell, which gave the visitors the field position needed for Fifita (5th minute) to slide over for first points.

Responding with a four-pointer of their own off the back of a repeat set, returning playmaker Aidan Sezer threw a terrific pass that created space for Justin Olam (11th minute) to cross for his fifth try of the season.

Taking advantage of retreating defence after a dashing kick return by Keano Kini, veteran halfback Kieran Foran split the Tigers defence with a show-and-go before passing to his halves partner Jayden Campbell (19th minute) to regain the lead.

The Titans continued to mount pressure during the latter half of the first 40, without converting their ascendancy into points, to take a 10-6 lead at the change of ends.

Determined to make amends for last week's capitulation after halftime, the Tigers began to grow in confidence when a strong run from Samuela Fainu saw Olam (60th minute) collect his second out wide; a sideline conversion from Apisai Koroisau put the side in front for the first time.

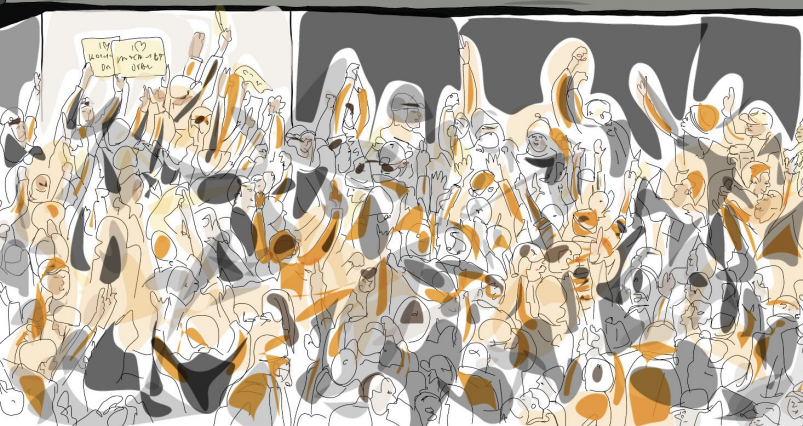

After narrowly beating the Sharks last week, the Dolphins will be looking to make another statement this week, taking on the top of the table Melbourne Storm.

Narrowly losing to both the Warriors and Raiders in Round 12 and 13 respectively, the Dolphins came back refreshed after their second bye of the season to claim their eighth 2024 season win against the Sharks. This sees the Dolphins sitting in fourth spot on the ladder, defying many fans' expectations and predictions.

With Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow and Felise Kaufusi away on Origin duties, Trai Fuller and Jesse Bromwich fill in at their positions, the latter returning from a rib injury that saw him sidelined for last week's match. Tevita Pangai Jnr also makes his NRL return through the bench after his mid-season signing with the South East QLD side.

The Melbourne side are comfortably sitting in first position all on their own and have won ten of the 13 matches they've played this season. Despite beating both the Knights and Warriors the past two weeks, they haven't boasted the best side, leaking a total of 52 points in these two matches, and could be playing even better football.

After missing five matches, Ryan Papenhuyzen makes his return to the side, this causes a shift in the back line with Sua Faalogo moving to wing as Xavier Coates is away on Origin duty. Will Warbrick also returns to the other wing, causing Grant Anderson to shift to the centre and Dean Ieremia to drop out of the side. Bronson Garlick moves to starting hooker with skipper Harry Grant in Origin camp. Trent Loiero is named as starting lock, who will be released from Origin camp for the match.

These two sides met once last year, with the Storm coming out on top 24-16 during Round 12. Although it could much be argued that the Dolphins are a changed and evolved team from that time, with them only needing two more wins this season to overtake the total number of wins from their inaugural season in 2023.

WHO TO WATCH: Recently signing an extension with the Dolphins, **Jeremy Marshall-King** has cemented his position as starting hooker with the side. Despite only crossing the line twice this season, JMK has made six try assists, seven line break assists and ten offloads.

After a tragic start to the fullback's 2024 season (again), **Ryan Papenhuyzen** makes his long-awaited return after missing just over a month. With the Storm undergoing many changes to their spine with never-ending injuries across the board, the return of Paps will give the side a much-needed boost (although the efforts of Sua Faalogo and Tyran Wishart are not to be discounted by any level). Already scoring seven tries in his earlier eight appearances, it'll sure be a show for his homecoming in the side.

FAVOURITE: The Storm are favoured to add the two points and stay in top position on the ladder for another week.

MY TIP: Both sides are fronting strong form and have shown their potential, although they both have weaknesses that aren't quite brushed off. I think it will be a tough competition between the two sides, especially with both missing key players away on Maroons duty, but I think Melbourne will come out on top by the end, with the Dolphins not able to withstand the stormy weather for the entire 80-minute contest. **Melbourne by 10.**

The Warriors will be looking to make it four wins from five matches as they continue their 2024 revival, taking on a Titans side that now sits at the foot of the NRL ladder.

New Zealand suffered a very poor loss to the Storm last weekend, failing to take advantage of a dominant opening 15 minutes to fall 38-24. While Charnez Nicoll-Klokstad, Addin Fonua-Blake and Jackson Ford did everything they could, injuries and a lukewarm return by Shaun Johnson meant they could not make their mark.

But that's not as bad as the Gold Coast, who handed the Tigers their first win since April in a 18-10 loss. Keano Kini was nearly flawless, while Jayden Campbell and Mo Fotuika also starred, but errors let them down as they repeatedly failed to press home a field position advantage.

David Fifita is a big in for the Titans after missing the loss to Wests with an ankle injury. Keenan Palasia starts at prop with Moeaki Fotuika in Maroons camp, while Klese Haas will miss the game due to injury. This means Joe Stimson and Iszac Fa'asuaumealeui are added to the bench.

The Warriors have been unusually impacted by Origin - with Kurt Capewell and Mitchell Barnett called into Queensland and New South Wales camp respectively. They're replaced in the starting side by Dylan Walker and Tohu Harris while Tom Ale and Jacob Laban join the bench. Roger Tuivasa-Sheck also returns from a hamstring injury in the centres to replace the injured Rocco Berry - while Ed Kosi comes in on the wing for the suspended Dallin Watene-Zelezniak.

The Warriors stack is slowly returning to the league median, currently at just under 22 points per game. The Titans would be expected to be beneficial to this rising average, as they concede over 28 points per match. Similarly the 3pm kickoff also benefits the Warriors, who have a 40% win rate in the daylight compared to the Titans 37.5%.

WHO TO WATCH: The return of David Fifita is massive for the Titans - since it feels as though the only way they can win a match is with him in the squad. The bollocking back rower is averaging 152 metres per game to go along with 4 tries, 5 linebreaks and 9 linebreak assists. Importantly he has featured in all three Titans wins, including their win over the Warriors in New Zealand back in Round 8.

For the Warriors they will sorely be needing a better performance from Shaun Johnson. SJ had a poor match kicking and running against the Storm, his first since a pec injury in Round 10. Having made 9 try assists in his first 10 games of the year, the Warriors will desperately need his scoring generation to improve after an off week.

FAVOURITE: The Warriors are backed to win here.

MY TIP: One side is getting back to their best while the other is banged up and missing one of their best remaining players. This could be brutal. **Warriors by a lot.**

Central Coast sets the scene for rivalry without rep stars

The Sydney Roosters and Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs will look to consolidate a place in the top eight when they face off without their representative stars on Saturday evening.

Opting to move a home game to the Central Coast for the 18th time in two decades, the Sydney Roosters will rate their chances of downing their in-form rivals despite missing a host of players to representative duties.

Unable to call upon representative quartet Angus Crichton, Connor Watson, Spencer Leniu and Lindsay Collins, along with injured centre Michael Jennings, from the side that downed the Eels 28-18 last Saturday, coach Trent Robinson has drafted in Dominic Young, Brandon Smith, Blake Steep, Sitili Tupouniua and Siua Wong.

The Roosters hold an imposing record of 15 wins from 20 meetings against the Bulldogs, along with nine wins from 15 matches without their representative stars prior to Origin, during Robinson's tenure.

Coming off a bye with levels of belief not sighted at the club for some time, the Canterbury-Bankstown will be hoping to post four straight wins for the first time this decade.

Sitting inside the top eight midway through a season for the first time in eight years, coach Cameron Ciraldo has been forced to alter his team with Stephen Crichton (NSW), Kurt Mann (suspension) and Jacob Preston (injury) unavailable; Jeral Skelton, Jake Turpin and Poasa Fa'amausili come into the side.

The Bulldogs have struggled without their representative stars in the years following Des Hasler's tenure, winning two out of seven, but were triumphant over the Knights under those circumstances earlier this season.

Winning seven of their 11 visits to Gosford historically, the Bulldogs will be aiming to record back-to-back wins over the Roosters for the first time in eight years.

WHO TO WATCH: Earning a recall after watching last week from the sidelines, **Brandon Smith** will be determined to atone for failing to attend a mid-year review with a starring performance. Generating plenty of media commentary over his future at the club, the 28-year-old New Zealand representative should relish the opportunity to silence his critics and get the better of Reed Mahoney in key personal duel. Regarded as a destructive ball runner despite weighing in under 100 kilograms, Smith will be looking to improve upon his average output of 61 running metres to help the Roosters come away with two valuable premiership points.

Overlooked for NSW after acting as 18th man in three of the past four Origin matches, **Matt Burton** will be raring to back up his efforts against the Roosters from earlier in the season. Collecting a hat-trick when the two sides met in rain-drenched conditions at the start of April, the 24-year-old has been a leading figure in the Bulldogs resurgence with eight tries, four try-assists and 91 running metres on average each week. Possessing a kicking game capable of terrorising opposition backlines, expect Burton to wield his trademark bomb with regularity on Saturday evening.

FAVOURITE: The Roosters are expected to replicate their success over the Bulldogs at Gosford last season, where a Luke Keary field goal proved the difference in a 25-24 win.

MY TIP: Despite James Tedesco playing a club game prior to Origin for the first time since his days at the Tigers, the momentum enjoyed by the Bulldogs should carry on after the bye. **Bulldogs by 8.**

Rejuvenated Rabbitohs take on depleted Manly

Souths will look to continue an unlikely semi-final push when they take on an injury depleted Manly side further weakened by the loss of Origin stars at Accor Stadium.

The Rabbitohs season has been one filled with disaster, after sacking coach Jason Demetriou after eight weeks the Rabbitohs have showed remarkable improvement. Despite interim coach Ben Hornby dropping his first three matches on the bounce, they have hit back in style winning their next three matches. Remarkably, saving their best for now after an impressive domination of premiership contenders Brisbane. Although they are two wins outside the top eight, they have had two byes so far this season. Every point counts however, during this difficult stretch of the season.

Souths will need to do what they did against Brisbane and that is dominate the middle of the field. Keaton Koloamatangi has delivered in spades since moving to the lock forward position, producing monster efforts to give Souths the middle ascendancy. He has strong support from his bench and fellow middle forwards. They enter this one as surprising favourites, so they will again need a strong performance from halves Cody Walker and Jack Wighton.

Onto team news, Latrell Mitchell and Cam Murray are absent due to their State of Origin commitments. Jye Gray returns early from injury in a handy boost for the Rabbitohs. Liam Le Blanc comes onto the bench for his NRL debut. Elsewhere, it is a settled line-up for the boys from Redfern.

For Manly, they are coming off a potentially famous win in their club history. They were left with no fresh reserves and still found a way to secure victory over a recently resurgent St George Illawarra side. They did this by sticking to the basics and frustrating the Dragons into errors with strong goal-line defence. Lehi Hopoate has been a revelation since debuting and has even sparked talk of a Tommy Turbo return via the centres.

They will be injury and Origin hit by significant standards in this clash, so their resilience will once again be tested. To beat Souths, they need to win the middle, they have more than enough spark and speed in the backs to have an edge out there even with the injuries. Their middle depth will again be tested with Paseka set to be sidelined in this fixture so expect the next man up to try and take the most from their opportunity. Plus, Anthony Seibold will be keen for revenge against his old club.

Where do we begin with team changes, Reuben Garrick is in concussion protocol replaced by new signing Aaron Schoupp. DCE is replaced by Karl Lawton, NSW skipper Jake Trbojevic is also missing replaced by Nathan Brown at lock. Aaron Woods starts for Taniela Paseka, while Tof Siple is named despite a finger injury along with Corey Waddell. Ben Condon comes onto the bench as well as a club debut for Aitasi James and an NRL debut for Caleb Navale.

WHO TO WATCH: While all the focus has rightly been on Koloamatangi's emergence in the middle. My focus has been on **Davy Moale**. Moale started the year in and out of the side but he's one guy that has significantly benefited from the change in coaching. He's started in every match and has been dominant in the middle for the Rabbitohs, averaging just under 150m the last three weeks while only missing one tackle. So watch for Moale to try and go after the depleted Manly pack.

Onto Manly and the focus is going onto **Luke Brooks**. This is the sort of game where Brooks needs to showcase his playmaking leadership. He's had a great year with 9 try-assists and 11 line-break assists this season dealing with less scrutiny than his previous club. It's been a massive breath of fresh air for Brooks and your seeing him enjoying his footy again. This is a game I expect Brooks to be the dominant half in and take the game right up to Souths.

FAVOURITE: Souths are favourites for this clash. Manly haven't beaten Souths at Homebush since the 2013 prelim final.

MY TIP: I see this as a Souths win but it won't be a blow out score-line. Manly's depleted line up will compete for lengthy periods but just fall short with the experience of Walker and Wighton proving the difference. **Souths by 8.**

It's been a long year for the Wests Tigers, and they will be hoping they can keep some momentum going from Round 15, which was the first win since Round 4. The 18-10 win against the Gold Coast Titans showed that if the team kept up completions and didn't fumble the ball, they could keep in the game. Solid performances from veteran and star players Aidan Sezer and Api Koroisau were complemented by strong performances from Stefano Utoukamanu, Justin Olam, and Alex Seyfarth, which would give the team confidence that when they click, they can compete.

The team will have Lachlan Galvin return to five-eighth from a hand injury, allowing Koroisau to return to hooker and Sezer to halfback.

Both front rowers got involved last round, and with Api at the helm up front, let's hope they've turned a corner and will back up their performance. **Alex Seyfarth** is as fiery as they come, and his energy off the bench is noticeable in attack and defence. He is the mongrel the Wests need off the bench, and if they are completing sets, he will add to the momentum. With the media storm around young **Lachlan Galvin** simmering down, it may be a chance for the young player to shut down all the hype about moving and show the NRL his energy is focused on winning for his team. Watch for him to reignite a combo with Jahream Bula, whose pace into the gap could be too much for the Canberra forward pack. **Api Koroisau** proved he was a club man by jumping into the halfback position last week; he showed that his club came first before any idea of Origin selection. A classy move by a classy layer; let's hope this is starting to rub off onto the rest of the team.

Jordan Rapana always enjoys scoring tries against Wests Tigers, racking up 16 tries in 14 matches against them. He will be keen to be the number 1 fullback out there on game day, so watch for him to get involved. **Ethan Strange** has given the Raiders a good dose of energy, and his game has been consistent. A tough player to tackle, the Wests will have to make sure they secure him on those speedy runs out wide, opening up opportunities for his outside backs. But it's also his defence game that should draw attention, too, and he will be happy to mix it with any frame coming at him. With **Hudson Young** being dropped from the Origin team, we should be safe in thinking he will take it personally, and I hope he does. A fiery young will be trouble for the West's outside backs, and let's see if he can get under the spinoff Seyfarth. With **Savage** having a quiet game last round, you can be sure Sticky would have been in his ear asking for a reply when he runs out this round. When he gets involved in the game, he is an exciting player who has the power to disrupt the line if he turns up.

FAVOURITE: Raiders have beaten Wests in their last eight games, and The Tigers haven't seen a win at Campbelltown in 10 years, so Canberra is looking odds on favourite,

MY TIP: That being the case, there was something in the Wests' win last week; with all the off-field drama being pumped up by the media, the team shrugged it off and held their composure, even if it was against the next worst team in the league. But I feel, and you can call me crazy, that the Tigers are going to pull an upset here and will take it to an offbeat Raiders team. Tigers to claw themselves a win by a couple. **Wests Tigers by 2.**

CASTLEFORD TIGERS 8 WIGAN WARRIORS 10 AT THE JUNGLE, CASTLEFORD

The Super League season entered its second half as round 14 began this weekend. Recently crowned Challenge Cup champions, Wigan Warriors, got the job done against the Castleford Tigers.

However, they were potentially feeling the effects of their celebrations as they made heavy weather of their victory. On another day, Castleford may have pinched the points against a less-than-fluent Wigan side.

Wigan took an early lead after seven minutes through winger, Liam Marshall. Harry Smith was involved in the build-up drawing in the Castleford defence 20 metres out before passing left to centre, Jake Wardle. Wardle showed quick hands to find Marshall, who ran in from 10 metres out. Smith missed the kick, however, to restrict Wigan's lead to four points. However, Castleford were level before half-time, thanks to a try from mid-season signing, Tex Hoy. Hoy went clean through a gaping hole in the Wigan defence deep in his own half. He ran 70 metres, rounding Bevan French, before touching down to score. The conversion was missed, meaning the two sides went into half-time level at 4-4.

Castleford then took an unexpected lead after 50 minutes, as Rowan Milnes kicked a tricky penalty to put the Tigers into a two-point lead. Milnes then extended the Tigers' lead to four points with a second penalty, this time from around 40 metres out, in the 59th minute. At this point, Wigan looked like they could slip to an unexpected post-Challenge Cup defeat. But the Tigers' lead did not last long, as Wigan struck back two minutes later, with Liam Marshall going in to score another try. A brilliant break from Bevan French, who twisted and turned his way deep into the Castleford half, gave Wigan an excellent field position. Veteran winger, Ryan Hall, broke the Super League try scoring record, as he scored two tries in Hull KR's victory over the Huddersfield Giants.

Hall passes former team-mate as the competition's all-time leading try-scorer. He will return to the Leeds Rhinos next year to end his career. KR registered a comfortable 32-6 victory to increase the pressure on under-fire Huddersfield coach, Ian Watson.

The first half did not give many clues the how the game would end. It was the Giants who took the lead in the game in the seventh minute, through departing centre, Esan Marsters. Marsters intercepted a Tyrone May pass, 30 metres from the Huddersfield line, before running 70 metres to open the scoring. The conversion was missed, to give the Giants a 4-0 lead. Ollly Russell then kicked a penalty for the Giants in the 20th minute to extend their lead to six points. However, a yellow card in the 27th minute for Huddersfield's Adam Milner allowed KR back into the game. Peta Hiku scored for the Robins in 33 minutes, the first of two tries on the night, to give the Robins a foothold in the game. Hiku collected a kick-through from May, after good work from Mikey Lewis to give KR a strong position. Lewis added the extras to level the scores, May then grabbed a try of his own to give KR the lead. KR's win keeps them in third place, two points behind joint leaders, Wigan and St Helens. For Huddersfield, defeat sees them lose more ground in the race for the play-offs, sitting four points behind sixth place.
