TRELL AND CODY STAR AS SOUTHS CHARGE TOWARDS THE EIGHT

Five-star performances from Latrell Mitchell and Cody Walker have inspired South Sydney to five straight victories with a 32-16 victory over a determined Parramatta Eels at a rain-soaked CommBank Stadium.

The early exchanges saw both sides spoil good attacking chances, letting themselves off the hook for respective disciplinary relapses. South Sydney capitalised first after nine minutes off a Parramatta mistake. Cody Walker saw an overlap and took full advantage, combining with Latrell Mitchell to send Jacob Gagai away untouched in the corner. Mitchell's conversion came off the posts and remained 4-0.

Both sides continued to make good yardage but left plenty of scoring chances off the board. Souths bombing the worst of the best chances when Walker lost the ball seemingly with the line wide open after 20 minutes. Parramatta had chances down the left, but Sean Russell was mistiming his passes to debutant Jake Tago.

Something had to give as we approached the half-hour mark. A strong carry from Taane Milne saw him get an offload to Damien Cook to quickly linked up with Keaon Koloamatangi who engaged the line to find Michael Chee-Kam who got it a magical pass to Jacob Gagai putting him in space. Gagai was able to link up with Wighton to cross for Souths' second. Mitchell converted for a 10-0 lead.

Parramatta were getting up field well but failing to execute throughout the opening 40. A strong carry from Blaize Talagi enabled him to get the arm free to put Dylan Brown into space. From the ensuing tackles, Mitch Moses and Brown combine with Clint Gutherson to find Talagi to finish what he started to cross in his 7th straight match. Moses' conversion came off the post and the gap was six.

Right on the break, Parramatta were hanging on for dear life, however conceded the cardinal sin on half-time. Walker drew the defence left on the unders route to Chee Kam who was able to get another magical pass away to Walker who crossed to break the Eels' spirit on half-time.

As the heavens opened in the second half, the Eels seemed to get in their element. However, when push came to shove, Ben Hornby's renewed defensive spirit stopped the Eels right in their track with a desperate try-saver on Will Pensini in the 45th minute a big highlight. Souths' poor discipline was giving Parramatta repeated chances on the Rabbitohs line. As much as Hornby's side has improved defensively in the second half of 2024, they can only hold on for so long. A brilliant pass from Brendan Hands to find a charging Reagan Campbell-Gillard to cross for the first of the second stanza after 51 minutes. Moses converted to reduce it to a converted try.

Parramatta gave away an extra set, and with the superstars on show for South Sydney, it wasn't long before the advantage was back to double digits. Great lead-up work from Davvy Moale who found Walker, and drew the defence wide to find Mitchell who slid early but got the ball down brilliantly. The conversion did struggle to hook across and it

remained a ten point game.

The Eels were building as Souths were getting comfortable and thought they had a third with debutant Jake Tago crossing with 18 to go. However, the Bunker correctly spotted a foot on the sideline and denied the try. South Sydney worked their way to go and seal the game and were rewarded with 11 minutes to play. A shift to the right saw Walker and Mitchell combine to send Gagai away to get his second of the contest. Mitchell's conversion off the posts seemed to put the game out of Parramatta's reach. However, off a penalty for a professional foul, the Eels saw a chance. Parramatta scurried a late try as Gutherson directed play back to the middle and grubber kicked it to a chasing Bryce Cartwright who was able to win the race to the ball. Wighton sealed the game late for the Rabbitohs with a great individual try capitalising on the man advantage with Moses binned for a cynical slow down of play.

TITANS UPSET SHARKS IN COFFS HARBOUR

The 15th-placed Titans hold off a fast-finishing Sharks to secure another win against a top 8 side.

The Cronulla Sharks took their home game to C.ex Coffs International Stadium, facing off against the Gold Coast Titans. Both teams made some pre-kickoff changes, with Royce Hunt starting for the Sharks and Tanah Boyd returning from injury in the halves for the Titans, replacing AJ Brimson. Beau Fermor shifted to the centres, Jacob Alick-Wiencke moved from the extended bench to the second row to partner David Fifita, and Jaylan De Groot made his NRL debut from the bench.

The Titans dominated the opening minutes, with veteran half Kieran Foran scoring in the 7th minute and Tanah Boyd converting.

The Sharks faced an early setback when Royce Hunt lost the ball just short of the try line in the 11th minute. Two minutes later, Siosifa Talakai was sent to the sin bin for a high shot on Sam Verrills.

With the Sharks down to 12 men, the Titans capitalised on their advantage. A short ball from Foran to Chris Randall resulted in a try directly under the posts, with Boyd adding the extras to push the score to 12-0 after 15 minutes. The Titans continued their relentless attack, forcing multiple drop-outs from the Sharks.

A brief respite came when Keano Kini picked up a fast-moving grubber from Braydon Trindall, but the Sharks were penalised for the Titans being offside. However, their luck stayed the same as Nicho Hynes turned the ball inside to Jesse Ramien, only for the pass to be called forward. The Sharks were denied again in the 28th minute when Will Kennedy's try was sent upstairs as no try.

The Titans earned another forced drop-out before halftime, but the Sharks managed to regain possession by kicking deeper. Despite their efforts, the Sharks went into the sheds down 12-0.

At halftime, the Titans had 64% possession with 22 sets to the Sharks' 10, completing 85% of them compared to the Sharks' 59%. This possession disparity led to the Sharks making nearly 100 more tackles.

The Titans opened the second half scoring with a successful penalty goal from Tanah Boyd. Less than five minutes later, Braydon Trindall finally scored the first points for the Sharks, but Hynes failed to convert, leaving the score at 14-4.

The Sharks' momentum was short-lived as they failed to make the 10 meters on yet another forced dropout, handing possession to the Titans. A quick play-the-ball from Beau Fermor and a strong run by Keenan Palasia saw the Titans extend their lead, with Boyd successfully converting again.

C.ex Coffs International Stadium, Coffs Harbour / Gumbaynggirr

The Sharks tested the Titans' defence repeatedly, finally breaking through when winger Daniel Atkinson crossed the line after a beautiful rainbow pass from Trindall. Hynes added the extras, narrowing the gap. With four minutes to go, the Sharks scored back-to-back tries, spreading it to the left for Hynes to find the try line and convert, reducing the deficit to 4 points.

In the closing minutes, both sides attacked and defended well. The decider came when young Sharks winger Daniel Atkinson attempted to tap back a Hynes cross-field kick, but it went over the sideline. The Titans ran down the last 41 seconds, with David Fifita going to ground with the ball as the siren sounded, securing the win.

The result sees the third-placed Sharks lose their third game in a row, falling to the 15th-placed Gold Coast Titans in front of a sold-out crowd in Coffs Harbour.

PERSISTENT PANTHERS HOLD OUT BRONCOS IN SUNCORP THRILLER

The Penrith Panthers of old came to the fore on Friday night as the defending premiers put on a defensive masterclass to hold out the Brisbane Broncos 14-6 in a Suncorp Stadium thriller.

Both teams come out of the game with injury concerns, with Jock Madden and Daine Laurie failing to finish after picking up hamstring issues.

Speaking of hamstrings, Penrith superstar Nathan Cleary is now scheduled to return after the bye in Round 20 as the Panthers look to make a push towards locking up a top four spot.

As for Brisbane, while a much-improved effort in defence on Friday, the loss means the Broncos will still be at least two points adrift of the top eight by the end of the week.

Ivan Cleary dropped a selection bombshell before Friday's game, promoting Laurie to the wing in place of Sunia Turuva, although it took just a few minutes for that plan to quickly unravel.

Laurie came from the field with a hamstring injury and did not return, seeing Jack Cole injected into the game while Paul Alamoti shifted to the wing.

Cole made an immediate impact as he scored with his first touch, in the right place at the right time after a sublime pass from prop James Fisher-Harris opened up space on the left edge.

The Panthers had several chances to extend their lead throughout the first half but struggled to break through Brisbane's brick wall defence, finishing with 28 tackles in the opposition 20 but managing just the one try.

It meant the Broncos went into halftime leading 6-4 after the speed of Reece Walsh proved too much for Penrith's right edge defence in the 26th minute.

It took something unconventional for the Panthers to go over for their second of the night, with an awkward Jarome Luai bomb taken on the full by Liam Martin, who spun it to Lindsay Smith as the front rower put boot to ball and set up Brian To'o out wide.

Dylan Edwards was once again unable to convert the try, leaving the score at 8-6.

It came after Brisbane was dealt an injury blow of its own as Madden limped off after chasing down an Ezra Mam kick, pulling up lame with what was later reported as a suspected torn hamstring.

While the attack wasn't always slick, Penrith quickly got the upper hand in the second



half on the back of its relentless line speed as Brisbane continually struggled for meterage in its own end.

The persistence and patience from the Panthers eventually paid dividends as Mitch Kenny slid over out of dummy-half to put the away side up 14-6 with 10 minutes left.

Brisbane threatened to set up a grandstand finish on a few occasions but Penrith continued to turn up and held the Broncos scoreless in the second half.

Kevin Walters' side now have to prepare for the Dragons next week while the Panthers will be able to rest up on the bye after a grueling win.

BURTON BOOTS THE BULLDOGS HOME IN GOLDEN POINT - AGAIN

A field goal to Matt Burton in golden point has delivered the Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs a 13-12 victory over the New Zealand Warriors in one of the games of the season.

Nailing a match winner for the second time in as many weeks to extend the Bulldogs unbeaten record to seven wins at home this season, Burton fell short with three attempts before landing his fourth to the delight of 27,223 supporters in attendance at Accor Stadium.

In a tight opening which saw Roger Tuivasa-Sheck denied an early four-pointer for a knock-on in the lead up, the Bulldogs struck first midway through the half when Burton swooped onto a Te Maire Martin pass and found Bronson Xerri (20th minute) in support for first points.

The home side's joy was short lived when Sam Hughes knocked on from the kick-off and a scrum play allowed the visitors to shift the ball right, allowing Dallin Watene-Zelezniak (22nd minute) to perform an acrobatic put-down for his ninth try of the season.

The Warriors continued to build pressure which translated on the scoreboard with former Bulldogs outside back Marcelo Montoya (28th minute) powering his way over in the opposite corner.

The Bulldogs were unable to make the most of attacking opportunity late in the half as a penalty goal to Adam Pompey after the halftime siren sent the Warriors to the sheds leading 12-6.

The Warriors lead on the scoreboard came at a cost with Charnze Nicoll-Klokstad (calf) and Watene-Zelezniak (HIA) ruled out of the game, and Montoya (groin) remaining on the field, despite being inconvenienced, before being replaced in the final quarter.

Taking advantage of a penalty from inside their own half, the Bulldogs made the most of good field position with Toby Sexton executing a well-placed bomb for Viliame Kikau (56th minute) to level the scores up at 12-all.

With both teams unable to land a knockout blow close to the goal line, including Warriors debutant Leka Halasima busting down the sideline only to be held up over the tryline, Te Maire Martin attempted to break the deadlock only for his field goal to be charged down.

In response, Burton looked certain to seal the result only for his shot to ricochet off the posts, resulting in the match going to golden point.



As both teams played for field position in an attempt to ice the result, Chanel Harris-Tavita missed with two attempts in the first half of golden point, while Burton did likewise with his sole shot.

With the clock running down and a draw looking likely, a charge down on Burton's third attempt gave the Bulldogs the field position needed for the five-eighth to land the decisive score in the 87th minute.

Next week, the Bulldogs will have their third - and final - bye, while the Warriors will have their second bye of the season.

Wayne's world: present vs. past and future

All eyes will be on Wayne Bennett as the current coach of the Dolphins takes on the South Sydney Rabbitohs – his past and future club – in an Origin-impacted fixture on Thursday evening.

Coming into the final Origin-impacted round after their third bye of the season last week, the Dolphins will be hoping to arrest a disappointing run which has yielded one win from their past five matches.

Unable to call upon Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow and Felise Kaufusi due to representative commitments, coach Wayne Bennett has been dealt a major blow with Jeremy Marshall-King sidelined with a foot injury until the final weeks of the regular season.

Jack Bostock returns in the backline with Josh Kerr doing likewise in the forward pack, while Max Plath moves from lock to hooker as part of a rotation which sees Sean O'Sullivan join the bench.

The Dolphins will make their final appearance at Kayo Stadium this season; the league's newest team have won four out of five matches at the Redcliffe venue with their lone loss occurring against the Raiders prior to Origin I.

Progressing up the ladder to remarkably sit on the precipice of the top eight, the South Sydney Rabbitohs will be aiming to show their future coach what they're capable of right now.

Posting their fifth successive victory with a 32-16 win over the Eels last Thursday, interim coach Ben Hornby has recalled Jye Gray and Liam Le Blanc with Latrell Mitchell (injury) and Cameron Murray (NSW) unavailable.

Winning eight out of 17 matches leading into Origin over the past decade, the Rabbitohs have vastly improved during their run of five wins, averaging 31 points in attack and 13 points in defence, compared with 16 points in attack and 35 points in defence during their first ten matches.

WHO TO WATCH: Enjoying a stellar campaign to stand as one of the leading rookie of the year contenders, Max Plath will take on added responsibility by starting at hooker for the first time in the top grade. Shifting closer to the action with Jeremy Marshall-King set to spend an extended stint on the sideline, the 22-year-old has been explosive through the middle of the field while playing above his weight in defence. Coming up against the experienced Damien Cook in a key positional battle, the Dolphins will need strong service from Plath if they hope to arrest their mid-season malaise.

Shifting from an edge to the middle of the field in recent weeks, Keon Koloamatangi has embodied the gains made by the Rabbitohs during their mid-season resurgence. Performing as well as – if not exceeding – the form that saw him debut for the Blues a year ago, the 26-year-old has run for over 200 metres in each of the side's wins while also crossing for four tries. Coming up against a Dolphins pack boasting some of the most experienced forwards in the league, the Rabbitohs will be looking for Koloamatangi to maintain his work rate in order to come away with two vital points on Thursday evening.

FAVOURITE: The Dolphins have won both of their games following a bye this season and are expected to complete the hat-trick on Thursday evening.

MY TIP: The Rabbitohs have gone from rock bottom to a team capable of not only toppling a struggling Dolphins side but contending for the top eight. **Rabbitohs by 14.**

Hobbled Hynes a bitter blow for Sharks side desperate for turnaround against Tigers

A Sharks side reeling from the sudden loss of their chief playmaker will look to turn their flagging fortunes around when they take on a rising Tigers outfit.

Last week's 20-16 loss to the Titans was the low point in a mid season form slump that has continued to dig the Sharks into a deeper and deeper hole. Not many teams can win a game after making 16 errors, and certainly the Sharks were not one of them. While they had some bright sparks in Jesse Ramien, Nicho Hynes and Briton Nikora, a lack of performance from their bench and back 3 contributed to the loss.

The Tigers also tasted defeat - a 40-28 loss to the Storm - but their loss showed the promise the team has had in spurts throughout the season. They controlled possession, defended well and took chances in attack, but in the end the better team took the win. One weakness in their side was a lack of production from their prop rotation - particularly Stefano Utoikamanu having a rather poor audition for a club reportedly keen to sign him for 2025.

The big news for the Sharks is that Hynes is out - and not just for this week either, with the star half fracturing his leg and rupturing his syndesmosis in a freak accident in training. He'll be forced to sit out around 2 months, which could rule him out of the rest of the regular season. Braydon Trindall shifts to halfback with Daniel Atkinson named at five eighth. Sione Katoa returns on the wing after clearing concussion protocol, while Teig Wilton starts in the back row with Siosifa Talakai suspended. Jesse Colquhoun and Braden Hamlin-Uele have been added to the bench.

For the Tigers Justin Olam is out as he continues to battle a knee issue, bringing Solomona Faataape into the centres and Alexander Lobb to the wing. Justin Matamua has been dropped to the reserves with his bench spot taken by Reuben Porter. Starford To'a is also among the reserves and could make his comeback from a hamstring injury.

The Sharks have won 10 of their past 12 games against the Tigers, and if the Tigers were to buck the trend in this one 2024 would become the first year they've defeated Cronulla twice in the same season since 2014. The Tigers have struggled away from home all year with just 1 win from 8 matches, and in their last three they've conceded an average of 46 points a game. The Sharks meanwhile average 25 points per game at Pointsbet (a figure greatly brought down by their shutout against Penrith) compared to a mark of 24 points per game in all matches.

WHO TO WATCH: With no Hynes more pressure will be placed on Will Kennedy to perform for the Sharks. The 27 year old has struggled this year, with just 9 try contributions and 3 line breaks in 16 games. His running metres are also down on 2023's figures by almost 30 metres per game. But in the two matches Hynes has missed this year he was strong, with a try against the Eels and a try assist against the Broncos. The Sharks will need him to be at his best again if they want to win this one.

His opposite number Jahream Bula will also be worth keeping an eye on. His match against the Storm was by far his best of the season, with a try, two try assists and 181 running metres. He's quietly been improving in 2024 from his barnstorming rookie campaign, and a strong performance against the Sharks would only cement that growth.

Have the Gold Coast Titans finally turned a corner, and will the confirmation of a new coach help the Parramatta Eels find some form?

Cbus Super Stadium will host the first game for the Saturday leg of the round 19. The Titans are in unfamiliar territory of back-to-back wins and a roster slowly returning to full strength.

Titans coach Des Hasler stressed the importance of last rounds win, saying the team knew it was essential to show the competition consistency in their play. The 20-14 victory over Cronulla can be attributable to the team's defensive efforts, which kept them in the game. With players always turning up and sliding across to tighten the gaps when required, something which has been lacking lately, letting points leak for the Gold Coast.

Hasler earmarked David Fifita and Beau Fermor as players who have been consistent for the last six weeks and have been rewarded with the back to back wins, and now a chance to make it 3 in a row at home against an Eels outfit struggling to get their heads above water.

A bit of movement with the Titans team sees Jayden Campbell return from a hand injury to five-eighth; the game will be Campbell's 50th NRL appearance. With Moeaki Fotuika representing the Maroons, Josiah Pahulu slots into the front row. Klese Hass returns from a foot injury to run on in the back row, and Phil Sami will be on the bench as he returns from a calf strain.

Even with Origin halfback Mitchell Moses, the Eels could not trouble the opposition in the last round, going down 32-16 against a spirited South Sydney team.

Unlike Des Hasler's praise for his troops of shifting across to fill the gaps, Eels interim coach Trent Barrett was critical that his players would stop shifting in defence, creating a broken line and leaking points at crucial times in the game. In a game that saw some up-and-coming talent like Jake Tago and Charlie Gymer come into the fray, but on many accounts, the team didn't find any cylinders to fire on across the pitch.

With Mitchel Moses off on Origin duty, Daejarn Asi will fill in at half-back, and Lorenzo Mulitalo will debut on the wing, replacing Sean Russell. Blaize Talagi to the centres. Regan Capmbell-Gillard will play his 100th game for the Eels on Saturday.

WHO TO WATCH: The combination of Kieran Foran's kicking and organisation with Jayden Campbell's speed and knack for finding gaps will be something the Eels may have an issue with. And if Dylan Brown doesn't step up to cause pressure with his own running game, it could allow the Titans to get the ascendancy in the middle to build for their forwards.

Klese Hass was starting to find some consistent form before his injury, and he will undoubtedly be back to show that he has earned his place in the run-on side. Combined with his back row partners of Chris Randall and David Fifita, there is a nice energy that these players are tapping into.

With Verrills and Erin Clark up front, I would suspect the Titans will try to play a quick game from the dummy half area and try to catch the bigger Eels pack flat-footed in the middle.

Fermor is in good form and will no doubt continue, as will the speedster Keano Kini. The pocket rocket is having fun with the space to move allocated by Hasler, and his speed and awareness for being in the right spot will work with the freakish play that Jayden Campbell can bring to the game.

The Eel's main playmaker will be Dylan Brown, and he's one to watch because if he fires, the team will rally behind him. And if he is on the front foot, it will be the counter to the Titans half combination.

Jake Tago showed he was ready for the NRL with a gutsy performance in the last round. His talent is screaming to be given the ball, and he is the kind of winger and player who will go looking for the ball. If he and Clint Gutherson can click on the back end of the movements, it may be easy to expose some holes in the Titan's defence.

When Shaun Lane and Bryce Cartwright get on the field, they can be devastating along the edges with their rangy limbs, perfect for offloading to some speedy outside backs. A bit quiet of late; let's hope the news of a new coach can reinvigorate the team to come back to form.

FAVOURITE: With a few victories under the belt and playmakers in the fold, the Titans are coming in as favourites. Unlike the Eels, who are with their playmaker Moses and are yet to give their fans any confidence in their ability.

MY TIP: The Gold Coast is riding a high, and with a home game, they are going to get this one. Though the Eels may find some confidence in announcing a new coach, it could be closer. **Titans by a try.**

A pivotal mid-table clash at Suncorp in the scrap for a highly competitive top eight spot.

The Brisbane Broncos look to snap a five-game losing streak, where they face the inconsistent and unpredictable St George Illawarra Dragons at home, with the visitors sitting one place above them in 10th.

Brisbane play their second home game in a row, after showing grit and discipline to hold reigning premiers Penrith Panthers to only 14 points last Friday. With their defence seemingly fixed, the burden falls on their attack as they look to score more than the lowly 6 points of their last 80 minutes.

This task proves challenging, as stars Reece Walsh, Selwyn Cobbo, Patrick Carrigan and Payne Haas are unavailable due to Origin duties. Tristan Sailor replaces Walsh at the back, with Tyson Smoothy starting lock, allowing dummy half prospect Blake Mozer to take his 14 jersey. Although an injury to halfback Jock Madden forces Josh Rodgers into the side, the Broncos are bolstered by returns to Kotoni Staggs at centre and Jordan Riki in the second row.

St George have seen a mixed year under Shane Flanagan, with a loss-win-loss-win pattern from their last eight games providing an accurate summary of their tumultuous season to date. They were stunned by the Roosters last week, falling 42-12 in a showing where they lacked any competitiveness. Still, the Dragons have shown they can beat top teams in 2024 and will be licking their lips at a battered Broncos side.

Zac Lomax and Ben Hunt are out for Origin commitments, which sees Milkaele Ravalawa and Jesse Marschke come into the side. Raymond Faitala-Mariner returns from injury, pushing Luciano Leilua to the bench, where he's joined by Hame Sele in place of the injured Blake Lawrie. Despite not being named to start, Jack Bird at 18th man is a slight chance to sneak into the 17 come game day.

WHO TO WATCH: Keep a close eye on fullback Tristan Sailor, who is as exciting as he is at times frustrating. With a strong passing and kicking game, Tristan poses as a dynamic attacking threat. I watched him in the Hostplus Cup last week, and he still didn't look 100% fit from what seems to be a lingering ankle injury. Brisbane will be hoping a solid showing can put any of my concerns about his defensive efforts to bed.

After being controversially overlooked for Origin selection, arguably the form second rower of the competition, ex-Bronco Jaydn Su'a will be gunning for a chance to prove he's still one of the best in his position. I expect him to be fast and powerful up the middle, and with Brisbane having suspect edge defence at times, Su'a has a golden opportunity to make a statement in the biggest way.

FAVOURITE: The Brisbane Broncos are favourites to win at home

MY TIP: I have to admit, St George have been impressive to watch in 2024 and I do think they'll make Brisbane work hard and fight their way through the match. Ultimately, I think too much of the Dragons structure revolves around Ben Hunt and although Brisbane are severely down on men, I think they'll have just enough to squeeze through, with a slight return of form in the week prior certainly bolstering their chances. **Brisbane by 8.**

Both sides continue to battle for a top eight position whilst they are missing many key players due to Origin Game III camp.

In a golden point thriller last week, Manly came away with their eighth win of the season with Daly Cherry-Evans kicking a field goal in the 83rd minute, after he missed an attempt in the 77th minute, along with the Cowboys missing their five field goal attempts. This leaves the Sea Eagles in seventh position, sitting lonesome on 21 points.

With Daly Cherry-Evans and Jake Trbojevic in Origin camp, Jamie Humphreys and Karl Lawton take their places respective. Tolu Koula is facing a stint on the sidelines, so Tom Trbojevic shifts to fullback, with Tommy Talau moving to the centre and Lehi Hopoate on the wing. Corey Waddell, Gordon Chan Kum Tong, and Clayton Faulalo join the bench, whilst Nathan Brown takes Ben Trbojevic's place who will miss the match due to a head knock.

The Knights managed to keep the Raiders from getting the win last week, winning 16-12 which marks their eighth win of the season, and knocking on the door of the top eight again, sitting in ninth position. With many of the senior, experienced Knights players not playing this week, Jackson Hastings will have to step up and lead the spine, with both Sharpe and Pryce playing a combined six games in their collective careers. Hastings has featured in 14/16 Knights games this year, scoring three tries whilst also making ten try assists and eleven line break assists.
