NRL FINALS WEEK 1 WRAP

KING CLEARY RULES THE ROOST AS PANTHERS POWER TO PRELIM

The defending premiers have advanced to their fifth consecutive preliminary final, after defeating the Roosters by 30-10 in their final game at BlueBet Stadium tonight.

Skipper Nathan Cleary was magnificent on return from injury, setting up three tries in an absolute masterclass from the two-time Clive Churchill Medalist, with the Panthers sending a message to the rest of the competition that a fourth consecutive premiership is on the cards.

Penrith simply flew out of the blocks racing in four first half tries to leave the Roosters floundering and despite the Roosters fighting back early in the second half, the home side were never really threatened. The win sees as the men in black advance to one win away from another Grand Final with confidence sky high at the foot of the mountains. Penrith came into the match as the finals specialists and they made the Roosters pay for an early error, when Brian To'o charged over for the first try of the night following a slick backline movement led by Yeo and Cleary.

Cleary was at it again minutes later, when his kick on the last took a deflection off the post and into the arms of Izack Tago for his sides second try in just 12 minutes. The Panthers charges were relentless, as they again marched up field and off the back of a repeat set they had their third try as Jarome Lui stepped inside off his left foot to crash over to extend the lead to 16-0. Penrith had the Tricolours at sixes and sevens quite literally as Lui and Cleary continued to pin the Roosters in goal and then they scored again when Mitch Kenny produced a neat pass from dummy half for Luke Garner to muscle over to score. The Tricolours were desperately clinging on and they almost lost Luke Keary to the Sin Bin for a jersey pull on Liam Henry who was chasing a kick. Keary stayed on the field despite the home fans chants and Penrith elected to take the penalty on offer and go to the break with a dominant 24-0 lead.

The Roosters needed to score first in the second half to have any hope of advancing to next week and they did exactly that, as James Tedesco put Joseph Suaalii in some space to score. The visitors then had back-to-back tries, when rookie half Sandon Smith produced a nice ball to Tedesco who barged his way over the line to narrow the scoreline to 24-10 in the opening 10 minutes of the half. The Roosters continued to chance their arm out wide through the likes of Joey Manu and Domonic Young but Penrith managed to scramble and turn them away time after time.

Penrith then iced the game with eight minutes remaining, when man of the match Cleary produced a deft kick at the line for Luke Garner to score his second try of the night to take a commanding 30-10 lead and earn a week off next week.

WIZARDRY FROM GRANT AS A STORM SURGE MOVES TO A PRELIM FINAL

A maiden NRL hattrick from Harry Grant has again showcased that the Melbourne Storm are Penrith's biggest challenge to a potential four-peat with a commanding 37-10 win over the Cronulla Sharks at AAMI Park.

The second qualifying final couldn't have started any worse for the visitors as Will Kennedy failed to defuse the opening kick-off. Off the line-dropout, Cam Munster caught the Sharks asleep, and it is a ruthless start from the Storm. He used big Nelson Asofa-Solomona as a decoy which fooled Toby Rudolf and Munster goes through to score the opening try after just over 60 seconds.

Cronulla were able to wrestle back momentum. A smart offload from Oregon Kaufusi saw the Sharks motor up field and began to push the Storm back towards their own line. From the ensuing set-restart given away by Jack Howarth, Cronulla moved the ball right as Nicho Hynes found Siosifa Talakai who isolated Howarth one on one. Talakai was able to get it away to Sione Katoa and the Sharks get one back and were right in the contest in the opening exchanges.

Unfortunately, two critical Sharks mistakes came back to bite which led to scoring plays for the Storm. Hynes and the visitors were punished for their inability to get a kick away on the last. The home side was able to work towards their right edge which allowed Nick Meaney to deliver a magical offload to Will Warbrick and the Storm grabbed a second try despite the visitors cries of a forward pass.

Melbourne added a further penalty goal after Munster was hit off the ball by a Sharks player. The Storm were fortunate to secure possession after a horrific kick for touch by Hynes which was easily recovered by the home side. At 14-4, the Sharks were up against it, however a late penalty gave the Sharks the final say of the first 40. Brayden Trindall was skipping across the field, dragging the Storm defence out wide. Trindall turned Nikora underneath with a spectacular flick pass to score right under the posts on the stroke of half-time to make the score 14-10.

The second half started strongly for the boys from Melbourne. The Storm had plenty of try-scoring opportunities but early on the Sharks were keen on keeping the gap at four points. However, a penalty against Katoa saw the Storm finally crack the Sharks side. Josh King dug into the teeth of the Sharks pack, before unloading to Harry Grant who dove over under the posts to make it a two possession game.

More possession down the Sharks end of the field tested the Sharks defence further and despite their best efforts, another try was on the way just past the hour mark. A brilliant pin-point kick from Jahrome Hughes landed in the lap of Warbrick to put the match beyond doubt. Melbourne were looking great with ball in hand and looked set to



run up the score, but a brilliant try-saving tackle on Tui Kamikamica stopped the score-line going into the 30's (for the moment).

Melbourne added further salt into the Cronulla wound with a brilliant Hughes bomb. Eli Katoa made these kicks contests' all night long and got his reward when he defused it and unloaded to Grant to add his second try next to the posts. This became a hattrick when Hughes' bomb again was contested, this time Warbrick batted it back to Grant and "Prince Harry" delivered for the Storm in a commanding performance. Ryan Papenhuyzen added the final bullet with a disrespectful field goal in the dying stages.

The Cowboys have staged a come-from-behind victory to advance to the second week of the finals, with a last gasp victory over the Knights.

Despite the Knights dominating the match in all aspects early on, it was the Cowboys who scored first, entirely against the run of play, in the 14th minute. Kalyn Ponga bounced out of three tackles on the left side, passed to Dylan Lucas who then attempted to link with his winger, however Kyle Feldt took a clean intercept and raced 85 metres to score. Valentine Holmes failed to convert from touch.

10 minutes later, the Knights replied when that man again Ponga, slipped through the Cowboys defence after a lovely show-and-go, then linked with Jayden Brailey on the inside and the Knights rake ran 20 metres to score. Ponga converted.

Fletcher Sharpe crossed in the 33rd minute when a Ponga kick was not cleaned up by anyone in the contest, Sharpe swooped in and cleaned up the loose ball near the Cowboys line and he walked in to score. Ponga converted again to give the Knights a 12-4 lead at the break.

The Cowboys scored just 4 minutes after play resumed when Holmes batted along a long ball to the unmarked Murray Taulagi, who dived to score in the corner. Holmes converted.

The Cowboys regained the lead in the 51st minute when Scott Drinkwater lobbed a lovely ball to his lead runner Jordan McLean, allowing the front rower to waltz in for an easy try. Holmes converted.

In the 65th minute, Lucas received the ball 10 metres from the Cowboys line, whose defence was scattered. He shaped to pass left, stepped back and straightened then barged over between two defenders to score. Ponga's conversion attempt hit the post and was waved away, leaving the scores tied at 16 apiece.

In the 72nd minute, the Cowboys put up a kick to the Knights corner. Feldt knocked it back, the ball bounced off Heilum Luki's leg, then ever so narrowly evaded Daniel Saifiti's hand, bounced off Reuben Cotter's knee, dribbled into the Knights in-goal. Ponga and Cotter raced to get to the ball and almost got to it simultaneously, but it was Cotter who planted his hand on it first for the try. Holmes converted.

NRL FINALS WEEK 1 WRAP

SEA EAGLES STAGE AN UPSET TO SOAR INTO THE SEMI FINALS

The Manly Sea Eagles have spoiled the party for the Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs with a famous 24-22 victory to progress through to the Semi Finals.

Staging a second half comeback in front of the largest crowd for a Week One finals match in the NRL era, a scintillating try from Tolu Koula saw the Sea Eagles upstage the Bulldogs' first finals appearance since 2016.

Getting off to a dream start with points stemming from a Tom Trbojevic error close to the Sea Eagles goal line, a left-side shift allowed Bulldogs winger Jacob Kiraz (6th minute) to plant the ball down to the delight of 50,714 supporters in attendance.

Penalties in quick succession saw the Sea Eagles momentarily take the lead with Tommy Talau (14th minute) diving for the corner and Reuben Garrick nailing a conversion from the touchline.

The Bulldogs big name stars delivered midway through the half with Viliame Kikau (19th minute) bullocking through feeble defence and Matt Burton exposing Tom Trbojevic defending in the frontline with a chip kick for Stephen Crichton (23rd minute) to pounce.

A costly error by Jeral Skelton, who dropped the ball over the try line, was compounded on the cusp of halftime with Lehi Hopoate soaring onto a Daly Cherry-Evans bomb and offloading to Ethan Bullemor (36th minute) in support to narrow the margin to 16-12.

A fortuitous bounce of the ball allowed Skelton (46th minute) to make amends for his first half mishap after a cross-field kick from Toby Sexton was knocked on by Koula and batted on by Crichton into the waiting arms of the replacement winger.

The Sea Eagles clawed back the deficit with Luke Brooks and Cherry-Evans (55th minute) pulling off a perfectly executed scrum play to narrow the margin to four points.

Posting back-to-back tries for the first time with an audacious decision to run the ball on the last tackle, a series of offloads from inside their own half allowed Tolu Koula (70th minute) to streak away for one of the tries of the season; Garrick's conversion put the Sea Eagles ahead 24-22.

Burton was unable to land two two-point field goals in the dying moments, leaving the Sea Eagles to record a famous victory against the odds.

Next week, the Sea Eagles will face the Roosters on Saturday night at Allianz Stadium.

TIGERS BREAK SEASON DUCK AT LEICHHARDT *TIM COSTELLO*

A late Dragons comeback wasn't enough to steal the limelight from a drought-breaking Wests Tigers team on Thursday night at a wet and sparse Leichhardt Oval.

Having raced to a 14-0 halftime lead, the home side managed only a penalty goal in the second half - but it proved absolutely crucial as they witheld a surging Dragons outfit in awful conditions in Sydney's inner west.

The Tigers were on the board first at the seven minute mark with Rebecca Pollard scoring the first of her two tries, dashing over in the right corner after the hosts picked up a crucial penalty.

Not long after Leanne Tufuga had the Tigers second and the fast start was looking convincing. When Pollard picked up her brace in the 31st minute, it was clear the Tigers were the real deal.

It wasn't until 8 minutes after the break the Dragons finally cracked the duck, with a Pollard error eventually handing Fotu-Moala a Red V four-pointer. Soon after Madison Mulhall went over and the Tigers' lead was abruptly cut to just four.

Step up Pauline Piliie-Rasabale, whose penalty goal ultimately won the game - meaning a late Fotu-Moala try (which went unconverted) wasn't enough for the Dragons right near the fulltime siren.

The Tigers' win keeps their narrow hopes of avoiding the spoon alive (albeit only mathematically, and even then...) and ensures the Jamie Soward era at the Dragons ends with a bottom-four finish.

SIX STRAIGHT AS BRONCOS SHUN SHARKS *BETH NICHOLLS*

The Broncos fly to win six in a row, whilst the Sharks fall to back-to-back losses after a flawless start to their season.

Despite trailing 14-16 with only a minute left on the clock, the Broncos manage to get the job done yet again to seal their chances at a 2024 finals run.

The Broncos opened the scoring in the fifth minute with an offload from Chelsea Lenarduzzi allowed for the Brisbane side to shift the ball to the right, with Stacey Waaka crossing over for her sixth try in six games. It didn't take long for the Sharks to attack back though, with the Broncos defenders unable to stop Ellie Johnston who powered over the line, and a successful conversion from Tayla Preston put the away side in front by two points.

Brisbane continued trailing by two, with neither team able to score, but in the final 20 second of the match, Chelsea Lenarduzzi powered through the line on her own on the last tackle and gave the Broncos their sixth win of the season.

Despite looking like they were destined for their first loss since Round 2, the Broncos yet again get the job done, and see themselves in second place, where in the final round they take on the Dragons in Townsville, fighting for minor premiership pending the results of the Roosters in Round 9. For the Sharks, they see themselves in third position, facing two losses in a row, where next week they come up against the West Tigers, who recorded their first season win this past round.

SHARKS v TIGERS:Luke **JOBSON**

The final round of the NRLW regular season has crept up on us incredibly quickly - starting with the last game at Leichhardt in 2024 as the Cronulla Sharks take on the Wests Tigers on Thursday night.

The Sharks had a home final in their hands for the first 68 minutes last week, before a disastrous last 90 seconds saw a ball get kicked dead and the Broncos scoring with the last play of the game. The 20-16 loss was the Sharks second defeat in a row, with the compounding effect in that finals are no longer guaranteed for last week's ladder leaders. Coming off a 40-0 trouncing loss at the hands of the Roosters two weeks ago, it means that the Sharks must win this week against the Tigers in order to host a home final - and that is assuming that results go their way. A points differential of +26 also means that in the unlikely event that the Parramatta Eels can beat the Roosters by more than 30 points, the Cowboys defeat the Dragons and the Sharks lose to the Tigers - the Sharks could slip out of finals contention.

They will look to avoid that by winning against the Tigers - the same Wests Tigers that won their first game of 2024 last week against the Dragons. While the Tigers are basically confirmed to win the wooden spoon, it is a shining light on their struggling season that has seen them so close on a couple of occasions before watching the win slip away. Two tries to Rebecca Pollard last week sealed the win for the Tigers, who were able to get that elusive win and have something to smile about in what has been a tough season. One can expect that the Tigers will come out firing as they look to double their season tally with the upset in their last home game of the season.

Cronulla have one change from last weeks game, with Chloe Saunders making way for Manila Takapaatolo on the bench, while the Tigers have an enforced change with an injury to Claudia Brown, likely ending her 2024 season. Montana Clifford returns from concussion protocols to replace Brown, who is on the extended bench should she be okay to go this weekend.

WHO TO WATCH: Tayla Preston has been brilliant for the Sharks this season, moreso in just pure organization around the park than anything else. Despite only having two try assists this season for the competition leaders, Preston has been able to ensure that the attack is firing on all cylinders bar one game against the Roosters - something that has been lacking for the Sharks across the past few seasons in September.

Coming off a two try performance last week, Rebecca Pollard will look to replicate that performance against a Sharks side that has been leaking points in the last few weeks. Pollard, who ran for 167 metres with four line breaks, has grown into this season with four tries in five games. The Tigers will no doubt target Pollard's side this week as they look to cause a huge upset to finish off the 2024 season

MY TIP: Put simply, a Cronulla Sharks win allows them to host a preliminary final without the need to worry for other results. The Tigers, riding high off their first win of 2024, will look to play party pooper to the Sharks efforts but the Sharks will be too strong as they look to tune up for next week's finals with a win away from home. It won't be a blow out, but it will be a comfortable Sharks win. **Sharks by 12.**

DRAGONS v BRONCOS:Beth **NICHOLLS**

Brisbane is eyeing their fifth minor premiership, whilst the Dragons are fighting to finish their season on a high despite not being able to make the 2024 finals.

The Dragons faced their seventh loss of the season last week, with the Tigers recording their first ever win of the season over the St George Illawarra side. They have now not won since Round 6 against the Eels and are looking to put together something in this final round of their season.

Jamie Soward makes some changes for the side, with Kimberley Hunt returning to the wing which sees Maatuleio Fotu-Moala drop to the reserves. There is also a slight reshuffle, with Sophie Clancy starting at hooker; Kasey Reh at lock and Alexis Tauaneai moving from starting lock to prop.

Looking to face their first loss since Round 2 last week, the Broncos scored a try in the final 20 seconds, to give them their sixth win in a row, and consolidate a finals campaign for the sixth time, only missing out on finals during 2022.

The Broncos make one forced change to the side, with Lauren Dam returning to the starting 17 in the wing position, after Stacey Waaka suffered a suspected fractured fibula in her leg. After a massive effort last week, Chelsea Lenarduzzi swaps to start off the bench, with Annetta Nu'ausala instead in the starting line-up.

Both clubs have been a part of the NRLW competition since its inception in 2018, and the Broncos have the upper hand winning six of their seven match ups.

WHO TO WATCH: Leading the try scoring leader board for the 2024 season, Teagan Berry has scored eight tries this year, including a double in both Round 6 and 7, she is a weapon in the Dragons side. Along with this she has also made three try assists, 40 tackle breaks and nine line breaks.

Opposite Berry is Broncos fullback Hayley Maddick, who has had an outstanding season so far, scoring three tries, making nine try assists (with a record five in one match), 14 tackle breaks and six line breaks.

MY TIP: Brisbane have been on a roll and have consistently gotten the job done over the past six rounds, and I don't think it's stopping anytime soon for them. The minor premiership is in grasp for them but won't be decided until the Roosters also play their match this round. **Broncos by 18.**

COWBOYS v KNIGHTS:Beth **NICHOLLS**

The Knights are looking to push for a third or fourth position on the ladder, with no realistic mathematical chance of dropping out of finals, whilst the Cowboys are extremely unlikely to play finals with their poor points differential.

The Cowboys faced their fourth loss of the season last week, unable to beat the Roosters who are currently camped in first place. The Cowboys sit in sixth place on an equal number of wins and losses, however with a points differential of -49, even if they manage to beat the Knights, they will have to win by over 100 points to slide into fourth, which is virtually impossible.

Some forced changes have been made for this final regular season match for the Cowboys, with both Tiana Rafstrand-Smith and Lillian Yarrow ruled out due to concussion and ankle sprains respectively. Tallisha Harden comes in for Yarrow, with Shellie Long joining the team in the second row. After suffering a quad injury Krystal Blackwell returns to the wing, meaning Vitalina Naikore reverts to the reserves.

Reigning minor premiers have had an up and down season, but are looking to make their third finals appearance, which will be guaranteed if they can get the job done against the Cowboys. The Knights recorded a major win against the Titans last week, which marks their fifth win of the season, bouncing back after a loss to the Broncos.

Ben Jeffries makes one change to the side that got the job done against the Titans last week, with Nita Maynard dropping out of the squad and Evie Jones taking her place on the bench.

These sides met once last year during the Cowboys inaugural season, which saw the Cowboys come out on top against the Knights, winning 31-20.

WHO TO WATCH: Joining the Cowboys side this season, centre Jakiya Whitfeld leads the club for the number of tries scored, with a total of six in eight games. Whitfeld has also made 56 tackle breaks and six line breaks.

Reigning Daly M Medallist, Tamika Upton has so far had a season to remember, with an impressive highlights reel at both club and representative level. She is leading the competition for line breaks with a total of nine (tied with Hayley Maddick from the Broncos) and leads the Knights for tries scored with seven in eight matches.

MY TIP: With the season about to end, and with finals on the line I think the Knights will put the pedal on the gas and get the season finished on a high, looking upon a third consecutive finals campaign. **Knights by 12.**

RAIDERS v TITANS:Kelly **HOLLIS**

With a spot in the finals out of reach, both sides will be playing to finish their seasons with pride.

As the 2024 NRLW action wraps up, the Canberra Raiders will host the Gold Coast Titans in their final home game of the season at GIO Stadium. With both teams out of finals contention, this clash serves as an opportunity for pride and a chance to finish the season on a positive note.

The Raiders currently sit in 8th place, having endured a tough run, losing six consecutive matches at home. Their last outing saw them narrowly lose to the Parramatta Eels, with a late penalty goal sealing an 18-16 defeat despite a spirited comeback. Despite the loss, coach Darrin Borthwick has made no changes to his side for the final match of the year.

Last year's grand finalists, the Gold Coast Titans find themselves in 7th position after a disheartening loss to the Newcastle Knights, where they were dominated 46-10. The Titans struggled with possession and errors, completing only 62% of their sets. In response, coach Karyn Murphy has made several changes, including the return of rugby league pioneer Karina Brown, who will make her final appearance in the No. 1 jersey. Along with this, Sarina Masaga comes into the centres, with Taliah Fuimaono returning to the five-eighth role, pushing Sienna Lofipo to the bench. Dannii Perese also comes onto the bench to replace the suspended Ngatokotoru Arakua.

With both teams eager to end their campaigns on a high note, fans can expect an intense battle in the Nation's Capital, especially given the Titans' previous victory over the Raiders in 2023. This is only the second time these two sides have faced each other, with the Titans looking to replicate last year's dominant performance. While the Raiders have scored over 60 points more than their opponents this season, both teams have struggled defensively, conceding 204 and 175 points, respectively. As the Raiders aim to break their losing streak at home, the Titans will be keen to rebound and find some form heading into the off-season.

WHO TO WATCH: Raiders winger Madison Bartlett has scored eight tries this season and will be hoping to make it nine to finish the season with an average of one try per game. She has scored three doubles, though, so she hasn't scored in every game she's played this year. She's also a strong runner of the ball, averaging over 85 run metres per game and has accumulated 17 tackle breaks and 8 line breaks this season.

Although she will be wearing the #1 jersey, Titans winger Karina Brown will be one to watch as she takes to the field for her last game of rugby league before retiring. The 35-year-old will wrap up seven seasons of the NRLW, where she debuted for the Sydney Roosters and played for the Warriors before being the inaugural signing for the Gold Coast Titans in 2021. Although this will just be her second game this season, you have to admit that her final game will be something special to watch.

MY TIP: It would be nice to see a fairytale end for the time that Karina Brown has served in the game. So, for the nostalgia points - I'm going to go Gold Coast in a super-close one. **Titans by 4.**

EELS v ROOSTERS:Josh **ROBERTSON**

The final NRLW game of the regular season comes down to the Eels and the Roosters and it's far from a dead rubber with both sides having plenty to play for with the Blue and Gold hoping for an outside finals chance whilst the Tricolours will want to lock up the minor premiership.

The Blue and Gold sit in fifth spot equal on points with the fourth place Knights, but with a much worse for and against, they will need to be hoping for results to go their way. The Eels last week almost had their finals chances disappear as they nearly threw away the lead twice to hold onto an 18-16 win over the Canberra Raiders last week. The Eels held a 12-0 lead early in the contest before seeing their opponents come back to 12-10 before the Blue and Gold took another 8 point only for the Raiders to score just shy of full-time and time saved Parramatta to hold onto the two point win. Hoping they can get book a finals spot if results go their way, the Eels have named an unchanged lineup for their clash on Sunday afternoon at Combank Stadium.

Looking unlikely just two weeks ago to win the wooden spoon, the Sydney Roosters sit atop the NRL ladder but could be fighting for the minor premiership if both the Sharks and Broncos win earlier in the weekend and they will need to ensure they win but by a big enough margin to take top spot on the ladder. The Roosters last week took an important 24-12 victory over the North Queensland Cowboys in Gosford last week. Despite looking comfortable, the Roosters had to come from behind with the visitors taking a 12-6 lead before going 18-12 up at the break and then 24-12 at full time. Team wise, the tricolours have been forced into changes with Eliza Lopamaua suspended due to a Hip Drop tackle. Amber Hall has moved into the second row whilst Mille Elliott comes into the starting side after coming from the bench last week. Mya Hill-Moana returns from concussion protocols whilst Tarryn Aiken is a chance of returning from a shoulder injury after being named in the reserves.

WHO TO WATCH: Rachael Pearson has had one of her best NRLW seasons to date and that's a major part of why the Blue and Gold sit where they do on the ladder. Pearson's game control has been one of the best things this season including last week when early she was able to create the Eels momentum with what was essentially a 40/10 to help the Eels kick start the game. If Pearson fires the Eels could pick up an upset.

Isabelle Kelly has seen records tumble week after week in the past few weeks as she continues to run for hundreds of metres. Running for a whopping 350m against the Cowboys, it follows a 266m effort against Cronulla and 269m against the Dragons earlier in the season. The Eels will need to contain Kelly for a chance of an upset.

MY TIP: The desperation will be there for both teams, but I think there is just enough in the Roosters team to get the victory on Sunday afternoon. The results previously in the weekend will play a big part in how this game could go but the Roosters should still win out. **Roosters by 10.**

Cronulla's sink-or-swim reckoning

Finals football intensifies on Friday evening as the Cronulla Sharks renew their September rivalry with the North Queensland Cowboys at Allianz Stadium.

The Sharks and Cowboys have met five times in finals football since 2013 with the men from North Queensland holding a 3-2 advantage, including an extra time victory in the most recent meeting two years ago.

Earning a second chance in the finals off the strength of a season that has seen the side hold a place inside the top four since Easter, the Cronulla Sharks will be desperate to prove they are capable of winning when it matters most.

Losing all four finals contested during Craig Fitzgibbon's coaching tenure, the Sharks have developed an infamous reputation for failing to close out matches following losses decided by field goals in consecutive finals campaigns.

Unable to go the distance with the Storm in a 37-10 defeat last Saturday in Melbourne, Fitzgibbon has retained the same squad with Jesse Ramien included on an extended bench after missing last week with an ankle injury.

The Sharks have won 15 out of 20 meetings against the Cowboys since 2016, however the two losses that were played in Sydney during that period occurred in the finals.

Riding into the Semi Finals without the burden of expectations, the North Queensland Cowboys will be striving to become only the sixth team to reach a Preliminary Final from outside the top four since the abolition of the McIntyre system.

Staying alive in the finals race with a 28-16 victory over the Knights in Townsville, coach Todd Payten has retained the same squad that fought back from a halftime deficit last Saturday.

The Cowboys have won five out of seven matches in Sydney this season, however one of those losses was the side's heaviest defeat of the year against the Sharks back in Round 7.

Jake Clifford will make his 50th appearance for North Queensland on Friday night; the 26-year-old has enjoyed an unbeaten run of four straight matches since replacing Chad Townsend at halfback a month ago.

WHO TO WATCH: For more than 12 months, Nicho Hynes has waited for the opportunity to seize the moment of a sudden death final. Falling short in four previous finals as a starting playmaker and doing likewise with NSW earlier this season, the 28-year-old has lived with a weight of scrutiny unlike any other player in the league. Set to make his fourth appearance back from an ankle injury on Friday evening, the rugby league world will be watching intently to see how Hynes responds under the pressure of prosper or perish football.

Only one man has appeared in all five previous finals contested between Cronulla and North Queensland: Jason Taumalolo. Coming a long way from an interchange forward struggling to crack first grade when the sides first met over a decade ago, the 31-year-old has grown to hold the second most appearances for the Cowboys as well as being the only forward in the NRL era to win the Dally M Medal. Producing a return to form last week with close to 150 running metres in just over a half of game time, Taumalolo will be aiming to have a similar impact to book the Cowboys a date with the Panthers in the final four.

FAVOURITE: The Sharks are favoured to continue the Semi Final success enjoyed by 79% of top four teams bouncing back from a Qualifying Final loss since 2012.

MY TIP: Sink or swim, make or break, prosper or perish - whichever way you put it the Sharks just have to rise above the pressure and get it done in September. **Sharks by 7.**

A battle of the Spit Bridge rounds out week two of the finals as the Sydney Roosters host the Manly Sea Eagles

Two teams coming off starkly different performances will look to progress to the Preliminary finals as a battered Sydney Roosters look to bounce back against a Sea Eagles side that is looking to peak at the right time.

Having ensured a second bite of the cherry, the Roosters will look to use it after a disappointing loss to the Penrith Panthers last weekend. Having been 24-0 down at half time, the Roosters attempted to mount a comeback but the lead proved insurmountable at the foot of the mountain.

The loss of Sam Walker showed out, with Sandon Smith and Luke Keary unable to guide the team around the park - while the defensive lapses early in the first half proved too much for the tri-colours.

Having been pummeled in the middle early on, the return of Jared Waerea-Hargraves will bolster what was a sorry forward pack last week. Coming up against the likes of Taniela Paseka and a fired up Matt Lodge, the Roosters will need every ounce of JWH aggression to ensure they do not go out in straight sets.

Manly will be flying high after a thrilling 24-22 win last weekend over the Canterbury Bulldogs, with a Tolu Koula try sealing a brilliant come from behind win at Accor Stadium.

It looked like the Sea Eagles were gone for all money, but a masterclass second half from the Sea Eagles ensured they were able to walk into week two of the finals. Tom Trbojevic had sparks of brilliance coming back from injury, and will no doubt look to rekindle some of that form we've seen from him across the season against a Roosters defense that was leaky early on last week.

I highlighted him last week and I will say the exact same thing again - but Tom Trbojevic has to be here for the Sea Eagles to want to progress. The last time Tommy Turbo came back from injury, it took a week for him to hit his stride before he absolutely obliterated the league. This would be week number two, with the Roosters the unlucky side to see the wrath of Trbojevic. There will be plenty of block plays left for Trbojevic to be on the end of, targeting Dom Young's wing.

FAVOURITE: The Roosters have the backing of the bookmakers for this contest.

MY TIP: The Roosters will come out firing, with Trent Robinson lighting a fire underneath his side at training this week. Tom Trbojevic will look to get involved early, with the spine of the Sea Eagles no doubt wanting to fire a warning shot early with some sweeping plays. The Roosters should be able to hold firm early - but the versatility of Manly will prove too much for a Roosters side missing their main playmaker. It will be Manly and Melbourne in the Preliminary final... start salivating over it. **Sea Eagles by 10.**
