# PENRITH PANTHERS 2024 NRL PREMIERS

## FANTASTIC FOUR: PENRITH CLAIM HISTORIC PREMIERSHIP

Penrith Panthers have become the first time in six decades to claim four consecutive first grade rugby league titles, downing Melbourne 14-6 in a gritty 2024 Grand Final at Accor Stadium.

In front of just 80,156 fans on league's biggest day, the Panthers battled hard and won it tough in what was ultimate a game of defence.

After dominating the opening quarter of the match, Penrith ultimately conceded the opening try when Harry Grant burrowed over from dummy half after 22 minutes. Five minutes later departing winger Sunia Turuva was on the end of a solid backline movement to bring the scoreline in and open Penrith's account, the score at that point 6-4.

The Panthers finished the half with 56% of the ball, so it seemed it would be unjust if they didn't go in to the halftime break ahead - and that they did, with Liam Martin crashing through the defence just short of the break. Cleary's conversion had the scores 10-6 at halftime.

Just four points - a solitary Penrith try for Paul Alamoti at the hour mark - would alter that scoreline after halftime, but there were plenty of headline moments to come out of what was a controversial second forty.

The biggest of these was a Bunker call around the 50 minute mark which went against Melbourne. Jack Howarth crashed over the line despite the attention of plenty of Penrith defenders. With referee Ashley Klein referring the try to the Bunker as 'no try' and Howarth having been held up.

Replays suggested that he may have grounded the ball on one or two angles, but Review Official Grant Atkins judged that there was no evidence to confirm a try, so the decision stayed 'no try'.

Later in the game, with the result just about locked away, Paul Alamoti alleged Cam Munster bit his arm in the 74th minute. The Melbourne five-eighth was placed on report although no Match Review charge was made following the match.

Melbourne seemed to make metres easier late in the contest but Penrith's well-drilled defence was up to the task - in fact, both teams' defences were incredible in a high-quality contest.

The end result is Penrith creating history, the first team to win four straight in the salary cap era and first since the St George 11-in-a-row of the 50's and 60's for any club. It's also a fitting goodbye for departing players Jarome Luai, Sunia Turuva and James Fisher-Harris.

# SYDNEY ROOSTERS 2024 NRLW PREMIERS

## ROOSTERS HOLD OFF FAST-FINISHING SHARKS TO CLAIM NRLW TITLE

The Sydney Roosters have won the 2024 NRLW Grand Final, holding off a late surge from the Cronulla Sharks to triumph 32-28 in a thrilling contest at Accor Stadium.

Both teams came into the decider with impressive seasons behind them, but it was the Roosters' experience and resilience that saw them lift the trophy.

The Sydney Roosters, with a wealth of experience amounting to 466 games in their starting 17, faced a Cronulla Sharks side with just 406 games between them. Despite their comparative inexperience, the Sharks made a huge statement in the 2024 season, winning their first six games to put the competition on notice. The Roosters, who lost their opening game, went unbeaten for the rest of the season, and this clash was set to be a fitting end to their respective campaigns.

The Roosters stamped their authority early in the contest, capitalising on some key errors from the Sharks. NRLW Dally M Medalist Olivia Kernick opened the scoring for the Roosters after 16 minutes, and they quickly added two more tries through Brydie Parker and Jayme Fressard. A well-executed game plan, built around precision kicking and strong forward runs from Millie Elliott and Olivia Kernick, saw the Roosters take control. The Sharks struggled to find their rhythm, missing 19 tackles and completing only 50% of their sets in the first half. Jessica Sergis crossed the line late in the first half, giving the Roosters a commanding 24-0 lead at the break. The Sharks were shell-shocked but determined to make amends.

Whatever was said in the Sharks' sheds at halftime had an immediate impact. The team came out firing in the second half, led by captain Tiana Penitani. Penitani, who scored twice in the game, opened her account in the 38th minute, starting what would become an incredible comeback attempt.

The Sharks scored four second-half tries, beginning with Quincy Dodd in the 43rd minute, followed by Georgia Hannaway, Ellie Johnston, and Penitani again. Tayla Preston's accurate kicking kept them within striking distance, with her conversion narrowing the Roosters' lead to just two points at 26-24 with eight minutes left on the clock.

Despite the Sharks' heroic efforts, it was the Roosters who held their nerve in the final minutes. Olivia Kernick scored her second try of the game in the 66th minute, pushing the lead back out to eight points. But the Sharks, true to their season's form, refused to give up. Tiana Penitani crossed for her second try with only two minutes remaining, making it 32-28 and setting up a heart-pounding finale, with the captain opting not to kick of goal to give themselves as much time as possible to try to score one more try in the dying minutes.

With one last attacking set, the Sharks threw everything at the Roosters' defence, but it was too little too late. The Roosters' experience came to the fore as they absorbed the pressure, securing the win in a nail-biting finish.

Sydney Roosters half-back Tarryn Aiken was awarded the Karyn Murphy Medal for her outstanding performance. Aiken's tactical kicking and cool head under pressure were instrumental in the Roosters' victory, and she guided her team with poise throughout the match.



The Roosters' triumph in the 2024 NRLW Grand Final capped off a remarkable season, showcasing their consistency and depth of talent. For the Sharks, this was a valiant effort, but they will undoubtedly be left wondering what could have been after their stunning second-half fightback. Both teams have set the benchmark for seasons to come, and fans will eagerly anticipate their next encounter.

# NORTHS DEVILS 2024 STATE CHAMPS

## DEVILS GRIT THEIR WAY TO FIRST QRL STATE CHALLENGE WIN SINCE 2015

A determined second half has seen the Norths Devils wrestle back the NRL State Championship with a gutsy 20-18 win over the Newtown Jets to kickstart NRL Grand Final Day.

The Devils opened the scoring inside the first six minutes of play. Jeremiah Simbiken looked the most likely for the Devils in the first half and he was rewarded when he crossed to put the Devils ahead by six. Newtown woke up ten minutes later as the Jets scored a scintillating try. A strong kick return from Liam Ison got the ball in Norths territory before several sets of hands got involved as Sam Stonestreet reached out to score a sensational team try to level the scores.

Puru nailed a 40/20 and it looked like momentum would be flipped on it's head. A great ball from Jayden Berrell put Braden Hamlin-Uele away who was able to get a flick pass away, yes a front rower with a flick pass. Puru picked it up and scored for the Jets. Stonestreet picked up a vital try with nine to play before half-time after Norths made several key mistakes. Puru created the extra man, Chris Vae'ila drew in the defence and passed the footy to Stonestreet for his second try.

Norths were able to stay in the contest late as Newtown were placing themselves under pressure with elementary errors coming out of their own end. The Devils capitalised as Oryn Keeley delivered a magical offload to Jordan Lipp who scored a vital try in the shadows of half-time. It was anyone's game with goal-kicking proving to look the difference.

The Jets quickly added a try as Stonestreet rounded out his hatrick. Brilliant hands down the right edge saw Ison link up with Stonestreet to get try number three. With 25 to go, Keeley was able to capitalise on the space provided, he had plenty of work to do to beat the sliding Newtown defence which he nearly bombed himself. Keeley had numbers and was seemingly stuck in quick sand before beating the defence to score and make it a two point game.

It was a tense final quarter, both sides had a plethora of errors. This meant attacking opportunities were sparingly utilised in the first half. Some contentious refereeing decisions gave the Devils field position and the QLD Cup premiers capitalised to seal the game. Jack Wright came through in the clutch with a lovely pass to Keeley and he charges across the line to give Norths a two point lead. Despite some desperate Jets attack, it wasn't to be as Norths become the first QLD Cup side to win the State Championship since the Ipswich Jets in 2015.



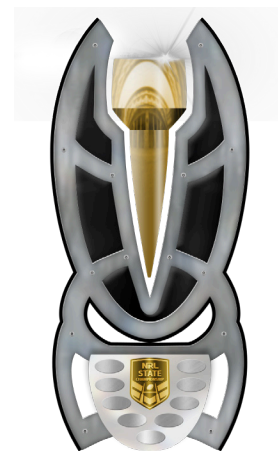

The Wigan Warriors have made their second successive grand final after a 38-0 rout of the Leigh Leopards.

It was a tight start to the game as both sides jostled for field position. Leigh however have been running low on the energy bar as they've had to win out just to make the finals.

The Warriors started in fine fashion after 11 minutes. A well worked set play out to the left saw Harry Smith, Bevan French and Jai Field combine to send Liam Marshall on his way for the first try of the contest. Nine minutes later some disappointing edge defence allowed late inclusion Sam Walters to use his strength to ground the ball to make it 10-0.

Adam Keighran added a gift two points after Abbas Miski took an intercept. As Leigh scrambled to get back onside, the referee pinned Leigh for offside and the penalty goal made it 12-0. A well worked movement before the half saw more success for the Warriors as Marshall had a second and Leigh were in major trouble at the break.

The second half started disastrously for Leigh when Aaron Pene lost the ball off the first carry of the half. A lovely pass from French sent Walters away and Wigan had one hand on a grand final birth.

Keighran added a penalty goal after another offside call gave Wigan a 26-0 lead. French scored a cracking individual try to make it 32-0 on the hour mark. He got the ball from a standing start, skipped and danced before kicking for himself to score. Jai Field added further salt into the wound as Wigan completed the rout.

## ROAD TO THE GRAND FINAL

In stark contrast to their opponents, the Robins will lace up for their first Super League Grand Final this Saturday, having never won the competition since its inception in 1996, and their first top-tier title since the 1984-85 English Championship season.

After a 2-2 start to the season, Hull KR gathered momentum across late March and into April, also reaching the Challenge Cup Semi Finals before being bundled out by Saturday's grand final foes Wigan at Doncaster.

The loss steeled the red-and-whites - recording only two more defeats for the remainder of the season. The first was a golden point thriller at home against Catalans in Round 16 and the Round 25 loss to Wigan, where their opponents came from behind to record a four-point victory and ultimately cost them the League Leaders' Shield.
