PENRITH PANTHERS 22 SYDNEY ROOSTERS 16

PENRITH PUNISH RUSTY ROOSTERS

Down on men, Penrith found a way to get it done at Allianz Stadium tonight with a 22-16 win over a fast-finishing Roosters.

From the start, Penrith dominated this contest - with strong line-speed in defence and tough carries in attack. With big shoes to fill, Brad Schneider looked comfortable as ever, coming up with a good kick leading to Penrith's first try. With the Panthers making a mid-air take on the last, an offload was knocked on by the Roosters with a loose ball finding its way to Dylan Edwards who put Sunia Turuva over. Kicking in Cleary's absence, Edwards was solid converting from the sideline.

Only 5 minutes later, the reigning premiers did it again. A scrappy set where Jarome Luai had the ball on the last, he stepped and danced in circles and seemingly, nothing was on. Any other team would've been tackled, but not Penrith. Luai found Turuva who found Edwards, with the star fullback kicking for himself and pouncing on the ball to score. Penrith led 12-0.

A couple penalties to Sydney found them in with a chance, and some solo brilliance and strength from Joseph Manu had Allianz on their feet - until the bunker called the play back. Jared Warea-Hargreaves was found to have stopped in the line and obstructed Dylan Edwards from defending.

Penrith continued to dominate up the middle with only Sam Walker's solid kicks keeping the hosts out of trouble. An escort penalty gave Edwards the chance to kick a penalty goal from right in front and he made no mistake, giving the Panthers a 14-0 lead with under 10 minutes to go in the half.

Out of nowhere, with under a minute to play, a Sam Walker kick found a charging Sitili Tupouniua who grounded the ball just before the dead ball line. Despite being dominated all half, Sydney managed to walk into the sheds only 14-6 down, but it got worse from there. 9 minutes into the second half and Sunia Turuva scored a simple but clinical try. Edwards missed the conversion, but Penrith led 18-6.

Only 5 minutes later, Turuva completed his hat-trick through some expansive ball playing where he finished the try off flawlessly. At 22-6, it was dire - but the Roosters kept giving up silly errors and missing chances, and the possibility for a comeback was looking more and more unlikely, until Brandon Smith crashed over the line in the 76th minute. With Sam Walker converting, it was 22-12 with only 4 minutes 40 seconds to play.

Although their attack looked disjointed off the restart, Sydney carried the football hard and forced themselves up to Penrith's line. A few crash plays were unsuccessful, but they went wide and found Daniel Tupou who did a good job to stay in the field of play and score. At 22-16, the Roosters opted not to take the conversion and use the full 22 seconds left on the clock to try and come up with a miracle.

Ultimately, they were unsuccessful with the impossible task proving too much. Taylan May knocked the ball on attempting an intercept, but no time was left to pack the scrum and the Sydney Roosters went down fighting to a defiant Penrith Panthers outfit.

SOUTH SYDNEY RABBITOHS 20

CANTERBURY-BANKSTOWN BULLDOGS 16

SALVATION FOR SOUTHS WITH GOOD FRIDAY WIN

It was a Friday that was Good Enough for South Sydney as the Rabbitohs claimed their first win of the season with a 20-16 victory over the Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs.

Getting a much-needed result following weeks of intense scrutiny on and off the field, the Rabbitohs claimed their fifth consecutive Good Friday win to the delight of 35,275 supporters at Accor Stadium.

The Rabbitohs got off to a strong start with a captain's challenge and penalty providing the besieged club with the field position needed to send Thomas Burgess (9th minute) over for the opening try of the day.

Extending their lead into double figures after an offload from Latrell Mitchell put the Bulldogs defence on the backfoot, new signing Jack Wighton (12th minute) finished off a left-side shift to score his first try in red and green colours.

The Bulldogs managed to hold their nerve despite continued pressure on their try line and were rewarded following an attacking raid instigated by Viliame Kikau and Josh Addo-Carr, who found Matt Burton (24th minute) in support to touch down underneath the posts.

Burton shifted the momentum of the match with a 40/20 that enable Blake Taaffe to shine against his former club with a pinpoint perfect chip kick for Connor Tracey (33rd minute) in the corner.

Almost going further ahead only for Kurtis Morrin to lose control of the ball a metre out from the try line, the Bulldogs were dealt a major blow with Addo-Carr ruled out of the match with concussion after heavy contact from Mitchell on the final play of the half.

Staring down the prospect of their worst start to a season since 2008, the Rabbitohs responded immediately with Alex Johnston bursting down the touchline and finding Wighton (46th minute) in support to regain the lead.

Taking the lead out to a converted try via a Mitchell penalty goal, the Rabbitohs survived a scare with the bunker overturning a Kikau try due to obstruction by Jaeman Salmon in the lead up.

The Bulldogs were unable to convert a stack of possession on the Rabbitohs try line and were dealt a further blow when a lack of discipline from Tracey allowed the Rabbitohs to go beyond a converted try with a penalty from in front.

A quick tap from Stephen Crichton allowed Tracey (79th minute) to set up a thrilling finish, however the Rabbitohs managed to hold on for a 20-16 win.

Next week, the Rabbitohs will host the Warriors on Saturday afternoon, while the Bulldogs will commemorate 20 years since their last premiership against the Roosters on Friday evening.

BRISBANE BRONCOS 38 NORTH QUEENSLAND COWBOYS 12

REYNOLDS KICKS COWBOYS TO LOSS

Adam Reynolds put on an absolute masterclass, especially with his kicking game, to spearhead the exciting Broncos attack as they recorded a resounding 38-12 win over the Cowboys.

Before play began, both sides gave a moments silence to pay tribute to the late Carl Webb, who represented both sides in his career.

The Broncos took just 3 minutes to get the scoreboard moving when Billy Walters at dummy half and 10 metres from the Cowboys line, went for a scoot, looked for a support runner but then just decided to keep going himself and he burrowed over for a try. Adam Reynolds converted and then 2 minutes later, Reynolds extended the lead with a penalty goal.

In the 13th minute, Brisbane crossed again when Reynolds put up a bomb. Scott Drinkwater let it bounce and Ezra Mam cleaned up, passed to Fletcher Baker who threw a brilliant long ball out to Kotoni Staggs who then sent Jesse Arthars over to score untouched. Reynolds converted from the sideline.

Just 2 minutes later the Cowboys hit back when Murray Taulagi was sent down the sideline, before he kicked back in-field where Valentine Holmes caught it cleanly. Despite being tackled from behind, he still managed to get across the line to score. He then converted his own try.

In the 19th minute the Broncos marched upfield with ease and then on the last Reynolds grubbered behind the Cowboys line and found Staggs flying through who dived, regathered and slid in to score all in one motion. Reynolds failed to convert, hitting the upright.

The Broncos very nearly scored again in the 25th minute but a strong tackle on Jordan Riki saw the ball go forward out of his hands to Tristan Sailor, who dived over for a try, which was immediately disallowed.

The Cowboys got themselves a second try in the 31st minute when Drinkwater got put into a gap on the inside and he raced away, stepped Sailor and then dived over to score in the right corner. Holmes from the sideline nails the conversion.

The Broncos skipped back out to an 8 point lead 5 minutes from halftime when he slotted a gift penalty goal.

In the 38th minute Reynolds put up another great kick which the Cowboys again failed to take cleanly. Cobbo looked to have cleaned up the loose ball and scored, but the bunker and on-field ref agreed that he knocked the ball on. At halftime the Broncos had a 20-12 lead.

The Cowboys very nearly scored just 2 minutes into the second half when Taulagi attempted to tap back a kick, but it went forward to Townsend, who dived over for what he thought was a try.

The Broncos looked to have extended their lead in the 50th minute when Drinkwater threw a cut-out pass, but Cobbo intercepted it and raced 95 metres to get to the tryline, just as Tom Dearden tackled him around the legs. The referee awarded the try but the bunker found that Dearden got him into touch at the very last second.

The Broncos finally extended their lead in the 55th minute when Tyson Smoothy at dummy half and close to the Cowboys line, stood and turned right, almost threw a dummy, which fooled everyone and then barged over to score. Reynolds converted.

Brisbane crossed again in the 70th minute when Ezra Mam at first receiver, changed direction, grubbered into the Cowboys in-goal for himself and he planted the rolling ball for a great solo try. Reynolds converted.

With 5 minutes remaining, Reynolds went to the line and then grubbered for Corey Oates following through, who regathered and scored. Reynolds converted. The Broncos record a convincing 38-12 victory.

ST GEORGE ILLAWARRA DRAGONS 20 MANLY-WARRINGAH SEA EAGLES 12

BALL SECURITY OPTIONAL AS DRAGONS TAKE IMPORTANT WOLLONGONG WIN

The St George Illawarra Dragons have put two disappointing performances behind them with a 20-12 win over the Manly Sea Eagles in front of 16,000 fans at WIN Stadium.

In a game that could hardly be called a classic, it was a brilliant start for the visitors as Tom Trbojevic managed to conjure an offload out of nowhere when he had five defenders on him for Tolu Koula who only need to catch and put the ball down to score.

The Dragons hit back soon after when Jack Bird was able to dive on a loose ball after the kick was lost backwards by the Sea Eagles. The Red 'V' were denied twice by the bunker with Moses Suli denied an effort with an obstruction from Luciano Leilua opening a gap meanwhile Mikaele Ravalawa was driven into touch.

Eventually the Dragons were able to crack the line twice inside the final five minutes of the first half when Tyrell Sloan went through the defence just a couple of plays after Luciano Leilua probably bombed a certain try after not electing to pass to a man on the outside. The Dragons third try of the half came when Jaydn Su'a was able to get over from close range.

Neither try was converted surprisingly by Zac Lomax who won't want to see the first of the two missed conversions as the ball ended up closer to the sideline and the 20m line than what it did at the posts.

The second half was a pretty shocking half with neither side earning themselves a potential job with armaguard as they just struggled to protect the ball when they had possession of it. The Dragons defence though was one thing that was secure as it kept coming under pressure from the Sea Eagles and kept turning them away.

An effort for the Sea Eagles was denied by the bunker when somewhat bizarrely Jaxon Paulo was awarded a try on field when he was trying to reach over Mikaele

Ravalawa to ground the ball and despite it looking like a knock-on, referee Ashley Klein awarded it until the bunker overturned it.

It wasn't long until the Dragons took advantage when Tyrell Sloan picked up his second of the night when there was space in the middle and he chased through a Ben Hunt kick to score under the posts. Another effort late in the half saw Jack Bird denied when he lost the ball trying to get it down.

The Sea Eagles took advantage of some late possession after more ill-discipline from the Dragons gave them a big opportunity to fight their way back and a consolation try gave them half a sniff but like the rest of the half, ball control failed them again.

Next week, the Dragons head to Newcastle for a clash against the Knights on Friday night whilst the Sea Eagles will really need to improve with a clash against the three time defending premiers Penrith at Brookvale.

42 per cent of the ball. Six tackles in the opposition 20 compared to 29. Three linebreaks to zero. Nine offloads to four.

Those sort of numbers last year would have seen the Wests Tigers on the wrong end of a lopsided scoreline. But this is a different Tigers team under Benji Marshall if Sunday's effort is anything to go by.

The Broncos travel down south to Melbourne to take on their arch-nemesis, the Storm, with both sides being competition heavyweights, looking to add a third win to their 2024 season campaign.

Melbourne are fresh off their first bye of the season, following their defeat to the Knights away from home in Round 3.

The Storm started their season with back-to-back wins against the Panthers and Warriors, showing some strong signs in defence and attack, however had some trouble against Newcastle where they were without star halfback Jahrome Hughes, who returns from his one-week suspension this week.

Cameron Munster makes his 2024 season return after suffering a groin injury, along with the return of Hughes, means that Tyran Wishart reverts to the bench and Jonah Pezet is dropped out of the squad. Christian Welch is also back on deck after missing out on the Round 3 clash due to HIA stand down protocol.

Brisbane are looking to secure their first back-to-back win of the season, following a massive victory over the Cowboys last week, with a final score of 38-12.

The Broncos have had a slow start to the season, with loses against the Roosters and Panthers, and despite their Round 2 win against the Rabbitohs, they had sloppy ball play and their defence was quite there. However, their defeat of the Cowboys started to show the potential that the Broncos are building towards in this 2024 season.

The injury cloud over the Broncos seems to be hanging around for a little while longer, with Xavier Willison being ruled out after suffering a head knock at training. Ben Te Kura comes in to take his place, making his NRL debut off the bench, after being 18th man last week. This is the only change to the team which took down the Cowboys in the first of the QLD Derbys.

The clash between these teams has a very one-sided history and with a rivalry as alive as ever, with the Broncos only winning one of the last fifteen matches against the Storm, which was the 2023 Qualifying Final, where Brisbane claimed victory, 26-0. The Broncos also have a rough history down south, not having won at AAMI Park since 2016, so the history books are mostly dedicated to the Storm.

WHO TO WATCH: Both sides sport squads with many star spine and forward players, however this week I am looking forward to the battle of the fullbacks.

After missing out on most of the 2023 season due to injury, **Ryan Papenhuyzen** has returned as the Storm's permanent fullback, and so far, has scored three tries (including a double in Round 2), made 4 line breaks, 17 tackle breaks and six offloads. It's been a rough go for Paps and I'm happy to see him back in the starting side and playing well, and (begrudgingly) would love to see him score a try come Thursday night.

Moving to Red Hill in 2023, **Tristan Sailor** is currently filling in for Reece Walsh at fullback, who is recovering from a facial fracture. Despite his limited game time, he has shown his potential in the Broncos side, making six try assists during his four games in 2023. I am looking forward to seeing him play again in the Brisbane side, as well as seeing what happens moving onwards with the return of Walsh looming.

FAVOURITE: Melbourne are favoured to get the job done at home and add another two points to their tally

MY TIP: As always, my heart is split in two for this match up, and I never quite know who will take home the win. I think both teams have the potential to win, and it will come right down to the wire.

After a rough start the Broncos finally have some momentum swinging their way, but the Storm are back to a strong spine which could be lethal to the Brisbane side. Backing my Broncos boys to get it done though. **Brisbane by 8.**

Grand final rematch from before I was born

This round marks the 20-year anniversary of the Bulldogs triumph over the Roosters in the 2004 NRL grand final - where the underdogs (no pun intended) from Canterbury will look to repeat their antics from the past.

Both the Bulldogs and the Roosters come into Saturday's clash following losses - and scorelines more competitive than their performances reflected. With last minute tries bringing down their deficit to 4 and 6 points respectively, the two sides looked closer in the fight than they were.

Sydney were favourites last week against a depleted Panthers outfit, but looked flatter than a bottle of lemonade opened over Easter as the 'next man up' mindset of the reigning premiers shined through. They went down 16-22, but went the majority of both halves without scoring points in what was a worrying performance.

On the contrary, Canterbury-Bankstown were something of a dark horse against a significantly underperforming South Sydney team. Few expected them to win, but an upset was still potentially on the cards. Ultimately, they were hampered by unfortunate injuries and an ill-disciplined sin bin - losing 16-20.

The Bulldogs have been forced into a number of changes, with a concussion to veteran winger Josh Addo-Carr seeing young flyer Blake Wilson take his spot. A broken jaw to Jacob Preston and Kurt Morrin's suspension makes way for Josh Curran to get a crack in the starting 13, with Harrison Edwards and Kitone Kautoga joining the bench. The only voluntary change for the Dogs is Samuel Hughes being promoted to the starting side and Liam Knight dropped to the interchange.

The Roosters are in a much better situation team wise, boosted by the return of dominant prop Lindsay Collins. This sees Terrell May return to the bench. Fan favourite Angus Crichton starts in his first game since Round 17 2023, pushing Sitili Tupouniua to the bench, and Egan Butcher to the reserves.

WHO TO WATCH: Fullback and skipper **James Tedesco** has defied the critics so far in 2024, with a strong season reminding us what he's capable of. Despite this, he was quiet against Penrith and will be wanting a dominant bounce-back game this week against a much weaker opponent in the Bulldogs.

Young halfback **Sam Walker** has had a mixed start to his season, with some glimpses of spark and brilliance, but a failure to control the game and come up with pressure building kicks has come under the spotlight at times. Though still learning, Sam needs to find some genuine consistency and cohesion in his combination with Luke Keary to elevate his game to the next level.

For the Bulldogs, halfback **Drew Hutchinson** will want to prove a point against his old club. Drew ran the ball 13 times last week, in a performance where he posed very little genuine threat to the opposition. With young gun Toby Sexton looking to edge him out of a starting spot, he'll need to prove his playmaking ability, and fast.

On a more positive note, new recruit **Josh Curran** has been phenomenal in his 4 matches for the white and blue. Coming off the bench so far, he has a chance to start in the 2nd row for the first time this year. Josh's impact and toughness has been an asset and with the potential for an 80-minute performance, he'll be able to show off his full potential.

FAVOURITE: The Sydney Roosters are overwhelming favourites.

MY TIP: Although I like the style of footy shown by the Bulldogs in 2024 - and believe they have a brighter future than most predict, the Roosters will be just too strong I feel. **Sydney by 16.**

Big changes for both sides as the Dragons head to Newcastle for the first time since Round 4, 2021.

Both games these teams played during Round 4 saw a 20 - 12 scoreline; however, only the Dragons were in the winner's circle. The Dragons handed Manly their second loss of the year at Kogarah, while the Knights went down to the Warriors in Auckland.

In a game marred by 15 errors from both sides, the Dragons crossed the line four times, including a second double to Tyrell Sloan in the 2024 season. Hunt provided the goods with the boot, tormenting the Manly side with a range of pin-point cross-field kicks and bombs that gave their wingers grief. The skipper had a hand in three of the Dragon's four tries, with three try assists, a line break assist and almost 580 kick metres.

Coach Flannagan was impressed by the team's resilience despite the limited possession and poor completion rate. He backed the team's talent and ability to defend against a quality side like Manly and now is imploring his side to find consistency and bring this into future games.

The Newcastle Knights crossed the Tasman to play the New Zealand Warriors in Auckland, with Roger Tuivasa-Sheck returning to his favoured number 1 jersey. The Warriors got off to a fast start, leading the Knights by 8 before Tyson Frizell crossed for their first points in the 35th minute. Bradman Best was the only other Novacastrian to get over the line, scoring a late try to bring the difference to 8 rather than 14.

Once again, there was a lack of cohesion within the halves for the Knights team as they continued to work towards finding the best combination. They didn't have much to work with as the forward pack failed to fire to provide their spine with the platform they needed to be effective in attack.

This weekend, the Knights return to McDonald Jones Stadium, where they beat the Storm in Round 2 after a short turnaround from the trip home from Auckland. The Dragons will make the trip up the M1 for the first time since Round 4, 2021.

Both sides have considerably changed the lineups that started their Round 4 clashes, and Adam Brown has made the most significant changes. Jackson Hastings will return in the number 7 jersey, with Tyson Gamble being left right out of the 17 and Jack Cogger taking on the five-eighth duties. Dane Gagai is expected to return from illness, and Jayden Brailey moves into the hooker spot, pushing Phoenix Crossland to the bench. The changes don't end there, with Daniel Saifiti being demoted from the starting front row and replaced by Leo Thompson. The changes Shane Flannagan has made are primarily to the middle, with Jack De Belin and Tom Eisenhuth being promoted from the bench, seeing Blake Lawrie and Raymond Faitala-Mariner demoted to accommodate them.

WHO TO WATCH: Jackson Hastings will have a point to prove after being dropped by the Knights after just two games. In both games, he partnered with Tyson Gamble in the halves, but this weekend, he will run out alongside Jack Cogger, who has retained his spot. The Knights' forward pack will have to be better than they were in Auckland to help lay the platform for their halves pairing to fire, though.

There's lots of noise in the media around the fact that Zac Lomax has been granted a release to leave the Dragons at the end of the 2024 season. This kind of attention can either help or hinder a player, so it will be interesting to see how he responds. He will have the number 2 jersey on his back again as Flannagan continues to deny him his favoured centre position.

FAVOURITE: Despite coming into this game with only one win, the Knights are firm favourites at the moment.

MY TIP: The Knights will be looking to use the home-ground advantage to help get them over the line for just their second win of the season. And although they have only won 1 game in 2024, they have met much stronger opponents than the Dragons. **Knights by 8.**

Last start winners look to keep the momentum rolling

The South Sydney Rabbitohs and New Zealand Warriors will be eyeing off two crucial competition points on Saturday afternoon when they clash at Accor Stadium.

Relieving weeks of mounting pressure with a breakthrough win on Good Friday, the South Sydney Rabbitohs will be hoping their fortunes continue by posting back-to-back victories for the first time since May last year.

Making minimal changes from the side that prevailed 20-16 over the Bulldogs, coach Jason Demetriou has named Izaak Thompson on the wing in place of Alex Johnson (hamstring), while Sean Keppie earns a recall with Shaq Mitchell out due to concussion.

Holding an imposing record over the Warriors with 14 wins from 15 clashes dating back to 2013, the match will serve as the 50th club game for second-rower Jacob Host.

Sitting on the precipice of the top eight with two wins and two losses over the opening month of the season, the New Zealand Warriors will be hoping to make Roger Tuivasa-Sheck's 200th NRL game one to remember.

Leading from start to finish in a hard-fought 20-12 victory over the Knights on Easter Sunday, coach Andrew Webster has been boosted by the return of Charnze Nicoll-Klokstad at fullback for the first time this season. Other changes include Te Maire Martin replacing Luke Mecalif in the halves and Tom Ale coming in for Kurt Capewell as part of a reshuffled forward pack.

The Warriors have lost their past four matches in Australia dating back to final weeks of last season, however the side's overall record has been much improved with seven wins from 15 matches played across the Tasman during Webster's tenure.

The Warriors have won three of their past five matches at Accor Stadium; the venue also served as the site of the club's biggest victory with a 66-0 thrashing over South Sydney in 2006.

The Rabbitohs and Warriors have met at Accor Stadium on six previous occasions with both sides emerging with three wins apiece.

WHO TO WATCH: Gaining his first taste of the top grade against the Warriors six years ago, **Tevita Tatola** has gone from strength to strength in the ensuing years to become one of South Sydney's premier front-rowers. Remaining reliable in his output with 100 running metres and 31 tackles on average to start 2024, the 27-year-old will relish the opportunity to go up against one of the best forward packs in the league headlined by fellow Tongan representative Addin Fonua-Blake. Scoring his last try against the Warriors on the Sunshine Coast two years ago, look for Tatola run with added intensity every time he gets close to the try line.

Developing into an unsung figure in the Warriors resurgence over recent seasons, **Marcelo Montoya** will be aiming to continue his try-scoring exploits against the Rabbitohs. Crossing for five tries in eight matches against South Sydney, the 28-year-old winger has been in fine touch to start the year with 135 running metres on average to go with two tries. Scoring the only four-pointer for the Warriors in their loss to the Rabbitohs last season, expect Montoya to be a threat every time the ball shifts to the left on Saturday afternoon.

FAVOURITE: The Warriors are expected to make it three on the trot on Saturday afternoon.

MY TIP: While the Rabbitohs will be buoyed with confidence by last week's much-needed victory, the Warriors should defy the history books with a win on the road. **Warriors by 12.**

MATCH PREVIEW *Andrew JACKSON*

After a strong opening two rounds to the season, Manly will be looking to re-establish itself as a genuine contender when it takes on Penrith at 4 Pines Park on Saturday afternoon.

The Sea Eagles emerged as early season surprise packets after back-to-back wins over the Rabbitohs and Roosters, although the former's early struggles suggest that victory in Vegas may have not been the statement it seemed at the time.

Nonetheless, two straight losses to the Eels and Dragons have seen Anthony Seibold's side come crashing back to earth and it doesn't get much easier this week against the defending premiers.

Penrith came up short 8-0 against Melbourne in the opening round but has remained unbeaten since that point, taking care of the Roosters last week with relative ease despite being without Nathan Cleary, Scott Sorensen and James Fisher-Harris.

While the scoreline didn't reflect it, the Panthers were dominant and controlled field position for the majority of the contest due to the impressive metres their back three provided.

Penrith's attack was hardly clinical though and at times conservative so it will be interesting to see how Ivan Cleary's side respond if Manly jumps out to an early lead.

The Panthers are bolstered by the return of Fisher-Harris this week, seeing Mavrik Geyer drop off the bench after making his NRL debut last week.

Meanwhile, Manly is 1-17 as Daly Cherry-Evans becomes the club's all-time appearance record holder, passing Cliff Lyons as the halfback suits up for his 310th game.

WHO TO WATCH: The Roosters' forwards struggled for any real ascendancy in last week's game and so if Manly is any hope of pulling off an upset it will start up front. Specifically, that could include getting early ball to **Haumole Olakau'atu**, who has the power and offloading ability to cause problems for Penrith's defence. Parramatta's second phase play has helped them pick apart the Panthers a few times recently and the dynamic Olakau'atu, who is averaging a career-high 152 run metres this season, is Manly's best chance of opening up space given how many defenders it usually takes to bring him down.

It has been a few weeks now since **Taylan May's** impressive individual performance against Melbourne, where the tackle-busting centre looked Penrith's best bet of cracking what proved an impenetrable Storm defensive line. In the rounds that followed it was Izack Tago who was the standout for the Panthers, capitalizing on two straight games playing opposite second rowers filling in for injured centres. Then last week it was winger Sunia Turuva, again on Penrith's right edge away from May, who scored a hat-trick. May though is deceptively hard to take down and slippery close to the line, combining both power and finesse to make him the perfect finisher on Penrith's usually lethal left edge. Look for May to get back on the scoreboard and remind Panthers fans why the club was so desperate to extend him.

FAVOURITE: The Panthers are backed to continue their winning ways despite being without Cleary and Sorensen.

MY TIP: Penrith's forward pack and superior outside backs should pave the way for another workman-like win. It won't necessarily be pretty but like last week against the Roosters, it'll be enough. **Panthers by 8.**

Phins Up and Claws Out as Dolphins and Tigers go head to head

After 4 rounds of the NRL season, the Dolphins and Tigers are both Top 6 sides (as we're sure everyone would have predicted) leading into this Saturday night blockbuster.

The Dolphins come into this match off a 30-14 win over the Titans, their second straight victory with a bye thrown in between. Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow was in fine touch with a try and two try assists, while Isaiya Katoa, Tom Flegler and Jack Bostock also starred.

The Tigers are also coming off back to back victories with a 17-16 win over the Eels on Easter Monday. Lachlan Galvin was the star in that match, however the 18 year old is out for the next two weeks after being suspended. Apisai Koroisau and Justin Olam also played key roles.

In terms of the direct matchup, both sides seem to have a similar level of defence through three games, although almost half of the Tigers 54 points conceded came in their first 40 minutes of the season, with just 5 tries given up in their last 5 halves of football. Attacking wise however the advantage is clearly with the Dolphins, who have scored 86 points compared to the Tigers 61.

Oddly enough the match being at Suncorp might also be an advantage for the Tigers, with the team winning 2 of their last 3 games at the venue while the Dolphins have lost 3 of their last 4.

WHO TO WATCH: Immediately off the bat there are two key positional battles that pique my interest. The first is the battle of the fullbacks, where Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow and Jahream Bula enter off the back of star performances. Even with his horror performance in Round 1, The Hammer averages almost 180 metres per game and has been responsible for 6 of the Dolphins 15 tries. Bula meanwhile averages 160 metres and has been responsible for 4 of the Tigers 10 tries.

The second major battle will be at the hookers, where NSW incumbent Api Koroisau meets his New Zealand counterpart (and brother of the Tigers coach) Jeremy Marshall-King. At 31, Koroisau is enjoying a career best start to the season, having been nothing short of a serious problem around the ruck for the Tigers. Marshall-King is also enjoying the form he showed in 2023, however the addition of a short kicking game has firmed him as one of the premier number 9's in the competition.

With Galvin missing the game, attention will be placed on Jayden Sullivan, who's been elevated back to the starting side after being dropped following their Round 2 loss to Canberra. But just as he was hooked that day for Aiden Sezer; the Tigers have named Latu Fainu to make his NRL debut at 14, and potentially usurp the five eight spot if given the opportunity.

FAVOURITE: With the loss of Galvin, many people have favoured the Dolphins to get the win in this one

MY TIP: Although the Tigers have been one of the most exciting teams to watch over the past 2 weeks, the Dolphins have the weapons to fight fire with fire and I believe they will do just that. **Phins by 12.**

Both coming off losses, the Cowboys and Titans battle it out in another all-Queensland derby.

The North Queensland Cowboys come out of Round 4 as the losers of the XXXX Derby. After a few, very strong opening games, the Cowboys were 3-0 to start the year; a mixed Scott Drinkwater game, where he made five out of the team's sixteen errors, saw the Cowboys handed their first loss of the season 38-12 at Suncorp Stadium to the Broncos.

For the Gold Coast Titans, it is quite the opposite. After Round 3, the Titans were 0-2 and their loss to the Dolphins 14-30, leaves them 0-3 after four rounds. This could be attributed to many factors, the main being the exclusion of captain Tino Faasumaleaui due to a torn ACL. Although the Titans scored 14 out of their 18 points for the season last week, even a 12-man Dolphins' side for 10 minutes couldn't help the Titans point differential, so they will be hard pressed to find their first win this season against the Cowboys.

The exclusions of Phillip Sami and Issac Liu to an ankle injury and failed HIA post-match respectively, make a Titans triumph even more unlikely. Josiah Pahulu has been named on the bench to make his NRL debut, joining new recruit Harley Smith-Shields and Jojo Fifita as the three changes made to last week's squad. Fifita replaces Sami and Smith-Shields replaces Alofiana Khan-Pereira who wasn't named. Jaimin Jolliffe moves to prop to cover Liu and Erin Clark starts at lock as a result. In more positive news for the team, Brian Kelly plays his 150th NRL game and Beau Fermor plays his 50th.

There is also a milestone man for the Cowboys as Jake Granville plays his 200th game for the club off the bench. Otherwise, it is an unchanged 17 from last week.

WHO TO WATCH: After what was a mediocre game for fullback **Scott Drinkwater**, he will be wanting to play a big part for his team at home, so he can be the attacking threat we all know he is. With the aforementioned five errors, compared to the week before with three, Scott will want to get his handling under high balls better, but with Tanah Boyd's kicking ability, his skills will likely be satisfactory. We saw aspects of his attack with one try and nine tackle breaks, but to have a strong win, he will have to combine with his spine.

Jeremiah Nanai has been a quiet 2nd rower as of late but has heaps of potential that isn't shining through like it used to despite the Cowboys' dominant wins. He will want to get involved in non-red-zone attack and make more than last week's 41 run metres from 7 runs. Whilst he was big in defence with a 95% tackle efficiency, that does not offset his poor performance when carrying the ball outside of his own half. Nanai should be looking to combine with his outside men in order to put points on this weekend.

Points aren't coming easy this season for the Titans, but with the inclusion of **Jayden Campbell**, they might just be. According to coach Des Hasler, the team is 'still growing' - which makes sense given they are one of the youngest teams age wise in the competition - despite this, Campbell's individual performance in his first game of the year will certainly inspire the Titans. He made one line break and four tackle breaks, along with 188 metres which was the second most of the team, only placing behind Phillip Sami.

Also making his first appearance for the season last week after injury is **David Fifita**, who played 55 minutes off the bench. His performance was mediocre at times, but considering he made 22 tackles with an 85% tackle efficiency and 12 runs for 129 metres in his first game back, it was a solid effort. Fifita will once again line up on the bench and will be looking to play a more prominent role in guiding the Titans in both defence and attack.

FAVOURITE: The Cowboys by the biggest margin of the round.

MY TIP: I really do hope the Titans win, but the Cowboys have been too powerful and at home they should be unstoppable. **Cowboys by 24.**

Raiders and Eels ready to scrap for a win

The Canberra Raiders play host to the Parramatta Eels to close out round five of the premiership. With both teams coming off contrasting losses, there will be an element of desperation as both teams will be looking to show they can get back on track.

After two defeats in a row, Canberra will welcome a home game to get their bearings back. A questionable performance last round saw them give up an 18-0 lead against Cronulla to go down 36-22 at PointsBet Stadium.

Raiders coach Ricky Stuart was filthy on his team's performance last round and was adamant that the efforts put in during the game would be dealt with. With what was perhaps a solid and honest week of training, Stuart has only made one change to the line-up, and even that was because his hand was forced. Zac Hosking will sit this round out due to concussion protocols and will be replaced by Ata Mariota.

Although the Raiders had a three-try lead, they began to lose structure once Joe Tapine and Josh Papalii had a rest on the bench. It would be fair to say Stuart has given his capable forwards a fair rev-up and a chance to make amends.

Jamal Fogarty's kicking game was good for distance but failed to inspire anyone to pressure the Cronulla lines once they started to hit back. Fogarty has shown he has an elite kicking game, and if he finds consistency, we will see the speed of Matthew Timoko come into play, as well as Jordan Rapana's robust style of play.

It can be all too easy for coaches to slash and burn after losses that hurt, so it's a credit to Ricky Stuart that he believes his men will answer for their faults on the field rather than forcing them to fight back into the team from feeder sides.

Although it was a close call for Parramatta, coach Brad Arthurs felt his side failed to take the right mindset into the last round, which saw the Eels lose by one point to the West Tigers. Clinton Gutherson had a late chance with a penalty to edge out the valiant Tigers, but it fell short, much like Arthurs's team's attitude.

The Eels will welcome back Bailey Simonsson into the centres relegating Morgan Harper to the reserves. J'maine Hopgood will slip into the lock position with Kelma Tuilagi starting from their bench. Bryce Cartwright will still be out for another week, nursing a rib injury.

Arthurs has stuck with Blaize Talagi in the halves combo with Dylan Brown. Arthurs is looking for the young player to take much out of the loss to Wests and hopefully use the speed we know he is capable of to run amok in the middle and get the Raiders forward doubting his moves.

WHO TO WATCH: Ricky Stuart was forward saying no one from his team last round deserved any praise, so the onus is on some key players to stoke the Raiders engine on Sunday to get them moving. The front-row combo of **Joe Tapine** and **Josh Papalii** makes a dent in any opposing team. And even though Stuart was lacking praise, Tapine was a stand-out for the team and, as a captain, will be leading from the front again. **Jamal Fogarty** knows his boot will get his team where they need to pressure and score points. Watch for Fogarty to get his team the ground they require. The speed of people like Timoko and Xavier Savage should do the rest.

Not making the most of their opportunities last round, it will be vital that **Dylan Brown** takes a leadership role in the middle; he's capable, and now will be his time to shine. Clinton Gutherson can be a problem and will be keen not to have back-to-back losses on his watch. The Eels' left edge might find some fruitful exchanges, with Shaun Lane and Maika Sivo teaming up against James Schiller and Matthew Timoko.

FAVOURITE: There's not much to this, but the Raiders are currently a better bet with a home game and are in no mood for a third loss in a row.

MY TIP: The Raiders will turn around last week's poor effort to bring the house down for the Raiders faithful. Although bristling with talent the Eels are still missing the Moses factor. Blaize Talagi does have talent, but with him finding his feet with Brown, it may be close but down to the wire. **Raiders by 2** in a hard-fought battle.

Castleford Tigers were left to rue not making the most of their first half dominance, as the Leeds Rhinos registered a comfortable win in the opening fixture of the Super League Rivals Round.

Hooker, Andy Ackers, ran from dummy half before passing to Croft, whose clever inside pass released James McDonnell. With only Castleford full-back Jack Broadbent left to beat, McDonnell took the right option and passed to Momirovski, who ran in a simple try. Rhyse Martin converted both scores to give the Rhinos a 12-0 lead, before Richardson kicked a goal line drop-out on the full, handing Martin a simple opportunity to extend Leeds' lead to 14-0 with a penalty under the sticks, in the 63rd minute. Lachie Miller scored his first try for Leeds in the 65th minute. The Tigers defence failed to deal with another kick, this time from Matt Frawley on the left wing, which Ash Handley tapped back for Miller to pick up and score. Castleford scored their first points of the night, after Matt Frawley failed to deal with a hanging kick from Richardson. Josh Simm reacted fastest and collected to score, with Richardson adding the extras.

But it was Leeds and man of the match, Miller, who had the last say, scoring the pick of the night's tries. Miller passed to Brodie Croft, who dummied to pass right before cutting back inside, through a gap in the Tigers' line. HUDDERSFIELD 26 LONDON 6

Huddersfield took the points in the final game of rival's round with a 26-6 victory at the Cherry Red Records stadium, thanks to a virtuoso performance from Tui Lolohea.

London came into the game winless, after 5 straight defeats to open the season, while Huddersfield had two wins from their opening 5 fixtures.

London took an unexpected lead in the 11th minute, through a penalty try. Bill Leyland kicked through and turned the Huddersfield defence. From the ensuing set, Lolohea's jinking run bamboozled the London defence, before he spread the ball out to Adam Swift to finish acrobatically in the corner. However, Huddersfield's wasteful kicking from the tee ensured London still had plenty to play for in the second half. Huddersfield missed all 3 kicks, which left the door open for London by keeping them within one score.

Huddersfield struck first in the second half, through playmaker Adam Clune. Good play from dummy half by Ashton Golding, gave Clune the ball 10 metres out. His dummy fooled Leyland, allowing him to step through the line and score. Tui Lolohea took over kicking duties and kicked Huddersfield's first goal of the night to make the score 18-6. Another failed short drop out gave Lolohea the simplest of kicks to extend Huddersfield's lead to 20-6 in the 51st minute, meaning London needed to score 3 tries to win the game. Lolohea was at the heart of everything good that Huddersfield did, and his kick allowed Sam Halsall to out jump Jarred Bassett and score in the 61st minute, which Lolohea successfully converted. Whilst Huddersfield continued to press, London showed resilience to hold out without conceding anymore points. However, they were visibly tiring and unable to offer any real attacking threat. The Broncos wait for a first win goes on, whilst Huddersfield registered their third win of the season, ending the weekend in 8th place.
