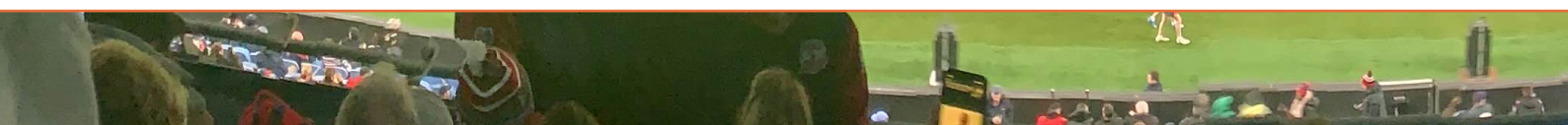

The Wrap: NRL Round 10

Lead changes multiple times as Dolphins hold on to narrow win

The Dolphins have put a two game losing streak behind them to pick up an important 20-16 victory over the Parramatta Eels in front of just over 11,000 fans at Commbank Stadium.

The first half was more of an arm-wrestle than anything too flamboyant as neither team could land a major blow on the other during the opening forty minutes. The Dolphins opened the scoring inside the first 15 minutes when Jack Bostock found himself on the outside of the Parramatta defence after a lapse in judgment left the Dolphins winger all alone.

The Eels struck back just shy of the half hour mark when for the first time in the game, they elected to go right and it paid off as Bailey Simonsson finished off in the corner. The Eels missed conversion didn't hurt too much at that stage as on the stroke of halftime, Sean Russell added a 47m penalty goal to level the scores at 6-6.

The second half started quickly for the Blue and Gold as after just two minutes, a run straight through the middle let Matt Doorey score relatively untouched as a good ball from Dylan Walker put him straight through. The conversion was successful and Parramatta opened up a 12-6 lead.

Momentum had swung to the Blue and Gold though they couldn't take advantage of the opportunities and neither could the Dolphins when they went up the other end. The Eels were denied by both referee Wyatt Raymond and the bunker when Will Penisini claimed a try but replays showed the Parramatta centre had knocked the ball on in the contest after an error initially from Herbie Farnworth.

The Dolphins couldn't throw much at the Eels, but it finally clicked on the hour mark when the Eels defence sat waiting for a Kodi Nikorima kick but instead the Redcliffe five-eighth elected to run it and put Connelly Lemulemu over to level the scores.

Not long after, Herbie Farnworth ran through two poor tackle attempts to find himself in open space before beating Isaiah Longi with speed to score. Jamayne Isaako added the conversion to give the Dolphins an 18-12 lead. The action wasn't too far away from Farnworth when he stayed down clutching his neck before the bunker intervened and ruled there was a crusher from the Eels. The subsequent penalty goal gave the visitors a 20-12 lead.

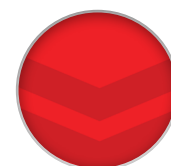
Parramatta kept the game alive almost in miraculous circumstances when on last tackle it looked as if they were going to be tackled on their own side of halfway but an offload from Kitione Kautoga found Isaiah Longi who went through and found Dylan Brown who scored.

Despite the missed conversion, momentum was with the Eels and it was a try saver from Herbie Farnworth that saved the Dolphins once when Will Penisini went at the line instead of passing to the winger and then on the stroke of halftime, Josh Addo-Carr got through linking with Dylan Brown who was tackled by Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow who forced the error at the end of the game ensuring the victory for the Dolphins.

Next week, Parramatta take on the Knights on Friday night in the 6pm game whilst the Dolphins are back at Suncorp Stadium playing host to the New Zealand Warriors on Saturday afternoon.

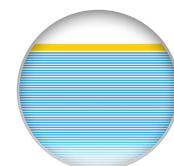

Des' Titans go on as Knights hit a comeback-shaped iceberg

From 20-0 down, the Gold Coast Titans have recorded their first win in Newcastle in nine years with a 24-20 victory over the Newcastle Knights.

Snaring victory with three minutes remaining courtesy of AJ Brimson's second four-pointer, the Titans put aside a week of off-field scrutiny to break a run of five straight losses with a gallant fightback.

The result lifts the Titans to their third win of the season, while the Knights and their 15,193 supporters in attendance will be left to lament a dismal second half riddled by errors.

Opening the scoring with an early penalty goal, the Knights took their time to convert a run of penalties with Dylan Lucas (16th minute) charging onto a short pass from Fletcher Sharpe to set in motion a run of tries.

Having set up the first four-pointer, Sharpe (23rd minute) continued his try-scoring heroics by finishing off a left side raid, while interchange forward Mat Croker (28th minute) made an immediate impact to crash over for his first try of the season to give the Knights a seemingly unassailable 20-0 lead.

Staring down the prospect of a scoreless first half for the second time this season, a thrilling passage of play on the final tackle, involving multiple offloads, reaped rewards as Phillip Sami (34th minute) touched down for one of the tries of the season.

The Titans carried their strong finish into new half with Sami (46th minute) capitalising on multiple Newcastle errors to collect his second of the night.

As both sides descended into mediocrity with errors and poor execution for much of the second half, a miraculous pass from Alofiana Khan-Pereira - delivered inches before being tackled over the sideline - saw Brimson (65th minute) reduce the deficit to just two points.

With the Titans surging at the same time their opponents were flailing to hold onto the lead, a penalty against Kai Pearce-Pail for dangerous contact on Beau Fermor allowed the visitors to strike; Khan-Periera threaded a grubber towards the posts which was gladly pounced upon by Brimson (77th minute) to seal the unlikeliest of wins for the Titans.

Next week, the Knights will remain at home in the same time slot against the Eels, while the Titans will face the Raiders in Canberra on Sunday afternoon.

Magical Mitchell secures gutsy Bunnies win

A fifty metre drop goal from Latrell Mitchell has given Souths a gutsy 22-14 win over a misfiring Broncos squad.

Both sides got off to a sputtering start, with a handful of errors early in the game, and the Broncos finally struck first after 18 minutes when a Ben Hunt kick landed perfectly for Kotoni Staggs, ultimately allowing Jordan Riki to go over. Adam Reynolds knocked over a penalty goal soon after and the Broncos led 8-0.

Another period of slow paced play ended just before halftime, when Deine Mariner crossed from a right side shift. The Broncos took a 14-0 lead into the break, but any thoughts of them going on to post a large score in the second 40 were proven misguided a few minutes into the half when Siliva Havili crossed from dummy half.

Around 10 minutes later, the Rabbitohs showed they were truly in the game when Isaiah Tass made Staggs look like a ragdoll before playing hot potato with Fletcher Myers to pick up a try. All of a sudden it was 14-12 with almost half an hour remaining and Souths were knocking on the door.

Brisbane started to turn it on, but they could not find a way to finish any of the 8 linebreaks they were able to pick up throughout the game, several of which came in the second half. And then, when Hunt pulled up lame chasing a grubber, the game completely shifted in favour of Souths.

First, a penalty on the goal line allowed them to tie the game with a penalty goal. Then, after another missed chance by the Broncos, a fifty metre two-point field goal by Latrell Mitchell put the Rabbitohs in front. And finally, when Selwyn Cobbo made an error in the Broncos last chance to force a tie or win, Mitchell scored a disrespectful four pointer which he converted to seal a 22-14 win.

The result means both teams have won 5 of their first 10 games, Souths winning their first in 5 while the Broncos have won just one of their last 5.

Add onto that the loss of Hunt, even if he can be just replaced by Ezra Mam, and they could have some serious issues during the traditionally taxing Origin period.

Canterbury comeback cruels Canberra in cracking contest

The Bulldogs have executed one of the game's great second half comebacks to overturn a 20-0 deficit and down the Raiders 32-20 in front of a massive 23,827 crowd at GIO Stadium.

It was the ultimate tale of two halves. Canberra came out of the blocks strong and within four minutes capitalised on some sloppy discipline and defence from the Bulldogs with Zac Hosking scoring near the posts.

The visitors struggled to get their hands on the footy and kept making poor decisions with and without the ball. Canberra fullback Kaeo Weekes found his way through some of that poor defending and the Raiders were up 10-0 before the quarter-mark of the game.

By the 25th minute the damage was clear when Xavier Savage scored a long range effort put on by Jamal Fogarty, who found Matt Timoko before Savage finished off the right side movement.

'Dogs fans would've been forgiven for getting an early start up the Federal Highway when Hudson Young sliced through two minutes before the break, handing the hosts a 20-0 lead at halftime.

Stephen Crichton turned into Canterbury's own version of the Incredible Hulk after the break and almost on his own turned the entire contest.

He scored himself on the 45th minute to start the Bulldogs' road back into the contest, before laying a try on for Jaeman Salmon at the 48th minute.

By the 53rd minute, big parts of the packed stadium were stunned into silence when Marcelo Montoya got the Bulldogs' third try and the twenty point deficit had reduced to just two points.

Tries either side of the 60-minute mark from big Max King and Viliame Kikau saw the Bulldogs surge into the lead.

Jacob Kiraz capped the win with a 72nd-minute try, completing one of the more remarkable comebacks in recent memory and putting the Bulldogs four clear at the top of the competition (at least for the next few hours).

Next week Canterbury will host long-time rivals the Roosters in a marquee Friday night clash, while the Raiders are hosting the Gold Coast in Sunday afternoon footy.

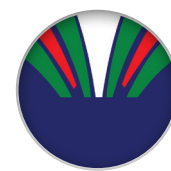

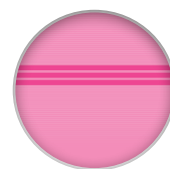

A star is born as Cowboys and Panthers play out epic draw

The North Queensland Cowboys and Penrith Panthers have played out the first draw of the 2025 season after an enthralling game went the entire 90 minutes at Queensland Country Bank Stadium.

The Panthers led by 12 points on two separate occasions but the speed of North Queensland's spine, along with the dynamic presence of Jeremiah Nanai on the edge, saw the Cowboys continually fight their way back in a seesawing battle that ended 30-all.

The story of the game, however, was Penrith five-eighth Blaize Talagi, who finally looked at home next to Nathan Cleary as he scored a try and set up four in a standout performance. Speaking of those two, the Panthers got on the board first in the 5th minute as Cleary combined with Talagi to put Isaiah Papali'i over and Penrith almost had a second when Liam Martin came down with a Cleary bomb a few sets later, passing it to Talagi who found Papali'i again but he was unable to connect with a wide-open Brian To'o. Still, these were early warning shots from a Panthers side that looked much more like the one that continued to defy the odds on the way to four-straight premierships.

Errors and ill-discipline have crippled Penrith at times this season though, and a few mistakes from the Panthers invited the Cowboys back into the game and eventually they evened the score in the 15th minute. On that occasion, Jeremiah Nanai caught an awkward mid-range bomb, linked with Tom Dearden who found Murray Taulagi and then Nanai was backing up in support to score.

Just as the Cowboys looked to have worked their way back into the game, Robert Derby spilled a Cleary bomb in what was just the start of a nightmare half from the young winger, who made four errors. The Panthers were quick to capitalise too as Talagi put Luke Garner over and that combination struck gold again shortly after, this time with the five-eighth putting it on the toe for his centre. Just as Penrith looked to be in cruise control, back-to-back penalties marched North Queensland up the field and Viliami Vailea barged over to score and leave the difference at 18-12 by halftime. It could have been far worse for the Cowboys, who had just 35 per cent of the ball in the first half and seven tackles in Penrith's 20-metre zone compared to 37 for the defending premiers.

Those tackles inside the North Queensland 20 kept coming as Reece Robson spilled the ball a few tackles into the opening set of the second half, but the Cowboys held firm on their own line and were eventually rewarded for that perseverance. Although initially it looked like Jaxon Purdue had bombed a try by looking inside instead of to his left with Taulagi in support after a linebreak from the Cowboys speedster. It mattered little though as Purdue took another carry on the next tackle and this time connected with Jake Clifford for North Queensland's third try of the game to tie it up at 18-all. The Cowboys then almost took the lead for the first time in the game when Nanai charged onto a last-tackle bomb and almost came down with it, only to spill the ball with the try line looming. It proved a crucial turning point as Talagi produced his fourth try assist of the game on the other end, this time confidently kicking early for Tom Jenkins, who had just come onto the field.

There was a tinge of controversy, not with the try itself, but the fact the Panthers were in a position to score it after Taulagi was penalised for a dangerous tackle on a falling Liam Henry. That put Penrith ahead 24-18 and the game hung in the balance for another 10 minutes before Derby's horror night continued as he spilled the ball while trying to get into the field of play, with Talagi on the spot to ground it and cap off a career-best performance. There was redemption of sorts for Derby as he crossed over for a late try as Drinkwater curled it in from the sidelines to set up a grandstand finish. And then a show of pure pace from Drinkwater delivered just that as he put Dearden over under the posts to tie up the game with five minutes left. The drama continued from that point, with the Panthers denied a penalty goal to win the game after the referees missed a blatant accidental offside from North Queensland off a Cleary bomb while Mitch Kenny then bizarrely decided to run the ball on the last as Penrith wasted a crucial chance to steal it at the death.

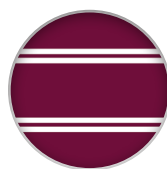

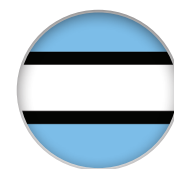

Blues look to seal 2025 Women's Origin in Sydney

New South Wales will look to secure the Women's State of Origin shield on Thursday night as for the first time, Women's Origin heads to Allianz Stadium for the first time as the Blues take on Queensland.

It was a Blues ambush in Queensland when New South Wales took a surprise 32-12 victory at Suncorp Stadium. The victory may not have necessarily been a surprise for the Blues but it was the margin that was the biggest shock of the night. The Blues started fast and despite some concerning defence at times the Blues were able to pull away later in the first half and put a strong second half performance putting on 18 unanswered points after leading 14-12 at the break.

The Blues performance in game 1 was exemplary and they will need to ensure that they put in the same level of effort in that they did in the first game because Queensland are going to improve. The aspect of only having one half was a risk for the Blues and whilst it paid off in the first game, it might not be something that could be perfect for New South Wales in Game 2.

The Blues have kept their on-field team exactly the same as they did for the first game at Suncorp Stadium whilst there was just one extended squad change with Brydie Parker coming in for Kirra Dibb.

A first game loss won't be a worry for the Queenslanders who had the exact same situation happen to them last year however the scope of the loss would be the biggest concern. Last year, the Maroons lost game one at Suncorp Stadium before picking up wins in Newcastle and Townsville to win the first three game series.

The performance for the Maroons would be a concern to the coach Tahnee Norris as the Blues were dominant across all the stats and the key players didn't really match the expectations put upon them. The statistics didn't paint a pretty picture for Queensland out of the first match with all the key stats favouring the Blues showing how much they were dominate through out the contest including only having just one line break.

Queensland have kept the same overall squad but made one change to their 17 with Chelsea Lenarduzzi coming onto the bench to add some size to the bench rotation whilst Destiny Brill drops off into the reserves.

Who to watch: The key is going to be in the halves yet again and as mentioned above, the option for the Blues to go with one specialised half is a risk again so the pressure goes well and truly on Jesse Southwell. The halfback had an indifferent NRLW season at the end of last year before the break but she played excellently for the game but in Game 2 the pressure will be truly on.

One of the best ever female players to grace the field, Ali Briginshaw has been a leader for Queensland for a long time and they are going to need another captains knock to keep the series alive. The performance of Briginshaw was bizarrely below par as she failed to find range with her kicking game and just being outplayed. There is never any reason to doubt the veteran but this week in particular, the pressure will be on

Favourite: NSW are slight favourites.

My tip: In front of a home crowd, New South Wales I think should be able to have enough to lock up the series. The Queenslanders will definitely be better than they were in game 1 but there was just a lot to like about the Blues performances to think they can see off the Maroons in a much closer game. **NSW by 6.**

This match has 'anybody's guess' written all over it.

The two worst attacking teams in the competition and both sitting in the bottom 4 of the ladder. The Knights have scored 50 points in their last 2 games after having scored a paltry 36 points across their 5 games prior. Their defence had been reasonable enough and may well have helped them win some games if they could've put some scoreboard pressure on their opponents. They couldn't though, so the fact they've conceded 20 points or more in 6 of their last 7 games does look like a failure as well.

The Eels are much less muckier right now. They've conceded an average of 30.22 points per game this year, however since the return of Mitch Moses in Round 7, they've scored 72 points and conceded 70, winning 1 of 3 games. They've actually kept themselves in the last 2 matches which they lost and they will come into this contest feeling confident of victory.

Newcastle started the season with back-to-back victories against strugglers Wests Tigers and the Dolphins, before losing consecutively to the Titans, Bulldogs, Tigers, Sharks and Warriors – dropping them into the bottom 3. A commanding win against the inconsistent Souths looked to revitalize the Knights. But then the Knights threw away their match last week against the struggling Titans. They lead 20-6 at halftime, but they let in 3 converted tries, the last of which was within the final 3 minutes of the game, to lose 24-20.

The Knights are dominant when it comes to ball running and line breaking/bending stats, ranking fourth for line breaks, second for post contact metres, first for tackle breaks, second for total run metres, while also being the top ranked side for offloads. They should be scoring points easily off the back of all that fantastic work in the middle, but their discipline and variation in attack is abysmal in comparison.

The Eels by comparison are the worst team in the competition for post contact metres, second last for tackle breaks and last for run metres. This could well mean the Knights will dominate field position all game, which will put pressure on the Eels defence. Given the Knights improved point scoring ability over the last fortnight, it could be enough to see them score enough points to get the win.

The Eels were slow out of the gate, losing their first four games of the season against the Storm, Tigers, Bulldogs and Manly. In Round 5 they scored a Golden Point victory over the Dragons, before getting flogged by the Raiders the following week. Round 7 saw the return of Moses and winning, as they beat the Tigers before losing their last 2 games, 28-18 against the Sharks and 20-16 against the Dolphins last week, despite leading by 6 points after an hour of play.

The Eels though have Mitch Moses, who knows to keep his side in a game and if the Knights attack reverts to its dire form, the Eels will be in this game for the full 80 minutes. Moses has enough class and guile to help his side to a win from that position.

Who to watch: The player everyone will be watching in this game is Mitch Moses. The Eels half has been in good form and will be playing for a Blues jumper. Expect him to be everywhere and involved in everything.

On the other side of the field will be Kalyn Ponga whose form has been well down on his best so far this year. He'll be desperate to get back into the Queensland fullback jumper, which he last wore in 2022. The Knights attack will suffer immensely in this game, as they won't be able to rely heavily on the powerful running game of their winger Greg Marzhev, who has been ruled out due to a knee injury.

Favourite: The Knights at home are the favourites here, however the Eels have won 6 of their last 7 games against the Knights and look to be improving more convincingly than the Knights are.

My tip: I'm going to find it hard to have any confidence in that Knights outfit in their current situation. **Eels by 10.**

Bulldogs look to continue momentum against resurgent Roosters

There is no doubt about it, the Bulldogs are currently the hottest team in Rugby League and as it stands are as good a shot as anybody to win the 2025 premiership. The way they effortlessly erased a 20-point deficit on the road against an equally surging Raiders side quieted any doubters the Belmore boys might've had left, with the 32 unanswered second half points sending a warning shot to the rest of the competition that defence isn't the only trick they have in the book.

They come up against a Roosters side who just had the bye, but before that were hitting some strong form themselves. On ANZAC day they towelled up a Dragons outfit that has been competitive in every other game they've played, before easily disposing of the Dolphins during magic round in a game that was more lopsided than the final scoreline suggests.

When the Roosters have struggled this season, it's mainly been because of their inability to convert their attacking opportunities into points. They're averaging just 11.6 points in every game they've lost, while that number skyrockets to 36.5 in wins. Obviously, the more points a team scores the more likely they are to win, but such a stark difference points to the Roosters attack as the most important aspect of their game.

While they have come off two great performances with ball in hand, it's one thing to do it against the Dragons and Dolphins and another to do it against the best defensive team in the comp by far. It warrants mentioning how far ahead of the pack the Bulldogs are in that regard, conceding 15.33 points per game to lead the league in that category, with the next closest being the Sharks at 18.

Despite this, the Dogs have shown tendencies in recent weeks to clock off for periods in games. You don't come back from 20 points down in the second half without conceding 20 in the first half, and we're only a few weeks removed from the Broncos blitzing them 34-0 in the opening forty. A strong early defensive showing against a Roosters attack exhibiting strong signs of life will be a key point of emphasis for Cameron Ciraldo in this one.

Who to watch: You won't see too many better individual takeovers of games in Rugby League history than what Stephen Crichton was able to produce in Canberra last week. With his side on the ropes down by 20, the Bulldogs captain put the team on his back as he cruised past Seb Kris to score a long range try before doing the same thing in set off the kick-off to assist another one. Watching such dominance in a first-grade game, let alone one between first and second on the table, was surreal, and his final stat line of 9 runs for 161 metres, 3 line breaks, 1 line break assist, 2 try assists and 4 tackle breaks probably doesn't do enough justice to how unstoppable he was out there. Centre is a position that the Blues origin side is spoilt for talent in, but Crichton might've done enough last week to lock up his spot for the next three series. Look for him to have another big one against a Roosters left edge that has struggled defensively for much of the season.

For the Roosters, James Tedesco has been the spearhead behind their recent attacking resurgence and will have extra motivation to put his best foot forward with origin selection right around the corner. It's well documented what a transcendent player Tedesco has been throughout his career, however there is a strong argument to be made that his current footy, whilst not being the best he's ever played, is the most impressive. This is a Roosters halves pairing that's combined for less than 50 NRL games, but have been freed up by Tedesco's involvement to pick their spots and play their natural games in a way that has translated to fairly immediate on-field results, with Smith and Savala suiting up for their first game together just four weeks ago. When tasked with this role in the past, Tedesco has often overplayed his hand, leading to frustration seeping into his game. The way he's been able to learn from his mistakes and adapt his style this late into his career is a testament to his stature in the sport. If the Roosters are to cause the upset, Tedesco is going to have to be heavily involved once again.

Favourite: The Bulldogs are 7-point favourites at the time of writing.

My tip: As a Roosters fan, I would love nothing more than to tip my boys to cause the boilover. Objectively speaking though, they've been far too inconsistent to suggest with any confidence that they can stop this well-oiled Canterbury machine. **Tip.**

Katoa v Metcalf in the battle of next-gen halves

The NRL's two young halves sensations in Isaiya Katoa and Luke Metcalf go head-to-head to kickstart Round 11's Super Saturday when the Dolphins host the Warriors from Suncorp Stadium.

2025 has been a rough initiation into the week-in-week-out coaching cycle for Dolphins coach Kristian Woolf with the side taking a little longer to find their groove in the post Wayne Bennett world of Redcliffe. But after a slow start which had many critics questioning the succession plan, the Dolphins have only lost once since Round 5 in a clear sign that the changes are having a desired effect at last.

Isaiya Katoa has really come into his own this year, taking full reigns of the Dolphins offence with his instinctual running game causing chaos for defences around the league. His pass selection and kicking game has also improved tenfold on previous seasons and the combination with his spine has been really key for the Phins in this mini run of late. Their unheralded pack has also lifted this year with the likes of Finefuiaki and Molo really adding some umph to a forward group that needed it.

To beat the Warriors, they need to match intensity of the pack nice and early and dictate terms the way they want to play. If they play the way the Warriors want to, they will lose because the visitors just have too much leg speed around the ruck so it's going to be up to the backs to get the speed advantage out wide. Onto the team news, Dolphins are unheralded for this clash.

After ten rounds of the season, a lot of people (including yours truly) are sat here eating a good old slice of humble pie after the Warriors have blown away most people's expectations (circa 2023 anyone). After a Vegas horror show, everyone was getting out the champagne citing a correct prediction for the first time, but there was just one problem... the Warriors took it personally.

They have been a joy to watch this season, with a great pack of forwards and a halves combination that has defied expectations. Chanel Harris-Tavita has been the perfect foil for Luke Metcalf who has been sensational this season, with his speed around the ruck blowing teams away, especially in Magic Round a fortnight ago with a coming out part on the biggest regular season stage.

Their unsung pack of forwards have risen to the call in the absence of James Fisher-Harris with new signing Erin Clark leading the way after Dylan Walker's departure. Young guns Leka Halasima and Demitric Vaimauga rose to the call with Supercoach users everywhere looking at this week's teamlists to see the minutes impacts for their rising stars.

Speaking of team-lists, let's look at them. Jackson Ford and Bunty Afoa are OUT, James Fisher-Harris returns from a pectoral injury, shifting Marata Niukore to an edge while Sam Healey comes onto the bench.

Who to watch: The Dolphins other big name to shine this season has been outside back Herbie Farnworth. After a slow opening fortnight, he has been sensational for the Dolphins on the left edge, racking up tackle-breaks for fun and coming up with big plays on a nearly weekly basis to get the Phins out of trouble. Farnworth averages 6.2 tackle breaks PER GAME as well as 165 metres. Watch for Herbie to try and capitalise on a matchup that is favourable for him this weekend.

For the Warriors, we mentioned him earlier but we have to go more in-depth here and that is Erin Clark. His signing has been a critical one for the Warriors, who struggled to replace Josh Curran last year for impact in the middle third of the field. This year, that problem has been answered emphatically with the middle forward exploding back into form, averaging over 150 metres a game and making over 33 tackles a game (on average). Since Walker's departure, he has played 60 minutes + in every game showing his value to this side.

Favourite: The Warriors are favourites at the time of publication. The Warriors hold a 2-2 record over the Phins with both wins coming at Suncorp Stadium (today's venue).

My tip: It's a toss of the coin, but I suspect this will be the end of the Warriors Suncorp Curse, having not won here (outside of Magic Round) since 2021. They have been in a rich vein of form this season and I just have concerns on whether the Dolphins pack can match the intensity of the Warriors middles for 80 minutes as well as contain Magic Luke! **Warriors by 8.**

Match preview

The Cowboys come into this match with some strong form behind them.

After dropping their first 3 games of the season, they won their next 4 straight games before a tight 4 point loss to top side Warriors before a draw last weekend with the defending Premiers Penrith. They've racked up 182 points in those 6 games. However, their defence hasn't exactly been elite either, as they've conceded a considerable 132 points in that time, and after 9 games, despite sitting in 6th place on the table, their points differential is still in the red at -14.

Manly on the other hand feel like the most unconvincing top 8 side right now. They won 3 of their opening 4 games but have since lost 4 of their last 5 games, and while they've not been too heavily beaten, they've been beaten. Last week they went down to the Sharks 30-14, but held onto their top 8 spot courtesy of the Wests Tigers getting towelled up royally by the Storm last Sunday.

The Cowboys then look like the team to have the upper hand here, but then they went and shifted teenage outside back Jaxson Purdue into five-eighth, shifting Tom Dearden to halfback and last week's number 7, Jake Clifford, onto the extended bench as 18th man. Not saying it's a bad move, but it adds an air of uncertainty around the Cowboys attack and that could be enough to give Manly's experienced spine an edge.

Manly's pack has had some deckchair reshuffling take place, with the returning Jake Trbojevic moving back into his Lock position, Jazz Tevaga from lock to hooker, Jake Simpkin from hooker to the bench and Ethan Bullemor from the bench into the front row.

All these moves appear to be giving Dearden and Trbojevic opportunities to impress Origin selectors. One can't help but think that such moves are a gamble that seldom work out.

Who to watch: The men vying for Origin jumpers are the ones to keep an eye on. Tom Trbojevic has been overtaken form-wise, by Cronulla's William Kennedy and the Roosters ageless custodian James Tedesco, so don't be surprised to see him injecting himself into the attack a lot, especially to run strong lines, solely to remind the Blues selectors that he can also slot in at centre. His brother Jake Trbojevic has a lot of competition for a middle forward spot, which could well be the reason why he's reverted back to Lock. Away from Origin hopefuls, Manly's wingers Lehi Hopoate and Jason Saab have been producing plenty of strong performances of late, adding an extra edge to their attack.

Tom Dearden has been playing well, but a shift to halfback will see him taking control of the Cowboys attack, becoming the centrepiece of all they do. There's a bit of uncertainty over who the Maroons halves will be, but Dearden is likely the most certain of all options. By proving he can play both halves roles well further strengthens his chances.

Favourite: The Cowboys will be the favourites in this match, however Manly have won their last 5 games against the Cowboys that were played in Queensland. Cowboys have the form, but Manly have a spine that you can never take for granted.

My tip: This could well be a very tight match, but I'm gonna lean towards a Manly upset. **Sea Eagles by 2.**

Saturday night in the Shire

A consolidated spot in the top four heading into the representative season awaits the winner on Saturday night as the Cronulla Sharks host the Melbourne Storm in the match of the round.

Returning to Sharks Stadium following six weeks away from their spiritual home, the Cronulla Sharks will be looking to prove their premiership credentials against last year's grand finalists.

Soaring home with three tries in the final 15 minutes to turn a 14-all deadlock into a comprehensive 30-14 victory over the Sea Eagles, coach Craig Fitzgibbon will welcome back Siosifa Talakai in place on Tom Hazelton on the bench.

Second-rower Billy Burns will play his 50th game in first grade; the journeyman forward played a central role in the side's victory last Sunday setting up two tries to seal the win away from home.

Winning their past three matches against the Storm at Sharks Stadium, the Sharks have bounced back from a slow start to the year with four wins from their past five matches to sit in outright fifth position.

Coming off their equal biggest ever win last Sunday at home, the Melbourne Storm will hit the road with the determination to win under more challenging circumstances.

Scoring 11 tries in a 64-0 rout of the Wests Tigers in their most recent outing, coach Craig Bellamy has recalled Tui Kamikamica on the bench, while Harry Grant and Nelson Asofa-Solomona have been included in the extended squad.

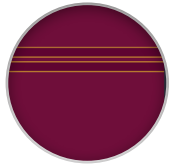
Holding a decisive record of nine wins from 15 matches against the Sharks in the near decade since facing off in the 2016 grand final, only two players – Cameron Munster and Asofa-Solomona – remain from the last Storm side to win at Sharks Stadium eight years ago.

Who to watch: Recruited by the Sharks for the explicit purpose of winning games like these, Addin Fonua-Blake will be determined to deliver on his reputation as a heavyweight performer. Enjoying a strong start to life at Cronulla with 170 running metres – including 77 post-contact metres – on average to go with three tries and 30 tackle breaks, the 29-year-old Tongan front-rower will be integral to his side's chances of weathering the Storm. Holding the distinction of winning the Dally M Prop of the Year accolade for the past two seasons, the Sharks will be looking for Fonua-Blake to stand up and deliver on Saturday night.

As speculation mounts over who should wear the Queensland number six jersey in this year's State of Origin series, Cameron Munster will be out to deliver a decisive performance on Saturday night. Making 18 appearances for the Maroons before missing last year's series through injury, the 30-year-old has produced 11 try assists and two tries to hold a slight edge over incumbent five-eighth Tom Dearden – eight try assists and three tries – from nine appearances respectively. Capable of single-handedly changing the course of a game through sheer brilliance – as evidenced by his Player of the Match heroics in the 2020 decider – Munster will be aiming to guarantee his place in Billy Slater's side with a strong performance.

Favourite: Coming off one of the biggest wins recorded in the NRL era, the Storm are expected to back up that success against their rival opponents.

My tip: The likely return of Harry Grant should give the Storm the confidence to overcome a hostile crowd and win their first match in the Shire since 2017. **Storm by 8.**

Both the Broncos and Dragons will be gunning to arrest concerning form slumps when they face off on Sunday afternoon at Suncorp Stadium.

For Brisbane, the 2023 grand finalists looked to be in control early against South Sydney but floundered late, with the 22-14 loss compounded by a serious injury to Ben Hunt.

That sees Ezra Mam named to play his first game in the NRL this season.

While the Broncos are currently only on a two-game losing streak, they have still dropped four of their past five games, and at the moment look far too inconsistent to be a genuine premiership threat.

The blowout win over the Bulldogs remains proof of what Michael Maguire's team is capable of, but also stands in stark contrast to what they have dished up in the past fortnight.

As for the Dragons, that upset win over the Storm earlier in the year seems so long ago, with Shane Flanagan's on a three-game losing skid.

The latest came at the hands of the in-form Warriors and while it was a defensive improvement on the combined 80 points they had conceded in the two weeks prior, it still did little to suggest the Red V are a real chance of competing for a top-eight spot.

In team news, Toby Couchman (shoulder) is out, seeing Jack de Belin join the starting side with Blake Lawrie on the bench.

If there is one thing working in the Dragons' favour this week it is recent form against the Broncos, having won seven of their past nine against the Brisbane club.

Who to watch: Who else? All eyes will be on Ezra Mam in his return to the NRL, having served his suspension and starred in his comeback game in Queensland Cup. The Broncos could use his spark in the halves, although defensive lapses and a general lack of effort a fortnight ago against Penrith won't be solved by Mam's return. Nonetheless, Mam almost inspired Brisbane to grand final glory two years ago and is still an incredibly talented player when he is taking the line on and playing at his confident best. There may be rust early on Sunday, but as long as the fundamentals are there this could be the start of Mam reminding the Broncos what they've missed, and leaving Maguire with a headache when Hunt returns.

It is going to be a challenge taking on a motivated Broncos pack that has been kept in check for two-straight weeks, so the Dragons may have to turn to – checks notes – a one-game rookie? Well, that's just a reflection of how good Loko Pasifiki Tonga was in his NRL debut last week. He more than matched it with a big Warriors pack and provided an instant impact when he was injected into the game, punching out over 100 metres in 30 minutes. The Dragons have plenty of toilers and workman-like forwards, but they desperately needed some juice and firepower. Pasifiki Tonga brings just that and shapes as a potential X-factor off the bench, should the Broncos have not already opened up a handy lead by the time he comes on.

Favourite: Back at home, the Broncos are well-backed to return to their winning ways.

My tip: The Broncos may be inconsistent this season but the highs of their 2025 campaign have been far more impressive than that of the Dragons and so you have to feel better about Brisbane putting it all together in front of a Sunday afternoon crowd at Suncorp. **Brisbane by 18.**

The Canberra Raiders will host the Gold Coast Titans on Sunday afternoon, hoping to repay their fans for their shocking second-half loss to the Bulldogs in Round 10.

The Canberra Raiders and Gold Coast Titans have met 32 times since their inception in 1998, with the Raiders holding a 19-13 advantage. Of the 15 matches played in Canberra, the home side has claimed 10 victories. The Raiders come into this clash after a tough 32-20 loss to the Canterbury Bulldogs, in which they gave up a commanding 20-0 halftime lead. Despite the setback, Canberra remains comfortably within the top 4. The last time these two sides met, the Raiders were too strong, dominating the second half to secure a 30-20 win in Round 7, contributing to the Titans' ongoing six-game losing streak.

In Round 10, the Raiders started strongly against the Bulldogs, applying early pressure and keeping their opponents scoreless through much of the first half. However, the Bulldogs hit back with a vengeance after the break, scoring 32 unanswered points to hand Canberra a disappointing 32-20 defeat. Despite the loss, the Raiders showed glimpses of their potential, particularly in the opening half, and remain in the top 4, with plenty to build on moving forward.

AJ Brimson has been in fine form for the Gold Coast Titans, scoring seven tries in his last seven matches, including a double in their stunning win over the Knights. His creativity and leadership will be crucial for the Titans.

Favourite: The Raiders are the favourites going into this match, with their strong home form and their impressive display in Round 10.

My tip: Despite the Titans' sensational comeback win over the Knights, the Raiders are in red-hot form and will prove tough to beat, especially in Canberra. With a dominant record at home and key players like Hudson Young firing, the Raiders should take this one comfortably. **Raiders by 16.**

10th meets 11th in battle of finals hopefuls

Sunday night will see round eleven brought to a close with the Wests Tigers hosting the South Sydney Rabbitohs at Campbelltown Sports Stadium. Souths will be aiming to build on their close win last week, continuing in their efforts to get their season back on track following four straight losses. The Tigers have been brought back to reality thanks to a Storm thumping and will be aiming to be much more competitive back at home this week.

Travelling south to Melbourne is difficult for any team, but a young Wests Tigers outfit looked to simply be lacking effort throughout their 64-0 loss to the Storm. Their goal line defence, which up to this point had been sound, was torn apart by Ryan Papenhuyzen - in attack, final passes weren't sticking and dumb decisions were being made. The loss has opened the door to media criticism, with a social media post from Jarome Luai's dad keeping Wests in the headlines. It's important that, instead of wallowing in their defeat, the Tigers can learn from the past week, in order to avoid replicating it.

Starford To'a will return from a neck injury this week, slotting back into the centres. It's Brent Naden who's forced out of his spot, somewhat surprisingly being named on the bench instead. Fonua Pole has gone down with a knee injury, seeing Royce Hunt elevated to the starting side and Jack Bird joining the bench. Tallyn Da Silva is a surprise omission from the 17, with the young hooker seemingly making way to allow Api to play 80 minutes.

Trailing 14-0 at the break, a colossal effort was demanded of the Rabbitohs to turn the tides against Brisbane last week. But turn they did, with a stunning Latrell Mitchell two point field goal completing the comeback in the 77th minute. The 22-14 win, which broke a four game losing streak, didn't stop Mitchell from receiving criticism over his controversial try on the last play of the game. Regardless, South Sydney have signalled that they are well and truly back, and will want to dispose of the Tigers who currently sit just one place above them on the ladder.

Alex Johnston returns on the wing for the Rabbitohs, having been on the sidelines with a hamstring injury. Fletcher Myers makes way, dropping back to the reserves. Josh Schuster, Lewis Dodd, Tevita Tatola, and Jacob Host are also among the reserves, arguably the strongest cohort of players left out of the top 17 in the NRL.

The Bunnies have won four of their past five games against the Tigers, but it was Wests who came out on top in their last meeting - a game that was also played at Campbelltown.

Who to watch: Jahream Bula has had a cracking start to the season at fullback for the Tigers. After bursting onto the scene in 2023, the 23 year old has international experience for Fiji and 48 NRL appearances to his name. Bula has been named Wests Tigers Players' Player, Rookie of the Year, and Player of the Year so far in his career, and it's clear that he still has room for more improvement. Signed until the end of 2027, Wests Tigers fans are definitely hoping that he is the club's long term fullback as he continues to develop as a player.

Alex Johnston is rapidly closing in on the NRL's all-time try scoring record. The South Sydney winger has been known as a prolific try-scorer throughout his career and appears set to etch himself further into the history books in the very near future. On 196 career tries and currently ranked second of all-time, he is also the first player to score 30 tries in consecutive seasons. At just 30 years of age, the Kumul and Kangaroo seemingly has plenty of time to chase down Ken Irvine's record of 212 career tries. A sneaky few 4-pointers on his return from injury this weekend is definitely not unlikely.

Favourite: Most bookies can't split the two teams. After all, the only differentiating factor on the ladder is the Tigers having an 18 points higher for and against.

My tip: The Bunnies might enter this game a little bit more relaxed than they should, and the Tigers will definitely be ready to make up for last week. **Tigers by 2.**

Challenge Cup Semis Wrap

Rovers ruthless as McNamara sees red over Kendall's performance

Hull KR are the first team through to the Challenge Cup final after a 36-12 verdict over the Catalans Dragons in a result where Dragons coach Steve McNamara slammed referee Chris Kendall's performance.

Rovers got off to a hot start after Luke Keary's general play kick sailed out on the full. Mikey Lewis was able to put a grubber kick in behind which wasn't defused by the Catalans fullback and James Batchelor recovered for the first of his quick fire double. The second of his double was more contentious when Lewis stopped in the run thinking there was an obstruction, the ball was knocked out by a Catalans defender and Batchelor simultaneously grounded it with a Dragons defender to score and McNamara's men were shell-shocked after 12 minutes.

Despite a poor run with the officiating, the Dragons managed to take the lead with two quick tries in succession involving their Australian pivot who's been in the headlines this week. The first came before the 20 minutes when Keary found Reimis Smith who got on the outside of Peta Hiku to score.

The second try was a rough watch with Ben Thaler taking an excruciating amount of time to review Keary's claims of a try, after it was given to a chorus of boos, Catalans led 12-10. The lead didn't last long as Jai Whitbread continued his great run of form with a great pass to Lewis to give Rovers a half-time advantage.

After a tight opening 40, the second half was an excruciating watch for a Dragons fan as Rovers ran riot. A penalty for an untidy ruck gave Lewis a gift two points to open up a converted try gap but there was no way anyone was stopping Rovers. At the 53 minute mark, Jack Broadbent went through some poor defence to slice the game open. Rovers finished with a flurry with further tries to Joe Burgess and Broadbent (rounding out his double) to give the Hull based side a 24-point hiding.

Post game, McNamara was seething at the performance of the man in the middle.

"We got it back to 12-10 but we spent too much energy. We didn't work hard enough at certain times ourselves, but as you can tell I'm pissed off not to receive a penalty at all apart from them kicking out on the full" McNamara said.

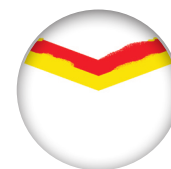
He further added his concerns about the "neutral venue" status of Challenge Cup semi-finals.

"I was concerned (about it pre-match) because in Hull KR's home games this year (they have had) 42 penalties given and 16 conceded, and only three six against all year.

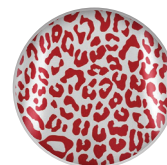
