## Parramatta’s dream result is a Knight-mare for Newcastle

The Parramatta Eels have spoiled the party in Dane Gagai’s 300th NRL appearance, continuing a strong recent record in the Hunter with a 28-6 win over the Newcastle Knights.

Leading from start to finish to crush the hopes of 20,125 supporters in attendance, the Eels posted their fourth win from five visits to Newcastle this decade to potentially move off the bottom of the ladder pending other results this weekend.

The result was a further blow to the confidence of the Knights who followed up last week’s calamitous collapse at home with an inept attacking display riddled with errors and ill-discipline.

In an energetic opening which saw both sides show their intentions by attacking close to the sidelines, a rampaging run from Jack Williams allowed the Eels to capitalise with future Knight Dylan Brown laying on a well-placed chip kick into the arms of Mitchell Moses (11th minute) for first points.

The Eels extended their lead minutes later off the back of a penalty and repeat set with Zac Lomax (14th minute) exposing the makeshift edge pairing of debutant Fletcher Hunt and Dylan Lucas - shifted to centre following a hamstring injury to Bradman Best at training - to score his 50th career try.

The Knights were not without their chances during the opening half only to come up with errors inside their opponent’s half; despite having ample opportunities to extend their lead the Eels remained ahead 10-0 at the break.

A one-on-one strip by Dylan Walker midway through the second half paved the way for the Eels to break the Knights’ resolve with Lomax (55th minute) outmuscling Hunt out wide to collect his second of the night.

Following a run of infringements in quick succession against Newcastle - resulting in Kai Pearce-Paul being sent to the sin bin - the Eels added a penalty goal before cutting loose with tries to Brown (64th minute) and Jordan Samrani (66th minute) in consecutive sets.

In a fleeting moment of joy for the badly beaten home side, Gagai marked his milestone match with flick pass that sent James Schiller (75th minute) over for a consolation try to round out the 28-6 rout.

Next week, the Knights will face the Panthers in Bathurst on Saturday evening, while the Eels will host the Sea Eagles on Friday night at home.

# Bulldogs bark late to down Roosters in another miracle comeback

Canterbury have beaten the Roosters by 24-20 in an absolute classic match at Accor Stadium tonight.

The Bulldogs have now come back from zero at halftime in consecutive weeks following their incredible win in the Nation's Capital last week, leaving Roosters fans in heartbreak after they wrestled the lead back late through a miracle Mark Nawaqanitawase try.

It was Matt Burton who was the hero for the home side, when the star five-eighth took the game by the scruff of the neck to score a superb solo try with five minutes remaining, sealing yet another miraculous comeback for Cameron Ciraldo's men.

The Bulldogs came into the game as warm favourites given their electric start to the season. However, it was the visitors who managed to get the jump on their bitter rivals when Roosters rugby convert Mark Nawaqanitawase scored the first try of the night following some slick hands from James Tedesco.

Following the kickoff, Blues incumbent Spencer Leniu ran over the top of Bulldogs prop Daniel Suluka-Fifita in a steaming run, which saw the young Dogs forward deemed a Category 1 and ending his night early.

The Tricolours continued to dominate possession and after Dogs prop Matt King was penalised for a clumsy high shot, Sandon Smith took a gift two points to give the Roosters an 8-0 lead.

Canterbury continued to look lethargic and could not seem to produce a decent last tackle kick to apply much pressure and Sydney continued to march up field again and again.

The Dogs defensive line finally cracked, when Roosters firebrand Lindsay Collins crashed over before halftime to give his side a convincing 14-0 lead, leaving Canterbury being held to nil at the break for the second consecutive week.

The Bulldogs needed to get on the scoreboard first and they did just that when Bailey Hayward split the Roosters line with a dummy and found Viliame Kikau in support who scored next to the posts.

Moments later the Bulldogs had their second try when halfback Toby Sexton pounced on a Roosters dropped ball to race away and score next to the posts and narrow the lead to two points.

Matt Burton then stepped up, putting up an enormous torpedo bomb that was dropped by Mark Nawaqanitawase. The error proved crucial when Bronson Xerri ran an inside line to charge over to score and give the Bulldogs the lead for the first time in the match.

Then just as Canterbury had all the momentum, Roosters winger Mark Nawaqanitawase scored one of the tries of the season through a chip and chase in limited space to score and put the Roosters back in front with 13 minutes remaining.

Canterbury couldn't be denied however, with Burton charging over to score the match winner with minutes remaining to consolidate the Bulldogs position at the summit of the NRL ladder.

The Roosters now face another tough match in the Sharks in Gosford next Sunday, while Canterbury will return to Accor Stadium next Thursday night where they will host the Dolphins.

## Warriors survive late scare to down Dolphins

New Zealand Warriors won 16-12 against Dolphins in the first game of Super Saturday at Lang Park on Saturday afternoon.

The Warriors won their fifth game in a row with another fantastic defensive effort in the second half. Tries from Marata Niukore, Kurt Capewell and Jacob Laban helped them get the two points.

The game was a tight tussle but both sides went close in the opening quarter. Chanel Harris-Tavita had one chalked off for the Warriors while Kodi Nikorima was similar for the Dolphins.

Warriors did produce first points on the half hour mark. It was a superb short ball from Wayde Egan for Marata Niukore who strolled over from close range for a 4-0 lead.

Metcalf might have missed his first conversion but was full of confidence today. He grubbered through for himself, regathered then found a trailing Kurt Capewell who picked up the four-pointer.

Dolphins were in the fight for the game but their discipline was cruelling them against a Warriors side that doesn't offer you many chances.

They were given a pair of penalties early in the second half but the execution from the Dolphins wasn't up to scratch and they spilled them both.

The hosts kept getting chances to attack the Warriors line. They had over a dozen tackles headed towards it but a knock on from Felise Kaufusi cruelled their chances in a low-scoring affair.

Kaufusi went close again for them but when he stretched out, he lost it as the Dolphins kept monopolising possession but no points to show for it.

The Warriors put the nail in the coffin with 10 to go. Harris-Tavita hoisted it high, got a knock on from Herbie Farnworth and Jacob Laban was on hand to get his first NRL four-pointer for 16-0.

Dolphins did get across the line and avoided being niled. Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow beat his initial defender then powered to the line to claim the score.

There was a final twist in the contest when the returning James Fisher-Harris was sin binned for a moderate high tackle on Dolphins interchange player Harrison Graham.

Dolphins made quick work of their advantage. They stripped the numbers on the left which allowed Farnworth to stroll over then Jamayne Isaako curled it over for 16-12.

They made a fist of the final set, Nikorima kicked through for Jack Bostock who sliced the second kick off his boot and the away fans erupted in Lang Park.

Warriors won their fifth straight game and remain second on the NRL ladder. Once again, they only scored once in the second half but their defense won the day.

The win pushes Manly back up over the Cowboys on the ladder ahead of their clash at Parramatta against the Eels on Friday night whilst the Cowboys get their first bye of the season next week.

At 31-22 the Sharks looked the more likely to go on with the game until a freakish aerial display from Xavier Coates delivered the Storm winger his hat-trick and narrowed the margin to five points.

Try as they might, both sides kept blundering chances to seal victory which left the Sharks five-point winners at the end, in spite of a prolonged final minute of the game where Ryan Papenhuyzen found himself on report for high contact.

The Storm have a bye next week ahead of Origin I, while Cronulla are headed to Gosford to face the Roosters on Saturday.

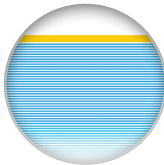

# Match preview

### Luckless Dolphins meet dangerous Dogs

The Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs will play host to the Dolphins at Homebush this Thursday night to kick off a short, bye-effected, round 12. The Bulldogs are sitting pretty at the top of the NRL table, and a win against the Dolphins would be their fourth win on the trot. Dolphins fans have been suffering through some awfully close games, and will be feeling like it's about time some luck went their way. The upcoming State of Origin opener has seen some significant changes to both sides, and perhaps gives the Dolphins a small advantage.

Canterbury were made to work extremely hard to come away with the two points against the Sydney Roosters last week. Coming out 24-20 victors, it was a try to Matt Burton in the 73rd minute which proved the difference. Despite the win, their scoreless first half performance will undoubtedly be a cause of concern for the Bulldogs. Showing the resilience required to overcome that 14-0 half-time deficit is perhaps even more important than a full 80 minute performance at this stage of the season, however there is still room for improvement.

There are a number of forced changes to the Bulldogs 17 this week brought on by State of Origin preparations. Canterbury captain Stephen Crichton, prop Max King, and lock Kurt Mann are the representative players missing, whilst injuries to Jacob Kiraz and Daniel Suluka-Fifita bring about a real test of the Bulldogs' depth. Josh Curran's suspension has come to an end so he slots into the front row, with Lipoi Hopoi upgraded to the other starting prop position. Blake Wilson plugs the gap on the wing, Bailey Heyward in at lock, and Blake Taaffe in at centre for his first start of the NRL season. The bench is filled up by Jake Turpin and Sam Hughes.

In front of a home crowd of over 30,000, the Dolphins fell just short last week against the NZ Warriors. Defeated 16-12, their efforts were ultimately too little too late. They were trailing 16-0 by the 70th minute mark, but tries to the Hammer and Herbie Farnworth in quick succession, as well as the sin-binning of James Fisher-Harris, almost brought the win into their grasp. In the end though, it was a whopping 16 errors (to NZ's 8) that cost them, and if they want to push for finals they will need to start delivering full 80 minute performances.

With Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow whisked away to Maroons camp, it's Jake Averillo who receives the nod and the number one jersey this Thursday. Max Feagai plugs the gap that he leaves behind in the centres. A pectoral injury to Tom Gilbert promotes Connelly Lemuelu to a starting back row position, with Oryn Keeley the new face on the bench.

Canterbury-Bankstown stand as the only club remaining in the NRL who the Dolphins have never recorded a win against, with the two sides having only played each other twice in the two full seasons since 'Redcliffe's' admission.

**Who to watch:** Bulldogs forward Luke Smith has been named to make his second NRL appearance on Thursday after debuting last week. Coming off the bench, Smith played 27 minutes in his team's win against Easts. The 22 year old was the captain of Canterbury's premiership-winning 2024 Jersey Flegg side and he will be aiming to impress Cameron Ciraldo in order to hold down his spot in the top grade, even when the Dogs have access to their full contingent. Smith also has experience in the centres, and with Stephen Crichton out, could potentially play some minutes in that role on Thursday.

Jake Averillo has played the full 80 minutes in all eleven games of the Dolphins' season so far, showing great consistency. Normally playing at centre, he has been handed the keys to the fullback role this Thursday due to the absence of Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow. The 24 year old started his career at Canterbury-Bankstown, making 78 appearances for them all up before joining the Dolphins at the start of the 2024 season. Up against his old club and playing out of position, this match will certainly be a challenge for Averillo, a challenge that coach Woolf clearly thinks he's up for.

**Favourite:** The ladder-leading Bulldogs are the strong favourites to take away the two points.

**My tip:** While it's clear that Canterbury are far from flawless, it'd take quite the effort from 14th-placed Redcliffe to overpower them. Despite losing a few players to Origin duty, I can't see the Bulldogs losing this one. **Bulldogs by 14.**

# Match preview

**Friday night football heads to Parradise Park as the Parramatta Eels look to go for back-to-back wins against the Manly Sea Eagles at Commbank Stadium.**

The Eels were able to put together a near 80-minute performance last week against a struggling Newcastle Knights, ever so slightly propping themselves up the ladder with a 28-6 win at McDonald Jones Stadium.

NSW Origin players Mitch Moses (1 try, 1 try assist) and Zac Lomax (2 tries, 271 metres) secured their spots in the Blues with two scintillating performances, while the spine of the Eels actually looked threatening, albeit against a Knights side that would struggle against the Woy Woy U10's team.

The loss of Moses and Lomax to Origin duties disrupts what was an improving side under the halfbacks guidance, but the Eels have won 5 of their last 6 against Manly at Parradise Park. It will give them confidence against a Manly side that is easily flying under the radar.

Manly, led by departing club legend Daly Cherry-Evans, are sitting pretty in sixth after a very comfortable win in Townsville against the Cowboys. The 24-6 win could easily have been more, if not for two Tom Trbojevic errors at the end of long range breakaways.

It wasn't all sunshine and daisies in the far north for the Sea Eagles, with Jake Trbojevic suffering a concussion early on in the contest - seeing the captain stood down under after Wednesday's Origin opener. His brother, Tom, will be coming off a performance that accounted for just over 100 running metres, two bombed tries, six errors and a sin bin last Saturday.

While it is a depleted Eels side that Manly come up again, one can not discount Parramatta at home. It's called Parradise for a reason - Parramatta always come ready to play.

The Parramatta Eels are without Mitchell Moses and Zac Lomax as they look to help NSW win another series, with Dean Hawkins coming into the halves. A reshuffle in the backline sees Sean Russell move to the wing, with Jordan Samrani moving into the centres. Kelma Tuilagi comes back from suspension into the starting line up, with Luca Moretti heading to the bench and Toni Mataele in the reserves. Matt Doorey will also be on the bench to fill the spot left by Samrani.

Manly lose Daly Cherry-Evans to Queensland duties, while Jake Trbojevic sits out this week with his concussion. That sees Jake Arthur come in for his first game in 2025 against his former side, while a re-shuffle in the forwards has Jazz Tevaga at lock and Jake Simpin at hooker to start. Matt Lodge and Lachlan Croker both play their first games of 2025 in the top flight from the pine, with Caleb Navale dropping to the reserves.

**Who to watch:** Dylan Brown has been a big talking point in the Eels struggles so far this season, having signed his multi-million dollar deal to head to Newcastle in 2026. While Brown did show glimpses of brilliance over the first 8 weeks, it took the addition of Moses to fully showcase Brown's running ability. He will need to bring that form from the last few weeks into a must win game. Look for Brown to combine with Isaiah Longi early in a bid to shock the Manly defense.

The aforementioned Tom Trbojevic very rarely has a shocker like last week - six errors is uncharacteristic for Manly's golden boy. Normally, that would go hand in hand with a Manly loss, however they were too good last weekend. Tommy Turbo will no doubt be looking to make amends against a side he loves playing against (3 tries in the last 5 games, and a try assist in 41 minutes last time out).

**Favourite:** Manly are better backed after their return to form last week.

**My tip:** Head versus heart - the heart really would love to see Parramatta pull themselves up off the canvas to ensure that they stay off the bottom of the ladder this week. A win would see the Eels be within a game of the top eight, but it seems to be wishful thinking without the Prince of Parramatta in the halves. Manly will come out too strong on the back of their forward pack, dominate early and leave too much for Parramatta to chase. **Sea Eagles by 8.**

The Panthers and Knights renew their rivalry in Bathurst on Saturday evening, a regional clash that sees Penrith host their annual home game away from BlueBet Stadium.

Since 1998, these two sides have met 43 times, with Penrith holding a slight edge with 22 wins to Newcastle's 19, along with two draws. But recent history has been far more one-sided – the Knights have only managed two wins from their past 19 encounters with the Panthers. With both teams impacted by Origin selections, depth will be tested in what promises to be a rugged contest in the Central West.

Penrith are fresh off a bye, having drawn 30-all with the Cowboys in a 90-minute epic in Townsville the week prior. In that match, Blaize Talagi was electric, having a hand in all five of Penrith's tries. Brian To'o's strong return from injury, along with 90-minute efforts from Mitch Kenny and Isaah Yeo, kept the Panthers in the fight. However, with Origin duties, the side will be missing Dylan Edwards, Liam Martin, Brian To'o, Nathan Cleary, and Isaah Yeo, all representing New South Wales.

Coach Ivan Cleary has made sweeping changes, with just seven players backing up from last year's grand final-winning side. Brad Schneider will steer the ship at halfback, Daine Laurie slots in at fullback, and Thomas Jenkins and Casey McLean join the backline. Luke Garner shifts to the back row, with Lindsay Smith starting at lock and Matt Eisenhuth at prop. The bench sees the injection of Luke Sommerton, Preston Riki, and Jack Cole.

The Knights, meanwhile, are looking to stop a slide after suffering back-to-back losses, the latest a deflating 28-6 defeat at home to the Eels. Newcastle struggled to fire in attack, with James Schiller's late try the only joy in a match otherwise dominated by Parramatta. Kalyn Ponga's absence due to Origin, combined with injuries to Bradman Best, Jacob Saifiti, and Greg Marzhew, has left the Knights' lineup looking significantly different.

Coach Adam O'Brien has shifted young gun Fletcher Sharpe to fullback to cover Ponga, while a new halves pairing sees Tyson Gamble and Jack Cogger take over the playmaking duties. Kyle McCarthy comes in for just his second NRL match in the centres, prompting a reshuffle that moves Dylan Lucas back to the forward pack. Leo Thompson returns from a head knock and replaces Saifiti in the front row.

**Who to watch:** Blaize Talagi continues to impress in his breakout season at Penrith. With three tries in six games and an ever-growing influence in attack, he looms as a genuine threat every time he touches the ball.

Fletcher Sharpe's shift to fullback gives him the chance to show off his blistering pace and elusive footwork. With Newcastle's attack misfiring, his spark from the back will be crucial.

**Favourite:** The Panthers are clear favourites according to the latest odds.

**My tip:** Despite missing several stars, Penrith have built their dynasty on depth and resilience, and that "next man up" mentality should see them through. With the Knights struggling in attack and fielding another new halves combination, it's hard to see them breaking their current losing streak. **Panthers by 12.**

From Bondi to the Shire, footy in Gosford set to go down to the wire

The Central Coast will be the centre of the rugby league world on Saturday night as the Sydney Roosters take on the Cronulla Sharks at Industree Group Stadium.

Feeling the brunt of State of Origin and injury with six top-tier players unavailable for this weekend's match, the Sydney Roosters will be depending upon the exuberance of youth to get the job done.

Missing Angus Crichton, Connor Watson, Spencer Leniu, Robert Toia and Lindsay Collins to representative duties, along with injured prop Naufahu Whyte from the side that went down to the Bulldogs 24-20 last Friday, coach Trent Robinson will hand Benaiah Ioelu his first grade debut alongside experienced forward Nat Butcher who makes a welcome return from injury.

The Roosters hold a strong recent record against the Sharks with eight wins from the past ten meetings, while their record in matches without representative players prior to State of Origin stands at ten wins from 16 fixtures during Robinson's tenure.

Boasting a 50 per cent record from 20 matches in Gosford overall, the Roosters have won their past five matches at Industree Group Stadium this decade.

Saturday night will mark a milestone match for Victor Radley as the two-time premiership winner makes his 150th appearance in first grade for the tricolours.

Coming into the representative season without the burden of players unavailable for selection, the Cronulla Sharks will be hoping to take advantage of their depleted opponents.

Recording a memorable 31-26 victory over the Storm last Saturday at home, coach Craig Fitzgibbon will be without try-scoring winger Sam Stonestreet with Mawene Hiroti coming into the side.

Holding an above average record of four wins from six visits to Gosford, the Sharks posted an emphatic 44-12 victory over the Roosters in the only previous meeting between the two sides at the venue back in 2017.

The Sharks have won ten out of 15 matches prior to State of Origin dating back to 2013, including four out of five fixtures during Fitzgibbon's time as coach.

**Who to watch:** Returning to the scene of his first grade debut two years ago, Sandon Smith will be looking to continue an impressive year as a starting playmaker. Set to take on additional responsibility with five players unavailable on representative duty, the 22-year-old Central Coast local has scored five tries, set up a further four and averaged just under 100 running metres each week. Making the number six jersey his own after playing predominantly off the bench early on in his career, the Roosters will need a strong performance from Smith if they are to bounce back from the disappointment of last week's loss.

Making a timely return from injury with the Sharks' backline stocks taking a further blow over the weekend, Mawene Hiroti will be looking to make the most of a rare opportunity in the top grade. Scoring three tries in four appearances at left centre throughout April, the 26-year-old Maori representative has relished in his chances this season with 139 running metres on average to go with ten tackle breaks. Embodying the 'next man up' mentality that has seen the men in black, white and blue prosper under Craig Fitzgibbon, look for Hiroti to give a good account of himself as the Sharks eye back-to-back wins over the Roosters for the first time since 2017.

**Favourite:** With a squad unaffected by State of Origin, the Sharks are expected to deliver a killer blow to a Roosters side already missing a chunk of players.

**My tip:** The Sharks have impressed in recent weeks with five wins from their past six outings. If they are serious about making an impact in September, they should be too strong for their depleted opponents. **Sharks by 16.**

**A top of the table clash with minimal impact to either sides due to State of origin – perfect!**

A top of the table clash with minimal impact to either sides due to State of origin – perfect!

The Warriors will be without their form prop Mitch Barnett while the Raiders will be down back rower Hudson Young due to Origin duties.

The Warriors though will come into this game without fellow prop James Fisher-Harris, due to suspension, while Jackson Ford, Edward Kosi, Ali Leiataua and Rocco Berry are all doubtful due to injury.

The Warriors have been the much more consistent defensive unit of the 2, ranking second in defence behind the top-of-the-table Bulldogs, while the Raiders rank 12th. But when it comes to attack, the Raiders are second best while the Warriors rank down in 14th. So it becomes a battle to determine which is stronger – Raiders attack or Warriors defence.

The Raiders rank second for line breaks, Warriors are equal last. The Raiders top the NRL for most Post Contact metres, the Warriors rank a respectable sixth. The Raiders top the NRL for Tackle Breaks, by a long way. The Warriors are fourth last. Raiders are ranked second for kick return metres and offloads, the Warriors are second last in both. The Raiders have almost twice as many line break assists as the Warriors.

The Warriors though are a wonderfully disciplined side, ranking first for conceding the least number of penalties, the Raiders are second last. The Warriors are equal first for least number of Handling errors, Raiders are third last. Warriors are also equal first for least number of errors, the Raiders are a respectable 7th, but there's a sizeable gap between the two sides.

Tldr; The Raiders will make big inroads through the middle and will get downfield much more easily than the Warriors will in reply. The Raiders will throw everything at the Warriors and that will see them turn the ball over a number of times, but it will also produce a number of tries.

The Raiders need to turn that field position into points, because the Warriors will not hand the ball over cheaply or easily. The Raiders defence has struggled to keep teams quiet. Just 3 times this year have they kept their opponents to a score of less than 20. 5 of their 8 victories has seen their opponent reach 20 points. Against a side that is as disciplined and defensively strong as the Warriors, conceding 20 points will almost certainly ensure a Raiders loss.

The Warriors are without their two starting props and given their struggles with making metres already this year, this will be a big headache for them in this clash. Don't be surprised if the Warriors instead opt to run slightly wider of the ruck to try and make their metres where there will be more 1-on-1 contests. Part of the reason why their error counts is so low, and their attack so much less dominant, is their reluctance to offload and resort to second phase play, which the Raiders have struggled to contain this year.

**Who to watch:** Warriors half Luke Metcalf has been in very good form of late and thus, has taken the lead on the Dally M leaderboard. Raiders winger Savelio Tamale has been a real powerhouse on the wing, sitting second in the league for line breaks, fifth for post contact metres, fifth for tackle breaks and eleventh for most metres run. He's also racked up 4 tries in his last 5 games. Wayne Egan has been strong this year, especially out of dummy half in attack and even moreso defensively in the middle.

**Favourite:** The Warriors are the narrow favourite, on the back of their very strong recent record at home, where they've won 8 and drawn 1 of their last 12 games at Go Media Stadium, while they have won 12 of their last 17 games played in New Zealand against the Raiders.

Mate against Mate, State against State: Rugby League's greatest rivalry resumes for 2025

The greatest tradition in Rugby League is once again upon us. 34 of the best players the game has to offer lining up with the weight of an entire state on their shoulders. Only the true stars will shine on the games grandest stage, while those who falter even a tiny bit will be relentlessly criticised by armchair observers on Twitter.

New Blues coach Laurie Daley made his mark on the team by changing the captaincy - out is Jake Trbojevic, who will ultimately miss the game with a concussion, and in comes Panthers star Isaah Yeo, a man who has hosted four Provan-Summons trophies and will be hoping to do the same with an Origin shield in a few weeks time.

It wasn't the only change Daley made however. Jarome Luai has been left out of a Game 1 squad for the first time since 2020, the Blues instead shifting Mitchell Moses to five-eighth to complement Nathan Cleary. Most pundits expected Tigers star Terrell May to earn an Origin debut, but Daley opted against this, instead retaining Spencer Leniu despite a mixed start to the season and handing a debut to Bulldogs prop Max King. Daley did however stay loyal to Panthers stars Dylan Edwards and Brian To'o despite having missed considerable portions of the season to date with injury and their club sitting 13th on the ladder.

Queensland coach Billy Slater meanwhile adopted a selection policy of loyalty where he could, ultimately choosing only to leave out ageing veterans such as Dane Gagai, Felise Kaufusi and Kurt Capewell. Cameron Munster is a huge in for the Maroons, having missed all of last years series due to a groin injury, while Tom Dearden's breakout campaign as his replacement saw him called up to the bench utility role due to Ben Hunt's injury. Slater surprised many by handing rookie Roosters centre Rob Toia an Origin debut, while more experienced campaigners Beau Fermor and Trent Loiero will make their maiden appearances from the interchange bench.

The Blues return to Suncorp Stadium with a pep in their step this time, having wrapped up last year's series at The Cauldron with their 14-4 win in Game 3. But the truth is that remains an outlier. The Maroons have won 6 of the last 8 Origin's played in Brisbane, and 21 of 29 in total since the stadium was rebuilt in 2003. While New South Wales proved last year they can defy history, doing it twice is a different story all together.

There's also some history to watch out for in this one: Cleary needs just 6 points to become the second Blues player to score 100 points in Origin

**Who to watch:** So much of Origin is about who teams have in their back lines and halves, with points at a premium and edge defences always needing to be improved. But the reality is it's won in the forwards. The side that lays the better platform will more often go onto win the game and usually the series when all is said and done. And the forward packs of both sides are star studded casts.

The Maroons have a one-two punch of Pat Carrigan and Tino Fa'asuamaleaui, who between them have combined for 33 offloads and 31 tackle breaks through just 11 rounds of the NRL season. Complimenting them is the rock steady Mo Fotuika, while the Maroons will be hoping veteran Lindsay Collins can rediscover some form he's been lacking this season when he is injected off the bench alongside debutant Loiero.

New South Wales meanwhile have the best prop in Rugby League in Payne Haas - a man who needs three players to bring him down every hit up and even then can still find an offload. Next to him is a pair of dominant middles in their own right - captain Yeo, who proved last year he can be more than just a second five-eighth at Origin level, and Mitch Barnett, who is averaging 140 metres per game despite sharing a forward pack with New Zealand star James Fisher-Harris at club level. Leniu will provide 20 minutes of unadulterated chaos when he is injected into the game, and King has proven to be a workhorse forward who will happily get his hands dirty in the middle.

**Favourite:** New South Wales are the favourites in this one, and you'd be tempted to back them 13+ given 7 of the last 8 Origin clashes have had a winning margin of 10 points or more.

**My tip:** On paper, New South Wales should easily take the cake in this one. But Origin is never fought on paper. And with a Queensland crowd roaring them on, **I'm taking the Maroons by 4 in this one.**

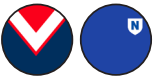

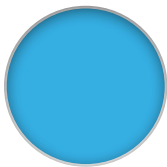
Two minutes later though, Kernick slipped out of a low tackle and then brushed off the cover defence to score a strong solo try under the sticks. Southwell converted.

After a little bit of a scuffle, the siren sounded and the Blues had a 12-6 lead at halftime.

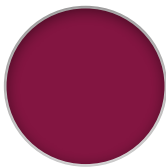
