The Wrap: NRL Round 14

Hunt's hand of god seals comeback for the ages in Newcastle

Despite being booed off McDonald Jones Stadium at half-time, the Newcastle Knights reversed a 16-0 half-time deficit to defeat Manly Warringah by 26-22 in golden point thanks to some brilliance from young winger Fletcher Hunt.

After an early set-for-set grind, Manly spreaded the ball to the left and had Newcastle shot to bits and it was Tolutau Koula who broke away down the right before kicking in field, before Lehi Hopoate toed ahead before trying to ground the ball. Hopoate spilt the ball trying to ground the ball. The Manly flyer's game would end at this point as he was concussed attempting to score.

Despite both sides losing key players to Category 1 incidents (Tyson Frizell and Hopoate). It didn't stop the Manly attack from motoring without their main man at the back. Reuben Garrick made a fool of the Newcastle left edge as he brushed away from James Schiller and he found Koula to score his ninth try of the season and a 6-0 lead after 12 minutes.

Manly's second try came from pure momentum. Following a ruck infringement by debutant Elijah Leaumoana, Manly were just playing far too laterally for the Knights' defensive systems and Corey Waddell first broke through to put Newcastle on the backfoot. Several plays later, Lachlan Croker went flat to the returning Toafofoa Sipley to charge over.

Newcastle began their implosion with a poor sequence of play. Schiller continued his horror game with an error, penalty and being placed on report before two other Knights (Jack Cogger and Leaumoana) were also placed on report for a dangerous throw.

Following a decisive bust from Koula where he continued his first half rampage, Haumole Olakau'atu made a fool of three defenders on his way to the line and make it 16-0 at the break. The Knights were held to zero yet again this season and were roundly booed off McDonald Jones Stadium at half-time.

Newcastle came out of the break a different football side, playing with shape and a purpose. A great short pass from Cogger sent Kai Pearce-Paul into a yawning gap before finding Fletcher Sharpe who beat the cover tackle of Tommy Talau to score the first try of the second half. Talau would have to go for a HIA following an incident trying to stop the try.

Manly were clocking off as the outside back injuries took their toll. Newcastle took advantage as Cogger sailed the bomb to the air. Flying through the air was rookie Fletcher Hunt who took it on the full over Clayton Faulalo to score.

The Knights continued on the rampage and continued their second half reversal. An early shift to Greg Marzheew saw him break away before finding Kalyn Ponga and then Jack Cogger who was tackled 20 away from the line. On the ensuing play, the home side shifted to the right quickly and it was a fast exchange of passes to find Schiller who redeemed his earlier sins to score in the corner. Gagai's conversion was just away to the left and it was 16-all.

Just as the Knights took momentum. A sequence of plays turned the game, a strong run from Faulalo through some lethargic Knights defence changed all momentum and set up the game-turning try. A shift to the left saw Tommy Talau come back against the grain to beat Sharpe and Brodie Jones to score.

The Knights desperately needed to find another gear to potentially force golden point. Following an explosive Dane Gagai kick return, the hosts went back to the right and it was a Pearce-Paul offload which kickstarted a raid which sent Schiller into the clear. The winger who had a rocks and diamonds night found Sharpe for his second and we were off to Golden Point.

A Ponga bomb went high into the air, the leaping Hunt batted it back into the arms of the QLD fullback to score the game winning try to claim victory out of absolutely nowhere to kickoff Round 14.

Cowboys had their chances in the first half but they were undone by some committed Storm defense and some turgid end to their sets which saw them turnover the ball close to their line.

Conversly, the Storm were efficient in their use of the footy. Some good passing again, engineered by Harry Grant sent over his spine partner Jahrome Hughes to give them a 12 point lead.

The visitors did get themselves on the board in the first half. It started from a late six-again call then Tom Dearden unfurled a lovely cut-out pass for Jaxon Paulo to dive over in the corner.

That buoyed the Cowboys to further cut into the deficit. There were chances for Scott Drinkwater and Dearden but again, the Storm defense came up trumps again to hold their lead.

Drinkwater had a late error which saw the Storm capitalis again. The ball refused to die as the clock wound down, it was sent back inside and Hughes was in the right spot to collect a first half double.

Storm picked up where they left off in the second half. They get a result from a kick again then Hughes punches one through for Nick Meaney to pounce on a grubber for 24-4.

Cowboys kept themselves in the game with back-to-back scores. Drinkwater supported well to score then some hands from a high kick saw Robert Derby go over in the right corner.

They couldn't get out of their own way though. Paulo threw one away which led to Nelson Asofa-Solomona crash over from close range and extinguish the comeback from the visitors.

Melbourne finished the game in style. The bomb was a helpful weapon all night especially when the ball bounces, comes back to the hosts and Tyran Wishart is there to pounce for 32-14.

The Dolphins came into their clash with St George as warm favourites, but following back-to-back penalties in the opening minutes saw Valentine Holmes kick a penalty goal to give his side an early 2-0 lead.

Redcliffe managed to hit back through blockbusting centre Herbie Farnworth, who used his speed to crash over for a try in the corner for the first try of the night.

The Dolphins then took momentum when some quick hands from the Dolphins backline and a brilliant finish from Jamayne Isaako saw a second try for the home side in just five minutes.

The home side continued to dominate the match when they raced in two further tries to Kodi Nikorima who shimmied his way through the Dragons defence to score under the posts and Connelly Lemuelu who leapt high over Clint Gutherson to score a great try and give his side a commanding 22-2 lead.

Then nearing halftime, it was winger Jack Bostock who flew high to collect a Kodi Nikorima kick to score a spectacular try and give Redcliffe a dominant 28-2 lead at halftime.

The Dolphins continued where they left off after the break and Lemuelu had his second try after collecting a great offload from Katoa.

The Dolphins continued to put the foot down, with Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow getting in on the act, which was follow up by a second try to Jamayne Isaako.

Kodi Nikorima then put Jack Bostock away down the wing, which saw Tabuai-Fidow loom up in support to get his second and take the Dolphins to 50 points for the first time in their history.

St George-Illawarra then finally got their first try through Valentine Holmes for a late consolation try which failed to create a cheer from the away supporter bay given the dire scoreline.

The Dolphins then put an exclamation mark on the win, when Herbie Farnworth finished off the game in style racing away to score his second try of the night to celebrate a huge night for the club.

Speaking of Walsh, he made an instant impact in his return from injury, firing a missile to Gehamat Shibasaki for the opening try on the very first set of the game.

A powering Kotoni Staggs run put Brisbane deep in Gold Coast territory on that set, and it was a sign of what was to come from the Broncos centre, who had 126 metres and seven tackle busts in the first half alone.

The Broncos extended their lead in the 11th minute as Patrick Carrigan popped a late offload for Corey Jensen and they quickly made it three tries soon after as Staggs soared onto a Reynolds bomb.

The floodgates had well and truly opened by that point as Ezra Mam put Brendan Piakura through a hole, with Shibasaki trailing in support for his second and the Broncos almost went over again on the ensuing set after points, only for Jordan Riki to spill the ball in a tackle as he closed in on the try line.

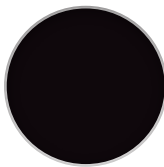
But it didn't take long for Brisbane to push the halftime lead out to 28-0 as another monster carry from Staggs off a quick tap ended with Josiah Karapani scoring in his first NRL game this year.

It was all the Broncos in the first half and while the home side had plenty of chances to push ahead early in the second, ill-discipline and cheap turnovers saw the Titans get onto the board first through Alofiana Khan-Pereira.

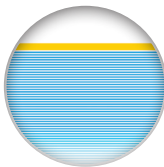

Returning serve with an intercept of their own minutes later, Eels' winger Zac Lomax snatched a pass close to his goal line before finding Mitchell Moses (11th minute), who supported with an 80 metre run down the touchline.

The Bulldogs regained the lead midway through the half when a cut-out pass from Burton gave Bronson Xerri the space needed to send Marcelo Montoya (20th minute) over for fifth try of the year.

Viliame Kikau was sent to the sin bin for making contact with Moses while kicking late in the half; the Eels needed less than a minute to capitalise of their one-man advantage with Junior Paulo popping an offload for Dylan Walker (36th minute) to send both sides to the sheds level at 12-all.

Regaining the lead with a Stephen Crichton penalty goal shortly after the resumption of play, the Bulldogs injected Galvin into the game in the 57th minute in a reshuffle that saw Reed Mahoney replaced and Toby Sexton shifted to hooker.

The reshuffle paid dividends straight away for the Bulldogs as Connor Tracey marked his 100th first grade appearance in style with an offload to send Kikau (60th minute) over for by a converted try lead.

Having been selected to make his State of Origin debut earlier in the day, Kurt Mann justified his selection with an incisive break which saw Harry Hayes (68th minute) charge over to seal the win.

With the result in hand and the clock winding down, the Bulldogs' faithful erupted when Galvin (73rd minute) found himself in the right spot to finish off a passage of passes for a try on his club debut.

Next week, the Bulldogs will face the Rabbitohs on Sunday afternoon at Accor Stadium, while the Eels will have their second bye of the season.

Toby Rudolf is an addition to the reserves with a potential return from injury on the cards.

Embarrassing is the only word to describe the St George Illawarra Dragons performance last week as all the good work of previous weeks was undone following their 56-6 loss to the Dolphins at Suncorp Stadium. The Dragons have struggled at times throughout the year but last weeks effort was their worst of the season.

The ladder position of the Red 'V' is probably flattered by the fact they've had two byes as they sit in eleventh although with the same number of wins as the Panthers, Tigers and Knights who have as many wins. The performance last week was that of a bottom placed side with no real positives of note with the Dolphins dominating almost every stat.

The task of bouncing back from such a heavy loss isn't made any easier for Dragons coach Shane Flanagan with star centre Valentine Holmes as expected called up for Origin duty whilst losing Christian Tuipulotu and Raymond Faitala-Mariner through injury and health concerns. Tyrell Sloan and Corey Allan come into the team for Tuipulotu and Holmes whilst Emre Guler comes back into the starting side after being reserve last week and Blake Lawrie switching to that role.

Who to watch: It's always easy to pick one of the halves but for the Sharks Nicho Hynes comes into big focus. Hynes has always been a player with a big focus but it's easy to say these days that he hasn't delivered and last week was a good example of that. The kicking game from Hynes has been off the mark for a while and the options that he takes are poor such as the intercept pass he threw last week. The Sharks need Hynes to find form because if he doesn't, then it can be a slippery slope for Cronulla.

Clint Gutherson left Parramatta for the Dragons as part of a rebuild at the Red 'V' and Gutho was meant to be the spark at the back that they needed amongst their high profile recruits. The Spark that Gutho has brought has been a mere flash at rare times this season as his impact on the side has been a lot less than expected. A strong fullback, Gutho hasn't had the dynamic season he has had in the pass at Parramatta and only running over 200m twice this season has been a downfall for the Red 'V'. The Dragons will need a big performance from Gutherson to win against Cronulla.

Favourite: Cronulla are favourites

My tip: The Sharks have been poor the past two weeks, but their side should be too strong for the Dragons. There just doesn't seem to be a next level for the Red 'V' especially after last week and Cronulla will try to prove something and in respect a game against a bottom 8 side has been their bread and butter. This is the sort of game where they'll lure most into thinking how good they are with a big win. **Sharks by 16.**

Both sides look for resolve for the run home

The Gold Coast Titans are looking for consistency on both sides of the ball when they take on a Manly Sea Eagles side that has completed its soul searching after last week’s 16-0 collapse against Newcastle.

It’s been a rough year for the Titans, losing star fullback Keano Kini early due to a neck injury, while rugby convert Carter Gordon has yet to see the field due to a similar issue. Despite that, they have criminally underperformed this season, with disappointing results aplenty, including a 30-point derby loss to the Broncos. Des Hasler is fighting tooth and nail to save his job and needs to see his side turn it around.

To beat Manly, they need to go back to basics and refine their game. Given their current predicament, it’s not unfair to say that they are overtrying in search of results. If they go back to playing grinding football and then spreading the ball when they’ve earned the right through the middle third, they are a dangerous side. But, a point of discontent has been their bench usage, while they have forwards on the field that can play big minutes, Hasler hasn’t trusted his young brigade of forwards nearly as much as he should have.

It doesn’t get any easier with Hasler missing his two big forwards up front, with Mo Fotuika and Tino Fa’asuamaleaui missing on Origin duty, Klese Haas starts at lock and Iszac Fa’asuamaleaui joins the bench. They did get a solid from QLD coach Billy Slater, who dropped Beau Fermor from the Maroons squad and will take his place in the back row. Elsewhere, there is an NRL debut for Josh Patston while Tuki Simpkins makes his club debut on the bench. Sam Verills has been named in the reserves and could return from a hand injury.

For Manly, it’s been a season full of disappointment so far despite their ladder position. There is too much talent for this team to be as inconsistent as they have been throughout the season and that showed during the collapse to the Newcastle Knights on Thursday night. Yes, the loss of Tom Trbojevic has been significant, even when he came back he was looking less than 75%. His return this week will be major in a number of ways.

For this clash with the Titans, they just have to frustrate them into submission. Force errors and build consistent pressure. That will earn them the right to throw the football around and play with ruthless attacking flare that saw them dismantle the Broncos a fortnight ago at Brookvale Oval. They shouldn’t have to worry about impact off the bench given the aforementioned Hasler policy of refusing to play two guys for beyond 25 minutes...

Onto team news, as mentioned Tommy Turbo is back at fullback following the concussion suffered by Lehi Hopoate last Thursday. Elsewhere, the controversial dropping of QLD captain Daly Cherry-Evans sees him take his place at halfback. Jason Saab (illness) is also set to return. In the pack, the return of Siosia Taukeiaho (calf) sees Jazz Tévaga revert to the bench and Toafofoa Sipley move to 18th man.

Who to watch: It would be almost like nullifying the article if we didn’t highlight Tom Trbojevic and his return from another leg injury. It felt like on his return that he wasn’t out in stride like we are used to seeing. Hopefully the time off did him some wonders and he comes back with vengeance against the Titans, just like he did in Round 6, 2021 where on return he ran riot against the Titans.

For the Titans, pressure is building on Jayden Campbell. Yes he has been shifted around from six to fullback on several occasions but he is yet to find his consistency this season so far. He has had his brilliant moments but then there’s been times where he has gone missing throughout the season. Look for Campbell to play a vital role in picking the Titans up off the canvas against Manly.

Favourite: Manly are favourites with the bookies in this fixture.

My tip: Manly will be too strong in this one. The Titans have been a real disappointment this season and the decision to fire Justin Holbrook is one that will be written about as one of the worst coach firings in NRL history if their fortunes do not change. DCE in particular will be out for a big one after his dropping from the QLD side so expect points a plenty. **Manly by 18.**

Time to make a mid-year move

The Newcastle Knights will be looking to post back-to-back wins for the first time since the opening fortnight of the season when they host the Sydney Roosters on Saturday evening.

Riding high after a stirring come-from-behind victory last Thursday, the Newcastle Knights will be aiming to build on that performance and repay the faith shown by their passionate home supporters.

Overcoming a 16-0 halftime deficit to record a 26-22 victory over the Sea Eagles in golden point, coach Adam O'Brien has named maligned playmaker Jackson Hastings for the first time in 2025, while Phoenix Crossland will shift to lock in a move that allows Matt Arthur to join the bench.

Set to be without Kalyn Ponga after the golden point hero was selected for Queensland, the Knights have underperformed without their representative stars historically with three wins from 12 pre-Origin fixtures over the past decade.

Holding a poor record against the Roosters with one win from seven meetings during O'Brien's tenure, the Knights last win over the tricolours on home soil occurred back in 2019.

Travelling to the Hunter rejuvenated following a bye over the King's Birthday long weekend, the Sydney Roosters will be aiming to continue an emphatic record over the Novocastrians.

Winning 16 out of 19 matches against the Knights during Trent Robinson's tenure as coach, including eight of ten contested in Newcastle, the Roosters have scored more than twice as many points during that period (549-250).

Lining up without five State of Origin representatives for the second time this season, the Roosters have named Sam Walker for the first time since tearing his ACL on the eve of the finals last year, while Dominic Young has been named for what is likely to be his final appearance for the club before rejoining Newcastle.

The Roosters have won eight of their past 13 matches without Origin players, including a narrow 18-16 win over the Knights at McDonald Jones Stadium two years ago.

Winning five matches apiece yet sitting in 15th and 10th on the ladder due to points differential and an additional bye for the Roosters, the two sides will be treating Saturday night as a must-win in order to stay in touch with the top eight.

Who to watch: Showcasing passing skills last week that have rarely been sighted during his time in the NRL, Kai Pearce-Paul will be looking to make the most of his attacking abilities as his time at the Knights draws to a close. Announcing a move to the Wests Tigers in the aftermath of last week's come-from-behind victory at home, the 24-year-old English international showed signs of the talent that led him to make the move down under. Remaining solid in defence with 41 tackles on average each week, look for the Knights to lean into Pearce-Paul's attacking abilities over the second half of the season.

When Billy Smith plays his eighth game of the season on Saturday evening, it will be only the second time the injury-plagued centre has achieved the feat in his career. Touted as the long-term replacement for Latrell Mitchell while still a teenager, the 25-year-old has begun to realise that potential with 100 running metres on average this season. Marking up against Dane Gagai, one of the most experienced outside backs in the league, Smith will need to be at his best to shut down one of the Knights' key attacking threats.

Favourite: Having shown how potent they can be without their representative stars already this season, the Roosters are favoured to get the job done in Newcastle.

My tip: For as underwhelming as the Knights have been for much of 2025 to date, the resolve shown to win last week may be the catalyst needed for a much-improved second half of the year. **Knights by 4.**

Cowboys and Dolphins fight for the right to be lead Queenslander

The Cowboys and Dolphins are gearing up to do battle in a sub-XXXX Derby that is heavily impacted by State of Origin selections, and one where the two Queensland sides currently highest on the table have a chance to cement their status as the states premier club.

The Cowboys have been forced to name a squad devoid of stars Jeremiah Nanai, Reece Robson, Reuben Cotter and Tom Dearden, while John Bateman and Viliani Vailea are also unavailable after picking up a pair of one match bans during their 38-14 loss to Melbourne last week.

In better news star forward Jason Taumalolo and Origin winger Murray Taulagi have both been named to make their return from a pair of calf injuries. Braidon Burns has been called into the centres, Jake Clifford replaces Dearden at halfback, and 19 year old prop Kaiden Lahrs - the son of ex-Origin prop Tom Learoyd-Lahrs - has been named to make his NRL debut from the bench.

The Dolphins by contrast have only lost one player to Origin duty in star fullback Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow, but they were bitten by a cruel injury bug last week. Standout utility Max Plath has suffered what the team will only label a serious knee injury, while Daniel Saifiti's season is over after his rehabilitation for a shoulder injury failed, as is Tom Gilbert's after surgery on a torn pectoral also revealed he required additional shoulder surgery.

Jake Averillo has been moved to fullback to replace Tabuai-Fidow with Max Feagai coming into the centres, while Ray Stone is the new face on the bench to replace Plath.

Despite being the best of the four Queensland clubs for three of the past four seasons, the Cowboys recent form in XXXX Derby's has left a bit to be desired. The team from Townsville has won just four of their past 12 showdowns with their interstate rivals - including a 26-16 loss to the Broncos back in Round 3. They'll have to reverse that form agains a red hot Dolphins side with the best momentum in the NRL, having scored 100 points across their last two matches thanks to big wins over the Bulldogs and Dragons.

Who to watch: Scott Drinkwater has been handed the captaincy of the Cowboys for this match, and how they go in the game will be dictated heavily by his performance. He's been in top form the last two weeks with back to back 200 metre performances against the Tigers and Storm, scoring in both and picking up a try assist against Wests. Entering this week in a tie for third among the league in try assists, Drinkwater will be aiming to dominate the Dolphins and get the Cowboys over the edge.

While the loss of Tabuai-Fidow is something the Dolphins need to cover, the form of Isaiya Katoa helps make up for it. The Tongan international is one of the best halfbacks in the NRL this season, with 5 tries, 12 try assists, 8 forced dropouts, almost 450 metres worth of kicking every game and a strong tackle efficiency of 89%. Three of those try assists have come in the last two weeks, and Katoa will look to continue knocking on the door of an invite to New South Wales camp heading into Game 3.

Favourite: The Dolphins are the favourites in this one, priced in at \$1.52 on Sportsbet.

My tip: While the Cowboys have done extremely well this season with Clifford at halfback, the hit their depth has taken before this game is likely too much to overcome. **Dolphins by double digits.**

Match preview

A shortened round concludes with an assault on Accor Stadium as the South Sydney Rabbitohs look to topple the competition leaders in the Canterbury Bulldogs on Sunday afternoon.

Coming off the back of 60,000 people at Accor Stadium on the King's Birthday, the pinnacle of rugby league lights up once again as an Origin affected Canterbury attempt to win back-to-back games against South Sydney for the first time since 2015-16.

South Sydney were blown out by the high flying Canberra Raiders in the nation's capital last Sunday - Josh Papalii scoring a double as he became the most capped Raider ever in a 36-12 demolition job of the Bunnies. It wasn't as if the Rabbitohs weren't competitive, considering that they led 12-0 after as many minutes. It just so happened that the defensive woes of the Rabbitohs were yet again on full display in the second half as the Raiders ran in 30 unanswered second-half points.

The loss of Campbell Graham prior to kick off and Cody Walker to a groin injury certainly haven't helped an already injury-ravaged Rabbitohs, who now lose Latrell Mitchell to Origin. The addition of Tyrone Munro helps alleviate a brutally hit backline who will need to perform against the form team of the NRL in 2025.

It took the Bulldogs 60 minutes to get rolling against a very buoyant Parramatta Eels, but the boys from Belmore ended up slicing the Eels in half as they ran to a 30-12 win on Monday. While the hype was fully surrounding the debut of Lachlan Galvin, it was the explosiveness of Matt Burton who took out the Eels - so much so that he has earned a berth as 18th man for the Blues in Perth on Wednesday.

Lachlan Galvin will have to fill in the shoes of Burton this weekend, as a couple of big ole' Bulldogs step up to try and keep Belmore bustling at the top of the ladder at the halfway point of the season.

The Bulldogs lose the Origin bite that rocked up against Parramatta, with Kurt Mann, Max King, Matt Burton and Stephen Crichton all out of the line-up. Blake Wilson comes in for Crichton, with Jacob Kiraz shifting to centre. Jacob Preston returns from suspension in the second row, while Jake Turpin and Kurtis Morrin joins the bench. Lachlan Galvin will lineup at five-eighth, with Toby Sexton having one more game to prove his worth in the Dogs line up.

South Sydney lose Latrell Mitchell (Origin) and Cody Walker (Groin) from last week, with Jye Gray and Jamie Humphreys sliding straight into the starting line-up. Tyrone Munro has been named to return from a broken collarbone, with Campbell Graham in the reserves as he looks to recover from the back spasms that held him out of last week's loss to the Raiders.

Who to watch: Jacob Kiraz makes another appearance here as he lines up against one of the weaker defensive units in the competition. On his return from injury, the Origin bolter from two months ago ran for over 210 metres, broke six tackles and offloaded seven times. South Sydney have conceded 25 points in seven of their twelve games so far, including the preceding 32-0 loss against the Dogs in Round 7... Kiraz running for 229 metres, breaking five tackles and setting up a try.

Keon Koloamatangi should consider himself insanely unlucky that he isn't pulling on a NSW Blues jersey on Wednesday, much to the joy of all Supercoach players and Rabbitohs fans. The bustling forward has been in career best form over the last month, averaging 230 running metres, 43 tackles and four tackle busts to single-handedly drag his side up the field. Whilst named at second row this week, Koloamatangi will no doubt look to involve himself in the guts throughout the game as he heaps the pressure early against a strong Bulldogs forward pack.

Favourite: Canterbury are firmly favoured by the bookies in this one.

My tip: The Bulldogs, whilst considered the away team, are very accustomed to being victorious at Accor in 2025. They've won four from five, the only loss being a wet weather loss against the Dolphins. A win here will see the Bulldogs on top of the ladder until at least round 17, whilst the Bunnies need a win to kick off a dreadful run of games coming up (Storm, Dolphins, Sea Eagles, BYE, Panthers, Sharks, Broncos). Origin stars aside, the Bulldogs could easily drop a cricket score here if the Rabbitohs don't fire up early. I hope that Scott Bailey has his X account ready... we could see 50. **Bulldogs by 30.**

The NSW Blues will be looking to keep the State of Origin shield down south next Wednesday night when they face a desperate Queensland Maroons side in Perth.

For the Blues, it represents a chance for them to win back-to-back series for the first time since 2018-19 and all pressure is on the Queenslanders, especially after coach Billy Slater made the massive call to axe captain and halfback Daly Cherry-Evans.

In these sort of must-win situations, coaches will often lean into their experience but instead Slater has opted to elevate Tom Dearden from the bench into the starting side while his halves partner Cameron Munster takes on the captaincy.

That is just the start of the changes for the Maroons though, with Kurt Capewell and Trent Loiero starting in the second row and at lock respectively while Kurt Mann is the fresh face off the bench.

Patrick Carrigan, meanwhile, drops back to the bench.

As for the Blues, Laurie Daley initially made just the one forced change with Stefano Utoikamanu onto the bench for the injured Mitch Barnett.

But in an additional blow they later lost Mitchell Moses mid-week to a calf injury, seeing Jarome Luai recalled to the fold to partner former Panthers teammate Nathan Cleary.

The Blues won the series opener 18-6 in Brisbane after a dominant display from their forward pack, with five players running for 90 metres or more compared to just two for the Maroons.

New South Wales' wingers were also heavily involved when it came to giving Moses and Cleary a strong platform to play off, with Brian To'o and Zac Lomax combining for 381 metres.

Lomax, of course, was also an aerial threat to counteract the distinct advantage Queensland had targeting To'o and was unlucky not to win man of the match honours, with Payne Haas instead deemed best on the ground.

For the Blues, they can take confidence out of the fact both Moses and Cleary had off nights on the boot.

Obviously Cleary was particularly poor from a goal-kicking standpoint, but their general kicking game was supposed to be one of their greatest strengths and the fact the Blues won so decidedly without having to rely on either dominant playmaker was impressive.

Of course, Cleary still had an impact with the ball in hand, playing a part in all four of NSW's tries and the Blues will take comfort in knowing even without Moses, they can lean on an experienced halves pairing like Cleary and Luai.

The same can't be true for the Maroons given the amount of changes they have made, starting with the fact Dearden and Munster are a complete contrast to Cleary and Moses.

Neither are dominant long-range kicking options in club land, although Dearden has developed that side of his game since Chad Townsend's departure.

In terms of numbers to know for game two, Queensland has a horror record at Perth, albeit in a small sample size, having lost both games by a combined score of 82-18.

Meanwhile, the Blues have won the opening Origin game 20 times and went on to wrap up the series with a victory in game two just over half of the time (11).

Who to watch: The decision to move Patrick Carrigan back to the bench is an interesting one from coach Slater. He has already copped criticism for persisting with Cotter in the second row and promoting Capewell along with Loiero seems to indicate Slater is looking to get maximum impact from his bench. After all, those three players are all high-workrate toilers who will churn through the metres and tackles but don't pose the same ball-playing threat as Carrigan. Maybe the plan is to inject Carrigan into the game later so that his more varied skillset can be better used against tiring defenders. It could turn out to be a genius plan from Slater or, if the Blues are already well ahead at that point, he could come under further scrutiny for not using his best players from the opening minute.

As for the Blues, it will be interesting to see how Stefano Utoikamanu performs given at one point it looked like his Origin career may have already ended with just one forgettable stint bench. But a move to Melbourne has brought the best out of the former Tiger and he has been rewarded with a recall by a new coach in Daley. Brad Fittler famously played Utoikamanu for just 12 minutes in his Origin debut only to then dump him, with the Storm prop saying at the time he was told he was being "rested". Now, Utoikamanu has the chance to make up for lost time and prove why he deserves much more of a look-in for the Blues.

Favourite: The Blues were well-backed to wrap up the series in Perth, but Moses' omission has tightened the odds.

My tip: Losing Moses is a big blow, but the fact the Blues can rely on a tried and tested halves pairing like Luai and Cleary is a luxury. **NSW by 8.**

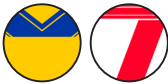
