Touchdown Vegas: Wigan and Warrington renew old rivalries

Super League heads to the shores of America's west coast and to the party capital of the world for the first time in history. Defending premiers Wigan will do battle with Warrington to kickstart a quadruple header in rugby league's push into the American market.

Wigan conquered everything in the game in the Northern Hemisphere, winning the quadruple for the first time in the Super League era. The Warriors won the World Club Challenge, Challenge Cup, League Leaders Shield (Minor Premiership) and the Grand Final last year. So far to start this season, they have had a mixed start. They played in the famous 1-0 defeat against Leigh but bounced back brilliantly to defeat Hull FC last week to prepare for Vegas in style.

For those that aren't as familiar with the Super League, Jai Field has showcased the potential he showed flashes of in the NRL before he moved abroad. Coming off a hatrick last time out, Field has averaged 170 metres a game from the back and is a danger every time he carries the ball.

Junior Nsemba replaced Kai Pearce-Paul in style last year. In a break-out 2024, Nsemba averaged over 110 metres a game, had 4.5 tackle-breaks per game and caused havoc on the left edge this season. As a result, Nsemba made the Super League Dream Team (Team of the Season), and Super League Rookie of the Year on top of putting pen to paper on a mega contract extension. The deal set to keep the backrower at Wigan until the end of the 2030 season.

Bevan French too had a world class 2024 scoring 22 tries in just 24 games including some spectacular individual efforts, consistently making life for the opposition a nightmare. It culminated in French winning the Harry Sutherland Trophy in the Challenge Cup final as well as Man of the Match in the regular season finale.

Onto Warrington, the Wolves had a strong first year with former Souths enforcer Sam Burgess taking the reigns. Burgess and the Wolves have had to overcome drama around the approval of his visa to enter the USA after his well-documented legal issues in Australia in recent years, but late on Wednesday local time, he was cleared to join his players.

Despite the off-field dramas surrounding the trip to Vegas. The Wolves were two points shy of the Grand Final last year, narrowly going down to Hull KR in the penultimate game of the season. So far this season, they have started undefeated but have been slightly unconvincing across their first two outings downing both Huddersfield and Catalans to begin the year.

Matt Dufty proved himself as one of the most electric fullbacks in the game, consistently featuring in the Wire's attack throughout the season. Paul Vaughan has shown his ability as one of the club's enforcers, consistently attracting several defenders into contact. George Williams has been described by his coach as "as scratchy as I've seen him" by his coach over the first two weeks of the season and will be looking to shine brightest in the Sin City.

Who to watch: Looking at Wigan, it's hard to ignore half Harry Smith. In the aftermath of last season's historic achievements. Those across the pond were making some wild claims about their English half. Wigan CEO Kris Radlinski said that he would prefer to have Smith in his side as opposed to Penrith ace Nathan Cleary. Smith had 15 try-assists and 24 line break assists last season and the 24-year-old is currently signed until the end of the 2027 season.

For Warrington, the focus is on hooker Danny Walker. Walker has had a strong start to 2025 after bursting on the scene last year. He has already entered the sights of NRL clubs with the Raiders keen to bring him down under this season, but the move was scuppered at the last moment. Walker has a great running game from dummy half and is tactically one of the best kickers from the 9 position, already kicking a 20/40 on-top of several game changing kicks last season. Watch for him to press his claims for the NRL in 2026 and beyond.

Favourite: As reigning champs and big winners last week, Wigan are better backed to win this contest.

MY TIP: Wigan's suffocating defence should be enough to claim victory in this clash. Wigan have only conceded one try so far this season and have only conceded one try in six games, a defensive record that would make Penrith fans envious. If the Wolves can unsettle Wigan with their aggressive attack early in the piece then this one will be a tight one, but we just see Wigan having too much class across both sides of the ball. **Wigan by 6**

Rugby league comes back to Las Vegas.

The NRL's mission to spread the rugby league gospel abroad is back for another year with the Canberra Raiders and New Zealand Warriors facing off in Las Vegas to open the 2025 season.

Kicking off year two of the NRL's five-year project to gain a footing in the US, the Saturday afternoon local time clash – Sunday morning for viewers in the southern hemisphere – will see two sides that failed to play finals football last year look to make amends with an opening round win.

Defying expectations to narrowly fall short of the finals on points differential last season, the Canberra Raiders will have their sights set on laying the foundations for the year to come with a style of football based around high completion rates and playing for field position.

Claiming seven wins from 11 opening round matches during Ricky Stuart's tenure as coach, including first up wins in five of the past six years, the Raiders demonstrated positive signs during the pre-season with an inexperienced side defeating the Panthers (22-16) before going down to the Sharks (10-40) at home.

The Raiders have named 15 players who featured in first grade last year in their squad; highly-rated hooker Owen Pattie will make his NRL debut off the bench, while outside back Savelio Tamale will make his first appearance in green after joining from St George Illawarra over the off-season.

Coming into the new campaign with a changing of the guard following several high-profile departures, the New Zealand Warriors will be banking on strong crowd support despite playing nearly 11,000 kilometres from home.

Boasting a solid record of five opening round wins over the last eight seasons, the Warriors were among the better performing teams during the pre-season with a draw against the Sharks (12-12) followed by a flamboyant attacking display over the Storm (36-10).

Kiwi test captain James Fisher-Harris and returning utility forward Erin Clark headline the new faces in coach Andrew Webster's squad, while emerging forwards Demitric Vaimauga and Leka Halasima have won spots on the bench.

Canberra and New Zealand have met once before in the opening round with the Raiders claiming a 24-8 victory in Auckland back in 2001.

The Raiders have won 10 out of 22 matches against the Warriors under Ricky Stuart; the Warriors, in contrast, have claimed three wins from four matches against the Raiders during Andrew Webster's two seasons at the helm.

Who to watch: Starting a season in the number one jersey for the first time in his career, Kaeo Weekes will be looking to light up Allegiant Stadium with his dazzling speed and footwork. Beginning his time at the Raiders in the halves before shifting to fullback with great success, the 23-year-old former Sea Eagles utility created plenty of havoc in 17 appearances last season with eight tries, five try assists and 120 running metres on average. Showing no signs of slowing down after a sensational kick return to set up a try during the trials, expect Weekes to have a major impact on the scoreboard as the Raiders look to hit the Las Vegas jackpot with two premiership points.

After mixed results in his return to rugby league as a centre last year, Roger Tuivasa-Sheck will be aiming for better things as he winds back the clock to play on the wing. Scoring five tries in 18 appearances across the backline in 2024, the 31-year-old New Zealand dual international remains one of the most influential figures at the Warriors given his standing as the only player to win the prestigious Dally M medal in the club's history. Scoring tries in his past three appearances against the Raiders, including four pointers in both matches last season, look for the man known as RTS to make a point of getting his name on the score sheet.

FAVOURITE: The Warriors have been backed to translate their pre-season successes into two premiership points.

MY TIP: The Raiders have built a reputation out of proving their naysayers wrong and they'll relish the opportunity to do it once again on the world stage. **Raiders by 8.**

Meeting for the first time since 2017, history is set to be made as the Australian Jillaroos are set to take on the English Lionesses as Women's Rugby League heads to Vegas for the first time as part of the Rugby League spectacular.

The two sides surprisingly don't have a big history of contests which makes this contest even more historic and vital as in the few contests there have been, Australia holds a strong record winning all three contests between Australia and England.

A rocky off-season has seen change at the top of the Australian women's side with the clash in Vegas set to be the first under the control of Jess Skinner after former coach Brad Donald resigned following intense pressure which included the non-selection of Dally M winner Olivia Kernick for the Pacific Championship squad and then reported off-field incidents. The lead-up was also difficult for the Jillaroos with a training camp on the Gold Coast cancelled suddenly with the coaching dramas.

Coming into the contest, the Jillaroos have been in good form winning all three of their Pacific Championship games at the end of last year with an 84-0 win over Papua New Guinea before 14-0 and 24-4 wins over New Zealand in Christchurch and Parramatta respectively. The timing of the game will be interesting regarding the form of the Jillaroos

The big change for the Jillaroos team is that Olivia Kernick has come straight into the second row following her controversial and shock omission from the Jillaroos squad for the Pacific Championships.

Men's International: France 34 Morocco 10

France have claimed victory in the first men's international of 2025, with a comfortable 34-10 win over Morocco in Avignon.

France, with former Toulouse star and ex-NRL Cowboy Zac Santo at fullback, led 16-4 at the break, before going on with the job after halftime.

It was Morocco's first international since the 2019 Middle-East Africa Championship, and their first clash against France since a 46-6 loss in the 2004 Mediterranean Cup.

This week in addition to the Australia-England Women's International, three other internationals (2 mens, 1 womens) will be staged between the USA and Greece in Las Vegas.

The clash against the Jillaroos is set to be the biggest test for England since their clash with New Zealand in the 2022 World Cup which was also the last time that the Lionesses had actually conceded any points. The Lionesses have had a solid period of Rugby League and the experience of players having played in the NRLW is set to boost their game.

England have had four matches since their defeat to New Zealand at the 2022 World Cup coming up against both France and Wales twice in those four matches. One of the players with NRLW experience for the Lionesses, Georgia Roche who has been a part of the successful Knights program over the past two seasons. The game will be controlled in the halves and Georgia Roache will have the cool hand as she has shown with the Knights to lead her side.

FAVOURITE: Australia are strongly backed for victory in this test.

MY TIP: It's hard to go past the Jillaroos here, the contest will be tough no doubt but there is still a strong gap in quality between Australia and England going forward and even though England are in strong form, the level of opponents isn't quite as strong as Australia. Sin City plays host to a Preliminary Final rematch that is bound to be a showstopper.

Coming off the back of their fourth premiership in a row, you would think the Panthers are a force to be reckoned with; they might be, but they weren't during their first and only pre-season outing against the Raiders (their latest match featured none of the Penrith first-grade team), losing 16-22.

Having played only one game compared to Cronulla's two, Penrith are looking quite unpredictable. This is due to several factors: player departures, surgeries and a relatively new team as a whole. There seems to be a lot of uncertainty surrounding injured players or those recovering from surgery. Ivan Cleary said it himself, "the slightest setback" could dash the players hopes of playing in Vegas. It will be interesting to see what this new era of Penrith looks like and whether they possess the same prowess of their previous premiership-winning teams.

After a slow start, the Sharks dominated their second pre-season outing, thrashing the Raiders by 30 points. If that performance is anything to go by – which it is, as the exact same 1-17 has been named for Vegas – the Sharks could give the Panthers a run for their money. That said, the first 15-20 minutes were troubling for Cronulla, with all of the Raiders' points being scored in that period. In order to outplay the Panthers, the Sharks need to be cohesive and disciplined from the get-go. It is evident they have it in them, but they must remind themselves that this is a new season and new Penrith side, so anything is possible.

The superstars are back for the Panthers, with Nathan Cleary, Liam Martin and Dylan Edwards named in the starting squad. However, Brian To'o will miss the match due to a hamstring injury. Paul Alamoti, after recovering from an elbow injury, will play on the wing instead of in the centres, while Lindsay Smith steps in at prop following James Fisher-Harris' departure.

There are a few changes about at the Sharks, Samuel Stonestreet replaces Sione Katoa on the wing with the latter nursing a shoulder injury and Jesse Ramien is back after missing the last NRL game in 2024, pushing Siosifa Talakai to the bench. Meanwhile, Toby Rudolf didn't board the flight to Vegas as he continues to recover from shoulder surgery. Instead, new recruit Addin Fonua-Blake takes his place.

Who to watch: The Panthers are once again calling on Jack Cole to play at five-eighth in a northern hemisphere match. With only ten NRL games under his belt, Cole is still relatively inexperienced but has shown he is ready for any challenge. He has big shoes to fill following Luai's departure and needs to prove he is worthy of the number 6 jersey – especially now with Blaize Talagi in the squad. It will be interesting to see what type of game Cole plays, whether it will be similar to Luai or if he lets Cleary take more of a lead to start the season.

I think that Samuel Stonestreet is poised for a big season. Despite having played only five NRL games, he has already scored eight tries, proving to be a serious attacking threat. Especially considering Hynes likes linking up with him, twice in the 40-10 win did Hynes throw a floater all the way over to the wing, one eventuated into a try. In the match, he made the most run meters – 15 runs for 154 meters – 43 meters more than Mulitalo. While he is filling in for Katoa for the time being, I believe that if he shows how much of an asset he is to the backline we could see him on the bench throughout the season.

FAVOURITE: The Panthers are favoured to come out winners in Vegas.

MY TIP: The Storm fan in me wants neither team to win, alas I feel the Panthers will get it done. **Panthers by 16.**
