Sharks hold off Dolphins to get their season back on track

Cronulla-Sutherland has held off a fast-finishing Dolphins side to secure a much needed 24-12 win at Shark Park tonight.

The win sees the Sharks enter themselves back into the Top 8, following some strong performances from halfback Nicho Hynes who bagged a double and yet another slick performance from Blake Brailey who was a constant threat out of dummy half.

Cronulla looked to be cruising to victory with thirteen minutes remaining in the match, before Herbie Farnworth sparked Redcliffe with a crucial one-on-one strip and then a line break and try to give his side a late chance. Cronulla however iced the game late with tries to Hynes and Sione Katoa to secure a much needed win in the Shire for Craig Fitzgibbon's men.

Cronulla came into the match sitting just outside the top eight and desperately needing to get their season back on track. They got off to a hot start inside ten minutes when Nicho Hynes ran down a narrow short side to throw a dummy at the line to score the first try of the night. Hynes converted his try from out wide and it was 6-0.

The game continued to be a real arm wrestle in the first half, with both defensive lines holding strong for the Sharks to lead narrowly at halftime.

Cronulla were gifted an early penalty after the break to extend their lead to 8 points. Blockbusting centre Jesse Ramien then crashed over for the Sharks second try, following some clever hands from Briton Nikora and the home side were in control at 12-0 with just over twenty minutes remaining.

Dolphins lock Kurt Donoghoe was then penalised for a sloppy tackle on Hynes. The goalkicking number seven took the two points on offer as the Sharks continued to push for victory.

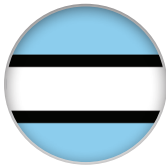
Redcliffe finally got on the board with 12 minutes left, when centre Max Feagai scored a try out of nowhere following a break from Jake Averillo. Jamayne Isaako converted from out wide to give the visitors a late chance.

The Dolphins then doubled their tally minutes later, when Herbie Farnworth exploded onto the ball inside his own half. The English centre then stepped William Kennedy to pass to Kurt Donoghoe who then found Farnworth back on the inside off a very questionable pass to score. Isakko converted to narrow the scoreline to just two points to set up a thrilling finish.

Cronulla however snuffed out the late fight back through Nicho Hynes who scored his second try next to the posts to seal victory for the home side.

The Sharks then put an exclamation mark on the victory with seconds remaining when Sione Katoa dived over in the corner following a superb cut out pass from Nicho Hynes to secure a 24-12 win.

Cronulla will now look to make the way back up the ladder in Round 20 when they face the Roosters back at Shark Park next Friday. The Dolphins meanwhile will face the Warriors at Suncorp Stadium on Thursday night.

Hughes stars as Storm go six in a row

A virtuoso performance from Jahrome Hughes has seen the Melbourne Storm fightback from a halftime deficit to defeat a gallant Newcastle Knights side 32-14 on Saturday afternoon.

Turning an 8-2 deficit with a minute left in the first half into a comprehensive victory, the reigning Dally M winner was at his attacking best with a direct hand in four tries as the Storm extended their record over the Knights to 30 wins from 40 matches during Craig Bellamy's tenure.

The result failed to reflect the home side's effort with the Knights producing one of their best halves of the season in the first 40 minutes only to be outclassed after halftime to the dismay of 21,107 supporters at home.

After conceding first points via a penalty goal from former Novocastrian Nick Meaney, the hosts flexed their attacking muscles with a right-side shift which saw Dominic Young (12th minute) streak down the sideline before regathering his own chip kick to ground the ball just inside the field of play.

Growing in confidence after repelling the Storm on multiple occasions on their goal line, the Knights took advantage of a penalty to extend their lead after Young (27th minute) used sheer strength for his second four-pointer.

The Storm managed to keep the Knights at bay for the remainder of the half and struck a blow of their own in the final minute of the half; a well-placed chip kick from Hughes was plucked cleanly from the skies by Eliesa Katoa (39th minute) for an 8-6 halftime scoreline.

A fortuitous ricochet put the Storm back in front early in the second half with Harry Grant's grubber kick bouncing off the posts into the arms of Trent Loiero (44th minute), while Hughes' boot delivered once again with Kane Bradley (47th minute) using his height advantage over Greg Marzheew for a 16-8 buffer.

Hughes continued to assert his class on the match with a blistering passage to set up a second for Loiero (58th minute), nail a 40/20 and throw an audacious cut-out pass to give Bradley (61st minute) his second career double.

The Knights refused to wilt despite seeing the game slip away with Fletcher Hunt (71st minute) chasing a Young offload, which bounced off a Storm player, to keep the host's hopes alive.

A powerful run from Katoa (75th minute) close to the try line capped a dominant second half as the Storm ran out 32-14 victors.

Next week, the Knights will host the Warriors on Sunday afternoon, while the Storm will return home on Saturday evening to take on the Sea Eagles.

Things looked to go from bad to worse for the Roosters with Victor Radley put on report for dangerous contact in the air on Clint Gutherson and then Sam Walker was sent to the sin bin for dangerous contact on the legs on David Klemmer. The sin bin though had the opposite effect as the Roosters were able to score when Robert Toia outjumped Val Holmes to score.

On the stroke of halftime, Sam Walker made up for his sin bin adding a field goal to give the Roosters a 19-18 lead at the break.

The second half wasn't as free flowing as the first half as it took seven minutes for the scores to change and it was when Billy Smith went through a big gap in the defensive line to score.

The game became an arm-wrestle for most of the second half, the Dragons thought they had closed the gap just after the hour mark but both Grant Atkins and the Bunker denied them with Jacob Liddle ruled to have knocked on despite the arguments of the Red 'V' that he had held the ball.

A contentious successful challenge for the Dragons with fifteen minutes to go gave them the ball after errors began to riddle the Roosters game and eventually Jaydn Su'a was able to go through and score. Kyle Flanagan converted to close the game back to a solitary point.

The Roosters began to dominate field position after the try and inside the last minute Victor Radley sealed the victory with a try next to the posts and Sam Walker put the icing on the 31-24 cake.

Next week, the Dragons have a tough clash against the Bulldogs at Accor Stadium whilst the Roosters head to Shark Park for a clash with the Roosters.

Dogs overcome Cowboys and dreary attack

The Bulldogs ended their two-game losing run with a narrow and hard-fought victory over the Cowboys in a match that was dominated by tough defence and grim attack.

Both sides were guilty of not respecting possession when they had it, turning the ball over regularly through poor handling, however both displayed tenacious and powerful defence from start to finish.

All the points were scored in the first half, The Cowboys scored all their points in a 6 minute period midway through the first and the Bulldogs responded by scoring all their points in the final 4 minutes of the first half.

The Cowboys got on the board first after spreading the ball left on one tackle, they quickly sent the ball back to the right side on the next, where Zac Laybutt got one-on-one with his defender, put on a huge sidestep back infield and then forced his way over to score a great try. Scott Drinkwater converted.

5 minutes later Drinkwater landed a penalty goal to give themselves an 8-point lead.

On the 30th minute, Murray Taulagi tried to muscle his way over for a try. The Bunker was called to adjudicate, and they ruled double movement - no try.

The Bulldogs hit back in the 36th minute when Matt Burton saw a gap in front of him, so he placed a lovely grubber through it and Jacob Preston got a good bounce, regathered and scored. Burton converted.

Then with just a few seconds left in the half, the Bulldogs shifted to the left and found Enari Tuala, who got into space before passing to debutant Jethro Rinakama who goes in to score a well-deserved try. Burton converted from the sideline and at halftime the Bulldogs were up 12-8.

Things looked dire for the Dogs in the 57th minute when they were defending. Two consecutive tackles saw Kurtis Morrin and then Matt Burton come off the field for HIA's.

Two minutes later from the back of a scrum deep in the Bulldogs half, the Cowboys sent the ball to Drinkwater, who got outside his defender and got across the line, but as he fell to ground the ball, Viliame Kikau strikes at the ball and knocks it free. Drinkwater claimed he got hit high by Kikau. The Bunker was called to review and found there was no high shot by Kikau.

With ten minutes remaining, both Morrin and Burton were cleared and returned to the field. 3 minutes after he returned, Burton made a half-break, offloaded inside to Reed Mahoney who also made a half-break before chipping over the top as he was tackled, but the kick bounced once and went dead in the Cowboys in-goal.

Two minutes later, Jeremiah Nanai made a break, ran 20 metres downfield and then kicked ahead, but the Bulldogs were able to get back and clean it up in time near their own line.

The Warriors extended their lead beyond two converted tries early in the second half with Roger Tuivasa-Sheck (49th minute) touching down in the corner after multiple sets on the Tigers' line.

A successful captain's challenge was promptly converted into points as Doueihi (57th minute) incisively left the Warriors' defence grabbing at thin air to keep the Tigers in the contest.

The Tigers' hopes of mounting a comeback were cruelled by their inability to hold onto the ball; the Warriors struck the knockout blow with late tries to Harris-Tavita (73rd minute) and Leka Halasima (79th minute) reflecting the dominance of the 34-14 final margin.

Two teams on the cusp fighting to stay in the race.

In focus ahead of Thursday's round opener is the Dolphins' incredible recent record at their Suncorp Stadium home. Heaping 50+ points on both the Dragons (R14) and Rabbitohs (R17) over the past months has catapulted Kristian Woolf's outfit into finals calculations, but the tight and tense nature of the middle of the table means they sit 10th, two points adrift of a chunk of teams straddling either side of the eight.

In an added boon for the competitor's newest team, Queensland fullback Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow returns at the back, his presence sorely missed in last Friday's lost against Cronulla in the Shire. This allows Jake Averillo return to his favoured spot on the wing. There is some negative news though – former Cowboys forward Kulikefu Finefeuiaki will miss the clash with his ex-teammates after sustaining a broken thumb. That brings Lemuelu into the back row and another former Cowboy in Peter Hola onto the bench.

Ah.... the Cowboys.

They have truly been the enigma of the competition. Todd Payten's side somehow recorded wins over Canberra and Penrith, and a draw in their return fixture with Penrith this year – but it's been a bit of a dry run since. Their only wins since Easter have come against the Titans (twice) and Tigers (once), and in between some of those losses have had the fans and media asking questions about Payten's future. In a three-week period in June they copped 38 (Melbourne), 58 (Dolphins) and 42 (Sydney) – a seriously leaky defensive line setting off alarm bells in Townsville.

To their credit though, that Titans win seemed to have shored things up a touch. In the fortnight since, they held the Storm firm and lost 20-26, before a low-scoring duel against the Bulldogs which was lost 8-12. Payten will be looking for more of the same desperate defending heading into Thursday night's contest under Suncorp's bright lights.

The visitors will be without Jordan McLean (calf) which brings Mikaele in at prop and Lahrs in on the bench. Robert Derby, struggling for form lately, has been pushed to the reserves. That gives Jaxson Paulo a fresh shot in the Cowboys' backline.

The last meeting between these sides could be revealing – or it could be a complete aberration – five weeks ago the Phins beat the Cowboys up to the tune of 58-4 in Townsville.

Who to watch: While both teams boast high-quality fullbacks, it's the makeshift names in the number six jerseys who will have an impact on the outcome.

Sean O'Sullivan has only made four appearances for the Dolphins this year – two at five-eighth and two off the interchange – and they've lost all four. While that doesn't necessarily speak to the Phins' struggle in those particular games, he'll need to offer a bit more alongside current LU Player of the Year leader Isiaya Katoa in the halves if the Phins are to make their maiden finals appearance.

On the flip side, Jaxon Purdue made the move from the centres to the halves mid-season. It's a bold move from Payten and so far in six games at #6, they've won just one. The Cowboys' halves have been unstable all season, with Queensland star Tom Dearden playing both sides of the scrumbase at various times through the season. Jake Clifford, Tom Duffy, and Purdue all partnering him along the way. If they can gel and get some consistency, could Purdue-Dearden be the pairing to deliver the Cowboys an unlikely finals berth?

Favourite: The Phins at home and based on the last result have solid support.

My tip: While the Cowboys have offered plenty against two good teams in recent weeks, I can't see them overcoming a points-happy Dolphins side who welcome the Hammer back in jumper #1. **Dolphins by 18.**

Rising from the bottom of the premiership ladder to a place in the top eight off the back of five consecutive wins, the Penrith Panthers will be looking to continue their mid-season resurgence with several stars back on deck and others rested.

Welcoming back Dylan Edwards and Brian To'o after the NSW duo sat out last week's 32-10 victory over the Eels, coach Ivan Cleary has elected to rest co-captains Nathan Cleary and Isaah Yeo, while centre Izack Tago will miss the game after accepting a one-match ban for dangerous contact.

Resurrecting their season with five straight wins during the middle-third of the year, the Panthers have enjoyed tremendous winnings streaks during their premiership years, including runs of 8 (2022, 23), 9 (2022), 12 (2021) and 17 (2020) straight victories.

The Panthers hold a dominant record over the Rabbitohs with 12 wins from 16 meetings since Cleary returned for his second stint at the club in 2019.

Languishing in 16th position off the back of one of their worst losing runs since being reinstated, the South Sydney Rabbitohs will be hoping returning cavalry can reverse their fortunes.

Coming off a bye following State of Origin III last week, the Rabbitohs will welcome back Latrell Mitchell, Euan Aitken and Peter Mamouzelos, while English import Lewis Dodd has been included on the bench.

The Rabbitohs last win came prior to State of Origin in Round 11; a loss to the Panthers would see the side equal the seven straight losses recorded at the end of last season and beginning of 2008. The side's longest slump since being acquired by Russell Crowe nearly two decades ago occurred in 2016 with a run of nine straight losses.

A loss on Friday evening would be only the fourth time in Wayne Bennett's career that the esteemed coach has lost seven consecutive matches; the seven-time premiership winner endured seven match losing runs with Newcastle (2014) and Brisbane (2005) while his longest run of losses stands at eight matches with Brisbane (2003).

The Rabbitohs have won 10 out of 15 matches played at Commbank Stadium, including their past three appearances at the Western Sydney venue.

Who to watch: Mitch Kenny may have missed out on a spot in the grand final team that defeated South Sydney four years ago, but ever since that moment he's been a fixture of Penrith's continued success. Providing dependable service out of hooker with tireless application to defence, the 27-year-old has averaged over 46 tackles each week to rank among the hardest-working players in the league. Scoring only four tries over the course of 120 appearances in first grade to date, look for Kenny to have a strong influence on the fulltime score even if his name doesn't appear among the try-scorers.

With their finals hopes hanging on by a thread, South Sydney will never need a big game performance from a big game player more than now: enter Latrell Mitchell. Adding to his extensive highlights reel with several awe-inspiring moments already this season, the Rabbitohs will need their superstar fullback to deliver once again if they are to record their first win in two months and stave off the prospect of an ignominious wooden spoon. Scoring seven tries in 13 clashes against the Panthers throughout his career, Mitchell has proven he has the ability to single-handedly win matches – for Souths' sake, they will be hoping he can do it again on Friday evening.

Favourite: The Panthers are expected to continue their winning streak and extend the Rabbitohs losing slump at the same time.

My tip: Having been given no hope of defending their title after a horror opening to 2025, the Panthers have the form and draw to make the top eight. If they can get to September, they've proven they know how to win. **Penrith by 16.**

Match preview

The Canberra Raiders and Parramatta Eels will lock horns once again this Saturday afternoon in chilly Canberra, with the home side boasting a dominant historical record over the Eels.

Since 1998, these clubs have met 41 times, with the Raiders claiming 24 victories. Recent history paints an even more one-sided picture: Canberra put the sword to the Eels twice in the past two seasons, notching up a brutal 50-12 win earlier this year and a 41-8 demolition in 2024. With the Raiders riding high on a seven-game winning streak and the Eels stumbling with four losses from their last five, the momentum is well and truly with the Green Machine.

Adding to the occasion is the Raiders' annual Forever Green celebration, with more than 50 club legends returning to GIO Stadium to honour the club's history. That sense of legacy and pride was already on full display in Round 18, when Canberra edged the Dragons 28-24 in a thrilling clash at home. Kaeo Weekes starred with a classy attacking performance, while hooker Tom Starling turned defence into offence with a crucial one-on-one strip.

With Origin stars Josh Papalii and Hudson Young returning, Ricky Stuart has reshuffled his forward pack, shifting Corey Horsburgh to lock and giving Morgan Smithies and Simi Sasagi roles off the bench. There's a strong air of belief brewing in Canberra—and their loyal fans can sense something special building.

For Parramatta, belief seems in short supply at the moment. The Eels fell to Penrith 26-10 last week, despite showing promise early with tries to Kitione Kautoga and Zac Lomax. However, coach Jason Ryles raised eyebrows by shifting Dylan Brown to hooker—a move that did more harm than good to their attacking flow.

With Brown relegated to 18th man this week, Ryles has placed his faith in Joash Papalii to wear the number 6 jersey and spark some attacking magic. The return of Ryley Smith from suspension at hooker may offer some structure, but a reshuffled forward pack—triggered by Kautoga's ankle injury—adds another question mark over the Eels' stability. Jack Williams moves to the back row and J'maine Hopgood to prop, while debutant Jordan Samrani joins the bench.

Who to watch: Veteran enforcer Josh Papalii returns full of confidence after Queensland's Origin triumph and the birth of his fourth child. Expect him to channel that energy into a rampaging performance up front.

For the Eels, keep an eye on Joash Papalii—the young five-eighth now has the reins of the side, and his response under pressure could define Parramatta's direction moving forward.

Favourite: The Canberra Raiders are heavy favourites, according to the latest odds.

My tip: The Raiders are simply in too strong a form to look past. With Origin stars back, past legends in the stands, and a red-hot home crowd behind them, they'll be too much for an unsettled Eels outfit. **Canberra by 16.**

All eyes on will be on Lachlan Galvin and Matt Burton as the Bulldogs commit to their long-term halves pairing for Saturday's game against the Dragons.

The Bulldogs bounced back from two-straight losses last week with a gritty 12-8 win over the Cowboys, although it was a third round in a row that Cameron Ciraldo's side had struggled for cohesion in attack.

While the Bulldogs had experimented with Galvin off the bench, the return of Jaeman Salmon from injury left Ciraldo with plenty of versatile options for both the starting side and interchange along with Bailey Hayward and Kurt Mann.

It also left Ciraldo needing to make a decision – either leaving Galvin out completely, as was the case in the win over North Queensland, or looking towards both the present and future by promoting the former Tiger to the halfback jersey.

He ended up going with the latter and against a Dragons team that hasn't conceded less than 20 points since late May, the expectation will be a far better showing in attack on Saturday afternoon.

Of course, there will be some teething issues as Galvin builds combinations but the hope, at least for Ciraldo, is that it will leave the Bulldogs in a stronger position come the finals when you don't want to be tinkering with the line-up.

In other team news, Origin duo Stephen Crichton and Kurt Mann have both been named after being rested from the game against the Cowboys.

Crichton's return is a welcome one with Bronson Xerri (groin) unavailable.

As for the Dragons, they put in a strong effort against the Roosters only to come up short in a high-scoring thriller 31-24.

A top-eight berth is quickly slipping away for Shane Flanagan's side, sitting four points adrift of the Roosters and with a far inferior for-and-against, effectively meaning they need to win three more games than the Tricolours to run them down.

The Dragons have named an unchanged line-up for Saturday's game despite both Hamish Stewart (knee) and Luciano Leilua (laceration) picking up injuries in the loss to the Roosters, while Mat Feagai (ankle) is on the extended bench and a chance of returning in the backline.

Who to watch: Who else? Galvin has become a walking human headline and that is what happens when you have as dramatic an exit as the teenage playmaker did from the Tigers. But more than anything, forgetting what happened with the Tigers, Galvin has been brought to the Tigers as the potential missing piece in a team that is capable of contending for the premiership. It has been an awkward fit at times, largely due to the fact he has been brought onto the field mid-game, but when Galvin has started he has looked far more comfortable. Now he will have soon-to-be regular halves partner Matt Burton alongside him to do most of the general kicking, which should free Galvin up to play off-the-cuff and challenge the line with his running game. It won't be perfect but Ciraldo and the Bulldogs have committed to him this season.

The Bulldogs have an incredibly versatile bench, but it is also a bit light and that is where the Dragons and could find an advantage if they keep this game tight early. Michael Molo in particular has played his way into the conversation for a starting role, having impressed in last week's game against the Roosters with an incredibly effective 27-minute stint which saw him rack up 94 metres, including 42 post-contact. It wasn't just that game either. The week prior against Canberra when promoted to the second row he was still equally impactful in 80 minutes, pumping out 102 metres to go with 44 tackles (just one missed). With the Dragons' season fast slipping away it may soon make sense to give Molo more of an extended run to see what they have in him, especially considering he is off-contract at the end of the year.

Favourite: The Bulldogs are well-backed to continue their winning ways.

My tip: While the attack isn't exactly humming, the Bulldogs looked a much-improved defensive unit last week and were also brilliant on their own line against the Panthers. Against a leaky Dragons defence, it should be a comfortable win for Ciraldo's side. **Bulldogs by 18.**

The stars are on show for both teams in Melbourne's Starlight Round.

Back to Tiger Town in Spoon Bowl Preview?

In a game that features two of the bottom four going head-to-head, there is surprisingly a lot on the line for both the Wests Tigers and the Gold Coast Titans at Leichhardt Oval this Sunday.

The Tigers have 'improved' considerably on last season's efforts under Benji Marshall, make what you want of their off-field performances. Their product on the field has been at times fun to watch but at other times frustrating to watch as they make the same lapses week in, week out. The almost breakdown of their strong first halves before half-time has been one area of concern. But, the emergence of the Fainu's, Terrell May and Jarome Luai as a leader (despite his stat sheet taking a hit) have been highlights for Tigers fans.

In this dual with the Titans. They need to restrict the Titans big men of Fotuika, RCG, Fa'asuamaleaui and Jolliffe. When the visitors have flourished this season, it has been on the back of the pack. Expect that to be no different here. They'll have to do a strong job on the edge with Beau Fermor hitting a good run of form with his combination with flyer Phil Sami. Elsewhere, they'll need to be disciplined and focus on their 1% plays.

Onto team news, troubled mid-season recruit Taylan May will make his Tigers debut after a 10 minute hattrick in the NSW Cup last weekend with Adam Doueihi shifting to lock as a result. The reshuffle will see Alex Twal start at prop, while Alex Seyfarth has been named in the back row after Samuela Fainu picked up a knee injury last weekend. Fonua Pole also moves to the interchange.

For the Titans, it has been a rough season. With persistent rumours around Des Hasler's future playing a part, the Titans haven't defeated a side since their Round 15 win over Manly. Despite that, you can see the effort is high, but they are lacking in execution and it's why the Titans are battling down the bottom of the premiership table. They rate fifth in missed tackles while making the third least amount of tackles in the NRL.

To beat the Tigers, early shifts will be their friend. Edge defence has been a problem for the home side throughout the season, a dynamic centre such as Sami could cause problems, similar to what Mark Nawaqanitawase did a fortnight ago. Elsewhere, they have to contain Terrell May and the offloads he can produce. If they do that, they can cause a bit of a boilover in the race for the spoon and get level with the Rabbitohs.

Onto team news. Tino Fa'asuamaleaui returns to the starting side after coming off the bench last week. The switch with Jaimin Jolliffe is the only change to the team that fell to Brisbane last week. Sam Verrills has been cleared of a concussion and will take his place at hooker.

Who to watch: For the Tigers, it's going to be Adam Doueihi. After the spot fire issued by Isaac Moses calmed down, Doueihi has been in some strong form playing across the halves and the centres. It was a move to the middle that sparked results against the Warriors, his footwork in the middle third of the field could spell trouble for the Titans.

For the Titans, it's a challenge to David Fifita. It feels like we can't go more than a few weeks without hearing about his future. After backflipping on the Roosters last year, we are yet to see the best of Fifita in this new role off the pine. Expect the former QLD backrower to be at his rampaging best from the bench against the Tigers.

Favourite: The Tigers are favourites with the punters. The visitors hold a 17-10 win-record against the hosts. Last time at Leichhardt, it was a narrow Tigers win.

My tip: Tigers at Leichhardt are a different beast and it should be a comfortable victory to show the doubters how much they have improved. **Tigers by 12.**

Newcastle look to mine the depths of their squad against sturdy Warriors.

It won't be surprising if people make comparisons to the recent malaise of the Wests Tigers when they see the Knights run out onto McDonald Jones Stadium in hi-vis orange this Sunday, a decade-old to the NSW Mining industry.

The home side for this clash are anchored firmly in the bottom group of the competition after a frustrating season. A win here would keep their slim finals hopes in the frame, while a loss is probably season-over territory – if it isn't already. Just three wins from their last nine games and injury to star fullback Kalyn Ponga aren't even the headline now, with coach Adam O'Brien's future called into question not just by frustrated fans, but now media scuttlebutt.

Whether O'Brien sees out the season aside, the Knights have made a good account for themselves in recent weeks. The 32-14 loss to Melbourne didn't really show how well the side performed, but their inability to hold true for 80 minutes was their downfall, particularly when Jahrome Hughes took control of the contest after halftime.

Looking at the teamsheet, Dylan Lucas comes out of the squad with Tyson Gamble joining the side on the bench. Brodie Jones starts back row in Lucas' place; while a series of changes sees Gagai move to fullback, and Hunt to centre. Elsewhere Frizell is benched, Crossland moves to lock and Brailey starts hooker.

The Warriors welcome back Kurt Capewell, who replaces Rocco Berry in the centres – the only change to their teamlist.

Their formline is interesting as well. Coasting along in the top four since the end of April, they've only won three of their last six, although those losses have come against in-form teams in Penrith, Brisbane and Canberra.

A longer-term statistic working against the 'Wahs' is that they've lost their last four matches against the Knights at Hunter Stadium. They last tasted victory in the pre-COVID era at the venue in 2019.

These sides have already met once this year - the Warriors coming away 26-12 winners in Christchurch on ANZAC Day.

Who to watch: These sides have had contrasting fortunes in their halves pairings this season, but that has changed in recent weeks.

The Warriors enjoyed incredible stability at the scrumbase until the ACL injury to halfback Luke Metcalf 3 weeks ago. Metcalf and Chanel Harris-Tavita formed the 6-7 pairing for the side's first fifteen matches. Titans' outcut Tanah Boyd filled in admirably in Sunday's win over the Tigers and will be hoping he can be the like-for-like replacement as Metcalf himself looks to recovery and 2026.

Newcastle have had five different halves pairings across the season, and only short runs of consistency with those pairings. The latest iteration – Hastings and Cogger – are entering their third week and it will be interesting to see how that momentum will generate better quality play for the Novocastrians. What won't help is O'Brien's continued indecision at hooker, with Crossland pushed back to lock for Brailey yet again.

Favourite: The Wahs, while on the road, are well-favoured against the lowly Knights.

My tip: I can't see anything but a Warriors win here. And while that's exactly what could spur Newcastle to victory, there's not enough confidence there to predict the upset this time around. A close contest the visitors will get away with. **Warriors by 10.**

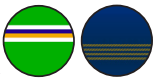

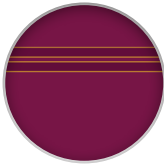

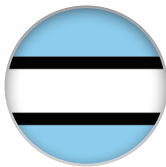

NRLW Round 3 Preview

Canberra v Parramatta

Round three of the NRLW Premiership kicks off bright and early on Saturday afternoon as the Canberra Raiders look to win their first game of the season in front of their faithful against the Parramatta Eels. Kicking off the first game of a loaded Super Saturday, the Raiders will look to bounce back from what can only be described as a demolition job, going down 56-6 against the competition favourites in the Cronulla Sharks. It was all downhill from the start, with Emma Verran running in four tries in the first forty minutes as the Raiders did anything but raid the Sharks defense for 70 minutes. It went so far down the slippery slope that our old friend Scott Bailey had to pull out his infamous tweet... no one has ever won a premiership after conceding 50 points in a season. Canberra finished the game with 34 missed tackles, another 17 that were deemed inefficient, ten errors and on the wrong side of an 8-1 line break count. It bodes poorly for the Green Machine in 2025, who currently have a -68 points differential after the opening two rounds. Ironically, they come up against a side who only two years ago, lost 56-6 against the Sharks at GIO Stadium.

The Parramatta Eels come into the game with a win and a loss, having upset the Sharks at home in round one before being held scoreless in New Zealand last weekend. The 14-0 scoreline possibly makes it look worse than it was for the blue and gold, with the Eels matching the Warriors in every aspect bar where it truly counted. 17 errors did not help the cause of the Eels, as well as being on the wrong end of an 8-1 penalty count. The Eels took down the Raiders last season in a tight two point win, and will be looking to do the same as they try to condemn the Raiders to their third straight loss of 2025

Who to watch: Elise Simpson comes in to make her debut for the Raiders at the back, and walks into the side with an already established sporting career. A former Australian youth touch football representative, as well as a school-girls sevens rep to boot, Simpson has the ability to break apart the game with a dash of speed and some glamorous footwork. If you haven't seen her highlights from the Tarsha Gale competition in 2025, do yourself a favour and go find them... she will need to be shut down early if the Eels want to win. Rachael Pearson is coming off a career season and has started well once again as she looks to lead Parramatta to their second ever grand final. She was almost perfect in round one, scoring a try and setting another up in the upset win over the Sharks. While she isn't seen as a dominant ball runner in comparison to some, she's a sneaky runner who can cut through the line while also providing some class kicking around the red zone. She will be crucial in putting the Raiders under pressure early.

My tip: The Raiders have yet to inspire confidence in 2025, with two lacklustre performances capping off a brutal start to the campaign. The Eels, whilst held scoreless last week, have been playing very gritty, tough football which bodes well against a Raiders side that has rolled over in the opening rounds. It won't be high-scoring, but it will be an Eels win all the same. **Eels by 10.**

Cronulla v North Qld

The Cronulla Sharks and North Queensland Cowboys will meet for the third time in their short NRLW histories, with the Sharks holding a perfect record over their northern rivals. After a bruising opening round loss to the Eels, the Sharks bounced back in emphatic fashion last weekend, dismantling the Raiders 56-6 in one of the most dominant performances in the club's NRLW journey to date. Emma Verran was simply unstoppable, crossing for four tries and wreaking havoc down the edges, while Georgia Ravics and Stephanie Faulkner both bagged doubles in a clinical team effort. Georgia Hannaway was near-perfect with the boot, converting 8 of 10 attempts to keep the scoreboard ticking. However, it wasn't all good news for the Sharks, with winger Annessa Biddle copping a suspension for a high shot and being replaced by debutant Grace-Lee Weekes. Weekes, a NSW U19s rep and former development player, becomes Cronulla's third NRLW debutant in as many weeks. The side is otherwise unchanged heading into Round 3.

The Cowboys, meanwhile, will be out to regain momentum after suffering their first loss of the season in a 26-6 defeat to defending premiers Newcastle. Alisha Ford was the lone try-scorer in a game where the Cowboys struggled to match the Knights' firepower and polish. Coach Ricky Henry has stuck solid with his 17, with experienced back-rower China Polata listed among the reserves as she eyes a return from an ACL injury. With no major changes and a point to prove, expect a sharper Cowboys outfit this weekend.

Who to watch: Coming off a four-try masterclass, Emma Veran is in red-hot form and will be Cronulla's biggest threat out wide. Her speed, footwork, and instinct around the try line make her a nightmare for defenders. Expect her to see plenty of ball again. Named as co-captain and starting at five-eighth, Kirra Dibb brings a wealth of experience and leadership to the side. She's a seasoned playmaker for both club and country, with a sharp kicking game and strong vision around the ruck.

My tip: After a mammoth win over the Raiders in Round 2, the Sharks will be brimming with confidence and looking to secure back-to-back victories. While the Cowboys are resilient and well-coached, the Sharks' attacking combinations are beginning to click, and their home-ground advantage may be the difference. **Sharks by 10.**

Canterbury v St Geo Illa

Round three of the NRLW Premiership heads to Accor Stadium as the newest team in the competitions takes on a foundation club on Saturday afternoon. The Canterbury Bulldogs take on the St George Illawarra Dragons for the first time ever as Brayden Williams' side look to continue their unbeaten run to their top flight history. The 26-12 win was something of a surprise as the Dogs ran in four tries in just over twenty minutes to pierce the armour of the Knights defense. They then backed it up against the Wests Tigers with some tough defense, holding off Kezie Apps and the Campbelltown faithful that went on Thursday to make it two on the trot. Leading from the front is halfback Tayla Preston and lock forward Holli Wheeler, both representative players with vast experience in the NRLW while rookie coach Brayden Williams is playing his cards perfectly to start his coaching career. Running out of the kennel and into the fire of the Dragons, this may be the toughest task to date as St George looks to put the Dogs in their place on Saturday.

The Dragons come into the game with a win and a loss to start the season, most recently going down to the defending premiers, the Sydney Roosters 24-10 at Jubilee Oval last week. The sin-binning of Hannah Southwell condemned the Dragons to the loss, as the Roosters were able to run up the scoreline against an otherwise valiant Dragons outfit. Teagan Berry looks as dangerous as ever at fullback, while Indie Bostock has cemented her spot in the side with lightning speed and brilliant footwork at the line. The Dragons side is a relatively inexperienced one, and yet will no doubt be up to the tasks as they look to hand the Bulldogs their first ever loss in the NRLW.

Who to watch: The most experienced player in the squad, playing her 40th game this weekend, Holli Wheeler brings some much needed firepower to the Dogs line-up. Averaging a touch under 30 tackles a game to go with 140 running metres, Wheeler is to-go woman for the Bulldogs to go forth and charge at the Dragons front-line. With a plethora of experience and knowledge playing against the likes of Raecene McGregor and Teagan Berry, Wheeler will know where to go and who to attack. The aforementioned Teagan Berry is one of the most dangerous fullbacks in the competition. A nightmare to defend, Berry already has 15 tackle breaks (tied for second behind Michaela Brake) to go with five line breaks and two tries so far this season. Those two tries took her up to 31, currently the all-time leader for the NRLW and at only 23, she could very easily add another century onto that number. Newcastle v Warriors

For the first time in NRLW history, the Newcastle Knights and the New Zealand Warriors will face off – and there's plenty of intrigue around this Round 3 clash.

Both sides are coming off impressive Round 2 victories and will be looking to build momentum as the 2025 season takes shape. The match kicks off at McDonald Jones Stadium following the NRL fixture between the Knights and Warriors, setting the scene for a bumper Sunday of rugby league in the Hunter. Newcastle bounced back in style last weekend after a Round 1 stumble, putting in a dominant performance against the Cowboys in Townsville. Led by halfback Jesse Southwell, the Knights were in control from the outset, building a 14-0 halftime lead and never looking back. Southwell's running game created plenty of headaches for the Cowboys, and the return of Olivia Higgins from suspension added extra spark around the ruck – her late try sealing the 26-6 win. The only change to the Knights' line-up sees Tess Staines named on the wing, replacing Lilly-Ann White, who shifts to the extended bench.

The Warriors, meanwhile, claimed a historic 14-0 shutout win over the Eels in their first NRLW home game since 2019. Coach Ron Griffiths – who was part of Newcastle's premiership-winning coaching staff – would've been particularly pleased with the defensive steel his side showed. Michaela Brake starred with over 200 running metres and multiple line breaks, while rookie Payton Takimoana also made her mark with a try. With a settled squad and back-to-back wins, the Warriors will head across the ditch full of confidence and ready to spoil the party in Newcastle. Griffiths has stuck solid with his 17 for the third week running.

Who to watch: For the Knights, Jesse Southwell is the architect. When she runs the ball, good things tend to happen. Her control, vision, and footwork will be central to the Knights' attacking strategy. Keep an eye also on Olivia Higgins – her experience and speed around the ruck make her a constant threat. For the Warriors, Laishon Albert-Jones has been rock solid in the middle and will be up for a big one against her former club. Michaela Brake was electric last week and looms as a serious danger anytime she gets in open space.

My tip: Back on home turf and with the support of a local crowd rolling over from the men's game, the Knights should lift again. But the Warriors are no easybeats, and their defence will keep things tight. This one could go down to the wire. **Knights by 4.**
