Dolphins deliver a Hammer blow to Cowboys season

Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow collected a double against his former club as the Dolphins recorded a 43-24 win over the North Queensland Cowboys in the opening match of Round 20.

Making a memorable return after being rested following State of Origin III last week, 'The Hammer' crossed for a brace of tries as the Dolphins scored at will for the first 50 minutes before the Cowboys threatened to conjure a second half miracle that ultimately fell short.

Having posted ten tries against the Cowboys when the two sides met in Townsville five weeks ago, the Dolphins picked up from where they left off with Isaiya Katoa laying on a try for Oryn Keeley (3rd minute) with their first set on the try line.

The Cowboys managed a response minutes later with Scott Drinkwater throwing a lovely cut-out pass to give Murray Taulagi (7th minute) a clean passage to the try line.

A penalty goal to Jamayne Isaako midway through the half gave a false impression of a close contest as Jake Averillo (20th minute) and Tabuai-Fidow (24th minute) produced long-range tries in quick succession to blow the contest wide open.

Squandering an opportunity to collect his second only moments after his first, Tabuai-Fidow (36th minute) atoned just before the break by finishing off a long-range bust from Connelly Lemuelu to give the Dolphins a 24-6 lead.

HT did nothing to deter the Dolphins' lust for tries with Harrison Graham (44th minute) barging over from close range before Isaako (47th minute) touched down for his ninth try of the season.

Facing a 34-6 deficit - and the prospect of things getting worse - the Cowboys rallied with tries to Taulagi (56th minute), Drinkwater (62nd minute) and Tom Dearden (63rd minute) in less than ten minutes to breathe new life into what had been a one-sided affair.

The Dolphins managed to extinguish the Cowboys' comeback with Isaako adding a penalty goal and Averillo (76th minute) collecting his second of the night; Isaako's conversion saw the Dolphins bring up 100 points from the two meetings against the Cowboys this season.

Katoa finished the contest with the first field goal of his NRL career to the delight of 23,172 supporters in attendance at Suncorp Stadium.

Next week, the Dolphins will have their final bye of the season, while the Cowboys will host the Dragons at home on Friday evening.

Sharks take a bite out of the Roosters finals hopes

Cronulla-Sutherland Sharks won 31-18 against the Sydney Roosters in front of 11,846 fans at Shark Park on Friday night.

The Sharks were propelled forward by the stellar work from Blayke Brailey and halfback Nichol Hynes which saw them win five tries to three including a debut try for Chris Veaila on a cold night in the Shire.

Sharks drew first blood in this important contest. Off a pair of six agains, fullback William Kennedy spied a small gap and burrowed over from close range to make it 6-0 for the hosts.

The crackdown from the roll ball hurt the Sharks in this one. Sam Walker hoisted a kick high and it was the reliable Daniel Tupou who went highest and brought it the tri-colours within two.

Errors and six agains were killing the Roosters early in this contest. Braydon Trindall provided the perfect short pass for Tieg Wilton to steam onto and stretch it out to 14-6.

The Sharks were streaming upfield and dominating the ruck. Blayke Brailey opened them up with his run then found Nicho Hynes inside for his to stroll over for the four-pointer.

Roosters weren't going down without a fight. They produced a brilliant counter-attack which ended with Walker finding James Tedesco inside for the custodian to bring the side within eight.

They brought themselves back within two just after the break. Walker initiated the move on last then a kick from Chad Townsend found it's way to Angus Crichton who swerved over for 20-18.

Sharks stemmed the tide and put themselves more than a converted try ahead again. It was a simple ball inside which interchange forward Billy Burns took and crawled over.

The icing was put on the win with a moment for the debutant. Chris Veaila was given the ball with space and he got one over his opposite number and gets a four-pointer on debut.

Trindall further put the exclamation point on a big two points for the Sharks. He drilled a field goal which put them ahead 31-18 and the hosts saw out the rest of the game without incident.

Penrith keep on as Souths keep counting the fallen

South Sydney's 2025 season found another way to get worse with a potential season-ending ankle injury to star Keaon Kolomatangi in their 20-point loss to Penrith at CommBank Stadium tonight.

It was a tense opening ten minutes to the game as both sides had their chances in good ball territory. A desperate Tyrone Munro try-save on Tom Jenkins early kept our score-board level. But the Panthers capitalised off a Brad Schneider bomb, the visitors didn't want to contest it as Brian To'o batted it back to Paul Alamoti who chipped ahead and beat Tallis Duncan to ground the ball.

The Panthers had a quick fire double following a strong kick return from To'o. It was terrific transition from the premiers as they went to the left edge, a vicious left hand fend sent Thomas Jenkins away before finding Edwards in support for his second try.

Right before the break, the Panthers issued the dagger in the hearts of the South Sydney side. Blaize Talagi was able to get the arm free to Edwards who broke into the clear before finding Casey McLean to go over for the Panthers third of the first half. Souths fired the final shot before the break but the terrific scramble of Edwards denied the Bunnies and it was 18-0 at oranges.

Off the back a strong start to the second half. Some direct attack saw the Rabbitohs crash across for their first of the second half. A crash play from Peter Mamouzelos sent Liam Le Blanc charging over for his first NRL try.

Penrith wouldn't be down for long. Despite having to wrestle momentum back, the Panthers played short and targeted the South Sydney edge defence. A short pass from Brad Schneider found Garner who sat and offloaded to Edwards to get his second try and restore the 18 point advantage.

On a night where nothing seemed to go Souths way, there are injury concerns with Kolomatangi (ankle) and Mamouzelos (HIA) failing to finish the match. Lewis Dodd showed some nice touches with his kicking game causing some grief for the Panthers but it's clear that he was having a crack.

Penrith finished with a bang after a Scott Sorensen offload found McLean who turned the defence inside and out to score the try that cemented a victory for the Panthers. Souths managed a consolation as Alex Johnston moved to within five of the legendary Ken Irvine's record after getting to a Jack Wighton grubber first.

Raiders score 18 in seven minutes to sink Eels

The Raiders have torn the Eels apart with a seven-minute surge in the second half today at GIO Stadium, ultimately downing the visitors 40-16 in front of more than 20,000 fans.

Canberra got off to a red hot start against Parramatta, leading 12-0 after 7 minutes, but the Eels clawed their way back into the match, leading at HT. The Dogs regained the lead after an hours play, before putting the Eels away with a flurry of points in the final 7 minutes.

The Raiders got off to a red hot start when a perfectly executed short side play on the left was capped off when Sebastian Kris, with a defender on top of him, batted a pass along to Jed Stuart who scored a good try. Jamal Fogarty converted from the sideline.

The Eels restart then went too deep. The Raiders got a penalty on halfway and went straight back on the attack. At the end of the set, Fogarty held up a nice ball for Zac Hosking, close to the line, and the back rower scored. Fogarty converted.

The Eels knuckled down and forced their way back into the game. In the 13th minute a lovely grubber by Dean Hawkins into the Raiders in-goal was pounced on by Charlie Guymer. Zac Lomax converted.

With ten minutes left in the half, the Eels reduced the margin further when they shifted right to Guymer who hit Isaiah longi with a lovely short ball. The fullback produced a perfect catch and pass to put Lomax in for a try in the corner. Lomax failed to convert from the sideline.

With a minute left in the half the Eels crossed again when Joash Papali'i chipped to the Raiders left corner. Josh Addo-Carr and Xavier Savage fall over each other in pursuit of the ball. Sean Russell cleaned up to score. Lomax's sideline conversion goes through off the upright and at the break, Eels had come from 12-0 down to lead 16-12.

Thirteen minutes after play resumed, Raiders shifted left to Kris, who executed a lovely draw and pass to send Stuart in untouched for his second try. Fogarty failed to convert.

Eight minutes later the Raiders regained the lead when Ethan Strange held up a crash ball for Simi Sasagi who barged over to score. Fogarty converted.

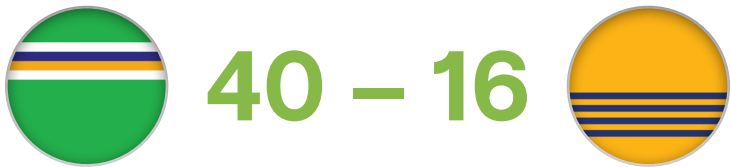
The Raiders received a penalty in the 68th minute and decided to take a shot at penalty goal to give themselves an 8 point lead, however Fogarty failed to land the kick. From the ensuing set, Kaeo Weekes grubbered into the Eels in-goal for Savage, who dived to force the rolling ball, but landed awkwardly and his face hit the ground hard. He failed to score the try and had to come off for an HIA.

After back-to-back set restarts, the Raiders extended their lead when Corey Horsburgh took a crash ball into the Eels line, then popped a flick pass away to Owen Pattie who barged over to score. Fogarty converted.

Two minutes later and the Raiders nearly scored again when Matthew Timoko looked to score after a great run by Weekes, however as he was putting the ball down for the try, Josh Addo-Carr's tackle knocked the ball loose.

It was only 2 minutes later that the Raiders extended their lead further when Pattie made a break from dummy half and scooted through the tired middle defence, racing 30 metres to score under the posts. Fogarty converted.

Just before fulltime, Stuart made a break down the sideline, grubbed back in-field and Strange regathered to score. Fogarty converted and the Raiders raced away to a 40-16 victory.

The Tigers took the lead again from another penalty. Titans didn't pack the scrum in time and Koroisau easily piloted over the penalty goal and gave them a two-point lead.

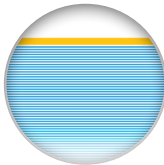

It's one of the modern-era rivalries that always delivers, but it's been a while since the Roosters have had the upper hand against the Storm.

Melbourne have won 11 of the past 12 clashes between the sides, including the last two, and the Chooks will be desperate to reverse that trend. Despite sitting outside the eight, the Roosters have a knack for delivering when their backs are against the wall, having won 14 of their last 21 matches when starting the round outside the finals picture.

This matchup carries added spice with both teams coming off frustrating losses in Round 20. The Storm fell at home in a rare slip-up against Manly, while the Roosters let themselves down with poor discipline and handling in a 31-18 defeat to the Sharks. With finals spots on the line and only six rounds remaining, every point matters from here on out. And for the Roosters, facing Melbourne twice in the run home makes this clash crucial.

The Roosters' performance last week against Cronulla was a mixed bag. They had some strong moments—most notably Sam Walker's pinpoint kick for a flying Daniel Tupou—but were ultimately undone by unforced errors and a lack of discipline. Veteran Chad Townsend had a night to forget in his return, while the side completed just 50% of their sets in the second half, allowing Cronulla to pull away. Naufahu Whyte stood tall through the middle, and Blake Steep produced a try-saving tackle, but it wasn't enough to stop the Sharks from claiming the points.

Coach Trent Robinson has made several changes for this week's crucial home fixture. Chad Townsend drops out of the 17, with Sandon Smith joining Sam Walker in the halves. Ethan King earns his second NRL cap, replacing Billy Smith (concussion) in the centres. Up front, Victor Radley is sidelined with a shoulder injury, opening the door for Siosa Wong to return from a knee issue and slot straight into the starting side at lock. Hugo Savala has been named among the reserves as he nears a return from a wrist injury.

Melbourne's 18-16 loss to Manly was one that got away. Despite a late surge that saw them level the scores, the Storm were undone by two penalty goals—one of which came after Harry Grant was penalised for an ill-timed challenge on Daly Cherry-Evans. Xavier Coates was the lone attacking spark, crossing for yet another hat trick, but the team as a whole produced a sub-70% completion rate and looked far from the composed outfit Craig Bellamy is known for.

They'll need to sharpen up quickly, especially with some key players unavailable. Cameron Munster has been given time off for his father's funeral, with Tyran Wishart filling in at five-eighth. Nelson Asofa-Solomona has taken a two-game suspension for a stray elbow, which sees Kane Bradley and Bronson Garlick added to the bench. Ryan Papenhuyzen remains sidelined with a calf issue, leaving the side a little light on star power—but certainly not experience.

Who to watch: Sydney Roosters forward, Naufahu Whyte, was immense last week, leading the forward charge. He'll need to replicate that effort to give his playmakers a fighting chance.

Melbourne Storm captain Harry Grant's late-game lapse cost his side last week. Expect the Storm skipper to bounce back with a statement performance.

Favourite: Melbourne Storm are the slight favourites according to the odds.

My tip: Melbourne don't often lose back-to-back under Craig Bellamy, and coming off a rare loss at home, they'll be determined to make a statement. **Storm by 12.**

Desperation day for top eight hopefuls

Do-or-die stakes await the North Queensland Cowboys and St George Illawarra Dragons when the two struggling sides meet in a season-defining clash on Friday evening.

Both teams remain mathematical hopes of playing finals football, despite sitting outside the top eight respectively, with only seven rounds remaining. Victory on Friday night will keep the dream of September alive, while defeat will make it nearly impossible as the gap between top eight contenders and pretenders becomes clearer.

Enduring a wretched run with six losses from their past seven matches, the North Queensland Cowboys will be desperate to reverse recent results through improved defensive resilience.

Going down to the Dolphins 43-24 last Thursday in a performance that regularly exposed the frailties of their defence, coach Todd Payten has responded by recalling Thomas Duffy in the halves with Jaxon Purdue shifting into the backline. John Bateman will also make a welcome addition after missing the past fortnight with a groin injury.

Sitting in 13th position – seven points adrift of the top eight – the Cowboys have conceded close to 35 points in their past seven matches while managing just 15 of their own in response.

The Cowboys have won their past five clashes against the Dragons, scoring at least 30 points in each of the victories.

Coming off yet another narrow defeat in their most recent performance, the St George Illawarra Dragons will be hoping the football gods smile favourably on Friday night.

Conceding a last-gasp try to go down to the Bulldogs 20-18 last Saturday night, coach Shane Flanagan has recalled Mat Feagai in place of Sione Finau in an otherwise unchanged squad.

The joint venture – currently ranked 11th on the premiership ladder – hold a poor record in Townsville with one win from four appearances at new stadium, while their overall record in North Queensland stands at a paltry four wins from 16 visits.

Last week's defeat was the eighth time the Dragons have lost by less than eight points this season; no other side has suffered as many narrow losses with the next closest being the Roosters, Tigers and Rabbitohs (five losses by less than eight points).

Who to watch: Having burst onto the scene as one of the most destructive edge forwards in the league, the Cowboys will be looking for Jeremiah Nanai to deliver his attacking best on Friday evening. Enduring a turbulent season with an early stint in reserve grade before adding a further three Maroons jerseys to his collection, the 22-year-old Australian and Samoan dual representative has been emblematic of his side's woes with point-scoring prowess offset by poor defensive reads. Set to return to his favoured left edge position after accommodating a forward reshuffle in recent weeks, Nanai's ability to turn half chances into points could prove decisive as the Cowboys strive to revive their season.

As the only remaining member of the last Dragons' side to defeat the Cowboys in Townsville, Blake Lawrie will be hoping to wind back the clock on Friday evening. Playing predominantly off the bench this season, averaging 80 metres and 21 tackles in just under half an hour of game time each week, the 28-year-old front-rower remains an important member of a developing squad given his experience. Contracted until the end of next season, look for Lawrie to give a good account of himself as the Dragons strive to keep their season alive.

Favourite: The Cowboys' home ground advantage – coupled with the Dragons' poor record in Townsville – is expected to be a decisive factor on Friday night.

My tip: For as spirited as the Dragons have been without getting results indicative of their effort, the attacking potential of the Cowboys should keep the home side in the top eight race for at least another week. **Cowboys by 14.**

Competing motivations come together in Suncorp showdown

The Brisbane Broncos will be striving to move one step closer to a finals return when they host a Parramatta Eels side determined to avoid the prospect of claiming the dreaded wooden spoon.

Returning home off the back of their final bye of the season last week, the Brisbane Broncos have soared back into contention – rising from eleventh to fifth – with five consecutive victories.

Welcoming back a host of top-tier players, headlined by Payne Haas in the front-row, coach Michael Maguire will also have the services of Corey Jensen and Jesse Arthurs at his disposal for Friday night's clash.

With seven matches remaining in their home-and-away campaign – including four fixtures scheduled at Suncorp Stadium – the Broncos have a favourable run home with all their opponents, except the Storm (twice), currently ranked outside the top eight.

The Broncos have won five of their past six matches against the Eels, averaging 35 points with the ball in each of the victories.

Showing glimpses of promise against heavyweight sides only to fade away in recent weeks, the Parramatta Eels will be hoping to stage an upset with major ramifications for both ends of the premiership ladder.

Holding a slender halftime lead only to go down 40-16 to the Raiders last Saturday in Canberra, coach Jason Ryles has received mixed news on the selection front with captain Mitchell Moses making a welcome return at the same time that star rookie Isaiah longi is set for a stint on the sidelines; Joash Papalii will shift to fullback, Will Penisini will return from suspension in place of Bailey Simonsson and Luca Moretti joins the bench.

Boasting a solid overall record at Suncorp Stadium with ten wins from 20 meetings against the Broncos, the Eels last win at the venue occurred in the penultimate round of 2022 with a half century score.

The Eels face a precarious run home with all their remaining matches against higher-ranked teams, while their standing on the ladder is only one win – and eight differential points – clear of the last-placed Titans.

Who to watch: In the weeks since making his return to the NRL, Ezra Mam has brought about a monumental shift in the Broncos' fortunes. Playing a pivotal role in reversing a worrying slump into a season-defining surge, the 22-year-old has been dynamic with ten try-assists in seven appearances upon return from suspension. Providing a much-needed spark to the side's attack, while allowing the likes of Reece Walsh to play with greater freedom, Mam's on-field influence has been undeniable in recent weeks.

The signing of Jack Williams may not have garnered much attention over the off-season, however the former Cronulla forward has had an impact far greater than any headlines can measure. Providing great service for the blue and golds after honing his craft as a hard-working interchange forward, the 28-year-old has made the most of his opportunities to start in the middle and on an edge as needed. Averaging over 120 running metres and 35 tackles each week, Williams will play a central role if the Eels are to claim their first win in Queensland since 2023.

Favourite: The Broncos are expected to record six straight wins for the first time since their run towards the grand final two years ago.

My tip: While the Eels have shown they have the potential to be a thorn in the side of the best of opponents, the confidence of the Broncos should shine through in front of a strong home crowd. **Broncos by 16.**

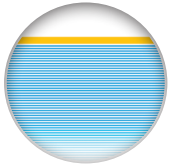

Kicking off Super Saturday is the New Zealand Warriors heading back home to face off against the mercurial Gold Coast Titans side.

The Warriors produced a magic trick through skilled backrower Leka Halasima on the buzzer to get back-to-back wins and maintain their spot in the top four.

Now, they get a game which looks a lay-up on paper but the Titans are the side that no one can predict ever.

They have dealt with the key injury to Luke Metcalfe with aplomb thus far and the tests for them might come further down the road.

The Warriors still possess the formidable side that has only lost twice at Mt Smart Stadium in 2025 and will be a tough out for anyone.

James Fisher-Harris has been a great leader in his return to New Zealand and his leadership should see them not see this as a trap game.

These are the games the Warriors need to bank if they want to confirm a top four spot and get a second chance in the finals.

What to make of the Titans? There is so much talent in the roster across the field but they have once again underachieved in 2025.

Before we get to the on-field players – it would be remiss not to celebrate Des Hasler who brings up his 500th game in coaching on Saturday despite his shower antics.

Last week, while they lost Jayden Campbell once again showed why he is a special talent with two superb try-assists and he should remain a fixture in their halves.

One thing the Titans need to do is bring Afoilana Khan-Pereira back in from the cold and give David Fifita some more minutes if they want to take anything from this game.

Around that nucleus, Titans can take something from another lost season and try to avoid the dreaded wooden spoon.

In their favour is their recent record against the Warriors. Gold Coast have won five of their last six against their trans-tasman rivals.

Who to watch: He has had a fortnight to settle into the role now, so Tanah Boyd remains the man under the spotlight for the Warriors. He will need to steer around the side and give the room for their electric backline to flourish.

Erin Clark has relished his change of scenery moving from the glitter strip to the land of the long white cloud. The lock remarked earlier this season he was enjoying his footy and being valued so might come back to haunt the Titans.

AJ Brimson showed off his brilliance with his individual four-pointer in the Titans loss but the fullback will have to dig deep into his bag of tricks if he is to find a way past the Warriors defence and that might be linking with Jayden Campbell.

Favourite: Despite their poor record against the Titans recently, the hosts should go into this game as heavy favourites to notch another win.

The Penrith Panthers are looking to continue their push towards the top four while the Wests Tigers are hoping to keep their faint top eight hopes alive on Saturday afternoon when these two fierce rivals meet.

For the Panthers, the early-season struggles are a distant memory of the past.

Ivan Cleary's men have won six in a row to surge up the ladder and while the Warriors' last-second win over the Knights was a dent to their top-four aspirations, Penrith still remains only five points behind Andrew Webster's side.

Their 30-10 victory over the Rabbitohs last week was particularly impressive considering they were without Nathan Cleary, Isaah Yeo, Liam Martin and Izack Tago.

While the understrength Panthers pulled off a similar win a fortnight ago against the Warriors, they weren't burdened by the weight of expectations then.

It would have been easy for complacency to set in, especially with a top-eight berth looking increasingly safe now for the defending premiers.

Instead, a Dylan Edwards masterclass inspired the Panthers to victory while Casey McLean continued to flash his enormous upside after a shaky start to his first full season in the NRL.

In team news, Nathan Cleary and Isaah Yeo return for a near full-strength Panthers team with Liam Martin on the extended bench and a chance of featuring in Saturday's game.

As for the Tigers, it is hard to see them challenging for the top eight but they remain in the mathematical hunt after last week's golden point win over the Titans.

Perhaps in a bid to make sure his team doesn't get too overconfident or carried away with the result, Benji Marshall called it the Tigers' "worst game" of the year in his press conference.

"In the first half we were looking for things that weren't there and to me it looked like our heads weren't on the job," Marshall said.

"We addressed some things at half time and in the second half we completed well and gave ourselves a chance at least.

"To get the two points it helps, but we have a lot to improve on."

Considering the quality of opposition, especially with the Titans losing skipper Tino Fa'asuamaleaui, maybe he was right but either way you can guarantee Marshall will have his players focused for a tilt at the defending premiers on Saturday.

The only major change to last week's side is the inclusion of Izaac Thompson on the wing in place of Charlie Staines, while Apisai Koroisau starts.


Who to watch: Tom Jenkins had a hat-trick the last time these two teams met and has quickly become one of the best feel-good stories of the 2025 season. Having progressed through the grades at Penrith before making his NRL debut in 2022, Jenkins moved to Newcastle in 2024 after he struggled to get consistent playing time. He wasn't able to make much of that change in scenery through and potentially looked lost to the NRL until the Panthers threw him a lifeline and now Jenkins has been playing so well that he has been keeping Paul Alamoti out of first grade. He has been remarkably safe under the high ball and a slick finisher too on set plays while also improving his defensive connection with McLean.

One of the players who kept Jenkins out of first grade during his time at Penrith was Taylan May. Saturday's game will mark the first time May has faced his former teammates and he was an instant success for the Tigers last week, scoring in his club debut. May is a dynamic threat in the centres and his inclusion allowed the Tigers to shift Adam Doueihi to the middle of the field. That, in turn, gives the Tigers two genuine scoring options on either side of the field in May and Starford To'a given Doueihi at this point of his career after all his injuries struggles to beat his opposite man when playing in the centres.

Favourite: The Panthers are well-backed to continue their winning ways.

My tip: With the Knights and Titans to follow in the next two weeks, the Panthers could very well be on their way to winning nine games in a row. But it can be easy to look too far ahead and with the return of both Cleary and Yeo, there is also the risk of falling into old habits and gifting a hungry Tigers team cheap field position with errors and yardage penalties. The Panthers should still have too much class, but don't be surprised if this is closer than many expect, especially given the Tigers traditionally put up a fight in this fixture. **Panthers by 8.**

Run. Perhaps its what Souths need to do because the Sharks form has taken a dramatic turn in the last fortnight for the better. Their attack looks vastly improved.

But run is also the thing Sharks hooker Blayke Brailey has started to do and it is tearing teams to shreds through the middle. Against the Dolphins in Round 19 he ran for 111 metres and the following week he made another 118. On both occasions the Sharks won and looked the stronger team.

Over the last 2 seasons, Brailey has made 64 metres or more on 10 occasions and the Sharks won every one of those games. On the 20 occasions over the last 2 years that he ran for more than 45 metres, the Sharks have won 18 of 20 games. When he's run for 45 metres or less, the Sharks have won 9 of 25 matches.

This is no coincidence. He's a smart, elusive and fast runner out of dummy half. He makes good decisions when to run and backs himself close to the line. He's scored just 4 tries over the last 2 seasons, but each time he crossed the line, he ran for 50 metres or more in the match.

Souths come into this match having lost their last 7 straight games and in that period have conceded 231 points (33 points per game). Not the sort of form you want to bring into a contest against a side whose attack is invigorated and powering through the middle. Souths boast one of the best completion rates in the NRL which, given they are second last on the ladder, suggests a very one-dimensional attack. Only the Knights have a worse attack than the Bunnies in 2025.

They rank second last for post contact metres, last for tackle breaks, last for metres gained, last for offloads, last for line breaks and have more missed tackles, on average, than every other team. Maybe they should be referred to as Safe Sydney. The surrender in tackles quickly in order to get quick play-the-balls, they do run from dummy half more frequently than most teams, but do absolutely zero off the back of it. If the Sharks defence can remain tight in the middle, Souths most prominent attacking strength will be nullified.

The Bunnies need to start running. Harder and straighter. This safe approach is sending them further South on the table. They have zero to lose now, so try something different. That may well happen and will be the only way they will beat this Sharks side.

Who to watch: Most notably, Blayke Brailey will be the one to watch. Everything is happening around him right now and that's on the back of his own hard work and his new running game which compliments the side so well. Because he has the side rolling forward constantly, its creating space for his halves, especially Nicho Hynes who is also at his best when running the ball. When Hynes has less room to work with, he plays sideways and the Sharks attack shuts down. His running game has always been a strength and now that he's playing straighter, he's a real weapon.

Alex Johnston is always one to watch. While the prolific try scorer is just 5 tries away from reaching the record of 212 set by Ken Irvine, he has historically struggled to score against the Sharks, scoring just 4 times in 11 games against them. Apart from the record he's approaching, Johnston is a gifted finisher and is a key target for the Souths attack. Watch for Souths to go his way frequently.

Favourite: The Sharks are comfortable favourites here. Sharks have had a form reversal and playing good footy and are back inside the top 8. The Bunnies are besieged with injuries and languishing at the bottom end of the table and stuck on a 7 game losing streak. The Sharks have won 27 of their last 35 games against sides placed 15th or lower on the ladder since 2016.

My tip: Sharks to be too much for the understrength Bunnies. **Cronulla by 20.**

Favourite: Canberra are the bookies favourites for this game.

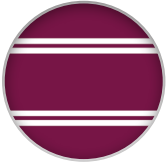

Sunday's top of the table clash sees the second placed Bulldogs needing a win to stay in the hunt for the Minor Premiership, taking on the seventh placed Manly who are in a precarious position as a loss could see them drop out of the top 8.

Manly's predicament isn't just this game. The Sharks are equal on competition points but still have a bye in hand and are playing the injury-riddled, out-of-form second last Rabbitohs this week and the next team below them on the ladder, just 2 points behind, is the Dolphins who have a bye this week, the Dolphins points differential is vastly superior to both Manly and Cronulla. Also on 22 points is the Roosters, who this week play a somewhat out-of-form Melbourne. Manly cannot afford a loss and if they do lose, it can't be a heavy loss.

The Bulldogs have seemingly hit a reset button after their Round 13 bye. No one really knows why the team running first had to do a reset for, but it's not worked out. Lachlan Galvin arrived at the club for their Round 14 win over lowly Parramatta and their Round 15 win over lowly Souths. The Dogs lost their next 2 games against Penrith and Brisbane, which saw Galvin dropped for Round 19. The Dogs beat the Cowboys in a miserable performance by both sides. Galvin returned last week for the match against the struggling Dragons and the Dogs snuck home courtesy of a Galvin pass that put Jethro Rinakama over for the match winning try.

But lets be honest here, because while the media talked up Galvin for the play, the fact was Tyrell Sloan rushed a long way up and in way too early and essentially created the play for Galvin. Galvin's arrival has had a negative impact on the Bulldogs attack so far, not solely because of him, but because the team was functioning effectively with Matt Burton at five-eighth and Toby Sexton at halfback. Now they've brought in a new five-eighth and they're trying to figure out which of their halves to displace to accommodate Galvin, whose style is different to both the Bulldogs halves.

Manly last week scraped home in a gallant effort against the Storm in Melbourne, but their attack was at times a clumsy mess. Luke Brooks had a strong game and was the best performing half on the field. Daly Cherry-Evans was heavily targeted by the Storm defence and was almost relegated to being a catch and pass player who also kicked at the end of sets.

If the Sea Eagles can improve their attack via some better mobility through the middle, especially towards the end of their sets, so as to give Cherry-Evans some space, their defence is good enough to withstand the disjointed Bulldogs attack. If both these sides perform this weekend the same way they did last weekend, Manly may well sneak away with another victory.

The Bulldogs club though are eyeing a massive milestone here and that might be enough to motivate them for a victory, because a Bulldogs win here will be the 1000th for the club in its first grade history.

Who to watch: All eyes will be on Lachlan Galvin whose running game is his biggest asset. Look for him to capitalise on lazy markers and tired defenders on the edge.

For Manly, their rookie fullback Lehi Hopoate has been a revelation, so much so that he's forced Tom Trbojevic out of his custodian role and into the centres. His ball playing skills are improving every week making him a vital link man on either edge. Siosiaua Taukeiaho had a massive game last week, running for over 200 metres against the Storm. He'll be tough to handle in the middle again.

Favourite: The Bulldogs are favourites but not commanding favourites. Manly have a lot of recent success against the Bulldogs having won 12 of their last 14 clashes since 2017.

My tip: The Bulldogs wins of late have been against struggling sides and those wins have not been convincing. Manly have now won 3 straight with their last win coming against the Storm in Melbourne – a rare feat for any team to achieve. This will likely be close, so I'll pick the roughie for fun. **Sea Eagles by 2.**

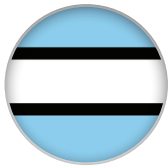

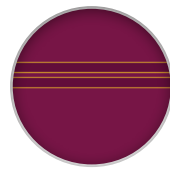

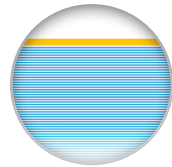

NRLW Round 4 Preview

Warriors v Gold Coast

The Titans travel over the ditch to take on the Warriors for the first ever time. The Warriors have had a rough start to their 2025 season, having started the year on a loss to the Roosters, before going on to beat the Eels for their first home game, and then losing to the Knights last week 36-20. The NZ side currently sit one better than the Titans, where they are respectively in ninth and tenth place on the ladder. Due to injury Rob Griffiths has been forced to make a few changes to the side. With Emily Curtain out with a hip injury, Lydia Turua-Quedley will start as halfback after starting from the bench for the first three rounds and Avery-Rose Carmont will make her NRLW debut from the bench. Makayla Eli also makes her NRLW debut in jersey number 17, joining Lavinia Kitai and Maairie Puketapu on the bench.

Also having a tough start to the season, the Titans lost their two opening matches to QLD rivals: the Cowboys and Broncos. The side managed to bounce back though and defeat the Tigers in Round 3 with a final score of 24-12. Having missed last week's game due to a suspension for a dangerous contact charge, Georgia Hale returns to the side to take on her former side, for the only personnel change made by Karyn Murphy. To allow for Hale to slot back into the side as lock, Sienna Lofipo shifts to prop and Takoda Thompson moves back to the bench.

Who to watch: Both decorated and experienced players, the battle of the fullbacks will be an intriguing one to watch. Returning home to the Warriors this season after spending time at the Titans and Raiders, Apii Nicholls is an experienced player, and was the first player to resign for the Warriors after they announced their return to the competition. This season, Nicholls has so far had three try assists and nine tackle breaks. Previously playing for the Broncos and Dragons before joining the Titans in 2023, Jaime Chapman has made 33 appearances and scored 20 tries. Missing the Round 2 clash against the Broncos, Chapman has scored one try for her two games so far, along with five tackle breaks.

My tip: I think it will be a close game, with both sides still trying to find their feet. **Titans by 4.**

Sydney v Canterbury

The undefeated champions take on the exciting new kids on the block on Saturday afternoon as the Sydney Roosters take on the Canterbury Bulldogs at Allianz Stadium. Coming into round four as the only undefeated team, the Sydney Roosters had an inconsistent performance in their 30-26 win over the Brisbane Broncos last week in Brisbane. The Roosters were dominant in the first half especially the first ten minutes when they were able to open up an 18-0 lead before leading 24-6 at the break. The second half the Broncos came back and in the end it was goal kicking that saw the Roosters survive. No changes have been made to the Roosters team from last week with coach John Strange showing faith in his side.

Just ten seconds were left on the clock when the Canterbury Bulldogs conceded the match-winning try that gave the Blue & Whites their first NRLW loss when they went down 18-14 to the St George Illawarra Dragons at Accor Stadium. The Bulldogs went down 10-0 early but came back to level the scores at 10-10. The sides were level for most of the second half but a rushed field goal attempt from Tayla Preston that missed gave the Dragons a seven tackle set and they took advantage of field position to score. The Bulldogs bring back Angelina Teakaraanga-Katoa straight into the side after missing last week through suspension as well as Moana Courtenay who missed last week with a groin injury. The changes see Hope Millard dropping back to the bench with Paea Uilou going to the reserves

Who to watch: Roosters captain Isabelle Kelly has been their best player this season and will need a big impact here. The Roosters will want Kelly at her best to get through the Bulldogs who have shown in their three games that they won't meekly surrender like some other teams and Kelly's numbers will be key for the winning streak to continue. Returning from injury this season, Canterbury fullback Andie Robinson has

started the season with a bang for her new side. The Bulldogs speedster is a danger and her running metres have been over 150m in each of the three games and has had 12 tackle breaks in the three games. The Roosters will need to keep Robinson quiet if they are to take victory.

My tip: It's hard to go past the Roosters; The Bulldogs aren't going to be easybeats though there is just an extra level of class for the tricolours that should get them home. **Roosters by 12.**

North Qld v Canberra

NRLW returns to Townsville as two sides with very differing fortunes in 2025 come to clash as the North Queensland Cowboys take on the Canberra Raiders at Queensland Country Bank Stadium. The Cowboys have had a mixed start to their NRLW season with two wins from their three games so far this season with wins over the Titans and Sharks sandwiching a heavy loss to the Knights in Round two. Last week, the Cowboys were in control for most of their 16-14 win though despite leading 12-4 at halftime, the North Queenslanders had to come from behind to snatch the victory and to survive a last-minute attacking opportunity from the Sharks. Cowboys are boosted by the return of Jakiya Whitfield at fullback after missing last week's win over Cronulla. The changes see Krystal Blackwell move back to the wing and Ana Malupo on the bench. The North Queenslanders have named Kirra Dibb in the reserves after being a late withdrawal last week and Tiana Raftstrand-Smith also in the reserves for a potential return from suspension.

For all the wrong reasons in 2025, the Canberra Raiders have left people stunned as unlike their men's side, the Canberra NRLW team sits at the bottom of the ladder having been heavily beaten in all three games this season. Coming off the back of a 50-point loss the week before, things slightly improved for Canberra losing 46-12 to the Eels. Nothing went right for the Raiders as defence was out the window yet again and inexperience with odd plays plus injury to Zahara Temara hurt the green machine out there. Despite injury concerns, Zahara Temara is named in the side which welcomes back Emma Barnes and Kerehitina Matua who come onto the bench. Mackenzie Wiki comes onto the wing in place of Isabella Waterman.

Who to watch: For the hosts, eyes go to their hooker Emma Manzelmann who has been a star for the Cowboys since coming into the NRLW. The Cowboys captain as named this week has been rock solid in defence and her play out of dummy-half will be key for the Cowboys. Canberra halfback Zahara Temara has been clearly playing through an injury and it's shown with the spark that the Raiders number 7 brings almost not there this season. The experience she brings would be a big loss but her performances have been poor and if the Raiders want to turn around the season Temara has to stand up tonight otherwise the season that is already hanging by a thread is a write-off.

My tip: The Cowboys should have an easy win at home. Their performance in Round 1 against the Titans and then last week against the Sharks should have them primed. The Raiders need a monumental turn-around and in Rugby League that can happen but from how they've played it's hard to see it coming in the hostile territory of Townsville. **Cowboys by 16.**

Parramatta v Newcastle

This Sunday's Round 4 clash between the Parramatta Eels and Newcastle Knights promises to be one of the most anticipated fixtures of the NRLW season to date. With both teams sitting in the top four and coming off convincing wins, this shapes as a potential finals preview. The Knights have dominated the head-to-head record between the two sides, winning four of their five previous encounters. However, 2025 has brought a renewed confidence to Parramatta, and with both teams evenly matched on key stats, fans can expect an intense, physical battle in Western Sydney.

Parramatta bounced back from a scoreless outing in Round 2 against the Warriors with an emphatic 46-12 demolition of the Raiders in Canberra. The Eels ran in eight tries, with Rory Owen bagging a double and Mahalia Murphy leading from the front in the back row. Coach Ryan Walker has stuck solid with the same 17 this week, rewarding consistency and cohesion. Boss Kapua remains sidelined, while Abbi Church retains the fullback role, combining well with speedsters Martha Mataele and Zali Fay on the flanks.

Newcastle, meanwhile, continued their climb up the ladder with a commanding 36-20 win over the Warriors at home. The Knights started fast, with Kayla Romaniuk scoring inside the first 10 minutes and debutant Tess Staines marking her arrival with a powerful try in the corner. Their forwards laid a strong platform, while the halves pairing of Jesse Southwell and Georgia Roche continues to gel nicely. With no changes to the side this week, coach Ronald Griffiths has plenty to be pleased about heading into this top-four showdown.

Who to watch: For the Eels, Rory Owen looms as a genuine strike weapon after her two-try performance last week. If she can find space on the edge again, Parramatta will be hard to contain. Mahalia Murphy also deserves mention for her leadership and work rate on both sides of the ball. For the Knights, Jesse Southwell will once again be central to Newcastle's attack. Her ability to control the tempo and unleash her outside backs could be the difference. Keep an eye on Tess Staines, whose recent form in both grades suggests she could quickly become a fan favourite.

My tip: This is a tough one to call. Newcastle have the edge historically and are in strong form, but the Eels showed just how dangerous they can be when it all clicks. With home ground advantage and momentum on their side, I'm tipping a tight one. **Parramatta by 6.**

St Geo Illa v Brisbane

The Broncos travel down south to Wollongong, to take on the Dragons. The Dragons season got off to a flying start, beating the Raiders 36-14, but then they struggled against the reigning premiers, the Roosters in Round 2, before bouncing back to just beat the Bulldogs in Round 3, 18-14. The Saints will be looking to secure their first back-to-back win of the season. Coach Nathan Cross makes a few changes to his side. After suffering a knee injury, Charlotte Basham returns to the side which forces Shenai Lendill to the bench and Bronte Wilson to reserves. Nita Maynard-Perrin and Pia Tapsell also revert back to the bench, with Zali Hopkins and Pia Tapsell returning as starting hooker and prop respectively.

Having gone two from two and winning both QLD derbies the Broncos were off to a great start to the season sitting top of the table, but then they couldn't quite get the job done against the Roosters last week, losing by four points in a constant back and forth, close battle. Brianna Clark returns to the side as starting prop after suffering an ankle injury, which means Chelsea Lenarduzzi returns to the bench. Lauren Dam also takes Tara McGrath-West's place in the starting side after being ruled out with a foot injury. Skyla Adams also joins the squad for her first game of the season from the bench.

Who to watch: Both fullbacks will be pivotal to their teams' success in attack and will be the secret to getting another win on the board.

Currently leading the NRLW for most tries scored, Teagan Berry has been a core member of the side's spine, having played for the Dragons since 2020. Overall, Berry has scored 31 tries in 35 games, and has already scored two tries this year along with making two try assists and five line breaks.

Sitting just behind Berry, Tamika Upton has scored 30 tries in 40 games across her time at the Broncos and Knights. Having re-joined the Broncos in 2025, she is the key to their attack and is the electric energy they have been missing. Upton scored a double in both Round 2 and 3 this season, along with four try assists and six line breaks.

My tip: Brisbane will be looking to strike again, especially after having just missed out on a win against the Roosters. **Broncos by 10.**

Cronulla v Wests Tigers

The final game of Round 4 sees the Cronulla Sharks host the Wests Tigers in a clash between two teams desperate to find consistency in the 2025 NRLW season. While the Sharks have shown flashes of brilliance, and the Tigers continue to battle for their first win of the year, it's the visitors who remarkably boast a 2-0 head-to-head record over their hosts. The most recent meeting came in the final round of 2024, where the Tigers delivered a strong performance to claim their second win of the year—something they'll be hoping to repeat on Sunday.

Cronulla will be ruing their missed opportunity against the Cowboys last week, falling 16-14 in a game they could have pinched at the death. Despite a slow, error-prone first half

that saw them down 12-4 at the break, they fought back through wingers Georgia Ravics and Cassie Staples but were ultimately let down by their execution and goal-kicking. Craig Palmer has made a couple of key changes heading into this clash. Anessa Biddle returns from suspension to take her spot in the centres, pushing Grace-Lee Weekes to the bench, while Manilita Takapautolo earns a start in the front row with Jacinta Carter sidelined due to concussion protocols.

For the Tigers, it's been a frustrating campaign so far, going down in their third consecutive loss—this time to the Titans at Leichhardt Oval. Coach Brett Kimmorley has swung the axe in an attempt to spark his side into action. Faythe Manera retains her spot in the starting side and will now steer the team from five-eighth, partnering Losana Lutu in a fresh-look halves pairing. Pihuka Berryman-Duff returns to the starting hooker role, while Jessikah Reeves has been named on the bench after clearing HIA protocols. Chelsea Savill remains an

outside chance to return, named in the extended squad.

Who to watch: For the Sharks, Cassie Staples continues to be a strike weapon out wide. Her try last weekend showcased her finishing ability, and with Anessa Biddle returning to the centres, Cronulla's left edge could cause serious problems for the Tigers. For the Tigers, Losana Lutu will be key. With a new halves partner and added responsibility, her kicking game and leadership will be crucial to unlocking a stubborn Sharks defence. Keep an eye on Pihuka Berryman-Duff too—her spark out of dummy half could shift the momentum.

My tip: While the Sharks are tipped to win and have home ground advantage, the Tigers have shown in the past that they know how to trouble this Cronulla outfit. With a reshuffled spine and history on their side, this could be the Tigers' week to break through. **Tigers by 4.**

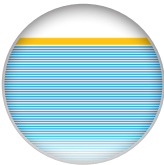

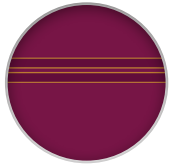
