Panthers' nightmare continues as Dolphins win back to back

The seemingly never-ending nightmare at the foot of the mountains continues as the Dolphins ran riot all over the Panther's defence for 80 minutes in the 30-12 win at Suncorp Stadium.

The evening looked to start with great fortune for the Panthers as Dan Saifiti spilled the football within the first 15 seconds of the contest.

But as the Panthers soon found out, the Dolphins goal-line defence slid everywhere all night as Isaako and Tabuai-Fidow combined to shove Tom Jenkins into touch with Penrith's opening couple of possessions.

The Dolphins then hit the ground running as Herbie Farnworth and Hamiso torched the Panther's defence for the opening score.

Penrith went back to their formulaic defensive patterns as seen with multiple hard hits from Liam Martin, one of which led to Daniel Saifiti's second error of the night.

The Panthers hit back as Nathan Cleary sent through a delicate grubber kick that sat perfectly for Casey McLean to tie the score at 6 a piece.

No matter how far left or right the Panthers shifted the ball the Dolphin's defence would not break, being orchestrated by the conductor at the back in their custodian The Hammer.

With 15 minutes before the break and just the lone tackle inside the Panther's half, The Dolphin's inaugural marquee signing once again sliced through with the accompanying Jake Averillo sending him for a try double.

A few brain explosions from Penrith eventually resulted in Paul Alamoti being sent from the field after failing to make a genuine attempt to wrap his arm and contact direct to the head with moderate force.

Off the back of a 12-man defensive line, the Dolphins went coast to coast sending Jake Averillo over in the broadcast side corner of the ground. Isaako, maintaining his mantle as one of the league's best goal kickers currently, bending it from touch to further the lead, which at 18-6, remained so til halftime.

The Dolphins started the second half much like the first, this time with some soft hands from both interchange forwards Josh Kerr laying a peach on for Connolly Lemuelu. The Redcliffe-based club extended their lead to 18 points.

A near-half hour of scoreless footy was broken in the most bizarre of circumstances as Jack Bostock thought he was playing for the Brisbane Roar, sending it across his own in-goal only for Moses Leota to fall onto it for easily the simplest try of his career.

But on this night, the Dolphins simply just arrived and played much better footy as the star of the show Hamiso Tabuai Fidow finished his 5-star night with a hat-trick in a fantastic long-range effort.

The Dolphins have the joys of playing the Storm in their next start. As for Penrith, they stay on the road and head to Allianz to play the Roosters whom they lost to begin this horrid run of form.

Dragons breathe fire into 2025 with thrashing of Titans

The St George Illawarra Dragons breathed fire into their 2025 season courtesy of a 22-point thrashing of the Gold Coast Titans at WIN Stadium.

The Titans thought they opened the scoring in the opening five minutes when Jaylan De Groot sliced through some paper-thin defence. But the Bunker spotted a knock on from Reagan Campbell-Gillard and the try was overturned. A few minutes later, Chris Randall broke through before a desperation tackle from Clint Gutherson saved the day.

Following a six-again, the home side opened the scoring with a well worked move down the left-hand touchline. This sent Christian Tuipulotu into space and he streaked away to score, his celebration was still extravagant despite Shane Flanagan's warnings. Eight minutes later, the Titans reduced the gap to two when David Fifita was able to isolate Lachlan Ilias one-on-one and get the pass away to Brian Kelly to score.

After a lull in the contest where both sides struggled to break through each other's defensive patterns. St George Illawarra capitalised on a Brock Gray crusher tackle to cross for their second try. A terrific short pass from Luciano Leilua caught the Titans defence asleep and Valentine Holmes slid through to score with eight to go before the break.

The Dragons would add a further two tries before the break in a ruthless display of attacking football, punishing the Titans poor handling. The error count kept rising for the visitors and the door continued to open for the home side. Great shape from Flanagan to get Suli on the outside of Kelly and Tyrell Sloan had too much pace for Francis to score.

Just before the break, Leilua's ball playing again caught the Titans asleep as Holmes broke through. The QLD Origin star linked up with Gutherson before finding Kyle Flanagan to go over for a 20-point halftime lead.

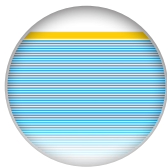
Straight after the break, the Dragons got to work courtesy of a brilliant pass from Flanagan which landed on Tuipulotu's chest to go over untouched out wide. His celebration returned but his match ended prematurely, leaving the game with 20 to go with a hamstring injury. Just on the hour mark, some great passing from Lachlan Ilias caught the Titans edge defence wanting and it was a simple draw and pass to send Sloan over for a second.

From the short restart, the Titans were able to cause carnage. Fifita ran over 30 metres before linking up with Beau Fermor who held the ball up nicely and sent Phil Sami over for a try to cut the gap to 24 points. The night for the visitors got worse when Brock Gray ended up in the sinbin for a high tackle.

The Dragons put an exclamation mark on this one when Ilias had the ball on a string. It was a terrific ball to the young edge forward Dylan Egan who was one of the best on ground to score in the final ten minutes. The Titans added consolation when AJ Brimson finished off a great team try courtesy of some great work from Jayden Campbell but it was all in vein as the Dragons won by 22 points.

Roosters stun Broncos to get season back on track

After a slow start to the season, the Roosters have snapped a three-match losing streak to stun the Broncos by 26-16 at Suncorp Stadium tonight.

A two-try performance from Roosters centre Billy Smith proved the difference, in what could be a season turning performance for Trent Robinson's men who simply out enthused and showed gritty determination to ensure they left Queensland with a valuable two competition points.

Skipper James Tedesco was enormous for the visitors in a typical barnstorming performance running for over 200 metres, as well as a try assist and linebreak.

Brisbane were very scrappy with poor discipline costing the home side, who were simply out muscled by a physical Roosters pack. The poor second half performance will no doubt lead to some rough training sessions at Red Hill from coach Michael Maguire this week.

Despite coming into the match as underdogs, the Tricolours had plenty of ball early and took the lead following a penalty goal to Sandon Smith.

The visitors then extended their lead minutes later, when Billy Smith leapt high to pluck the ball away from Broncos fullback Reece Walsh to score a superb opening try for the visitors.

Smith then went from hero to villain when he was sent to the Sin Bin for a high shot on Reece Walsh. Brisbane took advantage of the extra man when Selwyn Cobbo snatched an intercept to race 50 metres to score a try in the corner.

The home side then had back-to-back tries through Reece Walsh, who broke clear to score after some great lead up work from Adam Reynolds who converted to level the scores at 8 all.

Brisbane then lost Jack Gosiewski to the Sin Bin for a high shot on Victor Radley to give the Broncos a taste of a one-man advantage. Reece Walsh then kicked a penalty goal following a high shot on Adam Reynolds from Angus Crichton to take back the lead.

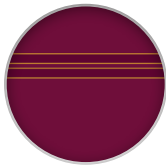
The major turning point came just before halftime, when Billy Smith then grabbed his second try following a magnificent put down off a James Tedesco grubber close to the line. The Roosters then took the momentum when Angus Crichton crashed over after a clever dummy half run from Connor Watson to give the Roosters at 20-12 lead at halftime.

Brisbane needed to hit back first after halftime and they did when Jesse Arthars scampered over for a try in the corner following a neat pass from Walsh to narrow the scoreline to 20-16.

With the game in the balance the Roosters pack managed to contain Broncos internationals in Payne Haas and Patrick Carrigan well, while Angus Crichton and Nat Butcher got through the tough stuff to keep the visitors on the front foot.

Off the back of a mountain of possession, the Broncos defensive line finally cracked when Nat Butcher crashed over off a neat pass from Watson at the ruck which proved the match winner and leave the Suncorp Stadium crowd disappointed.

The Tricolours now prepare for a huge clash with a desperate Penrith at Allianz Stadium next Saturday, while Brisbane will look travel over the ditch to play the Warriors in Auckland.

Sharks win, Will scores in the wild wild West

The Cronulla Sharks have bounced back into form with a 24-18 win over the Manly Sea Eagles in the first match of a double header held at Optus Stadium.

Claiming their fifth win from six matches against the Sea Eagles during Craig Fitzgibbon's tenure as coach, the Sharks led all the way - despite a nervous final set - to get back in the winner's circle following back-to-back losses over the past fortnight.

In a first half which saw both teams struggle to make an impression on the scoreboard, the hosts broke the deadlock with Sam Stonestreet (35th minute) running onto a cutout pass from Braydon Trindall to touch down in the corner.

The Sharks capitalised on a penalty from inside their territory with seconds left in the half to take an 8-0 lead to the change of ends after Trindall threaded through a grubber kick to give Stonestreet (39th minute) his second double of the season.

Both teams had tries denied minutes apart early in the second half with Will Kennedy making a length of the field kick return - only for the bunker to rule Stonestreet obstructed Tommy Talau - while Clayton Faulalo's acrobatic effort came up short after replays showed the ball grounded on the sideline.

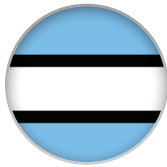
The disappointment of being denied by the bunker did little to deter Kennedy (46th minute) as the fullback dazzled the Sea Eagles' defence with footwork to give the Sharks a 14-0 lead.

Two tries in quick succession shifted the momentum of the match in the Sea Eagles' favour with Faulalo (52nd minute) pouncing on a grubber and Luke Brooks (56th minute) racing 90 metres after snatching an intercept to narrow the margin to two points.

A left side shifted finished off by Mawene Hiroti (63rd minute) gave the Sharks breathing space which was converted into a victory when Tom Hazelton (75th minute) crashed over from close range.

Daly Cherry-Evans (78th minute) finished off an intercept run from Talau to give the Sea Eagles one set to send the game into golden point, however the Sharks stood tall to emerge with a win in Western Australia.

The Eels 12 year relationship with the Northern Territory has ended in disappointment, with the Raiders crushing the blue and golds 50-12.

The Raiders immediately got the ball rolling with a quick try to Joe Tapine, who punished a slow Eels defensive line defending just metres off the try line. But the Eels were soon able to hit back, a remarkable solo try to Dylan Brown keeping the game tied after 20 minutes.

But the Raiders ended the half in style, first by a lovely grubber from Jamal Fogarty which allowed Ethan Strange to score his first try of 2025. Then minutes later, a strong kick return by Kaeo Weekes and Xavier Savage set them up on the attack again, which soon led to Hudson Young being rewarded with his first try of the night. Then finally, on the stroke of halftime, Strange broke the line and found Matt Timoko in support to give the Green Machine a 24-6 lead at the break.

To their credit the Eels did not simply roll over and die in the face of pressure, dominating possession in the first few minutes of the second half and being rewarded with a try through Josh Addo-Carr to cut the lead to 12. But once Fogarty knocked over a penalty goal with 25 minutes remaining, it appeared as though all morale left within the Eels completely faded and they were left sitting ducks for a rampant Raiders side.

Young's second was the first domino to fall, as he pounced on a ball dislodged by an Eel that was rolling around in goal. Then it was Xavier Savage, being awarded a penalty try after the Bunker ruled a slight grab by Addo-Carr was enough to stop him from winning the race to a bouncing ball. Matt Nicholson charged onto a Tapine offload and put the Raiders in sight of 50, which they cracked minutes later when a Strange offload allowed Seb Kris to outrun a fatigued Eels defence to wrap up the win.

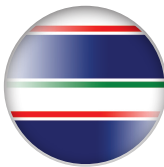

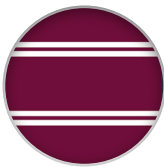

Who to watch: The Sea Eagles' hard-running back-rower, Haumole Olakau'atu, loves playing the Red V—crossing for four tries in five games against them. He'll be extra fired up as he notches his 100th NRL appearance.

The Dragons' rookie back-rower, Dylan Egan, announced himself in style last week and has retained his spot. He'll be one to watch as he continues his rise in first grade.

Favourite: Manly are currently sitting as the slight favourites going into this one.

My tip: With their place in the top eight on the line and playing in front of a home crowd, expect Manly to dig deep. It won't be easy against a Dragons side brimming with confidence, but the Sea Eagles should have just enough in the tank. **Manly by 6.**

Three years of sacrifice leads Bulldogs to 2025 resurrection

Although it's been a seemingly easy run to start 2025, they have done their most of their winning without integral pieces of the premiership run in Matt Burton and Viliame Kikau (both of which they hope to be healthy for the contest.)

Bennett's Bunnies are looking to bounce back after suffering an 8 point loss to the on the rise Cowboys. Sitili Tupouniua is the only other change for the Dogs, coming in for Harry Hayes. Viliame Kikau has been listed as a reserve in 23 and could be a late inclusion.

As for the Bunnies, Alex Johnston is sidelined with injury. Replacing him is returning three-quarter Campbell Graham who was last seen in Round 3. Jayden Sullivan makes way for Cody Walker and included on the bench looking to debut is 23 year old Englishman Lewis Dodd at the expense of utility forward Liam Le Blanc. Josh Schuster is listed as a reserve after having a mixed return to NSW Cup last week.

Who to watch: With every back-rower exploding this year, both Jacob Preston and Keaon Koloamatangi have a pivotal opportunity to impress New South Wales Coach Laurie Daley.


Preston has averaged 11 carries a game with 4 tackle breaks per match, as for Keaon he can expect to get his hands dirty defensively, making only 25 tackles a game in his minutes this season. Both should play on the same side, grab the popcorn and enjoy!

Favourite: As they should be, the Bulldogs are the firm favourites in this one by 9.5+. Once again, Wayne Bennett licks his lips at the thought of that, definitely some value for the Rabbitohs considering the Dogs' Good Friday woes.

My tip: I expect both teams to come of the proverbial back fence from the fireworks. Both packs will be battered and bruised from the physicality which should open up acres of space for the diminutive Jye Gray and the Red Corvette Bronson Xerri. The scores will remain low in the first half and explode in the last 20 minutes as the fatigue becomes too much for both teams. Not quite the Golden Point that the rugby league purest will be hoping for, but Souths will keep it close before the dogs kick away late down the last 50 on the track. **Bulldogs by 8 - I'll go 30-22.**

Missing from their loss against the Dragons, Jahrome Hughes is a key player in the Storm side, and it's obvious that although Melbourne has a strong spine, but when he is absent that are missing their chief playmaker who holds everything together. In his five games this year he has scored one try, whilst making four try assists and four line break assists.

Favourite: Storm are favoured to add another two points to their 2025 tally.

My tip: Melbourne are currently on fire, scoring 90 points within their last two games, however they currently are not playing the full 80 minute game. During both their win over the Warriors and Sea Eagles, the Storm stopped scoring in the last 20 minutes and instead let through five tries combined in these games. Although by the 60th minute in both matches it was obvious that they were going to win, the decline in defence and attack is something that should not continue for their long-term game. Two sides coming off disappointing losses in round six meet in Auckland, as the New Zealand Warriors look to avenge their thrashing from last week against the Brisbane Broncos.

One side were blown out of the water as soon as they walked onto the field last week, while the other seemed to lack confidence at home to a side firmly in the bottom four. It was a pretty dour week for Brisbane and the Warriors last weekend, as they both look to bounce back on Saturday night.

In what could be a copy and paste job from last weeks Storm v Warriors preview, the Melbourne outfit came out firing to condemn the Warriors to their biggest loss of 2025 so far. At one point, the Warriors were letting in tries for fun as they conceded nearly a point a minute in the first half last week - Scott Bailey yet again on speed dial with the Storm being up 30-0 at half time

While the Warriors knuckled down in the second half, it was still an ugly 42-14 loss for the Auckland outfit. Further compounding that loss, the Warriors also now have to deal with James Fisher-Harris missing time due to a pectoral injury that will have him sidelined for the coming weeks.

The Broncos were outplayed at home by the Roosters, going down 26-16 in front of over 40,000 fans at Suncorp Stadium. We saw flashes of the Broncos best, with Adam Reynolds and Reece Walsh popping up in stages but the Roosters were too good off the back of Hugo Savala's kicking game.

The sin binning of Jack Gosiewski and the concussion of Jesse Arthurs ended up being too much for the Broncos to handle, with their attack stifled by the Roosters forward pack. Whilst Reece Walsh somewhat looked like his old self, he will need to be at his best as he returns to Go Media Stadium to face his old side.

There are changes galore for the Warriors with three injuries from last week forcing changes. The aforementioned injury to James Fisher-Harris sees Jackson Ford start and Jacob Laban move onto the bench. Rocco Berry is out, so Kurt Capewell will play at centre, Leka Halasima starts in the second row and Te Maire Martin gets his first NRL appearance of the year from the bench. Ed Kosi also gets a recall with Charnze Nicoll-Klokstad in concussion protocol, as Taine Tuapiki moves to fullback and Kosi comes onto the wing.


The Broncos lose Jack Gosewski to suspension, with Jordan Riki returning from his own ban to start in the second row. Tyson Smoothy will come see his first action of the year from the pine, replacing Martin Taupau. Deine Mariner remains in the reserves, named as the 18th man.

Who to watch: Mitchell Barnett will have to lead from the front with the absence of James Fisher-Harris, coming up against the form forward pack lead by Payne Haas. The NSW Origin forward will have to make an impact early in this game, moreso defensively than in attack in order to thwart the insanely strong Broncos pack. Averaging over 125 running metres and 33 tackles, Barnett will have to go well above that if the Warriors are to start their home stand with a win against one of the competition favourites.

At the risk of highlighting the obvious, Payne Haas could make or break this game very early on in the piece. The Warriors are susceptible through the middle and if any forward in the game today is going to make light of those issues, it is Payne Haas. The premier forward in the game today, if Haas can get rolling against the Warriors, it could get incredibly messy.

Favourite: Brisbane are well-supported here to bounce back and collect the win.

My tip: Despite last weeks result in Melbourne and what that may say about this Warriors side, they can, on their day, take it to the best in the competition. It will not be the Warriors day on Saturday though - a disshevelled Warriors line up coming up against a Brisbane side that is looking to bounce back on the road in what will be the first game Reece Walsh plays at Go Media Stadium since leaving the Warriors... look out. **Broncos by 14.**

For the Panthers, it has been a rough start for the boys that have had most things go their way over the last five years. After returning from Vegas, the Panthers have seemingly left most good things about their play over there. So far this year, they are the second worst defensive side in the competition and have been a shadow of themselves in key performance indicators such as discipline (especially in the first half) and errors.

To beat the Roosters, they have to go back to basics and dictate the terms they want to play on. That was something that had frustrated the Bondi boys in all their losses against this team since 2020. If they have the better share of possession, they will find a way to break you down. Another key point here is the forward pack, outside of Kangaroo duo Lindsay Smith and Isaiah Yeo, it feels like they are lacking something this season. The side just doesn't have the same lift when coming out of trouble as in previous seasons and it's something that Ivan Cleary is hoping the nine-day turnaround will readjust attitudes at the club.

Onto team news. Izack Tago has been dropped to the bench with Luke Garner coming into the centres. Elsewhere, Blaize Talagi keeps his 5/8 jersey while Mitch Kenny is a welcome inclusion at hooker with Luke Summerton reverting to the NSW Cup.

Who to watch: If you know me for five seconds, you probably knew where I was going with this one. New Zealand prop Naufahu Whyte has been one of the shining lights for the Roosters this season. A strong carrier of the ball, averaging well over 100 metres a game and having explosive runs that change matches. The only knock on his game is a few defensive reads he would love back in review, but look for the 23-year-old to continue from where he left off in Round 2.

For the Panthers, the focus is squarely on Izack Tago. Ever since his hot start to 2024 where he capitalised on some favourable match-ups, it feels like we've said the same thing over and over again on his form. It has just been consistently inconsistent, one minute he looks like he will look fine in a NSW Cup spot, the next he is making great defensive decisions and running hard out of his own end. Currently, his form suggests a stint in NSW Cup as he approaches a big decision in his career trajectory.

Favourite: Believe it or not, the Panthers come into this one as the bookies favourites. Penrith are undefeated at the new Allianz Stadium.

My tip: It feels like a game that the Panthers simply have to win. It's not quite Grand Final territory yet for the Mountain Men, but boy it's approaching steadily after a 1-5 start to the year. For the Roosters, they are riding high and are looking for something not achieved in a decade thanks to quirky scheduling and poor play. It's going to come down to the final five again and that could be enough for either side to win, it's really a toss of the coin scenario. **Roosters by 4.**

‘And on the third day, there was more rugby league’

The Gold Coast Titans will look to rise up the premiership ladder when they host an Easter Sunday clash against the in-form Canberra Raiders.

Returning to CBUS Super Stadium intent on making amends following back-to-back losses, the Gold Coast Titans will be eyeing an improved defensive display after conceding a dozen tries over the past fortnight.

Suffering a 38-16 loss to the Dragons last Friday to remain winless in Wollongong from seven attempts, coach Des Hasler will welcome back captain Tino Fa’asuamaleaui in a reshuffle that also sees Izaac Fa’asuamaleaui and Jojo Fifita join the side in place of Brock Gray, Arama Hau and Allan Fitzgibbon.

The Titans will host a match on Easter Sunday for only the third time in their history; the side triumphed over the Knights (2019) and Dragons (2023) in their two previous Easter Sunday home fixtures.

Chasing their third straight win following a half century in the Northern Territory last Saturday, the Canberra Raiders will be hoping to extend a dominant record against the Titans.

Winning 13 out of 18 matches against their weekend opponents during Ricky Stuart’s tenure as coach, including the past four matches in succession, Zak Hosking will make his return in place of Simi Sasagi on the bench, while Josh Papalii drops to the bench with Morgan Smithies starting at lock.


Last week’s 50-12 victory over Parramatta was the sixth time the Raiders have scored 50 points in a match during Stuart’s time as head coach.

Who to watch: Coming a long way from the teenager who debuted against the Raiders seven years ago, Moeaki Fotuaika has matured into one of the best players developed by the Titans. Providing solid impact in the front row with more than 100 running metres and 28 tackles on average this season, the 25-year-old Queensland and Tongan representative has remained consistent amid fluctuating team performances. Facing off against one of the premier forward packs in the league, the Titans will need Fotuaika to be at his best if they are to record their first win over the Raiders since 2021.

Mounting a strong case as arguably the best edge forward in the game over the opening rounds, Hudson Young will be determined to continue his try-scoring prowess on Sunday afternoon. Scoring five tries in six matches, including consecutive doubles in the side’s past two victories, the 26-year-old has made a strong case for a recall to the New South Wales team after being dropped following the Blues’ loss in last year’s series opener. Getting on the scoreboard in his past three matches against the Titans, look for Young to feature prominently as the Raiders look to go three on the trot.

Favourite: The Raiders are expected to get the chocolates on Sunday afternoon with their first win in Queensland since last June.

My tip: Gold Coast and Canberra have met twice before over the Easter long weekend, resulting in one win apiece. With this being the third Easter meeting between the sides, it would take nothing short of divine intervention to prevent the Raiders from posting their third straight win at the expense of the Titans’ third straight loss. **Raiders by 3.**

The Knights and Sharks do battle this Sunday up in Newcastle with the Knights in a world of trouble, as their almost non-existent attack has to compete against the solid defence and rejuvenated attack of the Cronulla Sharks.

The Knights attack is in a dire situation. At the end of Round 6, all bar 3 teams have scored 100 points. The Warriors (who have played 5 games) have scored 98 points, last placed Parramatta have scored 79 points and the Knights (also played 5 games) have a paltry 46 points – an average of 9.2 points per game.

Statistically, in recent times and in the entire history of the game, a score of 19 or better ensures a minimum 50% chance of success, the Knights need to score at better than half their average already this year to reach that mark. They've scored 10 points in their last 274 minutes of play.

And it's not like they've been up against competition heavyweights either. Perennial strugglers (in recent seasons anyways) the Titans and the Wooden spoon side for the last 3 seasons, the Wests Tigers have been their opponents either side of their match against the top-of-the-table Bulldogs.

The Knights have actually had a rather favourable draw to start the season and while defensively they've been very good, their attack would need to be upgraded in order for it to be regarded as pedestrian.

As a team they rank in the bottom four for line breaks, post contact metres, decoy runs, metres gained, runs, kick return metres, try assists (they have 6, the next worst sides have 11), line break assists and handling errors.

This is an attacking unit that is going through the motions. They are running the same system so frequently every game that they have become very easy to defend against. To the point that they have resorted to playing a bash and barge style, with the only attacking flair coming from offloads – their halves are almost redundant, basically, they are there to kick the ball at the end of the set, and even then its just a high kick to the wingers – how long before they decide to get a few extra wide ball-runners to man the halves and kick?

Their defence is doing great things, but their attack needs to....exist.

The Sharks have found their mojo again and they've really created a dynamite running game on the right side of the field, producing points regularly for them. Their middle is their strength in attack and defence, but the Knights middle defence could well contain them. So the focus for the Sharks will be their back rowers and centres. It wouldn't surprise if Blayke Brailey and Braydon Trindall take the bulk of the organizing duties in the middle of the field in order to give Nicho Hynes space out wide.

Who to watch: For the Knights Greg Marzhew carries have been powerful and given the Knights attacking woes, it'd be smart for fullback Kalyn Ponga to send the kick return duties to Marzhew wherever possible and then give Ponga the ability to run from dummy half for the second tackle against a retreating or stationary defensive line.

The Sharks will be utilizing their back rowers when in prime attacking range. This is where fullback William Kennedy tends to involve himself as a support runner and link man. His brilliant footwork and pace gets him through gaps, outside defenders and exploiting defensive gaps in order to put others in for tries. Addin Fonua-Blake has been in brilliant form already and loves nothing more than a challenge. Expect him to have a huge game.

Favourite: Despite being a Knights home game, the Sharks change of form last week against Manly, coupled with their dominant recent record over the Knights (Sharks have won 12 of their last 17 games against Newcastle), the Sharks have been placed as the clear favourite.

My tip: If last week is the best guide, the Sharks will do this easy. And I'm going with that. **Sharks by 20.**

Galvin dropped, Moses returns as Tigers meet Eels on Easter Monday

The Easter Weekend will come to a close on Monday afternoon in Parramatta, where the Tigers will 'host' the Eels despite the location. This is undoubtedly one of the games of the weekend, with Eels playmaker Mitch Moses returning from injury for his first game of the season, and 19 year old Lachlan Galvin nowhere to be seen in the team list for the Tigers. Form should see the Tigers take the two points, but this week's commotion presents a good opportunity for the Eels to steal a rare win and get themselves off the bottom of the table.

Hype has been steadily building in Concord throughout the season so far, with the Tigers' defensive resolve helping them to a 3-3 record and 7th place on the ladder. They nearly shut out Newcastle last weekend, only conceding in the dying minutes of their 20-4 victory. The Monday after their win saw a statement from the club confirming that Lachlan Galvin would be departing the Wests Tigers following the 2026 season and the consequent media frenzy has focussed on how the Tigers should choose to handle the situation.

These questions were answered in part on Tuesday when the release of team lists confirmed Galvin's dropping. It remains to be seen if this is a permanent measure, or if Galvin will be able to get out of the remainder of his deal at Wests. In his 100th NRL appearance, Adam Doueihi is Lui's new halves partner, somewhat surprisingly named in the 7 jersey to Lui's 6. Elsewhere, Brent Naden plugs Doueihi's gap at centre in what will be his first game of the season following a pre-season injury. A recurring hamstring injury for Jeral Skelton means Luke Laulili has received a call up onto the wing.

With just one win to their name in 2025, Parramatta have really been struggling. After a thrilling victory over the Dragons thanks to a Zac Lomax golden point field goal two weeks ago, there was hope that the Eels would be able to build confidence and momentum going forward. However that doesn't appear to be the case, getting smashed by Canberra 50-12 last week in Darwin and Lomax being ruled out for six weeks. The lack of star playmaker Mitch Moses due to a foot injury has meant their spine has lacked experience and ability.

In a boost for Parramatta, Moses has been named to return two weeks earlier than first expected, lining up alongside Dylan Brown in the halves. There are a number of other big changes to the Eels' 17, with forwards Ryan Matterson, Charlie Guymer, and Joe Ofanhangau all dropping out of the side, as well as replacement half Dean Hawkins. Jack Williams and Kelma Tuilagi are the new inclusions to the starting 13 whilst Matt Doorey and Luca Moretti join the bench. Joey Lussick's thumb injury means he's still around a month away from returning, but Maltese international Ryley Smith will continue at hooker in his place.

These two sides have already met this year, with the Tigers coming away with a big victory in round two. The Tigers have won the past three games against the Eels at Parramatta.

Who to watch: Brent Naden was in great form for the Indigenous All Stars earlier this year, and was also off to a brilliant start in the Tigers' pre-season game against Parramatta when he unfortunately suffered a serious knee injury. He returned to footy last week in NSW Cup, helping the Magpies record a 40-24 win over the Knights with 199 run metres to his name, 83 of which were post contact. His return to fitness is timed perfectly with the axing of Galvin, allowing Doueihi to slot into the halves. Naden is also a potential option as a half if Fainu remains injured and Galvin remains outside the 17, with Naden having excelled as a five-eighth last season for the Magpies. He will want to have a good game to reinstall some confidence following his time out with injury.

Mitch Moses is the big inclusion for Parramatta. Their key halfback has been sorely missed so far this year, and if the Eels want to fight their way off the bottom of the ladder his return may be the turning point that they need to utilise. The former Tiger will want to have his hand in everything to make a statement upon his return, and if he doesn't get involved, I don't see this game going Parramatta's way. If the 30 year old Lebanon and Australia international can't find form, the Eels season will be over, but if he can instill some life into the team then maybe they can start building some confidence and momentum. How he performs in this game may very well be an indicator for how the Eels go for the rest of the season.

Favourite: Tigers are strong favourites against the struggling Eels.

My tip: Despite this game's context being sharply in contrast to that of their round two clash, I think the Tigers without Lachlan Galvin will want to prove they don't need him to dispose of a struggling Eels team.. **Tigers by 20.**
