Fogarty added a penalty goal after the hosts poor first half discipline carried over into the second stanza to lead 30-0. Manly's strong domination of possession and territory continued in the second half and a terrific crash ball from Jake Simpkin sent Olakau'atu over to score. An inside/outside play from Ben Trbojevic to Tolutau Koula sent Manly on their way for their seventh try and the new age Sea Eagles were absolutely flying at Kayo Stadium,

The problems continued for the Dolphins with every attempt at thwarting Manly's attacking seemingly failing. Every loose pass was touched, giving Manly a fresh set. Ben Trbojevic was the next beneficiary with a crash ball on his way to the line. Manly soon hit the 50-burger in fine style as Ben Trbojevic charged through before linking up with Tolu Koula to break away before Selwyn Cobbo to make an incredible tackle before finding an offload to Corey Waddell to score.

The Dolphins finally put some possession together but it came all too late despite scoring three tries in a bizarre five minute window. Averillo soon found some space to burn down the right edge on a kick return before linking up with Tabuai-Fidow to cross for a second try. The counter attacking footy continued for the Dolphins with Selwyn Cobbo going down the right edge before linking up with the ever trying Herbie Farnworth to score.

It was a night to celebrate for Kieran Foran and the Eagles as they cap off a tumultuous week with a 34 point verdict.

# Beating Canterbury makes for a Good Friday for Souths

A 20-point haul from Latrell Mitchell has paved the way for the South Sydney Rabbitohs to record a 32-24 victory over the Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs.

Extending their dominance over the Bulldogs on Good Friday to ten wins from 14 clashes since 2012, the Rabbitohs fought back from a halftime deficit to overwhelm a Bulldogs' side hampered by the loss of captain Stephen Crichton with a shoulder injury.

Playing in front of a crowd of 49,813 supporters at Accor Stadium, the Rabbitohs struck the opening blow against the run of play with Connor Tracey throwing an intercept pass to Alex Johnston (5th minute), who raced 90 metres for his fifth try of the season.

The Bulldogs responded midway through the half with Marcelo Montoya (20th minute) tip-toeing his way inside the sideline only for Cody Walker to respond moments later with a chip kick that saw Mitchell (23rd minute) touch down just before the dead ball line.

A Mitchell penalty goal appeared to have the Rabbitohs in control heading towards halftime, however a blue and white surge shifted the momentum after Lachlan Galvin (30th minute) grubbered for himself, Crichton landed a penalty goal, and Sitili Tupouniua (37th minute) crashed over from close range to turn a 6-12 deficit into an 18-12 lead.

Crichton was forced from the field early in the second half with an injured AC joint - prompting a reshuffle which saw Sean O'Sullivan move into the halves and Matt Burton shift to the centres, despite having Bronson Xerri available on the bench - and the Rabbitohs were quick to exploit through Tallis Duncan (46th minute) to lock up the scores at 18-all.

Regaining the lead through Cameron Murray (56th minute), who crossed for his first try in red and green since August 2024, the Rabbitohs secured the result when Mitchell (66th minute) took advantage of a Jamie Humphrey's grubber for his second of the day.

Mitchell completed his 20-point haul with a penalty goal while a consolation try to Connor Tracey (79th minute) rounded out the 32-24 result.

Next week, the Rabbitohs will take on the Raiders as part of the Perth double header on Saturday afternoon, while the Bulldogs will host the Panthers on Thursday evening.

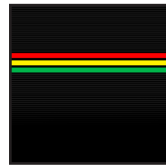

## Premiership race down to one? Panthers hit 50 in drubbing of Storm

The gap between the Penrith Panthers and everybody else in the NRL seems to be getting wider and wider, with the mountain men dismantling a helpless Storm outfit by a scoreline of 50 points to 10 on Good Friday.

Liam Martin had his family accompany him onto the field for his 150th NRL match, and it was a dream start for the milestone man who pounced on a loose ball before powering his way over the line for the first try of the match. A penalty and a couple of set restarts saw Penrith right back on the attack, and Freddy Lussick took advantage of some shoddy marker defence to barge over and make it 10-0 in almost as many minutes.

The Storm looked like they may make a contest of it though, getting some set restarts of their own which were capitalised on through a short ball from Munster to Waitere, who crashed over for his first ever NRL try.

Melbourne had their chances to level up after the Panthers gave away a cheap penalty in their own half, but were unable to as Tuimalatu-Brown was thrown into touch. The Panthers were able to turn on the magic straight away, with Casey McLean finding some room out wide to put Tom Jenkins away in the corner.

Things went from bad to worse for the Storm, who gave away a yardage penalty in the next set, which was enough for Nathan Cleary to take advantage of some tired middle defence and extend the lead to 14.

Any hopes of a miracle Melbourne comeback were extinguished in the shadows of half time, where Casey McLean produced some individual brilliance to score a 40 metre solo try, brushing past Faalogo and Hughes in the process. It meant Penrith went into the sheds 20 points to the good.

The second half started much like the first half ended. The Panthers did well just to keep the ball alive, before Dylan Edwards did even better to get the ball to Brian To'o via a cross field kick, which the great winger was able to haul in on his way to the try line.

If the Storm's spirit wasn't fully broken after that, it was shortly afterwards, when an attacking raid ultimately amounted to nothing due to Stefano Utoikamanu playing the ball incorrectly.

Penrith capitalised on the error as they so often do, marching down the field and producing some more brilliance, this time in the form of a Scott Sorensen flick pass which ended with Luke Garner strolling over for a try. They proved they weren't invincible about five minutes later though, with Papali'i dropping the ball cold with only fresh air between him and the try line.

Melbourne had a rare thing to smile at off the back of that, with Faalogo finding some room out wide and using his speed to score his 8th try of the season.

With the game wrapped up, the Panthers were clearly taking the opportunity to throw the ball around. It resulted in a fair few mistakes, but when it came off it was brilliant, Edwards' 72nd minute try a prime example. Nathan Cleary threw a peach of a cutout pass to Brian To'o in his own half before throwing it back in to his halfback, who found Edwards in support to make it 44-10.

The icing was put on the cake when Jenkins returned a short drop out for a try in the 77th minute, and Alamoti's conversion made it the first time the Storm have conceded 50 points since 2003.

Next week, the Panthers play the struggling Bulldogs at Accor Stadium, while the Storm will look to end a 3 game losing streak at home against the Warriors.

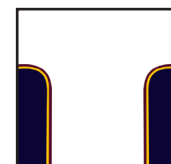

## Knights snap home hoodoo, run roughshod over Raiders

**Newcastle finally broke their long home hoodoo with a commanding 32-12 victory over the Canberra Raiders, delivering a performance full of energy in front of a sold-out McDonald Jones Stadium.**

After going winless at home since June 2025, the Knights gave their supporters a long-awaited afternoon to savour, lifting themselves to 4-1 for the season while last year's minor premiers slumped to 1-4.

The Raiders struck the first blow, capitalising on early momentum when Ethan Strange sliced through the middle and sent Simi Sasagi over under the posts. Canberra looked composed in the opening stages, controlling field position and forcing Newcastle into errors. But once the Knights settled, the tone of the match shifted dramatically.

Greg Marzhew ignited the home side with a powerful finish in the corner, and moments later a defensive miscommunication from Canberra gifted Fletcher Sharpe a simple try off a bouncing bomb. Suddenly Newcastle were in front, and the crowd sensed a momentum swing. The Knights carried that 10-6 lead into halftime, a reward for their growing control of the ruck and their willingness to shift the ball early.

The second half opened with a decisive turning point. Canberra's Savelio Tamale was sin-binned for a professional foul, and Newcastle immediately punished the visitors. Dominic Young, already a constant threat on the edge, burst through a fractured defensive line to score and extend the margin. With the Raiders temporarily down to 12, the Knights tightened their grip on the contest.

Phoenix Crossland then produced one of the moments of the match, slicing through from close range to score his first try in two years. His effort pushed the lead to 20-6 and sent the home crowd into full voice. Newcastle's spine began to take complete control, with Sandon Smith steering the side confidently and Dane Gagai repeatedly breaking the line to create opportunities.

Canberra briefly rallied, stringing together their best passage of the afternoon. Sasagi broke the line from the restart and linked with Strange to pull the margin back to 14 points. For a moment, the Raiders looked capable of mounting a late charge, especially as Newcastle's error count began to creep upward.

But any hope of a comeback was extinguished when the Knights struck twice more in the final ten minutes. Marzhew completed a strong afternoon with his second try, finishing a clever short-side movement. Then, in the defining highlight of the match, Fletcher Hunt burst into space and sent Dominic Young racing 55 metres down the sideline to seal the victory in style. The stadium erupted as Smith added the final conversion.

# Madden drives Eels mad in Golden Point thriller

**Wests Tigers produced one of their most dramatic victories in recent memory, edging the Parramatta Eels 22-20 in a gripping Easter Monday contest that went all the way to Golden Point at a sold-out CommBank Stadium.**

In a match defined by momentum swings, injuries and controversy, the Tigers held their nerve when it mattered most, climbing to second on the ladder in the process.

Wests Tigers trailed 10-0 early after conceding tries to Bailey Simonsson and Junior Paulo, with Parramatta dominating the opening quarter of the clock through strong defence and superior field position. But once the Tigers settled, their attack began to click. Adam Doueihi sparked the comeback with a well-constructed try down the left edge, before Jahream Bula finished a sweeping movement to level the scores. Jock Madden's reliable boot pushed the Tigers ahead 12-10 at halftime, capping a spirited turnaround.

The second half opened with the Tigers continuing to control possession and territory. Tino Tavana soared above the pack to claim a kick and score, extending the lead to 18-10. But the match turned sharply when Luke Laulilii was sin-binned for a mid-air tackle that left Simonsson with a serious ankle injury. With the Tigers reduced to 12 men, Parramatta surged.

Debutant Apa Twidle became the story of the afternoon for the Eels, scoring twice in the space of two minutes to tie the match at 18-18 and electrify the home crowd - including an epic in-the-corner try that had to be seen to be believed. The Tigers were suddenly scrambling, their defensive line stretched and their composure tested. Parramatta appeared to have all the momentum, but their goal-kicking woes kept the contest level.

The final minutes of regulation time were frantic. Both sides traded errors and penalties before each earned a late shot at goal. Mitchell Moses nudged Parramatta ahead 20-18 after a controversial high-tackle penalty, only for Madden to respond moments later with a pressure kick from longer range to send the match into extra time at 20-all.

Moses missed an early field-goal attempt in Golden Point, gifting the Tigers a seven-tackle set. Fielding the kick return on the ensuing set, Jack Williams spilled possession deep in his own half. The Tigers countered, pushing into range for Madden to attempt the winning one-pointer. As he shaped to kick, Dylan Walker rushed up from an offside position in an attempt to charge it down. The infringement was immediately spotted by referee Peter Gough, and the Tigers were awarded a penalty from 15 metres out.

Madden stepped up with the match – and the stadium – holding its breath. His kick sailed cleanly through, sealing a 22-20 victory and sparking wild celebrations among the boisterous Tigers fans.

It was a match that had everything: injuries, controversy, a debut double, a sin-bin, late drama and a Golden Point finish. Parramatta fought bravely despite losing multiple players to injury, but the Tigers showed resilience, patience and belief under pressure. Both teams deserve credit for delivering an Easter Monday classic that will be remembered for years.

### On the brink Bulldogs meet purr-fect Panthers

The out-of-sorts Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs will face their fiercest test of the season when they host the undefeated Penrith Panthers at Accor Stadium on Thursday evening.

Thursday night will see Nathan Cleary achieve another career milestone as he becomes only the 12th player to appear in 200 NRL matches for Penrith; the superstar co-captain made his debut a decade ago and has developed into one of the greatest players of the modern – or any – era.

The Panthers have enjoyed a strong record at Accor Stadium this decade winning 11 out of 15 matches, including three grand finals, while their overall record against the Bulldogs at the venue stands at ten wins and a draw from 18 fixtures.

**Who to watch:** Spending more time on the sidelines than on the field since making the move to Belmore at the start of last season, the Bulldogs will be looking for Stitili Tupouniua to go toe-to-toe with the Panthers' powerhouse pack. Running for just under 50 metres, despite scoring a try, as a starting forward last week, the 28-year-old has proven himself to be a destructive ball runner during his time with the Roosters and on the international stage with Tonga. Named (X) for Thursday night's clash, the Bulldogs will need Tupouniua to increase his involvement if they are to pull off an upset.

Enjoying a day to remember with a hat-trick in his last outing against the Bulldogs last September, Paul Alamoti will be hoping to keep the tries coming on Thursday evening. Starting the year at right centre ahead of three-time premiership winner Izack Tago, the 22-year-old has justified his place in the team with performances that have balanced hard work and defence with attacking flair. Beginning his career in first grade with the Bulldogs three years ago only to be discarded after one season, Alamoti has thrived in the Panthers' system and will be eager to make that known to his former teammates.

**Favourite:** The Panthers have averaged more than twice as many points (38) than the Bulldogs (17.25) so far this season, and will be looking to flex those attacking muscles in a big way on Thursday evening.

**MY TIP:** While the Bulldogs' defensive record has remained respectable, conceding 20 points on average, to start the season, it's hard to see a path where they can match the premiership front-runners in a defensive grind or points scoring free-for-all. **Penrith by 22.**

### Battered and Bruised Broncos looking to continue momentum against Bucking Cowboys.

Despite missing Reece Walsh and Ben Hunt, the Broncos will be looking to pick up a fourth win in a row as they host a Cowboys side who has seen a dramatic improvement in form over the past fortnight.

The Broncos took on a resilient Titans side in Round 5, only being able to build an 8-6 advantage at half time, but were able to finish the job in the second half thanks to a dominant cameo from five-eighth Ezra Mam, who's try and 2 try assists lifted them to a 26-12 victory.

But it came at a significant cost, with Walsh suffering a fractured cheekbone which will see him sidelined for the next 4-6 weeks, while Hunt played through a knee problem which was later revealed to be a significant MCL injury, which will cost him 6-8 weeks on the sideline. Furthermore, Adam Reynolds injured his groin during the match, and while he has been named to start at halfback in this one, there's no guarantee he will be fit to play.

As a result Michael Maguire has turned to two familiar faces among Broncos fans, with Jesse Arthars, who started on the wing against the Titans, named to replace Walsh at the back, while Blake Mozer has been named to replace Hunt on the bench in what could be his first NRL game since 2024 (he was an unused replacement against Melbourne in Round 3). Former Cowboys half Tom Duffy has also been included on the 6-man bench, and will provide cover for Reynolds if he needs to be withdrawn either before or after

The Cowboys meanwhile have put an 0-2 start and a shaky win over the Titans in Round 3 behind them with strong showings in their last two matches. The Townsville club was able to back up their dramatic 28-24 comeback win over Melbourne with a 32-0 drubbing of the Dragons, the first time they have pitched a shutout since 2016.

The Cowboys were forced into one change, with backrower Sam McIntyre sidelined due to injury. He's been replaced in the starting lineup by Kai O'Donnell, with Mason Barber joining the bench.

**Who to watch:** With no Walsh or Hunt and an incapacitated Reynolds, the Broncos attack is going to need to be run through Ezra Mam. The five-eighth was able to put a slow start to the season behind him to step up in a big way against the Titans, but he will need to keep that performance going for the full 80 minutes against North Queensland. His connection with Gehamat Shibasaki and Josiah Karapani - who have also been criticised this season - will be vital to deciding the match.

The Cowboys are going to need a leader to step up against the ever-consistent Broncos forward pack, and who better to rely on than Jason Taumalolo. The 32 year old has turned back the clock this season, averaging his most metres per game and his highest tackle efficiency rate since 2022. Against a Broncos pack boasting more big men than the San Antonio Spurs, Taumalolo's experience and form will be crucial to avoid the Cowboys being swamped.

**Favourite:** Despite their injury concerns, the Broncos remain favoured in this one.

**MY TIP:** Brisbane have won 6 straight XXXX Derby's against their 'little brothers' up north, and Suncorp has not been a happy hunting ground for the Cowboys even when they've had success. I think history repeats itself in this match. **Brisbane by 14.**

**This battle shows just how much the fortunes for two teams can change in eight short months.**

Back then, Souths had just ended a nine-game losing streak with a narrow victory over the lowly Titans, the win raising Souths from the bottom of the ladder, while the Raiders had a bye which propelled them to the top of the table, resulting in them claiming the Minor Premiership 3 weeks later.

Both teams have carried over their end-of-season form from 2025 into the 2026 NRL season. Souths finished 2025 with 3 wins before a last round loss. They've since won 3 of their 4 games played to start this year, starting with a high-scoring 40-30 victory over the Dolphins, before a narrow loss to arch-rivals Sydney, before scoring consecutive victories over the Wests Tigers and Bulldogs. They rank sixth in attack and are one of the 5 teams that have yet to conceded 100 points so far.

The Raiders on the other hand, despite claiming the minor premiership in 2025, had the meekest of finishes to their season, starting with a 62-24 loss to the Dolphins in Round 27 (where they rested most of their players), before losing back-to-back finals games to Brisbane and Cronulla. They won their Round 1 game in 2026 against Manly in golden point, but have lost all 4 games since, sinking to second last on the ladder.

Souths will be looking at the next fortnight as a great opportunity to rise higher up the table as they play the current bottom two teams on the ladder back-to-back, while Canberra have an in-form Souths and next week will take on a Melbourne Storm side who just last week had 50 put on them by the Panthers.

Defensively he's even more tireless, building a reputation for being safe defending kicks and denying tries through his tackling and ability to wrap the ball up. Latrell Mitchell and Alex Johnston's combination on the left edge is an ever-present menace for any defence. Up front Tallis Duncan is one of the most whole-hearted performers in the game, who never quits on any play, while new recruit David Fifita has been in strong form thus far.

For the Raiders, Kaeo Weekes is the biggest threat to any team. His blistering speed alone is enough to worry any kicker, but he also possesses great ball skills and is always keen to take the line on. Ethan Strange is a brilliant ball player and support player while Corey Horsburgh has also been playing well in the middle.

**Favourite:** Souths are the favourites for this clash, not by a huge amount, but by enough.

**MY TIP:** The Raiders defence has fallen off badly compared to last year and there's been no signs of that getting rectified in recent weeks, while the Bunnies attack is firing on all cylinders. **South Sydney by 18.**

# PREVIEW

**The Sharks take momentum west to Perth as the Roosters return from the bye, aiming to steady their season in a crucial Round 6 clash.**

Cronulla will be chasing a third straight win over the Sydney Roosters when the two sides meet in Perth on Saturday evening, with Optus Stadium again hosting a fixture that has become a regular feature of the NRL's west coast calendar. The Sharks enter Round 6 sitting sixth on the ladder after a strong opening month, while the Roosters are hovering just outside the eight in tenth and looking to build momentum through a demanding upcoming stretch. With both sides still shaping their early-season identities, the clash looms as an important litmus test under lights in Western Australia.

Cronulla produced one of their most complete attacking displays of the season in last week's 36-22 victory over the Warriors, crossing six times in a high-tempo performance at Ocean Protect Stadium. Will Kennedy's first-half double set the tone, while KL Iro continued his impressive emergence with 163 running metres, a try and eight tackle breaks. The Sharks dominated key attacking indicators with nine line breaks to three and 45 tackle busts, and their left-edge combinations again proved difficult to contain as Nicho Hynes steered the contest with authority.

The Sharks have been forced into a reshuffle in the centres after Jesse Ramien suffered a knee injury, with Mawene Hiroti named as his replacement. There is also some concern around Tom Hazleton after he picked up a knee complaint against the Warriors, though he has been named to play. Tukupa-Ke Hau Tapuha joins the extended bench as Craig

The Roosters return from a Round 5 bye after a confidence-boosting 32-16 win over Manly in what proved to be Anthony Seibold's final match in charge. The Tricolours were clinical in difficult conditions at 4 Pines Park, completing an outstanding 51 of 53 sets and finishing with over 2000 running metres. Daly Cherry-Evans played a leading role with a try assist, two line break assists and 530 kick metres, while James Tedesco (218 metres), Nat Butcher (201 metres) and Rob Toia, who scored twice, all made strong contributions.

# PREVIEW

**Just when you thought Easter was over the Storm's bunnies arrive in Melbourne.**

Melbourne are on a 17-game winning streak against the Warriors, which began in 2016. And its not just victories, they're big victories – scores like 42-0, 50-10, 32-10, 50-6, 42-20, 42-16, 70-10 and 42-14. The Warriors defence has served as little more than a training run for the Storm for a decade now.

But then last weekend happened.

The Storm started the season racking up big scores against Parramatta (52-4) and the Dragons (46-20) but then something happened. They lost their Grand Final replay 18-14 to Brisbane and then the erratic Cowboys completely out-enthused them to win 28-24. Then last weekend the Storm came up against the in-form Panthers and got spanked 50-10. There were no excuses. Penrith were magnificent. Melbourne are struggling. Their attack looks clunky and impatient. Their defence is inconsistent. They're off their game. Initially, it was not by much, but by enough. But last week it was by a long way. How they respond is key this week and if history is any guide, Melbourne will come out determined to win. Storm coach Craig Bellamy, since he became the Storm coach in 2003, has managed to get his side to bounce back from a 20+ losing margin with a win the very next week on 23 of 31 occasions.

They opened with a 42-18 win over the Roosters, followed by a 40-6 hiding of the 2025 Minor Premiers Canberra. Then they belted the Knights 38-12. The Warriors defence is struggling against multi-faceted attacks, while their attack is struggling in the middle. They are in marginally better form, considering they've been more heavily impacted by injuries, but both sides are performing well below the form they showed in their opening 2-3 weeks of the season.

The Warriors have not won in Melbourne since 2014 and have lost all 10 games there since. And they'll come into this game without their gun playmaker Luke Metcalf, who succumbed to a hamstring complaint last weekend. His loss to the Warriors last year saw them go from Premiership front runners to barely scraping into the finals, before departing quietly in a week 1 loss. His absence this weekend could be catastrophic for the team. However he will be replaced by the experienced and reliable Chanel Harris-Tavita.

Meanwhile the Storm have Xavier Coates still recovering from an achilles injury and is not expected back for another 4 weeks, while Marion Seve is also recovering from a bicep injury and is due back in a fortnight. Rookie winger Siulagi Tuimalatu-Brown is replaced by the returning Moses Leo, while centre Manaia Waitere drops back to the bench to make way for the returning Jack Howarth.

**Who to watch:** Storm fullback Sualauvi Fa'alogo has been tremendous so far this year, quickly becoming the most dangerous attacking weapon in the Storm side. His elusive ball running was always known, but he has added some very impressive ball-playing skills to his repertoire for the 2026 season. Harry Grant has also been in strong form early in the season, as has his front row partner Stefano Utoikamanu. The Warriors have been guided around superbly by Tanah Boyd, who has been one of the form players in the first month of the 2026 NRL season. The Warriors forwards have all been solid and consistent with front rower and captain James Fisher-Harris and lock Erin Clark leading through the middle

**Favourite:** The Storm on home soil and with a decade of unbeaten dominance over the Warriors, and coming off a shellacking, are clear favourites.

### Injury hit Eels look to ground Titans

Despite battling a near unprecedented injury crisis in club history, the Parramatta Eels continue to battle hard when they host the Gold Coast Titans in Round 6 of the NRL season.

With a casualty ward fast becoming over-crowded, the Parramatta Eels are being put together by superglue and their expanded NSW Cup squad. Despite that, they are putting in determined efforts on a weekly basis. Last start against the Tigers, they were incredibly tenacious in defeat and they could count themselves as unfortunate in several contentious moments with the officials, but they would rue the slew of elementary errors in the first half that saw a 10-0 lead evaporate quickly.

To beat the Titans, they need to simplify their game plan extensively. With so many changes to their roster due to the aforementioned crisis at the club with their injuries. If they can manage the game well and dominate up front, that should make it easier for the band of rookies that will be called upon. Watch for Jack Williams to feature up front while Kelma Tuilagi will have a battle to reign in Beau Fermor.

Elsewhere, expect Jayden Campbell to be given a roaming licence to take this game to the Eels.

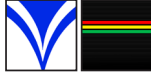
