Sea Eagles soar despite Turbo-lence

It was a win on the scoreboard but it came at a cost as the Manly Sea Eagles lost Tom Trbojevic in their 38-6 win over the North Queensland Cowboys.

Trbojevic's night lasted only 12 minutes before suffering another suspected hamstring injury, yet the Sea Eagles showed no ill-effects in the absence of their inspirational captain and fullback to extend their record over the Cowboys in Townsville to seven straight wins.

Lehi Hopoate (5th minute) wasted little time in opening the scoring, after an intercept put the visitors on the front foot, however the initial delight soon turned to dismay as Tom Trbojevic was forced from the field with a suspected hamstring injury.

With points proving hard to come by following the resumption of play, the Sea Eagles edged their lead out to three converted tries with a penalty goal before Koula denied Braidon Burns with an inspiring defensive effort on his goal line to end any hope of a home side comeback.

Having dominated their error-riddled opponents throughout the match, the Sea Eagles were able to revel in their biggest ever win in Townsville with late tries to Taniela Paseka (65th minute) and Luke Brooks (67th minute) before Fogarty added a late penalty goal to complete the 38-6 rout.

Next week, the Cowboys will host the Sharks on Friday evening, while the Sea Eagles will return to 4 Pines Park for a Sunday afternoon grudge match with the Eels.

Cleary ices golden point thriller... that comes at a cost for Panthers

The Penrith Panthers have put last week's reality check against the Bulldogs behind them in nervy fashion after outlasting the Dolphins 23-22 in golden point at TIO Stadium in Darwin.

The win looks to have come at a significant cost, however, with hooker and NSW Blues Origin bolter Mitch Kenny suffering a serious leg injury in a tackle from Kodi Nikorima.

Fortunately for the Panthers, they have an established back-up option in Freddy Lussick who was singled out by coach Ivan Cleary earlier in the month for his impressive pre-season.

Cleary labelled Lussick one of the fittest players he had seen and the 25-year-old will get an extended opportunity now to put himself in the shop front window given he is only contracted for this season.

In humid conditions, the first half didn't reach any great heights and while the Panthers were able to take an 18-0 lead at the break the Dolphins weren't without opportunities to close the gap. Instead, poor execution inside attacking territory let the Dolphins down and while the Panthers were far from clinical, they took enough of their chances to open up a commanding halftime advantage.

Penrith's first try of the night came as Dylan Edwards and Nathan Cleary combined before the Panthers halfback put five-eighth Blaize Talagi through soon after to extend the lead out to 12-0.

That came after Nikorima was sent to the sin bin for a dangerous tackle on Kenny, with the Dolphins playmaker facing a nervous wait for the verdict from the NRL's match review committee. Given the severity of injury is typically weighed into the length of suspension, Nikorima could be looking at as many as four games on the sideline considering the precedent set by Ryan Couchman's ban earlier this year.

The Dolphins were able to hold strong without Nikorima otherwise, only conceding one try while down a man, but a soaring Tom Jenkins went over on the stroke of halftime to make it a comfortable 18-0 lead.

The Panthers had been near-unstoppable with that kind of halftime advantage this year, but the Dolphins exploded out of the blocks in the second half to storm home and take a shocking lead.

First, Herbie Farnworth broke through to score before Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow burst onto a Jake Averillo offload and raced away to reduce the deficit to just one try. That small Penrith lead didn't last long either as a slick set play put Selwyn Cobbo over to tie it up, before a poor pass from Scott Sorensen gifted the Dolphins a chance to somehow push ahead through Averillo.

Suddenly, the Panthers were falling off tackles and struggling to get metres with the Dolphins on the verge of a famous comeback victory. But a Jenkins linebreak helped set them up in scoring territory before the NRL's leading try-scorer took his tally through seven games out to 16 to tie the game up after Cleary sent his conversion wide.

It sent the game to golden point and the Dolphins rued a few contentious calls, with the Bunker ruling inconclusive evidence on a potential Edwards knock on while a Lussick forward pass was missed from dummy-half.

Either error would have put the Dolphins in prime position to kick the game-winning field goal, but in the end it was a charging run from Izack Tago in his 100th game that helped set up Cleary to ice the game.

Curran drops back to the bench. Jonathan Sua is named in the starting side after Jacob Kiraz suffered a knee injury, and Jake Turpin joins the bench.

Both these teams met twice in 2025, which saw Brisbane claim the win both times, with a courageous win coming at their second matchup in July, where the baby Broncos came from behind and beat the Bulldogs despite all odds.

Who to watch: With Reece Walsh still at least a week away from a miraculous early return from a facial fracture, Jesse Arthars' temporary role at fullback is an important one. His coordination and desperation in defence helped guide the 'baby Broncos' to a narrow victory over the Wests Tigers last weekend and it's this experience and determination that will be key if the reigning premiers are to get this important victory.

Canterbury's surprise loss to the Parramatta Eels was made interesting by the lack of ball-in-hand time for second rower Viliame Kikau. The stats don't lie - when Kikau finds the ball, makes good metreage and breaks tackles, the Bulldogs perform. Whether his teammates simply didn't get it to him OR he didn't go looking for it last week, the imposing former Panther needs to get involved big time if the 'Dogs are serious about a title tilt this season.

Favourite: The Bulldogs are favoured to add another win to their 2026 tally.

MY TIP: Forever being labelled the underdogs and getting the job done in the end is the Broncos specialty. Time and time again we see the Broncos rise to the occasion when facing adversity, and I think this match will be no different. Yes, the Broncos are missing a long list of star players but that doesn't mean they don't have the team to get the job done. The Bulldogs have shown mixed results lately, beating Penrith before going on to lose to the Eels. I think it'll be a close fight between the two teams, but in the end the Broncos will be victorious. **Brisbane by 4.**

Since the dawn of time, men have fought over the most trivial things. Wars have broken out for reasons which make the average person cringe. Needless numbers of people thrown away in an ever evolving chess match.

So it's fitting, that on the 111th anniversary of the beginning of Australia's most famous military campaign, that one of its proudest clubs are too fighting for something ultimately meaningless: the Dragons, looking for their first win of the season, eight matches in.

Much like Gallipoli, this campaign for the Dragons has resulted in mass casualties - head coach Shane Flanagan, assistant coach Mick Ennis and head of football Ben Haran all departing the club this week after the club slumped to an 0-7 start to 2026, and a run of 11 straight losses as a whole. Taking over as interim head coach is Dean Young, a man who bleeds the Red V, but may not have the full support of those above him just yet.

Also much like Gallipoli, the Dragons are exposing young men to the horrors of conflict. Kade Reed, a 20 year old with just 5 matches of New South Wales Cup experience, has been tasked with wearing the number 7 jersey in a debut on one of the games grandest stages.

The Roosters, of course, won't take their opponents lightly, despite winning three straight ANZAC Cup's by a combined margin of 133-62. Recovering from a slow start leading into their Round 6 bye, the Chooks sit 5th in the ladder and are keen to get all the early wins they can before Origin ravages their playing stocks.

Reed is not the only change for the Dragons - Jaydn Su'a will serve the first game of a three match suspension after being sent off in the loss to South Sydney, while winger David Fale will also miss the match. As a result Matt Feagai shifts to the wing with the return of Moses Suli at centre, and Ryan Couchman returns from a four game ban of his own to replace Su'a. Kyle Flanagan, who lost the number 7 jersey to Reed, will play the bench utility role with Jye Simpkin unavailable due to a hamstring injury.

Meanwhile the Roosters have been able to make no changes, despite the return of Billy Smith - the centre unable to dislodge utility Hugo Savala from the number 3 jersey after his double in the win over Newcastle last week.

Who to watch: All eyes, rightly or wrongly, are going to be on Kade Reed as he makes his NRL debut. Despite only playing the 5 NSW Cup matches, he has impressed in all - with two tries, 5 try assists and flashes of a promising kicking game. However his defence is suspect even at the Cup level - with a tackle efficiency of just 79.2% - and that could see him get found out in first grade.

James Tedesco is continuing to age like a fine wine in what is his 15th season in first grade. The reigning Dally M Medalist has had a superb start to the season, with 3 tries, 4 try assists and an average of 221 run metres per game. With the Chooks hungry for some success against a wounded Dragons outfit, you'd expect Teddy would be primed to star in this one.

Favourite: You'd be a crazy man to put any money on the Dragons in this one - and that's reflected by them being the largest underdog of the round by a substantial margin.

MY TIP: Beware the new coach bounce. We've seen it many times in the NRL, including with Manly and Kieran Foran this season. However, the Dragons issues run deeper than just Shane Flanagan. And the interrupted week won't have helped them. **Sydney by a lot.**

A fascinating clash beckons between two uniquely different teams, specifically in attack.

The Warriors are a methodical, consistent machine, playing solid, disciplined football while the Dolphins are all razzle-dazzle, employing a 'lets have a party and see what happens' style.

That's not to say that both sides can't produce some of each others attack either. Both have good spines, with a mix of experienced talent and brilliant youngsters all in decent form. They also have brilliant fullbacks and tradesmen-like hookers. The backline for both sides are extremely talented and brilliant attacking weapons in their own right.

Both sides are powerful through the middle while defensively strong on the edges of the ruck.

The Warriors come into this game sitting in second place on the ladder and on a 2-game win streak, having beaten hoodoo side Melbourne 38-14 in a commanding Round 6 victory, before a tough 28-20 victory last week against a confident and resurgent Titans outfit.

Meanwhile the Dolphins have had just two victories this season, both over a month ago. They had two very strong outings, albeit losses against the defending Premiers Brisbane, losing 26-12 and the form team of the past 6 years, Penrith, who they lost to in golden point last weekend.

But between those two losses was a bye and a 52-18 hiding from Manly in Redcliffe.

There are few changes to either side in this clash. The Warriors have lost fullback Charnze Nicoll-Klokstad - his place being taken by Taine Tuauipiki. While for the Dolphins, they have Brad Schneider coming in to replace five-eighth Kodi Nikorima.

Front rower Daniel Saifiti is still out indefinitely with his shoulder injury.

While Max Plath is a modern day Darren Senter - Capable of being a hard running middle forward and being a classy rake. He can even compete with Senter in the Hollywood smile department too.

Favourite: The Warriors at home and in better form start as favourites.

MY TIP: The Dolphins do not want their sloppy start to continue any further. This is a tough Warriors side to beat, but the time is right to do so given their injury toll. And they have the attacking range and flair to do so. But that Warriors defence is stingy. I'll go with the **Warriors by 4**.

An occasion to end unwanted history

The ANZAC Day triple header comes to a close with the Melbourne Storm hosting the South Sydney Rabbitohs in a contest set to have historical ramifications for the loser.

Languishing in the bottom four off the back of five straight losses, the Melbourne Storm will be determined to end their wretched run and avoid the prospect of equalling their longest losing streak with a victory on Saturday night.

Returning to AAMI Park after a 26-22 loss to the Raiders in Canberra, coach Craig Bellamy has resisted making sweeping changes with Davvy Moale and Hugo Peel retained in the 19-man squad after not being used last Friday.

The Storm have enjoyed a stellar record on ANZAC Day with 14 wins and a draw from 18 fixtures overall, including nine straight wins at home over the past decade.

Two Melbourne forwards will celebrate milestones on Saturday night with Jack Hetherington making his 100th appearance in first grade and Shawn Blore lining up for his 50th game for the Storm.

Heading into ANZAC Day with the confidence of sitting inside the top four, the South Sydney Rabbitohs will be hoping to achieve history with their first ever win in Melbourne.

The Rabbitohs have never won in Melbourne from 20 previous visits and boast a dismal record of seven wins from 43 clashes against the Storm at all venues.

Outclassing the Dragons last Saturday with a comfortable 30-12 victory at home, coach Wayne Bennett has formally named Bronson Garlick at hooker with Brandon Smith in the second-row, while Euan Aitken has been included in jersey 18 after overcoming a leg injury.

Alex Johnston will become only the second player to appear in 250 first grade matches for South Sydney alongside John Sutton (336 matches); the all-time leading try-scorer made his debut on ANZAC Day in 2014 and scored four tries in his most recent match against the Storm last season.

The Rabbitohs' record on ANZAC Day stands at two wins from five matches during the NRL era; the visitors have lost both previous clashes with the Storm on ANZAC Day.

Who to watch: Cameron Munster has enjoyed plenty of good times over the course of his career – now he's facing the opposite: a losing slump. As the most experienced and acclaimed member of Melbourne's roster, the 31-year-old has been emblematic of the side's decline having produced three try-assist over the opening fortnight of wins before managing just a single assist during the current run of five losses. Demonstrating the ability to rise above adversity by inspiring the Maroons to a series win from 1-0 down last season, the Storm will be hoping Munster can replicate his heroics as Queensland captain at club level on Saturday evening.

Having made an eye-catching return to the NRL last week, the true test for Matt Dufty will be whether he can remain consistent from week to week. Enjoying a night to remember against his out-of-sorts former club with a try, 333 running metres, including 98 post-contact metres, and five tackle breaks, the 30-year-old backup fullback will face a tougher test against a Storm side desperate to arrest a losing streak of their own. Earning a reputation as a dynamic attacking player at his best, Dufty could be the game breaker the Rabbitohs need to finally breakthrough for their first win in Melbourne.

Favourite: In a contest pitting a side that has lost five in a row against a side that boasts a 0/20 record in Melbourne, the bookies are backing the Storm to snap their losing streak.

MY TIP: One of the greatest challenges faced by Craig Bellamy during his coaching career occurred on ANZAC Day in the immediate aftermath of the salary cap scandal. The Storm aren't facing anything close to that level of crisis right now, but the sense of occasion may be the remedy needed for the Storm to remember what it takes to win. **Melbourne by 6.**

While they welcome back Casey McLean from suspension, the Panthers will be without starting hooker Mitch Kenny for at least two months.

Freddy Lussick steps up to replace him while Luke Garner once again starts for the injured Liam Martin.

The Panthers have won eight straight against Knights at McDonald Jones Stadium and this week can set a club record with a ninth victory for the most consecutive wins against an opponent at a venue.

Who to watch: Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow proved the way to break down this Panthers defence is pure speed through the middle and the Knights have that in Fletcher Sharpe. Herbie Farnworth also had a field day but with Bradman Best out injured, it will be on Sharpe to provide the X-factor for Newcastle. Fletcher Hunt can absolutely provide some of that, as he proved in last week's hat-trick statement, but Sharpe's speed and evasiveness in particular could cause issues for the Panthers if he can get in space.

Happiness means everything in rugby league and Panthers winger Tom Jenkins is proof of it. It is quite the turnaround and on Sunday he has a chance to show just how far he has come against his former team.

Favourite: The Panthers are well-backed to continue their winning ways in 2026.

MY TIP: It is the furthest thing from panic stations right now at Penrith, but the Panthers don't look anything like the world beaters they were in the first month or so to open the competition. The Knights are a much sterner test this year, but with so many quality players out injured there is no reason the Panthers shouldn't do this reasonably comfortably, even on the road. **Penrith by 16.**

The high flying Manly Sea Eagles welcome a familiar foe as they get used to life, once again, without Tom Trbojevic.

Sunday afternoon sees the lights shining bright on Brookvale Oval as Manly welcome Parramatta to the northern beaches. Both sides are coming off convincing wins, albeit compounded by injuries once again to key players.

The Sea Eagles, in another lifetime, would have had their wings clipped when Tom Trbojevic went down with a nasty hamstring injury last Thursday. Under interim coach Kieran Foran, in 2026, the Sea Eagles ended up playing arguably their best game of the season.

Tolutau Koula seamlessly slotted into the fullback position, running for 238 metres and allowing his side to get on the front foot every time they had the ball. While it was against a Cowboys team who, admittedly, will struggle to defend at the best of times, Manly racked up 38 points in a demolition job at QCB Stadium.

On a three game winning streak now, the Sea Eagles, led by Jamal Fogarty and the power running of Taniela Paseka, will look to run riot over yet another questionable defensive line up.

The Parramatta Eels had, on paper, no right to win last week against the Canterbury Bulldogs. You could create a full starting line up with the players that the Eels have out injured, and yet they put the Dogs back in their kennel with an 18 point win at CommBank on Sunday.

Ronald Volkman had his best game as a Parramatta Eel, if not his best game in the NRL. His running game freed up Mitchell Moses to guide the team around the park, something that he's not been able to do this season.

litter of free flowing, unpredictable, almost disrespectful attacking football that sent the Bulldogs crawling back to Belmore with their tails between their legs.

The defense of Parramatta still, despite some fantastic last ditch efforts, leaves plenty to be desired. If they want to walk away from Brookvale Oval with the win, they'll need to shut down Manly's attack early and often.

Manly lose Tom Trbojevic for two months with a torn hamstring, which sees Tolu Koula move to fullback and Clayton Faulalo come into the centres. Josh Feledy takes the bench spot of Faulalo, while Simone Laiafi comes onto the bench for Jackson Shereb.

Parramatta welcome back Sean Russell and Kelly Tuilagi from their respective concussion layoffs, with Russell being a late scratching last week. Araz Nanva and Teancum Brown slide out of the side.

Who to watch: Tolu Koula will be the one player that can single-handedly break the hearts of Parramatta fans. He's lightning fast on his feet, has some good ball playing skills and can break any team apart from anywhere on the field. What should scare Parramatta fans the most, is that he has the ability to break tackles from a standstill, to create points from nothing. With Parramatta's defence being quite shaky, the eels will need to shut down the fullback almost immediately to ensure that manly attack isn't freeflowing.

Mitchell Moses is having a quiet season by his own standards, not being helped in part by Parramatta's massive injury toll. Against the Bulldogs on Sunday, Moses was able to finally utilise his kicking game to shut down the Bulldogs from the back. Whilst the running game hasn't really come through in 2026, his ability to lead Parramatta around the park in a hostile environment will be crucial to their chances against a fit and firing Manly.

Favourite: The bookies are backing Manly at home despite the absence of Tommy Turbo.

MY TIP: Brookvale Oval used to be a fortress - a place no team wishes to visit. While the crowd still rumbles in and the Sea Eagles perk up for a home game on hallowed ground, it's not the same scary experience for the veterans of the competition. That said, this Eels side doesn't have enough veteran experience to win this away from home. **Manly by 6.**
