MAGIC IN THE AIR

YOUR QUICK GUIDE TO BRISBANE'S MASSIVE WEEKEND OF FOOTY!

Welcome to Magic Round Brisbane! Eight games in three days awaits as Suncorp Stadium plays host to the tenth round of the 2022 NRL season.

The concept - borrowed from the English Super League who began the concept of 'Magic Weekend' back in 2007 - had its first iteration in Australia in 2019 when Brisbane hosted Magic Round. After the COVID-19 pandemic sunk hopes to hold the event in 2020, the round came back with a vengeance in 2021, bringing a huge weekend of action to the Queensland capital.

THE SCHEDULE

The Bulldogs and Knights kick off action at 6pm on Friday, followed by the Sea Eagles and Broncos to round out opening night.

On Saturday, the Warriors and Rabbitohs get things going at 3pm, with Gold Coast v St George Illawarra wedged in the middle at 5:30pm, finishing up with a mouth-watering showdown between the last two premiers - Melbourne and Penrith - as the 7:45pm nightcap.

Sunday's triple header gets underway at 1:50pm, the Sharks and Raiders first up. The Roosters and Eels are Sunday's free-to-air match at 4:05pm before the Wests Tigers and Cowboys close proceedings at 6:25pm.

THE FUN AND GAMES

There'll be plenty to do both inside and outside Suncorp Stadium throughout the weekend. Kids Zones, Chill Zones, Food Trucks and Bars will all be available on

the exterior of the ground, while a range of activations including exclusive seating areas will be available inside. A full event guide is available on the NRL website.

THE HISTORY

2019's inaugural event was held over four days - a Thursday match attracted a small crowd involving the Titans, then crowds of 41,000 piled in on Friday and Saturday before 34,500 finished the round on Sunday, making a 134,677 aggregate crowd for the weekend.


After skipping 2020 due to the pandemic, 2021's event was reduced to three days, with Friday attracting 41,367 fans, Saturday 45,122 and Sunday 43,537 for an total event crowd of more than 130,000.

With Saturday already sold out and limited tickets available for Friday and Sunday, 2022 Magic Round is set to break all kinds of records.



The new 'Don Bradman' side?

ARE MELBOURNE ON TRACK TO BE THE NEW 'EASTS OF 1935'? ANDREW FERGUSON


Last weekend the Melbourne Storm produced yet another thumping victory, which saw them reach 335 points scored for the year thus far after just 9 games.

Any major point scoring proficiency by a team will automatically bring out the comparisons against the Don Bradman of teams – the 1935 Eastern Suburbs side, which contained Immortal Dave Brown.

That Easts side scored 599 points after 16 Regular Season games – scoring at an absurd 37.44 points per game – in a time when tries were worth 3 points. In fact, if that 1935 side had 4 point tries, they would've scored 730 points in the regular season at a ridiculous 45.6 points per game!

Last years Melbourne Storm side came very close to being the first side to outscore the 1935 Easts outfit, but alas they fell 15 points shy of the mark.


In 2022 though, they are tracking to become the greatest attacking side ever! This chart shows the 4 greatest scoring teams in the NRL history – Easts (1935), Parramatta (2001), Melbourne (2021) and Souths (2021) and compares them with the 2022 Storm side. -->



← The 1935 Easts side were so dominant, when you look at their scoring prowess compared to all the other sides competing in 1935, they scored double or more points than half of the other sides in the Premiership.

When you look at the same chart for the current season, you find that the Melbourne Storm have current scored at least twice as many points than 8 of the other 15 sides. -->


Now while we are talking about Bradman, we cannot ignore the 'Bradman of League' himself, Dave Brown. In 1935, Brown scored 38 tries (still a Premiership record for most tries in a season) and 65 goals for 244 points in just 15 games. That's over 16 points per game!

Ryan Papenhuyzen this year is currently scoring at a rate of 14 points per game, however after both men had played 9 games each in their respective season, Papenhuyzen is clearly ahead. Brown though had a few games in the back end of the 1935 season where he piled on points, which will make it hard for Papenhuyzen to keep in touch, let alone stay in front - especially with 'Paps' missing the coming month with hamstring and PCL injuries.

But can the Storm keep up the momentum and become the new Don Bradman side?

The 1935 Easts side had 4 of their remaining 7 games producing scores of 40 points or more - giving them 8 40+ scores from their 16 Premiership games (1 x 80's, 2 x 60's, 3 x 50's, 2 x 40's).

The Storm have 3 tough games in a row, starting at Magic Round this weekend when they take on joint ladder leaders and defending Premiers Penrith. Next week they take on the high-flying Cowboys in Townsville before playing rivals Manly in Round 12. Then comes the Origin period with a continuation of tough games, with depleted squads, against the Sydney Roosters, Brisbane, Manly (again) and the 4th place Cronulla Sharks. This period could very likely see their scoring rate quickly get reeled in.



After Origin though, they play the currently out-of-form Canberra, the indifferent Souths, a poor-performing Warriors side and an erratic Titans outfit, before a tricky run home against Penrith, Brisbane, Sydney and Parramatta.

It looks unlikely that they will be able to continue this incredible scoring rate for the remainder of the season. But we will just have to wait and see!

REYNOLDS RETURNS IN STYLE AS BRONCOS BURST BUNNIES' BUBBLE

Lachlan Ilias will only continue to improve and in the long-term, the decision to part ways with Adam Reynolds may have been the right one.

But all we can judge South Sydney on is what we see now - and that is a team in desperate need of a cool head in the halves. Unfortunately for last year's grand finalists, that cool head was on the other side of the field, guiding the Brisbane Broncos to a 32-12 upset win at Accor Stadium on Thursday night.

Reynolds had his hand - and boot - in everything, setting up two tries, scoring one and kicking for over 500 metres in a masterclass. All the talk head into Thursday night's meeting between the Rabbitohs and Broncos was about him. Reynolds has said all the right things throughout the week, that this was "just another game", that coming up against his former teammates "doesn't really matter". But when the Broncos halfback surged onto a Patrick Carrigan offload to score under the posts, you could just see it in the way Reynolds celebrated, the way he beat his chest.

Sure, this was never just about Reynolds but it meant just a bit more than "just another game". You could see it from the opening set of the game, when Reynolds touched the ball on almost every play, stamping his authority on the occasion early. It was not just Reynolds though. The entire Broncos team lifted around him, upping the intensity in defence to hold a usually lethal South Sydney side to just one try in the first half. Kobe Hetherington was in the thick of it, with try-saving plays to force errors from both Cameron Murray and Jai Arrow while a last-ditch effort from Herbie Farnworth saw Taane Milne spill the ball with the line in sight. And those efforts in defence were rewarded on the scoreboard, with Reynolds putting the ball in the air for winger Corey Oates, who came down with it to score the opening try in the 14th minute. Reynolds then took it upon himself to score off the Carrigan offload and give Brisbane a commanding 12-0 lead.

South Sydney eventually capitalised on poor ball security from Brisbane late as a well-executed scrum play saw Milne go over in the 38th minute. But execution was lacking for the Rabbitohs otherwise throughout Thursday night, with Cody Walker and Damien Cook both coming up with errors early in the second half. The Broncos then re-established their lead as Selwyn Cobbo pounced after Blake Taaffe fumbled a Reynolds kick. An error from Brisbane fullback Te Maire Martin invited South Sydney back into the contest though and the Rabbitohs took full advantage, with Milne grabbing his second. Fortunately for the Broncos, the Rabbitohs relinquished any momentum it had gained with that try as Tevita Tatola coughed it up off the restart and a penalty then saw Reynolds extend the lead to eight.

Reynolds was at it again moments later, passing to Oates off a scrum as the winger burst through a few tackles and then linked with Herbie Farnworth to set up Brisbane's fourth try of the night. Reynolds' ghost did not just haunt the Rabbitohs when he was setting up tries for the opposition team. It lingered every time a pass went to ground, when those left-side raids South Sydney made so lethal instead broke down and went awry. Like it did when Walker coughed it up in the 74th minute and this time it led directly to points as Cobbo sprinted away to seal the win in emphatic fashion. **ANDREW JACKSON**

RAIDERS SNAP LOSING STREAK WITH GRITTY WIN OVER BULLDOGS

The Canberra Raiders are back in the winners circle for the first time in five weeks, taking advantage of a lion's share of possession to see themselves to a 10-point victory over the Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs at GIO Stadium.

The first half was an incredibly one-sided affair, with plenty of Bulldogs errors gifting the Raiders enough field position to win five matches. The Canterbury defence held firm however, forcing Nick Cotric to commit a double movement.

It looked as if the Bulldogs would somehow get themselves on the board first in the resultant set, with Matt Burton getting through the line far too easily before linking up with Josh Addo-Carr in support, who cruised to the line. The try was awarded, but the bunker intervened and correctly ruled that Corey Waddell obstructed Adam Elliott in the lead-up.

The call gave the Raiders yet another set on the Bulldogs line, and this time they took full advantage, with English back-rower Elliott Whitehead winding up from 15 metres out to cruise past Aaron Schoupp on his way to the line. The conversion attempt from Croker was unsuccessful, making it a 4-0 ballgame after 20 minutes.

The Bulldogs turned in some strong defensive efforts and were able to win back some field position, but a poor pass from Flanagan to Naden in the 31st minute relieved all the pressure.

In the ensuing set, Matt Frawley was able to take advantage of some pathetically soft Bulldogs defence. First, he took on the Dogs front-line, easing his way past Jeremy Marshall-King, before selling Matt Dufty a dummy to no one, and he was over the line virtually untouched from 20-odd metres out.

The Raiders would take a 10-0 lead into the break, but their fans were far from confident considering the club's recent history of squandering half-time advantages.

For a while in the second half, it appeared Raiders fans' nightmares were materialising once again. They had the bulk of possession and field position from the 40th-50th minute, but were only able to put two points on the board courtesy of a penalty goal.

Five minutes later the Raiders forced a dropout, and with 25 minutes to go it appeared they were finally closing out a match in mature fashion. However, Burton went short on the drop kick and it was recovered by Naden. Two tackles later, Burton put in an early kick for Addo-Carr, who gathered in the ball and put in another kick that was again recovered by the Dogs, who all of a sudden were only 10 metres away from the Raiders line and looking dangerous.

When Matt Burton muscled his way over in that same set, even the most staunch Raiders fan was dreading the next 20 minutes.

Five minutes later, the defining moment of the match came when Addo-Carr was unable to ground Burton's kick in the in-goal area, instead knocking it on. It proved to be an 8-point turnaround when the next Raiders possession resulted in another penalty goal, giving us the eventual final scoreline of 14-4.

MISSION IMPOSSIBLE: EELS TOO SLIPPERY FOR PANTHERS

The Parramatta Eels become the first side since Canberra in July 2019 to defeat the Penrith Panthers at BlueBet Stadium downing their arch-rivals 22-20 in an absolute thriller and submitting Penrith to their first loss of the season.

Penrith had all of the early possession and it took a Hayze Perham error for the first points to come. Dylan Edwards burrowed over after clever lead-up work from Api Koroisau and with Cleary's conversion, Penrith enjoyed an early 6-0 lead. However, Parramatta was quick to rebound and settle into the arm-wrestle, un-nerving the Penrith side through the resounding defence from their big forwards in Paulo and Papali'i. With repeated sets through poor Penrith discipline, a clever blindside play from Will Penisini and Clint Gutherson saw the captain cross for the Eels.

This game was full of controversy late in the opening 40 and the game's first contentious moment when Reed Mahoney appeared to be tackled short of the line. Bunker official Ashley Klein ruled that Mahoney was taken off the ball by Jaeman Salmon and due to Dylan Edwards committing to the tackled player and the gap presented, the bunker awarded a penalty try. With the chip shot from in front, Moses converted and the Eels had a 10-6 lead.

Penrith thought they levelled up almost immediately when Brian To'o crossed but the bunker took it off the board citing obstruction on Dylan Brown. Penrith had its own contentious moment when Viliame Kikau appeared to knock the ball on but was missed by both the referee and the sideline official. Off the ensuing Cleary linebreak, Penrith shifted it left and Kikau put it on the boot and Taylan May continued his purple patch of form to cross and level the scores at half-time.

Parramatta struggled coming out of the break, continuously being held inside Parramatta's end. The game's turning point was a Kikau charge down which allowed Penrith to be camped inside the Parramatta 20. Off the back of the possession, Kikau again turned provider and May crossed for his second. History showed that Penrith would run on a succession of points, but you never discount Parramatta in season 2022.

When the possession count swung back to the Eels, Gutherson again turned provider and Ryan Matterson put a vicious step past Dylan Edwards to cross for the Eels. Moses converted and Parramatta retook the lead. Off the next set, a mid-field bomb was left uncontested by Edwards, which saw Dylan Brown pounce to cross, although To'o caught him lacking and nearly bombed the try, the try was confirmed and the Eels led by 8. A late try to interchange forward Spencer Leniu got Penrith fans on the edge of their seats, but Cleary missed a two-point field goal which allowed Parramatta to hang on for the victory. **AJ LUCANTONIO**





New-look Broncos hope for Magic Round revenge against Manly

The last time the Broncos and Sea Eagles met at Magic Round, Tom Trbojevic scored a double in a 50-6 demolition job that made a mockery of Brisbane's brittle defence.

But in the space of a year plenty has changed. Of course, Brisbane has a new No. 7 – and he put in his best performance in Broncos colours last week to spark an upset win over his former side.

Brisbane's sudden resurgence though is down to more than just the signature of Adam Reynolds.

Sure, the 2014 premiership-winning halfback was the headline act in last Thursday's victory over South Sydney, but he was not alone.

Patrick Carrigan made an immediate impact in his return from injury while Selwyn Cobbo once again proved why the Broncos are in such a hurry to get him extended at Red Hill.

More than anything, the Broncos showed the defensive resolve that has so often deserted them in the past, like it did last year in Magic Round against the Sea Eagles.

And Brisbane did it without two of its most important players – Payne Haas and Kurt Capewell – with both forwards set to return this week in a timely boost.

Manly will be yet another stern test of Brisbane's resolve, coming off a 36-22 win over a resilient Tigers outfit.

For all their talent on paper, the Sea Eagles are yet to really put together a complete 80-minute performance like the one from Magic Round last year.

Injuries have played their part but with Tom Trbojevic well and truly settled in, the Sea Eagles are eventually bound to click in attack and prove they are genuine premiership contenders.

Josh Schuster put on a show in last year's 44-point win over Brisbane, scoring a try and setting up another while running for over 130 metres.

But the crafty edge forward looks set to miss another week with a calf injury, although the return of Haumole Olakau'atu eases the pain there for Manly.

WHO TO WATCH: It seems like it will only be a matter of time before Tolutau Koula finally has the breakout game of his rookie career. Koula showed glimpses of his blistering speed last week against the Tigers, making a break before setting up Daly Cherry-Evans in a long-range effort. Brisbane boasts plenty of genuine game-breakers in its backline and despite his relative inexperience, Koula has the speed and footwork to be that for Manly should Trbojevic be well-contained.

Speaking of Trbojevic, Penrith provided the early blueprint for shutting down the Manly fullback in the season-opener. Sean O'Sullivan kicked Trbojevic out of the game and Broncos halfback Adam Reynolds has the ability to do the same. Reynolds' pinpoint kicking was one of the key differences between South Sydney and Brisbane last week and will only be more important this week given his opposite number. Daly Cherry-Evans also boasts one of the best boots in the game but he will more than meet his match in Reynolds, who has the variety to really test Manly's back three.

FAVOURITE: The Sea Eagles are favourites but bookies are tipping a close one.



Warriors and Souths Look For Magic Reversal in Form After Shocking Round 9 Performances

Neither of these sides have any excuse for losing in the way that they did last week.

The Warriors were away from home and significant underdogs against the Sharks, and based on that information, predictably lost by more than 3 converted tries.

Their performance goes from slightly below expectations to a historically embarrassing one when you consider the Sharks had a man sent off in the 16th minute and another sin binned in the 53rd minute.

They failed to score a single point during the period in which they were playing against 11-men. They made just two line-breaks throughout the entire match. The Sharks made 45 tackle breaks to the Warriors 18. The Sharks outgained the Warriors by an average of 6 metres per set.

I could keep listing these mind-boggling stats until the Cows come home. The point is that the Warriors were beyond terrible last week, their performance considered by some to be more embarrassing than when they conceded 70 on ANZAC day.

Last Thursday, Souths lost by 20 at home to the Broncos, who vastly outplayed them and were clearly the better team. It isn't the first time this year they've lost a game in which they were heavily favoured in, the other prominent one being against the Tigers a few weeks ago.

However, during that game against the Tigers, Souths could at least find solace in the fact that they were out-completed by more than 20% and only had 43% of the ball. Not desirable stats by any means, but ones that you could say are easier to correct than a more fundamental problem of poor red-zone attack.

The Rabbitohs do not have any of these excuses for their pitiful performance against Brisbane. They frequently looked lost while attacking the opposition line, only looking threatening after multiple repeat sets and still blowing most of those opportunities when they arose.

They had 53% of the ball and completed at a rate 2% higher than Brisbane, making 6 less errors, but still came nowhere near beating them even without Haas and Capewell.

It certainly spells trouble for the Redfern based club, who will be without Cam Murray this week after the lock sustained an injury last week. Isaiah Tass has been dropped for Jaxson Paulo in the centres, while Tom Burgess returns at prop, pushing Davvy Moale to the bench. Jai Arrow shifts to lock to cover Murray, with Jacob Host returning at second row. Kodi Nikorima will make his club debut from the bench, ironically against the team he was contracted to just a week ago.

For the Warriors, Marcelo Montoya returns from suspension, pushing Adam Pompey to centre and Rocco Berry out of the side. Tohu Harris' long awaited return from injury pushes Eli Katoa to the reserves.


WHO TO WATCH: Tohu Harris is so so important to the success of this Warriors forward pack. He has been named in the second-row, a position he started in for 5 out of his 15 starts last season, and his inclusion no doubt gives the Warriors the edge in the battle of the big men, especially with Cam Murray missing. Last year, he averaged a whopping 41 tackles per game, which is more than any Warrior has made so far this year. His presence in defence alone will allow his fellow forwards to focus some energy into actually running the ball, which is something the Warriors desperately need as they rank dead last in total metres gained so far this year.

For the Rabbitohs, Jaxson Paulo gets another chance to start in the centres this week following the exclusion of Isaiah Tass from the team. It's a position that has very low job security at the moment as Souths' edges continue to struggle in both attack and defence. Paulo's defensive numbers in his last start against Penrith were not pretty, missing 3 tackles and making just 6, however he was playing on the wing against a very good side in that game, and he has historically been more reliable when playing in his preferred position, making 8 tackles and missing none against Melbourne just two weeks earlier while wearing number 3. The matchup this week is sort of a dream for Paulo, the Warriors last week let in multiple tries down their right edge while defending against 12-men. This could be the game for Souths attack to finally get itself right, and Paulo stands to be a major beneficiary if that does occur.

FAVOURITE: Souths are favoured by 6.5 points over the Warriors in this one.

MY TIP: Souths have just been so underwhelming so far this season, and I really don't expect to see that change, especially with someone as influential as Cam Murray out. The Warriors are one of the few teams with a worse form guide at the moment, but the return of Tohu Harris cannot be understated. Warriors by 4.

Two finals hopefuls battle it out in a clash to find form

On a sold out magic round Saturday, the St George Illawarra Dragons will meet the Gold Coast Titans in the second game of the day's triple header. Despite neither team really having the home advantage up in Brisbane, support for both clubs will be high as football fans from around the world descend on Suncorp Stadium.

The Titans will be hoping that some magic rubs off on them this weekend, with the past month bringing nothing but the harsh reality of footy to their fans. Playing last week's game all the way up in Mackay, the change of scenery seemed only to worsen their problems. The 44 points to 16 loss to the Roosters is their 5th loss in a row, and they will be desperate to end that streak this Saturday.

For the Gold Coast to find their third win of the season, however, they will need to fix some defensive issues that have been prevalent in the past month of competition. The Roosters ran in some easy tries in round 9, even when they were down to 12 men. The Dragons can and will make them pay for defensive lapses.

Titans coach Justin Holbrook has opted for a number of changes to last week's 17, with a few players returning from injury. Young gun Jayden Campbell retakes his fullback spot, pushing Brimson into the number 6 role. Esan Marsters finds his way back into the team in the centres, at the expense of Patrick Herbert. Big forward Kevin Proctor has been dropped in favour of Jarrod Wallace.

Phillip Sami returns on the wing, and Jamayne Isaako takes the other wing, pushing Corey Thompson and Greg Marzhev out of the team. Jaimin Jolliffe has been named on the reserves as question marks remain over his fitness.

For the Dragons, their short-lived run of wins came to a crashing end last Sunday, with the now competition leaders the Storm putting on a dominant display against them. The 42 points to 6 scoreline will be slightly disheartening for St George, but they have a good opportunity this week to refind that form line against the struggling Titans. They can take some encouragement from their resilient goal line defence early on in the game, in the face of Melbourne's weight of possession.

An hour before last week's game kicked off, a number of late changes were made by coach Anthony Griffin, with young Talatau Amone being allowed the opportunity in the halves. He has named the same 17 this Tuesday that started the game last Sunday, and will be hoping that they can find a result for the club. George Burgess has been named as the 18th man.

Neither of these teams have ever won a match at Magic Round in its short history. For one of these clubs, that trend will continue this weekend.

WHO TO WATCH: Jayden Campbell returns to the Gold Coast line-up for the first time since Round 3, starting at fullback for the fourth game this season. After suffering a rib injury in his team's loss to the Raiders, he has been overlooked for the past few weeks by coach Holbrook despite reportedly making a full recovery. Now being given another chance, he will be eager to show that he deserves that number 1 jersey for many weeks into the future.

Playing in every game so far this season for the Dragons, Talatau Amone has been named to partner star halfback Ben Hunt in the halves. With a late shift seeing him thrown in at five-eighth last week, and having alternated between the interchange bench and starting half throughout the season, he will want to nail this spot down as his. A win this weekend against the Titans will certainly help his case.

FAVOURITE: The two teams are hard to split, but the Dragons are favourites to extend Gold Coast's run of losses.



Title hot-shots take centre stage at Magic Round

Buckle up league fans, this is bigger than just one versus two. It's a Brisvegas jackpot where Magic Round's showpiece has landed at a heaving Suncorp Stadium.

Because after Melbourne and Penrith it's just daylight, right?

Ever since Craig Bellamy's outfit broke the hearts of Ivan Cleary and his young team in the 2020 grand final, the rivalry has escalated.

Now on Saturday night, they meet for the first time since the Panthers bundled Bellamy's big boys from last year's title race.

Since 2017, these two have been like cat and mouse - tit for tat. The last eight are split four apiece and of those, neither has triumphed with consecutive victories, while four of the last five have been decided by seven points or less.

Now in the midst of a slashing six game winning streak, the Storm are on another planet. Since falling to the Eels in round three, they have accumulated 270 points at 45 per match while conceding just 52 at a misley 8.7 per match.

With 10 tries in the Storm's unbeaten run, Ryan Papenhuyzen has returned to career best form. But in a blow to Melbourne and over 50,000 paying fans, injury has done what his opponents couldn't and stopped the fullback dead in his tracks.

Former Bulldog Nick Meaney fills his boots while Dean Ieremia comes onto the wing. With centre Reimis Smith also injured, Marion Seve gets another chance in the top grade.

Last week at the foot of the mountains, the locals were on track for nine straight wins, but a couple of costly errors let the Eels off the hook. Now as they prepare to combat a lengthy list of Storm matchups, for Penrith, there's no time to mope.

A loss here would be the Panthers' first back-to-back defeat since last June. And with the Roosters and a resurgent Cowboys to follow, Ivan Cleary will be desperate to restore the winning habit.

Compared to Melbourne, Penrith's backline is good to go. Scott Sorensen is the only change up front, rejoining the bench at the expense of Matt Eisenhuth.

WHO TO WATCH: Leaner and meaner after a sub-par 2021, Cameron Munster is rapidly making up lost ground. Over the past five rounds with three tries, eight line-breaks and just as many try-assists, the Queenslander has burned brighter than Venus.


Now as he prepares to face Nathan Cleary and Jarome Luai for the first time since last season's preliminary final exit, there will be no shortage of motivation to rain on their parade.

For the otherside, no one will be more motivated than Dylan Edwards. Last week's decision not to contest a second half bomb was not only unusual, it gifted Parramatta two competition points. It was a tough price for the reliable fullback to pay, who with the most run metres this season, is the man who often sets Penrith's attack on the front foot.


FAVOURITE: With Papenhuyzen parked up, Penrith are now odds-on.

But given both sides have conceded just 110 points across the opening nine rounds, an Origin-style scrap is the reality. Sadly for Melbourne, the absence of their golden-tipped star looks to be Penrith's rabbit in the hat. Panthers by 12.

Sharks circle inconsistent Raiders

The Sunday triple-header of matches as part of the NRL's Magic Round kicks off when the Cronulla Sutherland Sharks 'host' the Canberra Raiders at Suncorp Stadium. These sides met back in Round 1 where Canberra held on to defeat the Sharks 24-19 in a back and forth encounter. However, both sides have had contrasting fortunes since the opening round, with Cronulla firmly inside the top eight, while Canberra continues to fade away in the second half of matches.

Well, Canberra didn't fade away last weekend against the Bulldogs holding on for a scrappy 14-4 victory. But, they're going to have to lift their performance by a considerable margin if they want to compete with the top side of the NRL Telstra Premiership. They had a lot of ball in the opposition 20 and let's be realistic, they didn't convert their quality possession into points.

Matt Frawley eased into Jack Wighton's vacant 6 jumpers, showcasing brilliant organisation before scoring a neat solo try by making Matt Duffy fall for a dummy to no one. Hudson Young as well is continuing to thrive on the left edge for the Raiders since his return from injury, his dynamic runs and brutal defence could have the Shark's right-hand defence in disarray. Jarrod Croker left the field in sad circumstances when he hurt his shoulder saving a Matt Duffy try, he'll be on the sidelines and his place is set to be taken by Sebastian Kris. Xavier Savage is added to the bench to replace Kris.

Cronulla on the other hand was brave and gutsy defeating a woeful Warriors side 29-10. They played the best part of an hour without the services of Will Kennedy who was sent off after an old-fashioned coat hanger and even playing a period of the second half with 11 men due to Jesse Ramien's sin-bin for an awful high shot.

Nicho Hynes had his best performance for the Sharks showcasing excellent game management to help get Cronulla through the period where they were down to 11 men. Teig Wilton is another goer in the Sharks pack that is getting better with every passing game. For Cronulla to get revenge after their shock opening-round loss to the Raiders, they'll need to match Canberra's forward intensity and test what will be an inexperienced left edge with yet another change. Will Kennedy and Jesse Ramien are both on the sidelines serving suspensions so there'll be a backline reshuffle. Nicho Hynes shifts to fullback with Connor Tracey shifting to his more accustomed centre role. Ronaldo Mulitalo returns to the wing, and Braidon Trindall returns to halfback. Aidan Tolman is named back at prop, Dale Finucane starts at lock and Cam McInnes shifts to the bench. Royce Hunt replaces Andrew Fifita on the interchange.

WHO TO WATCH: Well, the pre-season injury to recruit Jamal Fogarty left the Raiders in a whole lot of trouble, but the shining light on a down season has been the emergence of rookie half Brad Schneider. Schneider has taken the number seven jumper by the scruff of the neck this season, taking the responsibility as the dominant kicker while Jack Wighton runs the footy and takes it to the line. Now with Wighton's suspension, it's a really good chance to see how Schneider runs the footy team on his own without the services of the former Dally M Medal winner.

Blayke Brailey is showcasing the faith Cronulla had in him when they let his brother walk on a lucrative contract at the turn of the decade. Brailey's defence and leadership at a young age are a testament to him. Having not missed any more than 5 tackles in a game this season, expect Brailey to be at his defensive best against a tough and resilient Raiders pack.

FAVOURITE: Cronulla is the overwhelming favourite in this one.



Contenders or pretenders? Sydney rivals put credentials to the test

The Sydney Roosters and the Parramatta Eels find themselves in strange positions among the current NRL hierarchy.

Establishing a reputation as one of the best teams of the past decade, the Roosters have underperformed over the opening third of the season, while being impossible to write off given their history.

In contrast, the Eels have claimed the two biggest scalps in the premiership - away from home - yet questions remain over their ability to perform at the business end of the season.

The Saturday night encounter between Melbourne and Penrith may be the showpiece of Magic Round, however the Sunday afternoon meeting of Sydney's East and West should give rival teams plenty to ponder in the weeks to come.

Coming into the contest with an above average record to sit in sixth on the premiership ladder, the Sydney Roosters will be hoping to break away from the pack of teams on ten competition points and overtake their opponents into the top four.

Returning to form with a dominant 44-16 win over the Titans at their home away from home in Mackay last Saturday, coach Trent Robinson has enjoyed a 75 per cent success rate over the Eels with nine wins from 12 clashes since taking the helm in 2013.

Recalling utility Connor Watson in place of injured hooker Sam Verrills, Daniel Suluka-Fifita is the new man on the bench after Lindsay Collins accepted a one-match ban.

Holding the distinction as one of four teams alongside the Tigers, Rabbitohs and Storm to boast a 100 per cent success rate in Magic Round, captain James Tedesco will bring up a century of appearances for the club on Sunday afternoon.

Coming off a major high after becoming the first team in three years to leave the foot of the mountains with two points, the Parramatta Eels will be out to consolidate their standing as a premiership heavyweight.

Rising to the occasion last Friday to down the Panthers 22-20 in one of games of the season, coach Brad Arthur will be hoping his players can continue a strong record in the pandemic era at Suncorp Stadium following four wins from five visits.

Sticking with the same group of players that got the job done last week, the Eels have experienced mixed fortunes during Magic Round with the Storm flexing their attacking muscles in 2019 before making amends in Jake Arthur's debut against the Warriors last year.


WHO TO WATCH: Holding the distinction as one of a select group of active players with three premierships to their name, Roosters playmaker Luke Keary has yet to recapture his past heights upon returning from major knee surgery. Missing all bar three matches last season due to a dreaded ACL tear, the 30-year-old has managed nine try-assists and seven forced drop outs alongside Sam Walker in a partnership pundits expected to challenge for the title. Gaining a reputation as a big game specialist for his feats in the 2018 decider, the Roosters will need Keary to step up and guide the side to victory against the highly credentialed Eels.

Pressing his case for a representative recall four years on from his sole appearance for NSW, Eels front-rower Reagan Campbell-Gillard will be determined to make his presence known against the Roosters pack. Producing strong numbers with over 150 running metres on average to go with a 94 per cent tackle efficiency rate, the Rooty Hill junior has ranked among the top forwards in the league over the first third of the season for run metres. Last experiencing the Origin arena, without making an appearance, as part of the Blues bubble in 2020, Campbell-Gillard will give himself every chance of going from blue and gold to sky blue with another strong showing on Sunday.

FAVOURITE: Despite winning a paltry one time against their poultry opponents in the past five years, the Eels are fancied to get the job done in Magic Round.

MY TIP: If historical precedents mean anything, the Roosters are in trouble after going win-loss in their past nine appearances at Suncorp Stadium. On the other hand, people can come up with statistics to prove anything... forty per cent of all people know that. Eels by 2.
