POTTER NAMED INTERIM COACH

The Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs have today announced that Michael Potter will take over as interim Head Coach until the end of this season.

Potter, who is currently the Head Coach of the Mounties side in the NSW Cup, will move into the Bulldogs role immediately.

Potter, has a major history with the club, having been part of the Bulldogs' Premiership winning sides of 1984 and 1985.

He then made a successful transition into Head Coaching roles with the Catalan Dragons (2006-08), St Helens (2009-10), Bradford Bulls (2011-12) and the Wests Tigers (2013-14).

THE ENDEAVOUR CUP

A LOOK BACK AT ONE OF THE MOST SUCCESSFUL AND IMPORTANT NON-LEAGUE TOURNAMENTS IN THE 1970'S WITH ANDREW FERGUSON

The 1970's in Australia saw the introduction of many minor competitions.

The Wills Cup which was a preseason competition running from 1962 til 1981, the mid-week, mid-season competition which ran from 1974 til 1989 and even a mid-season Challenge Cup in 1978.

But none of those had a lasting impact on the game as the short lived Endeavour Cup.

For a number of seasons, there had been some concerns from players whose club didn't make the finals, that they were being overlooked for end-of-season Test and Tour selections, in favour of players participating in the finals.

In 1970, the Cronulla-Sutherland club put forward a proposal to the NSWRL to host an end of season competition between the teams finishing 5th to 8th on the ladder. They had secured Toyota-Thies to sponsor the event. The competition would be played over the first two Sunday's during the NSWRL finals series, to allow players to remain match fit and in contention for selection in the World Cup squad at the end of the year.

On July 27, 1970, the NSWRL board held a meeting and agreed to let the competition go ahead. It was to be held entirely at Endeavour Field.

The competition was to have a total prize pool of \$10,500. First place winning \$5000, Second \$3000, Third \$1500 and fourth \$1000.

With two rounds of the main competition remaining, Cronulla were sitting ninth on the ladder and looking like they may not qualify for their own competition. But they snuck in thanks to two convincing victories. A 23-2 win against Penrith in Round 21 and a 34-6 hiding of Parramatta.

On August 30, the Endeavour Cup began with a double header at the Sharks home ground. Hosts Cronulla took on Newtown in the first game at 1.30pm and then Balmain played Eastern Suburbs in the 3.30pm game. These games were the first played under the 6 tackle rule, purely as a trial, as opposed to the 4 tackle rule that was in place.

The first game was a sloppy affair and the full merits of the new rule were not seen. Cronulla's captain-coach Tommy Bishop copped a stray elbow to the face which resulted in him losing two teeth. With 12 minutes remaining in the game, Bishop was sent off for tripping. Newtown won the game 13-11.

The second game was much better and provided everyone with the full benefits of the 6 tackle rule. Most notably was the reduction in scrums. The first game had 38 scrums which was on par for most games played during the year, however there were only 16 scrums in the second game. There was also the extra involvement of ball playing forwards, most notably Arthur Beetson, who was getting involved 2 or 3 times per set.

Balmain defeated a bits and pieces Easts side 34-12 which saw them advance to the final against Newtown on the following

Sunday, while Easts and Cronulla will play off for 3rd. After the match all coaches were in agreement that the new rule looked to improve the game.

"I like it. The six tackles give a team that little extra to work with and provide more continuity to the play. The element of panic is not as prevalent and there aren't as many dropped passes. The players have more time to settle down."

Harry Bath (Newtown and Australian Test coach)

"The rule could bring the forwards into the play a bit more but there would be no chance of going back to the old bash and barge because, after all, there are only six tackles to work with. I can see the forwards driving the ball in attack but this is good football. I would like to see another couple of matches under the rule before finally making up my mind on its merits."

Tommy Bishop (Cronulla captain-coach)

"In our game there were only 16 scrums, and this has to make the match better. I like the idea of the six tackles. The best football will come on the fourth, fifth and sixth tackles, when the defence is starting to tire a little."

Don Furner (Easts coach)

"From our match it was obvious there was not the panic from the players that has been there at times. Nor was there as much useless kicking and this has to be better."

Leo Nosworthy (Balmain coach)

The final saw Newtown beat Balmain 12-8, to claim their first title of any kind since they won the City Cup in 1945, 25 years ago. The win was more impressive given Newtown played the last 30 mins with 12 men, after forward John Oakley was sent off for a deliberate high tackle.

Despite Easts fielding a poor side and Cronulla failing to reach the final, the competition saw the Cronulla club financially "almost square."

So successful was the trial of the 6 tackle rule that the NSWRL decided to implement it fully for the upcoming season.

Toyota-Thiess decided to continue their sponsorship for the competition in 1971, due to the Cronulla club deciding to expand the competition to include more teams, possibly from Wollongong, Newcastle and Brisbane.

The 1971 competition would see trainers being allowed to attend to injured players without stopping play, as well as each game being just 25 minute halves. Every game of the competition would also be televised live. All 8 sides not involved in the finals would be taking part.

The final of 1971 saw Cronulla pick up their first ever title, defeating Canterbury 20-13. The trial of trainers being allowed to treat players without stopping play was seen as another success from the Endeavour Cup and was introduced from the start of the 1972 season. Half of the gate takings were donated to the NSW Paraplegic Association.

With the competition being used as a sounding board for new rule ideas, it was thought that the Endeavour Cup would continue functioning beyond 1971, especially given that it was the only post-season competition on the calendar.

However, a lack of major sponsor and the concern by the NSWRL that some clubs were not taking the competition seriously, with some clubs using the competition as an opportunity to allow suspended players to serve part of their suspension, it was decided not to continue the competition any more.

But in the space of two years and just 12 games, the Endeavour Cup provided the competition with the 6 tackle rule and no stoppages to allow injured players to be treated, making it arguably the most successfully innovative competition in the post-war era.

NEWCASTLE END LOSING RUN IN DOGGED AFFAIR

The Newcastle Knights have tasted victory after seven long weeks of misery with a 16-6 win over Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs in the opening match of Magic Round 2022.

Claiming their third win from ten matches to surpass their opponents off the bottom of the NRL ladder, the Knights overcame two bombed tries in the second half to secure the result courtesy of a late four-pointer to Adam Clune.

Opening the scoring via a Kalyn Ponga penalty goal during the opening minutes, the Knights posted the first try of Magic Round with Ponga finding Bradman Best down a short side, who offloaded to send Edrick Lee (14th minute) over for his first try in the NRL since the final round of the 2020 season.

Taking a fixated approach to attacking through Matt Burton's kicking game, the Bulldogs produced a result midway through the half after a grubber close to the try line allowed Josh Addo-Carr (20th minute) to outpace Dominic Young to the ball.

Adding a penalty goal through Burton in the latter stages of the first 40 minutes, the Knights were unable to capitalise on late opportunities to leave the scores level at 6-all.

Appearing to strike early after halftime through Daniel Saifiti - only for the bunker to overturn the on-field decision for an obstruction - the Knights disappointment was short-lived with Ponga exposing the Bulldogs rushing goal line defence and sending Best (48th minute) over for his third try of the season.

In a nervous second half for both side, Newcastle forwards Leo Thompson and Pasami Saulo were left to rue missed opportunities over the try line with Thompson spilling a pass from Phoenix Crossland, while Saulo failed to properly ground a grubber from Clune.

Securing the result in the final minutes following a fortuitous line drop out ruling, Clune (75th minute) broke through to score his first try in red and blue and seal the ten-point win.

Next week, the Bulldogs face the Tigers at Leichardt Oval in the early game on Friday, while the Knights return home to take on the Broncos on Thursday evening. **ROB CROSSBY**

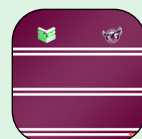

BRILLIANT BRONCOS MAKE IT FOUR-IN-A-ROW OVER SEA EAGLES

The Brisbane Broncos have continued to prove to doubters wrong, beating the Sea Eagles by a massive 38 points to nil scoreline in the second game of Magic Round.

The match started off in disaster for the Sea Eagles and never really got any better, with Tom Trbojevic allowing the kickoff to bounce and the ball then went over the dead ball line.

The Sea Eagles then opted to go short with the dropout, but it was taken well by Kotoni Staggs, and the Broncos went on the attack. Their set ended with a pinpoint crossfield kick by Adam Reynolds, who found an open Selwyn Cobbo for the first try of the game.

The Broncos then had a mountain of possession for the next 10 or 15 minutes, but were unable to turn it into points. Manly were finally given opportunities through penalties and Broncos errors, but didn't pose a threat. On their first trip to the red-zone, Daly Cherry-Evans put in a kick on the third tackle that was knocked on by Koula, and on the next occasion Kieran Foran simply dropped it cold.

The Broncos got a set restart on the ensuing set, and Billy Walters was taken out from chasing his own kick off the ball by Jake Trbojevic. They took the 2, making it 8-0 in the 22nd minute.

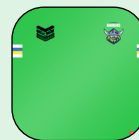
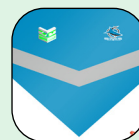

COWBOYS ROUND OUT MAGIC ROUND WITH THUMPING WIN OVER DEPLETED TIGERS

The NRL's most improved team, the North Queensland Cowboys have rounded out the NRL Magic Round in convincing fashion, downing a depleted Wests Tigers side 36-12.

Wests came into this game with a swag of late changes in the backs and would suffer further injuries throughout the game. The most notable was suffered by 5/8 Luke Brooks who left at half-time with a hamstring injury.

It was the Cowboys who got on the board first inside the opening ten minutes with the try of Magic Round, when Murray Taulagi looked for certain to go into touch, before flicking it back inside to Scott Drinkwater who crossed for the opening try of the game and an early lead. Six minutes later, the Tigers hit back when Junior Tupou flew through the air to take the bomb and score his first NRL try in his maiden top-flight appearance and give the Tigers a shock two-point advantage.

The Tigers compounded their try by making an unforgivable mistake off the kickoff when Starford To'a failed to place his foot on the sideline in trying to take the kickoff out on the full. The Tigers would rue this error when Taulagi grabbed a try of his own before the 20-minute mark when he finished off a well-worked set play. The injury hits began for the Tigers when Jake Simpkin failed his HIA following an awkward tackle attempt. Off a dubious hip drop penalty, the Tigers hit back when Hastings and Brooks combined to send Luke Garner away untouched in the corner and with Hastings' conversion, Wests led by four.

The Cowboys hit the Tigers with a cruel double blow before half-time, the carnage began when a Chad Townsend bomb was dropped by Zane Musgrove under the pressure from Coen Hess. Chad Townsend threw a lovely cut out ball to Kyle Feldt to cross and with Holmes' conversion, the visitors led by two. Off the ensuing set, Reuben Cotter accepted a lovely offload in the middle third and he sprinted the best part of 60 meters untouched to put the Cowboys ahead by 20-12 at half-time.

The Tigers were hit with another blow when Brooks failed to return for the second 40 with a hamstring injury, compounded with a shoulder injury to Musgrove, the Tigers played the second 40 with just one fresh reserve. Taulagi was denied an early double when he placed his foot on the line when going for the corner, but he made amends when he crossed in the 47th minute to extend the margin to 14. Ten minutes later, Peta Hiku crossed after a lovely ball from Dearden saw Hiku outmuscle several Tigers defenders. A late special from Jeremiah Nanai saw him snatch a bomb out of the air to seal a convincing Cowboys victory 36-12.

Wests next week take on the Bulldogs as they return to Leichhardt Oval for the first time this season. While North Queensland take on the Storm in a Super Saturday blockbuster. **AJ LUCANTONIO**

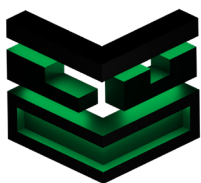

Long-standing foes fight for momentum

The Newcastle Knights will be hoping to make it back-to-back wins when the in-form Brisbane Broncos arrive at McDonald Jones Stadium on Thursday evening.

Breaking through for a much-needed win after falling from first to last over the course of seven miserly weeks, the Newcastle Knights will be determined to get their campaign back on course in front of their home supporters.

Clinching a confidence building victory over the Bulldogs 16-6 in the opening match of Magic Round, coach Adam O'Brien has received added good fortune with Tyson Frizell returning from injury and Dane Gagai an outside chance of playing as part of the extended bench

In addition to the returning cavalry, former Brisbane superstar Anthony Milford will make his club debut after serving a ban imposed by league for an off-field incident last season.

Holding a solid record against the Broncos in recent years with four wins from their previous five clashes, the Knights will have their sights set on making amends on home soil after embarrassing displays against the Eels (39-2) and Storm (50-2) prior to the past fortnight in Queensland.

Making the biggest statement of Magic Round to the delight of supporters throughout the Sunshine State, the Brisbane Broncos will be vying to record five consecutive wins for the first time in five years.

Eviscerating the Sea Eagles 38-0 last Friday in arguably the club's best performance since the departure of Wayne Bennett, coach Kevin Walters will be hoping his side can break a losing run in Newcastle dating back to 2017.

Retaining the same squad that got the job done last week, former Dragons winger Jordan Pereira could make his club debut should Te Maire Martin fail to overcome a hip concern.

Sitting in seventh position at the bottom of a group of four teams tied on 12 competition points, the Broncos could finish the round in the top four should results fall their way.

WHO TO WATCH: Dominic Young is a hard man to miss standing at two metres tall and tipping the scales at over 100 kilograms. Yet for as imposing as the English import appears, his ability on the football field is making rival teams stand up and take notice. Producing 18 tackle breaks, six line breaks and four tries in seven appearances this season, the 20-year-old winger gained plenty of plaudits for a tenacious defensive effort forcing Josh Addo-Carr into touch last week with the game on the line. Facing off against the Broncos for the first time in his career, look for Young to be heavily involved in a rare Thursday night game held in Newcastle.

Cory Paix may not boast the reputation of many of his more esteemed teammates, but in a short space of time the impact hooker has played a critical role in turning the Broncos from also-rans to top eight contenders. Consistently delivering in just under a half of game time over recent weeks, the 22-year-old has made a habit of elevating the side's attacking potency upon coming off the bench midway through the first half of matches. Facing off against a Newcastle outfit that has struggled to play for 80 minutes over the past two months, Paix shapes as a player capable of breaking the game open on Thursday evening.

FAVOURITE: Holding a strong historical record in the Hunter to go with an impressive run over the past month, the Broncos are expected to notch up their third win on the road this season.

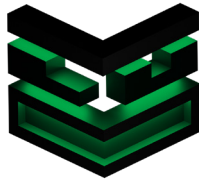

Rumour mill fuelling fire in bottom of the table clash

The Wests Tigers and the Canterbury Bankstown Bulldogs. Both of these cellar-dwelling sides have been synonymous with all kinds of media attention as of late, with very little of it being for the right reasons. These two sides come into their Friday evening clash with the weight of the world on their shoulders as they look to shrug off criticism coming from every which way for at least the next week.

The Tigers are coming off a 36-12 drubbing at the hands of the Cowboys in Magic Round, seeing them slip back to 15th on the ladder. Only Friday's opponents are below them in the standings at this point in the season. Even more dramatic, the Tigers acquired the services of Brent Naden during the week, who only a few days ago called Canterbury home. He is every chance to face his former club this week should Michael Maguire opt to rush him into the seventeenth. Not to mention, rumours linking coach Maguire with a move to the Bulldogs following the departure of Trent Barrett during the week have now surfaced, setting up a red-hot clash that might otherwise have drawn less interest.

The Bulldogs come into the match having lost last week in a dismal effort against Newcastle, 16-6. It would turn out to be then-coach Trent Barrett's last game in charge before he stepped down from his role, pre-empting his seemingly inevitable sacking. Michael Potter will take over as the interim coach and has a big job ahead of him if the Bulldogs are to climb off the bottom of the ladder after Friday's game.

In Tigers team news for this week, Michael Maguire has named changes to the side that went down to the Cowboys. Asu Kepaoa starts at centre, which sees Luke Garner move back to his preferred second-row position. Star five-eighth Luke Brooks has succumbed to his injury suffered in the game against North Queensland and will be replaced in the starting side by Jock Madden. Whichever forward pack gets the better of the other should win this one, and if that happens to be the Tigers, Liddle will be showing what a crafty hooker he is and put his side on the front foot. Liddle is another player who has had some media spotlight on him as of late, with rumours linking him with a move away from the club. He will be looking to impress the coach to prove his worth this week.

Matt Burton is another one to watch this week. The off-season recruit was touted as one of the biggest coups for the Bulldogs in a long time. Burton is another player being linked with a move away, with rumours suggesting he may test his worth on the open market. The Bulldogs need to start performing if they're going to keep him, and this is exactly the type of game they can win. Look for Burton to prove himself this week and be the dominant player in this Canterbury side. He will play a crucial role if they are to lift themselves up after a tumultuous week.

FAVOURITE: The odds are split dead-even for this game.

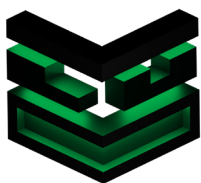

Manly Look to Bounce Back From Horror Loss Against Inconsistent Eels

Both sides were on the wrong end of the scoreboard at Magic Round in games they were expected to win, however it was the performance of the Sea Eagles that will have Des Hasler and company scrambling for answers after losing to the Broncos in a 38-point shutout.

It was more of the same for the Eels, who followed up an impressive win against a genuine contender with a lacklustre performance against a team in poorer form than them. Unlike Manly however, there were some encouraging signs for the Eels, who managed to turn a 25-6 second half deficit into a 25-24 scoreline, before the Roosters eventually pulled away to win by 7.

Still, Brad Arthur will not be pleased with Sunday's effort. He said in his press conference after the Panthers victory that his Eels were "not an elite team" due to not performing to their full potential each week. It was almost a direct challenge to his playing group to back up their performance against Penrith and they failed to do it.

If the Eels took one step backwards last week, the Sea Eagles took 40, 20 of them being of their own accord and the remaining 20 after being pushed back by a dominant Broncos outfit. It wasn't as if they were starved of opportunities or strangled out the affair either, Manly had multiple attacking trips but seemed to turn the ball over through stupid unforced errors every time. In the first half, Foran dropped the ball cold on their first visit to the Broncos line, while the second time saw DCE put in an unnecessary kick on the third tackle that the Broncos easily recovered.

On the rare occasions they did hold onto the ball, they offered little in attack, as the scoreline would suggest. Tom Trbojevic is either horrendously out of form or is still carrying some sort of injury, the latter being the more likely option, while Cherry-Evans looked a shadow of the player he was against the Tigers the round prior.

Manly's poor showing wasn't helped by the fact that they came up against the form player of the competition in Adam Reynolds, and it doesn't get any easier as they this week will face the red hot Mitch Moses, who was directly involved in three of the Eels four tries last week, including a scintillating tip-toe effort down the sideline. The kick defence of Garrick on the edge was woeful and needs to improve if Manly are to be any chance of stopping Moses' deft kicking game.

In team news, Ryan Matterson has been rewarded for consistent strong showings in the middle with the starting lock position, pushing Nathan Brown to the bench. Marata Niukore returns to the 17, pushing Bryce Cartwright to the reserves.

For the Sea Eagles, Tom Trbojevic has somewhat surprisingly been named at fullback again despite some apparent injury concerns. Morgan Harper has been recalled for the first time since being abused by Talakai a few weeks ago, with Ben Trbojevic making way. Ethan Bullemor has been dropped with Andrew Davey starting in his place and Schuster returning via the interchange.

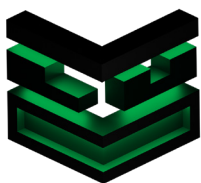
WHO TO WATCH: This Eels team is just so much fun to watch when they're in form that it's hard to pick just one, however someone who has been flying slightly under the radar in terms of plaudits for mine has been Ryan Matterson. After coming through the grades as a 5/8th and then switching to back-rower early in his first grade career and having success there, it was assumed that that was where he would continue to play. However, the Eels made the call to give him some minutes in the middle as a lock and it has so far been the most fruitful positional change of 2022. Last week, he came off the bench and in 55 minutes produced 1 line-break, 10 tackle breaks, 2 offloads, 17 runs for 172 metres and made 33 tackles at an efficiency rate of 94%, while also scoring a crucial try that got the Eels within 1. This was the week after he scored the try that gave the Eels the lead, which they never gave up, on the road against a team that hadn't lost at home for three years. He has this week, as was alluded to earlier, been rewarded with a spot in the starting lineup, and it will be interesting to see if/how he splits with Nathan Brown as well as if he can continue his strong run of performances.

The Sea Eagles were an absolute nightmare to watch last week that I wonder if any Manly fan was able to get through the entire 80 minutes without either walking out of the ground or turning off the TV. No player that was in the 17 last week has earned the right to be featured in this section of the preview, and for that reason I'm going to say Josh Schuster is the player to watch for Manly this week. He made his first appearance of 2022 against the Rabbitohs in the Karl Lawton send off game in Round 8 and the difference he made to Manly's attack was obvious. He draws a lot of attention from edge defences with his size and strength, while also having the skills of a five-eighth to throw a crisp pass to his left should his opposite man overcommit. This skillset is a good matchup for the Sea Eagles that Des Hasler should be planning to exploit; the Eels edge defence has been consistently one of the worst parts of their game, and Schuster's gravity is an asset that can be used to create more space out the back for out of form players such as Trbojevic.

FAVOURITE: The Eels are 7.5 point favourites at the time of writing.

MY TIP: Manly have had the wood over Parramatta recently, sweeping them last year by a combined margin of 68 points, however you'd have to be a madman to think they can continue that streak considering their recent performance and health of key players. Eels by 16.

Saturday's NRL action kicks off with a visit to Sydney's southern suburbs as both the St George Illawarra Dragons and New Zealand Warriors look to keep themselves in touch of the NRL top 8 with victory at Kogarah.

Coming into Round 11 sitting in 12th spot on the ladder, the Dragons have had an inconsistent season hampered by injury and team changes all season as coach Anthony Griffin tries to get his team right. Last weekend, the Dragons fell to a 20-16 golden point loss to the Gold Coast Titans at Suncorp Stadium.

The Dragons were denied possession early in the contest against the Gold Coast as their opponents put a stranglehold on the Red 'V' who impressed many with their defence early in the contest. Having survived the relentless attack of the Titans, the Dragons were able to throw a counter punch although they trailed at half-time. During the second half, the Dragons were the more dominant side but couldn't shake the Titans. In a game that was affected significantly by the rain, an error from the Dragons in golden point meant that the Titans got good field position and took the victory.

Dragons coach Anthony Griffin has wrung the changes both through choice and through injuries to key players. FAVOURITE: The Dragons are better backed to get the result at home on Saturday.

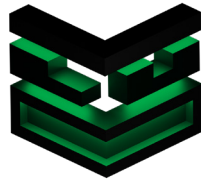

The NRL's most improved side in 2022, the North Queensland Cowboys will put their credentials to the test, taking on competition heavyweights, the Melbourne Storm.

North Queensland come into this one riding the waves of a five-match winning streak, after an indifferent start to the season. There's no doubting that the defence of the Cowboys has improved in leaps and bounds since last season. A lot of that can be put down to Todd Payten and Dean Young, that's a sentence we weren't saying last season. But the defensive mindsets have encouraged a renewed energy on defence as they are currently the NRL's second-best defensive side (only behind Penrith).

Last week, they had a neck and neck struggle with the Tigers in the first 40, before over-running the injury-hit side in the second stanza.

Tom Dearden is easily the game's most improved player showcasing the decision making that saw many pundits label him the next big thing in Brisbane a few years ago. Their young brigade of forwards are goers and will give 150% on every play as they continue to push for QLD selection.

This will be their biggest test so far this season, going up against a rugged Melbourne pack. Tom Gilbert faces a \$3000 dollar fine on his third offence of the season, but will play as the Cowboys name an unchanged line-up.

Melbourne were sent back down to earth after a rampaging run in the last few weeks. Yes it's easy to point to injuries to key players, but remember Melbourne punish teams that are injury depleted too (they did it to Penrith last year in Brisbane).

The most concerning aspect of this performance though was the way Melbourne was beaten in the middle, over the years it's happened on only a handful of occasions. Expect a response from Melbourne's pack, especially against a Cowboys side that has several players on the radar of Billy Slater's QLD side.

Jahrome Hughes returns after being a late withdrawal last weekend. The Tyran Wishart fullback experiment is set to continue for the time being. Nelson Asofa-Solomona is out, Brandon Smith starts at prop with Alec McDonald and Dean Ieremia takes positions on the interchange bench with Chris Lewis dropping out.

WHO TO WATCH: If you went around the NRL and asked them to pick a player that they enjoyed watching, Reuben Cotter's name would pop up quite considerably. Cotter's form this season is continuing to spark the Cowboys, despite being a little forward playing at prop.

Cotter's constant work ethic and desire to see the improving Cowboys continuing to fire is a testament to him. His name has been thrown around as a possible QLD debutant, against a tough Melbourne pack on Saturday, this is his chance to shine.

Harry Grant is one man that always continues to thrive. Even with the lopsided possession count against Melbourne on Saturday, Grant was always looming to get out of dummy half and try and spark the Melbourne attack.

Grant's running game and general organisation will look to be the difference against a Cowboys defence that has been rugged this season as Grant looks to secure the number nine jumper.

FAVOURITE: Melbourne is the slight favourite in this one.

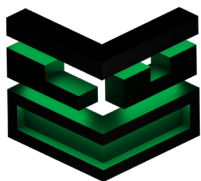

Roosters look to strike against prowling Panthers

The Sydney Roosters look to build their credentials in season 2022 against the high-flying Penrith Panthers as they return to the Sydney Cricket Ground after a mid-year QLD road trip.

The Roosters' start to season 2022 has been marred by inconsistency. You take the good wins over North Queensland, Brisbane and Parramatta but substitute the losses against Newcastle, St George and Canterbury. That being said, it appears things are going right for the tri-colours as they approach the trickiest part of their season.

They're coming off a 31-24 win over Parramatta who defeated Penrith just a week prior. Their forward pack showed up with the right mindset and matched it with Parramatta's notably strong pack of forwards. The backs are finding their groove with Joseph Suaalii proving to be a dual-threat in the air with Daniel Tupou and with Penrith's wingers lacking height, Keary and Walker are licking their lips at a potential air-raid. Paul Momirovski had his best game of the season last week and will be looking to prove a point against his old club as he warms into the centre position.

Onto the team news, Radley's ankle injury sees Nat Butcher promoted to lock, and Siosua Taukieaho remains at prop with Lindsay Collins returning from suspension via the bench. Sitili Tupouniua is in doubt having to pass concussion protocols, if he fails to pass the protocols expect either Egan Butcher or Naufahu Whyte to fill the void.

Penrith on the other hand has been consistently ruthless this season bar the hiccup against Parramatta. Their pack of forwards is consistent week in, week out and will look to crunch the Roosters through the forward exchanges. Penrith's back 5 has been consistently brilliant coming out of yardage this season, but face their toughest test with the Roosters' back 5 who pioneered the art of backs coming out of yardage.

Penrith slaughtered a depleted Storm side up in Magic Round. It would've been easy to be complacent, but Penrith showed true championship qualities. Jarome Luai arguably had his best game of the season with his kicking game placing Tyrann Wishart and Marion Seve under all sorts of pressure. Isaah Yeo continues to stamp his claim for the NSW lock jumper, his ball-playing attribute continues to shine brightest with his ability to draw in defenders at the line. The Panthers are unchanged once again, the only thing in doubt for the premiers is whether Ivan Cleary will be on deck after being absent from the coaches' box over the past fortnight.

WHO TO WATCH: Sydney's forward stock has taken a hit but they do get the services of Lindsay Collins back from suspension. Collins is an interesting commodity, in the finals series against Penrith two years ago his impact off the bench was able to help stem the tide from what would've been a finals blowout at the hands of the Panthers. He missed both games against Penrith last year due to injury and will be keen to stamp his claim for the vacant QLD prop jumper against a strong Panthers forward pack.

A bench player rarely is one to watch, but the form of Scott Sorensen is hard to ignore. A fortnight ago, his impact was missed as the Panthers pack was overrun by Parramatta. Against the Storm, Sorensen returned to his dynamic best running the ball 14 times for 124 meters as well as 25 tackles. The energy he brings to Penrith's middle makes Sorensen one to watch on Saturday night.

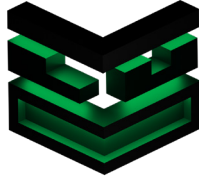
FAVOURITE: Penrith is the warm favourite. Although, the tricolours pipped Penrith at the SCG in their last meeting there in 2019 and have a bad record at the SCG since 1967 winning only once and drawing once from 11 trips to the Cricket Ground.

MY TIP: Both sides are running into this one full of confidence after a big win at Magic Round. But the Roosters don't complete above 76% in three straight weeks, it just doesn't happen. I've watched too many seasons and see the same stuff over and over again. Penrith will suffocate the Roosters after half-time and capitalise on the opposition's errors, but it'll be a close game as the Roosters won't go away. Panthers by 8

Wighton returns as Rabbitohs and Raiders face off in Dubbo

In past seasons, the Rabbitohs and Raiders have been genuine premierships contenders – at least, that is what they looked like on paper.

This year though is very different, with huge question marks hanging over both sides.

The Rabbitohs may have escaped with a win last week but it was hardly convincing, holding off a fast-finishing Warriors outfit 32-30.

That result in itself spoke to the biggest problem with last year's Grand Finalists – they no longer seem capable of dominating for the entire 80 minutes.

And a lot of that comes back to losing the calming influence of halfback Adam Reynolds.

But don't worry, as relevant as Reynolds' absence may be to this discussion, you have probably heard enough about the subject already and this is nothing new.

South Sydney did show glimpses of its best last week against the Warriors though, charging out to a 32-6 lead before a late collapse.

And that was without Cameron Murray and Latrell Mitchell, with Jacob Host (shoulder) now joining the pair on the sidelines and youngster Trent Peoples joining the line-up.

Rabbitohs coach Jason Demetriou has consistently spoken in the past about the importance of ball control to South Sydney's fate this year and last week's result proved him right.

The Rabbitohs built its 26-6 halftime lead off the back of a 86 per cent completion rate, dominating possession (56 per cent) and finishing with five linebreaks and 822 run metres to the Warriors' 551.

The second half though saw South Sydney dip to a 65 per cent completion rate as the Warriors almost completed a stunning comeback, teaching the Rabbitohs a big lesson in the process.

The only issue – it is a lesson Demetriou has been hammering home all season long, so when will the message actually get through?

Speaking of messages getting through, Ricky Stuart must have said something incredible to spark Canberra's 30-10 upset win over the Sharks last week.

The Raiders may have been coming off a win over the Bulldogs but it in itself was hardly impressive and the Green Machine's recent form suggested a brutal reality check was on the cards.

Instead, Canberra cruised to a 20-point win – although cruised is probably not the right word given how much adversity Stuart's men faced.

The Raiders had three players sent to the sin bin throughout the 80 minutes and still conceded just the two tries, frustrating Cronulla into submission.

What will please Stuart most is that Canberra bagged two wins with star five-eighth Jack Wighton suspended.

His return sees youngster Brad Schneider make way with Matt Frawley retaining his spot in the side while Adam Elliott (illness) is 18th man as Zac Woolford starts once more after his NRL debut last week.

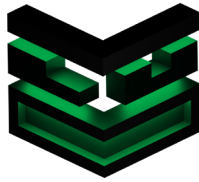
WHO TO WATCH: Damien Cook was a man on a mission in the opening half against the Warriors last week, running for 59 metres, scoring a try and busting six tackles. He was kept relatively quiet from that point but against the Raiders, it is more likely that the opposite will be true. Canberra's biggest issue this year has been working out its forward rotation. Too often, the Raiders' big men have grown fatigued in the second half of games, contributing to late fadeouts. That could be an issue against someone like Cook, who has the speed to expose tired forwards through the middle.

The Rabbitohs may have a speedster out of dummy-half in Cook but the Raiders have their own answer in Tom Starling. The 23-year-old was bumped to the bench last week even with Adam Elliott sidelined and had a few nice touches but given the nature of the game, Starling made more of an impact in defence (team-high 34 tackles). Starling is one of the best instinctive hookers in the game, knowing when to inject himself with a slicing run or when a crash ball to a prop forward is the better play. This time around, provided Canberra keeps its discipline in check, it will need Starling to make his presence felt in attack too.

FAVOURITE: The Rabbitohs are slight favourites to take the win in Dubbo.

MY TIP: Flip a coin at this point. Both of these teams have been wildly inconsistent at times this year. In the end, the threat of Damien out of dummy-half could blow this game open. Rabbitohs by 12.

Miller to debut for Sharks in an important clash to end Round 11.

The Gold Coast Titans will host the Cronulla Sharks in the final game of Round 11 this Sunday afternoon. The two teams are coming away from Magic Round in very different spots on the ladder, and both clubs will want to continue in their quest for a top eight spot as the halfway point of the season approaches.

A very promising season start for Cronulla, in which they won four from their opening five matches, has started to falter. With only two wins from their past five matches, the pressure is on them to refine their early season form. With their bye round rapidly approaching, the Sharks will be looking to bolster their confidence heading into the week off.

A key factor in Cronulla's season so far is new halfback Nicho Hynes, who has played a big role in their promising wins thus far. However a suspension to fullback William Kennedy saw Hynes shifted to fullback by coach Craig Fitzgibbon for last weekend's disappointing loss to the Canberra Raiders (10-30).

This week, Fitzgibbon has opted to put Hynes back into the halves forcing Braydon Trindall onto the bench, with rugby sevens convert Lachlan Miller named to make his NRL debut at fullback.

Coming into this Sunday's clash, Cronulla will want to perform a lot better when it comes to discipline.

With fourteen errors and a completion rate of just 71%, a much better performance with the ball will be needed this weekend.

They also gave away a number of simple penalties early in the game against the Raiders, taking away any field position pressure that they may have been developing.

Dale Finucane hasn't been named following injury concerns, and is replaced in the starting side by Royce Hunt. Wade Graham has been given a starting spot, with Teig Wilton moving back to the bench. Jack Williams hasn't been named due to a shoulder issue.

The Gold Coast Titans put an end to their five game losing streak last Saturday when they beat the Dragons in a thriller.

A number of missed field goal opportunities meant that golden point lasted almost the full ten minutes, before a Dragons error gifted the Titans the field position necessary for Jamayne Isaako to cross the line in the corner.

The return of young fullback Jayden Campbell seemed to be a big boost for the Gold Coast last weekend. Having failed to earn a spot in the 17 following his early season injury, his return game against the Dragons couldn't have gone any better. With 266 run metres, 13 tackle breaks and 160 kick return metres, Justin Holbrook had no choice back to pick him in the number one jersey for the second week running.

Something that is going the way of the Gold Coast at the moment is their lack of casualties in comparison with other clubs. This has allowed them to name the same 17 this week as last week, and with David Fifita and Patrick Herbert both expected to return next week, the Titans could be in good shape heading into the origin/bye rounds.

This game is shaping up to be quite unpredictable. The Titans will need to exploit Cronulla's slightly unusual backline if they want any chance, while the Sharks just need to apply constant goal line pressure, and not waste any opportunities.

Cronulla have beaten the Gold Coast in their last six meetings, and will want to make it seven this Sunday.

WHO TO WATCH: Lachlan Miller has been named to make his NRL debut at fullback this weekend for the Sharks. With Will Kennedy still out through suspension, Miller will get his shot in first grade after appearing 8 times this season for the Jets in the NSW Cup. The former Australian Rugby 7s player made the switch back to rugby league at the start of this year, with the Sharks winning his signature over a number of different clubs and codes. If he can perform under pressure, the Sharks will be well on the way to winning this game.

Replacing the now-Raider Jamal Fogarty at the start of this season, Toby Sexton has played every minute of every game so far this season as the Titans halfback. With more experience comes more responsibility and higher expectations, so can Sexton consistently deliver for the Gold Coast? Justin Holbrook is certainly backing his ability, and a good performance this weekend might be all that is needed to lift both his and the team's confidence with the majority of the season still ahead.

FAVOURITE: The Cronulla Sharks are the favourites to win this Sunday despite coming off a loss.

MY TIP: The Titans haven't displayed any consistency throughout their 2022 campaign so far, and won't be able to back up their win last weekend. Cronulla by 14.
