LODGE GRANTED IMMEDIATE RELEASE

FRIDAY 20 MAY

Vodafone Warriors prop Matt Lodge is leaving the club immediately after being granted a release from the rest of his contract.

"Matt told us a while ago that for professional and personal reasons he couldn't commit to a long-term future in New Zealand when we return home for next season," said Vodafone Warriors CEO Cameron George.



"The opportunity for him to leave now allows us to move forward with our future planning and to develop our younger players.

"We're grateful to Matt for the contribution he has made since joining us last year and wish him and his family all the best for the future."

Lodge (26) joined the Vodafone Warriors from the Broncos in July last year.

"I couldn't see my family living in New Zealand for a long-term future," said Lodge.

"Therefore we decided that the best thing for the club was for us to mutually part ways so they have some clarity.

"I respect the club and especially the boys a lot and hopefully I showed that by the way I trained and played physical and gave my all every game."

Lodge's 14th and final appearance for the Vodafone Warriors was against South Sydney last Saturday.

LUI SIGNED FOR REST OF SEASON

MONDAY 23 MAY

Former Queensland State of Origin front rower Dunamis Lui has been signed by the Vodafone Warriors for the rest of the 2022 NRL season.

The 32-year-old veteran joined the club at Moreton Daily Stadium today and is in line to make his Vodafone Warriors debut in Saturday's 12th-round home game against Newcastle.

He boasts 169 NRL matches including the 2019 grand final with the Canberra Raiders when they lost 8-14 to the Sydney Roosters.

Since ending his 89-game stint with Canberra last year the Toa Samoa international has been playing alongside a number of Vodafone Warriors players as captain of feeder side Redcliffe in the Queensland Cup.

"As well as his extensive experience, Dunamis will give our squad wonderful qualities as a leader," said Vodafone Warriors general manager football Craig Hodges.

"He's also familiar with many of our players after playing alongside them in the Queensland Cup.

"Dunamis is going to play a valuable role for us not only as a player but as a mentor for the young players we have here in our wider squad."

Lui, who has appeared in eight finals matches, is now set to extend his NRL career to a 14th season after linking with his fifth NRL club.

He debuted with the Brisbane Broncos as a 20-year-old in 2010, playing 32 matches before making 38 appearances for Manly Warringah in 2014 and 2015.

There was a one-season stop with St George Illawarra before Lui found a home with the Raiders.

After playing all 24 matches in 2018, he had his best season in 2019 as a key performer in all 27 games as Canberra went all the way to the grand final.

Another 20 appearances followed in 2020 when he was called up for his only State of Origin game.

FARNWORTH EXTENDS ONE MORE YEAR

MONDAY 23 MAY

Exciting centre Herbie Farnworth has extended his commitment to the Broncos until the end of the 2023 season.

The 22-year-old speedster with 51 NRL games for Brisbane including 16 tries to his name has signed a one-year contract extension.

Farnworth said, "I've been here since I was 15 and I'm really happy with all the boys and (Coach) Kevvie and all the staff - I really enjoy it here at the club.

"The past two years have been tough but to get the last five wins in a row and the direction the club is headed, that's played a big role in my decision to stay.

"With all the players who have chosen to stay, a lot of us came through the 20s competition together – Fleggy, Kobe, Patty, Payne, Staggs – we've all come through together and it's good to stay together.

"We're really happy that we can get some wins for our members and fans and give them something to cheer about at Suncorp."

Farnworth has had a sensational start to the 2022 season, crossing for seven tries, producing 31 tackle busts and running for an average 137 metres across his 10 games as the Broncos have surged into fifth position on the NRL ladder.



His early season form follows on from 2021 when the young Englishman's consistent performances earned him the club's Best Back Award.

The fast-stepping centre was also named in England's squad to prepare for the 2021 World Cup but did not get a chance to play as the competition was postponed until later this year due to the pandemic.

Broncos Head Of Football Ben Ikin said, "Herbie is a quality player with a deep desire to keep getting better, I think we're all seeing that in the ways he's performed this season.

"Despite having multiple options to go elsewhere, Herbie chose the Broncos, which I think is a great outcome for both parties."

BRONCOS INFLICT A KNIGHT-MARE IN NEWCASTLE

A late flurry of tries in the final 13 minutes has seen the Brisbane Broncos post an emphatic 36-12 win over the Newcastle Knights at McDonald Jones Stadium.

Making the most of a contentious obstruction ruling with the game on the line at 14-12, the Broncos ran in 22 points in the final moments to extend their dominant run to five straight wins for the first time since 2017.

Coming out of the sheds with attacking intentions from the kick-off, the Knights got off to a strong start with Adam Clune executing a well-weighted grubber that contacted off the hand of Broncos debutant Ezra Mam into the arms of Tyson Frizell (9th minute).

Going close to extending their lead on multiple occasions only for Lachlan Fitzgibbon and Frizell to lose the ball over the line, the Knights were left to lament a single try during the opening half despite dominating possession.

Playing without captain Adam Reynolds due to a groin injury, the Broncos managed to find the try line midway through the first half with Billy Walters (25th minute) collecting his first try in Brisbane colours by making the most of a six-again call.

Appearing to strike a critical blow late in the half following a terrific attacking kick from Anthony Milford in his club debut, a try to Dane Gagai was overturned after the bunker ruled the returning centre failed to re-grip the ball in the act of grounding.

Breaking the halftime deadlock after a goal line error from Dominic Young invited the Broncos on the attack, Jordan Riki (49th minute) charged onto a short pass from Tyson Gamble to put the visitors up 12-6.

Staggs, filling in as goal-kicker, pushed the margin out beyond a converted try following a late tackle from Jacob Saifiti on Gamble, however the Broncos were left to watch in awe a few sets later as Kalyn Ponga (61st minute) streaked onto a short pass from Mat Croker to score next to the posts.

Going the length of the field despite Clune appearing to be obstructed inside the Broncos half, Kotoni Staggs combined with Selwyn Cobbo (67th minute) to the disgust of 13,312 parochial supporters.

Blowing the game open during the final ten minutes with Corey Oates (70th minute) and Cobbo (74th minute) continuing their try-scoring prowess, an intercept from Milford on fulltime allowed Herbie Farnworth (80th minute) to complete a 36-12 rout.

Next week, the Knights face the Warriors in Redcliffe on Saturday afternoon, while the Broncos return home for a Friday night rivalry opposite the Titans. ROB CROSBY

From there the Tigers turned on the class. Jock Madden chipped for himself to give them some breathing space then Brown came back to haunt his former side again with a late burrowing effort which made it 36-22

Dogs did give themselves a chance for the comeback when Schoupp dived over to make it eight the difference but it wasn't enough. A torrid week for the Bulldogs ended with another loss but despite their comeback cameo in the second half.

Repeated sets off some poor discipline including a questionable high shot from Tuipulotu on Perham saw Manly eventually crack with three to go when Matterson linked up with Penisini to cross out-wide. Moses converted from the sideline showcasing his clutch ability.

Hughes returns as Turbo-less Manly looks to make statement against Melbourne

Melbourne and Manly were two genuine premiership contenders last season and entered this year with optimism of going one step further. But both have hit hurdles in recent weeks, although fortunately for the Storm, theirs does not appear to nearly be as permanent.

Melbourne is bolstered by the return of halfback Jahrome Hughes, allowing Harry Grant to return to hooker after struggling in the halves last week. That also sees Brandon Smith push back to the bench, where he will offer greater impact.

Melbourne has been a shadow of its former self in the past couple of weeks, clearly at a loss to find answers in attack with both Hughes and Ryan Papenhuyzen sidelined. More than anything though, Hughes' return is crucial this week because it allows Grant and Smith to go back to their natural positions - the less disruption, the better.

But regardless of who is missing, Storm coach Craig Bellamy would have been livid with his side's defence last week. While Xavier Coates produced a stunning try-saving tackle to stop Murray Tuilagi, his other Storm teammates were guilty of folding far too easily on the defensive line. The points may not be coming like they were earlier in the season but look for Bellamy to put all the focus on defence this week.

As for Manly, this week is the ultimate test in how it will fare without fullback Tom Trbojevic. Last year's Dally M medalist obviously has the ability to break games open himself but he also makes everyone else around him better by attracting attention from the defence.

The Sea Eagles will need all of their playmakers to step up in Trbojevic's absence, with Reuben Garrick moving to fullback in the only change to the spine. That sees Jorge Taufua recalled for his first game since Round 17 in 2020, although Jason Saab is lurking on the reserves as he nears a return from a toe injury. In other team news, Martin Taupau is sidelined with Ethan Bullemor joining the bench in his place.

There is added motivation for the Sea Eagles this week as Kieran Foran celebrates his 250th NRL game.

WHO TO WATCH: Justin Olam single-handedly humiliated Morgan Harper in their last match-up, scoring a try, running for 123 metres and busting six tackles in a barnstorming display. And their face-off before that one saw Olam erupt for two tries, over 140 metres and again six tackle breaks. Put simply, Olam has a history of exposing Harper's defensive weakness and even if the two don't match up this time around, it will be a tough task for rookie centre Tolutau Koula to contain the PNG sensation

As for the Sea Eagles, they will need to find some extra ball-playing out the back with Trbojevic sidelined and Josh Schuster shapes as the best chance of filling that void. Trbojevic had four linebreak assists and two try assists when Manly took it right to Melbourne in Round 21 last year, eventually falling 28-18. Schuster has had an injury-disrupted start to the season but he will have to increase his involvement off the bench if the Sea Eagles are any hope on Friday. Obviously the focus for Schuster should simply be on getting back into the rhythm of the game, with this just his third NRL match this season. But even still, the 21-year-old shapes as Manly's next option at five-eighth when Foran leaves and this is one chance to prove why he deserves the role long-term.

FAVOURITE: No Turbo, no Manly? That's what the punters think, with Melbourne strong favourites.

MY TIP: No Trbojevic makes this tough for the Sea Eagles. Facing Melbourne off two-straight losses just before the Origin period makes it near-impossible. Not impossible but as close as it gets. Storm by 20.

Cowboys size up Panthers and another surprise scalp

Worthy of a prime time Friday night blockbuster, the early start to this clash says everything about the Cowboys' unexpected revival.

Coming off a season defining 36-6 thumping of the Storm, it's hard to believe that this Cowboys outfit is the same one that vanished without a trace last season, winning just one of its last 12.

Now on a six match winning streak, the similarities in the rise of Todd Payten's young guns with Ivan Cleary's homespun premiers should have a packed BlueBet Stadium rocking well before the sun sets.

In round nine the Panthers slipped up on home turf for the first time in 22 starts and will be desperate to hit the ground running from the opening whistle out of respect to their loyal fans.

Since the loss to Parramatta, Cleary's mob have rebounded in spectacular fashion to suffocate both Melbourne and the Roosters while the Blues pairing of Nathan Cleary and Jarome Luai stood up to pilot back-to-back five try demolitions.

The last time the Cowboys racked up six on the trot was in 2015, back in the Johnathan Thurston days. Now with a host of fresh faces knocking on the door of Origin selection following several big scalps, we're about to find out just how far the Cowboys have come.

Despite the likes of Murray Taulagi, Jeremiah Nanai and Scott Drinkwater toying with the NRL's finest, it's without the ball where North Queensland have made their biggest impact. Having only conceded three more points than the table topping Panthers, at 11.9 per match, Payten's team now has a finals backbone.

Although, history shows the Panthers have little to fear. The Cowboys last beat them in 2019 and the last time they toasted at the foot of the mountains was way back in 2016. Now without skipper Jason Taumalolo and reliable winger Kyle Feldt, the hurdle just got bigger. But as they've shown all season, this is the type of obstacle the Cowboys have learned to relish.

WHO TO WATCH: Chad Townsend might not be as consistent off the boot as Nathan Cleary but his arrival at the Cowboys has certainly helped put Jeremiah Nanai on the map. An impeccable nous for turning attacking kicks into points has seen the 19-year-old backrower, already with 10 tries this season, become a lethal last play option.

Now head-to-head with Viliame Kikau, Nanai could be in for a dose of his own medicine. Renowned for his steamrolling prowess, the flying Fijian's aerobatics were there for all to see when he out jumped the Storm to score during Magic Round.

FAVOURITE: A frosty Penrith on a Friday evening is no place for any outsider, so it's little surprise the locals are warm favourites.

MY TIP: The Cowboys deserve respect for running laps around both Parramatta and Melbourne in recent outings, but both those upsets took place above the Tropic of Capricorn. It's a far cry from an icey Mulgoa Road and an unchanged Panthers lineup hellbent on eliminating every premiership threat. Panthers by 14.

Who would've thought that the Brisbane Broncos would be sitting in fifth place after 11 weeks as the Gold Coast Titans dwell in 13th place after just three wins so far this season. The Broncos have peeled off five wins in a row, including wins over Cronulla, South Sydney and Manly. They're fresh of a 24-point victory over the Newcastle Knights despite missing star halfback Adam Reynolds.

They'll head into this clash without Reynolds for the second week straight, with Ezra Mam named in his second game for the South East Queensland derby, as they look to extend their winning streak to six. The last time the Broncos won six games on the trot was way back in 2017 when Wayne Bennett and Darius Boyd were still at the club. However, it seems that the club has finally turned the corner for the first time since Bennett's departure at the end of the 2018 season. They possess a brilliant crop of young forwards backed by some exciting talent in the backline. Those players were key to the Broncos victory over the Knights on Thursday night. The Broncos outran the Knights by 408 metres and averaged an extra 11.7 metres per set than their opposition. Six of their forwards eclipsed 100 running metres, including all three bench forwards and their outside backs (not including fullback) all eclipsed that mark too. Just over a month ago, there was talk of the young Selwyn Cobbo heading back to reserve grade to work on his game, after a tough opening few weeks. However, the 19-year-old has been exceptional over the past month. Since their five-win streak began, Cobbo has scored nine tries, made five linebreaks, broken 29 tackles and averaged 163.8 running metres. When you compare that to the no tries, three linebreaks, 18 tackle breaks and the 105.7 metres per game over the first six weeks, it's clear that the 19-year-old has improved immensely over the first half of the season. Cobbo will be a key weapon for the Broncos as they look for another win over the 'little-brother' Titans. Cobbo will start on the wing for the Broncos in an unchanged line-up from their victory over the Knights.

At the start of the season, if you asked footy fans which Queensland team will finish the highest on the ladder, the most popular answer would've been the Gold Coast Titans. Now, 11 weeks into the competition, and the Titans are sitting in 13th spot and are the only Queensland team currently not residing inside the top eight. It's been a tough start to the year for the Titans, however, given the inexperience of their young spine, it's not all too surprising that they've struggled throughout the year. The Titans have lost six of their last seven matches, including their seven-point loss to the Sharks, which saw the Titans put up a fight. They've struggled in both attack and defence this season, scoring just 178 points (12th in the league) whilst conceding a large 265 points (14th in the league). An interesting point though, is that since the rule changes at the end of the season, the Titans have struggled with the ball in hand. Last season, the Titans scored 30 points or more in 11 of the 25 matches the club played. Fast forward to now, and the Titans have failed to score 30 points in a single game through 11 matches. Add this to the fact that their three wins all had margins of four points or less and it's starts to look grim for the Titans. However, Gold Coast still boast some immensely talented players in the likes of Jayden Campbell, AJ Brimson and Tino Fa'asuamaleaui just to name a few. The injury to David Fifita has naturally hurt their attack, although, their cohesion with the ball in hand has been something of a struggle for the young side. This will come with more game time together, but at the moment, it doesn't bode well for the Titans 2022 finals hopes. Fifita has been named in the reserves for the weekend, so we'll have to wait and see if he is selected prior to the game. Phil Sami misses this week with a knee injury and will be replaced by Brian Kelly, as Jaimin Jolliffe joins the bench at the expense of Herman Ese'ese.

WHO TO WATCH: This week's players to watch isn't a position matchup, but features two backs who have impressed so far this season. Firstly, Titans fullback Jayden Campbell, was one of the better players on the park for the Gold Coast in their loss at the hands of the Sharks on the weekend. The 22-year-old ran for 165 metres, broke four tackles and assisted a try as they fell seven points short. In his five games this season, Campbell averages a tick over 150 run metres per game and an incredible 5.8 tackle breaks per game, which included a whopping 13 against the Dragons two weeks ago. Campbell is only two games back from injury and is surprisingly only 12 games into his career at this stage, but with the glimpses we've seen, he could be in for a big performance on one of the biggest stages at Suncorp Stadium.

For the Broncos, with Origin selection just around the corner, centre Kotoni Staggs has been excellent over the past month and could be a chance to make his debut for the New South Wales Origin side with the injuries to Tom Trbojevic and Latrell Mitchell. The 23-year-old had a lacklustre start to the season, failing to crack 100 run metres and remaining scoreless in each of his first four games of the season. However, since that round four loss to the Warriors, Staggs has been on fire. In the seven matches since that Warriors match, Staggs has made five linebreaks, scored three tries, broken 5.7 tackles per game and ran for an average of 107.4 metres per game. His spike in form has coincided with the excellent form of Selwyn Cobbo on his outside, which has done nothing but reap rewards for the Broncos. With Origin selection around the corner, be ready for a big one from Staggs.

FAVOURITE: Despite missing Adam Reynolds for another week, the Broncos showed that they can still perform without their star halfback. A current five-game win streak could be turned to six on Friday night in Brisbane as the inform Broncos continue their quest for a return to finals footy. The Titans haven't looked great this season and given that they've only won three games this season, the favourite must be Brisbane.

MY TIP: Brisbane are surprisingly running amok at the moment, and will look to continue their excellent run over the Titans, which has seen Brisbane walk away as victors in 21 of the 31 outings between the two teams. I expect the Broncos to make that 22 from 32. Brisbane by 10.

Desperation is the name of the game in this Round 12 Indigenous Round clash between the New Zealand (Aotearoa) Warriors and the Newcastle (Mulubinba) Knights at Moreton Daily Stadium, the home of the Yuggera, Jinibara, and Kabi Kabi Peoples.

The Warriors return to their Redcliffe base for the first time since their last win a month ago over Canberra. New Zealand has developed a fortress mentality at Redcliffe this season, winning every game that they've played at their home away from home this season. But their football since their heart-stopping win over the Cowboys has been questionable to say the very least and if there's no improvement Nathan Brown's position could easily be untenable.

Last weekend was the epitome of Warriors football, they spilt the opening kick-off and conceded the first points inside 90 seconds. Although they came back strongly and were arguably in the game for most of the second 40, they were unable to get the job done. It's clear to every league fan, that they're missing the services of Josh Curran and Wayde Egan. Jazz Tevaga tries his best at hooker but is more suited to an impact role coming off the bench. Addin Fonua-Blake is out, and Daejarn Asi drops to the reserves. Jazz Tevaga shifts to prop with Freddy Lussick starting at hooker. Chanel Harris-Tavita returns at five-eighth. Taniela Otukolo joins the bench.

Newcastle has been a frustrating team to watch this season, after a promising start which saw many pundits have egg on their face, it has been a slow demise for the Novocastrians. Despite a win at Magic Round against Canterbury, even then they were unconvincing, it's been an uphill battle for the men from Newcastle. Kalyn Ponga has been the rare exception, desperately trying his best in every match. Ponga's solo try last week should've been the starting point of a Knights revival. Although they had a 50/50 call go against them, Newcastle allowed Brisbane to turn the tide and take advantage of the favourable call. They dropped their heads and were close to giving up in some portions of the game which even Adam O'Brien acknowledged as a concern.

He has some gems on the bench in Leo Thompson and Matt Croker, but they both need more game time as they have so much potential. The only forced change in Adam O'Brien's lineup is Bradman Best forced out with a gruesome elbow injury with Enari Tuala set for a recall. Jake Clifford is recalled at half-back with Adam Clune dropping out of the side altogether.

WHO TO WATCH: In a Warriors pack missing big names such as Fonua-Blake and Curran. Pressure is firming on Tohu Harris to return to his damaging best. Harris' return has been slow but expected, Harris had his best game last week in an increased role gaining 155 meters and making 35 tackles. Warriors fans will be hoping Harris continues this forward progression throughout the season and aim to get back in the winner's circle for the first time this month.

With State of Origin teams being picked at the conclusion of this round, Dane Gagai is under immense pressure to retain his starting centre spot. With the rise of the Cowboys this season which has seen their entire backline thrown in the ring come origin 1. Gagai returned from injury last weekend and didn't look a beat out of place. Gagai had 17 carries for 168 meters and had a try denied. Gagai will be looking to fire against the Warriors with a QLD spot on the line.

FAVOURITE: The Warriors start as favourites against the Knights. Newcastle has had the better strike rate over the Warriors in recent seasons.

MY TIP: Although the Warriors' form of late has been diabolical. There's something about Redcliffe that they are loving, with an undefeated record there spanning the last two seasons. Look for the Warriors to answer the critics and have a strong performance against a Knights side that have players fighting for their spots in the State of Origin. Warriors by 2.

The midde game of Saturday's trio sees the South Sydney Rabbitohs looking for revenge when they host the Wests Tigers at Accor Stadium.

Souths have struggled this season for any consistency and it shows by their eighth placing on the NRL ladder so far in 2022. The Rabbitohs have won just 5 of their 11 matches so far this season and see them sitting on a solitary point on for and against.

Last week, the Rabbitohs again didn't enjoy a trip to Dubbo when they fell to a 32-12 defeat against the Canberra Raiders. Completely outplayed in the opening forty minutes, the Rabbitohs trailed 20-0 and looked out of ideas both in attack and defence as the Raiders took advatange of the sloppiness in Souths plays.

Two big returns could potentially boost the Rabbitohs with Mark Nicholls named on the bench for his return from injury whilst Cam Murray is added to the reserves for a shock return. Hame Sele has been named to start with Trent Peoples dropping out of the side, Tevita Tatola and Taane Milne will be under scrutiny in the lead-up after suffering head knocks last week.

The Wests Tigers have had a poor season but in recent weeks, they have shown plenty of improvement including a scratchy at times victory over the Canterbury Bulldogs. The Tigers come into the contest sitting in 15th spot on the ladder but have the added confidence of beating Souths earlier in the season.

Last weekend, the Wests Tigers took a 36-22 victory over the Canterbury Bulldogs at a packed Leichhardt Oval. The Tigers started fast running in four first-half tries although goal kicking hurt them as they only lead 18-0 at the break. WHO TO WATCH: The mainstay of the Souths side, Cody Walker has struggled this season and coming up a halves combination that is beginning to fire, Walker needs to find improvement quickly if Souths want to win. There have been glimpses of form that make Walker special, he needs to find consistency because the Tigers will be confident they can beat Souths.

Since moving to five-eighth, Luke Brooks has started to find form and despite being missing last week, he is a big cog in any potential Tigers form. There are still things to find fault in his game, but now playing the second fiddle to Jackson Hastings, Brooks is playing better Rugby League and needs to step up this week against a potentially powerful opponent.

FAVOURITE: Souths are considered to be heavy favourites.

MY TIP: going for an upset, the form of Souths has been below average and the Tigers with some key players back could find some form. The Tigers will be confident they can beat Souths yet again this season and I think with the form of Jackson Hastings, he can lead them to win. Tigers by 4.

The Cronulla Sharks will host the Sydney Roosters this Saturday night as the NRL holds their 12th Indigenous Round, formerly known as Close the Gap Round. The two sides are both in the top 8, with only one win separating them.

For Cronulla, they will no doubt be very happy with the position that they find themselves in after 11 rounds. Sitting in 4th place on the ladder with their bye round next week, the Sharks will want to go into their week off on a high. Despite their promising start to the season, however, they have failed to string together successive wins since the 5th Round.

Despite a late scare up on the Gold Coast last Sunday, the Sharks held on to bounce back following their shock loss to the Raiders. A hard fought first 40 minutes in terrible conditions seemed to wear the Titans down a bit, with halfback Nicho Hynes slotting the field goal to ice the game, 25 points to 18, in the 80th minute. A Titans break following a short kickoff saw Hynes sin binned with just seconds left to play, only a small sour note on a solid performance in his return to the number 7 jersey.

Following the Sharks Magic Round loss, Nicho Hynes was moved back into the halves, with Lachlan Miller getting the chance to debut at fullback. Scoring a try and making 10 tackle busts, the Rugby 7s convert certainly made an impression on the game. With William Kennedy returning from suspension for their clash against the Roosters, Miller moves back to 18th man, however he will be of much utility value to the side as the season progresses.

The Sydney Roosters are sitting 7th on the ladder as the half-way point of the season approaches, with inconsistency rife throughout their campaign so far. Playing the defending premiers Penrith last weekend at the SCG, they managed to hold them out for nearly thirty minutes before a quick Jarome Luai double saw Penrith gain control of the game, with the Roosters down 32-12 at the full time siren.

Roosters captain and fullback crossed in the 61st minute for his side, which was his 6th try in just the past 4 games. His form is certainly coming at a good time from a NSW perspective, with origin sides being picked in the very near future, and with injuries to the likes of Tom Trbojevic and Latrell Mitchell. The Roosters will certainly want him to have a big performance this Saturday, as they will almost certainly have to make do without him for a few rounds due to the upcoming Origin commitments.

One gamer Terrel May has been named to retain his spot on the bench while Sitili Tupouniua returns from a head knock in a boost to the Roosters forward pack.

The Sydney Roosters have triumphed in their past 6 meetings with Cronulla, and will look to make it 7 this Saturday.

WHO TO WATCH: The last time Will Kennedy took to the NRL field, in Round 9, he was sent off for a high shot. Entering an early guilty plea, he received a two week suspension that created a selection headache for Sharks coach Craig Fitzgibbon. With his return in the number 1 jersey, the Cronulla backline looks on paper to be much more settled, but can it transition onto the field?

Named on the wing for his 7th game of the season so far, young talent Joseph Suaalii will be looking to add to his growing tally of tries in the NRL. Debuting at just 17, his 2021 season was cut short due to injury, but he is fast cementing his spot in this Roosters side with a number of solid performances strung together in recent weeks, highlighted by a big hit on Viliame Kikau last week. Picked over the likes of Kevin Naigama, Suaalii needs to keep showing his coach why he deserves his spot in the 17.

FAVOURITE: The Sharks are the narrow favourites heading into this one.

MY TIP: With William Kennedy returning to the Sharks backline, with him may come the Cronulla of the first few rounds. Sharks by 8.

Bulldogs look to find their bark at Belmore

Two of Sydney's proudest clubs - Canterbury-Bankstown and St George Illawarra - will face off on the lands of the Dharug, Eora and Bediagal Peoples during the league's annual Indigenous Round on Sunday afternoon.

Approaching the midpoint of the season with just two wins to languish in last position on the premiership ladder, the Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs will be hoping a return to Belmore brings about a change in fortune.

Rallying from a heavy halftime deficit only to go down to the Tigers 36-22 at Leichardt Oval last Friday, the blue and whites have fared poorly since returning to their spiritual home in 2015 with two wins from nine appearances at the venue.

Boosted by the return of Josh Addo-Carr in a backline reshuffle that sees Jacob Kiraz preferred ahead of Jayden Okunbor, Corey Waddell replaces Joe Stimson in the forward pack, while Kyle Flanagan will play his 50th game in the NRL.

Sitting on the precipice of the top eight with the worst for-and-against differential of the four teams locked on ten competition points, the St George Illawarra Dragons will be looking to mark their first appearance at Belmore as a joint venture with a win.

Getting the better of the Warriors 24-18 in a rain-affected clash at Kogarah prior to the polls closing last Saturday, the joint venture has edged the Bulldogs in five of their past eight meetings over the past four years.

Welcoming back Andrew McCullough after a fortnight out of action with a thumb injury, coach Anthony Griffin has opted to start Moses Mbye at hooker with McCullough taking the place of Jayden Sullivan as the interchange utility.

Set to wear commemorative jerseys designed by First Nations artists Pam Brandy Hall (Bundjalung) and Joanne Niki (Torres Strait) respectively, both teams have struggled historically in Indigenous Round with the Bulldogs last prevailing in 2018 and the Dragons dating back even further in 2016.

WHO TO WATCH: Making a welcome return after missing last week through illness, few players in the league will be out to make a statement during Indigenous Round more than Josh Addo-Carr. Descending from the Gunggandji, Wiradjuri and Gadigal Peoples, the man affectionately known as "The Foxx" has provided the Bulldogs with much-needed glimmers of hope in a season that has left supporters with little to celebrate. Scoring six tries in his past five appearances following a slow start to the season, Addo-Carr has enjoyed a memorable strike rate against the Dragons with eight tries, including back-to-back hat-tricks, in three previous meetings.

Returning to the second-row after a brief stint in the number six jersey, Jack Bird will be out to cap his newly inked deal with a win. Knocking back rival offers to remain with the Red V until the end of 2024, the Yuin man has relished a near injury-free run at the Dragons, after managing just 34 appearances in the four years following the Sharks maiden premiership victory. Considered a long shot of earning a place in Brad Fittler's Origin squad despite a shortage of edge forwards, a strong shoring could see Bird back in Blue for the first time in five years.

FAVOURITE: While the Dragons have produced some of their worst performances of recent years against the Bulldogs, the stability of the Red V is expected to be too strong on Sunday afternoon.

MY TIP: A change of government took place 26 years ago when both St George and Illawarra last appeared at Belmore. The Bulldogs haven't cracked 26 points in a match all year, while the Dragons have done so only once. No more than 26 players can be on the field at any time. I don't know where this bit is going but I've committed... Dragons by 26.

Resurgent Raiders Look To Continue Strong Form Against Inconsistent Eels

There's an old saying that a week is a long time in Rugby League. Going on that logic, three weeks is an eternity, and the Raiders recent turnaround in form has certainly backed that up.

Just under two fortnights ago, the Raiders were a shambles. They were sitting in equal last position after losing their last five games and there was seemingly no cause for optimism with 4 of their next 5 games against top 8 teams. Punters were rushing to the windows to get their wooden spoon tickets in and Raiders fans were turning their attention to 2023.

What has followed for the Green machine has been an absolute dream, winning their last three games convincingly, two coming against quality opposition in games they came into as the outsiders. They've got back to winning the battle of contact which has allowed them to dominate field position, leading to huge improvements in defence, while also generating increased momentum in attack. The return of Wighton last week also helped the left side be a more cohesive unit when in the red-zone. A win for the milk this week could potentially see them return to the top 8, however it gets even harder as they take on an Eels side who have shown that they are one of the best teams in the NRL when they want to be.

However, the Blue and Gold have been anything but convincing in the last two weeks, conceding 31 points in a magic round loss to the Roosters before scraping home at BankWest against Manly last week. They are yet to show the consistency required of a championship team, and travelling down to the freezing nation's capital against an in-form Raiders side has all the hallmarks of a famous Eels letdown game. In saying that, there are not many Eels sides in recent years that would've come back from a double digit deficit like the current one did last Friday. Too often in the past, the Eels would've seen Manly score two soft tries shortly after half-time, dropped their heads and lost in a blowout. To win the way they did, with a try in the dying minutes followed by Mitch Moses finally nailing a clutch sideline conversion, shows real growth.

As good as it was for the Eels to get one over their rival, it only brings their current winning streak to 1 in a row, with Round 5 being the last time they were able to win back to back games. The Eels desperately need to find consistency, and winning this one would be huge for them with the bye coming up in Round 13.

In team news for the Raiders, Charne Nicoll-Kolokstad is out for the foreseeable future after hamstring scans came back worse than initially thought. He is replaced at fullback by Xavier Savage, while Jarrod Croker makes his return from injury in the centres, with Ricky Stuart opting to leave incumbent Seb Kris in the 17 on the bench. Jamal Fogarty has been named to make his first appearance in the lime-green, with Brad Schneider making way, while Ryan Sutton is back from injury and will start from the bench, pushing Harry Rushton out of the side.

For the Eels, Waqa Blake returns as a welcome addition to Parra's wing stocks, with Hayze Perham returning to the reserves. Marata Niukore has been named in the back row with Papali'i moving to lock, the bench remaining unchanged from last week.

WHO TO WATCH: It will be good to see Raiders off-season recruit Jamal Fogarty finally run around for his new club for the first time after missing Rounds 1-11 through injury. While it is a shame that CNK got injured and as a result we won't see the Raiders spine at full strength (or as full strength as possible considering Hodgson's injury), Fogarty's inclusion comes at the perfect time; their attack is already running smoothly and he will not need to overplay his hand in any last ditch efforts to create. The fact that the machine isn't broken also takes the pressure off him to come in and be a quick fix. He was signed in order to fill that game-manager sized hold that has been vacant since George Williams' departure, and seeing how he settles into the side will be interesting, especially with Jack Wighton rediscovering his best form in recent weeks.

A lot gets made of the Eels halves and how critical their form is to Parra having success, which is of course fair enough, however it is my opinion that Clint Gutherson is the most important member of this Eels team. To put it simply, whenever the Gutherson plays well, the Eels play well and vice versa. A more detailed and well researched piece could investigating this could probably be written, but it's a theory that stands up anecdotally against the Eels last three games. Against the Panthers, the King played the best game of his career in my eyes, scoring a try and throwing a superb short ball to put Matterson through a hole to give his side the lead. A week later, he played poorly, not recording a single line break, line break assist or try assist against the Roosters as well as making a critical error that allowed Tedesco to score the Roosters second. Last week against Manly he was improved but not at his best, throwing a superb cutout pass to put Hayze Perham over while also missing a cover tackle on Tuipulotu that allowed the opposing winger to score. Gutho's form has been a microcosm of the Eels form, and it's fair to say that the way he performs on Sunday will have a huge bearing on the outcome of the game.

FAVOURITE: The Eels are 5.5 point favourites at the time of writing.

MY TIP: Contextually this is a huge game for both teams. A win for the Raiders would put them in a great position to make a charge to the 8 while also instilling further confidence, while the Eels simply have to start stringing consecutive wins together. Parramatta may have beaten the Storm and Panthers, but have shown that they aren't capable of turning up in consecutive weeks against quality opposition, and until they prove that they are I can't tip them in a game like this. Raiders by 4.
