

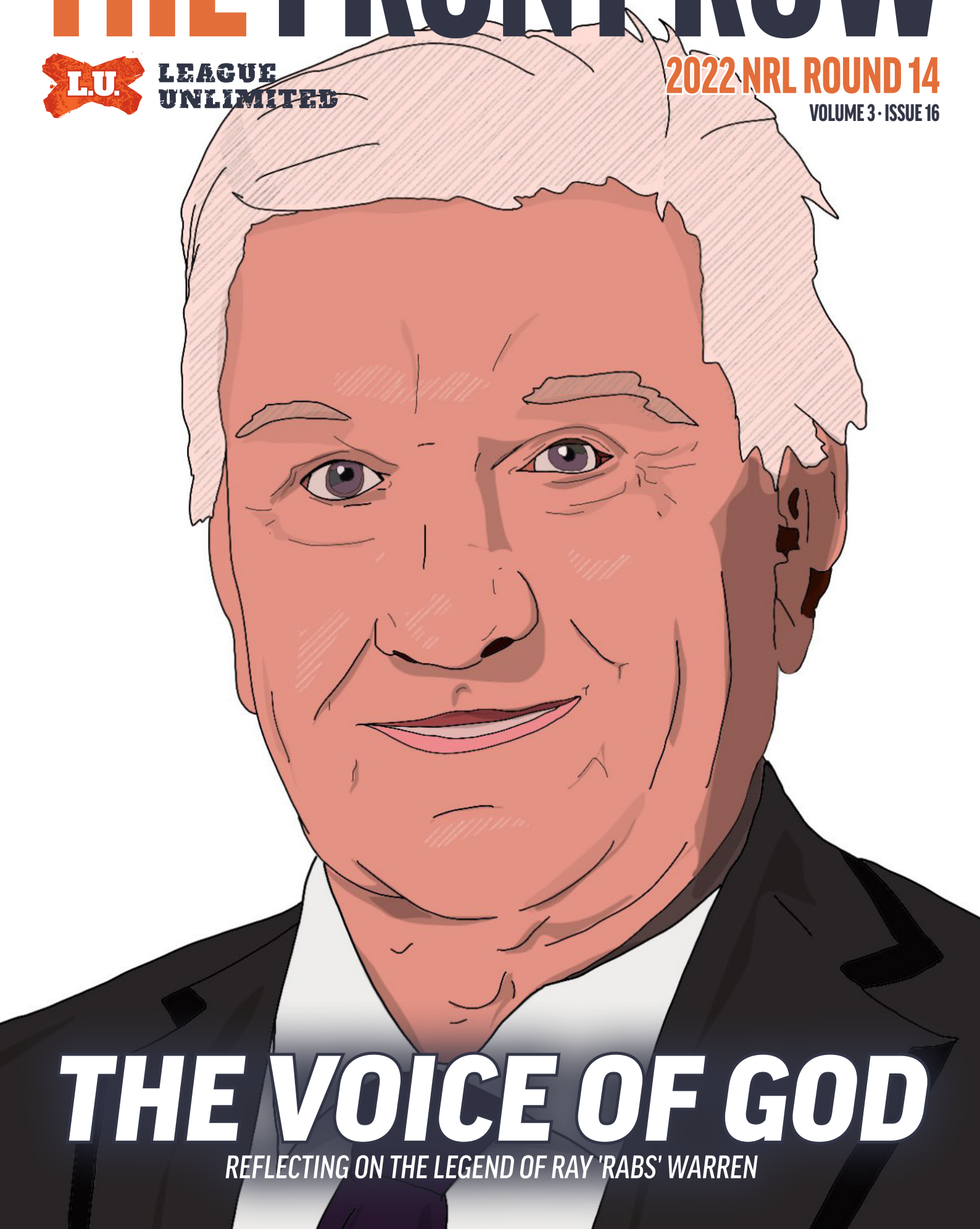

# AROUND THE GAME

## WARRIORS

### BROWN DEPARTS, JONES STEPS IN

TUESDAY 7 JUNE

Vodafone Warriors CEO Cameron George has today announced head coach Nathan Brown's departure and confirmed current assistant coach Stacey Jones will take over the role for the rest of the 2022 NRL season.

The decision leaves Jones in charge for the last 11 rounds of the campaign starting with Sunday's game against Cronulla Sutherland.

"Nathan told us he had made a personal decision that for family reasons he wouldn't be able to relocate to New Zealand as originally planned for the long term," said George.

"We fully appreciate his position and the call he has made.

"Given those circumstances we agreed we needed to make an immediate change.

"It's tough for everyone involved but, in the best interests of the club, we felt we had to go in a different direction now.

"Nathan has worked so hard for our club and we are extremely disappointed it has come to this. We're truly grateful for what he has done and wish him and his family all the very best for the future."

Jones (46) steps into the position after being involved with the club in playing and coaching roles for all but a few years of its existence.

"Stacey's love of the club and knowledge of it is unparalleled. He has been on the inside of it for close to 25 years," said George.

"We'll be giving him, staff and players all the support possible for the rest of the season."

Jones played his entire 261-game NRL career with the Vodafone Warriors from 1995-2005 and then again in 2009 following two years with Les Catalans in the Super League in 2006 and 2007.

After a part-time coaching role with the Vodafone Warriors in 2008 and his comeback year in 2009, he returned as the club's pathways manager in 2013 before coaching the Vodafone Junior Warriors to the 2014 NYC premiership title. In 2015 and 2016 he guided the club's New South Wales Cup side to the finals each season.

He has been in an NRL assistant coach's position since 2017 apart from last year when he returned home to work with the club's Sky Sport Future Warriors programme before heading back to Australia to re-join the NRL squad's coaching staff this season.

George said the club appreciated Jones stepping in to take up the role on an interim basis.

He added he would now work with owner Mark Robinson on an agreed process to appoint a new head coach.

# THE VOICE OF GOD

ROBERT CROSBY REFLECTS ON THE IMPACT OF RAY WARREN AFTER THE VOICE OF RUGBY LEAGUE CALLED TIME ON HIS CAREER AS A COMMENTATOR.

Ray Warren changed rugby league in a way like few others in the game's history.

Think of an iconic moment and, in all likelihood, it is accompanied by a voice so distinct it transcends the sport itself.

*"Marshall skips away."*

*"Was he onside?"*

*"Albert'll score, Albert'll score!  
Newcastle, have won, the grand final!"*

Such is the legacy the man beloved by all as 'Rabs' leaves behind as a caller.

In the days since Warren brought a close to his illustrious career, fans from across the rugby league divide have been united in their outpouring of adoration for the man who defined rugby league on television.

Everyone has a memory of 'Rabbits'; whether it was the sound of his voice, his rapport in the box with Sterlo, Fatty and Gus or capturing a moment in time through the excitement he brought through his commentary.

On a personal level, Ray Warren represented something deeply aspirational to me as a rugby league fan.

Growing up in the regional centre of Dubbo in my youth, I knew I couldn't be like David Peachey or Andrew Ryan, the local legends who went on to star in the NRL.

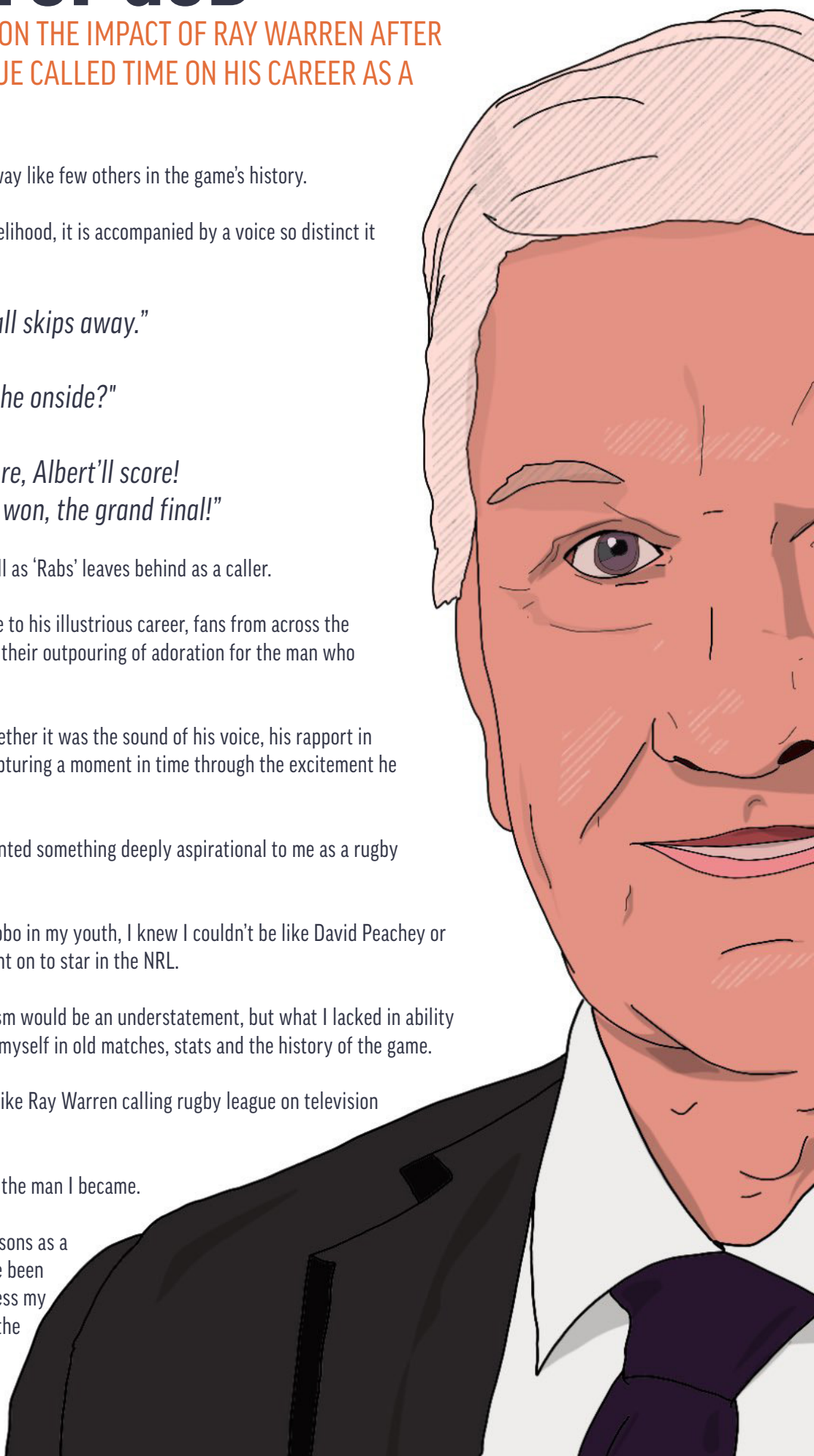
To say I was found wanting for athleticism would be an understatement, but what I lacked in ability on the field I made up for by immersing myself in old matches, stats and the history of the game.

I dreamed of growing up and being just like Ray Warren calling rugby league on television - what could be better than that!

The dream I had as a boy didn't die with the man I became.

Instead, it changed and during eight seasons as a contributor with LeagueUnlimited I have been blessed with an outlet where I can express my passion in a way that isn't burdened by the pressures of a job.

For fans, like me, who fell in love with rugby league during the 2000s and 2010s, there are touchstones that unite us in a shared passion.

Reading Big League, playing the NRL video games, collecting Footy Tazos, awaiting the release of team lists each Tuesday and, above all else, listening to Ray Warren on the Channel 9 coverage all played instrumental parts in our love of the game.

I've lost count of the number of matches I've watched over the years, yet I'll never forget my very first between Newcastle and Manly in 2006.

The Qualifying Final, won by the Knights 25-18, is a match that doesn't get its due as a result of the high watermark set by its 1997 ARL Grand Final predecessor.

As an 11-year-old, the come-from-behind victory is a classic that changed my life forever.

More than 15 years on from that fateful September night, watching at home on television, I can vividly recall the way Ray Warren brought meaning to the action occurring on-screen.

He was able to capture the drama, rivalry and to-and-fro of the contest with an evangelical quality.

*"Johns is wide away to the left."*

*"Here's Johns - no, it's gone back to Mullen."*

*"Mullen takes the shot."*

*"Jarrod Mullen's got the shot. Jarrod Mullen has nailed it. Jarrod Mullen has kicked the drop goal!"*

Rugby league became a religion for me in that moment and Ray Warren was the voice of God.

I will always treasure the joy Ray Warren provided me with as a footy fan.

There will never be another Rabs and we should all be so grateful to have lived in a time where the voice of rugby league brought so much joy to so many people year after year.

## NO ORIGIN PLAYERS, NO WORRIES FOR COWBOYS IN RESOUNDING WIN OVER TITANS

The North Queensland Cowboys have returned to the winners circle in the opening match of round 13, finishing fast to record a 26 point win over the lowly Gold Coast Titans.

The Cowboys came into this clash with significantly more talent on the sidelines due to State of Origin, the northernmost club missing the likes of Val Holmes, Tom Dearden, Jeremiah Nanai and Reuben Cotter.

It looked as if the Titans, who themselves were missing skipper Tino Faasuaaleai, were going to take advantage of the big name outs of their Queensland rival, dominating possession early and taking a 6-0 lead courtesy of Brimson connecting with his halves partner Sexton in the 15th minute.

For the second week in a row however, the Titans couldn't go on with it, the opposition comeback coming a little earlier in this one though. Heilum Luki ran a solid line and reached out to score after Sexton kicked out on the full, and the Cowboys advanced up the field with the aid of a 6 again call in the following set, spreading it left to Murray Taulagi, who used Jayden Campbell as a speed bump on his way to the line.

Disaster struck for the Titans when five minutes later, Jamayne Isaako knocked on while making a regulation carry out of his own end. Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow toed the ball towards the in-goal area and easily won the race. In the space of ten minutes, a 6 point lead for the Titans had become a 10 point deficit.

The first 30-odd minutes of the second half were an arm wrestle, the Titans again having mountains of possession and field position but predictably not being able to do anything with it. The score was still 16-6 with just over ten minutes left in the match when Reece Robson snuck his way past Jamayne Isaako from dummy half to make it a three score game.

It would've taken some resilience for the Titans to mount a comeback from that position, which is something they don't have a lot of on the Gold Coast. As such, the Cowboys scored two late tries, one from a Drinkwater grubber to Tabuai-Fidow and another when Peta Hiku's change of direction caught five Titans off guard, with the centre going over untouched.

The scoreline ended up blowing out to 32-6 to the Cowboys, a fair indication of where the two sides are at this point of the season.

Next week, the Titans host the Rabbitohs on Saturday Afternoon, while the Cowboys are back at home against the Dragons on Friday Night in prime-time. **ADAM HUXTABLE**

## KIKAU LEADS PANTHER CUBS TO WIN OVER BULLDOGS

Penrith has continued their winning streak, defeating a resurgent Bulldogs side by 30-18 at Bluebet Stadium tonight to remain four points clear at the top of the NRL ladder.

Despite missing their Origin contingent, their premiership winning stars in Viliame Kikau and Dylan Edwards led the side to a well-deserved win, with Kikau simply devastating against his future club. Former Panther Matt Burton was also outstanding in a losing side, as he put the cellar dwellers on his back and almost single handedly dragged Canterbury back to the brink of causing a massive boilover. However, with the game in the balance with fifteen minutes remaining, Canterbury simply shot themselves in the foot with a catastrophic error from prop Paul Vaughan inside his own half, followed by some woeful discipline costing Mick Potter's side any chance of an unlikely victory.

The Panthers came into the game missing six Origin stars, while the Bulldogs were desperately looking to snap four match losing streak despite missing two of their own stars in Tevita Pangai Jr and English prop Luke Thompson.

It was rookie Panther Kurt Falls who stepped into the Panthers system seamlessly early, when he placed a perfect kick for former Bulldog Chris Smith, who snatched the ball away from the Bulldogs defence to score the first try of the night. Penrith had the home crowd on their feet minutes later when Kikau put Izack Tago away down the left hand side. Tago then found his fullback Dylan Edwards in support to score his fourth try of the year. Debutant Falls then converted from the sideline to make it 12-0 after just fifteen minutes.

Canterbury needed something special to get them in the game and they got it through Matt Burton, who put up a towering bomb, which was spilt by Dylan Edwards. Off the next set, it was the former Panther with a deft grubber for Josh Addo-Carr to score and the former Blues winger was extremely pleased after a tough week after being dropped from the NSW Origin side. Burton then converted from the sideline to narrow Penrith's lead to 12-6. A confident Dogs outfit then chanced their arm in attack through Addo-Carr and new fullback Jake Averillo, however Penrith got the ball back following a desperate pass from Averillo which put his side under enormous pressure. Off the ensuing play, second string halfback Sean O'Sullivan produced a delightful floating pass over the top for his winger Taylan May. The rookie winger then added to his 2022 highlight reel when he produced a spectacular leap to plant the ball down and extend his sides advantage to 16-6 on the scoreboard. Penrith doubled down in quick succession when they again charged up field which saw Viliame Kikau power through some would be Bulldogs defenders to score and give his side a commanding 22-6 lead at halftime.

The Bulldogs needed to strike first after the break and they did so through Matt Burton who put his side back in the match with a chip over the top for a flying Josh Addo-Carr who raced sixty metres to score his second try of the night. Burton then celebrated his homecoming to Penrith when he silenced the crowd after charging onto a flat ball from Jeremy Marshall-King close to the line to score and narrow the score to 22-18 with twenty minutes left in the game. With the game in the balance and after Canterbury completed at 93%, prop Paul Vaughan then produced an astonishing error trying to offload in his own half. Blues back up hooker Apisai Koroisau made the Dogs pay for the error with a grubber out of dummy half for Jaeman Salmon to score. Canterbury then threw their discipline out the window, when backrower Corey Waddell was penalised for a lazy high tackle and then halfback Kyle Flanagan decided to try and dump Kikau on his back by lifting between the legs. Kurt Falls collected the gift two points on offer and the Panthers iced the game at 30-18. **SAM BOURKE**

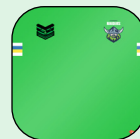

## RAIDERS RULE THE ROOST AT HOME

A stirring performance on home soil has seen the Canberra Raiders claim a deserved 22-16 victory over the Sydney Roosters without their Origin stars.

Leading from start to finish in a contest attended by only the most ardent supporters braving the cold conditions, the win sees Ricky Stuart's men move within striking distance of the top eight with four wins from their past five matches.

Withstanding an early threat from Sitili Tupouniua, who was denied a four-pointer due to an obstruction ruling, the Raiders responded with Zac Woolford sending Adam Elliott (8th minute) through a yawning gap to open the scoring.

Struggling to gain the ascendancy in a half frequently dictated by the referee's whistle, the Roosters made the most of good field position from a penalty to level the scores at 6-all after Tupouniua (24th minute) crashed over following superb footwork by stand-in fullback Joey Manu.

Regaining the lead through Xavier Savage (29th minute), who caught an offload from Ryan Sutton around his ankles, the home side repelled several sets on their line to take a 12-6 lead to the change of ends.

Getting off to the perfect start following the resumption of play, Corey Horsburgh charged down and regathered a kick from Luke Keary before linking with the speedier Sebastian Kris (42nd minute) in support.

Scoring a pivotal try midway through the second half after Tupouniua was denied over the goal line twice, Angus Crichton ran through a hole created by Sam Walker, before delivering a pass to send Paul Momirovski (61st minute) over for his fourth try of the season.

Taking advantage of a one-on-one strip by Siosua Taukeiaho inside the Raiders half, Joseph Suaalii (65th minute) leapt through the air with an effort reminiscent of Israel Folau to narrow the margin to two points following Walker's wayward sideline conversion.

Striking back after Matt Frawley forced a repeat set with a bomb, exciting centre Matt Timoko (70th minute) brushed aside Momirovski to restore a six-point buffer for the home side.

Holding off a late surge from the visitors after Frawley's late attempt at drop goal was wide of the mark, the Raiders held on to claim their first win over the Roosters since the 2020 finals series.

Next week, the Raiders face the Broncos at Suncorp Stadium on Saturday night, while the Roosters take on the Storm at the Sydney Cricket Ground earlier in the same evening. **ROB CROSBY**

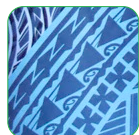

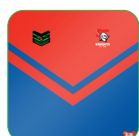

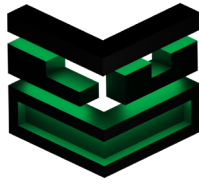

Fire-breathing Dragons looking to shake up the renewed Cowboys

North Queensland kick off Round 14 of the NRL Telstra Premiership with a rare prime-time Friday Night Football clash against a determined St George Illawarra side at QLD Country Bank Stadium.

This game was pencilled in as a potential Tank Bowl at the beginning of the season, but the rise of the Cowboys and emergence of the Dragons as turned this into must-watch footy.

The Cowboys are firmly placed inside the NRL's top four, yes it's a sentence many wouldn't have imagined at the beginning of the season. But, the Cowboys have been rewarded for their scintillating play this season, bar the minor hiccup against Penrith a fortnight ago.

North Queensland didn't have to do much to walk away with a victory on Thursday night against a mediocre Titans side. But it goes to show that the Cowboys didn't fall into the danger game trap that many of the top sides have fallen into this season.

What Todd Payten wouldn't be pleased with, however, was his side's poor completions. It's cost them in games this season, and as we're approaching the heavy workload of the season, it could cost the Cowboys dearly in the crunch.

As far as the team make-up is concerned, expect none of the original stars to back up, the only late inclusion could see Tom Dearden start at 5/8 with Ben Hampton dropping to the reserves.

St George Illawarra has been the definition of hot and cold to start 2022, there have been passages of brilliant footy that saw them knock off the Roosters, but this is rivalled by the poor showings against the Titans and Storm.

It's been a season that's offered more questions than answers on the future direction of the Dragons, and they need to turn the tables if they want to push for a top-eight birth.

The Dragons are coming off the bye week, which came at a bad time in terms of their momentum, coming off a two-game winning streak (albeit against the Warriors and Bulldogs). However, it does look like they've found their long-term fullback option in Cody Ramsey. I would like to be cautious here though, as this Friday will be his first significant test since taking the vacant fullback jumper post-Magic Round.

As far as their line-up is concerned, Jayden Sullivan comes onto the bench with Tyrell Fuimaono dropping out. Origin pair Ben Hunt and Tariq Sims are named to back up but could drop out.

Jaydn Su'a is a slight chance of returning as he's named in the reserves.

**WHO TO WATCH:** Well, if there's been one man that's had a complete contrast of fortunes in the last six months it's Scott Drinkwater. Drinkwater lost out to Tom Dearden in the race to partner Chad Townsend in the halves, he was patient in his time in the QLD Cup, and since taking the fullback jumper for an injured Hammer, he hasn't turned back.

His form has been scintillating scoring five tries, setting a further nine up and making 18 tackle breaks. Expect Drinkwater to be the focal point if the Cows get home.

Fresh off being overlooked by QLD coach Billy Slater, Francis Molo will have a point to prove against his former club. Molo has been in indifferent form to start the season, with glimpses of his best but largely a blip on the radar. Molo's averaging 102 meters a game and is a handful to tackle every time he gets the footy.

Molo will need to reproduce games, such as the ANZAC Day effort if he wants to recapture his QLD jumper, and it starts by taking down the highest-ranked QLD team.

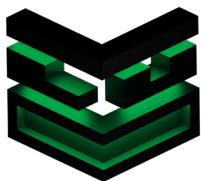
**FAVOURITE:** The Cowboys are the warm favourites to get home in this one. North Queensland hold the narrow head to head record over St George Illawarra since SGI entered the competition in 1999.

Both teams split the season series last year, with North Queensland winning their most recent meeting in Rockhampton.

**MY TIP:** If Todd Payten chooses to rest his origin warriors, then the game evens up into St George's favour, especially through the middle third. St George's pack will have a lot more resistance than the Titans pack did a week ago.

So, it'll come down to the creativity of the backs, and I believe the Cowboys have many underrated players in their backline and it should be enough to get home, on top of the support of a monstrous home crowd. Cowboys by 8.

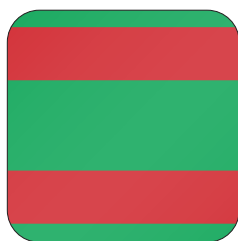

Last-start finalists push for a stronger second half to 2022

The Gold Coast Titans will be out to kick-start their fledgling season when they host the South Sydney Rabbitohs at CBUS Super Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

Coming into the second half of the season in 15th position with a paltry three wins, the Gold Coast Titans will be aiming to put aside a dismal record against their weekend opponents.

Losing 14 out of 20 clashes against the Rabbitohs, including their past six in succession, no current Gold Coast players remain from the last Titans side to defeat the Rabbitohs six years ago in Western Australia.

Slumping to a season low during last Thursday's 32-6 humbling to the undermanned Cowboys at home, coach Justin Holbrook has responded with changes brought on by injury and form.

Handing former Warriors utility Paul Turner a club debut in the halves, AJ Brimson reverts to fullback in place of Jayden Campbell, while Greg Marzhev and Partick Herbert take the places of Corey Thompson and Esan Marsters in the backline.

Refreshed and ready to surge following a weekend off leading into Origin I, the South Sydney Rabbitohs will be hoping to commemorate a major player milestone with a win.

Holding a unique piece of history as one of four brothers to represent the South Sydney Rugby League Football Club, Tom Burgess will make his 200th appearance in first grade; a feat made all the more remarkable given his standing as the last of the brothers to debut for the club.

Boasting an impressive record against all teams at CBUS Super Stadium, the Rabbitohs sole loss at the venue occurred in 2009 at the hands of the Titans.

Naming Damien Cook and Cameron Murray to back up after Wednesday night's Origin opener, highly rated hooker Peter Mamouzelos has been named as the interchange utility, while Tevita Tatola returns in place of Shaq Mitchell.

Keaon Koloamatangi will make his 50th appearance in first grade after debuting with the club in the early rounds of the 2020 season.

**WHO TO WATCH:** Set to make his club debut for the Titans after plying his trade across the backline with Tweed Heads in the Queensland state league, former Warriors playmaker Paul Turner will be out to make the most of his opportunity. Playing three games in the NRL during the previous two seasons, the last of which occurred more than a year ago, the 22-year-old will start at five-eighth for the first time in the top grade. Identified as a player with immense potential during his early career across the Tasman, the Titans will be hoping Turner can be the spark needed to revitalise their season.

Overlooked for a place in Queensland's final line-up despite being a mainstay of the team over the past four series, Jai Arrow will be pressing his case for a representative recall on Saturday afternoon. Establishing his credentials as one of the hardest working players during three seasons on the Gold Coast before venturing to Sydney last year, the 26-year-old forward has spent much of 2022 on an edge after playing the bulk of his career in the middle of the field. Averaging a touch under 120 metres and 33 tackles prior to the bye this season, expect Arrow to be heavily involved as the Rabbitohs strive to continue a dominant run on the Gold Coast.

**FAVOURITE:** Despite managing to string back-to-back results together only once this season, the Rabbitohs have been well supported to build upon their impressive showing before the bye.

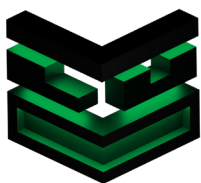

The Sydney Cricket Ground has played host to many epic contests and a potential Saturday evening blockbuster awaits as the Sydney Roosters take on the Melbourne Storm who are looking to close their gap to the Panthers in first spot.

Sitting in seventh spot, the Roosters have had an up and down season with a 7-6 record from their thirteen games which sums up their season of games where they have struggled to find crisp play this season.

The struggles of consistency were on show last weekend for the Roosters when they went down 22-16 against the Canberra Raiders where their key playmakers struggled to find any consistent form against Canberra.

The impact of the loss of James Tedesco was notable for the tricolours as they struggled without their captain and fullback.

Roosters coach Trent Robinson has named his three Origin stars to back up being James Tedesco, Daniel Tupou and Lindsay Collins, although it will only be known on Saturday afternoon if the three back up for the contest.

Two form sides meet when Brisbane host Canberra

The Brisbane Broncos will host the Canberra Raiders this Saturday night at Suncorp Stadium. With both of these teams hitting some serious form recently, both sides will be confident that they can come away with the two points this weekend.

For the Raiders, fortunes have really turned in the past month or so. Having only lost one of their past five games, the Raiders are now only two points outside the top eight despite their poor start to the season.

With young fullback Xavier Savage starting to find his feet in first grade, Canberra fans can be hopeful for what the second half of this season may bring.

With the media still swirling, his performance this Saturday could be important in silencing critics and getting the fans back on board.

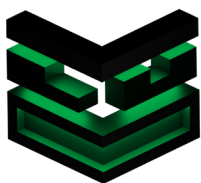

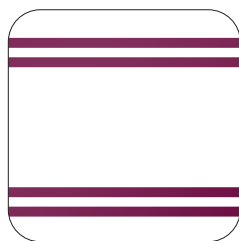

Tigers host Sea Eagles in 'Do it for Madge Round'

If anyone deserves a mid-season hug, surely it's the outgoing Michael Maguire.

Despite the endless speculation, the loyal Tigers coach soldiered on right to the very end. But having fallen two wins shy of last season's tally after 12 games, sadly for the premiership winning coach, that was the end of the road.

Despite sitting 14th with only three wins to their name, the Tigers are a tough read. A horror five game losing streak to start the season was followed by surprise victories over top-four aspirants Parramatta and South Sydney. Since then, an ugly win over the battling Bulldogs is all they have to show from their past five starts.

Now refreshed after last week's bye, once again there's renewed hope. A win over a Manly side still evolving without Tom Trbojevic has the potential to quickly become three. With the Bulldogs and Warriors to follow, the fate of the Tigers' season boils down to the outcome of the next three rounds.

Adam Doueih's expected return from a knee reconstruction has been pushed back, but the inclusions of club favourite David Nofoaluma and hooker Jacob Liddle should spark an outfit desperate to impress new caretaker coach, Brett Kimmorley.

Stefano Utoikamanu's absence upfront for Wests is a big blow, especially given how easily the Sea Eagles pack rolled through the Warriors' weakened middle in last week's 44-12 demolition at 4 Pines Park.

Daly Cherry-Evans has been named to return after Origin with the skipper to partner Kieran Foran in the halves, leaving Josh Schuster to swap the No.6 jumper for a spot on the bench.

Coming off three straight losses, last week's win for Des Hasler was a must and this week at Campbelltown is no different. A victory will take the Sea Eagles to 7-7, and anything less could spell trouble for their finals aspirations, especially with games against the Cowboys and Melbourne to follow.

But having won the past three contests by a combined 68 points, on the surface it's Manly's to lose. But scratch deeper, and just getting the bus to Campbelltown might be a feat in itself. Since 2003, the Sea Eagles and Tigers have only met there twice with victories shared one apiece.

**WHO TO WATCH:** It was great to see Manly speedster Jason Saab finally hit top gear against the Warriors. With only two four-pointers this year, the Dragon discard is strides behind the brash flyer who bagged 26 in 2021. **FAVOURITE:** Barely a month has passed since Manly got the better of Wests at 4 Pines Park in round nine. The Tigers now have the homeground advantage, but not the favouritism, that's still with the maroon and white.

**MY TIP:** Up 18-12 at halftime in their last start against Souths, the Tigers were poised to roll their bitter rival for the second time this season. For Madge, watching his side then concede 32 unanswered points must have been like digging his own grave. Now jobless, if the Tigers have a heart there will be a response. 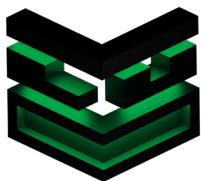

# THE PREVIEW

Mystery over Penrith's Origin stars as Newcastle target season-defining win

If the Knights are going to kickstart a mid-season resurgence and push for a top-eight spot, this is the week to do it coming. Newcastle is coming off an unconvincing win over the lowly Warriors, who themselves have hardly proven to be a genuine finals threat this year.

In the Panthers, understrength or not, the Knights will get a real sense of just how far off they are. The last time these two sides met it was viewed as a true litmus test for Newcastle after a surprisingly strong start to the season. Since that defeat though, the Knights have fallen away and looked closer to the bottom-four team many expected heading into the 2022 season.

Newcastle has named all of its Origin representatives to back up on Sunday, although Tex Hoy is in the extended squad should Kalyn Ponga fail to recover in time.

The Panthers have also named their Origin contingent to suit up on Sunday, although that will not mean much until teams are finalised closer to the date.

Even if Penrith's Blues contingent are a late scratching, Ivan Cleary will be confident of getting the job done after getting past a tricky Bulldogs side 30-18 last week.

The 12-point win flattered the Bulldogs in some ways and undersold just how in-sync the Panthers were despite the changes, with a few late tries overruled by the match officials.

Regardless, Kurt Falls and Sean O'Sullivan transferred their strong combination from NSW Cup straight into first grade and steered the side around perfectly.

They may once again be called on to do the same against Newcastle, with Jarome Luai and Nathan Cleary the most likely to be rested for Sunday's game.

Even if Cleary and Luai were not to play, even having Isaah Yeo back up would be a big boost for the Panthers given his ball-playing through the middle frees up time and space for the Penrith halves.

**WHO TO WATCH:** Penrith may seem like an unstoppable juggernaut at the moment but Parramatta showed that last year's premiers are in fact beatable. You have to grind away for 65-70 minutes before striking late. If the Knights are to do that, prop David Klemmer shapes as a key figure in what could be a season-defining upset on Sunday. Klemmer, like Parramatta's forwards, has the ability to sneak out a late offload that can disrupt Penrith's brick wall defence. The 28-year-old could feel hard done by to miss out on an Origin spot and has been one of Newcastle's best this season on a consistent basis. Look for Klemmer to set the tone early and take it to Penrith's fearsome front rowers James Fisher-Harris and Moses Leota.

For the Panthers, Nathan Cleary was unavailable the last time they faced the Knights. While he still may be a late scratching before Sunday, should he play, put Cleary down for a try. The Panthers halfback has been building towards it for a few weeks now - and I don't just mean a regulation try backing up in support after a linebreak. Coming off shoulder surgery in the off-season, Cleary has slowly been building his confidence to dig into the line again and take on the opposition defence. He did it on numerous occasions against the Cowboys. While it did not lead to points, North Queensland's defence is one of the best in the league. The same can't be said for the Knights. Should Cleary back up, look for him to put his stamp on the game before earning an early rest.

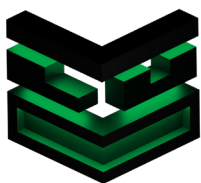
**FAVOURITE:** As currently named, the Panthers are strong favourites.

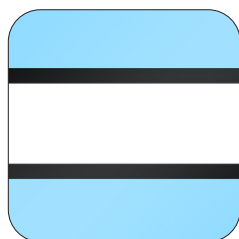

Well rested Sharks look to inflict more pain on woeful Warriors

The Warriors moving on from Nathan Brown was the biggest news in Rugby League for about three hours before Mudge got the sack on Tuesday. If the way the players performed against Manly last week is anything to go by, the mid-season coaching change isn't something they'll be losing any sleepover.

The end of Brown as the Warriors coach was as predictable as it was necessary. He has a dismal 42% winning record when hired for the 2021 season and proceeded to gradually take the Warriors backward from a 10th place finish before he arrived, to 12th last year and 14th at the time of his departure.

Club legend Stacey Jones will take over as interim coach for the rest of the season, and it remains to be seen whether or not he can inspire a Todd Payten 2020 style resurgence of a Warriors side desperate for some direction and identity.

They come up against a Sharks side that will be extremely well rested after having round 13 off with a bye. None of their players are in either Origin top 17, meaning those who suited up in Round 11's loss to the Roosters will have had 15 days of rest by the time kickoff rolls around.

It is a luxury that the Sharks probably don't need against this opposition. The Warriors were absolutely horrid against Manly, allowing them to roll up field with ease on multiple occasions, and in the rare instance they would make a stop defensively they would immediately turn the ball over cheaply.

If the Warriors struggled stopping Harper and Koula last week, what chance exactly will they have against Ramien and Talakai?

Despite their shaky form as of late, the Sharks are still sitting in 6th place on the table and have one of the easier schedules coming up. Their next three games are against the Warriors, Titans and Bulldogs, and winning all 3 would be great not only for their ladder position but for their confidence, considering they haven't won back to back games since round 5.

In the only change for the Sharks, Ramien is back in at centre replacing Tracey.

For the Warriors, they receive a much needed boost to their forward pack with Josh Curran returning from injury, however they are still without Addin Fonua-Blake.

Jones has opted to bring in Dunamis Lui to make his club debut from the bench, with Aaron Pene making way for the ex-Raider.

**WHO TO WATCH:** After a slow-ish start, high profile recruit Cam McInnes has been starting to get back into the form that saw him establish himself as one of the games premier players at the Dragons.

After coming off the bench in his first 4 games for the Sharks, McInnes has started at lock for the Sharks every game since round 7, and his performances have meant that Craig Fitzgibbon will have a good kind of selection headache on his hands when Dale Finucane returns from injury later this year.

Two weeks ago against the Roosters he ran 13 times for 128 metres, made 2 line breaks, a tackle break and an offload, all while making 34 tackles for only 1 miss. He also scored a try that put the Sharks in a position to make an improbable comeback, which didn't end up happening.

I'm going to go a little bit left field for the Warriors and say that the interim coach Stacey Jones is the one to watch this week. No I don't mean stare at him in the coaches box all game, rather watch the whole Warriors team to see how much effort they're willing to put in, particularly in defence.

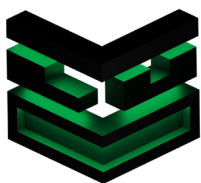
Last week against Manly, they conceded at least three tries simply by not being bothered to commit to making the tackle. The first try, where they let big man Siple go over basically untouched from dummy half, and the second one where Olakau'atu was allowed to fall over the line on a crash play with zero momentum were hallmarks of a side that weren't willing to put in for their coach.

Morgan Harper running right past three Warriors defenders to put Garrick over under the posts was the icing on the cake. Success for Jones in his first game as a head coach won't come from his team winning the match, although that would be a bonus, it would come from his team putting in 100% effort to give them some sort of a building block for the rest of this season and into the next.

**FAVOURITE:** The Sharks are 14.5 point favourites on the road this week.

# THE PREVIEW

Taking "classic" out of the classics.

The form line of the Bulldogs has denigrated to such a point in recent years that even these classic, storied rivalries just don't have the shine they once do. A regular refrain in commentary, even just a decade ago, is that something always happens with Canterbury face Parramatta.

Indeed there are countless memories of these teams facing off in vitally important matches, many unforgettable moments, and 150 games of history to back it all up.

Sadly for the team in blue-and-white though - and paying fans - this match-up on Monday has all the hallmarks of a lopsided rout.

The news isn't all horrible. Sacking Trent Barrett and bringing in Mick Potter as interim coach has yielded results in attack - up Round 10 the 'Dogs maximum points scored in a match was 16 - the three games since has seen them score 22, 24 and 18 despite losing each match.

Clearly their defence is an area that needs significant work. Given the same teamlist that took to the field last weekend in their loss to an under-strength Penrith is named this week, it's hard to see where the improvement comes from.

Making matters worse? Sivo's back. The prolific Eels winger returns after a long injury layoff and successful stint gaining match fitness in NSW Cup where he scored 6 tries in three games. His return for the Eels pushes Tom Opacic out of the 17, Waqa Blake shifting to centre.

One thing about the Eels - it is hard to get a good gauge on them at the moment. At their best, they can beat anyone. Having taken down heavyweights Penrith and Melbourne, you'd think they'd be ladder leaders - but losses to the Tigers, Cowboys and Roosters have fans and pundits perplexed and unsure what the blue-and-gold will serve up on a weekly basis.

The good news is they come in fresh and rested off a bye, following back to back wins over Manly and Canberra, and have a relatively settled lineup. Only injury to Origin stars Campbell-Gillard, Paulo and Matterson would create problems - depleting their intimidating pack massively.

**WHO TO WATCH:** The halves-wing combinations are going to provide plenty of entertainment on Monday afternoon. Canterbury pair Matt Burton and Josh Addo-Carr gave Penrith plenty of headaches last Friday and their connection will no doubt be something Brad Arthur's men will study ahead of the clash. Burton's kicking game, Addo-Carr's speed... could it be the Bulldogs' ticket out of the wooden spoon position?

The real question for the Eels will be how many tries Sivo can bag on his return to the big league. The kicking games of Mitch Moses and Dylan Brown will no doubt be key in helping him cross the line too. Worrying for Eels fans and the coaching staff though will be Sivo's defensive efforts, which have been a bit below the mark in recent years. If Canterbury's attack is creative enough to exploit that, it could be 'game on'.

**FAVOURITE:** Parramatta. Only the brave (or stupid) will be putting their hard-earned on the Bulldogs.

**MY TIP:** It's no surprise that everyone in every tipping competition nationwide is tipping the Eels. I shan't be going against that either. Eels by 16.
