The competition's expansion from 6 to 10 clubs super-charges the ARLC's initial plans which intended to have 8 teams in 2023 before further expansion to 10 a year later. A reminder for fans that the NRL takes a break after this week's fifteenth round, with the rep round to follow which features Women's and Men's Origin, test matches and more.

The Cowboys had their home fans on the feet early on racing to an early lead, before they again backed their tough as nails defence in a clinical display from Todd Payten's men. The win was however soured with a potential ACL injury to gun backrower Heilum Luki who will go for scans to determine the extent of his injury.

St George were poor, with a game plan that seemed to revolve around passing the ball to their star halfback Ben Hunt and expect the Origin representative to produce some magic, and while Hunt was their best he had limited support from his Red V teammates.

The Cowboys came into the match as favourites and were looking for a big performance at home for Queensland centre Valentine Holmes in NRL game 150. Surviving a late scare with Tupouniua unable to hold onto an audacious attacking kick from Walker over the try line, Kaufusi (73rd minute) showed his experience as a big game player to charge through the Roosters defence to seal the 26-18 result.

15 minutes later, the Panthers would go in again after Stephen Crichton put a dirty right foot step on Tuala, easily beating his opposing man before running right past Kurt Mann in the last line of defence. The next time the Knights had the ball, they dropped it, and To'o got his second try during the ensuing set.

The Knights went over two minutes later but it was reviewed and eventually overruled due to an obstruction, with the Panthers getting a penalty. Kikau opted to put in a kick towards the end of the set, which was scooped up by the Knights, and eventually Gagai was tackled up near halfway. The home side then spread it left to an unmarked Edrick Lee, who sprinted away to score a consolation try, which was the last time the scoreboard attendants were troubled in this one.



Hynes finally knocked a goal over and the Sharks led for the first time tonight. After a mini resistance from the Warriors' defence, they quickly were back waving the white flags when Matt Moylan bounced over some sloppy defence to cross and extend the margin to eight points. Another sloppy penalty conceded in the Warriors' own end, led to another try just before the break when Katoa crossed for his second and the Sharks led by 12 at half-time.

It was the Warriors who again started the half the strongest, Dallin Watene-Zelezniak crossed in spectacular fashion and there was hope for the Warriors only down by 8 points. But, old habits die hard and a controversial second try to Mulitalo after an extensive bunker check seemed to take it out of the Warriors. The wheels quickly came off the Warriors' express when Walsh juggled the ball for a good five seconds before spilling it and allowing Will Kennedy to sneak over and dive on the ball setting up a convincing 18-point lead. Another spilt pass from Walsh saw Katoa sprint 50 meters to cross for his hattrick.

The news doesn't get better for the Warriors with Ben Murdoch-Mesilla and Euan Aitken failing to finish the game with BMM leaving by ambulance with a dislocated elbow. To compound the news, their last game at their Redcliffe base is against a rampaging Penrith side before they can FINALLY return home across the ditch. 

Shape of Top 8 set to take place

The St George Illawarra Dragons will host the South Sydney Rabbitohs on Thursday night at WIN Stadium, Wollongong, hoping to bounce back from a dismal performance against the Cowboys and end Souths' two game winning streak.

It was a performance last week that Dragons fans disappointingly found all-too familiar, with a lacklustre attacking display compounded by a multitude of missed tackles resulting in a 31-12 defeat in the far North of Queensland.

Perhaps most disheartening, had the red and whites managed to claw their way to victory, they'd currently be sitting in the top 8. It is not the first time this season Red V fans have had to sit and mull over what could have been, with numerous losses this season seeing their side languish on the outskirts of the 8. The side seemed despondent and lacked any real go forward.

Anthony Griffin will be hoping to see greater desperation from his side this week as they go into a winnable game at home against a team also fighting to stay in the fight for the top 8.

With probably two of eight finals places still up for grabs at this stage of the season, the South Sydney Rabbitohs have done themselves no harm over the last three weeks in their quest to be centre stage come September.

They convincingly dismantled the Wests Tigers, collected two competition points from the bye, and backed up against the Gold Coast Titans last week with a 30-16 win.

Realistically, those are two games they would have been expected to win easily, even with the myrtle and cardinal's season being so up and down. They have an opportunity on Thursday night to really start to pull away from one of the team's vying for a top eight spot along with them.

This game could ultimately seal the fate of one of these team's seasons in the long run, meaning this clash should be full of passion and intensity.

In team news, Dragons coach Anthony Griffin named multiple changes to his 17 on Tuesday afternoon. The very talented Mat Feagai returns from illness, along with Mikaele Ravalawa on the other wing who is returning from a hamstring issue. Jack de Belin has moved to the front row, with Francis Molo vacating the spot and shifting to the bench. Jaydn Su'a starts again at second row for the first time since ANZAC Day, after returning from injury last week via the bench. Josh McGuire is out with a groin concern. Veteran Andrew McCollough will play game number 300 and start at hooker, with Moses Mbye dropping back to the bench utility role. Tariq Sims is back this week after being rested due to State of Origin duties last week and will play at lock.

There is only one changes for Souths coming into this game and it comes through the interchange. Peter Mamouzelos switches places with Blake Taaffe, with Taaffe coming into the bench utility role and Mamouzelos becoming 18th man.

WHO TO WATCH: After a week filled with criticism for his performances so far this season, Zac Lomax absolutely has to rebound. The young centre leads the competition in errors with 26, all of which have been handling errors. Most notably last week, Lomax another unnecessary flick pass, this time on his own 10 metre line, only to go to ground and be swooped on by Murray Taulagi to score. Look for Lomax to sure up his passing this week and get through plenty of work coming out of the back field in an attempt to make up for some of his performances this year.

Kodi Nikorima has an important role to play this week at fullback for the Rabbitohs. Ben Hunt is the equal leader in the competition for 40/20's so far this season, and for someone who is not a regular fullback, it may be difficult for Nikorima to set himself in the right position at the back every time. If Nikorima can nullify the impact of Hunt's long kicking game, a major cog in the Dragons' chances of winning will have been removed.

FAVOURITE: Souths are favourites to win this one away from home.

MY TIP: This is a tough one to pick. Both sides have so much to play for coming into the game and have the chance to take two points off another side competing for a position in the top 8. Even more, both of these sides have shown that killer touch to beat teams they could very well have beaten this season. Neither of the sides have been overly impressive throughout the 2022 campaign so far and it's difficult to split them.

The Dragons have been bolstered by the return of some of their players this week, whilst Souths could be starting to build on their recent run of wins. I'm going to say the Dragons pull a rabbit out of the hat so to speak, only because they absolutely have to bounce back from last week and they're playing at home, whilst South Sydney's form might be deceiving as they've only taken down the Tigers and Titans. Friday night Rugby League heads to the Northern Beaches of Sydney as the Manly-Warringah Sea Eagles look to bring themselves back into the NRL top 8 in their clash against the North Queensland Cowboys who want to keep themselves within reach of the top two.

The Sea Eagles have had arguably the most up and down season of any team in the competition so far with 7 wins and 7 losses from their 14 games so far in 2022 to go with a for & against of just minus 2.

The Maroon and whites come into the contest off two big victories including last week's 30-4 victory over the Wests Tigers.

The Sea Eagles - minus their captain Daly Cherry-Evans - found themselves in a battle during the first half last week at Campbelltown when they could only manage a 6-4 lead at the break. Second half favoured Manly has they dominated to run out big winners scoring 24 unanswered points.

With Papenhuyzen potentially returning and the Broncos missing several big names through injury, it'll be an almighty mountain to climb if Brisbane want to solidify their top 4 position. Desperate Titans meet Cronulla in Coffs Harbour

Saturday afternoon of Round 15 sees the Cronulla Sharks take their home game to Coffs Harbour, where they will meet the struggling Gold Coast Titans. The C.ex Coffs International Stadium will host only its second NRL regular season game ever.

The Cronulla Sharks find themselves on the edge of the top 4 after a dominant come-from-behind win against a fast starting Warriors outfit last weekend. Down 12-0 early on, the Sharks bit back in impressive fashion, up by 12 at the break, and never looked back. The final 38 points to 16 scoreline is surely a confidence booster for Craig Fitzgibbon's side.

It was the two wingers for Cronulla who shone last time out, with Mulitalo and Katoa both named on the wing again for this Saturday's clash. The two scored five tries between them against the Warriors, and Ronaldo Mulitalo has scored ten tries in his past ten games, with Sione Katoa also with ten tries to his name so far this season.

Something that is certainly helping the Sharks strong season so far is their relative lack of injury concerns. With just Braden Hamlin-Uele out for a long period of time with a significant injury, their troops have had time to gel with not much changes in the team throughout the season except for a brief stint where fullback Will Kennedy was suspended.

Dale Finucane is one of the only other players out for Cronulla at the moment, but he could be a late inclusion after being named on the reserves on Tuesday afternoon.

At the start of the season, Titans fans had reasons to be hopeful. With a finals appearance in 2021, things were starting to look up for the club. But the NRL is brutal, and 14 rounds into the 2022 season, the Titans find themselves in last place on the ladder. Last week showcased some positive signs, but still ended in a 14 point loss to last year's grand finalists, the Rabbitohs.

AJ Brimson returns from Covid at fullback, pushing Jamayne Isaako back to the wing and Esan Marsters out of the 17. Captain Tino Fa'asuamaleaui returns to the starting number 13 role following origin duties, with Mo Fotuaika shifting to the bench.

With these two teams clashing only one month ago, the Gold Coast Titans are up against it to change the result the second time around. A late surge from the Titans back in Round 11 showed the Sharks that they are definitely a threat, but Cronulla was able to hold on for a seven point win, and should be able to get the job done again this Saturday.

The Cronulla Sharks have beaten the Gold Coast Titans in the last seven meetings between the two teams.

WHO TO WATCH: After sitting out the 2021 season with injury, Cameron McInnes made his club debut for the Sharks in Round 2 of their 2022 campaign. The lock is known for his hard-work in defence, and has been a crucial addition to Cronulla's forward pack this season. Coming off the bench in the opening rounds, he has started at lock in every round since Round 7, and his performance is critical to the Shark's chances this weekend.

Young Titans five-eighth Paul Turner will play just his 5th NRL game this weekend. Making his debut in 2020 with the Warriors, and joining the Gold Coast outfit at the end of 2021, the 22 year old has a lot of responsibility on his shoulders. While another young Titans half in Toby Sexton will run the show, Turner will most likely play 80 minutes in an important ball playing role for his side. If he doesn't show up, the Titans could be caught somewhat lacking in attacking plays.

FAVOURITE: Cronulla are the strong favourites to beat the Gold Coast this Saturday afternoon.

MY TIP: While Cronulla have been inconsistent at times, it's hard to see the Titans putting up much of a fight. Cronulla by 14.

New Zealand bid farewell against Australia's finest

The New Zealand Warriors will play their 59th - and final - match on Australian soil against the high flying Penrith Panthers on Saturday evening at Moreton Daily Stadium.

Spending the past two-and-a-half years away from home in order to keep the premiership alive due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the New Zealand Warriors will be aiming to break a run of six straight losses with a win over the reigning premiers.

Getting off to a good start before reverting to bad habits in last Sunday's 38-16 defeat to Cronulla, interim coach Stacey Jones has responded on the selection front by handing former Roosters junior Ronald Volkman his first-grade debut at five-eighth.

Among the other changes announced on Tuesday afternoon, Chanel Harris-Tavita shifts to the bench, Jesse Arthars replaces Rocco Berry in the centres, and Bunty Afoa comes into the front-row with Aaron Pene joining the bench.

Winning four of their six appearances at Redcliffe over the past 12 months, hooker Wayde Egan will play his 50th game for the Warriors against the club he debuted with four years ago.

Riding high with a four-point buffer atop the premiership ladder, the Penrith Panthers will be aiming to extend a run of dominance over their opponents in recent seasons.

Claiming victories over the Warriors in their past four meetings, coach Ivan Cleary has enjoyed similar success with an 80 per cent strike rate over his former club since returning to the foot of the mountains four years ago.

Barely breaking a sweat while posting their largest score of the season during last Sunday's 42-6 victory over the Knights, co-captain Isaah Yeo has been named to return after sitting out last week due to a head knock sustained in the opening tackle of Origin I.

WHO TO WATCH: Finishing 2021 among the most exciting young players in the league, Warriors fullback Reece Walsh has struggled to recapture his attacking best in season number two. Taking until last Sunday to register his first try of the year, the 19-year-old Queenslander has recorded seven try-assists, 56 tackle-breaks and an average of 141 running metres in 13 appearances this season. Possessing the X-factor needed to break the game open on his own, Walsh will need to rise to the challenge if the Warriors hope to end their time across the Tasman with an upset.

Emerging as a diamond in the rough for the Panthers this season, Jaeman Salmon has produced his most consistent form in the top grade by transitioning into an impact edge forward. Coming through the lower grades at Cronulla before debuting with Parramatta in the halves, the 23-year-old has played exclusively off the bench, averaging a touch under 28 minutes, in every match over the opening 14 rounds. Providing the reigning premiers with the versatility to cover a variety of positions across the park, Salmon will be determined to build upon his reinvention by securing an extended deal at the foot of the mountains.

FAVOURITE: In a match up pitting the best attack against the worst defence, the Panthers will head into Saturday's clash as one of the shortest priced favourites of the season.

Underwhelming sides look to right the ship in intriguing clash at CommBank

Vou truly never know what you're going to get as a Parramatta fan. You could tell 10 thousand of the Blue and Gold army that they were going to win this game by 50 or lose it by 50 and both would be as believable as each other. The Eels shock 30-point loss to the last-placed Bulldogs last week was certainly their worst defeat in years. It means that the Eels have now beaten the clear top two teams in the Panthers and Storm, while also losing to two of the bottom teams in the Tigers and Bulldogs. So much for the flat-track bully label. Parramatta would probably kill to be able to show the same intensity on a flat track they do on an uphill track this season. It remains to be seen whether the Eels can back this most recent loss up the way they backed up the Tigers one (a whopping 37-point victory over Newcastle). Obviously, they're facing a higher quality opponent in the Roosters, but they also at least showed some fight against the Tigers, only losing by a field goal in the dying stages. The Bulldogs haven't dominated a mid-table team like they dominated the Eels in years. Parra were never in the contest, and it was clear they didn't turn up to play from very early on. Each spine player had their worst game of the season by some distance, and sometimes a loss like that one can do irreversible damage to a team's confidence. A win over the Roosters on Saturday would certainly ease some of the concerns which undoubtedly have crept inside the Eels building since the Queen's Birthday disaster.

Having been touted pre-season as one of the favourites for the premiership, the season so far for the tri-colours has been disappointing to say the least. Past the halfway point of the year, the Roosters are in 8th position and sit level on competition points with the Dragons. Some of their losses have come against the aforementioned Dragons and Bulldogs as well as the Knights, games had they won they would most likely be sitting in the top 4 right now. But it's easy to play hypotheticals, and the fact is that the Roosters didn't deserve to win any of those games. The last two weeks have been extremely disappointing, losing winnable games against a Raiders side missing Wighton and Papalii and a Storm side fielding a bits and pieces backline. When you consider that their next to opponents will be the Eels and the Panthers, both most likely at or near full strength, it becomes a very possible scenario that the Roosters will be heading into their Round 18 bye sitting outside of the top 8. It's not like the Roosters have a cupcake schedule for the run home either, in the final 8 rounds they play Manly and Melbourne away while hosting the Broncos, Cowboys and Rabbitohs. They also have return matches against lower teams that've proven they can rise to the challenge in the Knights and Dragons. The bottom line is that the Roosters simply don't have the luxury of waiting around for combinations to click and players to improve, they have to win and win now if they're serious about not just making some noise in the finals, but making the finals at all.

It's certainly not an exaggeration to say that this matchup shapes up as one that could put the winner's season back on track while also derailing the losers.

In team news, Brad Arthur has made no changes whatsoever to the 17 that got embarrassed on national television last week, perhaps attempting to send the message that "you got us into this, you can get us out of it." For the Roosters, Paul Momirovski has finally been dropped after weeks of terrible defensive performance, with Billy Smith being called in as the replacement at left centre. Sam Verrills makes his return to first grade at hooker, pushing Drew Hutchison to the bench and Terrell May out of the team. Egan Butcher has come onto the bench, replacing Daniel Suluka-Fifita, who signed with Souths during the week.

WHO TO WATCH: There are many who believe that had Reed Mahoney not been injured for the Eels semi-final against the Panthers last year that the Eels would've beaten the eventual premiers and perhaps advanced to the grand final. If the Bulldogs-bound rake performed in that game like he has for the majority of 2022, it's fair to say that the Eels probably would've lost by more than the 2 points the Panthers put between them. He, like basically everyone else on his team, had his worst performance of the season last week, but unlike everyone else on the team, there were signs it was coming for Mahoney. Last week he led his team with 5 ineffective tackles, while also missing two, and there were various occasions when the Eels were on the attack that he killed their momentum with poor options out of dummy half, opting for a crash ball on the last when his halves were calling for the ball out the back multiple times. At his best, Mahoney is a top 5 hooker in the competition, but right now it looks like while he may still be at Parramatta, his mind is at the Bulldogs, where he'll be moving next year and beyond.

With Trent Robinson proving he is capable of dropping underperforming players by doing just that to Paul Momirovski, Sitili Tupouniua should be spending every spare moment working on his defence and ball handling skills if he doesn't want the same fate to befall him. After coming onto the scene three years ago as a talented ball handling back rower, Tupouniua hasn't improved much at all, and about the only thing you can count on him for these days is to miss some crucial tackles and drop the ball at a pivotal moment. Last week was a prime example of a performance Roosters fans have come to know all too well, with Sitili missing 5 tackles and having another 3 ineffective ones for a grim tackle efficiency of 81.4%. This wasn't the worst part about his game however; with under 10 minutes to go and the Roosters down by two, Sam Walker put in an excellent kick that could not have gone into Tupouniua's hands more perfectly. All he had to do was catch the ball and fall to the ground and the Roosters have the lead and most likely achieve a season defining win. Instead, he dropped it cold, and on the ensuing 7 tackle set the Storm went up the field and scored the match sealing try. If it was a one off, it could be forgiven, but Tupouniua has proven over his career that his handling and defence is well below average. Egan Butcher, a highly touted second rower, has been named on the bench this week, and that could be bad news for Tupouniua's job security.

FAVOURITE: At the time of writing, the Eels are slender 1.5-point favourites over the Roosters in this one.

MY TIP: Both sides have been underperforming, but the Roosters were a key moment away from beating the Storm last week, while it felt like the Eels needed 50 more key moments to go their way to just get within 10 points of the last placed team. Roosters by 10.

Knights chase ambush in nation's capital

A road trip to Canberra couldn't come at a better time for the despondent Adam O'Brien. Feeling the burn immediately after his side's capitulation to Penrith, the befuddled Knights coach reasoned that the solution "is not a quick fix".

And after five straight defeats on home turf, the Arctic-like conditions in the nation's capital could prove just the tonic to fire-up the 12th placed Knights. They might be stuck on four wins, but with three of those away, the Novacastrians aren't without hope.

With victories over both the Bulldogs and Warriors from their past two away trips, how Kalyn Ponga responds to concussion protocols following last week's head knock will be crucial. Up front, Kurt Mann and Mitch Barnett have been named in the pack with Lachlan Fitzgibbon squeezed from the top-17.

Jordan Rapana rejoins the Raiders line up in the only change to the side that fell agonisingly short of the Broncos at Suncorp Stadium. Having resurrected their season with four wins from their past six starts, the Raiders now find themselves in 11th spot and just one win outside the top-eight.

But for Ricky Stuart, it's the devil in the detail that threatens to derail the Green Machine's season.

With three players rubbed out by injury during last week's clash, the Broncos were ripe for the picking. But just as poor decisions cost them against the Eels, once again, Stuart was left to wonder what may have been.

A loss here could rattle the finals aspirations of both teams. But with the Dragons and a bye to follow, a fifth win on home turf could kick-start the Raiders run home.

But don't be surprised if the Knights have the last say. Newcastle have collected the spoils in the past three encounters, including last year's clash at Suncorp. Back then, just like this year, both sides were chasing eighth spot with Canberra the favourite and two points clear of Newcastle.

It counted for little, as the Knights bounded out of the gates on the way to an upset 34-24 victory.

WHO TO WATCH: Joseph Tapine has always had the skills but the question marks have often centered on the powerhouse prop's desire. Whatever Stuart is doing behind the scenes has clearly shaken the big unit's tree. Now almost 100m clear of second spot for post contact metres, nobody bends the line better than Tapine. Throw in his 160m per match, 40m above last year's mark, and he's clearly in career best form.

It's almost hard to reconcile that it was in 2013 when a young tearaway named Anthony Milford ignited the NRL in a two year stay with the Raiders that yielded 21 tries. Now three games into his Newcastle stint, at 27, the former fullback is just four games short of the 200-club. With only one try assist to his name so far, the Knights will be banking on his cagey skills to unlock the defence of his former club.

FAVOURITE: The bookies treat form like gold, and in this match-up Canberra has a full vault.

MY TIP: It would be a tough call to say Adam O'Brien looks clueless, but he certainly doesn't ooze confidence. Newcastle won't be the last side to get toweled by the premiers, but with the coach's eyes on free-spins perhaps he has squeezed the Knights lemon for all its worth.

That doubt, alongside a committed Raiders points towards one result. Raiders by 16.

It was quite a contrast in weekends for the Wests Tigers and the Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs who face-off this Sunday afternoon at CommBank Stadium . The Tigers were humiliated in the second half on Sunday as they lost to the Manly-Warringah Sea Eagles by 26-points, suffering their 10th loss of the season. In Brett Kimmorley's first game as interim coach, after the sacking of Michael Maguire mid-week, the Tigers collapsed after trailing by just two points at the half-time break

This culminated in Brent Naden's send-off in the 64th minute after he dangerously spear tackled Jake Trbojevic, causing the Manly forward to land unsafely on his head and neck. That erased all hope of a Tigers comeback as the Sea Eagles added two tries in the final 10 minutes against a 12-men Tigers outfit. It was an ugly performance from the joint venture, who missed an astonishing 50 tackles. Add that to the nine errors and nine penalties the team gave away, and you're left with a recipe on how to not win a game of rugby league. They struggled to create chances with just two line breaks and 23 tackle breaks, an aspect of the game in which they've struggled with this season. Comparatively, the Sea Eagles finished with nine line breaks and 50 tackle breaks. Once again, the Tigers forwards struggled, with only Joe Ofahengaue (141) and Alex Twal (161) surpassing the triple figure mark. Most of the dirty work was left up to the club's outside backs who did their best at attempting to gain yardage. They can't allow that to happen again this weekend, otherwise they'll be staring down the barrel of their 11th loss of the season, and possibly a spot in the dreaded 16th position. To avoid this, the Tigers need to be more disciplined, just like all three of their wins this season as they don't have to personnel to single-handedly break the game open as the better teams in the competition do. The return of Adam Doueihi, albeit on the bench, will provide the Tigers with an extra spark once he enters the game and similarly so for Fa'amanu Brown, who did the job against the Bulldogs earlier in the season. Brown will again, fulfil the role of the '14' at the expense of Jock Madden, whilst Asu Kepaoa starts in the centres for the suspended Naden. Kelma Tuilagi starts in the back-row as Luciano Leilua played his 56th and final game for the Tigers on the weekend after being granted an immediate release to sign with the North Queensland Cowboys.

The Bulldogs will be looking for revenge after their 14-point loss to the Tigers in Round 11 and they could not be in better form to do so. After shocking the Rugby League world with a 34-4 point victory over the Parramatta Eels on Monday, the Bulldogs and former Tigers' coach Mick Potter, will be bouncing at the prospect of handing a defeat to the joint venture. A win could potentially propel the Bulldogs into 13th position after spending most of season languishing in last place. It was an impressive performance by the Bulldogs on Monday, as they handed the Eels their fifth defeat of the season on the back of a timely hattrick from Josh Addo-Carr, who has put his best foot forward since his omission from the New South Wales side for Game I. It was Addo-Carr's sixth hattrick of his NRL career and one of the most meaningful to date as it contributed just his third win in Canterbury colours. It highlighted an impressive performance by the Bulldogs back five, who all surpassed 120 run metres and scored all six of their four-pointers. Five-Eighth, Matt Burton was at his best with three try assists which included a spectacular chip kick, resulting in Addo-Carr's first try of the night.

It was a rejoice for the fans of the club, as they sat back and enjoyed their first victory by more than four-points for the season. A rare treat for fans of the Bulldogs - and Tigers fans for that matter - who will be hoping to witness a repeat this weekend. There's only one change to the team that has the opportunity to win club's back-to-back games for the first time since the 2019 season. Chris Patolo will miss this clash after suffering a head knock on Monday, his replacement, Kurtis Morrin is set to make his NRL debut.

WHO TO WATCH: An interesting matchup to watch this Sunday is the battle of the two fullbacks. Jake Averillo and Daine Laurie are both still young in experience and have shown glimpses this season of what they could become. Firstly, 21-year-old Jake Averillo has only had the two games at fullback this season, after starting the year in the halves before ending up in the centres. Since his move to the back in Round 13, Averillo has shown that spark that excited Bulldogs fans so very much over the past few seasons. On Monday, the fullback scored his second double of the season and ran for a season high 130 metres, a week after breaking six tackles against the defending premiers, the Penrith Panthers. We haven't seen too much of Averillo at fullback, with his last two games representing his only two appearances at fullback, but from the small sample size we've got, he could be one to open up the game on Sunday. His opposite number, 22-year-old Daine Laurie, has been one of the better players for the Tigers this season. In just his second full season of NRL, Laurie has taken his playmaking up a notch, registering seven try assists in his seven outings this season. Laurie has only made the three line breaks for the season, but that may be a result of the Tigers inability to create those types of opportunities for the former Panther. As a result, his average running metres are down from last season (101.9 down from 134.3 last year), however, he did miss the previous outing between these two sides, which surely would've seen Laurie with greater opportunities as his side didn't struggle to score points that day. It'll be interesting to see how these two players impact Sunday's game, if done so correctly, they could break open the game for their respective teams.

FAVOURITE: After Monday's victory, the Bulldogs enter this game as favourites, which seems almost inconceivable, but the Tigers haven't helped themselves with their embarrassing second half on Sunday. Historically, they've got the wood over the Tigers, winning 24 of the 41 contests between the two, but have only won one of the five matches played since the start of 2020.

MY TIP: This could sneakily be a close contest, the Bulldogs enter with great form, but the Tigers did defeat them earlier in the season. It's going to be a tight one. Bulldogs by 2.
