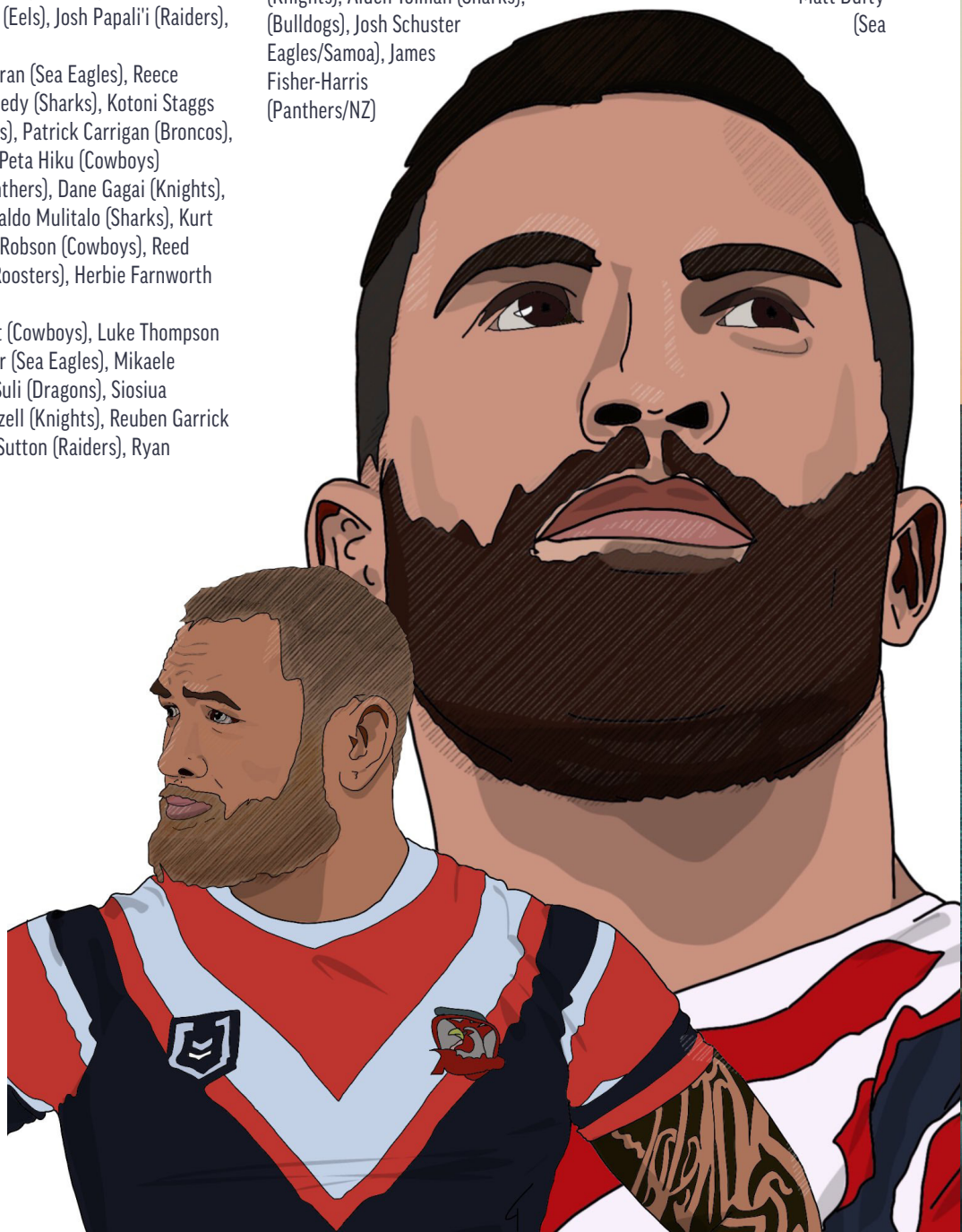

THE BIG PICTURE

IT'S AN UPHILL BATTLE FOR THE TRICOLOURS AS THE SECOND HALF OF THE SEASON LOOMS LARGE. CAN THE ROOSTERS RETURN TO THE TOP EIGHT?

WELCOME HOME.

AFTER 1038 DAYS, THE WARRIORS RETURN TO A FULL MOUNT SMART STADIUM FOR A MEMORABLE HOMECOMING.

August 30, 2019 wasn't a particularly special day. Of course, nobody at Mt Smart Stadium that afternoon had any idea of what lay ahead. SARS-nCOV-2 didn't even exist yet.

15,295 fans filled the stands at the Warriors' long-time home ground in the Auckland suburb of Penrose, and - sadly - largely went home disappointed as the South Sydney Rabbitohs took out a comfortable 31-10 courtesy of a second half surge.

Skip ahead to March 2020, and the club faced the difficult decision whether to 'stay or go' at the COVID-19 pandemic began to take hold. Already in Australia, to abandon ship and head home to Auckland would effectively remove a team from the NRL premiership.

After much deliberation and some player movement, the Warriors made the incredible and brave decision to play on. Basing themselves - at least temporarily - on the NSW Central Coast, and playing out of the stadium at nearby Gosford, the Warriors' sacrifice ensured the NRL could continue for at least the opening two rounds, and then indeed when the competition was able to restart at the end of May. As the situation continued to evolve and various

mutations of the virus and waves of infections peaked and troughed, the Warriors maintained. When an outbreak hit the greater Sydney area in mid-2021, the club uprooted once more and made tracks for Redcliffe, 40km north-east of Brisbane's CBD.

And there they've stayed. Moreton Daily Stadium their 'home away from home' - and somewhere they've enjoyed reasonable success despite a lean three season to date. Four coaches: Stephen Kearney, interim Todd Payten, Nathan Brown and another interim now in Stacey Jones, have guided the playing group - vastly changed since that night in August 2019 - through an incredibly difficult time.

So it was an emotional homecoming this week. Though only seven of the Warriors' squad have played for the club at Mt Smart Stadium previously, a special scene greeted the NRL's once-nomads, an emotional pōwhiri (welcoming ceremony) at the stadium's entry on Tuesday morning as the team bus pulled up.

That emotion will crescendo this Sunday, when at 4pm local time, the Warriors' 17 run down that famous tunnel and onto Mt Smart Stadium. **Nau mai ki te kainga** (welcome home).

ANDREW FERGUSON TAKES A LOOK AT THE WESTS TIGERS FIVE-EIGHTH AND THE IMPORTANCE OF THE SPINE IN HIS ROLE SINCE HIS DEBUT FOR THE CLUB NEARLY A DECADE AGO

Speak with any knowledgeable Rugby League person, and any footy fan who's been around long enough to know all the clichés, and they will all tell you about the vital importance of a strong and stable spine in your football.

If you are neither those categories - the spine of your team is essentially the chief playmakers, your halves, hooker and fullback. If you can keep those 4 on the field and full fit for the majority of the season, you're a very strong chance of playing consistently good football and making the finals.

Luke Brooks made his NRL debut in 2013, his sole appearance that year in a game where the Wests Tigers had to get an exception to allow him to play. And play he did!



He came out against the Dragons and absolutely blitzed them as he went on to win man of the match honours. The Tigers looked to have the most talented young roster to build upon, with the likes of Mitchell Moses, James Tedesco, Luke Brooks, Curtis Sironen, Nathan Brown, David Nofaluma, Aaron Woods, Tim Simona, Marika Koroibete to join up with 24 year old Chris Lawrence and club stalwarts Robbie Farah and Benji Marshall, both of which were still in their 20's.

So what went wrong? How could it go wrong?

Wests Tigers did as Wests Tigers do. They weren't watching the footy on the field.

From 2014 til 2022 the Wests Tigers have not managed even once to have back-to-back seasons with the same coach and spine.

In 2014 - Mick Potter was coach, but ultimately sacked at the end of the season. Instead of looking at the talent on the field that they

should be building around, they were looking at the tabloids about some 15 month old conversation that allegedly happened where captain Robbie Farah was apparently not too impressed with new coach Mick Potter. Since that time, they had righted their differences and were functioning well together.

The complete lack of leadership at the club saw this absolute nothing story manifest within the media to the point that Potter parted ways with the club.

As for Brooks - it was his first full season and he was in the halves with Braith Anasta. Farah was at hooker and James Tedesco was at fullback, although he played just 8 games. Kurtis Rowe deputised for 7 games at the back, while Mitch Moses covered 6 games.

In 2015, Jason Taylor was hired as coach and the side had stability in the spine, with Tedesco and Moses at fullback and five-eighth respectively playing every game. Brooks missed just one game while hooker Farah missed seven, all covered by Dene Halatau.

2016 though, saw the club self-destruct under Taylor. His ongoing feud with Farah, exacerbated by the signing of injured Manly and former Origin rake Matt Ballin (which again the club bosses did nothing about) ate away at the club until Farah departed. While Tedesco and Moses remained solid in the spine with Brooks, it meant Halatau - most notably a back rower, covered hooking duties all year.

The following year found the club unable to persist with Taylor, sacked early in the season amid some very important contract negotiations with talented youngsters including Moses, Tedesco, Brooks and new club captain, Aaron Woods. The club signed a new coach in Ivan Cleary but it was too little too late, as Moses agreed to depart mid-season to Parramatta. By seasons end, Woods had signed with Canterbury and Tedesco the Roosters. Brooks stuck solid.

The departure of Moses meant Brooks spent of the season playing along Tigers mid-season recruit Tui Lolohea, while Matt McIlwrick was hooker for most of the year. Ballin continued suffering injuries and played just 3 games, amounting to almost 80 minutes all up, in his two year tenure at the club.

Skip ahead to 2018 and the club was asking if 'everyone was on the bus', before the bus driver - Cleary - decided to jump off and go to Penrith so as to coach his son. Club icon Benji Marshall returned to play alongside Brooks in the halves, but it wasn't until Round 15 when the Tigers picked up Moses Mbye to cover fullback and Robbie Farah returned to cover the rake duties, that there was any stability

in the spine. From Rounds 1 to 14 the Tigers had used four hookers – McIlwrick, Pita Godinet, Jacob Liddle and Elijah Taylor, as well as three fullbacks – Lolohea, David Nofaloama and Corey Thompson.

A well credentialed, premiership-winning coach in Michael Maguire arrived in 2019. However he was hamstrung for three more years with several overpaid players taking up way too much cap space. Thompson played most of the fullback duties, shared almost evenly with Mbye.

The COVID-impacted 2020 season saw Adam Doueihi take over at fullback, while Harry Grant arrived at the Tigers on loan from Melbourne, to cover the retirement of Farah.

In 2021 Doueihi moved to five-eighth to cover the retirement of Marshall, while the club scored the immediate acquisition of Panthers talent Daine Laurie to play at fullback. Jacob Liddle replaced Storm-bound Grant at hooker as his loan ended.

And here we are in 2022 – Brooks had been moved to five-eighth to accommodate new half Jackson Hastings, but as is far too common at this club, the coach was sacked without having a replacement lined up, thus already jeopardising season 2023 before it even starts.

Amongst all this is Luke Brooks, until this season at halfback, surrounded by an ever changing spine and coaching structure. His key attacking stats are as inconsistent as one would expect from such a volatile environment. He has barely been given an opportunity to get settled with a set system.

In 2019 and 2021 he had his best seasons for try assists – netting 24 in 24 games in 2019, and 23 in 24 games in 2021. 2018 and 2019 were his best season for running metres, averaging 62 and 69 metres respectively. 2016 and 2022 have been his best so far for line break assists, averaging 1.05 and 0.77 per game respectively. 2017 and 2018 were his best years for line breaks while 2018 and 2021 were his best seasons for tackle breaks, with 2020 not far behind.

When we drill down deeper though, you begin to see clearly as to why he has struggled with his own form and why his stats are all peaking and troughing at completely different times – which in turn impacts his form in different ways.

In his 182 games in the run-on side – Luke Brooks has played alongside 17 different fullbacks, 14 different five-eighths, 2 different halfbacks and 12 different hookers – overall, he’s been part of 62 different spine combinations.

Only three of those 62 combinations has played in at least 10 games together - none in the last three seasons:

So while fans and the uneducated swill that make up the Rugby League mainstream media will bay at the moon for Brooks to be replaced, when you consider the continuous mess that the club continues to trot out around him in the spine and never give him an opportunity to build long lasting combinations, just how many halfbacks could have made something out of that situation?

These are the very simple things that the club needs to get right if it wants success. These are not specifically coaching related, as they have happened under every coach the club has had. Are they constantly looking for a miracle combination that provides instant success? If so, they are foolish, because that won’t ever happen.

Are they in fact utterly clueless when it comes to signing players, especially those that would compliment each others game so as to help the coach work towards a structure and style that they want?

You be the judge.

KELLY SHINES AS BLUES REGAIN ORIGIN DOMINANCE

New South Wales have regained the Women's State of Origin shield with a physical 20-14 victory in front of a record crowd of 11,321 in Canberra.

The game was a true origin effort from start to finish when the Blues looked to get over the line when Emma Tonegato was able to get through but she was unable to score when Tamika Upton got underneath her to hold her up.

Discipline hurt NSW as a penalty gave Queensland strong field position and Destiny Brill got her way

through when Brittany Breayley-Nati went out of dummy half before turning the ball back inside to Brill who scored. Ali Briggingshaw's conversion came off the upright at close range.

The first New South Wales try was all-round brilliance both from NSW and referee Belinda Sharpe in awarding the try. Coming out of nothing, Keeley Davis put a grubber kick through that looked to be too deep however Emma Tonegato was able to get there within inches of the line and was awarded the try.

Coming almost immediately after the first try, Kirra Dibb put on some individual brilliance after stepping through the defence off her left foot to score. Rachael Pearson added a second conversion to push the lead out to 12-4.

A successful captains challenge put the Maroons into good attacking position and straight off the back of a scrum, Tarryn Aiken was able to go through some poor defence to score. The conversion was good and closed the gap to two points.

New South Wales added a penalty goal just shy of the half-hour mark to push the lead out to 14-10 which they took into the half time break.

A second penalty goal pushed the lead for NSW out to six when the Maroons were penalised for a strip. The Maroons then closed the gap to two points when Evania Pelite took the ball out of Aiken's hands to get over in the corner. The missed conversion from Brown kept the margin at two points.

The Bunker stamped it's influence on the game when New South Wales looked to put the game to bed after a ball that looked like a pass went out to Tiana Penitani who scored in the corner. The bunker however ruled that it wasn't a pass but a knock-on to stun many.

New South Wales fans had their hearts in all sorts of issues when Julia Robinson chased through an Ali Briggingshaw bomb before finding Shenae Ciesiolka who scored next to the post. For the Blues though, the bunker intervention was a relief when it showed Robinson to be a long way offside on the kick chase.

The victory was sealed for New South Wales when Isabelle Kelly was able to beat two defenders and get her way over to score in the corner. The conversion attempt from out wide was missed giving Queensland an outside chance of forcing a draw but they couldn't do it.

The victory for New South Wales gives them a 3-2 lead in the overall Origin head-to-head record before the contest goes to a two game series next year. **JOSH ROBERTSON**

The first match in a big day of Pacific test action in Auckland and Campbelltown saw some hectic matchplay from both sides, with the scoreline threatening to get well out of hand before NZ triumphed 50-12.

Early on the Kiwi Ferns could not be stopped, rolling through Tonga's middle and finding space on both edges to create points. They were helped by some ill-discipline from Tonga, with penalties and errors mounting up.

It was Page McGregor who crossed for the first of three tries in quick succession for the Kiwi Ferns, although Laishon Jones struggled to make the conversions. With the momentum very firmly against the Tonga side, a sin bin to their hooker Shirley Mailangi for a professional foul didn't help their cause in the slightest.

With Tonga struggling for possession and territory, the Kiwi Ferns kept piling on the pain with three tries in the minutes before halftime. With the New Zealand side leading 30 points to 0 at the break, Tonga were finding themselves thoroughly out-matched.

Despite the huge lead, the Kiwi Ferns didn't let up, scoring another two tries early in the second half, including Madison Barlett crossing for her second. Every set they would just stroll downfield, with Tonga absolutely helpless to stop them.

But four penalties in quick succession against the Kiwi Ferns caused a minor momentum shift, and the mounting pressure ended with China Polata finding her way to the line for Tonga's first points of the match, to cheers from the crowd's large Tongan contingent. Some big defensive efforts from Tonga Women in the second half is something the team can be proud of as they build towards a possible world cup appearance in 2025.

A late consolation for Tonga's Haylee Hifo set the crowd alight again, and she converted her own try to bring the full time scoreline to 50 points to 12.

The Kiwi Ferns will now look to build towards the world cup at the end of the year, while Tonga will need to re-assess as they work towards world cup qualification for France 2025. **LACHLAN MCINTYRE**

MANU OF THE MOMENT IN NEW ZEALAND HOMECOMING

A starring performance from Joseph Manu has seen New Zealand cap their homecoming with a dominant 26-6 win over Tonga in front of a full house in Auckland.

Returning to the land of the long white cloud for their first test match since the 2019 Lions Tour, the Kiwis proved far too strong for a youthful Tongan side lacking experience in key playmaking positions.

Establishing the win from the opening minutes with Jahrome Hughes (3rd minute) managing to get the ball down in his maiden starting appearance at halfback, the Kiwis surpassed the clock to reach a 12-0 lead with Jordan Rapana (7th minute) racing underneath the posts following tremendous lead up work by Kenny Bromwich and debutant Dylan Brown.

Managing to stem the flow of points after an error inside the New Zealand half from Jesse Bromwich, appearing as captain for the first time since 2017, Tongan winger Sione Katoa (14th minute) touched down out wide for the side's sole try of the afternoon.

Putting the margin beyond a converted try with a penalty goal midway through the first half, the Kiwis took advantage of Christian Tuipulotu being sent to the sin bin for holding Rapana down close to the try line with Ronaldo Mulitalo (31st minute) capping his test debut with a spectacular put down narrowly inside the corner post.

Returning from the sheds with neither team able to capitalise on their opponent's errors, Manu - starting at fullback for the first time at test level - appeared the most dangerous player with a series of dashing runs and attacking kicks.

Taking advantage of quality field position following a superb kick from Hughes, James Fisher-Harris delivered the final pass to send Isaiah Papali'i (61st minute) over for the match-clinching try.

Cruising to victory over the final quarter with coach Michael Maguire electing to use veteran Kieran Foran at dummy half, Briton Nikora came close to giving the Mt Smart Stadium faithful a perfect send-off only to be held up over the line.

New Zealand will be buoyed by the performance heading into the end-of-season Rugby League World Cup, while Tonga will be hoping the chance to build cohesion with a longer preparation results in a much stronger showing on the international stage. **ROB CROSBY**

The Cook Islands got a consolation try soon after, with Esan Marsters getting a flick pass away to his namesake Steven, who also converted the try from the sideline.

6 minutes later, Josh Schuster made another break and again kicked ahead for his winger, this time it was David Nofaloaluma who won the race, the veteran scoring four total tries in this one.

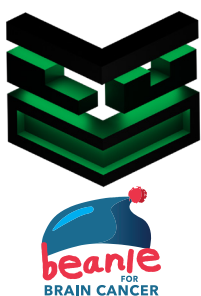

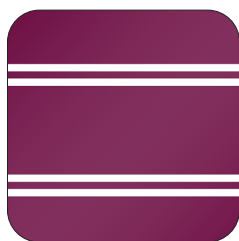

It might be 11 years since the Battle of Brookvale, but the rivalry between the Manly Sea Eagles and the Melbourne Storm has never died down despite different fortunes of the teams in recent seasons.

The Sea Eagles have had an up and down season sitting in tenth spot with seven wins and eight losses from their fifteen games this season including their capitulation at the hands of the Cowboys a fortnight ago. Leading 26-12 with 15 minutes to go, Manly looked as if they had the game under control having dominated the contest only to concede three tries in the space of three minutes to fall 28-26 behind.

Manly have had their struggles this season against top eight sides this season without a victory against a side above them on the ladder and they were comprehensively beaten by the Storm a couple of weeks ago when the sides met in Melbourne.

The Sea Eagles will have all their rep stars backing up from last weekend bar Josh Aloai who was left heavily concussed in last week's Samoa V Cook Islands match at Campbelltown. This has meant that Sean Keppie comes into the starting side with Taniela Paseka coming onto the bench.

Sitting in second spot, the Melbourne Storm are needing to play catch-up football if they want to close the gap to the Panthers who have a bye in hand as the Storm are four points behind on the ladder. Before the rep break, the Storm had to come from behind in their victory over the Broncos when they scored a 32-20 win after

The Storm have been in good form in recent weeks having won their past three matches including having the bye during that period. A minor injury crisis put the pressure on the Storm as they suffered two heavy losses against the Panthers and Cowboys which saw Melbourne fall four points behind the top of the ladder.

Despite being named by the Storm, Cameron Munster looks to be in serious doubt with a shoulder injury in Origin 2. This could be offset by the return of Ryan Papenhuyzen who has been named in the reserves after suffering a hamstring injury and then a delayed return due to COVID. The Storm will also be without Felise Kaufusi for family reasons.

WHO TO WATCH: Coming off the back of the loss in Origin 2, Daly Cherry-Evans will be looking to bounce back and the Sea Eagles star will want to be putting in a statement performance that Manly can match it with the top teams. A starring performance from DCE needs to happen if the Sea Eagles want to beat Melbourne.

The importance of Jahrome Hughes was on show during Melbourne's losing streak where they looked a completely different team to the one with Hughes. Potentially losing Cameron Munster, the pressure will go on Hughes and with the loss of a key playmaker, the weight will go on the shoulders of Hughes to get the Storm home.

FAVOURITE: The Storm are heavy favourites although injuries and confirmation of the 17 could change the favourites for the game.

MY TIP: Part of me wants to go for an upset, but I think that the Storm will get home but the game could be a lot closer than people think. The Sea Eagles always put in a better performance at home but the Storm have the class factor that should see them home. Storm by 8.

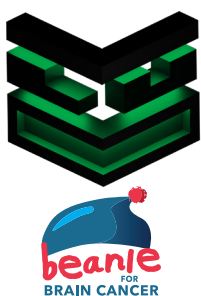

Desperation day for ladder laggards

The Newcastle Knights and the Gold Coast Titans will be fighting to keep their faint finals hopes in tact when they clash in Newcastle on Friday evening.

Most recently facing off for a place in the top eight during the penultimate round of last season, the two sides will meet under vastly different circumstances after enduring dramatic declines over the first half of the 2022 campaign.

Determined to put an end to a horror run of performances at McDonald Jones Stadium, the Newcastle Knights will be aiming to repay the faith shown by their loyal supporters with a much-needed win on home soil.

Coming off a heartbreaking 20-18 defeat on the road to the Raiders in their last performance, coach Adam O'Brien has been dealt a major blow with captain Kalyn Ponga ruled out after sustaining a concussion in the closing minutes of Sunday night's second State of Origin encounter. Tex Hoy will gain another chance to press his case in the top grade in the number one jersey, while Daniel Saifiti and Bradman Best could be late inclusions after being named as part of the extended bench.

Sitting in 12th position with four wins over the opening 15 rounds, the Knights hold the unwanted distinction as the worst attacking team in the league with an average of 13 points per game so far this season.

Conceding 197 points while scoring a measly 28 in their past five home matches, the Knights have performed strongly historically against the Titans with eight wins from 12 meetings in Newcastle.

Languishing at the bottom of the NRL ladder with the second worst defensive record, the Gold Coast Titans will be desperate to break a run of five straight losses.

Going down to the Sharks 18-10 in their most recent match held in Coffs Harbour, the Titans will welcome back David Fifita from a knee injury sustained during Indigenous Round, along with Tino Fa'asuamaleaui backing up from Origin II.

Winning two of the three matches contested against the Knights since taking over as coach in 2020, Justin Holbrook will be hoping his team can claim their first win in Newcastle since 2016.

WHO TO WATCH: Standing up in a forward pack that has regularly been outmuscled this season, veteran front-rower David Klemmer will be vying to experience victory in front of the Newcastle faithful for the first time in almost a year. Missing the side's Round 2 win over the Tigers through injury, the 28-year-old has averaged 144 metres to rank inside the top ten forwards for metres gained during the first half of the year. Still chasing his first try for the club after making the shift from Canterbury at the end of 2018, the Knights will be banking on a strong showing from Klemmer to claim two vital premiership points.

Unable to cement a regular position as a result of the side's substandard form, star playmaker AJ Brimson will be aiming to get the Titans back in the winner's circle and press his representative claims. Spending the bulk of 2022 in the halves before reverting to the number one jersey prior to the representative weekend, the 23-year-old has been the side's primary attacking threat with ten try assists and 32 tackle breaks. Overlooked for selection by Queensland coach Billy Slater during the first two matches of the series, a strong showing on Friday night could see Brimson come into calculations for a Game III recall should Kalyn Ponga's concussion create a vacancy in the Maroon's backline.

FAVOURITE: Beginning the week as favourites, despite boasting their worst run of losses on home soil since 2018, the Knights have drifted out to an even-money bet following the withdrawal of Kalyn Ponga.

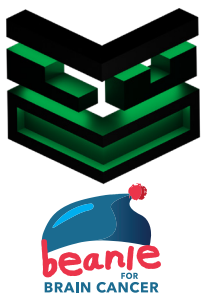

Reckoning arrives for rebuilding Roosters

Friday night shapes as a pivotal game for two teams in contrasting form as the league leading Penrith Panthers play host to the out of form Sydney Roosters at the foot of the mountains.

Thriving atop the premiership ladder four points clear of their nearest rivals, the Penrith Panthers will be determined to extend their recent run of dominance over the Tricolours to six straight matches.

Recording a comprehensive victory over the Warriors in their most recent NRL fixture, coach Ivan Cleary has stuck solid with the same squad that prevailed 40-6 in Redcliffe, featuring 14 players involved in last weekend's round of representative matches.

The match will serve as a club milestone for co-captain Isaah Yeo, who will move into outright tenth on the list of first grade appearances for the Panthers. The 27-year-old forward will surpass Trent Waterhouse with his 187th appearance for the club and, barring injury, will reach 200 NRL games in the early rounds of next season.

Interchange hooker Mitch Kenny will play his 50th game for the club, while Matthew Eisenhuth could bring up 100 NRL appearances if elevated from the extended squad into the final team.

Sitting outside the top eight midway through a season for the first time since their calamitous 2016 campaign, the Sydney Roosters will be desperate to break a three match losing run with a major scalp.

Winning three of eight visits to Penrith during Trent Robinson's tenure - the last of which occurred in 2017 - the Roosters will once again be without Luke Keary with Sam Walker named to start at halfback alongside Drew Hutchison at five-eighth.

In a major boost to the side's hopes of causing an upset, Victor Radley will return for the first time since Magic Round, while Connor Watson will make his 50th appearance for the club.

Facing a difficult run home with just three matches against teams currently ranked outside the top eight, the side will need to emulate the feats of the last Roosters team in 2010 to qualify for the finals from outside the top eight following Origin II.

WHO TO WATCH: Emerging as one of the breakout stars of the 2022 season, Penrith powerhouse Taylan May will be eager to continue his try-scoring prowess on Friday evening. Sitting alongside Alex Johnston as the league's equal leading try-scorer with 14 four-pointers, the 20-year-old Minichinbury Jets junior has averaged 167 running metres each week, while producing 61 tackle breaks and 12 line breaks, since gaining his opportunity earlier in the season. Debuting against the Roosters in the closing rounds of the home-and-away season last year, May proved equally as potent on the representative stage last weekend with a brace in his representative debut for Samoa.

Enjoying a rapid rise with nine tries in ten appearances this season, Joseph Suaalii has provided the Roosters with a sorely needed point of difference in attack. Cementing a place on the right wing after beginning the year in reserve grade, the 18-year-old star junior has shown glimpses of athleticism not seen since the emergence of Israel Folau at a similar age. Viewed as a representative player of the future after being included in the extended NSW squad during the series, the Roosters will need Suaalii to deliver if they hope to pull off an upset.

FAVOURITE: Returning home in high spirits and even better form, Penrith have been installed as the shortest-priced favourites of the round.

MY TIP: For as brilliant as individual players within the Roosters ranks may be, the collective brilliance of the Panthers will be too much to overcome on the night. Panthers by 14.

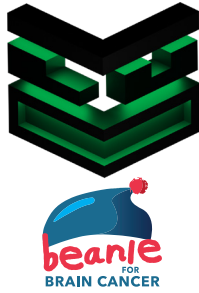

Two teams, each with two straight wins, fight to keep their respective streaks alive

With the representative round now in the past, the run home for all NRL clubs truly begins this weekend. This Saturday afternoon will see two teams with plenty to play for clash at Commbank Stadium in Parramatta, as the Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs host the Cronulla-Sutherland Sharks.

The Bulldogs had some reasons to be hopeful about their 2022 campaign leading into it, with some great signings over the past year, but Canterbury quickly fell into losing ways. The blame fell to their head coach, Trent Barrett, who quit back in May. Now under interim coach Mick Potter, the Bulldogs have won two in a row, and are sitting in 13th place on the ladder, just three wins outside the top eight.

Their last outing saw a convincing win for the Canterbury outfit against a struggling Tigers side. The 36 points to 12 victory renewed hopes of an admittedly unlikely late finals surge for Potter's side.

Big efforts from their star signings Matt Burton and Josh Addo-Carr were the standouts for Canterbury, but it was their fullback Jake Averillo's performance that has Bulldogs fans the most excited.

Averillo has been given the opportunity by Mick Potter to play at fullback, chosen over the more experienced Matt Dufty, and so far he has not disappointed. Averillo will start in the number 1 jersey again this weekend, with the Bulldogs sticking with the same 17 as their last outing. Matt Burton will be backing up from Origin, named to start in the five-eighth role.

The Cronulla Sharks have also won their last two matches, and will be just as keen as Canterbury to keep their streak alive.

Taking their home game to Coffs Harbour in round 15, they managed to fight their way to an 18-10 victory over the Titans. Playing another team towards the bottom of the ladder this weekend, the Sharks will be looking for a repeat.

Their recent wins have lifted Cronulla back into the top 4, although they're even on points with two other teams. A top 4 finish would be a massive result for the Cronulla club, but there's still a lot of work to be done between now and the end of the season.

Helping them get there is their lack of injury concerns, with Braden Hamlin-Uele being the only player with a long term injury on their roster.

Sharks coach Craig Fitzgibbon has named the same 17 to take to the field this weekend as he did back in round 15. Siosifa Talakai and Nicho Hynes return from a successful blues camp, and they will play against their team mate from last week Matt Burton.

Ronaldo Mulitalo spent his rep round with the New Zealand test side as they downed Tonga, and he has been named on the wing.

In round 7 of last year, the Bulldogs were able to pull off an 18-12 upset over the Sharks for Canterbury's first win of the season.

WHO TO WATCH: Matt Burton is riding high after an outstanding Origin debut for NSW on Sunday. Arriving as a key signing for the Bulldogs at the start of this year after playing a crucial, albeit minor, role in the Panthers premiership campaign in 2021, he has taken some time to find his feet. But as the season has progressed, he has looked more and more at home at Canterbury.

Now, with talk over NFL scouts and many rumours swirling about where he could be headed in the coming years, Burton will want to keep his form going. There are also question marks over his Origin spot for the deciding game despite his strong performance due to the plethora of centres at Brad Fittler's disposal. A strong performance this weekend is crucial to both his future and Canterbury's hopes of keeping their short winning streak alive.

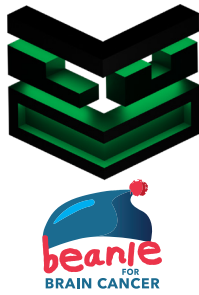
Cronulla Sharks captain Wade Graham has been named in the second row for this weekend's clash, which will be just his 7th game of the 2022 season. Injuring himself in a pre-season trial match against the Bulldogs, he didn't get back onto the field until round eight. Since then, he has been a very consistent worker for the Sharks, with the former NSW and Australian representative arguably being one of the Sharks best.

Having been at the club since 2011, and taking over as captain when Paul Gallen retired, Graham has over 250 NRL appearances at just 31 years of age. The amount of minutes he can get through this Saturday could have a major impact on the result of the game.

FAVOURITE: The Cronulla Sharks are the strong favourites to get the job done and make it three in a row since their bye.

MY TIP: The Bulldogs are on a roll and Cronulla have shown throughout the season that they can be inconsistent, so an upset might be on the cards here. Bulldogs by 4.

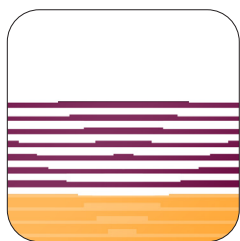

Season's big improvers go head to head

The NRL's two most improved teams in the North Queensland Cowboys and the Brisbane Broncos will go head to head in a twilight blockbuster on Saturday night.

North Queensland were most people's picks for the wooden spoon this year, but Todd Payten has delivered on the talent at his disposal placing the Cowboys comfortably inside the NRL's top four. The scary thing for the rest of the competition, is the Cowboys aren't at their best yet. With players tasting the experience of rep footy this season, they're going to be primed to finish the season on a high. Their march into September begins with an important derby match against the Broncos, a side which North Queensland trounced handsomely earlier in the season 38-12 in a match that showed that the Cowboys wouldn't be making up the numbers in season 2022.

North Queensland will be without Reuben Cotter again as he recovers from his hamstring strain in the warm-up against Manly, but will have the services of the rest of their line-up that trounced Brisbane. Jeremiah Nanai will be primed to put in another big performance against the team he made his presence felt against earlier this season with a hat-trick and several big plays. Luciano Leilua is named for his club debut on the bench in his 100th NRL game. North Queensland's representative players got through unscathed and are named, while Tom Gilbert returns from injury pushing Connelly Lemuelu out of the squad and Jamayne Taunoa-Brown back to the bench. Kyle Feldt is an outside chance of returning from a knee injury as he's named in the reserves.

Things were looking shaky for the boys from Red Hill early on this season, after two tough wins, they dropped four straight and the questions were asked about commitment and the future of Kevin Walters. But in Bronco spirit, they turned it around in spectacular fashion to win their next seven straight before going down bravely at the hands of Melbourne a fortnight ago. With the week off and the QLD contingent of Broncos looking for revenge after Sunday's disaster. They'll be primed to get revenge on a Cowboys side that ambushed them back in March on their own home ground.

Selwyn Cobbo will be keen to turn around a nightmare second appearance at the Origin arena after 4 errors and dropped bombs, so expect Chad Townsend and Tom Dearden to give Cobbo another nightmare evening under the high ball. Whilst Pat Carrigan and Payne Haas will be looking to carry their strong impact in the forwards with the latter carrying an ankle injury into this match and could be a late scratching. Adam Reynolds will return from a rib injury in an otherwise unchanged line-up.

WHO TO WATCH: After a lacklustre start to his Cowboys career, Jordan McLean has well and truly rebounded in season 2022. Off contract at the end of the season, McLean has been a constant goer for the Cowboys this season, which has allowed their outside backs to shine through his go-forward and tackling ability we saw at Melbourne and for Australia in the last World Cup. McLean has averaged 116 meters a game and tackling at 96.5% efficiency, with a place in the squad not secured for next year, McLean is looking to either cement a future at the Cowboys or put on a show for a future buyer.

Ezra Mam has been a shining light in his rookie season as the club looks for a long term halves partner for Adam Reynolds. In what has been another year of a halfback carousel (this time due to injury and not form). Mam has been the perfect addition to partner the former premierships winner in the halves. Mam has crossed the stripe three times and set up three more in the four matches he's appeared in this season. Watch for Ezra to be at his scintillating best on Saturday night.

FAVOURITE: North Queensland are the favourites with this one. The teams are even in matches played at QCB Stadium with Brisbane winning in 2020, and the Cowboys winning last year in an epic.

MY TIP: I just believe with the injuries that Brisbane have sustained in key positions, North Queensland will have enough strike power to overpower the Broncos in this one with Tom Dearden and Chad Townsend set to continue their combination in the halves as they knock off another impressive victory this season and cement their place firmly inside the top 4. Cowboys by 6.

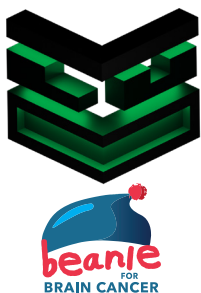

Mitchell returns to tame mixed bag Eels

Parramatta head to Homebush on Saturday to face a Rabbitohs side teetering on the edge of the eight. But for the sixth placed Eels, still on target for a fourth consecutive finals campaign, a loss threatens their place among the leading pack.

Coming off a horrid Round 14 hiding to the Bulldogs, the Eels rebounded in a last start pounding of the Roosters that included arguably the most complete first half performance of the season. Now adrift of the top-four on points differential, this is the type of game the higher ranked Eels can ill afford to let slip.

By contrast, South Sydney are coming off arguably the worst first half performance of the season. Simply woeful in conceding 32 unanswered points against the Dragons in Wollongong, if anything, Rabbitohs fans will be hoping Latrell Mitchell's return for the first time since Round 5 can at least lift the club's flagging spirits.

Another loss could squeeze Jason Demetriou's side out of the top eight, but with a host of Origin hopefuls including Mitchell ready to make a statement and with the Knights and Bulldogs to follow, a reversal of form this week could transform their season.

Damien Cook, Cameron Murray and Jai Arrow have all been named to backup following the trip to Perth. For Brad Arthur it should sound the alarm bells. The last time his side topped Souths was back in 2019, and since then it has all been red and green. Parramatta has been smashed in the last four contests by an average margin of 24.5 points including losses in the last three at the Olympic venue.

Rep-round fatigue might be a factor this weekend and it may just prove to be Arthur's saviour. The freshness of Parramatta's four Origin wannabes could prove decisive. Clinton Gutherson, Mitchell Moses, Reagan Campbell-Gillard and Ryan Matterson didn't lace a boot last week and will be desperate to dish up more of what they served the Roosters. And with the battling Tigers and Warriors to follow, the Eels should be focused on a return to the four inside the next month.

WHO TO WATCH: Cody Walker and Dylan Brown - hold your stare like a nosey neighbour.

Without his best mates, for the bulk of the season Walker has been like an aimless kid in the playground. Now with the return of Mitchell's havoc, the No.6 not only has another hole running target but with Eels eyes drawn towards the No.1, expect the playmaker to sniff out additional try scoring avenues.

Dylan Brown has always had a running game, but only now are we seeing it every week. Averaging just under one-hundred metres a week last season, the Kiwi five-eighth has since ditched the Dunlop Volleys for top shelf speedsters. Now at 129m a game he's only a bushy beard shy of Forrest Gump. Although statistics don't tell the full story of his impact. Without a try-assist since Round 6, the numbers say he's passive, but it's his 10 linebreaks that has opened doors for Parramatta.

FAVOURITE: Parramatta are the favourite, and that's despite recording just one victory over the Rabbitohs in the past seven contests since 2018.

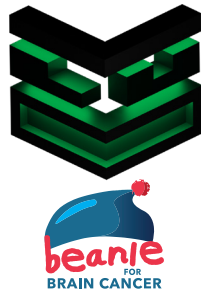
MY TIP: Latrell might be back, but is Lachlan Ilias? It can't have been easy for the young halfback to look his teammates in the eye after being dragged during the Dragons debacle. How he picks up the pieces will be central to Souths' revival. By comparison, Parramatta should be in a better headspace and with most of their big names on fresh legs they should run away with it. Eels by 14.

They're finally home!

After a two and a half year tour of duty playing home games in Australia, the New Zealand Warriors will return to Mt Smart Stadium for a critical match against the Wests Tigers. A win for either side gets them one step away from the wooden spoon.

It has been an incredibly challenging period for the Warriors since they've been relocated to Australia. It's been a period which has seen two head coaches sacked, and a new one to be appointed before the year is out. They can finally put the off-field politics behind them and play before their fans who have missed out on the chance to watch their local team in person. On the field, it hasn't all been plain sailing this season, after a promising start which saw the Aucklanders pull off upsets against Brisbane and North Queensland, the wheels have quickly fallen off the bus winning only one match since their three game winning streak which came to an end in Round 6.

However, they are back at Mt Smart and it's a real opportunity to re-establish their home ground as the fortress it once was a few seasons ago. Last start against Penrith, the Warriors were competitive in the opening 20 minutes, but ultimately came well short of defeating the premiers. This time around, New Zealand are the stronger side with a point to prove on their home ground. Addin Fonua-Blake outran the Penrith forwards last start and should come back from the Tongan side a much better player and with Ronald Volkman warming in confidence after his debut, expect his combination with Shaun Johnson and Reece Walsh to be firing. As far as the team list is concerned, Stacey Jones has bitten the bullet and shifted Euan Aitken back to centre in place of Adam Pompey. Eli Katoa returns on the bench replacing Duanmis Lui who's been left out of the line-up.

Meanwhile, the Wests Tigers are hurdling down the ladder at a rapid pace and are walking into a hostile atmosphere on Sunday as the Warriors will be keen to give their home fans something to cheer about. After two shock wins over Parramatta and Souths, there were signs of renewal but only one win from their next four spelled the end of Michael Maguire's tenure and more boardroom chaos.

The start of Brett Kimmorley's coaching tenure hasn't been easy with two heavy losses at the hands of Manly and Canterbury and poor defensive lapses in critical stages has led to the downfall of Noddy's side in the last fortnight. Adam Doueihi's successful return from injury is a welcome boost for a Tigers side heavily hit by injuries. Jackson Hastings need to rally his troops and take advantage of some at times paper thin defence that we've seen from the Warriors at times this season. Brett Kimmorley has seen enough from his under-performing forwards handing boom rookie Fonua Pole his first grade debut. Luke Brooks survives despite media reports suggesting he'd be dropped for this one. James Roberts and Stefano Utoikamanu return for the first time in several weeks. Nu Brown starts at hooker with Jacob Liddle dropped.

WHO TO WATCH: After shifting from the Roosters a few weeks ago, Ronald Volkman was rewarded with his NRL debut last round. Even though the scoreline wasn't in the Warriors favour, Volkman showed the huge potential that has seen the huge wraps placed upon his shoulders. Volkman has an excellent kicking game and good game management skills, look for the young half to assert his dominance as the Warriors look to make their return to Mt Smart a winning one for their long suffering supporters.

In what has been an inconsistent season for the Tigers thus far, Jackson Hastings has been the shining light for a side that has lacked an identity for the past few seasons. Hastings has never given up in a side that has been at times lacking that winning spirit and desire to compete with the top clubs in the NRL. Look for Hastings in this one to try to snap a losing streak and begin a late season surge to climb out of the bottom four on the premiership table.

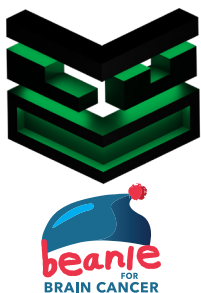

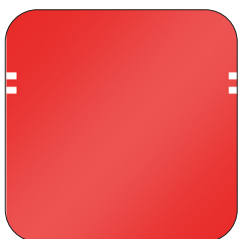

Top 8 hopefuls face off in vital Wollongong battle.

This is a game that will have huge ramifications on the final make-up of the top eight come the end of the season. Both the Dragons and Raiders are amongst five teams (the others being Souths, the Roosters and Manly) that are currently jostling for the last two spots in the finals. Disregarding points for the bye, all five teams are level on competition points (Souths and Dragons with a game in hand though), and as such, games that any of the said five teams play against each other are, at this stage, more important than games against other opponents. Both the Dragons and Raiders are 2-1 against fellow members of the five so far this season, both scoring a close win against the Roosters and a 20-point victory over Souths, while the Raiders fell to Manly earlier in the year and the Dragons lost their original clash with the Rabbitohs. These results would indicate that these two sides are of similar quality and should produce a close matchup on Sunday.

St George Illawarra will draw huge confidence from their last start win over Souths. It was the best their attack has looked all season as they piled on 32 points in the opening half an hour against the 2021 Grand Finalists. It was the kind of performance demonstrated that they are more than capable of winning enough games from here on out to make the finals and potentially cause an upset or two in the early weeks.

In recent weeks the Raiders have showed that they have the ability to hang in there with teams a tier above them on the table in games against the Eels and Broncos, but also that they haven't fully shaken the tendency to give up leads in games they should have already wrapped up. Their most recent game against Newcastle was a prime example of this, with Canberra dominating possession in the first half but only having an 8-point lead to show for it. The fact that winning that match required individual brilliance from Hudson Young is an indictment on them. In good news for Canberra though, star five-eighth Jack Wighton is back from Covid, coming in for Matt Frawley. Charnze Nicoll-Klokstad also returns, albeit via the bench, replacing injured utility James Schiller. The Dragons will roll out the same 17 that embarrassed South Sydney a fortnight ago.

It really cannot be overstated how important this game is for both sides. The Dragons are currently sitting in 8th spot, but a loss here could quickly derail their season. Their next five matches are against the Broncos, Roosters, Sea Eagles, Cowboys and Sharks, before a rematch against the Raiders. It's an extremely tough schedule, especially with every week being basically a must win with their ladder position. You get the feeling the Saints are aware of this with the intent they came out with against Souths. The challenge will not only be repeating it this week, but again and again against increasingly tougher opposition. Will they be able to rise to the occasions, starting this week against Canberra? Time will tell. If they do finish the season in the top 8, they will certainly have earned it.

The Raiders are one of the more perplexing teams in the competition. When watching them, it is clear that there are still remnants of the fairytale 2019 outfit, but the inconsistency and frustration of the 2021 team rears its ugly head way too often for them to be taken seriously as a contender yet. On their day, I genuinely believe they are capable of matching it with the competitions heavyweights, which is more than can be said of the Dragons, however it's simply too hard to trust them to win enough games between now and the finals to give themselves that opportunity.

WHO TO WATCH: Zac Lomax, like many Dragons players, enjoyed his best outing of the season last round against the Rabbitohs. It was a welcome change for Lomax, who up to that point was having his most disappointing season since becoming a regular starter in 2019. The fact he wasn't even mentioned in origin conversations despite NSW's best two centre options succumbing to injury should tell you all you need to know. However, there is no doubt that when in form, Lomax is one of the best centres in the NRL, and he reminded everyone of that two Thursdays ago, finishing with the stats of one line-break assist, three tackle breaks, an offload and two try assists, one of which was an outstanding flick pass to Ravalawa close to the line. He will be matched up against Seb Kris and Jordan Rapana, who have each had their struggles defensively, so look for Lomax to make another statement with his performance on Sunday.

Xavier Savage is already without a doubt one of the flashiest players in the game with an outstanding highlight reel, but he is also an 11-game rookie who still has a lot to work on if he wants to become one of the games genuine superstars. The rocks and diamonds of Savage were on full display against the Knights. In the first half, he produced a miraculous effort in the air to leap over 2 or 3 Knights defenders and come down with the ball to score and give his side a 14-point lead. His second half was an unmitigated disaster though. In the 65th minute, Edrick Lee ran over the top of him like a speed bump to give Newcastle the lead, while his effort to try and keep a would-be 40/20 in the field of play would've almost certainly lost the game for the Raiders had Enari Tuala not knocked on afterwards. With CNK nearing a return to full fitness, Ricky Stuart can either go high risk/high reward and keep Savage as starting fullback in first grade, or stick with the known commodity in Charnze and allow Savage to continue growing as a player in NSW cup.
