DCE MASTERCLASS NEARLY BOTTLED BY MANLY

A masterclass from Daly Cherry-Evans was nearly thrown away by his Manly Warringah side, but they hung on for a 36-30 upset victory over the Melbourne Storm to kick off Beansies for Brain Cancer Round at 4 Pines Park.

It was the home side that crossed for the first try when Ryan Papenhuyzen showcased some rust in his first game back from injury with a poorly timed grubber kick which was intercepted by Tolutau Koula who showcased his speed and raced 90 meters to cross untouched and set Manly up for an early lead. Reuben Garrick's conversion performed the double doink but failed to go over the uprights. Melbourne hit back moments later when Papenhuyzen showcased his skills with a lovely pass to Nick Meaney who crossed out-wide to put the Storm back on level terms before Meaney's sideline conversion put the Storm in front for the only time in the match.

Manly would take full momentum for the remainder of the first 40 minutes off the back of a brilliantly timed 40/20 from DCE which set Manly up in great attacking field position. It appeared that everything DCE was touching was turning to gold for Manly in the opening half when a well-executed set play saw Garrick throw a great pass to Jason Saab and Manly regained the lead. Garrick suffered a knock passing the final pass and wouldn't kick goals for the remainder of the contest, DCE nailed the kick from out near the sideline for Manly to lead by four. Off the ensuing set a bomb from the QLD halfback was allowed to bounce by the Storm's back three and Christian Tuipulotu charged his way over the line to score. Melbourne weren't their usual clinical selves in this contest, forcing poor passes and dropping the ball in critical situations. Manly made them pay right on half-time when Saab crossed for his second juggling the ball to give Manly a twelve-point lead at the change of ends.

Despite the narrow margin, Melbourne was playing as if they were down by 30 with Craig Bellamy's half-time address seemingly going in one ear and out the other. Morgan Harper continued his strong game charging over the top of some pedestrian Melbourne defence to put his side up by sixteen. Off the ensuing set, Manly went down the field and hit Melbourne with their second double whammy of the match when Haumole Olakau'atu charged over the top of four defenders to cross and give Manly a 22-point lead. Melbourne showed some signs of life off the very next play when Brandon Smith stole the ball off Martin Taupau and ran 20 meters to cross and give the Storm a chance. Any hope of a comeback appeared to be sniffed out when Koula scored off another DCE pass for Manly's seventh of the evening to lead 34-12. A run of sets on Melbourne's line eventually saw Manly add more points, however it was just a solitary penalty goal after Melbourne sent a short dropout out on the full and the Eagles looked home.

The last seven minutes were drama charged and all Manly's wrong doing. A failed attempt at a one on one strip by Taniela Paseka saw Melbourne cross off a routine scrum play when Nelson Asofa-Solomona crashed over. Off the kick-off, Josh Schuster was ruled offside and the Storm charged down field and Papenhuyzen crossed for the first of his two late tries when Manly's defence crumbled at the seems. The next kickoff saw it sail out on the full, which allowed Olam to cross for the Storm off some sloppy Manly defence. Although they finally got a kickoff right (yep it's a miracle), they let Papenhuyzen stroll straight through untouched to set up one final play. But, thankfully for Manly fans, there footy team remembered how to tackle for one play and hung on for an upset victory. Manly have the bye next week so they can work on trying to stop these late game fadeouts which reminds us of Canberra. Melbourne take on the Sharks next Thursday night without their Origin stars in what will be a massive test and after tonight's performance, you'll have to say there's some concerned Storm fans. **AJ LUCANTONIO**





DRAGONS DELIVER AS RAIDERS RUE THE RAIN

A controlled performance in rain-affected conditions has seen the St George Illawarra Dragons return to the top eight with a 12-10 victory over the Canberra Raiders.

Getting the job done at WIN Stadium in a match commemorating the 40th anniversary of the Illawarra Steelers, Dragons captain Ben Hunt once again earned man of the match honours with a performance seen by a hearty group of 7,069 supporters braving the wet Wollongong weather.

Knocking back the opportunity to post points with multiple penalties within kicking range, the Dragons opened the scoring in bizarre circumstances after Jack Wighton batted back a short line drop out which landed into the waiting arms of Talatau Amone (17th minute).

Extending the lead midway through the half just as the rain poured down at its heaviest, Zac Lomax added a penalty goal after Jordan Rapana failed to break the ten metre plane with his line drop out attempt.

Taking advantage of an error inside the Dragons half, young fullback Xavier Savage (30th minute) put the Raiders on the board by taking on the line and using the rain-soaked field to slide over out wide.

Striking a crucial blow with seconds remaining in the opening half, the home side capitalised on Nick Cotric spilling a bomb with Moses Suli (39th minute) powering over Savage to give the Dragons a 12-4 lead.

Using the conditions to their advantage following the change of ends, the Raiders made the most of multiple repeat sets with Tom Starling delivered a terrific pass to give Hudson Young (53rd minute) a clean run underneath the posts.

Failing to make the most of the opportunities due to a lack of patience and execution, the Raiders played out of their own end during the second half as a result of Hunt's instinct to kick early and often.

The Raiders had one final opportunity to score after Cody Ramsey dropped a towering bomb from Jamal Fogarty, however the Dragons managed to hold their line for one final set to run out two-point victors.

Next week, the Dragons will travel to Suncorp Stadium on Sunday afternoon to take on the Broncos, while the Raiders will have the bye prior to Origin III. **ROB CROSBY**



THE PREVIEW

The Cronulla-Sutherland Sharks have an opportunity to continue their push for a top four spot as they host the Melbourne Storm on Thursday night at PointsBet Stadium. Not only is that top four spot crucial for the Sharks, but they also have a chance at redemption after suffering a 16-point loss at the hands of the Storm earlier in the season.

After a comfortably win against the Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs on Saturday, the Sharks will be looking to extend their current three game win streak as they return home for the first time since Round 12. The Sharks were excellent on Saturday in their 12-point victory and showcased their immense talent in terrible conditions. The most eye-popping statistic from their weekend fixture is their 39.1 metres gained per set compared to a measly 29.7 metres per set by the Bulldogs. One, it highlighted the Sharks ability to charge up the field despite the torrential rain and secondly, their excellent defence which prevented the Bulldogs from gaining any territory.

This will be pivotal against the Storm in a game which could be played under rainy conditions once again, who are coming off an underwhelming performance against the Manly-Warringah Sea Eagles. A win for the Sharks would hand the Storm their first back-to-back defeats since the second and third games of the 2021 season, an incredible feat.

Former Storm premiership player, Nicho Hynes, will be pivotal this Saturday as he was against the Bulldogs last weekend. His kicking game was excellent, featuring two forced dropouts and an array of bomb kicks which led to the Bulldogs tallying only 47 kick return metres, putting the pressure on the Bulldogs from the very first tackle. If it is to rain again, this could be the tactic that Hynes looks for.

After an outstanding performance on Saturday, Siosifa Talakai is the only omission for the Sharks after being selected in the New South Wales side again, allowing Connor Tracey to come back into the fold at centre.

Meanwhile, the Storm are looking to get back on the winners list, after losing to the Sea-Eagles by six-points. However, the margin is misleading as the Storm trailed 36 points to 12 with seven minutes remaining, until a flurry of four tries in the final six minutes against an uninterested Manly defence brought them to a respectable margin on the scoreboard. Craig Bellamy would've been disappointed with the apparent ease of Manly's try scoring plays and he'll be reminding his players of that throughout the week.

The Storm have a bit to play for with a win ensuring that they hold onto second spot for another week, whereas a loss would see the Storm slide into third place as the North Queensland Cowboys have an incoming two-points due to the bye. To do so, they're going to need to improve upon their yardage game from Thursday night, averaging just 33.6 metres per set compared to the 38.9 metres per set gained by the Sea Eagles. However, it is Melbourne we are talking about, so it wouldn't be a surprise to see them back to their best, despite being without their Origin stars. They still boast the likes of Ryan Papenhuyzen, Jahrome Hughes and Brandon Smith, just to name a few. In contradiction, the Storm do field a fairly inexperienced outside back group and bench, which could be exploited by the almost full-strength Sharks.

For Melbourne, Cameron Munster will miss his second game in a row, this time due to Origin selection, giving Nick Meaney to opportunity at five-eighth with Jayden Nikorima dropping out of the side after fulfilling that role last week. Harry Grant will also be on Origin duty with Brandon Smith being named to start at dummy-half. Tryan Wishart and Jordan Grant join the bench to round out the 17.


WHO TO WATCH: On Thursday, two of the games better halfbacks will face off in an important top four battle, Nicho Hynes of the Sharks against Jahrome Hughes of the Storm. Hughes got the last laugh over Hynes earlier in the season, now Hynes can even the ledger. The 26-year-old has been exceptional in his first season at Cronulla, playing a pivotal role in the Sharks ascension into the top four. In his 15 appearances this season, Hynes has scored three tries, assisted nine and averaged a whopping 122 run metres, incredible for a halfback. Hynes will be a running threat for the Sharks as well as a kicking threat, having accumulated 17 forced dropouts so far this season, with 13 of those coming in his last seven outings.

His opposite number, Jahrome Hughes, has been just as exceptional, if not better this season. The New Zealand halfback has been immense to the Storms' success this season and showed his worth on the international stage in the Kiwis' recent victory over Tonga. Having won 49 of his last 66 NRL matches, Hughes will be searching for his 50th club win since the start of the 2020 season. This season has seen some of his finest football having scored nine tries and assisting 10 in his 13 appearances this season. 93 metres per game paired with five forced drop outs showcases the all-round ability of the 27-year-old. Without Munster and Grant, Hughes will be pivotal to a Storm victory, as he has been many times throughout the season.

FAVOURITE: The Storm are slight favourites to come away with the two points, however, they are the team more hampered by Origin selection. They did defeat the Sharks earlier in the season, which extended their current win streak over Cronulla to five games, dating back to the 2019 season.

MY TIP: With Munster and Grant out, this looks like it's going to be a very close game. This Sharks have the more well-rounded squad, but then again, the Storm hardly lose back-to-back games. With the Storm's omissions I'm tipping the Sharks in a tight one. Sharks by 4.

Brailey returns as Knights look to spring upset at home

Friday night NRL action will see the Newcastle Knights host the South Sydney Rabbitohs in what is a crucial match-up in deciding who plays finals football in just a few months time. With a deciding State of Origin match upon us, the second bye round sees only half the teams take to the field; this clash being the solitary game on Friday.

The Rabbitohs will be in good spirits on their trip North to Newcastle, coming off a very comfortable win over the 6th placed Eels last weekend. The 30 points to 12 scoreline was in part thanks to their try-scoring machine Alex Johnston, who scored a first half double for the Bunnies in front of their home fans.

But it was the return of their star fullback Latrell Mitchell that arguably had the biggest impact on the result last week. Kicking a perfect 5 from 5 conversions, Mitchell said following the game that he will not be available for NSW in Origin game 3, and that he is 100% focussed on the Rabbitohs. Named to start at fullback yet again, Mitchell's performance will again be crucial in determining the outcome of this match.

A big out this week for the Rabbitohs is their hooker Damien Cook, away on Origin duties. He's replaced by Siliva Havili in the number 9 jersey. Cameron Murry and Jai Arrow are also out, with Mark Nicholls and Jed Cartwright being named in the starting side. Injuries to Campbell Graham, Hame Sele and Liam Knight are further blows for the Bunnies, with Michael Chee Kam and Blake Taafe joining the bench.

The Newcastle Knights raced to a big win over the Titans in their last start, racking up 38 points to the Titans 12. Crossing the line plenty of times at the start of the game, Gold Coast showed some fight at the start of the second, but the Knights showed plenty of maturity to close the game out.

All 8 of the Newcastle tries were scored by their two wingers - Dominic Young crossing for 3, and Edrick Lee a huge tally of 5. With Edrick Lee off to the Dolphins at season's end, the importance of the Knights young outside backs increases significantly. Young is in incredible form, and there's no reason why that won't continue into this match. He scored his debut NRL try the last time these two teams met, back in round 14 of last year, so some good memories are no doubt attached to the Rabbits jersey that his side will be playing against.

After starting 2022 with plenty of promise, the Knights slumped to become one of the major wooden spoon contenders. But they have stayed in the fight, scrapping wins here and there, and still remain very much in touch with the top 8. Sitting in 12th and only 4 points out of the 8, a late resurgence could see a surprise finals spot fall the way of the Newcastle side, if they're up for the challenge.

A huge inclusion for the Knights is that of their hooker Jayden Brailey, who has been named to play his first NRL game of the season this weekend off the bench, with Chris Randall keeping the starting duties for now. Kalyn Ponga will be sorely missed by the Knights this weekend, out on Origin duty, but Tex Hoy will be suitable cover having played five NRL matches so far this season. Dane Gagai is also missing from the regular Newcastle side, with Bradman Best slotting into the centres in his place.

The Newcastle Knights have won just two of their past thirteen meetings with the South Sydney Rabbitohs.


WHO TO WATCH: Bradman Best has been named to return for the Knights at centre this weekend. He has made eleven appearances so far this season, before dislocating his elbow in his side's loss to the Broncos. His return is timely for the Knights, with centre Dane Gagai out on Origin duty. If Best can get straight back into his pre-injury form then the Knights outside backs will be a very intimidating force indeed.

Without their star hooker Damien Cook, Jason Demetriou has put his faith in Siliva Havili to fill the void. Playing the majority of the season as a bench forward and only occasionally being given hooking duties, Havili will need to adjust quickly. He has rarely played much more than forty minutes per game this season, so it seems unlikely that we will play the full eighty minutes, however this shouldn't be too problematic for the Rabbitohs with the utility options of Kodi Nikorima, Blake Taafe, and Michael Chee Kam all on the bench.

FAVOURITE: The Rabbitohs are the comfortable favourites to win away from home on Friday night.

MY TIP: South Sydney will be too good on this occasion. The Knights have lacked direction in attack all year, and this will only be worse with Kalyn Ponga missing. Rabbitohs by 14.

Sleepy Tigers look to pounce on jaded Eels

West's ambush of the Parramatta Eels back in Round 6 was supposed to be the turning point of the Tigers' season, and in many ways it was. It's just that with the appointment of an interim coach and only two wins since, it's clear the bus veered the wrong way.

Now on Saturday they face their western rival at Leichhardt Oval for the first time since 2013. And despite sitting at opposite ends of the table, the clash for both sides represents another fork in the road.

For the 15th placed Tigers, while their loss to the Warriors in their long overdue homecoming satisfied the majority of the code's fans, the sad reality is, the good deed did little more than edge the joint venture club closer to its first wooden spoon.

And with the Panthers and Cowboys to follow in the coming rounds, a repeat of their 21-20 CommBank Stadium miracle will go a long way to appeasing their loyal fans.

Having lost their past four by an average margin of 24 points, the problem for Brett Kimmorley is that there aren't many new alternatives left at his disposal. With only 18 points scored in the last three weeks, centre James Roberts has been axed while Adam Doueihy joins the run-on side for the first time in 2021.

Apart from the loss of Junior Paulo to Origin, the Eels are at full strength in a contest they simply must win to reignite their top four aspirations. Now sixth following recent below par efforts against Canterbury and South Sydney, the Jekyll and Hyde Eels can ill afford another slip-up against a lower ranked opponent.

Marata Niukore joins the front row while Ryan Matterson returns to lock the pack. Skipper Clint Gutherson will leave the Blues camp to fulfill his regular fullback duties.

The stats show that aside from this year's hiccup, Parramatta has a stranglehold over the Tigers with wins in seven of the last eight. And with three home games to follow, a victory in Tigertown could start a much needed surge up the ladder.

WHO TO WATCH: Eels coach Brad Arthur didn't name names when he questioned his side's individual accountability after last week's loss, but you can bet Reagan Campbell-Gillard was in the cross hairs. While the prop's 145 metres against the Rabbitohs sounds good, they paled in comparison to the 215 metres he put on the Roosters a week earlier.

Ranked second last for total run metres, the Tigers should be stronger with the return of powerful bookend James Tamou. But they'll be even better if rookie prop Stefano Utoikamanu can recapture last year's form. In an injury plagued season the boom youngster is averaging just 71 metres a week. In 2021, his 97 metres and routine ability to bust tackles earned him a place in Brad Fittler's extended Blues squad.


FAVOURITE: Parramatta are odds-on favourite, and despite their split personality, it shouldn't be a factor against a popgun Tigers line-up.

MY TIP: Everything here points towards a Parramatta victory. For Brad Arthur, it must be his worst nightmare. Nevermind the players, anything else but an Eels victory will raise questions over the coach's own individual accountability. Parramatta by 14.

Resurgent rivals face off minus Origin stars

Queensland take on New South Wales at NRL level on Sunday afternoon as the Brisbane Broncos host the St George Illawarra Dragons at Suncorp Stadium.

Returning home after back-to-back losses on the road either side of the representative weekend, the Brisbane Broncos will be looking to steady their season in order to remain in contention for a top four finish.

Producing a disappointing defensive display during last Saturday's 40-26 loss at the hands of the Cowboys in Townsville, coach Kevin Walters has been forced to make a host of changes due to injury and Origin representation.

Losing Te Maire Martin, Selwyn Cobbo, Corey Jensen, Payne Haas, Kurt Capewell, Patrick Carrigan and Thomas Flegler for the rare Sunday afternoon encounter at home, the Broncos will be relying upon Tesi Niu, Jordan Pereira, Rhys Kennedy, Ryan James, Cory Paix, Xavier Willison and debutant Zac Hosking to rise to the challenge of claiming a win without their representative stars for the first time since 2019.

Currently sitting two points adrift of the top four in fifth position, the Broncos boast a comparatively soft run home with only one match against a side ranked higher on the ladder to come over the final eight rounds of the premiership.

Coming into the contest off the back of consecutive wins over fellow top eight aspirants, the St George Illawarra Dragons will be hoping to prove their credentials as more than a one man team.

Set to be without captain Ben Hunt for the first time this season, coach Anthony Griffin has backed rookie playmaker Jayden Sullivan to wear the number seven jersey, while young winger Mat Feagai has retained his place despite failing to complete last week's 12-10 victory over the Raiders due to a knee injury.

Holding a strong record over Brisbane with five consecutive wins dating back to 2018, the Dragons have lost their past four matches at Suncorp Stadium against all teams, while winning in their past three visits to the venue against the Broncos. Sitting in eighth position with a minus 70 points differential, the Dragons face a difficult run of matches against the Roosters, Sea Eagles, and Cowboys throughout July which could make or break their chances of playing finals football for the first time in four years.

WHO TO WATCH: Under different circumstances Kotoni Staggs would be lining up at Suncorp Stadium in a blue jersey on Wednesday evening. Alas, the 23-year-old centre will instead provide a much-needed injection of strike for his club side three days earlier. Enjoying a career best season after a wretched run with injury limited the Indigenous and Tongan representative to four matches last season, the Broncos will be hoping Staggs can continue an impressive run of form that has yielded 62 tackle breaks in 2022.

Touted as a star of the future after captaining the Illawarra Steelers to victory in the SG Ball premiership three years ago, Jayden Sullivan will get a rare opportunity to play in his preferred position in the top grade. Playing predominantly off the bench or as a dummy half in ten first grade appearances to date, the 20-year-old Wollongong junior will be tasked with the immense responsibility of filling the void of the Dragons most influential player. Contracted to the joint venture for a further three seasons, Sunday afternoon looms as a pivotal game in Sullivan's young career.

FAVOURITE: The presence of Adam Reynolds contrasted against the absence of Ben Hunt looms as a huge factor in the Broncos being installed as favourites.

MY TIP: Despite fielding a vastly different line up brought on by the realities of rugby league in the professional age, the stability of the Broncos attacking structures should be too much for the Dragons to contend with in the absence of Ben Hunt. Broncos by 12.



Winner takes all in Suncorp Showdown

It all comes down to this, after two games in the series both New South Wales and Queensland are locked at one all with it all to play for in Game 3 at the cauldron that is Suncorp Stadium in Brisbane. A venue which in recent times has been an Origin nightmare for Brad Fittler and NSW.

Queensland will be looking for an immediate bounce back following a horror second half in Perth two Sunday's ago. It's safe to say that the Maroons let all their energy out defending in the ten minutes Felise Kaufusi was sin binned for deliberate slow down tactics. From the moment Kaufusi returned to the field, QLD were out-enthused and fatigued allowing the Blues to cross for three quick tries and resigning the Maroons to a win or go home third game.

After such an embarrassing loss, the question immediately asked at Billy Slater this week when browsing the NRL on Nine interviews was "what changes will be made to this side?". The media's blowtorch was focused on Dane Gagai, normally a strong representative performer has been singled out for criticism, but Slater has backed the Newcastle centre selecting him for the deciding game. Felise Kaufusi is a withdrawal for personal family reasons with Jeremiah Nanai starting. Tom Gilbert is set to be rewarded for his strong form with the Cowboys earning a debut on the bench for Billy Slater.

If Queensland are going to be competitive for a longer time period, they'll need to begin by shutting down the most powerful back three in rep football. The Triple T (James Tedesco, Daniel Tupou and Brian To'o) are meter eating machines and with all three running for over 200 meters in Perth. It's safe to say that their impact was humungous as it allowed the Blues to begin their sets in good ball territory. QLD's defence was pedestrian like and sorely missed Reuben Cotter and will be without him for the decider again. It is up to the QLD forwards to match it with the meter eaters in the NSW backline or else they're going to be trampled all over Lang Park just like they were last year when the series was on the line.

New South Wales executed a perfect game plan in Game 2 and it's easy to link it with the dominance of faces representing the Penrith Panthers. The inclusion of Matt Burton really brought this point home, Burton's execution of his torpedo bombs into the Perth skyline will be giving the QLD back three nightmares throughout training camp. More importantly, Api Koroisau gave the Blues much needed spark out of the hooker position that was missing from the opening encounter and Liam Martin answered his critics after an unusually quiet opening affair which saw him get little ball by making himself involved more and a nightmare for QLD in defence.

Outside of the Penrith players (yes that's 50% of the roster), the forwards really answered the call after being dominated in Sydney. The inclusion of Jake Trbojevic gave the Blues a rock solid defender they lacked in G1 and sealed up the gaps that allowed QLD to win the ruck. Junior Paulo provided the impact to match the intensity provided by Pat Carrigan and had a commanding performance.

Brad Fittler has chosen to make slight changes to the side that dominated the Maroons in Perth. First and foremost, it's important to note Latrell Mitchell made the brave and selfless decision to withdraw himself from Origin selection. Both Matt Burton and Stephen Crichton have been retained following strong performances. Payne Haas is out of the side due to his troublesome shoulder and Cowboys prop Jordan McLean has been rewarded with an Origin debut prop. Siosifa Talakai has been retained on the bench with Jack Wighton becoming the concussion replacement.

WHO TO WATCH: I'm going to say it right now, Nathan Cleary is a player that is unfairly targeted following a poor performance. NSW supporters took Cleary down the Mitchell Pearce route of trolling following an uncharacteristic Game One performance which saw his kicking game slightly off. But like a true champion does, he brushed himself off and pulled off one of the more commanding individual performances in Origin history. Cleary combined for two tries and eight goals for 24 individual points placing him behind fellow clubman Ryan Girdler's 30 point performance in 2000. Throw in two try assists and two line-breaks, and you have a commanding performance. Look for Cleary to be the catalyst for everything NSW does on Wednesday night with his firm command of the NSW side.

After having his "home" Origin cut short by a concussion. Kalyn Ponga will be out to prove that he can lead his side to victory. Another player that has been facing negative headlines after a controversial contract negotiation period, Ponga has faced adverse criticism this season for not being worth his salary. But when he pulls on the Maroon of QLD, he's one of the games most talented fullbacks. Ponga was the best in a beaten side in Game 2 and was close to their best in the series opener as well. Ponga's had a great series at the back setting up two tries, three tackle breaks and averaging 122 meters per match. Ponga's touches of the footy did reduce in Perth, so if QLD want to be in it to win it, KP needs to get his hands on the footy and be the focal point of the attack.

FAVOURITE: NSW are slight favourites with the bookies for the decider which is a bit of a surprise. It's a surprise because I believe we need to look at the Blues record at Suncorp, NSW have won only 34% of matches at Suncorp, only winning once since Freddy took over as coach.

MY TIP: In a winner takes all match, this is one that could really go either way. In the hostile environment of a Suncorp decider, I believe Brad Fittler and NSW have learned their lessons from the 2020 decider and will be better for the cause in this one. Having said that, it's Origin football and it's going to go down to the wire and enter the classical tales of Origin folklore, just like Freddy's side did in 2019. The only difference is, they're going to be lifting the shield in foreign territory despite the noise of a sold-out Suncorp. NSW by 4
