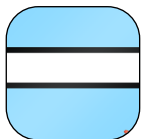

SHARK ATTACK AS CRONULLA SLAUGHTER MELBOURNE

The Cronulla-Sutherland Sharks have cemented their spot inside the NRL's top 4 with a commanding 22 point win over the Melbourne Storm with both sides missing key stars to kick off Round 17 at Pointsbet Stadium.

Both sides were short on big names due to Origin and COVID protocols but it was the Sharks who rubbed salt into the wounds of the Storm launching an aggressive attacking raid that would send Craig Bellamy into a fit of rage before the end of the first half. Cronulla kicked off proceedings when Jesse Ramien crossed for the first of his three tries. It came off a great play out to the right-hand side which engaged the sloppy Melbourne Storm defence and the rangy centre crossed for the first try of the evening.

The home side got into the spirit of Try July and their aggressive attacking raid left fans wanting more and more try celebrations. They wouldn't be disappointed when off the back of a cheap penalty, Matt Moylan engaged the defence and threw a dummy straight past an out-of-touch Ryan Papenhuyzen before linking up with Blayke Brailey to cross for the Sharks and the lead was out to 10 points rather quickly. Ramien thought he had a quick-fire double inside 25 minutes but a well-positioned Adam Gee ruled that the centre lost the ball over the line and the try was disallowed. Cronulla didn't have to wait long before nabbing a third try of the opening 40 when Moylan again turned provider putting a well-weighted kick in behind Grant Anderson and Ronaldo Mulitalo won the race to the ball before catching his centre partner with a clever post-try celebration and Cronulla were having a time of it. Braydon Trindall nailed the conversion from the sideline and Cronulla had an early cushion and Melbourne was facing deja-vu from last week's defensive disaster. Craig Bellamy would go from semi-angry to full-blown temper tantrum just a set later after Papenhuyzen was caught at marker when the Sharks shifted it right and Sione Katoa put a clever kick in behind and Jesse Ramien grabbed his double to give Cronulla a 20-0 lead at the change of ends.

If you thought the first half couldn't have made Melbourne fans any more angry and upset, the injuries added more salt to the fresh wounds. Grant Anderson left shortly after the resumption after his elbow was bent awkwardly. Worse was to come when Papenhuyzen battled through a series of injuries in the second half, but it was clear to even the most passionate of supporters that he was struggling. Cronulla was letting key attacking passages down with ill-timed mistakes and forward passes, but their defence frustrated the Storm.

This led to Brandon Smith taking out his anger on referee Gee and the referee didn't hesitate in sin-binning him for dissent. Melbourne's defence held firm while Smith was off until the final set until his return when Katoa grabbed a try off yet another slick movement involving Trindall, Moylan and Ramien before finding his winger and crossing for the first try of the second half. Ramien grabbed a hat-trick to continue Melbourne's sloppy defensive record as of late making it the fifth match they've conceded over 26 points this season making the score 28-0. Melbourne would grab a consolation try when Alec MacDonald (who was one of their best tonight) crashed over the top of Briton Nikora to reduce the margin to 22 points.

Cronulla have a big game next Friday night when they make the trip up north to Townsville to play the Cowboys, Melbourne meanwhile has a game against Canberra back at AAMI Park on Sunday afternoon. **AJ LUCANTONIO**

SOUTHS TAKE VICTORY IN ENTERTAINING AND ODD CONTEST

In one of the more bizarre games of 2022, the South Sydney Rabbitohs have taken a 40-28 victory that including 68 points, a comeback and a send-off all in front of 18,000 fans at McDonald Jones Stadium.

Weird circumstances surrounded the first try for the Rabbitohs when Cody Walker crossed after running into Tom Burgess and bumping away to get under an effort from Mitch Barnett to score. After looking certain to score, the Rabbitohs quickly got a rude shock when Dom Young turned defence into attack after saving a try tackling Nikorima from behind before a lost ball saw Newcastle counter-attack and score through Dom Young.

The Knights crossed again soon after when David Klemmer was on the spot to clean up the ball after Edrick Lee was able to tap the ball backwards and Klemmer was there to pick it up and get over. The message about not letting Edrick Lee take clean catches hadn't reached the Knights as Lee was again able to take a clean uncontested catch on the ball before getting it out to an unmarked Bradman Best to score.

Leading 16-6, the Knights looked as if they were going to dominate but the game turned on its head when a short dropout from Latrell Mitchell was regathered by Souths and the game changed significantly.

The Rabbitohs then turned the momentum big time running in three tries in ten minutes including back-to-back tries to Richie Kennar including the second coming off a pinpoint kick from Cody Walker who used the boot to take advantage of the overlap.

Souths added another try right on half-time when Cody Walker took an intercept off a poor pass from Matt Croker and raced 80m to score. Latrell Mitchell's conversion pushed Souths out to a 24-16 lead after trailing 16-6.

The Knights were left shellshocked as poor defence hurt them again when Dom Young needlessly raced 20m infield leaving space open for Richie Kennar to score his third try of the night and extend the Souths lead. Some more misfortune at the back for the Knights gifted Tevita Tatola a try and after leading by 10, the Knights were now down by 14.

Edrick Lee broke the run of Souths dominance out wide when Newcastle found their attacking groove but it wasn't to last long when the Rabbitohs were able to hit back. Poor defence again from the Knights let Jaxson Paulo muscle his way to the line when he easily could've been stopped.

The Knights were in reach of making a comeback and when Mitch Barnett crossed from close range and things looked good for the home side as they could mount a potential comeback. However, poor decision making from the Red & Blue cost them points and opportunities.

What was an entertaining contest finished on a sour note when referee Todd Smith sent David Klemmer from the field in the dying seconds after the Knights enforced dropped a cheap elbow onto a Souths player on the ground. The ensuing penalty gave the Rabbitohs an easy two points which they took to seal the 40-28 victory.

Next week, Souths head to Accor Stadium as the away team for a Sunday night clash with the Bulldogs whilst the Knights have a tough trip to Brookvale to take on Manly. **JOSH ROBERTSON**

EELS OUTMUSCLE TIGERS IN TOUGH CONTEST

In a game that won't ever go down as a good one, the Parramatta Eels have come from 12-0 down to take a 28-20 win at Leichhardt Oval over the Wests Tigers.

The Eels looked to have started the scoring inside the first five minutes when Shaun Lane thought he had crossed and despite it being awarded, the Bunker stepped in to overturn it with a knock-on during the kick contest with it being ruled Lane had knocked into Daine Laurie. A second almost certain try was disallowed this time via the touch judge who ruled a forward pass, although replays showed it was a harsh call.

Momentum had shifted to the Tigers and they took advantage of some lazy defence at marker from the Eels with Nu Brown getting his way over from dummy half to score. The Tigers then extended their lead a matter of minutes later when Daine Laurie pounced on a mistake from Clint Gutherson at the back to score and the Tigers had a surprise 12-0 lead.

A capitulation ensued from the half-hour mark for the Wests Tigers when Regan Campbell-Gillard scored for the Eels after a kick from Mitch Moses couldn't get cleaned up by the Tigers. The try had a double whammy with Tigers debutant Justin Matamua sent to the sin bin for late contact on Mitch Moses after he kicked the ball.

If you could define the Tigers but a passage of play, it was what happened leading to the half hour mark when a dumb kick from Luke Brooks put the Eels into counter-attack mode which was accelerated by a penalty. Maika Sivo took advantage of his size and powered his way to the line to score. The missed conversion saw the Tigers hold onto a 12-10 lead.

Things continued to go badly for the Tigers at the start of the second half when a lost ball at the end of the first set and put the Eels onto the attack which saw Mitch Moses take the line on and going through after showing the dummy.

Just like most of the game, the only dominant force was Chris Butler's whistle who was penalty happy and stopped either side from getting any momentum. In a poorly officiated game, there was a bright moment for the officials when Maika Sivo was denied a try by the eagle-eyed touch judge who spotted the Fijian star's foot hit the touchline and Parramatta were denied.

The Eels then finally were able to crack the line again when a Mitch Moses kick was perfectly placed for a chasing Isaiah Papali'i to get through and ground the ball.

A late comeback looked to have some potential for the Tigers when David Nofoaluma got a late dole when Luke Brooks put him into space and scored in the corner. The second try for David Nofoaluma had questions marks on the put down but was awarded. Both conversion attempts were waved away meaning that the Tigers comeback was thwarted.

BRONCOS RESILIENT WIN MARRED BY TARIQ'S MOMENTS OF MADNESS

The Brisbane Broncos paid homage to their 1992 premiership side with a resounding 32-18 victory over St George Illawarra at Suncorp Stadium despite missing 11 eligible first graders due to Origin or injury.

It was definitely a return of the 'Baby Broncos' tag today at Suncorp with this Broncos side almost looking unrecognisable to the side that took to the park last weekend against North Queensland. It was clear in the opening stages that St George would take leaps out of the Cowboys handbook of targeting a wounded Adam Reynolds, but Tariq Sims skated too close to the mark and was sin-binned inside the opening five minutes by Grant Atkins after hitting Reynolds late with "force and causing a whiplash action". Brisbane would quickly capitalise on the extra man advantage when Brenko Lee got a magical pass away to Delouise Hoeter to cross for his first try in his NRL career, a wonderful moment for a man who's worked so hard over seven seasons to reach this point.

The Dragons would hang on for the rest of the sin bin period and when Sims returned to the field (momentarily), the Saints took the lead following a wonderfully worked set play which saw Cody Ramsey fly onto a Talatau Amone pass and outpace Tesi Niu to go all the way to the try-line and with Lomax's conversion, the Dragons had a narrow advantage. Sims would earn another trip to the sin bin with 15 minutes to play in the opening stanza when he hit Rhys Kennedy with a shoulder to the head, making Sims the first player since Kane Evans to earn two trips to the sin bin in the same game, although replays suggested Sims was lucky to return this afternoon.

Much like the first stint, Brisbane capitalised almost immediately when Niu spun his way around some pedestrian Dragons defence to score and with Reynolds converting, Brisbane led by four. St George fired back almost immediately when Moses Suli continued his excellent form this season by powering past four defenders on his way to the try line and regaining the lead for the Saints. However, a cheap penalty against Zac Lomax was the catalyst for the turning point at half-time when Kotoni Staggs ran past Suli to crash over and give the Broncos a 16-12 half-time advantage.

The second half was a comedy of errors from both sides early with the half beginning with both sides kicking the ball dead giving the other a golden opportunity to convert. St George was missing Ben Hunt exponentially tonight and as good as Amone and Sullivan have been in their limited action, tonight showed that they are still incredibly raw at the NRL level and need to improve their short kicking games as well as their game management in the opposition red zone with many opportunities going astray to reduce the gap.

Hoeter grabbed his second try ten minutes into the second half finishing off a lovely set play from Niu who had his hands in absolutely everything tonight. Four minutes later, Kobe Hetherington went straight through a yawning gap before linking up with Niu before Ezra Mam finished off a lovely play to extend the margin beyond two possessions. Brisbane sealed the game off the game's following set when Reynolds and Niu linked up with Jordan Pereira down the right-wing before he kicked back in field to find Staggs who collected the footy and scored his second try. St George nabbed a consolation try in the final ten when Ramsey grabbed his second off a lovely offload from Jack Bird but it was in vein as Brisbane sealed an important win without their stars. **AJ LUCANTONIO**

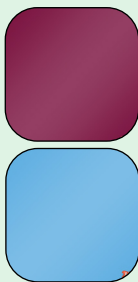

The big impact that was coming on the bench came from Jacob Saifiti and he made a lot of NRL fans eat their words with a sensational opening stint which culminated with a well-deserved try and gave NSW a six-point advantage.

Ben Hunt changed the game just on the hour mark with an excellent early tackle 40/20 kick.

From there, QLD suffocated the NSW side and the fatigue was obvious when Talakai ran sideways and lost the ball. After a few close calls, Ponga (after looking potent all night) stepped his way past four defenders and crossed to give QLD the four-point lead. NSW eventually got out of their own end, but the desperation chip from Nathan Cleary failed spectacularly and Ben Hunt ran the best part of 70 meters to seal a famous victory for QLD! Pat Carrigan was awarded the Wally Lewis Medal as the player of the series.

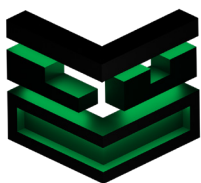

Second coming or false dawn for top four hopefuls

Two of the league's biggest improvers will face off in a precursor to finals football on Friday evening when the North Queensland Cowboys host the Cronulla Sharks in Townsville.

Undergoing a dramatic transformation few, if any, envisioned at the start of the season, the North Queensland Cowboys will be aiming to record five consecutive wins twice in a season for the first time in the club's history.

Sitting in second position on the premiership ladder, post-Origin, for only the second time in history, coach Todd Payten has named a squad boasting extensive cover for the side's contingent of representative stars.

Naming Tom Dearden, set to make his 50th first grade appearance, and Tom Gilbert to back up 48 hours after debuting in the State of Origin decider, Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow will come into the starting side in place of Valentine Holmes, while Brendan Elliot will gain a rare start with Murray Taulagi sidelined.

Holding a below average record of 11 wins from 26 meetings against the Sharks in Townsville over the years, the Cowboys will effectively confirm a return to the finals for the first time since 2017 with a win on Friday evening.

Chasing five wins in a row for the first time in four years, the Cronulla Sharks will be aiming to continue a golden run of form in recent years over their weekend opponents.

Recording seven consecutive victories over the Cowboys dating back to 2018, the Sharks have made tremendous strides under rookie coach Craig Fitzgibbon with the side positioned inside the top four, post-Origin, for the first time since Shane Flanagan was deregistered for breaching the conditions of an NRL-imposed suspension.

Riding a wave of confidence after embarrassing the Storm with an emphatic 28-6 victory at home, the Sharks will welcome back Nicho Hynes and Toby Rudolf after the pair were stood down due to testing positive to COVID on the eve of last Thursday's match.

Teig Wilton will replace suspended forward Briton Nikora on the right edge, while Connor Tracey will play his 50th NRL game with NSW utility Siosifa Talakai included on the extended bench.

WHO TO WATCH: Making a valuable contribution to the side's resurgence from bottom four perennials to premiership dark horses, unheralded forward Griffin Neame has played an unassuming, yet effective, role off the bench this season. Averaging 29 minutes of game time in 14 matches in 2022, the 21-year-old front-rower has made a steady progression through the ranks after shifting across the Tasman in 2018 before earning a place in the NRL squad until the end of next season. Catching the attention of Michael Maguire with a place in the extended New Zealand squad for last month's test against Tonga, look for Neame to put his best foot forward in a bid to represent his homeland in the World Cup at season's end.

Recruited to the club as an experienced campaigner held in rarefied esteem, the Sharks will be looking for Dale Finucane to draw upon his experience as a big game player. Featuring in six grand finals in the space of ten seasons prior to joining the club this season, the 30-year-old forward has averaged just under 100 running metres and 28 tackles in 11 appearances in 2022. Set to face off against Jason Taumalolo in a key duel between two of the premier lock forwards of the past decade, look for Finucane to provide a steady influence as the Sharks aim to make a statement in Townsville.

FAVOURITE: Despite missing several stars through injury and Origin, the Cowboys are expected to continue their strong home record on Friday evening.

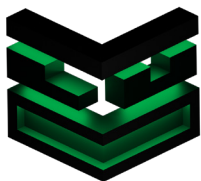

Another potential banana peel for the blue and gold

After a patchy mid-season Parramatta's quest for a top four berth (let's assume they're safely making the top eight for now) is now a key focus. Running on a W-L-W-L-W form line right now, they will want to snap that pattern to push their claims in a highly competitive group of teams vying for that all-important double chance.

In a quirk of the draw, both teams defeated the Wests Tigers in their last match. The Eels last week grinded their way past a spirited side, while the Warriors - having enjoyed the bye in Round 17 - last took to the field against the same side, recording a 22-2 win in an emotional afternoon at Mt Smart Stadium, the club's first home game dating back to August 2019.

With that emotion now dealt with, it's back to the business of closing out the year respectfully. During the week the club confirmed current Penrith assistant Andrew Webster as their new head coach for next year, which gives interim coach Stacey Jones - currently out of action with COVID-19 himself - a clearer picture for the last eight rounds.

Let's face it - short of a miracle, the NZ club won't be playing footy deep into September. Parramatta meanwhile, have been thereabouts for the best part of half a decade now but never seem to take that final step. It seems an annual question - but is this the year the Eels finally find their groove?

In team news, the Eels get Junior Paulo back from Origin duty. He comes in at prop, with Niukore moving to lock and Makatoa benched. Tom Opacic comes out of the 17 with Jakob Arthur being called up by coach Brad.

The Warriors have a mass list of changes, with COVID, injury and illness impacting them beyond coach Jones. Dallin Watene-Zelezniak, Ronald Volkman and Bayley Sironen are all out, but Reece Walsh is back. Walsh is in at fullback, with Harris-Tavita shifting to the halves to cover Volkman, and Murchie comes in for Sironen on the bench.

Parramatta's recent success means their have a solid recent record over the Warriors, having won four of the last five clashes between the sides - most recently a 34-18 victory in last year's Magic Round Brisbane.

WHO TO WATCH: It's often trite to just pick the halves - but both players wearing the 7 on Friday evening are worthy of praise over a long period of time.

Parramatta halfback Mitch Moses has been the subject of a bit of speculation in recent days, with reports the club want to sign him to a deal which would effectively ensure his career finishes at Commbank Stadium - while there are also suggestions his former club Wests Tigers might want to bring him back into the fold as well. His kicking game in particular has been elite in recent weeks, evidenced repeatedly in last week's win.

Shaun Johnson's 'prodigal son' style return to the Warriors likely hasn't gone the way he'd hoped - chatter only a month ago inferred he may not see out the season. But his performances in recent weeks, most notably in the homecoming win at Mt Smart, have helped his cause. Contracted to the NZ club until the end of 2023, the 31-year-old will want to go out on a high. A strong finish to the season should help his cause heading into next season.

FAVOURITE: Parramatta are comfortably backed to get the job done.

MY TIP: The Eels at home are an easy tip here. The Warriors should make a good account of themselves but ultimately the home side's class should get the job done. Eels by 8.

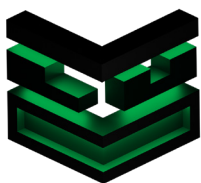

Pivotal Matchup Between Top Eight Hopefuls on Central Coast

2022 has certainly been a season of surprises, one of the most prominent being pre-season heavyweights the Sydney Roosters failing to fire a real shot in the first 17 rounds of competition. The fact that it isn't a stretch to say a Round 18 loss to the St George Illawarra Dragons would end their finals aspirations tells you all you need to know.

As for the Dragons, you'd have to grade their season as a pass mark so far. They are only outside of the top eight on for and against and can put some real distance between themselves and the Roosters/Raiders with an upset win on Saturday afternoon. Much of the credit has to go to Ben Hunt, with the Dally M leader basically carrying the Red V on his back so far.

His importance was magnified in his absence, with the Dragons laying an egg in an otherwise winnable game against the Broncos at Suncorp Stadium. It was their fifth tackle options that let them down, squandering multiple opportunities by gifting Brisbane seven tackle sets on various occasions.

As for the Roosters, it's not outrageous to say that we saw them finally come close to their best in an 8 point loss against the Panthers in Penrith. They were leading the game until the 63rd minute against the runaway favourites to take out the competition, and were doing so whilst not being at full strength, with enforcer JWH and leader Luke Keary both missing through injury. It's little consolation however - the tricolours sit at 7 wins and 9 losses and can't really afford to drop any more games cheaply like we have seen ad nauseum in 2022.

What happens in this specific matchup is anyone's guess. The Roosters are favourites, and rightly so as their ceiling is much higher, but they've proven to be unreliable at the best of times and the Dragons are a team that can take advantage of opposition who are off their game, as evidenced by their first half demolition of Souths about 3 weeks ago.

Another factor to take into account is the State of Origin decider, which may have already been played by the time you read this. The Roosters have four players taking part (Tedesco, Tupou, Crichton and Collins), while the Dragons' team carry Ben Hunt is playing the physical number 9 position. Injuries are a major factor, and they could rear their ugly head on Wednesday night, having a severe impact on this calsh. Let's hope it isn't the case.

In team news, underperforming centre Paul Momirovski has controversially been recalled to the right side of the field, allowing Joseph Manu to stay in the halves amid Luke Keary's absence. Sam Verrills is back into the starting side with Connor Watson retaining the bench in the utility role, meaning Drew Hutchison drops back to 18th man. Sitili Tupouniua returns to the second row, pushing Nat Butcher to the bench, while Jared Waerea-Hargreaves is back in for Daniel Suluka-Fifita, who has joined Souths.

For the Dragons, Mikaele Ravalwa has injured his hamstring and is out for 8-10 weeks, to be replaced by Tautau Moga, who is up against the club he made his debut for a decade ago. Ben Hunt is back, pushing Jayden Sullivan to the reserves, while Tariq Sims is out due to suspension, with Jack De Belin taking his place as lock forward. Aaron Woods is also back via the interchange bench.

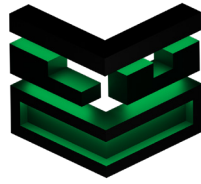
WHO TO WATCH: Joseph Manu staked his claims to be a long term member of the Roosters spine with his performance against the Panthers, with James Tedesco in a news corp article saying that he is the long term five-eighth at the club. Manu ran 17 times for 160 metres against Penrith, recording 14 tackle breaks, a try assist and a line break assist along with 2 offloads. It came after he ran for over 400 metres for New Zealand as fullback in their test match against Tonga, amidst a whole bunch of other mind blowing stats I won't bother listing here. To quote the channel nine/fox sports commentary team, he really is a footballer, and has proven he will excel almost anywhere he plays. It begs the question whether he is wasted in a low involvement position like centre, one that many Roosters power-brokers will be pondering. With another standout performance on Saturday, he may just force coach Robinson's hand.

For the Dragons, Cody Ramsey has unexpectedly emerged as the clear option as the Dragons fullback going forward, with multiple stellar performances in the custodian role in recent weeks. In terms of the eye test, he is the most dynamic player on the Dragons' roster, consistently turning half chances into threatening line breaks and assisting/scoring tries in the process. At only 22, Ramsey is all upside. Despite the heavy loss at the hands of the Broncos, he proved to be a shining light, running 11 times for 145 metres and making 2 line breaks, 6 tackle breaks and scoring two tries. Considering Ramsey likes to attack the outside backs of the opposition with his pace, look for Paul Momirovski to once again be exposed, leading to a Dragons try on the weekend.

FAVOURITE: The Roosters are 7.5 point favourites over the Dragons at the time of writing.

MY TIP: Obviously anything could happen, as evidenced by the Dragons 14-12 boilover win against the Hooks earlier this year on ANZAC day, but considering this is basically a must win for the Roosters, you have to think that they'll be up for it, despite their poor historical record on the Central Coast. Roosters by 10.

With a number of influential players expected to back up from what will surely be an intense Origin decider on Wednesday night, some of the less experienced players will need to step up for their teams to fight for the win.

After 17 rounds of play, Manly are sitting just inside the top eight. Ahead of the 9th place dragons on for and against only, every match will be crucial in their fight to play finals football. With the bye rounds over and every team on level pegging, Des Hasler's side will be looking to find some consistent form as the season winds down.

Having the weekend off last week, Manly will be rested in comparison to their opponents. They will be brimming with confidence after a commanding win over a lacklustre Storm side back in Round 16, so Newcastle will need to be wary of a fast start. Manly did drop off towards the end of their last match, letting in 18 points in the last six minutes, and they will be wanting to close out the end of this game a lot better.

With Jake Trbojevic backing up from Origin, the rest of Manly's forward pack will need to step up, and expect Davey to do just that.

FAVOURITE: Manly are comfortable favourites to see off Newcastle in front of their home crowd this Saturday evening.

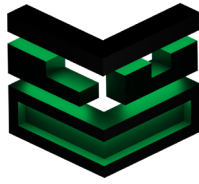

A Saturday night Queensland Derby awaits two teams with very differing fortunes this weekend as the 15th placed Titans play host to the 5th placed Broncos on the Gold Coast.

Coming off the bye this week, the Titans will be hoping that the week off will have sparked something because last years finalists have had a season that could only be described as pathetic with just three victories in 16 matches so far this season. The Gold Coast are currently sitting on a six game losing streak and need a big performance.

Prior to the bye, the Titans were comprehensively outplayed by the Knights in Newcastle falling to a heavy 38-12 defeat in the Hunter. Poor goal-kicking from Newcastle saved the Titans from an even more embarrassing loss when they looked no match for the Knights from the kick-off. The defeat raised more questions about the Titans and the future of coach Justin Holbrook and another defeat here could see the pressure reach breaking point.

The Titans have lost Jarrod Wallace through suspension after he was sent off against the Knights, Jaiman Joliffe comes onto the bench. AJ Brimson moves to fullback with Tanah Boyd into the side at five-eighth. Captain Tino Fa'asuamaleaui will back up from Origin 3 at this stage having been named at lock.

A relative surprise packet in 2022, the Brisbane Broncos put an awful 2021 behind them to come into the latter stages of the season sitting in fifth spot. The season for the Broncos has been one that has been slightly up and down with some big wins to go with some heavy losses this season against some of the top sides in the competition.

Last weekend, the Broncos were missing up to 10 key players and were considered outsiders against the Dragons but the Broncos put to bed a run of back-to-back losses to dominate the Red 'V' with a 32-18 win. 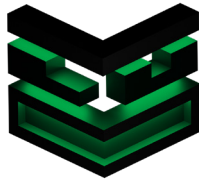

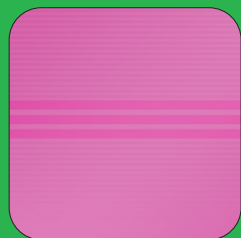

The Origin effected Penrith Panthers head out Parramatta stadium to face off against a desperate Wests Tigers team on Sunday afternoon.

Wests Tigers seem to lurch from drama to drama this season and the club sit rock bottom after 18 rounds and face a daunting prospect to avoid their first spoon in their joint venture's history.

New coach Brett Kimmorley has spun the wheel of unnecessary changes which has seen Adam Doueihi and Luke Brooks the halves pairing and one of Tigers best players in 2022 Jackson Hastings has moved into the lock position.

Add to that facing the Panthers, who have only lost once this season, with some of their stars missing is a boost for them but not much. The Tigers were valiant against the Eels but close only counts in horseshoes and hand grenades in rugby league.

There are also the whispers of Tim Sheens returning as Tigers coach so is a big game for interim coach Kimmorley as well. It all rests on the shoulders of the ever-reliable Luke Brooks turning up and that hasn't happened often in 2022.

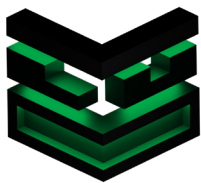
FAVOURITE: Despite not having any of their Origin representatives, there is enough talent in that Panthers side to still take favouritism into the contest.

Struggling Storm look for spark against desperate Raiders

The Storm enter Sunday's clash in unfamiliar territory, looking to bounce back after back-to-back defeats to Manly and Cronulla.

Melbourne's usually impenetrable defence has been anything but in the past fortnight, with Craig Bellamy's men leaking 64 points to fall to third spot on the ladder.

The Storm opened the season conceding just over 12 points in the first nine rounds – the kind of numbers that win you premierships – but have gone on to let in over 25 per game since Round 10.

Last week's loss also marked the first time since 2014 that the Storm have lost three games in a season by more than 20 points.

Bellamy did not seem too concerned after that defeat to Cronulla, telling reporters that the Storm simply ran into a "pretty hot" Sharks side that would not let up.

"[In the] first half I thought our effort was pretty good," he said.

"With all due respect, their footy in that first half was pretty off the charts. I thought we were in the game at 10-nil. There's some things there that we need to improve on but I just think our effort areas tonight were a lot better than last week."

Injuries had also played their role but fortunately for Melbourne there is some good news this week on that front.

Star five-eighth Cameron Munster is set to return after he was ruled out of Origin with Covid-19, seeing Nick Meaney shift to the wing for Grant Anderson.

Harry Grant has also been named to back up from Origin while Felise Kaufusi is back from personal leave to take his spot in the second row.

The Storm will be without versatile forward Brandon Smith, who has been suspended for three weeks after he was banned at the judiciary for contrary conduct.

As for the Raiders, they remain on the fringe of the top eight and have looked every bit like a team just making up the numbers in 2022.

For all the promise they showed in wins over the Roosters, Rabbitohs and Sharks, the Raiders were unable to capitalise on that momentum, dropping two of their last three games.

Canberra scraped home against Newcastle while falling short against Brisbane and St. George Illawarra, albeit in controversial circumstances.

Telling in just how frustratingly inconsistent the Raiders have been is the fact they have gone win-loss since Round 11, with their past five games decided by single digits.

The task will only be that much harder this week in Melbourne given Canberra's dismal away record this season (won two from nine).

The Raiders will be bolstered by the availability of star duo Jack Wighton and Josh Papalii though.

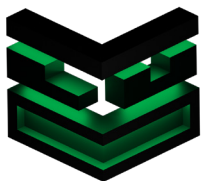
WHO TO WATCH: Ryan Papenhuyzen failed to take flight last week against the Sharks, clearly still hampered by injury as the Storm were thoroughly outclassed. It may just take one try though for the Melbourne speedster to regain his confidence and start to fire. With Munster back in the frame too there will only be more for the Canberra defence to deal with, which should free up more space for Papenhuyzen scheming out the back, waiting for his chance to pounce.

As for the Raiders, the key to winning this week's game will be up front. They have the forward pack capable of taking it to Melbourne and it all starts with Queensland prop Josh Papalii. The 30-year-old is a tone-setter, the type to lead from the front early and lift his teammates with his actions. Papalii proved it earlier this year when he crashed over for a try in the first half against South Sydney, playing a pivotal role in setting up Canberra's early dominance on the way to a big win. Melbourne is guaranteed to start fast and aggressive on Sunday, keen to atone for the past fortnight's results. It will be on Papalii to match that intensity with his carries.

FAVOURITE: The Storm are well backed to respond in a big way on Sunday.

MY TIP: It is hard to see Melbourne dropping three in a row. But then again, it was hard to see the Storm losing two straight and they did just that. Still, back at home, look for Melbourne to get a few quick-fire tries on the board early and not look back. Storm by 20.

Bulldogs looking to salvage pride against a charging Souths

The Canterbury Bankstown Bulldogs will be looking to salvage pride and respectability against a South Sydney side who's well and truly on the march to September in the final match of Round 18.

It's been an up and down season for the Bulldogs, but the Dogs post Magic Round have been one of the more entertaining sides to watch in the competition with the players seemingly getting a new lease of life under interim coach Mick Potter. Matt Burton has lived up to his reputation and has since been rewarded with an Origin birth and having the stable spine instead of the constant changing has given the four spine players a better grip on the attack, which has seen exponential improvement in the last few matches.

Last start, they ventured to the waterlogged CommBank Stadium and were competitive against a Cronulla side who are still trying to find their identity. Their attack was lacklustre but can be excused due to the monsoonal conditions. If they're going to get a win in this contest, they're going to have to win the forward battle. Souths pack is imposing especially if their origin contingent backs up following Wednesday's decider. Max King has been a shining light at prop as has Corey Waddell and Raymond Faitala-Mariner, these players can be the core that will be built around up front. They matched it through the opening exchanges of their Good Friday game until JMK's untimely sin binning, the question is can they take it to them for the full 80. As far as how they'll line up, Matt Burton is expected to back-up, Tevita Pangai Junior has recovered from a foot injury to take his place in the side and Braidon Burns returns from injury replacing Declan Casey.

South Sydney are firming for a top eight spot sitting in seventh spot, every win from here on in is a must have for the Rabbitohs on the march to September with sides like Manly, St George and arch-rivals the Roosters all on the outside looking in. It's been an in-different season for Souths following the departure of Wayne Bennett with Jason Demetriou taking the reigns and it's safe to say things haven't been smooth sailing. With a young rookie halfback and a dominant 5/8 struggling with the additional responsibility against the big clubs.

Last week however, showed that Latrell Mitchell and Cody Walker work better when they are together. With the game in the balance prior to half-time, the dream-team put together three tries in the final ten minutes of the first half to take all momentum and put the game for Souths to take and would eventually run out convincing winners in the final analysis. Cody Walker looked as comfortable as he has all season and it's down to having his mate in the number 1 jersey helping to dictate traffic around him. As good of a player Walker is, he needs the calming head of Latrell to help set the team up for success, look for these two to be scheming up a Sunday evening carve-up. Jason Demetriou has named all three State of Origin representatives to play on Sunday. The Rabbitohs also welcome back Mark Nicholls and Alex Johnston from injury for this match.

WHO TO WATCH: Despite receiving a truckload of criticism at the beginning of the season, it's easy to see why Jeremy Marshall-King was highly sought after by the Dolphins to be their inaugural number nine in season 2023. Marshall-King's running game is his strongest asset with his quick thinking being able to set him apart from the rest of the line-up grabbing three tries as well as three line-break assists and two try assists. It's a promising sign for the Dogs that the more JMK runs out of acting half, the more comfortable Burto and Flanagan feel in their respective roles within the roster.

My major question marks around South Sydney though revolve around the number one jumper and even though he's only two games back from a hamstring injury, Latrell Mitchell is yet to recapture his best. I look at all the other fullbacks in the game, guys like Tedesco, Edwards, Gutherson and Papenhuyzen, they're all carrying the ball 20-30 times a game AND are involved in their team's set-plays. Mitchell's only touching the football 24 times a game on average and for a player of his star quality, he needs to get more involved in the South Sydney attack. Look for Mitchell to assert his dominance against the Bulldogs this weekend.

FAVOURITE: Souths start warm favourites in this one. Interestingly, in the 43 matches these teams have played in the NRL era, it's the Bulldogs with the head to head edge winning 23 matches to Souths 19 with a draw.

MY TIP: It's hard to go past South Sydney in this one. There's so much more on the line for the Rabbitohs with a spot in the eight on the line. If South Sydney's origin contingent don't back up then expect the scoreline to reduce a little, but this is one that Souths simply need to win to create a gap on the teams on the fringe of the eight. Souths by 14.
