TURNING FOR HOME

ROB CROSBY WEIGHS UP YOUR CLUB'S HOPES WITH SEVEN ROUNDS LEFT OF THE NRL SEASON

With seven rounds remaining in the regular season, the race for the finals - and the dreaded wooden spoon - is intensifying.

This weekend shapes as one of the most important in the context of the entire season with four of the eight matches being contested between sides separated by two points or fewer on the premiership ladder.

Reigning premiers Penrith have all but wrapped up the minor premiership, yet the race for the top four and the battle for the final positions in the top eight will be sure to keep the home-and-away season interesting until the fulltime whistle sounds on the first Sunday in September.

At the other end of the spectrum, the Tigers and Titans will be desperate to register late season wins in a bid to get off the bottom of the table, while the also-rans will be aiming to build confidence heading into 2023.

Every minute of every game matters - where will your side finish this year?

TOP FOUR

Penrith Panthers

The Penrith Panthers could claim the largest legitimate minor premiership triumph of the NRL era given their current standing eight points clear of their second-placed rivals. Barring any serious injuries to the likes of Nathan Cleary or Isaah Yeo, the reigning premiers should be on track to defend their title on grand final day.

Run Home: Cronulla (H), Parramatta (A), Canberra (A), Melbourne (H), South Sydney (A), New Zealand (H), North Queensland (A).

Predicted Finish: Minor Premiers (1ST)

North Queensland Cowboys

Guaranteed to return to finals football for the first time since their grand final run in 2017, the North Queensland Cowboys could record a top two finish for the first time off the back of a comparatively smooth run heading into September. Set to spend the bulk of August on the road, the final round clash against Penrith shapes as a sell-out in Townsville.

Run Home: Wests Tigers (H), St George Illawarra (A), Canterbury-Bankstown (A - Bundaberg), Sydney (A), New Zealand (H), South Sydney (A), Penrith (H).

Predicted Finish: Top 4 (2ND)

Melbourne Storm

Playing five of their final seven matches on the road, including hyper partisan trips to Auckland and Penrith, the biggest challenge for the Storm will be finding form after several concerning performances. With the likes of the Bromwich brothers, Felise Kaufusi and Brandon Smith winding down their time in the Victorian capital, coach Craig Bellamy will be hoping his players can deliver on the big stage one last time.

Run Home: South Sydney (A), New Zealand (A), Gold Coast (H), Penrith (A), Brisbane (A), Sydney (H), Parramatta (A).

Predicted Finish: Top 4 (3RD)

Cronulla Sharks

Surging into form with wins over Melbourne and North Queensland in back-to-back weeks, the Cronulla Sharks will be looking for a top four hat-trick with victory over Penrith. Falling short of the finals on for-andagainst last season, a run of matches largely against also-rans should provide the side with an opportunity to pile on plenty of points.

Run Home: Penrith (A), South Sydney (A), St George Illawarra (H), Wests Tigers (A - Tamworth), Manly (A), Canterbury-Bankstown (H), Newcastle (A).

Predicted Finish: Top 4 (4TH)

TOP EIGHT

Parramatta Eels

At their best, the Parramatta Eels have the scalps to be premiership contenders. At their worst, the same team has appeared inert and inept. Having risen to the challenge against the likes of Melbourne and Penrith already this season, Brad Arthur will be banking on a difficult draw to bring out the best in his side.

Run Home: Brisbane (H), Penrith (H), Manly (A), South Sydney (H), Canterbury-Bankstown (H), Brisbane (A), Melbourne (H).

Predicted Finish: Top 8 (5TH)

Brisbane Broncos



It remains to be seen whether the Brisbane Broncos have over performed during the middle third of the season or can maintain their best heading into September. Recording enough wins to all but secure a return to the finals, coach Kevin Walters will have some selection headaches in order to find his best possible 17 in the weeks to come.

Run Home: Parramatta (A), Wests Tigers (H), Sydney (A), Newcastle (H), Melbourne (H), Parramatta (H), St George Illawarra (A).

Predicted Finish: Top 8 (6TH)

ON THE CUSP

South Sydney Rabbitohs

The South Sydney Rabbitohs have banked enough wins to make a run for the finals, but that may not be enough given their draw over the final seven weeks. Having missed much of 2022 through injury, the pride of the league will be looking for Latrell Mitchell to rise to his standing as one of the superstars of the game.

Run Home: Melbourne (H), Cronulla (A), New Zealand (H - Sunshine Coast), Parramatta (A), Penrith (H), North Queensland (H), Sydney (A).

Predicted Finish: Vying for 7th and 8th

Manly Sea Eagles

It's been hard to get a gauge on the Manly Sea Eagles in 2022. Having missed their greatest attacking weapon for all but seven games, the Des Hasler coached side has adjusted admirably, however it remains to be seen whether they can perform against quality opposition given their track record to date.

Run Home: St George Illawarra (A), Sydney (H), Parramatta (H), Gold Coast (A), Cronulla (H), Canberra (A), Canterbury-Bankstown (A).

Predicted Finish: Vying for 7th and 8th

Sydney Roosters

It's hard to fathom a side boasting the talent of the Sydney Roosters missing the finals - yet that looms as a very real possibility for the foundation club. Trent Robinson may have three premiership rings to his name, but the next two months could prove to be the toughest test of his coaching career to date.

Run Home: Newcastle (A), Manly (A), Brisbane (H), North Queensland (H), Wests Tigers (H), Melbourne (A), South Sydney (H).

Predicted Finish: Vying for 7th and 8th

Canberra Raiders

The Canberra Raiders stand the longest shot of the remaining top eight contenders - but a shot nonetheless. On paper, the Ricky Stuart coached side could make a run given their draw, however based on the form shown during the first two-thirds of 2022, it's hard to see the Raiders putting together a winning streak of more than two matches in a row.

Run Home: New Zealand (H), Gold Coast (A), Penrith (H), St George Illawarra (H), Newcastle (A), Manly (H), Wests Tigers (A).

Predicted Finish: Vying for 7th and 8th

St George Illawarra Dragons

Ben Hunt can lead the St George Illawarra Dragons to the finals - IF he remains fit. In the event Hunt faces an extended stint on the sidelines, there is a good chance the Red V will struggle to win another game - such is the influence of the Dally M front runner.

Run Home: Manly (H), North Queensland (H), Cronulla (A), Canberra (A), Gold Coast (H), Wests Tigers (A), Brisbane (H).

Predicted Finish: Vying for 7th and 8th

AND THE REST....

Newcastle Knights

It's been a bitterly disappointing year for the Newcastle Knights after the strides taken in recent years. Having struggled to find the try line early on in the campaign, the side has appeared more potent with the ball in recent weeks. How Adam O'Brien chooses to use the final seven rounds should give supporters an indication of the club's fortunes for next season.

Predicted Finish: Planning for 2023 (12TH)

Gold Coast Titans

Enduring a tragic decline from top eight finalists to wooden spoon stragglers in less than 12 months, the Gold Coast Titans should be able to pull off an upset over the final seven rounds if last week's performance against Brisbane is indicative of things to come.



HYNES SHINES AS SHARKS TAKE A BITE OUT OF TOP 4 RIVALS

A starring role from Nicho Hynes has proved the difference as Cronulla held on for a 26-12 victory against a North Queensland side missing their QLD Origin winners in Townsville tonight.

North Queensland was missing all their Queensland contingent with Tom Gilbert being the only Maroon to back up following Wednesday night, but still played a formidable line-up that stayed with Cronulla for most of the match. However, an ill-timed tackle on Ronaldo Mulitalo by Kyle Feldt set the visitors up with an early attacking opportunity and they didn't take long to execute when Matt Moylan executed a shift to the right and found try-scoring centre Jesse Ramien who continued his hot-streak to cross for the opening try of the evening.

North Queensland got themselves back into the game but as would be the case throughout the match, Cronulla would be more than happy to hold down and halt the momentum, but this would come back to bite later in the half. On the half-way mark of the opening half, Ramien burrowed his way to the line and despite Adam Gee ruling no-try, replays showed Ramien did enough to get the ball to the line and the Cowboys were looking shellshocked. Following a penalty inside their own end, the Cowboys hit back after a great catch and pass from Luciano Leilua who got it onto Peta Hiku who drew in Mulitalo and Kyle Feldt crossed for their first of the night.

A controversial late hit on Dale Finucane got the Sharks a further two points in front to lead by two possessions. Cronulla's dicing with the set restarts came back to bite when Adam Gee's patience ran out and Blayke Brailey was sin-binned, this proved costly when Chad Townsend found Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow and the Cowboys reduced the gap to two at half-time.

After a case of the dropsies went through Townsville, it appeared the Cowboys were going to take the lead when Jason Taumalolo broke through the middle and charged his way to the line. But, the bunker spoiled the fun when replays showed Reece Robson obstructed Braden Hamlin-Uele. Off the back of the penalty, a grubber from Moylan was spilt by Hampton and Teig Wilton crossed for the black, white and blue. Cronulla would seal a well-earnt win when Sione Katoa broke through a poor attempt of a tackle by Scott Drinkwater to sprint 60 meters to score, concerningly though he left the game with a shoulder injury and said he heard a pop in his shoulder.

North Queensland was far from disgraced, but they'll be better for the end-of-season games once the rest of their QLD contingent return following their rest period. Next up for the home side is a rare home Sunday afternoon match against Wests Tigers, while the Sharks take on Penrith in Penrith. AJ LUCANTONIO



RAIDERS RAIN ON MELBOURNE'S PARADE

The Canberra Raiders have produced a stirring performance to upset the Melbourne Storm in one of the games of the season.

Extending their record as the only team to boast a positive win-loss record at AAMI Park, the Raiders managed to fight back after squandering a halftime lead with little-known winger James Schiller bagging the match-winner with one of the tries of the season.

Adding to the Storm's woes, who slumped to their third consecutive loss, Ryan Papenhuyzen sustained a suspected fractured kneecap that looks set to sideline the star fullback for the remainder of 2022.

Beginning the match with a much-improved attitude following last week's debacle against Cronulla, Melbourne outside back Nick Meaney (5th minute) opened the scoring after the Raiders failed to wrap up the ball from Kenny Bromwich's grasp close to the try line.

Capitalising on an ill-timed pass from Papenhuyzen which allowed Sebastian Kris (10th minute) to streak 85 metres untouched, the Raiders hit the front with a penalty goal coinciding with Papenhuyzen being escorted from the field with a suspected fractured kneecap.

Establishing an eight-point buffer after Schiller (22nd minute) crossed for his maiden NRL try, luck continued to run with the visitors after the bunker overturned a try due to Jahrome Hughes losing control while grounding the ball.

The Storm managed to maintain the 14-6 deficit after Justin Olam produced a spectacular trysaving hit to deny Schiller a second four-pointer shortly before the change of ends.

Returning from the sheds intent on bouncing back on home soil, the Storm survived an early scare with Jordan Rapana ruled out of play while planting the ball before striking back with a try of their own through Hughes (50th minute), who made amends for his earlier blemish by taking advantage of a quick tap close to the try line.

Taking advantage of a one-man advantage after Rapana was sent to the sin bin for making head contact on Marion Seve, the Storm regained the lead with Harry Grant (59th minute) taking on the line from close range.

Securing the result with one of the tries of the season to Schiller (67th minute), the 21-year-old winger kicked ahead, ran back into the field of play and managed to ground the ball with an effort reminiscent of Parramatta rookie Krisnan Inu against the Bulldogs 15 years ago. In a frantic ending to the match, Xavier Savage and Hughes both had tries denied by the bunker which allowed the Raiders to run out 20-16 victors before a crowd of 16.106 supporters.

The match also marked the official unveiling of the Cameron Smith Stand in recognition of the Melbourne Storm's greatest player.

Next week, the Storm face the Rabbitohs at Accor Stadium on Saturday night, while the Raiders return home on Saturday afternoon to take on the Warriors. **ROB CROSBY**

Eels Look For Rare 3rd Win In A Row in High Stakes Matchup With In-Form Broncos

Neither the Eels nor the Broncos should need any help getting properly motivated for this game. With the Storm on a three-game losing streak, the winner here will be in the top-four outright for at least a day, and could stay there pending the result of the Storm v Souths game on Saturday.

It marks the start of a crucial leg of the year for the Eels. In recent seasons, they've gaines the unwanted (but warranted) reputation of fading in the later rounds, and with six out of their last seven opponents currently sitting in the top eight, the time is now for Parramatta to sink or swim.

The Broncos have a slightly easier run home, facing four current bottom eight teams, and with the way they've been playing recently with a depleted roster, you wouldn't expect lower teams like the Dragons, Knights and Tigers to trouble them much, especially at full strength.

The crucial matches for the Eels and Broncos come against each other (twice, including this game) and a home game against the Storm. If either side can win all three of those, they'd be in the box seat to land a top-four berth for the first time since 2017.

Considering, then, the importance of this game, you'd think the Eels would have no trouble getting up for it. However, they have only won 3 in a row once so far in 2022, and that was way back in Rounds 3-5, which is odd for a team on the brink of the top four.

The Broncos, in comparison, have made winning consistently a habit, going on a 7-game streak at the peak of their powers around mid-season. They, like Parramatta, have won their last two games against inferior opposition, and have done so with a bits and pieces side.

With this in mind, you'd think the Broncos would be in the box seat for this one with how much better they are at backing up their victories. However, the Eels are at home, and that is a huge advantage for them, going 5-1 in games at CommBank Stadium so far in 2022.

If it seems odd that they've only played 6 games there so far in 2022, that's because it is. As a result, 5 of their last 7 games are at the fortress out West, something which massively aides their pursuit of a top four spot.

In team news, Ryan Matterson has been named to play his first game since Round 15, starting at lock for Marata Niukore, who moves to the bench, resulting in Ky Rodwell dropping out of the 17.

For the Broncos, their origin cavalry is back among other regular starters, with Corey Oates, Payne Haas, Corey Jensen, Kurt Capewell and Pat Carrigan assuming their usual positions. Billy Walters is injured, so Jake Turpin will start at hooker with Cory Paix covering him on the bench.

WHO TO WATCH: After a shaky few return matches, Maiko Sivo returned to form against the Warriors, the Fijian Flyer reminding Rugby League fans that he is the complete package on the wing. At his best, he is a genuine game winner, and has proven as much by doing just that in the past, Round 2 against the Storm last year coming to mind where he leapt over George Jennings to catch the ball and score the winning try. His efforts last week were equally impressive, taking an intercept and showing superb awareness to draw the chasers and then pass to Waqa Blake, who scored. He was then involved in another long rang try off a kick return, outpacing the Warriors cover defence to score his 3rd try of the year. All up, he finished with the stats of 8 runs for 183 metres, a line break, a try assist, 3 tackle breaks and a try. Look for him to continue making an impact during the Eels' run home.

It's safe to say that Patrick Carrigan is the most improved player in the NRL. Fresh off winning a deserved man of the series award in origin, Carrigan will no doubt continue making the impact he's made all season for the Broncos. In the origin decider, he made 130 running metres, 2 tackle breaks, 3 offloads and, perhaps most impressive of all, 47 tackles with only 3 misses, all while only playing for 67 minutes. What's also helped Carrigan make the leap this year has been the development of his ball playing, which has added another dimension to the Broncos' attack, allowing for halfback Adam Reynolds to have much more room when organising/creating things for his side. His improvement has also helped the Broncos forward pack not be a one man band, with Payne Haas not having to do everything for his team to have a shot at winning the battle of the middle.

FAVOURITE: The Eels are 3.5 point favourites at the time of writing.

MY TIP: This obviously has potential to be the game of the round, and with both sides so evenly matched it's hard to say with any confidence who's going to win. I'll go with the Eels purely because they're at home. Eels by 6.

Last chance saloon for the Red V?

After two months, the Dragons return to their spiritual Kogarah home ground and it's a tricky one.

After a poor showing over the last fortnight which has seen them slide to 11th after spending parts of the Origin period in the top eight, home fans on Friday night will be hoping for a change in form to help their finals chances.

The biggest concern for St George Illawarra when they take to the Jubilee Oval turf will be defence. After a low-scoring slog in the rain against the Raiders in Round 16, they've since conceded scores of 32 and 54 against Brisbane and the Roosters, and if they give Manly too much of a sniff, the boys from Brookie will have little trouble in tearing them apart.

The Sea Eagles will don 1996 commemorative jerseys in Friday night's clash - a tribute to the premiership side of that year who defeated St George at the SFS on Grand Final Day. A replica result would no doubt please the visitors, who come into the contest having lost just one match from their last five and now find themselves inside the top eight.

In that run of wins, Manly has managed to score points for fun as well. Topping 40 twice - against the Warriors and Knights - their lowest score since the start of June was 26 against the Cowboys, a match they lost by two points.

They've also had the advantage of a home crowd across four of those five games - without such support this week, the question remains how they might perform.

There is mixed news on both sides of the teamlists. Tariq Sims is back for the hosts after picking up a suspension a fortnight ago which kept him out of the side's loss to the Roosters last Saturday. Moses Suli is out with an ankle injury, which sees Mbye move into the centres and Jayden Sullivan earn a recall on the bench. Aaron Woods is the player to make way.

Manly are without representative lock Jake Trbojevic, who has been struck down by COVID-19. In his place, Toff Sipley moves to lock and Taniela Paseka joins the bench.

WHO TO WATCH: It goes without saying but Queensland teammates Ben Hunt and Daly Cherry-Evans will be decisive factors in the outcome of this match.

After a his match-winning heroics for the Maroons in Game III, Hunt's performance at Gosford last Saturday was admirable but ultimately he couldn't guide the Red V to any sort of respectable result. With Jayden Sullivan nestled on the bench for this one and Moses Mbye in the backline, his link with the backline could well be a stronger one though - and their attack could improve as a result.

DCE meanwhile, was in vintage form as the Sea Eagles destroyed Newcastle on home turf last week, setting up three tries and even assuming goalkicking duties as he backed up from Origin in elite fashion. This week's challenge will be doing it all without experienced lock Jake Trbojevic laying the platform.

FAVOURITE: Manly are comfortable favourites as their form line would suggest.

MY TIP: While the Dragons will likely step up defensively for this one, knowing what's on the line, it's hard to see Manly's class giving their opponents too much of a sniff. A low-scorer awaits. Manly by 6.

Friday night Rugby League heads to the Hunter once again as the Newcastle Knights will look to emulate their round one heroics when they play host to the Sydney Roosters.

Back in Round 1, the Knights stunned many when they pulled off a surprising upset of the Roosters when the Novocastrians scored a 20-6 victory when things looked good for Newcastle. Fast forward to round 19 and the Knights have only won three games since their back-to-back wins in rounds one and two.

Last weekend, the Knights had moments of joy but were heavily defeated against Manly going down 42-12 at Brookvale Oval. The Knights were in touch with the Sea Eagles last week trailing by just 8 points at half-time but an off-the-pace second half from Newcastle saw them completely outplayed by the home side who looked a class above the Knights.

The Knights will welcome back Hymel Hunt into the starting side for his first game of 2022 while Dom Young is named in the reserves with him in doubt with a rib injury. Newcastle have named Tyson Frizell and Edrick Lee despite injury concerns though Simi Sasagi is ruled out. Kurt Mann returns to the side after missing last week.

The Sydney Roosters have had an up and down season and find themselves outside the top 8 but a big win over the Dragons last week in Gosford will give them the confidence they can potentially match the top teams still despite a mounting injury crisis.

Losing three players last week to serious injury didn't stop the Roosters as they cracked the half-century running out 54-26 winners over the Dragons. In what was a points fest, the Roosters looked impressive during the second half despite losing three players to injury. The performance showed that despite sitting outside the top 8, there is still plenty of fight in the boys from Bondi.

Injury concerns still have an effect on the Roosters team list with Luke Keary and Jared Warea-Hargreaves back into the side. Joey Manu was named despite an injury concern out of last week's contest. Matt Lodge makes his starting debut for the Roosters while Terrell May returns to the bench.

WHO TO WATCH: Having been one of the more impressive players for the Knights since joining up, Anthony Milford has played a big part in the Newcastle attack this season. Having settled his future last week with it being announced that the Samoan international will join the Dolphins next season which means that drama is over. Milford needs to have a big game if the Knights want to get past the Roosters

A lot of pressure has been placed on Sam Walker's shoulders in recent weeks trying to get the Roosters out of their form slump without key playmaking partner Luke Keary. Walker has been quiet in his performances this season and to me personally has been on the disappointing side and needs to step his game up for the Roosters to get over the Knights.

FAVOURITE: The Roosters are considered heavy favourites for the contest which may not be the case come kick-off time.

Ricky's Raiders fight for finals footy heats up

Saturday afternoon sees the Canberra Raiders host the New Zealand Warriors in what could be a crucial match in deciding the final few top eight spots. With the Raiders sitting in 10th position, and just one win outside of the finals spots, they will be hopeful of forcing their way back into the finals series after an absence last season. The Warriors, despite being only two spots behind Canberra in 12th, are all but out of the finals charge, with four wins separating them from the 8th placed Sea Eagles.

The Canberra Raiders are coming off a very important away win against Melbourne last Sunday. Winning by four points in a game that went down to the wire, the fact that Canberra were able to close out the match will be encouraging to both their players and fans. Having struggled to play a full 80 minutes of football so far this season, their trip to Melbourne showed encouraging signs on that front

Raiders fans have been having a nerve-wracking past month or so, with all of Canberra's last five games being decided by six points or less. Furthermore, two of their last three games have been decided by just two points. As such, expect another close one this Saturday, but in a finals race that will likely come down to for and against, every point counts for both sides, and the Raiders will be hoping to improve their current points difference of -37.

Nick Cotric makes his return from injury for the Raiders, replacing the suspended Jordan Rapana. An ankle injury to James Schiller on the other wing opens up a spot for Albert Hopoate. But the biggest in for the Raiders is that of their captain Elliott Whitehead, who will start in the back row after missing last week.

The New Zealand Warriors returned home to their fans in Auckland at the start of a month, where they recorded a resounding victory over a dismal Wests Tigers. They then had the bye, and thus the week off, and arriving at Parramatta to face the Eels last weekend there seemed to be a certain air around the team that their arrival home could signal a change in fortunes for the club.

But it was not to be. A fast starting Eels team got a comfortable lead early on through a Waqa Blake double, and from there the Warriors never looked like winning. If the Warriors had any hope of playing finals football this year, the team and the club needed to keep the momentum gained from their emotional homecoming. Momentum that seems all but lost following their ten point defeat to the Eels last Friday.

That being said, anything can happen in the NRL. With just seven games left in the season, the Warriors would need a miracle to make the eight. But as long as there is still hope, even if it's just mathematical, the Warriors, who have gone through so much hardship during the past few years, will be fighting for every point. They will be desperate to find a way to win down in Canberra this Saturday.

In big team news released on Tuesday afternoon, Reece Walsh has been dropped to the bench by Warriors interim coach Stacey Jones. The young fullback will have the number 14 on his back this weekend, with Chanel Harris-Tavita shifting to the starting fullback role. Cowboys recruit Daejarn Asi will start in the halves alongside Shaun Johnson, and Dallin Watene-Zelezniak returns on the wing.

The last time these two teams met it came down to a Shaun Johnson field goal in golden point. Canberra will need to be in on their game to avoid another upset loss like what happened back in round 8. The Warriors will be hopeful of beating the Raiders for a second time this year, something they haven't done since 2018.

WHO TO WATCH: Following the early season injury to Raiders hooker Josh Hodgson, it seemed almost set in stone that Tom Starling would have the starting number nine duties for the rest of the season. But this weekend he will come off the bench for the 11th straight game, with Ricky Stuart opting for young Zac Woolford yet again. The two are fighting for that dominant hooker role, and are joined in that fight by utility Matt Frawley and even 21 year old Adrian Trevilyan. With the season winding down, every player will want as many minutes as possible, and the performances of the two hookers included in this Raiders side will be crucial to not just their teams chances this weekend, but also their careers going forward.

Daejarn Asi has been named to play just his 5th NRL game of the season this weekend, placed in the five-eighth role over rookie half Ronald Volkman. Having started the season at the North Queensland reserve grade side Mackay Cutters, he made a mid-season move to the Warriors. Making his club debut in their win against Canberra back in round 8, he played a further three more NRL fixtures before being moved back to the Warriors reserve grade side, the Redcliffe Dolphins. He will be eager to prove this weekend that he deserves a spot in the first grade side going forward.

FAVOURITE: The Canberra Raiders are the strong favourites to get the win at home this Saturday afternoon.

MY TIP: Coming off a win against Melbourne, the Raiders will be full of confidence, and rightly so. Raiders by 20.

Top 4 battle as the Sharks travel to the foot of the mountains

It's a top four battle as the high flying (and well rested) Penrith Panthers go head to head with fellow top four compatriots the Cronulla Sharks at Bluebet Stadium on Saturday evening.

It's at the point where the writers are running out of superlatives to describe Penrith over the last three seasons. They've just been out of this world in terms of preparation and executing their game plans no matter the opposition that is placed in front of them. But, if this season's shown us anything, there are signs that Penrith can be beaten as evidenced by the Roosters a few weeks ago. It's been a challenging year for Ivan Cleary battling complications from a knee infection, but Penrith continue to perform in his absence this season which is a testament to their professionalism.

Last week was really an outlier in Penrith's strong season hanging on against rivals the Wests Tigers. But it's of my firm belief that this tough victory will be of benefit to the guys that are regular first graders. As it showcased that even when they are off, they can grind out a hard fought victory. They leaned heavily on James Fisher-Harris, Villiame Kikau and the people's champ Dylan Edwards to get the victory. It's going to be a challenge to see how Penrith's NSW brigade respond after a disappointing result in the decider, the week off would've helped them immensely but their run into the finals is only getting tougher. All of the NSW stars rested last week are back and named to start, Matt Eisenhuth and Mitch Kenny go back to the bench after starting last weekend.

This week sees another tough test come their way in the shape of Cronulla. The Sharks have proven they can compete with the top clubs, going toe to toe with Melbourne earlier down in the fortress of AAMI Park. Craig Fitzgibbon has gotten a lot out of his brigade in his rookie season as coach, with the Sharks playing an exciting brand of attacking footy which has made Nicho Hynes one of the game's more attacking playmakers and rediscovered Matty Moylan's best form.

Last weekend they took a tough road trip up north to Townsville and held on for a tough and tenacious victory over the most improved side in the competition. The key was definitely their forward brigade with Toby Rudolf and Dale Finucane playing key roles to power over the top of the opposition. This week though, the pack face their biggest test taking on a full strength Panthers pack with Martin and Yeo keen to put their Origin heartache behind them. Cam McInnes has proven to be an energiser bunny off the bench and will be going against Penrith's impact man Scott Sorensen. But the main task for Cronulla's pack is stopping Penrith's effective back three from gaining meters coming out of yardage, if they can contain Edwards, To'o and May it'll go a long way for victory. Sione Katoa hurt his shoulder in scoring the game sealing try last weekend, this is offset by the fact Siosifa Talakai will return after being rested last week, Mr Fix It Connor Tracey will slide onto the wing and continue his good form. Briton Nikora's return from suspension sees Teig Wilton revert to the bench and Jesse Colquhoun move to the reserves.

WHO TO WATCH: Is there a more consistent fullback this season than Dylan Edwards. After being considered the 'handbrake' of Penrith's attack in 2020-2021, the improvement in Dylan's game this season is second to none. His numbers in 2022 only speak for himself with the fullback averaging 220 meters a game as well as six try assists and six tackle breaks which has definitely placed him in the upper echelon of fullbacks in the NRL this season. Taking on more of a leadership role this season with a young backline, Edwards has stood up to the plate and is reaping the rewards of Penrith's strong season.

This is Cronulla's biggest test this season and it's going to show how far their rebuild has come. So if they want to win, it's going to have to come from Nicho Hynes. Hynes has been immense in his first season in the shire and wearing the number 7. It's safe to say that Nicho has smashed every expectation placed upon his shoulders scoring three tries, setting ten tries up as well as seventeen line-break assists. What's been the biggest strength has been his short kicking game, with the ability to place his kicks in the right place at the right time forcing 19 dropouts. Coming up against a strong Penrith defensive unit, Hynes' kicking game could be the difference for the black, white, and blue.

FAVOURITE: Penrith (at home) are short-priced favourites with the bookies. Cronulla haven't won at BlueBet Stadium since 2018 when Matt Moylan returned home to stun his former team 24-12 in Round 18. Since then though, the Sharks haven't been able to win in Penrith (like most NRL clubs).

MY TIP: It's rare to see Penrith put together two bad performances in a row. But, with Cronulla in a good patch of form looking to cement a spot inside the top four it's going to be a close encounter. However, I'm of the opinion that Penrith are going to begin their charge to the finals on the right track and place one hand on the J.J. Giltinan Shield, but it won't be easy against a determined Cronulla outfit. Penrith by 10

The Melbourne Storm attempt to end their losing streak as the defending minor premiers head to Sydney to take on the in-form South Sydney Rabbitohs.

The Storm suffered their third straight defeat for the first time in seven years after a narrow four-point loss to the Canberra Raiders on Sunday afternoon. If the loss wasn't painful enough, a season ending injury to Ryan Papenhuyzen would've left fans in despair after he fractured his kneecap during the first half of the game. It hasn't been a pleasant three weeks for Craig Bellamy and his side, as they've slipped from their cushy second place into fourth with the Broncos, Eels and Rabbitohs hot on their heels. This makes Saturday's game all the more important as they look to retain their spot in the top four. There were some signs of improvement for the Storm, who looked more threatening than they have over the past few weeks, breaking 43 tackles and making six line breaks as they did their best to break through the scrambling Raiders defence. However, the usually pristine defence of the Storm has slipped, conceding 20 points or more in each of their last four matches as they now boast the fourth best defence in the competition. This is by no means poor in relation to the rest of the competition, but by Melbourne Storm standards, this slip in defence is alarming. As is their record against the three teams that sit above them. Penrith and North Queensland defeated Melbourne convincingly in their only matchups this season, whilst the Cronulla Sharks responded from their loss to the Storm earlier in the year with a win of their own in Round 17. A combination of injuries and a lack of experience and chemistry in the back five have left the Storm thin and are a potential cause for their slip in defence. The back five have been made even thinner with the loss of Papenhuyzen and they face a tough challenge this week, coming up against a firing outside back group led by Latrell Mitchell. This leaves an even bigger load for the halves and forwards to carry and they'll no doubt look to their stars in the number six, seven and nine jersey to turn things around this week, which they are more than capable of doing. With

The Rabbitohs have been on a point scoring tear in recent weeks, scoring 30 points or more in five of their last six games. They've won all five of those games with the only loss coming at the hands of the St. George Illawarra Dragons who destroyed them in the opening half. However, their attack has look superb since the return of Latrell Mitchell in Round 16. The 25-year-old fullback has scored a try, assisted five and broken 22 tackles in his last three games and he'll no doubt prove to be a handful for the Storm outside backs as he looks to push the Rabbitohs up the competition ladder. It took all of Mitchell's talent and a hat trick from Alex Johnston to give the Rabbioths the victory on the weekend after the Canterbury Bankstown Bulldogs nearly came away with an upset victory. Three tries in the final ten minutes ensured the Rabbitohs would keep their neat form up as they hunt for an important top four spot. A win this weekend against the current fourth placed side would do them a world of good in that hunt. The return of Damien Cook and Cameron Murray will no doubt help their cause and add extra strength to an inform forward pack. A member of that forward pack who has been exceptional over the past two months is Tevita Tatola who has become an even more valued member of the Rabbitohs over the course of the season. The 25-year-old middle forward has eclipsed 150 running metres in five of his last seven starts including a mammoth 234 run metres, 82 post contact metres and 33 tackles in their victory over the Bulldogs on Sunday. Tatola was great in Souths' earlier meeting with the Storm racking up just shy of 150 run metres in their golden point loss which will give Souths' the confidence that they can one up their opponents this weekend. However, their defence this season has been leaky, conceding 20 points or more on eight occasions and that'll be something that the Storm look to exploit. With the return of Cook and Murray, Taane Milne and Daniel Suluka-Fifita return to reserve grade as Jed Cartwright move

WHO TO WATCH: This could be one of the most exciting matches of the round given the talent on display, particularly in the spine. Both sides' number sixes are two of the best at their craft and will no doubt be ready to trade metaphorical blows this Saturday. Cody Walker, the Bunnies' six, has been in great form over the past three weeks, scoring three tries and assisting a further four, having played a large role in his sides' victories in those three weeks. The former Blue took some time getting accustomed to playing next to rookie halfback Lachlan Ilias after years of playing alongside Adam Reynolds. After a poor performance against Melbourne earlier in the year, Walker will be licking his lips at the opportunity to secure the two-points against the defending minor premiers. His opposing five-eighth was once again elusive in their loss to the Raiders on the weekend, breaking four tackles and running for 180 metres. After missing out in Queensland's Origin victory due to COVID-19, Munster will be searching for his first win since Round 15. Munster has been exceptional this season and is regarded as one of the best players in the game and his numbers back it up. Seven tries, 12 try assists, 66 tackle breaks and 133.6 running metres per game for the Queensland six in his 12 appearances this season show why he's one of the best. Not to mention his man of the match performance in Origin Game 1 which gave the Queenslanders the 1-0 lead. Hopefully we get to see the best from both of these exciting players this Saturday night at Accor Stadium

FAVOURITE: Melbourne are slight favourites for Saturday's clash against the Bunnies' despite their current losing streak. The Storm have a current seven game win streak over Souths' dating back to 2018. The Rabbioths have only defeated the Storm in five of the 31 matches between the two sides and lost earlier in the season in golden point.

MY TIP: This one is hard to tip given the form of the Bunnies' and the fact that the Storm must snap this streak eventually. The loss of Papenhuyzen will hurt the Storm but if Munster, Hughes and Grant can all perform, it'll be tough for the Rabbitohs to win. Mitchell does have a history of kicking clutch field goals against the Storm and he might be required to do so again on Saturday. Storm to snap the streak. Melbourne by 2.

A must-win contest of a different kind

The desperation to avoid the wooden spoon will provide the Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs and the Gold Coast Titans with plenty to play for during their Sunday afternoon encounter at Commbank Stadium.

Sitting two points clear of wooden spoon territory with a for-and-against differential superior to their closest rivals, the Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs will be determined to keep the points flowing on home soil

Holding a six-point lead before conceding three tries in the final ten minutes to go down 36-28 to South Sydney last Sunday, the Bulldogs have improved considerably in attack following the appointment of Mick Potter as interim coach two months ago.

Averaging a touch over four tries in their past seven matches after managing less than two per game during the first ten rounds, the Bulldogs have named an unchanged line-up, including Josh Addo-Carr, who was initially feared to be sidelined for the remained of 2022 with an ankle injury.

Staring down the prospect of a third wooden spoon in 16 seasons as a top flight team, the Gold Coast Titans will be hoping the strides made last week culminate in a rarely sighted victory away for home.

Narrowly going down to crosstown rivals Brisbane in a contentious 16-12 tussle at home, the Titans have won only one of their past 13 matches and last tasted victory outside of Queensland in July last season.

Winning four of their past five matches against the Bulldogs, coach Justin Holbrook has recalled captain Tino Fa'asuamaleaui to the starting side with Jayden Campbell named on the bench for his first appearance in six weeks.

WHO TO WATCH: Finding his feet at Belmore after a slow start to the season, Matt Burton will be out to settle a personal score with a team victory on Sunday afternoon. Coming into contact with Queensland forward Tino Fa'asuamaleaui during a fiery scuffle during the deciding State of Origin encounter, the 22-year-old New South Wales rookie will be focussed on letting his football do the talking when the pair face off at club level. Producing 11 try assists, 11 line-break assists and 16 forced drop outs in his first season as a fulltime NRL five-eighth, Sunday will see Burton bring up his 50th appearance in first grade.

Biding his time in the Queensland state league for the first two-thirds of the season, late bloomer Aaron Booth made an immediate impression in his club debut last weekend. Producing 42 tackles and forcing a line drop out in 60 minutes of action against the Broncos, the 26-year-old hooker will be aiming to hold down the number nine jersey and earn a new deal beyond this season. Making six appearances over two years with the Storm before heading north in pursuit of regular game time, look for Booth to make a case to be the side's long-term hooker over the final seven rounds.

FAVOURITE: Bulldogs are expected to have too many points for the Titans and move four points clear of last position.

MY TIP: While both teams showed plenty of promise, despite suffering defeats, last weekend, the Bulldogs renewed attacking flair coupled with the Titans inability to perform on the road should result in a clear cut outcome. Bulldogs by 16.

THE PREVIEW

with Andrew Jackson

The last time the Cowboys and Tigers faced off in Townsville, they were sitting in 14th and 13th position on the ladder respectively.

That was only late last year. A lot has changed since then.

North Queensland has emerged as a genuine premiership contender this year, sitting in second and looking all but guaranteed a spot in the top four, save for an end-of-season collapse.

Last week's loss to Cronulla will likely be just a mere speedbump for Todd Payten's men, who are proof that wholesale changes are not always needed to produce results on the field.

The Tigers, on the other hand, are no longer spearheaded by Michael Maguire but they are still mired by mediocrity, constantly confusing their fans with where the team is actually going.

For now Brett Kimmorley is the interim coach while Luke Brooks and Adam Doueihi make up the halves pairing, with Jackson Hastings at lock forward.

Having a serious competitor and ball-playing option in the middle like Hastings certainly adds an extra element to the Tigers' attack, but is he really the long-term solution there?

Or will Hastings move to halfback eventually when the club finally admits Luke Brooks is not the answer?

Sure, Brooks is not the only issue but it looks increasingly likely he will be moved on before next year provided the Tigers find an interested suitor and are willing to chip in from their own pockets.

Yes, this is a preview of this week's game with the Cowboys but with their season over, the Tigers really need to be planning for next year and naming Brooks at halfback is further proof that is not happening yet.

The Tigers scrambled well in defence last week in their 18-16 loss to an undermanned Penrith, although Kimmorley would have been bitterly disappointed with the way his side opened up in the first place.

They only had to scramble so hard because the Panthers kept finding gaping holes through the middle, ones that a full-strength Cowboys side will punish them for.

Queensland trio Valentine Holmes, Tom Dearden and Jeremiah Nanai all return this week while Murray Taulagi (COVID protocols) is also back.

Nanai's return sees former Tiger Luciano Leilua move to prop while Jamayne Taunua-Brown shifts to the bench.

Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow is also on the interchange with Ben Hampton, Connelly Lemuelu and Tomas Chester are the men to drop out of the team named for last week's loss to the Sharks.

As for the Tigers, James Roberts and David Nofoaluma (both illness) have been named on the reserves and could return.

Brent Naden is locked in to come back on the wing after serving a four-game suspension while Tyrone Peachey and Alex Seyfarth have been named on the bench.

James Tamou is a fresh face in the starting team with Zane Musgrove back to the interchange.

WHO TO WATCH: Given how vulnerable the Tigers were through the middle last week, look for Jason Taumalolo to wreak havoc on Sunday. Taumalolo already showed in his disallowed try against Cronulla just how destructive he can be close to the line, regardless of how many defenders you put on him. If the Cowboys are able to get a roll-on and Reece Robson gets out of dummy-half with plenty of space to work with, look for Taumalolo to cause all kinds of issues. If he plays enough minutes, lock Taumalolo in for another 150-plus metre performance.

Once again, all eyes will be on the Tigers' halves situation and in particular how Jackson Hastings plays. Sure, he was named at lock last week but Hastings still had to do plenty of work organizing the side – the sort of responsibility that is usually reserved for the halfback. Instead, Brooks and Doueihi operated as if two five-eighths on different sides of the field. It is not a sustainable system given how much work Hastings has to do in the middle of the field. It will be interesting to see if anything changes this week, be it Hastings being able to play more like a ball-playing forward or Brooks taking on more responsibility himself.

FAVOURITE: The Cowboys are well-backed to take the win.

MY TIP: the Cowboys are in a mood they could run up 60-plus points - that is how bad the Tigers' defence is. It may not be that bad but North Queensland will still win this quite easily. Cowboys by 36.
