



DRAGONS SURVIVE TITANIC COMEBACK SCARE TO BOOK GF SPOT

The St George Illawarra Dragons have survived a late scare to make their second NRLW grand final following their 24-18 victory over the Gold Coast Titans at Leichhardt Oval.

Things started brightly for the Gold Coast when the veteran Steph Hancock was able to wrong foot the Dragons defence to get through and score close to the uprights. The conversion from close range gave the Titans a 6-0 lead.

Ill-discipline saw any dominance that the Titans were able to develop disappeared and the Dragons who themselves had some very questionable moments in attack, started to take

control. The Red 'V' opened their scoring through Madison Bartlett after some good work put over in open space in the corner.

They may have trailed by 2, but momentum stayed with the Dragons as Emma Tonegato scored after the Dragons surprisingly (for this game) kicked the ball on the last and the Dragons flyer was able to get the ball down.

Discipline didn't improve for the Titans early in the second half and it continued to cost them when the pressure continued to mount and Jaime Chapman took advantage to hurdle defenders and get over the line. The Dragons soon after extended their lead through a penalty goal off the boot of Rachael Pearson.

The Dragons then put the game to what everybody thought

was beyond doubt when Keeley Davis was able to get a short grubber kick away for the second time in the match but this time, she was able to chase through and ground the ball first.

If the game was beyond doubt, then nobody told the Titans as they created a remarkable final five minutes when Jasmine Peters got the green lights from the bunker after the Titans effort was initially ruled no try live on field.

Steph Hancock got the Titans their grandstand finish as she somehow got inspector gadget arms out to reach for a kick that was bouncing awkwardly for everybody. The conversion was successful and the Titans closed the gap to 22-16.

The Dragons move to their second NRLW grand final, whilst the Titans will reflect on a successful debut season.

ROOSTERS MIRACLE STRIKES AGAIN AS BRISBANE BUNDLED OUT

The Sydney Roosters have pulled off one of the biggest Rugby League upsets in recent times as they came from 16-0 down to snatch a 22-16 victory over the Brisbane Broncos to book their spot at the NRLW Grand Final.

Things didn't start well for the tricolours as an early error put the Broncos into good attacking position and even though it took a couple of minutes, the Broncos put their dominance onto the scoreboard as Amber Hall was able to get her way over the line.

It was a rolling disaster for the Roosters as Julia Robinson scored a try on her return after the Broncos took advantage of an overlap on the left and scored out wide. Lauren Brown's conversion from out wide was a beauty and she pushed the lead to 10-0.

Things were getting bleaker for the Roosters as Olivia Kernick was given 10 minutes in the sin bin by referee Belinda Sharpe for a professional foul and the Broncos took advantage of the overlap when Millie Boyle was impossible to stop from close range after Chelsea Lenarduzzi created the space with a good run and offload.

Finally getting some possession, the Roosters started to create some momentum and despite their first attacking ending with an error, the Tricolours found space out on the left when Raecene McGregor got a good offload out to Isabelle Kelly who scored.

The Roosters well and truly got the momentum turned in their favour and they added a second try shortly before halftime when Corban Baxter was able to get Leianne Tufuga space on the outside after a beautiful cut out pass. Temara's conversion pushed the scores back to a converted try at the break.

Things didn't start perfectly for the Roosters in the second half with poor kicking decisions and errors costing the Roosters good field position but thankfully it didn't hurt them too

much. The Roosters were able to score with fifteen minutes remaining although it came with a touch of confusion when Keilee Joseph was awarded a try on field and it seemed to have been confirmed by the bunker until referee Belinda Sharpe was asked to refer it up. The bunker ended up confirming the try after a few more replays leaving everybody confused but the subsequent conversion was good and scores were level.

Momentum was well and truly with the Roosters and Jocelyn Kelleher took advantage as she saw space out of dummy half and she got over to score and following the conversion the Roosters held an unlikely 22-16 lead.

The Roosters had ten minutes left to defend solidly and although they weren't perfect in their gameplay, they did enough to hold off a Broncos side who seemed to struggle and were devoid of ideas in the final 10-minute period and the Roosters held on.

After sneaking into the finals miraculously, the Roosters will be confident they can go onto win the big one following their win over the Broncos as they take on the Dragons.

THE PREVIEW

History will be made in Redcliffe on Sunday afternoon when either the St George Illawarra Dragons or the Sydney Roosters become NRLW Premiers for the first time since the competition began back in 2018.

The St George Illawarra Dragons have been a surprise packet this season (well to me at least) as they went on to finish second on the NRLW ladder for the 2021 season and it was their consistency through the season that made them dangerous contenders this year. The Red 'V' won four of their five matches during the regular season which saw them only fall to a narrow defeat against the Broncos when heavily under-strength.

Last weekend was hardly a vintage performance by the Dragons who started slowly trailing 6-0 early before getting back into the game thanks to the ill-discipline of the Titans which allowed the Dragons to build momentum. The Dragons attack though looked disjointed at times as they repeatedly failed to get away last tackle kicks both during the first and second half. The Red 'V' were able to open up a 22-6 lead despite their attacking flaws and only just thwarted a miraculous comeback to hold on 22-16.

The Dragons have announced an unchanged 17 from the one announced last week, but as has been the case there have always been late changes from coach Jamie Soward so it is highly unlikely the 17 names will be the 17 that takes the field.

With their season looking over, the Sydney Roosters needed a miracle to even get into the NRLW finals and when the Broncos thrashed the Eels in the final round, it was the miracle that the tricolours needed. Making the finals though meant that the inconsistent Roosters had to come up against the Broncos who were coming off a big win and were the minor premiers looking to go into their fourth straight grand final.

Needing a miraculous victory, things started terribly for the Roosters as the Broncos were quickly dominating the game and went to a 16-0 lead after just fifteen minutes with things looking very bleak for the Roosters as they had a player in the sin bin as well. A try on the twenty-minute mark swung momentum back to the Roosters and then a try just shy of half-time showed that the Roosters weren't quite out of the contest. Momentum was truly with the Roosters and a try to Keilee Joseph on the fifty-minute mark got the Roosters level after the conversion and then with 10 minutes to go the tricolours hit the front as Jocelyn Kelleher got over to score and the Roosters lead 22-16.

The Roosters have been given a boost with prop Sarah Togatuki free to play after having a Careless High Tackle charge downgraded at the Judiciary but otherwise it's the same 17 that was named last week by coach John Strange.

Who to watch: With doubt over her return for the 2022 season of NRLW, Emma Tonegato will be looking to potentially end her return to Rugby League on a high as the Aussie women's 7 star has been a key player for the Dragons. Tonegato has been dangerous all year and her experience on the biggest stage in Rugby 7s could help a young side out.

As the only player to have won an NRLW premiership out of either side, Raecene McGregor's grand final experience will be a key factor for the Roosters looking to pull off another miracle. McGregor is one of the games best players and she was an important part of the Tricolours comeback last weekend. Having the experience in a winning grand final side, will be a big boost to the Roosters this week.

Favourite: The Dragons are considered favourites for the contest

My tip: In a game that could go either way, I'm leaning towards the upset and the miracle result for the Sydney Roosters this weekend. Their performance against the Broncos was very strong in that second half and they handled the pressure extremely well. The Dragons are going to be tough to beat but some of their play last week was a touch concerning and if halfback Rachael Pearson isn't 100% fit then there are some concerns. It will be a close game but Roosters might just have an edge. **Roosters by 4.**

SUPERB SHARKS SEE PAST SCRAPPY KNIGHTS

The Cronulla-Sutherland Sharks have turned in an impressive performance to improve to 3-1, while their opponents the Newcastle Knights have lost their 2nd straight match.

There were winds of 65 kilometres per hour at Pointsbet, and it showed from the opening siren as the kickoff sat up for the Sharks to immediately go on the attack. Nonetheless, the Knights were able to see off their initial raids and the contest developed into an arm wrestle over the first 25 minutes or so.

The deadlock was finally broken in the 27th minute when the milestone man Aiden Tolman miraculously got over the line first in his 300th. His crash ball effort close to the line brought him up to a whopping average of 0.053 tries per game in his career, while also joining the 21% of 300 gamers who score a try in their 300th game.

With Latrell Mitchell getting involved, Souths had to be next to score, and off the back of Latrell's quick hands, Alex Johnston found space and linked up with Cody Walker who crossed for a vital try. Mitchell's conversion cut the margin to 8 points and the game was there for South Sydney to take. But once again, the Bunnies made too many mistakes, and off the back of a mountain of defensive work, Jarome Luai skipped and danced around the South Sydney defence before putting boot to ball and finding returning back-rower Liam Martin to put the game beyond doubt at 26-12.

Dylan Edwards' defensive efforts were the main highlight of this match with not one, but two incredible try savers stopping certain South Sydney raids on Penrith's line, going a long way to ensuring the Panthers retained their long-term undefeated record at Bluebet Stadium - a venue they haven't lost a game at since July 2019..

WARRIORS CLAIM BACK TO BACK WINS OVER PITIFUL BRONCOS

The New Zealand Warriors have claimed back to back victories for the first time since July last year, downing the Brisbane Broncos 20-6 in a controversial clash at Moreton Daily Stadium.

The 'home' side welcomed back big-name signing Shaun Johnson and his impact was immediate when he threw a lovely ball to Jesse Arthars who ran a perfect line to cross against his old club and give the home side a perfect start. Thomas Flegler would go on report four times in this one and his wrap sheet started in the seventh minute for a hip-drop tackle. Brisbane would later settle into the contest forcing mistakes out of the Warriors' side with bone-crunching defence. However, their execution left a lot to be desired. With two minutes to play, Jake Turpin was sin-binned for a blatant slow down of play which denied a 'captain's challenge' from Adam Reynolds. Walsh had another gift of two points and the Warriors secured back to back victories.

New Zealand face a tough test next weekend taking on the in-form Cowboys back at their home away from home in Redcliffe, while the Broncos take on the Roosters in what will be a vital match after their recent run of form (two straight losses).

PERFECT PAPHUYZEN SENDS OUT A STORM WARNING

A four-try haul from Ryan Papenhuyzen has seen the Melbourne Storm bounce back in a big way with a 44-0 demolition over the Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs at AAMI Park.

Commemorating the 10th anniversary of their 2012 grand final victory, the home side were more than a class above their lowly opponents, scoring eight unanswered tries to the delight of 13,437 supporters.

Holding off an enthusiastic start from the visitors, which almost yielded a try for former speedster Josh Addo-Carr, the

Storm struck first through Papenhuyzen (11th minute) who slid over after a strong carry from Xavier Coates down the right edge.

Making the most of the Bulldogs tendency to compound errors with penalties in quick succession, underrated forward Josh King (21st minute) claimed his first try for the club by pouncing on a grubber from Harry Grant to put the home side up 12-0.

Showing tremendous resolve on their try line to keep the Bulldogs at bay, the Storm rounded out a resolute first half display with Kenny Bromwich (36th minute) touching down for his first try of the season in the shadows of halftime.

Breaking the game open after halftime with Grant and Jahrome Hughes laying on tries to give Papenhuyzen (45th and 52nd

minutes) his second and third of the afternoon, a poor pass from Matt Burton allowed Coates (60th minute) to race the length of the field for his third try of the season.



Turbo-less Manly travel north to Newcastle looking to go three in a row.

The Newcastle Knights and the Manly Sea Eagles kick off round 5 NRL action on Thursday night in Newcastle. Two teams that both have two wins from their opening 4 rounds, they're nonetheless in very different positions. Manly are looking to make it three in a row, while Newcastle will want to rediscover their form from earlier rounds.

After a blistering start to the 2022 season for the Knights, a strong Cronulla side have caused them to come crashing back down to Earth. Fullback Kalyn Ponga will also need to contribute some attacking firepower for Newcastle to outscore Manly this Thursday.

But for the backs to do their work, it's up to the pack to lay a platform. Star players David Klemmer, Mitchell Barnett and Lachlan Fitzgibbon make up the long list of forwards out with injury. Tyson Frizzle has been named despite hamstring tightness. Add in co-captain and hooker Jayden Brailey's current sideline stint, and ruck dominance seems a near impossible task for the forwards. One of the players filling that gap is Rugby convert Leo Thompson. After making his NRL debut in round 1, he started at prop last time out against Cronulla, and has been named on the bench. Hymel Hunt was expected to return from injury this week, but hasn't been named. Winger Dom Young got off with a fine after being placed on report for a dangerous tackle in round 4, and keeps his spot in the 17. He will be fighting to keep it even when Hunt regains his fitness.

It's a very different story for the Manly Sea Eagles. In almost complete opposite fashion to their opposition, they started the season in an underwhelming manner, going 0 from 2 early on. But a nerve racking match against Canterbury which saw them escape with the two points in round 3 seems to have kicked the club into gear, with a trip to Mudgee last weekend ending in a comfortable win over Canberra.

Manly captain and halfback Daly Cherry-Evans has set the standard for Manly players in the past fortnight, kicking two field goals and setting up numerous scoring opportunities through his brilliant kicking game. It's an important reminder to national team selectors of his talent, with the upcoming Rugby League World Cup on the horizon. His main competition for the Kangaroos number 7 jersey is Nathan Cleary, who he will most likely come up against in this year's State of Origin series. His role will be even more important in the coming weeks, with fullback Tom Trbojevic sidelined with a knee injury. He is expected to return for Manly in around a month's time, and young centre Tolutau Koula has been named as his replacement. Koula showed his talent with an early try against Canberra last week, and will play his first game at fullback in just his third NRL appearance. Brad Parker has been named on the reserves due to covid protocols, so Christian Tuipulotu will slot in at centre to replace Koula.

Newcastle have won their past three matches against Manly, and the Sea Eagles have only won 4 of their 16 matches at McDonald Jones Stadium.


WHO TO WATCH: Young Tolutau Koula will start at fullback in the absence of Tom Trbojevic this Thursday night. Koula is the son of two Olympic sprinters/hurdles, and his whopping 100m time of 10.58 run when he was just 17 very much proves that. The now 19 year old is expected to get his first minutes as an NRL fullback at a very critical time for the club. With momentum building behind Manly, Turbo's injury might be all it takes to lose it. If Koula can do his job over the next few weeks, the Sea Eagles will be in a very good position.

Experienced utility Kurt Mann will start at lock for the fifth game running this Thursday. The seemingly more stable position appears to be getting better and more consistent performances from him. One of the best tacklers in the game, he has a tackle efficiency of 95.6% so far in the 2022 season, one of the best for locks who play most if not all of the 80 minutes. He has scored 40 tries over a career spanning 9 years, but is yet to score one in this campaign.

FAVOURITE: The Manly Sea Eagles are the favourites to get the win this Thursday away from home.

MY TIP: Being held to zero last week would've hurt Newcastle. They are going to be desperate to prove that they are a competitive team this year, and a turbo-less Manly may struggle. Newcastle by 2.

Warriors tackle Cowboys in a top-eight clash few saw coming

An upbeat Warriors will be shooting for three on the bounce when they host a wounded Cowboys in Friday's early opener at Redcliffe.

Coming off a comfortable win over the Broncos, another at their home away from home would see the seventh placed Kiwis striking at better than 50 per cent after five rounds.

And while the fifth ranked Cowboys are also on two wins, their coach simply wants more respect from the referees.

Basking behind a pack that had just rolled Brisbane, Nathan Brown was all smiles last Saturday afternoon, while just a few hours later in Townsville, Todd Payten had the look of a man who'd just discovered his car propped up on bricks.

Truth is, given a choice, the ex-Warriors coach probably would have predicted the crime instead of a rampant Roosters pasting his depleted side, who fort gamely with a man down on a rare three separate occasions.

Now as they prepare to head south to Brisbane, there's little doubt North Queensland will still be hot under the collar.

Not that Addin Fonua-Blake and Matt Lodge will be concerned. The Warriors bookends combined to blow away the Broncos with almost 400 run metres.

But in the thunderous charges of Jason Taumalolo, the Cowboys' resistance packs punch, while for up and comer Jeremiah Nanai, it's another opportunity for a big scalp.

In recent times, little has separated these sides in high scoring contests with the spoils shared two apiece since 2019.

Whether the points flow this time is yet to be seen. Brown has made a point of scaling back his side's attack until halves Chanel Harris-Tavita and Shaun Johnson settle as a combination.

But it's the presence of roaming fullback Reece Walsh that could prove the point of difference. With the Cowboys missing livewire equivalent Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow through injury, it means veteran recruit Chad Townsend will need to be at his organising best.

For the Warriors, another victory will soften the blow of having to face both the Roosters and Storm away in the weeks that follow.

While for North Queensland, with games to come against Canberra and the Gold Coast, a win this week could be the start of a mini resurgence.

WHO TO WATCH: If there's such a thing as a certainty in the NRL, then it's Kyle Feldt finding his way across the stripe against the Warriors. 12 tries in nine games going back to 2014 says it all. In a career that has already yielded 105 tries, the strapping winger has only been kept scoreless by the Kiwis in two games.


Returning to the Warriors after three seasons at the Sharks, Shaun Johnson showed the Broncos he's far from a spent force to set up his side's opening try.

Even against Payten's improved defensive structures, the New Zealander's ability to commit defenders and create space is a major reason why he has finished on the winning side in his past six outings against the Cowboys.

FAVOURITE: No stingy odds here, this one is a genuine flip of the coin, although respected outlets have the Cowboys as the narrowest of favourites.

MY TIP: North Queensland are yet to lose two on the trot this season. It's proof that Payten's calculated, yet harrowing, post loss stage act has merit. And even without the Hammer, look for Scott Drinkwater to make the most of his first opportunity in the No.1 this season. Cowboys by 2.

Broncos, Roosters Battle It Out In Brisbane For Third Win of the Season

After a start to the year which had many pundits wondering is 2022 may perhaps be the year the Broncos return to the top 8, Rounds 3 and 4 have brought the once proud Brisbane based club right back down to Earth. Two straight heavy defeats at the hands of the Cowboys and Warriors, neither of whom are tipped to be amongst the contenders at the end of the year, will have Kevin Walters scrambling for fast answers. Their job doesn't get any easier this week against the Sydney Roosters, who themselves haven't exactly been the beacon of consistency so far, with a disappointment, followed by a strong win, followed by another disappointment, followed by, you guessed it, another strong win being the story so far for the Bondi boys. They will be hoping to get their first consecutive victory for the year when they head up to Brisbane on Friday.

The Broncos attack has yet to click in 2022. They have averaged only 11.25 points per game as a team so far, which simply is nowhere near enough to consistently win games in the NRL. They were only able to put one try on the board last week against the Warriors, a team which going into that game was giving up an average of 20 points per game, and that sole four-pointer was from some Adam Reynolds individual brilliance in an otherwise uninspiring set. The Broncos extremely high error rate doesn't help this; Selwyn Cobbo and Kotoni Staggs are first and second in the league for errors with 17 and 11 respectively, while Tesi Niu's positioning defensively as a fullback also needs to improve.

The Roosters start to the season has been the definition of hot and cold. At their attacking worst, their key spine players have certainly been guilty of trying to force plays that weren't on, their game against the Rabbitohs being a prime example of this. However, they have also shown glimpses of what they're capable of at their best; they essentially won their games against Manly and the Cowboys with first half attacking blitzes. The main reason the Roosters have been so successful over the last decade or so has been their defence. It was no surprise that as soon as their defence regressed, they stopped winning games against elite teams. It has therefore been a refreshing sight for fans of the Red, White and Blue that the famous "bondi wall" is showing signs of returning. They only conceded 4 last week against the Cowboys, and have made numerous goal-line stands of multiple sets that the Roosters last year simply don't make. Against the below-average attack of the Broncos, the Roosters will certainly have a goal of keeping them to single digits or somewhere in that vicinity.

In team news, Billy Walters will start at five-eighth for the Broncos as a replacement for the injured Albert Kelly. Tom Flegler has been suspended until Round 7, meaning will start in the front row, while Capewell and Riki return to the back row, pushing Robati to the bench. Pat Carrigan is expected to be out until Round 10 with a knee injury, meaning Kobe Hetherington will make his first start of the year at lock. Corey Jensen and Cory Paix are the two new faces on the bench. The Roosters have stuck with the same 17 that defeated the Cowboys last week, with Kevin Naiqama maintaining his spot on the wing after a strong showing. Connor Watson has again been named to start at hooker, however expect Robinson to make the usual late change with Hutchison.


WHO TO WATCH: After injury affected much of his 2021 campaign, Kotoni Staggs has struggled to find form so far in 2022. As mentioned above, he is 2nd in the competition for errors made with 11, while he was recently dominated by Valentine Holmes in the Broncos matchup against the Cowboys. Last week, he produced the mediocre numbers of 12 runs for 76 metres without breaking the line, however he did bust four tackles, showing that the explosive talent Rugby League fans have come to know is certainly still in there somewhere. This week, he will match up against Paul Momirovski, who has at times been suspect in defence for the Roosters this season. Broncos fans will certainly be hoping to see Staggs return to form sooner rather than later, and you get the feeling they'll need a big one from him if they are to be any hope of causing an upset.

Victor Radley had a welcome return to form for the Roosters last week. After being embarrassed by the Rabbitohs and Cameron Murray the week prior, Radley clearly came out with a point to prove against the Cowboys and did so in emphatic fashion, scoring a try to go with 19 runs for 163 metres as well as 2 line breaks, 4 tackle busts and an offload. He was also a brick wall defensively, making 37 tackles and missing just 1. While much is made of Radley's ability to dig into the line and ball play for the Roosters, which is certainly a pivotal part of the teams attack, he can at times become preoccupied with doing so and forget that he is also a damaging ball runner, which can allow opposition teams to effectively prepare for the ball playing and negate it's effectiveness. Last week, Radley got back to primarily acting as a ball runner, while also using his ball playing to contribute to one of the Roosters' first half tries. If this version of Victor the inflictor can hang around, it'll go a long way to improving the Roosters' chances of competing with the elite teams of the competition.

FAVOURITE: The Roosters are 13.5 point favourites over the Broncos at the time of writing.

MY TIP: The Broncos haven't shown anywhere near enough with the ball in hand for me to consider picking them against a team like the Roosters. Roosters by 14.

Raiders look to defy awful record and pull off the upset against competition heavyweights

The NRL's regional road trip continues as the Canberra Raiders return to McDonald's Park, Wagga Wagga to go head to head with the Melbourne Storm. This will be Canberra's third season taking a game to the people of Wagga Wagga, in that span possessing a 50% strike rate at this venue, which also coincides with the 50th meeting of these two sides since Melbourne entered the competition in 1998.

Canberra come into this clash after a challenging opening month to the season that has been marred by inconsistent play and a lack of continuity in the way that they have played. This clash with one of the competition heavyweights will give a true indication of where the Raiders are at through the opening stages of the season. For Canberra to have a chance of securing an upset, their forwards need to lift considerably. They were rolled through the middle by a Manly pack that hadn't really fired up to this point. Look for Joe Tapine and Hudson Young to lift their game and help Josh Papalii through the middle third and fatigue the Storm's big pack. Their backline has been consistently reshuffled with a change it seems every week, but one man that is under an incredible amount of pressure is Charnze Nicol-Klokstad. With boom rookie Xavier Savage waiting in the wings, it's time for 'CNK' to ignite his season and hold his fullback jersey for the remainder of the season, his workload at the back was what made him an elite fullback a few seasons ago, expect him to be searching for the ball and looking to become involved when Canberra have the footy. Ricky Stuart has opted not to change his 17 drastically after last week's loss. Expect Matt Frawley to start at hooker even though he has been named in jersey 14.

Melbourne on the other hand has had their fair share of injury problems to start the year. Losing their captain and leader Christian Welch for the season after one round is a tough pill to swallow for their supporters. However, there's been some signs through the opening three rounds that Melbourne's defence isn't at the levels we've come to expect from them in recent seasons, leaking three tries late against South Sydney (albeit they were down to 12 men) as well as conceding 28 points against Parramatta last weekend, their most points conceded by the Storm since Round 21 2018. Melbourne was however bolstered during the week by three key re-signings of Harry Grant, Jahrome Hughes and Xavier Coates which will stop Wayne Bennett from further raiding Melbourne's playing roster to some extent. The Storm rebounded off a heartbreaking extra-time loss with a slaughter of Canterbury-Bankstown last week where their defence answered back to the critics. Ryan Papenhuyzen continued his purple patch with a personal tally of 28 points last Sunday. Melbourne's lethal right edge of Hughes, Olam and Coates continued to give the opposition nightmares and with Canberra struggling last week with their left edge defence, it could present the Storm with countless attacking opportunities. With Papenhuyzen always looming out the back, Melbourne could strike on the overlap with devastating results. As far as the team news is concerned, Cameron Munster was cleared by the match review committee of 'dropping the knees' into Canterbury fullback Matt Dufty and will be free to take his place. Brandon Smith will have to remain on the bench with Josh King continuing to impress in the 13 jumper to start season 2022.


WHO TO WATCH: With Canberra losing Josh Hodgson next season, their future is dependent on the emergence of young hooker Tom Starling. Canberra supporters are getting an early glimpse of life without Hodgson as he sits out the remainder of the season with a torn ACL. Starling has largely been used off the bench by Ricky Stuart so far in his career to avoid the 'roughening up' period. This allows Starling to come into the game around the 20-25 minute mark which allows him to exploit a tired middle third. Starling's running game was noticeably missing last week after a strong performance a fortnight ago against the Titans. Look for Starling's running game to set up the attack for Jack Wighton and Brad Schneider on Saturday afternoon.

Melbourne's Cameron Munster is the only big-name player not to have resigned with the club so far. You have to think that the contract saga has affected his form to some extent to start season 2022. Look for Munster to be back to his scintillating best on Saturday afternoon with his combinations on the left-hand edge giving the Canberra defence some things to think about. If he can fire with the brilliance he's possessed over the course of his magnificent career, it'll be a long day for the Raiders in Wagga.

FAVOURITE: No surprise that the Storm comes into this one as the hot favourite. They present a strong head to head record against the Raiders since entering the NRL in 1998 winning on 35 occasions with only 14 losses.

MY TIP: Melbourne looks to be coming into the season now, with last weekend's big win over Canterbury. Their class and experience will over-run a Canberra side in the final wash-up. Canberra will be competitive as they try and bounce back from their poor performance in Mudjee last Saturday. The history of this clash suggests that it won't be a runaway victory so the score will be competitive. Melbourne by 12

Long time rivals look to get back in the winner's circle

The South Sydney Rabbitohs and the St George Illawarra Dragons will be out to kick start their underwhelming campaigns with a win at Accor Stadium on Saturday evening.

Enduring a difficult run against several premiership heavyweights over the opening month of the season, the South Sydney Rabbitohs will be wary of their similarly low-ranked opponents, despite holding a dominant record in recent times.

Winning 15 out of 18 NRL clashes against the joint venture since 2012, including the past seven in succession, coach Jason Demetriou will be hoping history continues after succumbing to a 26-12 loss at the hands of the Panthers during last week's grand final rematch.

Set to be without fan favourite Mark Nicholls for an extended stretch due to a syndesmosis sustained in the opening minutes last Friday, Tom Burgess will start in the front-row with youngsters Davvy Moale and Blake Taaffe joining the bench, while veteran winger Josh Mansour has also earned a recall in place of Jaxson Paulo.

Coming into Saturday's encounter in need of two premiership points, the Rabbitohs will be striving to continue a unique trend, whereby after opening a campaign with one win from their first four matches, the side has gone on to win in Round 5 every time during the NRL era (2005, 12, 14 and 20).

Slumping to their third loss in a row after starting the year with signs of promise, the St George Illawarra Dragons will be out to atone for a disastrous second half showing last Sunday.

Left shell-shocked after conceding six second half tries to go from a 12-8 halftime deficit to a humbling 48-14 defeat at the hands of the Eels, coach Anthony Griffin has made further changes to his side in a bid to hold players accountable for their performances.

Recalling Jadyn Su'A from suspension in the second-row, experienced campaigner Aaron Woods comes into the starting pack with Blake Lawrie dropping to the bench.

Holding a dismal record at Sydney Olympic Park, winning 12 of their 33 visits, in the years since claiming the club's sole premiership, only three players - Ben Hunt, Tariq Sims and Jack de Belin - remain from the last Dragons team to triumph over the Rabbitohs in the corresponding round four years ago.


WHO TO WATCH: Experiencing the highs and lows that come with wearing the number seven jersey during the first four rounds of the season, rookie halfback Lachlan Ilias will be eyeing new opportunities to develop his game on Saturday night. Handed the first crack at taking over from one of the club's all-time greats, the 21-year-old has grown in confidence with each performance, producing a try-assist and forcing two repeat sets with his kicking game last week. Unlucky to be denied his first try of the season last Friday, look for Ilias to play a steady role, allowing the likes of Latrell Mitchell and Cody Walker to make their mark on the scoreboard.

Making the most of a change of scenery after falling down the pecking order at Manly last season, centre Moses Suli has offered a much-needed point of strike on the left edge for the Dragons over the early rounds. Relishing the opportunity to string together consecutive matches in the starting side for the first time in nearly a year, the 23-year-old Tongan representative has averaged 140 metres and 5.5 tackle breaks during his first four appearances at the club. Lining up opposite Campbell Graham in a key personal duel on Saturday evening, look for Suli to continue his impressive work with the ball and push for his first try wearing the Red V.

FAVOURITE: Winning seven of their past eight appearances at Accor Stadium dating back to last season, the Rabbitohs are expected to have too much strike power for the Dragons to contend with.

MY TIP: While both sides head into the match in similar form on the surface, the defensive frailties shown by the Dragons over the past fortnight should give the Rabbitohs the edge to bounce back at home. Rabbitohs by 16.

After sneaking home with two premiership points against the Wests Tigers last week, the Gold Coast Titans prepare to host the charging Parramatta Eels at Cbus Super Stadium on Saturday night.

It was a miraculous finish to Thursday night football when the Titans scored a bizarre try to pip the Wests Tigers at the finish line by two points. Despite securing their second win of the season, the Titans will have to perform much better if they are to come away with a win against the in-form Parramatta Eels this weekend. The Titans missed 30 tackles and made an incredible 16 errors in their win on Thursday night, compared to the 20 missed tackles and eight errors by the Parramatta Eels in their big win on Sunday night. The Titans have averaged 12.5 errors per game this season (third most this season) and coughed the ball up 12 times in their four-point loss against Parramatta in the opening round of the season. Compare that to the 8.3 errors per game that the Eels have made this season and there's a clear discrepancy. For their own sake, Gold Coast are going to have to tighten up these errors and if they don't, the Eels are a chance to run rampant on Saturday night. Despite the sloppy outing against the Tigers, captain Tino Fa'asuamaleaui showed grit and determination as he did his best to get his side over the line. The skipper ran for 133 metres, 77 of those after contact and made 34 tackles including an incredible try-saving effort on Tigers' winger David Nofoaluma in the 60th minute. It's efforts like this that'll encourage the same from his team mates on the weekend. You can count on Fa'asuamaleaui each and every week to put his head down and do the tough work for this Titans side and he's been the perfect leader for a side that is wildly inconsistent. The Titans will benefit from the return of Beau Fermor, Philip Sami and Isaac Liu with the hope that these three can help cure some of the errors the team made last week. These changes push Jamin Joliffe and Kevin Proctor back to the bench with Sam McIntyre, Sam Lisone and Brian Kelly missing out on the 17 this week.

Now, it was an incredibly strange match when the two met in round one, with 48 of the 60 points for the match coming in the first half. The Eels haven't slowed down scoring wise, scoring 124 points over the first four rounds, leading the league. Much of this comes down to the brilliant form that both Dylan Brown and Mitchell Moses find themselves in and they'll be licking their lips at the chance of having another crack at the Titans. The two halves led the Eels to a crushing 34-point victory over the St. George Illawarra Dragons which saw Parramatta pile on six tries in the second half. The pair scored three tries and assisted another three between them as they prove to the competition that once again, the Eels are going to be a tough team to handle during the regular season. If Brown and Moses can produce this type of form again on Saturday night, you wouldn't be wrong for thinking the Eels will come away with the win. The Eels have begun the 2022 season in flying form, winning three of their four games thus far with their only loss at the hands of a rejuvenated Cronulla Sharks side. The four-time premiers have scored more points in the first four rounds than any previous Eels side coached by Brad Arthur, and they currently sit second for tackle breaks (140), second for run metres (6,862) and second in line breaks (20). Typically, a team that has struggled to outscore its competitors at the top of the league, finishing ninth for points scored in 2020 and sixth in 2021, the 2022 Eels look like a different beast with the ball in hand. Although, they have leaked the most points out of any team currently in the top eight and have conceded the third most points this season. Parramatta welcome back Shaun Lane to the starting side, pushing Ryan Matterson back to the bench with the only other change seeing Mitch Rein welcomed back onto the bench at the expense of Bryce Cartwright.


WHO TO WATCH: As spectators, we didn't get to see these two five-eighths battle it out in round one with AJ Brimson missing out on selection due to injury. Four weeks later, we get to see these two future stars trade blows on Saturday night. Firstly, Dylan Brown still only 21 years of age, has been exceptional to start the 2022 season. The New Zealand international has received five Dally M votes over the past two weeks for his brilliant performances against the Storm and the Dragons. Brown is averaging 138.8 run metres per game and 25.5 tackles per game with only seven missed tackles over the first four games. Pair this with five try assists and three line breaks and you've got a damaging player. Brown has been in immaculate form since the two sides met in round one and he's going to demand a lot from the Titans defence.

His opposite number in Brimson set up a try with his first touch of the football this season in the Titans two-point victory over the Warriors in round two. In three appearances, Brimson has scored a try - a match winning one against the Tigers - and set up another three for good measure. He's only carried the football for 166 run metres this season, but the Queensland representative is still getting his feet set in his new position. Brimson has showed glimpses of his class as a number six and with each and every week, he'll only get better at being a lead playmaker for his side. I, for one, am super excited to see these two battle it out on Saturday night.

FAVOURITE: The Eels are the overwhelming favourites to record their fourth win of the season and with good reason. They've just beaten Melbourne - for the fourth straight time in the regular season - and thumped the Dragons. Compare this to the Titans last two games which saw a collapse against the Raiders and an error-fest against the Wests Tigers.

MY TIP: I'm tipping the Eels to win this one. They've been super impressive with the ball in hand over the past two weekends and if Melbourne couldn't stop them, I don't see the Titans being able to. Parramatta by 12.

Sink or swim in contest of contrasting fortunes

The Cronulla Sharks will be out to continue their recent run of form when they host the winless Wests Tigers on Sunday afternoon at PointsBet Stadium.

Surprising many over the opening rounds with a vastly improved approach under rookie coach Craig Fitzgibbon, the Cronulla Sharks will be eyeing off four straight wins for only the second time in the COVID era.

Coming off an emphatic display that saw the Sharks hold an opposition scoreless for the first time since their victorious premiership campaign, coach Fitzgibbon has stuck solid with the same side that got the job done over the Knights 18-0 last Friday in a welcome sign of continuity.

Holding a dominant record over the joint venture with seven wins from eight clashes since 2015, only five players named in the 24-man squad remain from the last time the Sharks hosted a Sunday afternoon match at Cronulla three years ago.

Staring down the prospect of recording their worst ever start to a season with zero premiership points after five rounds, the Wests Tigers will be desperate to make a lasting impression after a heartbreaking loss last Thursday.

Snatching defeat from the jaws of victory after a cruel error in the final moments allowed the Titans to emerge with an 8-6 victory on the Gold Coast, coach Michael Maguire has opted against changes in a bid to instil confidence and consistency throughout the playing group.

Returning to PointsBet Stadium for the first time in four years, the side holds a surprisingly strong overall record at Cronulla with eight wins and a draw from 15 visits; however only David Nofoaluma and Luke Brooks remain from the last Tigers side to prevail at the venue in 2014.

WHO TO WATCH: Producing one of the most outstanding games seen by a centre for some time last Friday, behemoth Siosifa Talakai will be looking to back up his efforts in the afternoon sun. Scoring a try, running for 223 metres and making an astounding 17 tackle breaks in a career best display against the Knights, the 24-year-old has established himself as a key player for the Sharks after making the most of his second chance at the top grade. Playing with a level of confidence and professionalism few would have envisioned from his time at the Rabbitohs as a teenager, Talakai could become a permanent fixture in the centres if last week is indicative of performances to come.

As Jock Madden can attest: rugby league can be a cruel game at times. Making a crucial error with the game on the line last week, the back-up playmaker will be determined to make amends on Sunday afternoon in a bid to elevate the Tigers to their first win since August last year. Showing signs of promise filling in for suspended recruit Jackson Hastings over the past fortnight, look for Madden's kicking game to feature prominently if the Tigers are to pull off an unlikely upset.

FAVOURITE: Cronulla have been installed as the shortest priced favourites of the round, matching the odds offered alongside the contest between the reigning premiers and the incumbent wooden spooners.

MY TIP: Eyeing off their best start to a season since the centenary of rugby league in 2008, the Sharks should rise to expectations if they are serious about competing for the top four. Sharks by 10.



While the Bulldogs were not expected to win last week's game against the Storm, it was still a chance to prove that they were heading in the right direction - that there was reason for optimism.

Instead, a 44-0 drubbing showed just how Trent Barrett's men have to go before truly turning a corner.

Most glaring was the hole at halfback, with Matt Burton alone not the answer despite his obvious potential.

The former Panthers playmaker, along with Josh Addo-Carr, was the face of a new era at Belmore but he himself is still developing and learning at NRL level.

Barrett has opted to give Kyle Flanagan another go in the halves, a move that on paper makes sense.

Without a recognized halfback next to him, Burton has struggled to unleash the same running game that made him such a threat at Penrith, instead reduced to a repetitive kicking machine.

The hope for Bulldogs fans is that, while Flanagan has not always been convincing at NRL level, at least his long-range kicking game will ease the pressure on Burton and free him up to take the line on.

Barrett will certainly need Burton to be at his best if the Bulldogs are to cause a boilover against the undefeated defending premiers.

Burton, along with Brent Naden and Tevita Pangai Jr, left the Panthers at the end of last year to join the Belmore revolution and will have added motivation this week.

Penrith though has refused to let those losses impact its stunning rise, winning four-straight to remain the only undefeated team left in the league.

The Panthers cruised past the Rabbitohs last week in a performance made only more impressive by the fact that returning halfback Nathan Cleary was quiet by his own lofty standards.

Penrith rarely looked troubled in that game and outside of complacency, should have far too many weapons in attack for a Bulldogs side still searching for its identity.

Coach Ivan Cleary will be reminding his troops of their clash with Newcastle a fortnight ago as an example of just what can happen if they ease the intensity.

On that afternoon, while the Panthers emerged victorious, they had concerning defensive lapses once the Knights were reduced to 12 men.

WHO TO WATCH: If there is anyone who can inspire an upset for the Bulldogs this week, it is former Panther Matt Burton. The Dubbo product has a lethal step and turn off pace that could pose problems for Penrith. Although, the issue for Burton is that his former teammates know his game so well they may be expecting it. That could work in Burton's favour though if the Panthers put too much of a focus on him in defence, leaving his teammates open on the edges. As potent as Izack Tago and Taylan May have been in attack, both are relatively inexperienced and Tago has been guilty of rushing in on occasions, leaving his winger exposed. If Burton is able to attract Tago to come in, it could open up space for the Bulldogs to exploit on Penrith's left edge.

For the Panthers, keep an eye on Dally M leader Isaah Yeo. While Dylan Edwards may have been unlucky to miss out on three points against South Sydney, Yeo has undoubtedly been Penrith's standout performer in the opening weeks of the season. Halfback Cleary has been missed but Yeo's ball-playing in the middle proved crucial in his absence. Even last week with Cleary back on the field, Yeo still took on extra responsibility, getting his hands on the ball to provide that linking pass in sweeping plays. The lock forward's short, crisp passes in the middle of the ruck could allow the likes of Apisai Koroisau and Dylan Edwards to cause havoc.

FAVOURITE: The Panthers are overwhelming favourites to run away big winners.

MY TIP: Penrith should do this easily but that in itself is a danger. Facing up against their former teammates and with a point to prove after last week's humiliation, the Bulldogs will pose a challenge early on. Should the Panthers nab a few early tries, it will be a matter of how many. But I have a sneaky feeling this will be closer than most expect. Panthers by 8.
