OUR REPORT with AJ LUCANTONIO ROOSTERS QUEENS OF THE COOP WITH THEIR FIRST NRLW PREMIERSHIP

The Sydney Roosters have won their first NRLW title defeating the St George Illawarra Dragons 16-4 in an entertaining grand final before 7855 fans at Moreton Daily Stadium.

It was a nightmare start for the Roosters with Yasmine Meakes losing the ball in the opening set of the game. From the ensuing scrum, St George Illawarra sent the ball wide and Dally M player of the year Emma Tonegato linked up with Maddison Bartlett to score the opening try of the game and break the record for most tries scored by a woman in the NRLW's short history. However, that would be the only time the Dragons found the stripe in a game that was dominated by defence.

The Roosters would go close with Brydie Parker stepping on the sideline. However, her grand final ended tragically as her knee gave out. The bunker found a high shot from Dragons 5/8 Taliah Fuimaono and she was placed in the sin bin by referee Belinda Sharpe. The Roosters couldn't convert the extra player advantage and failed to capitalise with St George's defence being the stand out feature.

St George though they had a second on the stroke of the break as Keeley Davis got to the ball first and grounded the ball first, the Bunker however found a little knockon as the Roosters breathed a huge sigh of relief as the Dragons held a narrow 4-0 lead at half-time. The Roosters had the better of the action in the second 35 minutes frustrating the Dragons with strong defence. Yasmin Meakes made a half-break before the tackle from Rachael Pearson saves the day, later in the set, however, St George cracked when Jocelyn Kelleher took a risk down the blindside and Yasmin Meakes charged onto the ball and the tri-colours had their first of the afternoon, but just like the men's side, they couldn't buy a conversion.

Ten minutes later, a great set play saw Corban Baxter flicks it out the back and was expertly picked up from Zahara Temara who linked up with Isabelle Kelly who raced away to score and with the conversion from Temara, the tri-colours held a 6 point lead.

> Sarah Togatuki sealed the game with a strong run-up field, off the ensuing tackle, Olivia Higgins shrugs off some St George defenders to score the game-sealing try and another conversion from Temara gave them the final margin of 12 points.

> The Roosters win their inaugural NRLW premiership, which is a remarkable achievement considering they limped into the finals on for and against, but showed who they really were when the big moments counted in the finals. Sarah Togatuki was awarded the Karryn Murphy Medal for being the best player on the ground.

SEA EAGLES SOAR AGAINST ERRANT KNIGHTS

Manly Sea Eagles made the best of the soggy conditions to down Newcastle Knights 30-6 tonight at Hunter Stadium.

The Sea Eagles made it three straight results in wet and wild conditions tonight with a late onslaught to run over the top of a Knights side that didn't looked at their best and fall to back-to-back defeats.

Tonight's scoreline looks inflated after the Sea Eagles scored three late tries to Karl Lawton, Haumole Olakau'atu and Taniela Paseka which gave them a 24-point success and further soar up the National Rugby League ladder to kick off Round 5.

Before that, it was a grinding contest which played right into the hands of Sea Eagles halfback Daly Cherry-Evans. Despite one brain snap where he kicked for Jason Saab inside his own 30 metre line which didn't work. He had an earlier kick for Morgan Harper which stretched the lead to 10-nil.

It was a night as dark as the sky for the Knights. They fumbled the ball several times in good field position in the first half and it took a moment of brilliance to get it back to 10-6 just after half-time. Kalyn Ponga started and finished the move off a wonderful Enari Tuala pass to give them hope.

OUR REPORT with AJ LUCANTONIO JOHNSON THE HERO AS WARRIORS DOWN COWBOYS

Shaun Johnson was the hero for the Warriors as they marched to their third straight victory in an epic 25-24 golden point thriller over the North Queensland Cowboys at Moreton Daily Stadium.

The Cowboys came into this match with a point to prove after a disappointing performance against the Roosters last week. There would be no doubting Todd Payten would've been pleased with his side's start to the contest when Tom Dearden slipped through some ordinary Warriors defence to score the game's opening try. However, the visitors would quickly return to their 2021 ways with poor discipline and their inability to defend their errors. Shaun Johnson took on the Cowboys' defence and fired a lovely pass to Jesse Arthars who hit a lovely hole to hit back for the Warriors. With Reece Walsh's conversion, the home side had an early 6-4 advantage. The home side's poor discipline would cost them dearly, a high tackle from Reece Walsh allowed the Cowbovs to level the scores. Off the ensuing set, Addin Fonua-Blake couldn't handle the grubber kick and it allowed Scott Drinkwater to score possibly the easiest try of his career and extend the visitors' advantage to a converted try. From there, the Warriors slowly began to settle in the match and began imposing themselves on the Cowboys' goal line. OUR REPORT with SAM BOURKE MANU LIFTS ROOSTERS TO COME FROM BEHIND WIN OVER SPIRITED BRONCOS

Roosters centre Joseph Manu has carried his side to a come from behind 24-20 victory over the Brisbane Broncos at Suncorp Stadium tonight.

After trailing 10-0 at halftime, the Kiwi centre scored a brace of tries through pure determination and grit in a superb individual performance to steal his underperforming side the two points in an absolute thrilling game of rugby league.

It was a heartbreaking loss for Brisbane, who were the better side for the majority of the match, with huge performances from their two young superstars in Kotoni Staggs and Payne Hass who were enormous in a losing side. Unfortunately, it was lapses in concentration in defence at key times which cost Kevin Walters men in the end.

The Broncos came with the attitude early, with halfback Adam Reynolds finding his strike centre Staggs with some early ball, which caused the Roosters defence some early headaches.

Brisbane then struck with the first blow, when Reynolds and Tesi Niu combined down the left-hand side to find a hard

running Corey Oates who bulldozed his way over for the first try of the night. Reynolds missed the conversion and it was 4-0 to Brisbane after 21 minutes.

Round 6 kicks off with a Round 2 rematch

The Canberra Raiders will host the North Queensland Cowboys in the opening game of Round 6 this Thursday night. The two sides will be trying to get back on track with both teams coming off two successive losses. The Raiders will be out to avenge their 20 point loss to the Cowboys back in round 2.

After dropping the first game of the season, by Round 3 the Cowboys found themselves second to Penrith on the ladder. Now in 8th, they are still looking for their third win of the season, a win that they got so close to last time out against the Warriors.

It was heartbreak for North Queensland in Redcliffe last Friday, going down to New Zealand in golden point after leading by 12 at the break. Despite not coming away with the two points, there were plenty of positive signs for the Cowboys, in particular their five-eighth Tom Dearden's strong performance. After suffering an injury in Round 4, speedster Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow is expected to return in Round 7 when the Cowboys meet the Gold Coast. This Thursday the experienced Scott Drinkwater will take his place at fullback, as he did last weekend as well. Drinkwater had a big tally of 200 run metres, the most run metres by a player in that game. He also racked up a try, a try assist and a line break. The decision to play Drinkwater at fullback over Valentine Holmes is an interesting one, but he seems at home there. The Cowboys will need him to produce a similar performance if they're going to find their third win of the season. Holmes is playing consistently well in the centres, and is also showing his worth as a goalkicker, with a tally of 40 points already through the first 5 rounds to his name.

The Raiders are also staring down the barrel of a third straight loss. Their trip North in round 2 was a little humiliating for the club, and they will do everything in their power for that not to repeat itself. But their past two games have shown some worrying signs, albeit against strong opposition. The two losses have both occurred at country venues, away to Manly in Mudgee, and at home to the Storm in Wagga Wagga. The Raiders announced earlier this week that they will be returning to Wagga for the 2023 season. With Jamal Fogarty out for the majority of the season, a lot of responsibility has been placed on Brad Schneider. Schneider has performed consistently, doing his job and letting Jack Wighton and Charnze Nicoll-Klokstad control the attack. At the start of the season, it seemed that Nicoll-Klokstad may have been under some pressure from young fullback Xavier Savage, but coach Ricky Stuart has stood by him so far this season. After impressing in trials, Savage will play his first minutes of the season this Thursday, being named on the interchange for the Raiders. It'll be interesting to see what role he covers from the bench. In the centres, Matt Timoko has been named despite concerns over his fitness. If Timoko isn't deemed fit in time for the match, captain Jarred Croker could finally make his NRL return after being named in the reserves, or Savage could slot into a starting spot.

The Canberra Raiders are 2 from 2 so far this season at GIO Stadium, while the last time they played the Cowboys back in Round 2 they were severely undermanned, missing the likes of Brad Schneider, Nick Cotric and Jordan Rapana. Can a closer to full strength Canberra side put up more of a fight against a Tabuai-Fidow-less Cowboys?

WHO TO WATCH: Cowboys second rower Jeremiah Nanai has recently signed a one year contract extension with the club. The 19 year old was reportedly offered contracts worth nearly a million dollars a year from as many as five clubs following his teams dominant performance in round 3 against a woeful Broncos defence, a game in which he scored a hat trick. Growing up in Cairns, he played only 7 reserve grade games for the Northern Pride before making his NRL debut in round 22 of last year. He will be keen to show the Cowboys that they made the right decision to re-sign him.

Tom Starling is beginning to make a name for himself. The Canberra number 9 has earned his spot at the Raiders, working well with Josh Hodgson and Siliva Havili over the past 2 years. Now that Havili is at Souths, and the injured Hodgson is reportedly heading to Parra from 2023 (to replace Reed Mahoney), Starling will be eyeing off a long term contract at the nation's capital. With Matt Frawley losing his bench spot this week in favour of Xavier Savage, Starling will most likely have to play 80 minutes, something which he has only done once this season.

FAVOURITE: Despite losing by a 20 point margin to the Cowboys just a month ago, the Canberra Raiders are favourites to get their third win of the season.

MY TIP: Drinkwater looked good at fullback last week, and the Cowboys will be fired up after such a close one last week. North Queensland by 8.

Easter Bunnies take on defiant Dogs

The saying used to go that "something always happens when the Eels play the Bulldogs" - in the past decade, it's certainly true that the saying now applies to this spicy contest.

Despite the Bulldogs relative lack of success in the last five years, clashes between these two historic rivals - the second oldest head-to-head match up in the premiership behind the Rabbitohs-Roosters rivalry - have had plenty of spice.

Of course, the most famous of these recent clashes hark back to the middle of last decade when the Rabbitohs claimed their 21st title over the Bulldogs in the 2014 decider, and the following clash on Good Friday 2015, where Canterbury were inches from redemption before a controversial late penalty goal saw South Sydney home 18-17.

Fast forward to 2021 and two unforgettable clashes will be stuck in the memory of both teams for reasons they'd rather blank out. On Good Friday, Canterbury copped a 38-0 hammering from the Bunnies, but the boys in red and green came out of the clash with huge concerns one the Match Review Committee came together - Cody Walker and Keaon Koloamatangi subject to suspension in the weeks that followed. When the two sides met again in Round 18, Canterbury were far more competitive - then the halftime siren went. For reasons that still remain a mystery, young halfback Lachlan Lewis opted to take Cody Walker down with a wrestling style tackle as the teams walked off at the break. Leading 12-10 at the time and with Lewis spending the first ten minutes of the second half in the sin bin, the 'Dogs stumbled through the second half as Souths ultimately recorded a 32-24 victory.

That brings us to 2022. South Sydney - minus star half Adam Reynolds - have won two of five in the new season but have remained competitive throughout. They were shellshocked by Brisbane in Round 1 before losses to the Storm and Panthers in Rounds 2 and 4. Their wins have come over the Roosters and Dragons.

The Bulldogs are an enigma at the moment. They started with promise - a win over the Cowboys to open the season has been followed by four losses. They kept things close against Brisbane and Manly, but have suffered more considerably in larger losses to both Melbourne and Penrith. Selection issues in the halves have - for yet another season already plagued Trent Barrett's team.

Speaking of selection - Souths face a serious challenge as they embark on a two-month period where fullback Latrell Mitchell will miss out through injury. Blake Taaffe earns the nod to replace him as has been the case in the last 18 months when Mitchell has been unavailable. Taaffe's promotion from the bench to the custodian role sees Hame Sele get a chance on the interchange.

Canterbury have largely stuck solid with a side that earned limited praise for a better effort against Penrith last week, with coach Barrett opting for only one change - Ava Seumanufagai dropping to the reserves and Chris Patolo earning a recall to the interchange. Corey Allan - who has missed the opening month of action through injury - is listed in the reserves and could displace Jake Averillo if passed fit.

WHO TO WATCH: One big question mark this year for the Rabbitohs has been edge defending. The wing covered by Jaxson Paulo and now Josh Mansour has often been exploited by opposition attack. If Canterbury can use the ball to the width of the field on the Mansour wing, there could be opportunities abound. In attack, Mansour has proved he still has the skill and class to finish with the best of them.

Five rounds, no tries. That record would be troubling Josh Addo-Carr as much as it would Canterbury fans. The 'Foxx' will no doubt be buoyed by the try assist he provided Joe Stimson against Penrith last Sunday but his inside men will need to find him more ball if he's going to get on the scoresheet. Speaking of halves, Kyle Flanagan performed well in his baptism of fire against Penrith last week - it will help the 'Dogs if he can be allowed to get his feet firm on the ground and continue to relieve Matt Burton's load.

FAVOURITE: Souths, of course. It'll be a surprise if Canterbury are listed as favourite for any match until they face the Wests Tigers or St George Illawarra.

MY TIP: Another Good Friday classic is coming up - you can just sense it. Souths will win but it'll be entertaining, unlike last year's one-way traffic. Souths by 6.

Panthers primed to pounce on Haas-less Broncos

Father-son duo Ivan and Nathan Cleary have been locked in on long-term deals until 2027.

Now, the Penrith Panthers will look to celebrate the double signing boost in style when they take on the Brisbane Broncos on Friday night.

The Panthers cruised to a 32-12 last-start win over the Bulldogs and will enter Friday's game on just a five-day turnaround.

But with the luxury of sticking with the same 17 that was named last week, there is little disruption for the defending premiers, who will be looking to continue their unbeaten start to the season.

Outside of their round two clash with the Dragons, the Panthers have not really been challenged this year - a daunting prospect for the rest of the competition.

Izack Tago and Taylan May have formed a lethal new-look combination on the left edge while even Matt Eisenhuth topped the Panthers for run metres last week in further proof of their unrivalled depth.

The Panthers are shooting for 20-straight wins at BlueBet Stadium on Friday and are aiming to become the first reigning premier since the Storm of 2013 to start a season 6-0.

Brisbane, meanwhile, has come undone since a promising start to its 2022 campaign, dropping three-straight games.

The Broncos were much-improved last week against the Roosters but left it too late in a 24-20 defeat.

In a hammer blow to Brisbane's chances of an upset this week, Payne Haas will serve a onegame suspension for his altercation with halfback Albert Kelly.

Corey Jensen comes into the front row while Adam Reynolds (knee) and Corey Oates (ankle) are under injury clouds but should be alright to play.

WHO TO WATCH: Nathan Cleary has been relatively quiet in his first two games back from injury, at least by his lofty standards. It is only a matter of time before Cleary explodes with his first man-of-the-match performance of the year and it could very well come this week. With Haas missing, the Broncos will struggle to match Penrith's forwards and that superior platform should allow Cleary to kick the Panthers to victory. It should also see him take the line on more often.

If Brisbane is any hope of an upset, it will come from individual brilliance and Kotoni Staggs has that in spades. Staggs, like Cleary, had also been quiet to open the season but that was more a case of getting limited ball in space. In recent weeks though and in particular last week, Staggs showed exactly what he can do if given early ball. Staggs erupted for a try, 14 tackle busts, two linebreaks and almost 200 run metres last week. Dane Gagai had some success a few weeks ago against Penrith and Staggs could also be a threat on the edge if he gets the chance.

FAVOURITE: The Panthers are strong favourites to get the job done.

MY TIP: If Haas was in, the Panthers may be vulnerable off a five-day turnaround. But without him, it is hard to see Brisbane keeping this close. Penrith by 26.

Titans return to haunt Manly at Brookvale

Manly return home to 4 Pines Park for just the second time in six rounds.

After recent road trips to Mudgee and Newcastle, of all the sides, the Titans would be last on Des Hasler's invite list.

Manly hold the upper hand with victories in three of the past four contests, including two thumping wins last season. The most recent, an astonishing 56-24 hiding that saw the Sea Eagles light up Cbus Super Stadium with 48 unanswered second half points.

But it's at Brookvale where the Titans have proven to be the Sea Eagles' kryptonite.

Ever since funky winger Kevin Gordon scored a double in 2010, the boys from the Sunset Strip have largely been an immovable force, finishing in front on five of six occasions. And with a combined tally of 120 points from their past three visits, the Titans have done everything but plant the club flag.

This week, the return of centre Brian Kelly adds spark to an outfit that stormed home last Saturday to give premiership contenders Parramatta an almighty fright.

But with their three defeats this season coming at a combined aggregate of just 12 points, if Justin Holbrook had one wish, it would be for sustained periods of concentration.

For Manly, last week's comprehensive win over Newcastle in the absence of Tom Trbojevic will have done wonders for their confidence.

Although more predictable with ball in hand, Daly Cherry-Evans will be key given five of Manly's past nine tries have come from kicks.

This week they'll miss Morgan Harper with rookie Tolutau Koula named to replace the COVID-stricken centre.

And with tough games against the Sharks and Rabbitohs to follow, a fourth straight win for Manly would ease the burden caused by Turbo's troublesome knee.

While for the Titans, it's all about consistency. Currently alternating in a win-loss cycle, this week points to a much needed win that would leave them well placed to buck the trend against the Cowboys the following week.

WHO TO WATCH: He didn't feature in the Dally M points against Newcastle, but Dylan Walker should have. With a deft pass and a sneaky grubber, the bulked up benchie laid on two tries to make sure the Knights left empty handed.

Add to that his 120m through centre field, and there's little else the underrated jack of all trades could have crammed into his 46 minutes on the park.

If AJ Brimson was in charge of the draw, Brookvale would be on the Titans' list every fortnight. The former fullback has five tries to his name against the Sea Eagles, all at the Pittwater Road venue - in just three appearances.

Still finding his feet in the No.6 jumper, the Origin star has only one try and a single line break to show for his efforts in 2022, but it's his try assists from the boot that will have Des Hasler flapping like a stranded catfish at low tide.

FAVOURITE: Buyer beware. Manly are the favourite in this one, just as they have been in all their defeats to the Gold Coast on home turf.

MY TIP: After a slow start against quality opposition, Manly have steadily improved against three middle of the road sides. The Titans fall into that basket, but with two defeats by a converted try or less against the high flying Eels, they're a real danger. In what could be another shoot out, look for Cherry-Evans to kick the Titans curse. Sea Eagles by 1.

Match of the Round billing as the Sharks circle in-form Storm

It's the match of the round between two in-form teams, the Melbourne Storm and the Cronulla Sharks at AAMI Park. Both sides have been impressive to start the season, with the two sides only losing one match in tight situations. This one promises to be the toughest challenge of the reborn Sharks season thus far. Cronulla will have to defy a poor head to head record at AAMI Park, winning only 2 of the 12 clashes at the venue since it opened in 2010.

Melbourne won convincingly in Wagga Wagga over a poor Canberra side 30-14 last weekend with the usual suspects of Papenhuyzen, Munster and Hughes combining making things look incredibly easy for the Storm. Cronulla poached two of Melbourne's best last season in Nicho Hynes and Dale Finucane, so expect a bit of a welcoming committee for those two in this one from the Melbourne forwards. Melbourne's middle defence has improved considerably from where they were two weeks ago after that heartbreaking loss to Parramatta. However, Cronulla's pack has been slowly building a solid reputation and will be looking to add Melbourne to the list of big scalps that they've claimed this season. Look for Nelson Asofa-Solomona and underrated middle forward Josh King to put pressure on the Sharks forwards from the outset. As far as the team news is concerned, Melbourne have opted for just one change on the bench with Tyran Wishart returning from a three week layoff to replace Alec McDonald on the bench in an otherwise settled 17.

Cronulla on the other hand has been the most improved side in the competition to start the season. Under new coach Craig Fitzgibbon, Cronulla has won their last four games on the trot and are looking like a team that could compete for a top 4 spot. Their spine had many question marks at the beginning of the season, but the three fullback combination of Kennedy, Moylan and Hynes has worked a treat early on. The only knock I have on Nicho Hynes' game thus far is his decision making with the footy, he seems to run the ball to the line and dummy 90% of the time making it easy for the defence to read the situation. With a Melbourne defence that knows his game so well, expect Hynes to have some surprise moments that stun the Storm. One area of concern, however, would be the poor completion rate and silly penalties Cronulla gave away against the Tigers last week. Even though they came away with the two competition points with relative ease, you can't complete at 66% and lose the penalty count against the top teams like Melbourne who are notorious for punishing sides off errors and ill-discipline. Craig Fitzgibbon will no doubt use these stats as a significant point of emphasis this weekend. As far as team selection is concerned, Aidan Tolman returns on the bench after his battle with COVID with Royce Hunt shifting back to the reserves.

WHO TO WATCH: Much of Melbourne's attack has been created through the tactical genius of Jahrome Hughes. Hughes was given the keys to the Melbourne attack towards the end of 2019 and hasn't looked back since. Fresh off a new contract extension, Hughes is in career-best form aiming for the New Zealand number 7 spot for the mid-season test against Tonga. Hughes' running game is well documented, but it's his kicking game that has been the dominant feature at Melbourne. Look for Hughes to continue his solid start to 2022.

Cronulla's unsung hero for the last three seasons is determined fullback Will Kennedy. Kennedy has been an impressive player for the Sharks over the last three seasons playing regular first-grade footy and his form so far in 2022 backs this up. The Sharks custodian has averaged 117m a game this season scoring three tries and breaking the line on 8 occasions. Kennedy has a tough positional match-up against Melbourne's inform full-back Ryan Papenhuyzen. However, if Kennedy can muster a good performance and set up the Sharks sets with solid kick returns, Cronulla is a good chance of sniffing the upset here.

FAVOURITE: Melbourne is the favourite with the bookies for this one and considering the head to head record at AAMI Park, it's not a surprise.

MV TIP: In a game where not much separates the teams on the competition table, everything is pointing to a close encounter. If Cronulla can cut out the ill-discipline that slipped into their game against the Tigers, they'll have every chance of causing an upset with the work of Nicho Hynes proving the difference. There were some defensive issues for the Storm that have been notable this season, particularly down Melbourne's left which could see Talakai and Mulitalo continue their impressive form thus far this season. Cronulla has been impressive and I'm going to go the upset in this one. Cronulla by 4.

Easter Sunday rugby league heads to the Sydney Cricket Ground for an all top 8 battle between two sides that have yet to find consistency this season when the Sydney Roosters play host to the New Zealand Warriors.

The Roosters have yet to find any consistency this season across the first five rounds of the competition and have left many scratching their heads at their struggles. The tricolours have won three of their opening five matches but have yet to find their best so far across the three matches.

Last weekend, the Roosters struggled their way to victory against the Broncos, a side that they were expected to beat heavily after their big win over the Cowboys the week prior. Forced to come from 10-0 down, the Eastern Suburbs side struggled to put Brisbane to the sword and it was only thanks to an off night for Adam Reynolds, that the game didn't go into golden point. The Roosters had to come from behind twice and then stave off a late comeback attempt to ensure the victory.

The Roosters welcome back Sam Verrills for his long-awaited return to the NRL this season, whilst Sio Siua Taukeiaho has been named in the 17 despite missing last week with a calf injury. The return of the two players means that Roosters coach Trent Robinson has left Drew Hutchinson and Daniel Suluka-Fifita out of the 17 and named them on the reserves bench.

Another side that has struggled for consistency across the opening five rounds has been the New Zealand Warriors although they have surprised many with three wins this season as well all coming in the past three successive games against sides admittedly having their owns struggles.

Last weekend, it took the Warriors 82 minutes to score their third successive victory with Shaun Johnson's golden point field goal being the difference in their 25-24 victory over the Cowboys in Redcliffe last week. Although Walker might publicly have the confidence of his coach, a poor performance in both attack and defence could put him under pressure.

Being one of the biggest names in Rugby League especially when it comes to New Zealand, Shaun Johnson is a favourite of many whether he played for their club or not. Returning to the Warriors, a whole country's spotlight turns on to SJ whenever he plays and after stepping up to seal the match-winning field goal last week, Johnson is going to be expected to stand up. Dragons, Knights to rise to the occasion

A little over 2000 years ago, a resurrection took place (allegedly).

On Sunday afternoon, the St George Illawarra Dragons and the Newcastle Knights will be hoping for something similar when they clash in Wollongong.

Coming into the Easter Sunday encounter in 14th and 11th on the premiership ladder respectively, both teams will be determined to halt a disappointing run of losses and deliver on the promise shown over the opening rounds.

Slumping to their fourth loss from five matches to emphatically rank as the worst defensive side in the league, the St George Illawarra Dragons will be hoping to overcome an underwhelming record at WIN Stadium after winning three of their eight fixtures at the venue during the pandemic.

Making little impression against the Rabbitohs during last Saturday's 24-12 defeat at Accor Stadium, coach Anthony Griffin has responded by recalling experienced duo Josh McGuire and George Burgess onto the bench in place of Aaron Woods and Jackson Ford.

Dominating their opponents with 13 wins from 17 meetings over the past decade, the last time the Dragons hosted the Knights in Wollongong coincidentally took place on Easter Sunday four years ago.

Going from competition leaders to sitting outside the top eight in the wake of three straight losses, the Newcastle Knights will be looking to regain a 50 per cent success rate in a rare appearance at WIN Stadium.

Winning two of their four previous visits to the venue against the joint venture, coach Adam O'Brien has been forced into changes after Dominic Young and Jirah Momoisea joined the side's mounting injury ward following last Thursday's 30-6 loss to the Sea Eagles at home.

Recalling David Klemmer into the starting side with Jacob Saifiti reverting to the bench, the biggest inclusion of the round sees winger Edrick Lee make his long-awaited return after a wretched run with injury.

WHO TO WATCH: Mikaele Ravalawa may not be held in the same esteem as some of the great Fijian speedster to feature in the NRL over the past decade, yet you would be hard pressed to find a player in the Dragons ranks capable of influencing a result quite like the powerhouse winger. Producing a man of the match performance with a hat-trick, five tackle breaks and three line breaks in the side's only win this season, the 24-year-old has struggled to replicate those numbers in ensuing weeks. Averaging 160 running metres each week to rank well above any forward at the club, the Dragons will need Ravalawa to be at his best in order to break through for a much-needed win.

Set to make his first appearance in the NRL since the first week of the finals in 2020, strike winger Edrick Lee will be out to make up for lost time. Missing the entirety of last season with a foot injury that threatened to prematurely draw the curtain on his career, opponents can expect the 29-year-old Queensland representative to be heavily involved with the ball in hand while providing the Knights with an added threat under the high ball through his height. Growing in confidence after three matches leading up to his return in reserve grade, look for Lee to give a solid account of himself in a bid to hold down a place in the top 17 for the rest of the year.

FAVOURITE: Despite staring down the prospect of their worst start to a season since 2008, the Dragons are favoured to get the job done at home.

MY TIP: Gaining plenty of plaudits over the opening fortnight with wins on the road and at home, the Knights should prevail in a tight affair if they can get back to a style of play built around effort and patience. Knights by 4.

Eels look to continue dominance, Tigers to search for unlikely first win 20-4

The traditional Easter Monday matchup between the Eels and Tigers has been incredibly one-sided in recent years, and barring a miracle that trend looks set to continue in Round 6. Parramatta have gotten off to an extremely hot start to the season, winning 4 of their first 5, which isn't really a surprise when you look at their recent results across the opening weeks of the year. In the opening 8 rounds of the last 3 years, the Eels are 20 wins and 4 losses, 24-5 if you include 2022 so far. Since having the opportunity to clinch a finals berth with a last round win over the Sharks in 2019, the Tigers have been in gradual decline, culminating in what you see now as a team in absolute shambles, with seemingly no reason for optimism, with their best shot at a victory being cruelly taken from them courtesy of a last sitch Toby Sexton kick two weeks ago.

Last week, the Eels got off to a flying start against the Titans, racing out to a 14-0 half time lead before making it a 20 point margin with just over half an hour to go. They then proceeded to let their opposition back into the game, with the Gold Coast scoring the next 3 tries and the final score ending 26-20 in favour of the Eels. The late game fade-out is definitely a cause for concern out West, especially some of the defensive efforts present from their big men on David Fifita's runaway try, however they will also draw some confidence that their playmakers were able to overcome the hurdles and make the crucial decisions when it mattered, with Moses' execution of a crossfield kick that ended in a Dylan Brown try being what ultimately won them the game.

As for the Tigers, their previous two close losses were followed by a blowout loss to the Sharks. It was over as soon as the ball was put into flight on the opening kickoff; the Sharks had all the momentum immediately and while they weren't able to convert that into points straight away, they did whittle the Tigers down throughout, culminating in a final scoreline of 30-4. While the spotlight is continually shone on the Tigers spine for their struggles, and they are certainly not without blame, however the front-rowers for the joint venture simply can't win contac battle and do not generate metres or momentum with their carries. Per @ LeagueEyeTest on Twitter, the Tigers only have 11.99% of their total metres gained coming from their prop forwards, the second lowest in the NRL and well below the league average of 15.2% and significantly lower than their opposition on Sunday, with the Eels big men accounting for 18.74% of their total metres. It will take a herculean effort from the Tigers pack to match it with the Eels on Monday and give them any chance at all of causing the upset.

In team news, the Eels have suffered yet another injury on the wing, with Waqa Blake being the latest to be sidelined indefinitely. Brad Arthur has opted to move Will Penisini to the wing as a result, while Marata Niukore comes into the side as a centre. Junior Paulo is out due to suspension, replaced by Oregon Kaufusi in the starting pack, while the return of Shaun Lane sees Ryan Matterson go back to the bench. Hayze Perham has been given the last interchange spot instead of Bryce Cartwright. For the Tigers, Michael Maguire has wielded the axe. Daine Laurie returns at fullback, pushing Starford To'a to the wing, while recent recruits Oliver Gildart and Ken Maumalo have been dropped, the latter to accommodate the return of James Roberts. The return of Jackson Hastings sees Jock Madden go back to the bench, while Jacob Liddle has been dropped due to poor performance, replaced by Simpkin. Tyrone Peachey is the other big name that has been dropped.

WHO TO WATCH: The move from Penrith to Parramatta has been extremely fruitful for Reagan Campbell-Gillard, and last week the former origin player had one of his best outings yet, running for over 190 metres in the first half alone. He finished with 20 runs for 241 metres (104 post contact), while also making a tackle break and making 37 tackles with only 1 miss. It wasn't just this one game in isolation that has Campbell-Gillard putting up impressive numbers. He has 342 post-contact metres on the season so far, the third most among front rowers, while also having 868 total running metres, with the only front-rower with more being Payne Haas of the Broncos (892). With his fellow stalwart Junior Paulo sitting on the sidelines for this one, it will be up to RCG to pick up even more slack for the Eels, and based on recent performances he will be more than capable of doing what's required.

For the Tigers, Luciano Leilua has been consistently one of their best forwards in a pack that has struggled for metres. Last week he ran for an extremely efficient 133 metres from 13 runs to go with 3 tackle breaks and 29 tackles with only 2 misses. On the season, Leilua ranks in the top 8% among front rowers for metres per run (stats again courtesy of the League Eye Test), and when watching the Tigers play it is clear the Leilua is extremely gifted at finding open space and accelerating into it, while also being able to consistently bend the line once contact is initiated. If the teams run out as listed, Leilua will be matched up on an edge against Shaun Lane, who can occasionally struggle defensively. Look for Leilua to have another impressive outing, even if his team doesn't.

FAVOURITE: The Eels are 20.5 point favourites over the Tigers in this one

MV TIP: Obviously I think the Eels are going to win, however it could be by less than expected with the Blue and Gold missing Waqa Blake and Junior Paulo, who are both in their top 5 for total metres gained. Eels by 10.
