## THE IMPORTAN OF A GOOD START

### **ANDREW FERGUSON** CRUNCHES THE NUMBERS AFTER A THIRD OF THE SEASON HAS BEEN PLAYED. HOW IS YOUR TEAM FARING?

The season is now a third of the way completed and so it's a good time to look back at past statistics to see if we can make any determinations about the future of each club this season - statistically speaking.

The following analysis is for the last decade between 2012 and 2021 and will look at how teams were performing at the end of Round 8 - and how they fared by the end of the regular season.

There's a 76.25% chance that a team in the top 8 at the end of Round 8, will still be there by the end of the regular season.

Only the team in first place after Round 8 has a perfect record of going on to make the finals. The last time the top side after eight rounds failed to make the finals was in 2006 when the Cowboys started the season with six wins from eight games, before winning just five of their remaining 16 games to finish 9th, one win outside the top eight.

At the other end of the table, the bottom two placed sides at the end of Round 8 have not reached the finals in the past decade. The 1999 Broncos were the last 16th place, and second last place after eight rounds to reach the finals. They started with just a win and a draw from their first eight games, and even lost their next two to drop down to last place, before winning their next 11-straight to sneak into 8th.

As far as last place is concerned, Balmain in 1975 were last and managed to reach a play-off for 5th place, which they lost to Parramatta.

Interestingly though, over the past decade, teams who were sitting in 10th place after 8 Rounds, had a better chance of finishing in the top 8 than sides that were place 7th at the one-third mark of the season.

Some good news for the strong starting sides too, is that no team in the top 8 after eight Rounds has finished the season with the wooden spoon in the last decade. The last official time this happened was in 2002 when the Bulldogs were hit with a loss of all their competition points due to salary cap breaches, which sent them plummetting from first to last.

The other telling stat from the past decade surrounds the Premiers - every year they have been placed in the top 8 after eight rounds - and on eight occasions they've been in the top four after Round 8 (four times in first position). The eventual premiers have gone on to finish the season in the top three every year for the past decade.

Interestingly, the eventual premier has been in second place on the ladder at the end of the season in four of the last ten seasons, but has never been sitting in second place after eight rounds.

So if we're looking at the 2022 ladder after eight Rounds, and using the data of the last decade:

- Melbourne will not win the Grand Final.
- Penrith will definitely be in the top 8.
- The Bulldogs and Knights will not make the finals.
- Penrith, Melbourne, North Queensland, Cronulla, Parramatta, Souths, Sydney and Manly will not collect the wooden spoon.

Now before we lock that all in, we need to look at each club individually. If we look at the ladder position of each team at the end of Round 8 compared to the end of the regular season, we can see which teams get better or worse as the season rolls on.

Over the past decade after Round 8, the Roosters have improved 70% of the time, with Panthers, Storm and Bulldogs all at 60%, while at the other end of the table, the Dragons have only improved 10%, with the Knights at 20%.

So while the ladder positional stats suggest that the Dragons are a better chance of making the finals than the Roosters, the team-specific stats boldly states the very opposite.

Also over the past decade:

- Every time the Sharks have been in the top 8 after eight rounds, they've gone on to make the finals
- The Titans have never made the finals when placed 11th or lower
- Every time the Storm have won the title, they've been placed in the top 3 at both Round 8 and at the end of the regular season
- The Knights have sat in the last 2 places after Round 8 on three occasions. Twice they ended up with the wooden spoon, the other occasion they finished 12th
- Every time the Cowboys have been placed in the top 8 after eight rounds, they've made the finals
- Every time Parramatta has been in the top 8 after Round 8, they've failed to improve their ladder position by the end of the
- The Dragons have fallen further down the ladder every year bar one in the last decade after the one third point of the season. The one exception was in 2020 when they rose from 13th to 12th otherwise they average a drop of four ladder positions
- Every time the Roosters have been in the top 8 after eight rounds. they've gone on to finish the regular season in the top 5
- The Warriors have never made the finals when outside the top 8 after Round 8
- The Tigers always finish in the bottom 8 irrespective of whatever happens after 8 Rounds have been played

Oh, and gamble responsibly.

#### SUPER STAGGS POWERS BRONCOS TO UPSET WIN

Kotoni Staggs thoroughly outpointed the in-form Siosifa Talakai as the Brisbane Broncos made a statement in a 16-7 upset win over the Cronulla Sharks.

While the match-up between Staggs and Talakai was billed as the headline act of the night, it was one-way traffic as the Broncos centre dominated on the right edge. He finished the game with 113 metres, six tackle busts and a try while forcing a few uncharacteristic errors from Talakai with some bruising defence.

The Brisbane defence as a whole was a highlight while the fact Payne Haas only had to play 55 minutes spoke volumes to just how much of a team effort it was. Haas went off early with a shoulder issue and was not needed to return as the Broncos held strong for a win.

For Cronulla, a lack of energy and impatience in attack proved costly. The Sharks looked dangerous on multiple occasions in the first half but lacked their usual precision passing on the edges. After all, Cronulla's only points of the opening half came in broken play, with five-eighth Matt Moylan kicking ahead for himself to score under the posts.

A host of errors from both sides resulted in a dour 10-minute period in the middle of the first half before some individual brilliance from Staggs brought the Suncorp faithful to their feet.

Te Maire Martin simply dished the ball off to Staggs in space and the Broncos centre then beat Talakai before surging past Ronaldo Mulitalo to dive over in the corner.

Nicho Hynes slotted a late field goal in the only other score of the half, seeing the Sharks head into the sheds up 7-6.

Brisbane received a big boost heading into the second half, with both Adam Reynolds (nose) and Haas (shoulder) returning despite carrying injury concerns into the sheds. nd the Broncos were the first to get on the board, with Jesse Ramien caught out in defence as Herbie Farnworth went over in the 43rd minute.

Suddenly Brisbane found itself on a roll as Kurt Capewell charged over after an earlier linebreak from Corey Oates had the Broncos in prime field position. The Sharks had a few chances to hit back later in the game but failed to capitalise on their field position as the Broncos held on for what could be a season-defining win.

Adam Reynolds faces his former Rabbitohs teammates next week while the Sharks come up against ex-Cronulla halfback Shaun Johnson and the Warriors.

#### PANTHERS PROWL ON THE GOLD COAST

Penrith Panthers continue their unbeaten start to the season with a 18-4 success against Gold Coast Titans on Friday night at Robina.

Jim Ross would describe this game as "bowling shoe ugly" as the Panthers did enough to secure two points. Nathan Cleary led the way with a personal tally of 10 points alongside a pair of try assists to keep the good times rolling.

The first half was an error-fest sometimes interrupted by a football game. Both games were abject with their handling and it led to a 4-0 scoreline headed into half-time. The surprise was that Gold Coast Titans held those four points after Greg Marzhew's late score after some razzle dazzle.

Panthers decided to press the accelerator in the second half. The visitors scored four minutes into the second stanza when Izack Tago held onto the grubber from Cleary after an u-and-down first half with his hands to make it 6-4.

Cleary doubled the delight for the Panthers just minutes later. He took the ball to the line, fed Villiame Kikau, who flopped it back to the halfback to dive over close to the sticks and stretched the visitors advantage to eight.

The Titans weren't going away after their dogged effort in the first half. The hosts regularly got into the right field positions but their options were bland and easily gobbled up by the ferocious Panthers defence.

Panthers added some late icing to the cake through Jarome Luai. Cleary again was the architect with a perfect grubber that bounced right up for Luai to take on the bounce and start the celebrations for the Premiers, 18-4.

There might be something rotten in the state of Titansmark. There is plenty of talent in the team, but they can't seem to put together a consistent 80 minutes or even at times, 40 minutes and might have lost star backrower David Fifita to injury. There is plenty for coach Justin Holbrook to ponder.

This is another pocketed two points for the Panthers before they head into a wicked part of their schedule. The Premiers have Melbourne, Parramatta and Sydney Roosters in quick succession which will put their streak to the test.

#### **SOUTHS SURGE AGAINST 12-MAN SEA EAGLES**

The South Sydney Rabbitohs have withstood a gallant performance from the Manly Sea Eagles to claim a spirited 40-22 victory at Central Coast Stadium.

Playing against 12 men for 70 minutes after Karl Lawton was sent off for a dangerous tackle on Cameron Murray in the opening stages, the Rabbitohs extended their dominance over the Sea Eagles to six consecutive wins in a match played before a crowd of 17,284 supporters.

Despite conceding first points via a Blake Taaffe penalty goal following Lawton's dismissal, the Sea Eagles showed tremendous resilience with Kieran Foran (16th minute) taking on the line through a run reminiscent of his younger self.

Taking a shock 10-2 lead midway through the first half, Jason Saab (19th minute) used his height to outleap Alex Johnston before narrowly getting the ball down before the dead ball line.

Struggling to capitalise on their one-man advantage early on in the half, the Rabbitohs found their attacking groove with Siliva Havili firing a short pass to Keaon Koloamatangi (27th minute) before Alex Johnston (32nd minute) used speed and footwork to collect his sixth try of the season.

Hitting back through Christian Tuipulotu (37th minute) following a skilful offload from returning utility Josh Schuster, an error from Martin Taupau off the kick-off invited Isaiah Tass (40th minute) to put the Rabbitohs up 18-16 at the change of ends

Returning from the sheds intent on keeping the points flowing, Tom Burgess (46th minute) barged over from close range before Cody Walker (50th minute) capped his his 150th first grade game with a try.

Determined to remain in the contest despite an injury toll that forced Brad Parker from the field, Daly Cherry-Evans (58th minute) was awarded a penalty try after Damien Cook was deemed to have impeded the Manly skipper in the act of scoring.

Putting the result beyond doubt through Cameron Murray (71st minute), Central Coast junior Taaffe (80th minute) delivered on home soil to secure the 18-point win.

Next week, the Rabbitohs host the Broncos at Accor Stadium on Thursday evening, while the Sea Eagles return home to Lottoland on Saturday afternoon to take on the Tigers.

#### **ASI WARRIORS WIN PUNISHINGLY BAD CONTEST**

Daejarn Asi had a brilliant debut for the Warriors, playing a chief role in two tries to keep his side in the game, before a Shaun Johnson field goal in Golden Point got the Warriors home 21-20 over Canberra in Redcliffe today.

Arguably the two worst performing sides of the previous round went head-to-head at Redcliffe with one of them set to redeem themselves while the other would undoubtedly find themselves under more pressure.

Both sides played with too much ill-discipline in the first half, preventing either outfit to build pressure or momentum. It was the Raiders though who managed to score first when Jack Wighton put Matthew Timoko through a weak tackle effort to score. Brad Schneider converted to give the Raiders a 6-0 lead after 8 minutes.

Schneider added a penalty goal in the 15th minute after a string of Warriors penalties.

The Warriors got on the board in the 25th minute when Jordan Rapana fielded a bomb, then threw a long ball to Nick Cotric, where it bounced up, but Cotric knocked it on and the Warriors cleaned up. From the next play the Warriors went left where Euan Aitken got a good ball out to Adam Pompey who scored in the corner. Reece Walsh converted from touch.

From the restart, Addin Fonua-Blake dropped the ball. The Raiders then got a set restart shortly after. From the ensuing set they produced some nice second phase play which resulted in Hudson Young straightening his run and beating the defence to score near the sticks. Schneider converted.

In the 31st minute, Daejarn Asi put in a lovely chip which Jordan Rapana looked set to clean up, but he slipped and Viliami Vailea got a nice bounce, regathered and scored. Walsh converted.

Four minutes before halftime, Jack Wighton went on a run as second receiver, fended off one defender, bumped out of a tackle and palmed off a third to score a soft try. Schneider again converted. At halftime the Raiders lead 20-12.

The second half was quite simply a mess of dropped ball, bad passes and ill-discipline.

It was until the 63rd minute before the scoring continued when Asi dropped a lovely short ball in the line into the hard running Aitken, who strolled through the vacant Raiders defence and he scored under the posts. Walsh converted to reduce the Warriors deficit to just 2 points.

The last five minutes were remarkable if you were a Cowboys fan, if you were a Parra fan you were very quickly reaching for the off button on your TV remote. Jason Taumalolo made a good bust through the middle before Tom Dearden showed and goed to put an exclamation point on a dominant display. Off the next set, Drinkwater found the Hammer who barely got out of second gear and burnt past Gutherson to cross for the visitors. ## THE PREVIEW

#### with Jason Hosken

Rabbitohs chase Broncos get-square.

Both the Rabbitohs and Broncos enter Round 9 with an identical four-and-four win-loss record.

For Kevin Walters, after just seven victories in 2021, it's a dream start. For Jason Demetriou and his top-four regulars, it could well be the cusp of a nightmare.

The trouble for South Sydney started at Suncorp back in Round 1. That night - against the odds - the Broncos held firm and kicked on after lights out. Since then the Rabbitohs have coughed and sputtered their way to sixth spot on the ladder.

Now for the first time on Thursday night, Adam Reynolds - for so long the red-and-green lynchpingets the chance to show his former teammates what they've been missing.

It promises plenty, and given both clubs have a soft draw in the fortnight that follows, a win here could be a crucial step in a season-defining run.

Coming off a heartbreaking one-point loss to the Tigers, Souths bounced back last week to down a 12-man Manly. Despite the extra player, they left it late before eventually controlling the middle.

Now back at Sydney Olympic Park, the Rabbitohs once again hold all the aces in the pack. Payne Haas is a massive out for Brisbane, and it's not just last season's Dally M Prop of the Year they'll miss. Injury also prevents the reliable Kurt Capewell from boarding the bus.

On the plus side, pocket-rocket backrower TC Robati comes in for Capewell while Patrick Carrigan slides into Haas' boots. The only change to the Rabbitohs' top-17 is the addition of bench prop Liam Knight, pushing Davvy Moale out of the 17.

Centre Isaiah Tass retains his place on Souths' lethal left edge, but it will be the two-gamer's battle with a rampant Kotoni Staggs that could decide the contest. Against the Sharks, the Origin hopeful's solo effort heading into the break proved decisive in Brisbane's low scoring victory.

With a win over Canterbury, Brisbane are already one-from-one at the Olympic venue this season, but it's the Rabbitohs who hold the advantage having won five of the past seven against the Broncos including three of the past four at Accor.

WHO TO WATCH: Compared to 2021, Cody Walker is down on key stats and if chat and niggle were measured, he'd be down on that too. Last week's try and two try-assists were a season best, albeit against a depleted opposition.

Now as he prepares to face his long time playmaking partner, expect the excitable No.6 to pack the yappy teeth and bounce onto the park like it's his own backyard.

If not for Staggs' demolition of Cronulla, Adam Reynolds would have scored more recognition. Not only is the halfback looking more comfortable in Brisbane colours by the week, so are his teammates.

And if there is a preferred venue where the Broncos skipper would like to face his old club, surely it's Accor Stadium - the old Stadium Australia. Some call it the Cavern, for Reynolds it doesn't matter, this will be his 100th NRL appearance at the venue, and with 28 wins from his last 34 outings, no-one knows it better.

FAVOURITE: South Sydney are short odds to reverse their unexpected first round loss.

MY TIP: A surprise win over Cronulla shows Kevvie Walters has Brisbane on the right track, but one of the last sides he'd want to face without Payne Haas is South Sydney. And if that's not enough, the Broncos have only one victory without the Blues prop since the start of last season. Rabbitohs by 8.

## THE PREVIEW

#### with Josh Robertson

It might not the pinnacle of Rugby League this week but there is two competition points to be won - and both the Canberra Raiders and Canterbury Bulldogs will be in desperate need of a win to help them push back off the foot of the ladder.

Sitting in 14th spot, the Canberra Raiders (or more accurately lately, the 'Faders') have struggled this season to put an 80-minute performance together, barring their efforts in Round 1 to beat Cronulla. Coming off five successive losses, there is a tonne of pressure being piled on the Raiders players for their performances thus far (though strangely, not the coach).

Last weekend was another example not executing for the full 80, with the Raiders blowing a 20-12 lead to fall to a 21-20 golden point defeat at the hands of the Warriors at Redcliffe. Worse still, the Green Machine failed to score a single point in the second half. The performance started strong with a left-field change from Ricky Stuart seemingly working - until the second half collapse and eventual defeat in Golden point.

The axe has been wielded by coach Stuart with a large number of changes to the side, including the return of club legend Jarrod Croker returning from a long stint in NSW Cup. Croker's return has him replacing Semi Valemei in the centres whilst Jordan Rapana moves back to the wing after playing fullback for a fortnight, Charnze Nicoll-Klokstad returning to the #1 jersey. Matt Frawley comes into the halves to replace the suspended Jack Wighton whilst Elliott Whitehead returns from injury in the second row, pushing Harawira-Naera to the bench and Rushton out of the 17. Seb Kris joins the bench while Adam Elliott retains the starting hooker role over Tom Starling.

A host of key signings was meant to make the difference for the Bulldogs in 2022, but poor results on the field paired with off-field instability has seen more of the same for the Belmore club this season. as they languish in 15th spot by a solitary differential point. The Blue-and-Whites though are coming off a victory and will be sure to grow in confidence.

Shocking many, Canterbury took a 16-12 upset victory over the Sydney Roosters in a game where their opponents had more than their fair share of luck to stay in the contest. The Bulldogs started fast opening up a 10-0 lead only for the Roosters to hit back and trail by six before halftime. Many 'Dogs fans weren't confident of holding onto their lead and once they extended it, they were even less confident. Canterbury's defence did survive a late surge from the Roosters to level scores when the Bunker overturned a try, allowing them hold on to their 16-12 lead through to fulltime.

Despite the victory, coach Trent Barrett has made a couple of changes to his side, with veteran Josh Jackson returning to the squad (personally not a great move) after missing last week with COVID. This shifts Max King back to the bench whilst Billy Tsikrikas is out due to suspension. Brent Naden also returns to the side in place of Jayden Okunbor, with the latter returning to the reserves list.

WHO TO WATCH: Back in the top grade for the first time this season, Jarrod Croker has been a longtime hero in the Nation's capital but has seemed to be out of favour with Stuart, who has played the club's greatest ever pointscorer in NSW Cup across the first eight weeks of the season. The veteran will bring experience to the Raiders line up and hopefully some fresh ideas that can change the fortunes of the Green Machine after a torrid opening two months.

Without sounding too harsh or disrespectful, the biggest anchor in the Bulldogs attack this season has been captain and lock Josh Jackson - whose decision to take a hit up often stymies the side's attack. Having a front on view of this during the Bulldogs match against the Panthers a few weeks ago, the veteran's decision making wiped away any pressure that was placed on the competition leaders when they were struggling defensively, putting the pressure back on the 'Dogs halves. Jackson needs to find a balance to his game because the Bulldogs looked better without him last week, and another loss will see pressure on him from the fanbase.

FAVOURITE: As of writing the preview, the game is considered pretty 50/50 with most having both sides equal although there is a slight favouritism to the Raiders by some.

MY TIP: This is a hard game to tip because both sides give you more reasons not to tip them than they do to tip them. In trying to come up with a tip I've typed 'Can', then really couldn't come up with a solid choice. Off the back of defeating the Roosters, I think the Bulldogs will hold a touch more confidence than the Raiders and take out a tight one. Canterbury by 4.

Eels looking to regain electric form against undefeated Panthers

The Penrith Panthers will be looking to continue their undefeated run at BlueBet Stadium, taking on the Parramatta Eels in the match of the round on Friday night. Parramatta was the closest to defeating Penrith at BlueBet in their last regular-season clash before the competition moved to its Queensland hub.

Penrith comes into this Round 9 clash following a scrappy 18-4 victory over a tenacious Gold Coast Titans outfit last Friday night. Ivan Cleary would be disappointed with his side's lack of execution against the Titans last weekend, completing at a poor rate and missing a whopping 50 tackles. Against a Parramatta side desperate to avenge last week's poor showing, Penrith will need to be at their best if they want to continue their undefeated run.

The positive of last week though was they showed that even when they're having an off day, they can still compete and get the job done in danger games, where other top teams have struggled like Cronulla, the Roosters - and Friday's opponents, the Eels. Nathan Cleary dominated proceedings with a dominant kicking game and kept a calm head to get Penrith home. Another impressive player was backrower, Liam Martin. Martin is in a purple patch of form which sees him primed for another NSW berth. Brian To'o and Moses Leota are named in the reserves and are outside chances of returning on Friday night.

Parramatta on the other end would like to forget the trip to Darwin as quickly as they could. They were disappointing going down 35-4 to a renewed Cowboys outfit. What would be of major concern, was the implosion of their right edge defence in the final five minutes - Parramatta conceded 16 points in that short time. However, the Eels has shown that they can match it with the big clubs - they took down Melbourne in Melbourne earlier in the season following a loss, and if the pieces align expect them to give Penrith a run for their money.

Jakob Arthur continued to struggle in the number six jersey - Parramatta had multiple sets on the Cowboys line including 41 tackles inside the opposition 20 which amounted to a solitary try. With that in mind, it's easy to conclude that Arthur's decision making isn't at the level that Dylan Brown's is. Brown can come up with a quick decision on the spot that allows Parramatta to ask questions of the opposition's defensive line. Parramatta's forwards will need to match the intensity of Penrith's pack through the opening stages. If they can go set for set with Penrith and not let the scoreboard blow out quickly which Penrith have a unique ability to do, the Eels are well and truly in this game. Dylan Brown returns to five-eighth with Tom Opacic returning to the centres. Arthur is in the reserves, and Sean Russell is also named in the reserves and is an outside chance to return following a serious rib injury.

WHO TO WATCH: This might be a touch controversial but I believe Jarome Luai hasn't quite found his groove so far in 2022. There's no doubting Luai's talent and ability, but in a Penrith squad which has improved considerably since last season, Luai is yet to fully reach the potential which saw him earn an Origin call up. Luai's running game is quite lateral and sidewards but when he fires, there's no better 5/8 in NSW. This shapes up to be the statement game that solidifies Luai's origin spot.

Reed Mahoney is the heart and soul of Parramatta's attack and defence. Out of dummy half, Mahoney is an elite talent who will be sorely missed when he departs for the greater pastures of Belmore next season. But his impact could decide this contest. Parramatta fans ad nauseum were saying that if Mahoney played last season's semi-final, the Eels defeat the Panthers. Well, this is the chance to put that theory to the test.

FAVOURITE: Penrith unsurprisingly comes into this clash as the favourite. In the NRL era, these rivals met on 45 occasions with Penrith winning 24 of the clashes. At BlueBet Stadium, Parramatta has a horrific record winning only 38% of encounters since 1998.

MY TIP: Penrith has enough strike power to get over an Eels side which continues to have injuries in their backline which will hinder their ability to come out of yardage. Parramatta showed that they could match it with Penrith in last season's finals thriller. I just don't see enough to get Parramatta home and with Penrith's fortress home record, the decision is made a little easier, but they will give Penrith their toughest home test this season. Penrith by 6.

Sea Eagles look to rise to the top against resurgent Tigers

The Manly-Warringah Sea Eagles will be looking to overcome a two-match losing streak when they take on a renewed Wests Tigers outfit to kick off Super Saturday from 4 Pines Park.

Manly come into this clash after an indifferent run of recent form. Their effort last week against South Sydney was commendable when they were given a seemingly impossible task of playing a man short when Karl Lawton was marched for a horror spear tackle on South's captain Cam Murray. hat let Manly down were their effort areas, particularly not placing enough pressure on Cody Walker, who had his best game of the season controlling play and punishing Manly's weakened and troublesome right edge defence.

Their attack looked okay all things considered, but they relied heavily on Josh Schuster down the left to create a spark in the attack. Daly Cherry-Evans is playing some of the best football of his career, and with an Australian World Cup number 7 jersey on the line, you shouldn't expect anything less from the Manly captain. As far as the team news is concerned, Manly is once again decimated by injury and suspension. Karl Lawton's suspension, Brad Parker's partially torn ACL and Jason Saab's toe injury see them all ruled out of Saturday's game. Haumole Olakau'atu returns and takes the place of Lawton. Guess who's back to reignite Manly's season - Tom Trbojevic returns at fullback to provide the spark in Manly's attack. This in turn sees Reuben Garrick return to the wing to cover the loss of Saab. Ben Trbojevic is in the centres replacing Parker. Aloiai returns from a knee injury on the bench.

There's no denying that the West's Tigers have improved considerably on their efforts in the first five rounds. However, their effort last week in attack left a lot to be desired. Jackson Hastings is their most dangerous player, but it is good to see Luke Brooks playing with a more temperament and looking less stressed out on the park. Brooks has one of the best running games of half in the competition and it was on full display when he scored his team's lone try.

Their forwards are in for a rough assignment this week going up against a Manly pack who get Haumole Olakau'atu back from a one-week suspension. One significant point of emphasis for Tigers supporters has been the dummy half position, although Jacob Liddle is a solid choice, tigers fans believe Jake Simpkin is the man to wear the number nine going forward. On the team front, David Nofoaluma is out, Ken Maumalo returns and takes his wing spot. Jake Simpkin replaces Jacob Liddle at hooker, and Alex Seyfarth starts at back-row for the injured Luciano Leilua. Tyrone Peachey replaces Jock Madden as the utility and Stefano Utoikamanu returns to the side via the bench, after a six-week injury layoff.

WHO TO WATCH: Manly's left-hand edge had a spark return on Friday night and it's safe to say Josh Schuster had a remarkable return from injury. Although Schuster went through the game unscathed, the concern I have is the apparent over-reliance on Schuster that the Manly attack appeared to have on him. Whenever the ball went left, Schuster got involved and had a lack of support play going with him. Up against a resurgent Tigers, expect Schuster to become involved and act as a second receiver and work the Tigers' middle.

One man who has had an indifferent start to his Wests Tigers career is UK import Oliver Gildart. It's safe to say Gildart has had a rough initiation to his NRL career, already having been dropped by Michael Maguire. But there's a world of potential for Gildart as evidenced in the matches against the Storm and the Warriors where he was one of their best. Look for Gildart to win his head to head match-up and try and steer the Tigers away from a two-match losing streak and cross for his first try of the season.

FAVOURITE: Manly is the resounding favourite with the bookies. Wests Tigers do have a poor record at Brookvale Oval only winning 3 out of 12 clashes but two of those wins have come in 2018 and 2020.

MY TIP: Manly will be desperate to turn around a poor record to start the season. But if this season has told us anything, expect the unexpected. Wests have a habit of pulling off the upset against their much more fancied opposition (Parramatta & Souths). So expect an ambush early, but I'm of the view the class of Manly will over-run the Tigers in this one especially with Turbo returning. Manly by 4.

Rotten Roosters face off against terrible Titans in Mackay

There's no two ways about it, on current form, the Roosters and the Titans would have to be two of the worst teams in the competition. Even the most passionate fan of either club could not make a case for them being above around 12th in an accurate power ranking. Considering this was a matchup in week 1 of the finals last year, it's fair to say it's been quite the fall from grace, however we are only a third of the way into the season, meaning there is still ample time for Robinson and Holbrook to make necessary changes and get their sides back where they were expected to be.

For the Roosters, the problem lies solely in their pitiful, predictable attack. Their defence is actually quite sound, they average just 15 points conceded in their recent losing streak and are equal 4th in the league for least points conceded. The fact that they have managed to lose to the Dragons and Bulldogs in consecutive weeks despite those defensive numbers should tell you all you need to know about their attack. They've averaged just 12 points over the last two weeks against the 10th and 12th best defences respectively. Watching the Roosters attack inside their oppositions 20 is akin to Shaun Kenny-Dowall taking a hit up out of his own end it's that sideways. No-one seems to know their role, and when the other team inevitably shuts down whatever mediocre shift to the left they attempt, frustration takes over and an error is made.

Unlike the Roosters, the Titans have at least shown glimpses recently of being a competent side, bar two weeks ago against the Cowboys. The main problem for the Gold Coast has been putting a complete performance together. In each of their last four matches, they have lost either the first or second half by 14 points or more, and their two wins have been at home by two points against the lowly Tigers and Warriors. Considering all this, it is somewhat surprising that the Titans have been able to string together 40 minute periods of domination, largely against quality opposition. They won the second half 20-12 against the Eels, 14-2 against the Sea Eagles and shut out Penrith in the first half of their most recent match to lead 4-0 at the break. This Titans team has the ability to attack well and defend well, but they are too mentally weak to convert that ability into wins.

Taking the above into account, this matchup has the potential to be so bad it's good. No one can say for sure when the Titans will show up and how long it'll be for, if at all. The way their opponent is playing, they may only need a quick 10 minute period of two tries and a penalty goal to outscore the Roosters. The definition of insanity, they say, is doing the same thing again and again while expecting different results. Trent Robinson has decided to ignore this and once again not make any unforced changes; Tupou returns to his left wing position and Momirovski is back in the centres after missing last week with a cold. Naiqama and Keighran are out of the side as a result. Sitili Tupouniua maintains his starting spot despite multiple poor performances in a row. For the Titans, it appears Holbrook is also ignoring the definition of insanity; the only change he's made is a forced one, with David Fifita out with a knee injury and replaced on the bench by Sam McIntyre. Holbrook has also kept an underperforming back-rower in the starting side, with Kevin Proctor retaining his spot despite only having 1 run for 4 metres in last weeks loss. In his defence, they were a very gritty and impactful 4 metres.

WHO TO WATCH: To be honest, the way things are going with these two teams you should probably skip this game and spend Saturday Night watching Channing Tatum and Sandra Bullock in their new movie currently in cinemas.

In all seriousness, Luke Keary has to start showing something to indicate that this move to halfback on the right side of the field is worth persisting with. So far, it's been a disaster, with Keary unable to even get close to regaining the form he was in prior to injuring his ACL. His long passing game in attack has been hard to watch, with the ball frequently hitting the turf and/or going behind the intended target. In recent weeks, he has looked most threatening in the brief moments he has run the ball down a short side on the left, something the Keary of yesteryear would do to expose edge defences for fun. It's not like the move is benefitting rookie half Sam Walker either; the youngster is trying to play a role he is not familiar with and is doing so with a partner who is not complimenting him in any way. Significant improvement is needed in those two if the Roosters want to have any hope of living up to being the premiership threat they were touted as pre-season.

For the Titans, Tino Fa'asuamaleaui, or "Big Tino" as he is called by commentators everywhere, has done a sound job in his first year as captain of the Titans. His performances have certainly been captain worthy, often leading his team in total runs, doing just that last week as he amassed 163 metres off of 19 total carries to go along with 7 tackle breaks and an offload. He also got through a mountain of work on the defensive side of the ball, making 40 tackles, again the most of anyone on the team, however he also missed 5, a figure he will want to clean up ahead of this week's game. With the absence of David Fifita, Fa'asuamaleaui might have to somehow find a way to get himself more involved. The inexperienced spine the Titans have will need all the leg ups they can get in trying to get points on the board against a solid Roosters defence, and their forwards giving them some momentum to work with would certainly fit that bill.

FAVOURITE: At the time of writing, the Roosters are favoured by 9.5 points over the Titans.

MY TIP: If David Fifita was playing, I would have absolutely no hesitation in picking the Titans, just look at what Kotoni Staggs did to Momirovski not too long ago. With the lineups the way they are however, this match is a real toss of the coin job. I will say that the Roosters certainly don't deserve to be 9.5 point favourites, the Titans still have a very good shot at winning, but I refuse to believe the Roosters will drop three games in a row against teams they are much better than on paper. Roosters by 1.

But as is always the case, all it takes is for a few wins for the whispers to go away. Now North Queensland has well and truly established itself as the surprise packet of the 2022 season.

The Cowboys have surged to third spot on the ladder, coming off their most impressive win in years – a 35-4 dismantling of the Eels in Darwin.

It leaves Payten in the enviable position of being able to name an unchanged line-up for Saturday's game with the Knights. Newcastle, of course, is back where North Queensland was earlier this year.

The Knights have dropped six games in a row, with back-to-back heavy defeats to Parramatta and Melbourne only casting a larger shadow over coach Adam O'Brien's future.

Like the Cowboys, the Knights have their own big-money superstar in the headlines for the wrong reasons, with Kalyn Ponga the easy target for criticism.

Ponga though has held his spot for this week's game, with O'Brien instead opting for a shake-up in the halves, naming a new-look pairing of Tex Hoy and Phoenix Crossland. It sees Jake Clifford dropped after being benched against the Storm.

Elsewhere, Adam Clune is also sidelined but due to a knee injury. Other changes see Lachlan Fitzgibbon and Dom Young return from knee injuries, replacing Simi Sasagi and Brodie Jones.

Kurt Mann (ankle), meanwhile, is still sidelined with Leo Thompson to start at lock.

WHO TO WATCH: While the Cowboys have named an unchanged side, it will still be interesting to monitor just what they do at the fullback position. Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow was a revelation in the role before his injury setback, seeing Scott Drinkwater given a chance to stake his claim for the spot. Drinkwater has done just that, offering an extra ball-playing option out the back that adds another element to the North Queensland attack. Silky skills don't necessarily mean everything, particularly for coach Payten, who prioritises a fullback who organises the defensive line. But should Drinkwater keep up his stellar form it is hard to see him surrendering the starting role anytime soon.

On the other side of the field, if there is anyway the Knights are going to cause an upset on Saturday, they have to get aggressive up front. That all starts with David Klemmer, who ran for over 130 metres and made 40 tackles in last week's defeat to Melbourne. For a Knights side lacking confidence and screaming out for a leader, Ponga is not that guy despite having the 'C' next to his name. Klemmer is the next closest thing given his experience in the representative arena and the Knights need him to lead from the front, both with his voice and actions.

FAVOURITE: The Cowboys are well-backed to get the job done on Saturday.

MY TIP: With the Bulldogs, Broncos and Warriors in the next three weeks, don't despair Knights fans. A win will be coming soon. It just won't be this weekend. There is every chance Newcastle is muchimproved but it is hard to see it being enough against a resurgent North Queensland team. Cowboys by 18.

## THE PREVIEW

Rain and fire clash in afternoon of milestones

The Melbourne Storm will be out to continue their dominance over the St George Illawarra Dragons when the long-standing rivals face off in the Victorian capital on Sunday afternoon.

Coming up against their grand final combatants from the club's inaugural premiership victory, the Melbourne Storm will commemorate two major milestones with Kenny Bromwich becoming the eighth player to reach 200 NRL games and Nelson Asofa-Solomona moving to 17th on the list of games played in his 150th appearance in purple colours.

Scoring 120 points in their past two matches, including a half century in the 50-2 demolition against the Knights seven days earlier, coach Craig Bellamy has benefited from consistency in his squad over the first third of the season with 15 of the 22 players used in first grade appearing in at least six of the opening eight matches.

Winning four of their past six matches against the joint venture at all venues, Jordan Grant will come onto the bench for his first appearance of 2022 in place of Tepai Moeroa in an otherwise unchanged roster

Finding form with three straight wins to move within striking distance of the top eight, the St George Illawarra Dragons will be hoping to create history with their first win in Melbourne during the 21st century.

Winning their first two visits to Melbourne in 1999 at the former Olympic Park, the merged venture have lost their subsequent 15 successive visits at all venues in the Victorian capital, including all five contested at AAMI Park.

Showing resilience to finish on top of the Tigers 12-6 last Sunday, coach Anthony Griffin has recalled Jack Bird to five-eighth with Talatau Amone shifting to the bench and last week's match-winner Jayden Sullivan dropping to 18th man.

Eyeing off four straight wins for the second time during Griffin's reign, the former Brisbane and Penrith mentor has never won against Craig Bellamy in 11 previous attempts.

WHO TO WATCH: Finding the try line seven times in the space of a week to bolster his claims as one of the buys of the season, representative flyer Xavier Coates has enjoyed a dream start to life in the Victorian capital. Leading the league alongside his teammate Ryan Papenhuyzen with ten tries over the first eight rounds, the 21-year-old flyer has contributed a further four try-assists and eight line breaks to earn an upgraded deal with the club mere months after joining from Brisbane. All but assured of a wing spot in Billy Slater's Queensland side for the opening State of Origin fixture in a month's time, look for Coates to continue his try-scoring exploits in his first appearance against the Dragons in first grade.

Making the most of a latter day shift to the edge after playing almost exclusively as a middle forward for more than a decade, Josh McGuire has been a prominent contributor in the side's recent run of form. Sitting out the opening five rounds through a suspension incurred in the final round of last season, the 32-year-old Queenslander has enjoyed three straight victories while averaging over 120 running metres and 30 tackles each week. Facing an uncertain future with his current deal expiring at the end of the season, expect McGuire to press his case for a new contract if recent performances continue over the coming weeks.

FAVOURITE: In a surprise not seen since Anthony Mundine dropped the ball over the line in the 1999 grand final, the Storm will start as favourites after winning seven of their opening eight matches this season.

MY TIP: Zac Lomax, Cody Ramsey, the Feagai brothers, Jayden Sullivan, Talatau Amone, and Tyrell Sloan weren't born the last time the Dragons won in Melbourne. You might call that a useless stat, but you'll still pick the Storm in Melbourne anyway! Storm by 12.

Cronulla look to bounce back from shock loss and go 5 from 5 at home

The Cronulla Sharks and the New Zealand Warriors will close out Round 9 this Sunday afternoon in The Shire. Despite the teams sitting 7 places apart on the ladder, there is only one win between the two teams, showcasing just how close the teams from 3rd down to 11th are to each other.

Despite a first round loss to the Raiders, the Sharks have bolted out of the gate this year. With solid wins coming against the likes of the Eels and the Sea Eagles, they have given their fans plenty to cheer for. In front of their home fans, they are four wins from four games at Shark Park so far this year, and they'll be hoping to keep that streak going when they host New Zealand this weekend.

This week though they're coming off a shock loss to the Broncos. Despite leading 7-6 at half-time, the Sharks failed to score at all in the second period, with Brisbane coming away with a 16-7 win. The loss was very much against their form line, and their coach Craig Fitzgibbon will be hoping that the momentum they had doesn't all go down the drain as a result. Bouncing back this weekend is critical to Cronulla's top eight or even top four hopes.

One player who has had a lot of media attention recently is second-rower turned centre Siosifa Talakai. In the forwards for the Sharks, captain Wade Graham made his long awaited return last week in his team's loss to the Broncos. Coming off the bench and playing just 23 minutes, he has been named to come off the interchange for the second week running this Sunday. In more good news for the Cronulla pack, Dale Finucane has been named to return from injury at lock.

The New Zealand Warriors have the right to be on a bit of a high right now, but need to be careful not to crash back down to Earth this weekend. A huge comeback win over the Raiders was exactly what the Warriors needed after an embarrassing showing against Melbourne two weeks ago. The 21-20 scoreline after golden point was despite the Warriors trailing by eight at half-time and not having led the match at any point throughout the 80 minutes.

In the end it was a field goal from halfback Shaun Johnson that sealed the golden point win for the Warriors. The 31 year old is yet to score a try this season despite playing every minute of 6 games so far, and will look to break that dry run this weekend. His match winning field goal however was his second of the season, after he kicked the Warriors to an extra time win against the Cowboys back in Round 5. Against his former club Johnson will want to put on a show this Sunday.

Warriors halfback Ash Taylor officially announced his early retirement at the beginning of the week. However, the signing of former Cowboy Daejarn Asi to fill the hole created appears to be a good decision. Making his club debut last week against the Raiders, Asi racked up two try assists in just his 11th NRL game. He has been named to start his second straight game at five-eighth this Sunday.

In other team news, Kodi Nikorima has still not been named despite getting out of isolation after a positive covid test result on ANZAC weekend. Dallin Watene-Zelezniak returns on the wing after a head injury saw him miss last week's clash, while Aaron Pene returns on the bench following a one match suspension.

WHO TO WATCH: Cameron McInnes is without a doubt one of the hardest workers in the NRL right now. With a tackle efficiency rate of 97.2% so far this season, the forward is well and truly back after his injury forced year on the sidelines last season. Starting the last three weeks in the run on team, he has been pushed back to the bench this week due to the return of Dale Finucane. Expect him to show his coach this weekend why he deserves to start.

Reece Walsh has moved to shut down rumours that he will cut his time at the Warriors short and join the Dolphins from next season. Telling Fox Sports that he will be playing for New Zealand next year is another big blow for Wayne Bennet's side, but it can only be a good thing for the Warriors. As the now consistent week-to-week fullback at the club, more responsibility is getting put on his shoulders every game. So far he is managing it well, and he'll look to keep that up this Sunday.

FAVOURITE: Despite a Round 8 loss, the Sharks are strong favourites to win this weekend at home.

MY TIP: The Warriors showed a lot of fight last week, and if the Sharks are off in any way they will punish them. That being said, Craig Fitzgibbon's side must bounce back after their disappointing performance in Brisbane. Cronulla by 10.

## **NSWRL JUNIOR REP GRAND FINAL WRAP**

Penrith completed a true sporting miracle, coming back from a 20-0 halftime deficit to defeat the Sydney Roosters in an epic SG Ball Cup Grand Final and claim their 8th premiership in this competition (their third in 6 seasons)

The Roosters dominated early proceedings, making Penrith pay for poor discipline and errors. They put three tries on in the opening 15 minutes through scintillating attacking play and support play. The first came in the fifth minute when Cassius Tia provided a lovely ball to Xavier Chatfield-Mooka who got pass some sloppy Penrith defence to cross for the opening try. Off the next set, the tri-colours shifted the ball on their left hand edge and Ben Dufficy showcased lovely support play to extend the tri-colours advantage out to 10 points. Minutes later, Cassius Tia stepped his way past some would be tacklers to cross and get the Roosters an early 14 point advantage. Penrith spent much of the opening half stuck inside their own end struggling to complete their sets.

Penrith started to ease into the contest, but errors in attacking territory rued their opportunities. Dolphin bound halfback Isaiva Katoa was dangerous for the Panthers in attack, but the polish the Roosters were showing up the other end was missing from Penrith's attack. 10 minutes later, Josh Wong broke through the tackle to link up with Tia before being tackled just short of the line. Off the ensuing tackle, Benaiah loelu burrowed over out of dummy half to cross for the tri-colours and give them a commanding 20 point lead. The Roosters margin could've been greater, but referee Ethan Klein spotted a forward pass to deny Chatfield-Mooka a first half double. After the break, Penrith looked more promising in attack, but the final passes went astray and let the Roosters off the hook through poor execution when it mattered most. Josh Wong and Xavier Va'a are impressive young prospects coming through for the tri-colours and Roosters fans should be tracking their progress in coming seasons. As far as Penrith are concerned, Ryley Smith and Mason Teague were the pick of the bunch for Penrith showing impressive leadership and trying their guts out to get Penrith back into the contest. Both should see game time for Penrith's Jersey Flegg line-up this season with Smith playing the opening two games of the season in Flaggr

Penrith opened the scoring in the second 40 with Jesse McLean crossing for the Panthers off the back of a lovely set play from the halves pairing of Russell-Smith and Katoa which saw McLean barge over the top of Ben Dufficy to cross for their opening points reducing the score-line to 16 points. 12 minutes later, Mason Teague crashed over against some fatigued Roosters defence and with Russell-Smith's conversion the margin was reduced to just 10 points. Teague has a promising future in the game, has good hole running and was dangerous every time he got involved in Penrith's attack.Off the ensuing set, Angelis Hotere-Papalii crashed over off good ball skills from Katoa and Hasslett to put the game within a converted try, and with Russell-Smith's conversion they cut the margin to just four points. Penrith were coming home with a wet sail and the Roosters were struggling to get out of their own end through ill-discipline and ill timely mistakes. Eventually, the pressure became too much, and Jesse McLean crashed over for his second try. Russell-Smith's conversion from the touchline was successful showcasing ice in his veins and Penrith took a two point lead. Last play for the tri-colours failed to gather anything, and the Penrith Panthers defeated the Sydney Roosters by 22-20 in a memorable SG Ball Grand Final.

Penrith 5/8 and goal kicker Keegan Russell-Smith told League Unlimited about the hunger that the side possesses to come back from the 20-0 deficit "we worked too hard all year not to win, we're such a tight group and we couldn't let each-other down on the goals we set back in pre-season". Penrith hooker Ryley Smith spoke exclusively to League Unlimited after the game "we had a lot to live up to after a horrible first half, we knew if we could complete our sets we could get the job done". Smith praised the patience from the halves to get the plays right in the clutch, further going onto say the period before half-time was the turning point where they stopped the Roosters raid and got through sets and asked questions.

The future at the foot of the mountains is well and truly promising, the challenge now is holding onto this premium talent. They've already lost Isaiya Katoa to the start-up Dolphins, many NRL clubs will now be circling this premium talent pool for their rosters to compete in the coming seasons. AJ LUCANTONIO
