# **BRISBANE**

## PREMIERS 2018, 2019, 2020

The powerhouse of NRLW, the Brisbane Broncos are looking to become the first side - male or female - to win four successive premierships since the St George Dragons men's side of the 1960s. Brisbane have only lost two games across the three seasons since 2018 to show their absolute dominance.

Despite the addition of three new teams to the competition, the Broncos still have the strongest line-up of the six outfits. The main bulk of their team has remained together, which will be a boost for them compared to other sides this year. The delay in the season shouldn't faze the Broncos with a strong squad looking to prove a point.

The key for 2022 for Brisbane will be their connection of players. With halfback Ali Brigginshaw leading the away again, she will be key with arguably the best football from Brisbane coming once she moved to lock and created a third ball player for the Broncos. The forward pack is just as strong, with the experience of Millie Boyle and Chelsea Lenarduzzi leading the pack along with Tallisha Harden.

Fullback Tamika Upton made a name for herself in the custodian role and has been a key cog in the Broncos attack. Upton will be expected to be a strong performer and to carry on her form that she had in 2020 and the 2021 Origin match.

There are so many positives in this Broncos side that it's hard to find a negative leading into the 2021 season, with one of the most stable squads in the competition and the strength. The question is though - with such a well-known squad and combinations, the opposition could have a much better sense of what they're up against, and with an extra few months of preparations for thosee coaches, this could put the kybosh on the Broncos run of dominance.

# **GOLD COAST**

## **DEBUT SEASON**

One of the new kids on the block, the Gold Coast Titans are looking to upset the apple cart and overthrow the Brisbane Broncos as the new dominant NRLW force in Queensland. The Gold Coast club will be led by veteran coach Jamie Feeney - who has had success with the Sydney Roosters and the Jillaroos in the past - and brings important experience to guide a debutant side.

The Titans squad has an excellent mix of experience and youth that will help them contend for the finals this season. The inclusion of Steph Hancock, Georgia Hale and captain Brittany Breayley-Nati will be important for the side in 2022, alongside rookies Tiana Raftstrand-Smith, Jasmine Peters and Grace Griffin.

Despite being a new squad, the Titans look very strong and could upset the applecart a fair bit, with depth of experience, and as mentioned they could frighten their neighbours in the Broncos with a their strong forward pack. The addition of Evania Pelite to their squad will bring good experience having played for Australia in the last two Olympics and having experience previously playing for the Warriors.

A young player to watch for the Titans will be Raftstrand-Smith, who was a star last year at the National Championships and part of Burleigh's victorious BHP Premiership side last season. She made her Origin debut and put in an impressive performance, and her versatility to either play in the back row or centres could help add to the Titans depth this season.

Overall there are positives across the park, and there is a really good aura about the Gold Coast with a strong mix of experience and youth with a strongly balanced squad, which when all combined, could make them premiership contenders.

# **NEWCASTLE**

### **DEBUT SEASON**

The second of the new NRLW teams this season is the most inexperienced. Newcastle have based their side predominantly on local talent for their inaugural season in the competition.

Relying predominantly on local talent and youth, the Knights will be up against it in contrast to many of the other sides in the NRLW, however an experienced forward pack will be crucial if they're to perform. They have added some key signings including the reigning BHP Premiership player of the year and former Bronco Romy Teitzel as well as forwards Annetta Nu'uasuala and Ngatokotoru Arakura.

A star in previous NRLW seasons, Chantay Poko returns to the competition after missing the 2020 season for personal reasons, after dominating the 2019 season with the boot for the Warriors notching up a competition record for kicking metres. Newcastle will need a strong return from Poko if they want to put up a strong fight this season. The forward pack will also be vital because the goforward of the Knights will come up against some fierce competition - the experience of Nu'uasuala and Arakura will be vital.

A key youngster to watch is Autumn-Rain Stephens Daly who has already represented New Zealand and was a star for the Maori Ferns during the recent All-Stars match, where she scored two tries. The popular young winger possesses good speed and can be a danger player for the Knights.

Newcastle's squad is the least experienced in the competition but with the local talent that would allow the squad to know and complement each other's game styles, as well as coach Casey Bromilow who has been in charge of the club's U19 Tarsha Gale Cup side in recent years. While the Knights may ultimately struggle in this competition, it will be a good building season and first hit-out.

# **PARRAMATTA**

### **DEBUT SEASON**

The third and final NRLW debutants are the Parramatta Eels who are looking to utilise their ability to access the whole of the Western Sydney talent-base, along with quality signings from their NRLW rivals to make a statement.

Coached by legendary former Parramatta forward Dean Widders - who already possesses a wealth of experience in Women's Rugby League - the Eels come into the competition with a strong mix in their squad which could create issues for the other teams in the competition. They have predominantly based their squad on local talent with the experience of Jillaroos pair Simaima Taufa and Botille Vette-Welsh, as well as NSW representatives Tiana Penitani and Kennedy Cherrington.

Maddie Studdon will be a key player for Parramatta, and while there are questions over her performances in recent seasons, she will be important for an Eels side that is lacking a bit of experience in the back row. Her experience could be vital if the Blue and Gold want to make an impact on the competition.

There are a number of young players coming through the Eels this season but one to watch is Fatafehi Hanisi who will be lining up during the competition with older sister Filomina Hanisi. who has represented New South Wales in the past. Another NRLW rookie to watch is Sereana Naitokatoka who has captained Fiji in the past and been a star for Mounties in the NSW Harvey Norman Women's Premiership. Playing in the halves, Naitokatoka can be a dangerous player for the Eels.

Parramatta have a good mix of experience and youth in their squad which can help them in the competition, though a lack of experience in key positions could put them into a an awkward position coming into the season.

# ST GEORGE ILLAWARRA

### **GRAND FINALISTS 2019**

A side that probably should've done better in the past than what they've have over the three NRLW seasons to date, the St George Illawarra Dragons will be looking to prove a point coming into the 2021 season, as the Red V are arguably the hardest-hit team with players exiting for the new teams.

A high turnover of players and even staff will likely work against the Dragons this season, as Jamie Soward takes over the reigns following the departures of Daniel Lacey, and originally appointed coach Mat Head at the end of the 2020 season. Soward brings premiership winning experience from the men's competition and a strong passion for the game which will help the side thrive. The loss of 11 players from the 2020 squad significantly weakens the Red V though.

Key players include Jaime Chapman, who starred in the recent All Stars match, her speed set to be an important weapon for the Dragons in attack. She can create something from nothing from all parts of the park which can cause so many issues for opposition defences. The experience of Kezie Apps and Jillaroos hooker Keeley Davis will also be vital for St George Illawarra.

Elsie Albert will be a player to watch for the Dragons after the Orchids captain had a big impact in her debut season in 2020. The PNG international is a tall strong forward and can cause the opposition defence issues with her ball running ability. Another NRLW rookie to watch - although no rookie to the game of Rugby League - is Rugby 7s star Emma Tonegato who enters the competition for the first time after starring for Australia at the recent Tokyo Olympics. Tonegato returns to the 13-a-side game having been a part of the winning Jillaroos 2013 World Cup team.

The Dragons may have lost a number of key players, however they still have a line-up that can cause problems and having a player like Chapman that can turn the game in a single moment will be big advantage for the Red V this season. They need their stars to put in but they still have a strong squad which could cause problems for opponents.

# **SYDNEY**

## **GRAND FINALISTS 2018, 2020**

Another team that has been decimated by the new clubs, the Sydney Roosters will be relying on their more experienced campaigners to guide through their younger players, with the Tricolours boasting a huge 12 uncapped players. They have also been forced into changes in the coaching ranks as well with John Strange taking over the reins from new Titans coach Jamie Feeney - who had taken the Roosters to the 2020 Grand Final just 16 months prior.

Despite having a high turnover of players, the Roosters have been able to make a number of key signings, including Isabelle Kelly's return as well as bringing over Golden Boot winner Jess Sergis to Bondi from the Dragons. Their core group of players comes into the competition with a lot of experience which will be vital for them coming into the season. The addition of Raecene McGregor from the Broncos as well as Maori All-Star prop Mya Hill-Moana is an extra boost after a busy period of player movements.

Halfback Zahara Temara has been a star for the Roosters over the past three seasons after taking on the halfback role and making it her own and has been a star for the ladies from Bondi. The control of the game Temara possesses will be very important for the Tricolours this season because with the loss of so many key players, a steady hand will be needed.

A key for the Roosters will be their connection to the Central Coast NSW Women's side, where eleven of the squad have come through in recent seasons. However, a young player to watch out for comes from Queensland with Maroons U19's player Keilee Joseph, who is set to make her NRLW debut. With a bright future on the horizon, the Roosters will need Joseph to stand up.

The Roosters will have a tough task ahead of them with the players that they have lost, but the strength they have existing in the squad and have brought in will be strong enough to make them a fearsome opponent across the season.



Favourite: The quality of the lineups dictates that the Gold Coast will go into this one as favourites.

My tip: It's difficult to look past the Titans here - their lineup boasts a touch more class than the Dragons. Don't count the Red V out by any means... but I'm going GOLD COAST BY 8.
