DRAGONS DELIVER IN NRLW OPENER

The St George Illawarra Dragons have claimed victory in the opening match of the 2021/22 NRLW season by downing the Gold Coast Titans 20-12 at McDonald Jones Stadium.

Outscoring the NRLW newcomers four tries to two, debutant halfback Rachael Pearson was a standout with an impressive kicking game, while Olympic Gold Medallist Emma Tonegato proved a constant threat from the back of the field.

In an opening high on passion but riddled with poor ball control from both teams, the Dragons crossed for first points through winger Teagan Berry (20th minute), who used her

pace to finish off a superb cut-out pass from Tonegato.

Extending the lead after Pearson forced an error with a well-placed grubber kick, Madison Bartlett (26th minute) made the most of a left side shift to give the Red V an 8-0 advantage. Unable to capitalise on a huge run from Tonegato in the ensuing set, the Titans appeared to hit back seconds before the change of ends only for Tazmin Gray to lose possession over the line.

Dominating possession early in the second half after Pearson produced the play of the match to trap the Titans in-goal with a kick reminiscent of Dragons NRLW coach Jamie Soward, Berry (44th minute) pounced from dummy half after Jamie Chapman was denied one play earlier. Taking advantage of a

rare opportunity inside the Dragons half, Kimiora Breayley-Nati delivered a superb pass to send Tiana Raftstrand-Smith (57th minute) over for the Titans maiden NRLW try. Buoyed by a greater share of possession late in the match, Destiny Brill offloaded to send Shannon Mato (65th minute) over to narrow the margin to 14-12 heading into the dying stages.

The Dragons secured the result with a try on fulltime to Quincy Dodd (70th minute) following a terrific offload from Elsie Albert to run out 20-12 victors.

Next Sunday, the Titans face the Roosters (1.50pm) and the Dragons take on the Eels (3.40pm) in the WIN Stadium triple header.

BRONCOS CONTINUE NRLW DOMINANCE OVER THE ROOSTERS

The Brisbane Broncos were looking to continue their dominance over the Sydney Roosters and they did just that in Newcastle following their 20-4 victory over the Tricolours.

Things looked good for the Broncos early when rookie Emily Bass was able to keep herself inside the sideline and get over to score after just three minutes. The Roosters looked to have crossed moments later when off the back of a penalty, Tayla Predebon fought her way to the line and looked to have got the ball to the ground. Despite looking good and being awarded by referee Belinda Sharpe, the bunker stepped in and overturned

the decision for a knock on.

Chances were thin for the Roosters who spent more time defending on their own line after consistent errors were able to give the Broncos plenty of field position. The Roosters defence had plenty to be proud off even though they did concede a second try when Roxy Murdoch was able to fight and twist her way to the line and got the ball down under the crossbar.

The second half started as a disaster for the Roosters who continued their error-prone ways and the Broncos took advantage as Emily Bass got her way over for her second try on debut after Shenae Ciesielka put her over. It was only a matter of minutes later when the Broncos were able to take

advantage again through the footwork of Tamika Upton who went through three defenders before linking up with Millie Boyle to score under the posts.

The Roosters were able to get on the board with just over ten minutes to go after Olivia Kernick ran a perfect line to slice through the Broncos defence to score right next to the posts. The conversion missed from close range and the Roosters trailed 20-4.

Although neither side was able to trouble the scorers, both sides had chances to add to their scores only for errors to nullify their chances. The Broncos march to a fourth successful NRLW title sees them take on the Knights whilst the Roosters have to contend with the Gold Coast Titans.

Parramatta have fought back from a six-point deficit on two occasions to down Newcastle with a late Maddie Studdon field goal in the third match of a McDonald Jones Stadium NRLW

The Knights shot out of the blocks in front of their home

The Knights shot out of the blocks in front of their home faithful - fullback Romy Teitzel bagged the side's first four-pointer in their inaugural game after just three minutes.

Newcastle held the lead for some time, the Bunker denying

the Eels twice before they eventually fought back to score a few minutes before halftime, Tiana Penitani's 31st minute try converted by Maddie Studdon and the score remained 6-all til halftime.

Phoebe Desmond put the home team back in the lead with a 43rd minute try some 8 minutes after halftime, Kirra Dibb taking the kicking duties to convert for a 12-6 lead. Simaima Taufa was on the spot to barge over for the Eels' second try at the 52 minute mark, and Studdon's conversion had things all square with more than 15 minutes left on the clock.

Both sides traded blows for much of the remainder of the

contest, Shirley Mailangi coming closest with the tryline mere centimetres away but no try in the final minutes.

But it would be Studdon who proved the difference in the end - potting a wobbly field goal with less than 20 seconds on the clock. Parramatta held on to a 13-12 victory for the handful of seconds the resumption of play allowed.

The Knights' task gets no easier in Round 2, they face Brisbane in the first clash of next Sunday's Wollongong triple-header, while Parramatta will again try to spoil the party for the hosts, this time the 3:40pm game against home side St George Illawarra later the same afternoon.



THE PREVIEW

The toughest challenge in NRLW stands in the way of the Newcastle Knights who need to put a heart-breaking single point loss behind them as they take on the Brisbane Broncos who put their stamp on the competition yet again last week.

One of three newcomers in the NRLW, the Knights came into the competition as the most inexperience side relying on predominantly local talent. The Knights squad though didn't look like they were lacking NRLW experience in their first hit out.

Newcastle impressed many last weekend despite falling to their heart-breaking 13-12 defeat against the Parramatta Eels last Sunday in front of a healthy home crowd. The Knights started fast early and lead 6-0 and could've lead by more if it wasn't for errors and missed opportunities up against a heavily favoured Parramatta side. Ultimately, pressure and errors came back to bite the Knights who gave up some strong attacking opportunities and, in the end, an 80th minute Maddie Studdon field goal came back to bite them.

Despite naming the same 1-17 initially, Newcastle will be forced into a change with Caitlan Johnson ruled out with an elbow injury meaning that Knights coach Casey Bromilow will be forced into a change.

The Brisbane Broncos are the clear front runners and they are definitely goliath in this battle as they look to continue their competition dominance with the most experienced squad in their line up as they look to seal their dominance on the competition.

Last weekend, the Broncos were given an early fright but ended up showing that they are the team to beat for the fourth consecutive season with a 20-6 victory over the Sydney Roosters. The Broncos were matched in the early stages of their match, but errors from their opponents helped the Broncos dominate taking a 10-0 lead into the break and then ultimate opening up a 20-0 lead.

Brisbane coach Kelvin Wright has been forced into a change with winger Julia Robinson ruled out with a fractured cheekbone, meaning Hagiga Mosby come onto the wing for her NRLW debut.

Who to watch: Fullback Romy Teitzel starred in her first outing as Knights captain and the Novocastrians will be hoping that she can star against her old club. Teitzel can pop up anywhere on the field and create plays which will be dangerous for the Broncos defence if they aren't on their game.

Broncos prop Millie Boyle is no stranger to being the focus and last week the New South Wales forward starred for the Broncos. Boyle possesses size and power which can rip apart any defence which she was able to do last week notching up a four pointer by backing up on a Tamika Upton burst.

Favourite: The Broncos are far and away favourites with their experience and coming off a last start win up against the Knights who fell to defeat.

My tip: The Broncos have too much power in all parts of the park and sadly it looks like it could be a long afternoon for the Knights to try and match the power of the Broncos. Brisbane have strength across the park whilst the Knights look a little weak in parts. BRISBANE BY 18.

The second of Sunday's NRLW matches will see either the Roosters or the Titans get their first win of the season or in the Titans case a historic first ever win in their clash on Sunday.

Despite losing a lot of experience, the Sydney Roosters still come into NRLW with a lot of experience and they were looking to that experience last week as they were looking to take their first victory against the Broncos and avenge their 2020 grand final defeat.

In their match last weekend, the Roosters actually started well against the Broncos matching them early and even getting on the board for a try that was ultimately overturned by the bunker before a mounting error count began to cost the Roosters. The errors put any attacking chances in the cupboard and the defensive pressure became to much as the Broncos went out to a 20-0 lead and despite a consolation try, the Roosters fell to a 20-6 defeat.

Roosters coach John Strange has made a number of changes with star half Zahara Temara dropped to the bench with Raecene McGregor starting in jersey 6. Captain Corban Baxter could return to the Roosters line up after missing round one due to a positive covid test.

Heading into round one, there was a big expectation on the Gold Coast Titans with arguably the strongest squad of the three newcomers but they disappointed last week up against a Dragons side that had lost many key players.

Whether it was nerves, Ill-discipline, an overestimation in the quality of the squad or a combination of the 3, the Gold Coast Titans were no match for the Dragons last weekend following their 20-12 defeat in Newcastle. The Titans were pretty poor in the early stages with errors and penalties costing them field position. The Dragons went out to a 14-0 lead and things looked grim for the Gold Coast and despite a fleeting hope of a comeback getting it back to 14-12, the Dragons had enough to win.

Titans coach Jamie Feeney has made a couple of changes as well with Jillaroo legend Steph Hancock starting in the front row in place of Brianna Clark who takes Hancock's bench spot. A shuffle in the backline sees Jasmine Peters moving to centre with Lauren Dam on the wing and Jetaya Faifua in jersey 18.

Who to watch: Being in the halfback role, there is going to be plenty of pressure on Jocelyn Kelleher to get the Roosters off to a good start. It is only the second time that Kelleher has started in an NRLW match and her performance leading the Roosters around the park is going to be important as the Tricolours look to get their first win of the season.

One of the Titans big name recruits, Evania Pelite starred for the Titans last weekend and will need to match that performance. Pelite was powerful and created issues for the Dragons from fullback and lead the running metres for the contest. Another strong performance from Pelite will go a long way to help the Titans to victory.

Favourite: The Roosters are heavy favourites to get their NRLW campaign back on track given their line-up and history.

My tip: It's hard to go past the Roosters, they have a strong line-up and weren't too bad last weekend against the Broncos.
