IT'S TIME TO BELIEVE IN MAGIC

GET THE LOWDOWN ON THIS WEEKEND'S EVENTS AT SUNCORP STADIUM

Welcome to Magic Round Brisbane! Eight games in three days awaits as Suncorp Stadium plays host to the tenth round of the NRL season.

The concept - borrowed from the English Super League who began the concept of 'Magic Weekend' back in 2007 - had its first iteration in Australia in 2019 when Brisbane hosted Magic Round. Due to repeat in 2020, the COVID-19 pandemic and subsequent re-fixturing meant we missed out on the event last year.

But fear not - save for an unprecedented outbreak between the time we publish this magazine and 6pm Friday - Magic Round is back!

The schedule

The Tigers and Knights kick off action at that time, followed by the Sea Eagles and Broncos to round out opening night.

On Saturday, Canterbury and Canberra get things going at 3pm, with Cronulla v Souths wedged in the middle at 5:30pm, finishing up with the Roosters and Cowboys as the 7:45pm nightcap.

Sunday's triple header gets underway at 1:45pm, the Warriors hosting the Eels. The centrepiece match on the final day is Melbourne v St George Illawarra at 4:05pm before the Titans and Panthers close proceedings at 6:25pm.

The entertainment

At halftime in every clash across the weekend, fans will be entertained by three bands:

On Friday, Sneaky Sound System are on hand; Saturday sees the Stafford Brothers spinning the decks; then on Sunday, Busby Marou takes the stage.

The fun and games

There'll be plenty to do both inside and outside Suncorp Stadium throughout the weekend. Kids Zones, Chill Zones, Food Trucks and Bars will all be available on the exterior of the ground, while a range of activations including exclusive seating areas will be available inside. Also in the Stadium Precinct keep an eye out on Sunday night for Fox League's Late Show with Matty Johns which will be filming on-site.

The history

2019's inaugural event was held over four days - a Thursday match attracted a small crowd involving the Titans, then crowds of 41,000 piled in on Friday and Saturday before 34,500 finished the round on Sunday, making a 134,677 aggregate crowd for the weekend.

ENOUGH IS ENOUGH

IN THE WAKE OF LAST WEEK'S GUILTY VERDICT, RUGBY LEAGUE NEEDS TO MAKE A STAND

Rugby league is back in the media for all the wrong reasons at the moment.

And the game needs to take a very long, hard look at itself.

It is time to stop giving out 'redemption' stories. This should not be our image, and it should never be again.

A former player, who will remain unnamed, was convicted of a heinous crime and sentenced to at least three and a half years in prison. Once the legal system plays out, I believe the game should remove this person's individual accolades.

In defence of this player, another player had their contract torn up in a strong stance by North American Rugby League club New York. Another player is being reviewed by their club in England.

Despite all of this, the game needs to say – enough is enough.

Convicted criminals have been allowed to play NRL football. One player was booed every time they touched the ball before the COVID-19 break because of a terrible crime they committed. And rightly so.

It is time rugby league puts victims first. It is time rugby league becomes a safe space for every single person.

It is time rugby league realised that this is political. There are young men watching and they will follow the lead of NRL players – they look up to them whether you like it or not.

Former Clive Churchill Medalist and NRL premiership winner Willie Mason, who plied his trade for the Bulldogs, was a polarising player. A win at all costs, tough player.

Last week, he committed the toughest act. Speaking up.

He said that anyone convicted of a domestic violence offence should be banned from the game forever.

And I agree.

Playing professional sport is a privilege. It is not, and never will be, a right. If you are good at kicking a footy around, you should be given societal special treatment.

Over the past few years, some players – players with convictions – have been given second chances. The NRL needs to stop this entirely.

There is room for redemption when the outside world sees rugby league as a sport for thugs and criminals.

We have a NRLW competition on the rise, more women entering the commentary space and female referees both in the NRL and through the ranks.

We have mothers, sisters, nieces and aunties playing footy every weekend.

They all deserve to feel safe. They all deserve to make their way through the ranks with no outdated viewpoints.

Lets come together as a rugby league community and say 'enough is enough'.

GAME CHANGER

CREATING OPPORTUNITIES FOR NRL WOMEN'S AND GRASSROOTS IN VICTORIA

Seabrook Reserve in Broadmeadows will become the home of rugby league youth development squads and in due time, the base for Melbourne Storm's women's team as work begins on a \$16.9 million hub.

The construction of the Rugby League State and Community Centre was made possible with a \$12 million investment made by the Victorian State Government. The NRL has contributed \$1.4 million, and the Storm a further \$1 million.

At a turning of the soil gathering at Seabrook Reserve, Minister for Community Sport Ros Spence said that the investment is record-setting for Victorian rugby league.

"It's fantastic that work has started; the benefits for elite women, developing young stars and local grassroots players will be substantial."

Melbourne Storm chief executive Justin Rodski said that the centre is a "game changer" for women's and grassroots NRL.

"This new facility is a game changer for rugby league and for the thousands of talented young girls and boys who aspire to play our great game across Victoria," Rodski said.

"It will also be a great venue for Storm to train and run community programs in Hume, giving more young people the chance to see their idols in person."

NRL Victoria general manager Brent Silva expressed his gratitude to the State Government for contributing to the project.

"We thank the Victorian Government for its support – this new centre and administrative hub will give the sport a real boost in Victoria and even better define the pathway for our next generation of champions," Silva said.

The Seabrook reserve is currently home to the Northern Thunder Rugby League Club. The club has a number of women's teams including Girls Tag team, Women's Tag Team and Women's Tackle that will benefit from the upgrades.



To support the Thunder's training and playing facilities, the City of Hume has also committed \$2.5 million to the project.

The Rugby League State and Community Centre is designed to be

female-friendly, with the construction including high-performance training and recovery facilities, a show pitch and two additional competition/training pitches.

The centre will also include administrative facilities for NRL Victoria and Touch Victoria.

The project will create a minimum of 35 jobs upon completion, which is expected to be mid-2022.

NOT HALF BAD

PEARCE PROVIDING CROSSLAND WITH TIPS AS KNIGHTS LOOK TO REBUILD SEASON

It came as no coincidence that Newcastle's return to the winner's list coincided with a halfback directing the team around the park.

While Blake Green had done an admirable job as a stop-gap replacement in the absence of Mitchell Pearce, the Knights' attack had been struggling.

Prior to last weekend's 24-16 win over Canberra at Wagga Wagga, the Knights had scored two tries in two weeks.

Coach Adam O'Brien then handed 20-year-old Phoenix Crossland a starting berth in the much-publicised number seven jumper and the young halfback repaid him in spades as the Knights overturned a 16-0 halftime deficit.

Crossland admitted Pearce had provided him with some handy tips in previous weeks as he continues his recovery from a torn pectoral muscle.

"If you're in that position (at halfback) there's a lot of expectation to do your best and not let the boys down," Crossland said.

"But even though there's injuries and Junior's out, he's still here at training so I've been learning plenty off him.

"He's pretty much been coach for me at the moment and he's been like that since I came here when I was 18. It's just my turn to wear the footy boots and lead the team on the weekend."

The Erina Eagles junior has come through the Knights ranks and he now shapes as an important piece in the puzzle over the next month as Newcastle look to navigate a tricky month until Pearce returns.

But Pearce has still had a significant role to play while on the sidelines.

"We look at a few clips and he's really encouraging (because) he likes to look at the positives to keep maintaining," Crossland said.

"But he also throws in a few improvements as well so he's really good because he's been around a long time and he can analyse a game really well."

The young Knight admitted "it was good" to spend time playing his favourite position.

He was already looking at ways to continue to improve, starting with the Tigers in Magic Round on Friday night at Suncorp Stadium.

"Defensively I probably slipped on a few tackles," he conceded.

"There was one on the fullback I wasn't too happy with but with the ball when I'm pushing with the middles and playing a bit of ad-lib footy I felt pretty good.

"I think defence can be a focus for me this week."

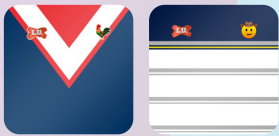

Yo-yoing teams looking for magic consistency at Suncorp

From the moment the Wests Tigers toughed out a gritty, resilient 16-8 win over a top 8 side in the Dragons 2 weeks ago, I was certain that they'd lose to the Titans in the next round. Certain of it. Flash forward to this week and after a straight up terrible performance in front of their home crowd, disguised as being a close game due to some late tries that had no bearing on the result, I and the majority of Rugby League pundits have been vindicated. The Tigers are either consistently poor or will put in a solid performance that increases optimism in their long-suffering fans, only to let them down with performances like we saw on the weekend. So much like clockwork is this process that Tigers fans refuse to get their hopes up anymore, and I don't blame them.

The Newcastle Knights broke the 2nd longest existing finals drought in the NRL last year, and in doing so renewed hope that Adam O'Brien is the right man to lead them out of this eternal rebuilding phase. The Knights have been up and down to say the least in 2021, losing convincingly to the Panthers and Roosters before coming back from a 16-point half time deficit to the struggling Raiders last week.

It was clear that veteran halfback Blake Green was not up to the task in those two heavy defeats, and last week his replacement Phoenix Crossland looked promising and scored the try in the 41st minute that got the comeback going.

In round 3, the Knights became the first of just two victories for the Tigers in 2021, with David Nofalouma scoring the match winner in the 72nd minute. The Knights will be keen to make amends for that showing, which hopefully is in their minds as a reminder not to be complacent. In team news, Michael Maguire has made a raft of unexpected and frankly unwarranted changes that reek of desperation. Adam Doueihi, who was by far Wests' best player last week and has been one of the few rays of light coming from the Tigers' 2021 season so far, has been moved away from five-eighth and into the centres in a direct swap for Moses Mbye. Rookie winger Zac Cini has been dropped for Tommy Talau, while rookie hooker Jake Simpin has also fallen victim to Madge's axe, dropping to the reserves for Jacob Liddle, who starts his first match at hooker since Round 5. Jock Madden comes onto the bench to make his first-grade debut, with rookie forward Stefano Utoikamanu dropped for Shawn Blore.

Amongst all the changes is one significant piece of non-action, with struggling half Luke Brooks retaining his spot as starting halfback. The players dropped for the Tigers are all in their first year of first grade, which seems to be in direct contrast to the words of Maguire in the post-match press conference last week, stating that he felt "the senior players really let us down."

It is a lot less chaotic for the Knights, with Adam O'Brien naming an unchanged 17 from the team that beat the Raiders last week.

Who to watch: Although he has been moved away from his preferred position of centre, in my opinion to the detriment of the team, it will still be good to watch **Adam Doueihi** play footy on Friday night. Those watching the Tigers v Titans last Saturday will tell you that Doueihi seemed to be among the only players putting in for the joint venture, and he had the stat line to back it up, with 5 tackle busts, 2 try assists, 2-line break assist and a try of his own. Doueihi faces a different sort of challenge on Friday, being tasked with defending against the strong and explosive Bradman Best. It will be interesting to see what kind of impact he can have in the traditionally less involved position.

For mine, **Connor Watson** has been among the top 2 or 3 players for the Knights so far this season. After joining from the Roosters in 2018, Watson has had an injury riddled few years for Newcastle where he's played just 41 of a possible 73 games. This year, touch wood, he has had a lot more luck and played every game and is proving himself to be extremely valuable as a smaller, ball playing lock. He knows when to run, amassing 99 metres off just 10 runs last week, while also adding astute attacking skill, identifying last week a gap in the Raiders defensive line and throwing a sublime pass to set up Phoenix Crossland. He is someone who has previously played every spine position at first grade level, and while he has always been impressive, it is really pleasing to see him play well enough to lock down a role in the Knights best 17. He is off contract at the end of the year and there are a few clubs that could do worse than add him to their roster.

Favourite: The Knights are favoured by 5 and a half points over the Tigers.

My tip: I was actually leaning towards the Tigers keeping the trend of inconsistency going in this one, however after Maguire named that team list, I simply can't do it. **Newcastle by 10.**

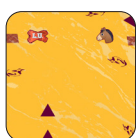

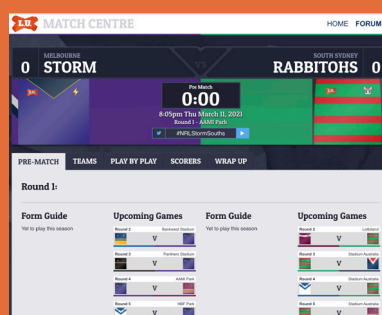

I'm keeping it in the halves with the Raiders. **Jack Wighton** and **George Williams** are both very talented footballers, and have a massive chance to play themselves back into form here. They are capable of dictating how this match pans out.

Favourite: Canberra are unbackable favourites at the time of writing.

My tip: It's honestly hard to see anything except a big Raiders win. Yes, they've lost five on the trot, but Canterbury have a knack of playing struggling teams back into form, and I'll be flying up to Brisbane to see my Bulldogs go down yet again, barring a miracle. **Canberra by 20.**

If there were ever two teams in need of some spark from Magic Round it is the Sharks and Rabbitohs, with both heading to Brisbane off the back of embarrassing defeats.

South Sydney's 50-0 drubbing at the hands of Melbourne caught everyone off guard.

Sure the Rabbitohs were missing a host of first graders but this is a team that is supposed to be contending for a premiership.

Instead they were made to look like anything but as Josh Addo-Carr ran in six tries to expose South Sydney's right-edge defence.

The Rabbitohs are boosted though by the return of halfback Adam Reynolds. He may not plug the defensive holes that saw Souths stumble last week but his composure and long-range kicking game will be much-needed if the Rabbitohs again struggle to dominate up front.

Meanwhile, Taane Milne comes onto the wing with Dane Gagai back to the centres and Steven Marsters dropped back to the extended bench.

There is also movement in the forwards with Liam Knight switching to lock in place of Jai Arrow who drops back to the bench while Hame Sele also joins the pine, knocking off Patrick Mago.

While many anticipate South Sydney's loss to Melbourne will be a one-off, the opposite is true for Cronulla, who have been on a downward spiral since John Morris' exit.

The Sharks' error-prone performance last Friday did not go close to challenging the ladder leaders, with Penrith running out 48-0 winners.

Halfback Chad Townsend was also hooked in the second half with Matt Moylan brought in off the bench.

The musical chairs in the halves surely cannot go on much longer as the Sharks put a red line through 2021 and instead plan for the upcoming season, settling on whether Moylan or Johnson is part of their long-term plans.

An injury to Jesse Ramien sees Josh Dugan recalled while Andrew Fifita also gets a chance to impress in place of Bill Magoulias.

Who to watch: The battle of the fullbacks shapes as an interesting one. **William Kennedy** had his most disappointing game of the season last week for Cronulla, with minimal involvement in attack. That though spoke volumes to how poor the Sharks were in building pressure as opposed to his own individual effort. It also signalled the need for Cronulla's halves to make sure to give him early ball in the red zone as Kennedy's combination of speed and ball playing makes him a dangerous option worth pursuing with out the back.

Meanwhile, **Cody Walker** also could wreak havoc out the back against a Cronulla side lacking in defensive resilience. The Sharks were incredibly passive in defence last week against Penrith and cannot afford Walker the same amount of time and space to make decisions. Otherwise they stand to be on the wrong end of another lopsided scoreline. While not on Walker's mind, the opportunity to stamp his claim at fullback before Latrell Mitchell's return could also strengthen his Origin hopes. No - he won't be another fullback playing out of position, five-eighth is undoubtedly his best spot but showing off his versatility will certainly only help his chances.

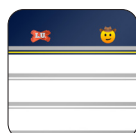

An injury depleted Sydney Roosters take on the North Queensland on Saturday night at Suncorp Stadium.

It's not the most exciting fixture to be played on Saturday night in the second instalment of Magic Round, although injuries to the Roosters' side give the North Queensland Cowboys a glimmer of hope. Drew Hutchinson will miss the next two months of footy after suffering a punctured lung on Friday night. Luckily for the Roosters, Lachlan Lam will return from injury this weekend after having not played since their round three loss to the South Sydney Rabbitohs.

Another potential omission could be Victor Radley who played only nine minutes of Saturday night after being taken off with concussion. Radley has been named to start at Lock but as we've seen numerous times this season, he could fail concussion tests later on in the week. Despite struggling with injuries throughout this season, the Roosters once again showed grit and determination in their 13-point loss to Parramatta. The Roosters only had 36 per cent of the ball but managed to stay in the concept until Mitchell Moses' field goal in the 73rd minute. Parramatta completely dominated the Roosters, but they struggled to break down the Roosters defence. It's a credit to the Roosters for staying in the contest for that long despite making 180 more tackles than their opponents.

After their performance last weekend and throughout the season, the Roosters should be confident heading into their clash on Saturday night as all three of their losses have come against sides situated above them on the ladder. All six of their wins have been convincing results against sides lower than them on the ladder and they should expect no different this weekend. The Roosters will be glad to see Sitali Tupouniua returning from suspension which pushes Nat Butcher to the interchange after completing a monster 70 tackles on the weekends. As a result Tuku Hau Tapuha has dropped out of the 17.

The North Queensland Cowboys have catapulted into 11th position thanks to four wins from their previous five matches after sitting winless after four weeks. Their most recent victory came on Saturday night against rivals the Brisbane Broncos in a one-point thriller. A 77th minute Valentine Holmes field goal was all that could separate the two sides and it was the first win for the North Queenslanders against Brisbane since 2018. However, this Saturday's fixture will be a tough task for the Cowboys as they play their first top eight side of the season. Although the Cowboys have been in good form recently, they haven't blown any of the struggling sides out of the water and have only won their last two games by a combined three points. Defence is a key issue for the Cowboys, having conceded 255 points so far this season, the third most in the league. The Roosters are going to try and expose the Cowboys weakness in defence and they're one of the better attacking sides in the competition having scored 254 points, fourth most in the league.

Meanwhile Holmes' form has followed the opposite path. Starting the season on the Wing, Holmes found himself back at fullback just three games into the season and has accumulated over 150 run metres in six of his seven outings at the back. Holmes is slowly showing signs of his past self with his immense tackle breaking ability, breaking 4.2 tackles per game. It should be a great battle between the two number one's with Origin selection just around the corner.

Favourite: The Sydney Roosters are the favourites to win the Saturday night's clash and for good reason. They're still one of the better sides in the competition and despite the Cowboys recent form, they've got a long way to go until they compete with sides like the Roosters. Although they have won two of the past four outings against the Sydney Roosters.

My tip: The Roosters are hard to go past on the weekend and the inclusion of Lam and Tupouniua will help a tired Roosters side after a gruelling effort last weekend. They'll be keen to respond after last week's loss and they've successfully dismantled every bottom eight side they've played this season. **Sydney by 16.**

Sunday's action on Magic Round begins with what is set to be an entertaining clash between the New Zealand Warriors and the Parramatta Eels at Suncorp Stadium.

Coming into the contest in eighth spot, with four wins and four losses for their season so far. The Warriors have been their true inconsistent selves in their performances with both strong performances and poor efforts during the individual games.

Tuivasa-Sheck will need to be the key cog in attack for the sometimes-stumbling Warriors attack.

If he gets the go-ahead, Jakob Arthur will be a key player for the Eels on Sunday afternoon. Arthur has scored five tries across 7 NSW Cup games for the Blue and Gold as well as chalking up 6 try assists. Although NRL is a step up, the son of Eels coach Brad Arthur, Jakob could put his mark on the game.

Favourite: The Eels have been put up heavy favourites for the contest based on their last start win and their overall performances this season.

My tip: It's hard to go past the Eels even with their off-field issues and the number of players that they have out this weekend. The performances of Mitch Moses and Clint Gutherson at their very best would be too strong for a Warriors side that would no doubt be in the contest for a long way but just lack the all round game to match the Eels for the whole game. **Parramatta by 12.**

Magic Dragons to empty hat against depleted Storm

Often the premiership front runner, Craig Bellamy's Storm find themselves somewhat under the radar in third place behind the Panthers and Eels.

After a rusty 1-2 start to the season, Melbourne has rocketed back to form with six consecutive thumping victories. Since their round-3 loss to fellow grand finalists, the Panthers, Melbourne have been untouchable in compiling a formidable aggregate of 244-62 at an eye-watering 40-10 per match.

And with the Raiders, Broncos, Titans, Warriors and Tigers to follow this week's clash, there's a real possibility that following round 15 Melbourne will still have only tasted defeat twice.

But before they get ahead of themselves, first the Storm must conquer the Dragons minus the injured duo of Cameron Munster and Harry Grant as well as the suspended Brandon Smith.

Kenny Bromwich slots into hooker with Ryley Jacks named at No.6. But in a potential bonus, fullback Ryan Papenhuyzen's name on the extended bench indicates he's not far off returning from several weeks on the sidelines.

On the other side, St George Illawarra is a tough read. A shocking first half against the Bulldogs showcased the Dragons' ability to match the quality of their opponent. The points eventually flowed after halftime once Ben Hunt and Matt Dufty found their range.

A repeat of that effort won't cut it against the Storm. But as Anthony Griffin knows, on their day the Dragons are equally capable of rising alongside the best in the competition. Despite a perplexing inconsistency, the Dragons' round-5 demolition of the high flying Eels still ranks as one of the performances of the season.

Currently in sixth place, regardless of the result, this week's clash could prove pivotal in the Dragons' season. Following the intense effort against the Eels, Griffin struggled to re-stoke the fire and three successive losses followed.

How St George Illawarra rebound in the month after Magic Round against the struggling Sharks, Tigers, Broncos and Bulldogs could prove more telling than this week's result.

In team news, Mikaele Ravalawa returns on the wing in one of two Griffin changes that sees prop Poasa Faamausili named on the interchange.

Who to watch: Magic Round came a week early for **Josh Addo-Carr**. In bamboozling the Rabbitohs with a record six try blitz, the sneaky speedster increased his tally to nine tries from his last three outings. While much of the credit can be attributed to his creative teammates, the Fox's nous still sees him finish what many can't. For the Dragons right edge, it means they'll need to be on high alert otherwise it could be another rout.

So much of the Dragons punch is driven by the diminutive **Matt Dufty**, so it's hard to fathom why the live wire fullback is yet to be signed beyond the end of 2021. Surely a repeat of his match winning performance against the heavyweight Eels should be enough for the Red-V junior to earn another contract.

Favourite: Even though the last six contests are split three each, Melbourne are short priced favourites to claim a seventh straight victory.

My tip: The Dragons rolled a depleted Storm last season and once again will look to take advantage in the absence of several big names. But even with their backs against the wall, Bellamy's tried and true systems with a sprinkling of class should still be too good for an inconsistent Red V. **Melbourne by 10.**

Panthers eye a purr-fect 10 to close out Magic Round

Magic Round concludes with the match of the weekend on Sunday evening as the Gold Coast Titans take on the Penrith Panthers at Suncorp Stadium.

Sitting in seventh position after a high-scoring win last week, the Gold Coast Titans will face their fiercest test of the season against the competition leaders.

Getting out to a big lead before allowing defence to take a backseat in a 36-28 win over the Tigers last Saturday, coach Justin Holbrook will be hoping his team can overcome a dismal record at Suncorp Stadium that has yielded eight wins from 27 appearances.

Going down to the Sharks in a tight affair during Magic Round two years ago, the match will mark a milestone for club stalwart Anthony Don as he become only the fourth player after Mark Minichiello, Luke Bailey and William Zillman to appear in 150 first grade games for the Gold Coast.

Naming behemoth back-rower David Fifita despite a possible one-match ban for a high tackle, mid-season signing Esan Marsters will be hoping to make it onto the field for his club debut after sitting on the bench for the duration of last week's win at Campbelltown.

Returning to the scene of one of the darkest days in the club's recent history, the Penrith Panthers will be hoping to set an NRL record on Sunday evening.

Suffering an embarrassing loss to the Tigers during Magic Round in 2019, the Panthers have undergone a dramatic transformation in the ensuing years to sit atop the premiership ladder following nine consecutive wins to start the season.

Running riot against the Sharks in a 48-0 rout last Friday, coach Ivan Cleary will be hoping his team can overcome a poor record at Suncorp Stadium that has seen the Panthers win six of their past 18 visits to the venue.

Retaining Matt Burton in the centres despite Paul Momirovski being available for selection after serving a suspension, Liam Martin replaces Kurt Capewell (concussion) in the second row in a reshuffle that sees 22-year-old Queenslander J'maine Hopgood come onto the bench for his NRL debut.

Who to watch: Producing his best form for a number of seasons after being elevated into the starting pack, **Tyrone Peachey** has provided the Titans with a distinct attacking threat through the middle of the field. Having struggled to cement a regular position on the Gold Coast with stints in the centres, halves and as a bench utility, the 29-year-old has thrived at lock forward after being handed a roving commission by coach Justin Holbrook to play with his natural instincts. Facing off against the team that helped to establish his credentials as a representative-calibre player, Peachey could find himself back in a NSW jersey should his form continue over the coming weeks.

Earning rave reviews for his dynamic start to the season, **Jarome Luai** will be eager to enhance his claims for a New South Wales debut in the opening State of Origin fixture. Earning an unexpected call up to the Blues squad after a breakout year in 2020, the 24-year-old has developed his game further to lead the league in try assists (12) and linebreak assists (13). Set to play his 50th game in the NRL after debuting with Penrith back in 2018, look for Luai to cause plenty of havoc on the left edge as the Panthers look to go 10 from 10.

Favourite: Looking to become the first team since the Sydney City Roosters in 1996 to open a season with ten straight wins, the Panthers are favoured to continue their winning momentum.

My tip: Ranking first in defence and equal second in attack, the Panthers should have the Titans' measure with and without the ball. **Penrith by 14.**

Addo-Carr has SIX appeal

The Melbourne Storm have eviscerated the South Sydney Rabbitohs 50-0 in a match where Josh Addo-Carr became the first player in 71 years to score six tries in first grade.

Equalling the record set by Newtown winger Jack Troy in 1950, the man affectionately known as 'The Foxx' had a night to remember as the Storm posted 10 tries in a match played before 7,501 supporters at Stadium Australia.

Weathering an early Rabbitohs' attacking raid that almost led to points only for Cody Walker's pass to Alex Johnston to be ruled forward, a skilful left foot kick from Justin Olam allowed Addo-Carr (11th minute) to open the scoring.

Taking advantage of a seven-tackle set, Nicho Hynes broke through the Rabbitohs' defence before linking with Addo-Carr (22nd minute) who used the wet conditions to slide over for his second.

Breaking their opponents resolve with Cameron Munster and Harry Grant combining from inside their own half to put Addo-Carr (27th minute) over for his third of the night, a strip from Munster enabled Jahrome Hughes (31st minute) to sprint 50 metres with barely a hand laid on him..

Following in the footsteps of Ryan Papenhuyzen earlier this season with four first half tries, Addo-Carr (39th minute) completed a left side shift to send the Storm to the sheds up 26-0.

Continuing the rout following the resumption of play,

Brandon Smith (46th minute) powered over with a great burst that exposed the Rabbitohs' retreating defence, while a beautiful cut-out ball from Hughes allowed George Jennings (50th minute) to get on the scoresheet minutes later.

Taking the score past 40 with Jennings (57th minute) bagging his second, Addo-Carr (67th minute) created history by becoming the first Melbourne Storm player to score five tries in a match.

Completing the ten-try demolition as it began, Addo-Carr (72nd minute) scored in the corner to bring up the final 50-0 scoreline.

Next week during Magic Round at Suncorp Stadium, the Rabbitohs face the Sharks on Saturday evening, while the Storm take on the Dragons on Sunday afternoon.

Eels clinch brutal victory over resilient Roosters

Parramatta have defeated a resilient Roosters side by 31-18 in a brutal match at Bankwest Stadium tonight.

The match was overshadowed by several incidents that the Match Review Committee will be busy investigating tomorrow morning, with Eels stars Dylan Brown and Marata Niukore sure to be the most nervous. Both players are likely to be charged in the lead up to a disallowed try at halftime by Roosters five-eighth Drew Hutchinson. Hutchinson copped knees in the back from Brown and was immediately rushed to hospital with broken ribs and a suspected punctured lung. Niukore also collected James Tedesco high in the lead up, along with a suspected shoulder charge which luckily for the home side only led to a penalty.

Both sides earlier lost key players to head injury assessments, with Eels hooker Reed Mahoney coming off second best in defence, which was offset by the Roosters losing Victor Radley in the similar circumstances. Halfback Mitch Moses was the standout, setting up three tries and kicking the match winning field goal in his best performance of the season. The win for the home side puts the Eels into outright second on the NRL ladder in another great start for the season for Brad Arthur's team.

The Roosters will be proud of the effort, however with injuries continuing to mount their depth will certainly be at breaking point in the coming weeks.

The Tricolours came into the game in the unfamiliar position of underdogs. They were however welcoming back their superstar fullback James Tedesco, who managed to make an immediate impact when he found some space down the right-hand side and produced a superb pass for Matt Ikuvalu, who managed a spectacular touch down to open the scoring and the Roosters jumped out 4-0 lead.

Parramatta has managed to turn Bankwest Stadium into a fortress in recent times and they predictably hit back, when Mitchell Moses kicked across field for his backrower in Ryan Matterson. Matterson made the catch and shifted the ball wide to Blake Ferguson who showed tremendous strength to carry two Roosters defenders over the line in the corner to score. Moses converted from out wide and the Eels lead 6-4 after 20 minutes. Parramatta looked likely again minutes later, before they put down a loose pass and the ball was picked up by Roosters backrower Nat Butcher, who managed to find Ikuvalu in support. The Roosters winger then accelerated away from the Eels cover defence to score under the posts and regain the lead for the visitors. The Eels then regained the lead when Mitchell Moses kicked again for Matterson on the last and he then produces a neat offload for super sub Bryce Cartwright who scooped up the pass and slam the ball down for a try just minutes after entering the field of play.

Parramatta then kicked away when hooker Reed Mahoney darted out of dummy half close to the line and put on an old school run around play with his prop Junior Paulo which saw Cartwright steam onto the ball to score his second try. Moses converted and the Eels lead 18-10 and looked to have the match in their control.

Minutes before the half time break however the Roosters looked to have scored through five-eighth Drew Hutchison, however replays showed a knock on in the lead up. The Tricolours didn't come away empty handed with Eels centre Marata Niukore penalised for a shoulder charge on Tedesco, which will surely come under more scrutiny this week. With Hutchison assisted from the field, Adam Keighran kicked the penalty goal to narrow the Parramatta lead to 18-12 at the break. It was a shocking start to the second half from the Roosters, when two try hero Matt Ikuvalu turned villain, when he dropped a Moses bomb and Tom Opacic collected the loose ball for a gift wrapped try to score next to the posts to extend the Eels lead 24-12. The Roosters needed something special to get back into the match and they got just that, when Ikuvalu scored his hat trick, after rookie number seven Sam Walker threw a superb floating pass over the top of hit the stocky winger on the chest for him to score in the corner. Keighran then nailed the conversion from the sideline and the Roosters revival was on with 15 minutes remaining.

Parramatta just couldn't manage to put the resilient Roosters away until with six minutes remaining, Moses kicked a field goal to give his side a seven-point lead. Minutes later they well and truly iced the match when Dylan Brown stepped through a number of exhausted Roosters defenders clinching a brutal victory for the Eels at home.

Both sides now travel to Brisbane for Magic Round next weekend, with Parramatta taking on the Warriors on Sunday afternoon, while the Roosters will need to find some reinforcements before taking on the Cowboys on Saturday night.

Debutants delight in Dragons win

It wasn't pretty - in fact it was downright awful at times - but the St George Illawarra Dragons have downed the Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs 32-12 at Netstrata Jubilee Stadium.

In a match unlikely to linger in the annals of rugby league history, the home side - wearing heritage jerseys in recognition of the inaugural 1921 St George Dragons team - scored six tries to two with debutants Mat Feagai and Junior Amone crossing for four-pointers in the second half.

In one of the most punishing spectacle of football seen this season, errors and missed tackles plagued both teams during the opening half with the Dragons committing eight errors and 17 missed tackles, while the Bulldogs fared even worse with six errors, 21 missed

tackles and producing a string of dismal attacking options epitomised by Kyle Flanagan overpowering a kick on the first tackle ten metres out from the try line.

In the only scoring play of the opening 40 minutes, the Dragons took advantage of good field position with Jack Bird delivering a nice inside pass that allowed Matt Dufty (22nd minute) to use his speed and footwork to cross underneath the posts.

Coming out of the sheds with improved discipline and ball handling, the Dragons gave Mat Feagai (51st minute) a debut to remember alongside his twin brother, Max, as Ben Hunt sent the 20-year-old winger over for a try.

Appearing to deliver the knock-out blow with Bird showing determination to pounce on a Hunt grubber, the bunker overturned the try after replays showed the centre failed to properly ground the ball - however the respite was short lived for the Bulldogs with Will Hopoate sent to the sin bin for a professional foul.

Delivering a belated knock-out through Paul Vaughan (55th minute), the flood gates opened with Norman (61st minute) and Dufty (63rd minute) taking the scoreline from 10-0 to 28-0 in Hopoate's absence.

The Bulldogs managed to avoid another shutout with an unexpected consolation try to Renouf Atoni (67th minute), however the home side finished with a bang as Junior Amone (70th minute) put himself in the right spot to cross for a try on debut.

A late intercept to Nick Meaney (73rd minute) rounded out the scoring as the Dragons ran out 32-12 winners to move into outright sixth position on 10 competition points.

Next week during Magic Round at Suncorp Stadium, the Dragons face the Storm on Sunday afternoon, while the Bulldogs take on the Raiders on Saturday afternoon.
