Suncorp field maintained its condition throughout the weekend and we saw minimal injuries. Given the reputation Suncorp


Stadium has held in the past, this is a huge positive for Brisbane as well as Magic Round going forward.

Josh Addo-Carr scoring nine tries in two games

In round 9 we saw Josh Addo-Carr make club history as he scored 6 tries in Melbourne's beat down against South Sydney. The Fox is no stranger to scoring tries although, there weren't too many fans that thought he would rack up similar statistics in Magic Round. However, the flying winger overcame a leg injury to score a hat-trick and bring his fortnight tally to nine. As we close in on game one of the Origin series, many Blues fans are buzzing at Addo-Carr's current form hoping he can replicate the same sort of performances for their state. Queensland fans of course, are hoping the opposite. Regardless, his current form has rugby league fans watching in awe and questioning whether he is the best winger the game has seen.

10 straight for Penrith

The Penrith Panthers go into round 11 having not lost a game yet. An accomplishment that has not been seen since the Sydney Roosters in 1996. For context, almost half the current squad weren't even born yet. This young

Knowing that Will Smith remained sidelined with a broken thumb, the playing group fought for his debut. When his father weighed up his options, it became a clear decision. The decision did not come without some hurdles to cross first, including Arthur being elevated to the top 30 just a day before flying to Brisbane. All of the pieces of the puzzle came together however and the 18-year-old ran onto Suncorp Stadium alongside the likes of Mitch Moses and Clint Gutherson.

Although it was not a debut to rock the history books, Arthur still found himself with a meat pie in the 75th minute. A try that would usually see a subdued response from the coach's box however, this time we saw not a coach's reaction but a proud dad's. A beautiful moment for the Arthur family, Parramatta Eels and Rugby League in general. In the words of many fans across, we love to see it.

across the nation and New Zealand packed out Suncorp across the three days, providing an unmatched atmosphere. The end goals were packed out with respective bays for specific team fans but the rest of the stadium was still buzzing with neutral fans just enjoying the footy.

UNDER THE PUMP

WINDS OF CHANGE BLOWING AGAIN AT MCDONALD JONES STADIUM

If you have been a fan of the Newcastle Knights over the last 15 years you would be used to change by now.

So why is it when the man capable of changing the Knights' fortunes suggests a way forward, some punters and pundits suggest he's merely shifting the blame?

Not taking responsibility for the team's shortcomings they would say.

But the fact remains the Knights are so far away from the top sides in the competition it's not funny and Adam O'Brien is aware of that.

"We've got to find a way in this club to learn how to win again," O'Brien said after the game on Friday night.

"We need to learn what it takes week in, week out. It sits with me.

"The club is used to this roller-coaster we're on, and we need to get off it. It ends with me."

Their 36-18 Magic Round capitulation to the Wests Tigers highlighted some alarming deficiencies which have been there all year.

A couple of high-quality Kalyn Ponga performances have allowed them to paper over the cracks and bought them time.

In doing so, the gap between the Knights best and worst performances has seen what started as a monkey slowly morph into a gorilla on their back.

But when O'Brien dares mention some of the other systems he has been involved in – namely with the Melbourne Storm and Sydney Roosters – some experts spin it into a crisis narrative.

Why wouldn't a man who has seen what success is want to replicate it?

More to the point, why wouldn't fans of a success-starved club want the man capable of replicating success to be able to ... attempt to replicate success?

O'Brien knows what it takes, but questions are starting to rightly be asked if he can do it with the current crop.

"I've seen teams in the past that I've been a part of leave no stone unturned in trying to go and get that success again and I've got to try and get that in this group," O'Brien said.

"There will be some changes at this club over the next few years. I'm not going to single blokes out, but it's clear if we can't get it then I've got to find a way to get it through recruitment."





In the last decade the Knights have three wooden spoons and their finals appearance in 2020 was their first since 2013.

They've been through six coaches and three changes of administration since 2012.

"There's been 10 years of probably not having a whole lot of success and there's three wooden spoons so it's ingrained in us a little bit," O'Brien said.

"We've got to try and find a way to get a winning culture in there and do what those teams that have tasted success do. They know what it takes.

"They're that hungry to get it back to taste it again that they're willing to put themselves through anything and we've got to learn that."

Even over the last six weeks the Knights performances have changed on an almost weekly basis.

They were overrun on the Gold Coast in round five, by the Roosters in round eight and the Tigers in round 10. Two gutsy wins over the Sharks and Raiders in the last month have shown what they could be capable of.

But chief executive Phil Gardner has a reputation of also knowing what success is.

He's been on the front foot this week suggesting changes at all levels of the club could be on the horizon.

"We're reviewing everything," Gardner told The Daily Telegraph.

"Right the way through from the front office down.

"We'll look at all individuals and what they bring to the club. That includes culture, recruitment and physical performance and rehabilitation.

"We're off the pace at the moment and need to fix it."

Cowboys return home to host struggling Knights

The 12th placed Cowboys host the 11th ranked Knights in a contest that's about as far removed from a traditional Thursday night blockbuster as you can get.

Although with both sides locked on eight competition points alongside three others including the eighth placed Raiders, the result for both clubs could be season-defining.

Both are last start losers but if post match press conferences are any gauge, then Todd Payton is in the more desirable shoes. Apart from a slow start, the Cowboys proved more than a match for the highly rated Roosters, while for Adam O'Brien, the Knights just simply stalled on the grid.

Widely tipped to tame the Tigers even after the late withdrawal of fullback Kalyn Ponga, Newcastle slumped to their third loss in four starts. Two late tries added some respectability, but it wasn't enough for a forlorn O'Brien who once again questioned his side's mental toughness.

With Manly, Parramatta and South Sydney set to follow, for Newcastle, this game takes on monumental significance.

And with Ponga still sidelined, O'Brien has surprisingly chosen a relatively unchanged line-up. An injured hamstring sees Hymel Hunt replaced on the wing by Brayden Musgrove in the only change following last week's loss in Brisbane.

Black Green's name on the extended bench is the calming influence the Knights need. While the makeshift pairing of Kurt Mann and Phoenix Crossland have shown glimpses of form, it's Green's structure and patience which the Knights have missed most.

As for North Queensland, they appear in far better shape and if not for a James Tedesco masterclass, the Cowboys may have run down the Roosters in Jason Taumalolo's 200th game. While it wasn't to be, with four of their pack topping 100 metres, Reece Robson and Scott Drinkwater once again showed their ability to ignite the Cowboys' attack.

This week they'll be without prop Coen Hess who failed his HIA with Tom Gilbert named to start in his place. In the only other change, second-rower Heilum Luki looks set to make his NRL debut off the bench.

Who to watch: Since landing a new two year extension, **Scott Drinkwater's** game has risen to another level. With two tries and two linebreak assists, the running five-eighth was at his scheming best during Magic Round. And with a kicking game that's on the improve, Todd Payton looks to have backed a winner.

While not named in O'Brien's post match rant, you can bet **David Klemmer** will be primed to lead the Knights' charge. Averaging a healthy 165 metres a week, look for the former Origin prop to roll forward with renewed intensity in effort to lift his side's spirits.

Favourite: Having won five of the past seven against Newcastle, the Cowboys are tipped to continue the trend.

My tip: With the tough words of a frustrated coach, the Knights are on notice and with a trio of Origin weapons up front, the response should rattle Queensland's newest stadium. But talk is cheap, and on home turf the Cowboys should prove far too good. **North Queensland by 14.**

For the Sharks, Josh Hannay has apparently liked what he's seen from the team that's lost 6 in a row and named an unchanged line-up. The most bizarre decision in my opinion is to retain Chad Townsend in the 17. Townsend will not be at the club next year and there are 3 players of equal or greater skill in Tracey, Trindall and Moylan who have been forced to play out of position during the year to accommodate him.

Who to watch: He has been somewhat of a polarising figure recently, however last week it was great to see Andrew Fifita get back to something resembling his best form. After coming out swinging against former coach John Morris during the week, Fifita clearly had a point to prove in his first NRL game since October last year, and he certainly delivered. Although he only played 19 minutes off the bench, he was able to make a clear impact for the Sharks off the bench, running harder than he has in recent years and showing determination which paid off when he was able to get to a loose ball first and set up fellow big man Aaron Woods for a try which swung momentum. It will be interesting this week to see if Fifita can replicate the effort this week as well as how many minutes Hannay plays him for.

Last week, Matt Dufty was undoubtedly the Dragons best attacking threat, however he unfortunately succumbed to a shoulder injury. It's a shame, however it does give Dragons and Rugby League fans a chance to see Cody Ramsey get his first career start at fullback. St George Illawarra have handed Ramsey a long-term deal through to the end of 2024, with the vision of him being the custodian for the bulk of that time. Last week, through no fault of his own, he wasn't able to conjure much with ball in hand, but he did show some nice speed to finish off a long range try at the death. Against a Sharks defence that has leaked 120 points over the last 3 weeks, Ramsey has an opportunity to give the Saints something to look forward to in the future on Friday night.

Favourite: After starting as outsiders, the Sharks are favoured by 6 points over the Dragons in this one.

My tip: Although the Dragons are missing a whole heap of personell and the Sharks looked promising last week, I still think the experience of Ben Hunt will be enough to ensure the Red V will be the ones snapping the losing streak come Friday Night. **St George Illawarra by 7.**

After a controversial weekend of football, the Sydney Roosters continue their quest for a top four spot as they take on the Brisbane Broncos.

The Sydney Cricket Ground hosts the Roosters after their convincing 14-point victory of the North Queensland Cowboys. After a quick start scoring four tries in the opening half an hour, the Roosters quickly found themselves ahead by eight points at the half time break after the Cowboys capitalised on Sitali Tupouniua's sin bin.

Despite, the comeback attempt from the Cowboys, the Roosters still showed why their one of the better teams in the competition, conceding just one try in the 70 minutes where they were able to field 13 players.

It's incredible that the Roosters are still able to play as a top five side despite all of the injuries that the side has experienced throughout the season. That's a credit to Trent Robinson and the system that he has built in Eastern Sydney, turning the Roosters into a modern-day powerhouse in similar fashion to the Melbourne Storm.

Like the Storm, the Roosters just keep rolling through the season as they comfortably beat the sides below them on the ladder. The Roosters made it seven from seven on Saturday night when it comes to beating sides below them on the ladder, whilst they sit zero from three against sides above them on the ladder.

That's the next step that the Roosters have to take if they're pushing for the premiership by the season's end. The Roosters will be aiming to extend that record to eight from eight with a victory over the Broncos on Saturday evening.

The Roosters have named an unchanged 17 from their win over the Cowboys on the weekend after Lachlan Lam successfully returned after recovering from a MCL injury.

The Broncos will be licking their wounds this week after they were dismantled by the Manly-Warringah Sea Eagles on Friday night. Brisbane suffered their largest defeat against Manly as the 'home' side piled on 50 points to the Broncos six. They struggled to keep up with Manly for much of the game and unfortunately were a massive casualty from the crackdown over the weekend as both Tyson Gamble and Jordan Riki were sent to the bin within seconds with the score at 26-6. The Sea Eagles took advantage of the numbers overlap and scored three quick tries to extend their lead.

There wasn't much the Broncos could do during that period of the match, but they could certainly put in a better opening 40 minutes against the Roosters than they did on the weekend. Conceding 20 points in the opening term isn't going to win you many games and the Broncos need to tighten up in defence if they're to trouble the Roosters at all on the weekend. The Broncos have made several changes after their humiliating loss to Manly. Anthony Milford has been dropped for the second time this season, making way for Albert Kelly's return to the NRL, having last played in 2014 for the Gold Coast Titans. Keenan Palasia will start for the suspended Jordan Riki as David Mead comes into the team for Corey Oates. Youngster Kobe Hetherington has been named on the bench for his NRL debut in place of Danny Levi.

Who to watch: Despite the Roosters being heavily backed to win this clash, there are some decent one on one battles to occur. Jared Waerea-Hargreaves against Payne Haas will be one to keep an eye on just as Angus Crichton versus Tevita Pangai Junior will be. But as always is the case with the Roosters, the player to watch will be James Tedesco and his opposite number Jamayne Isaako. Tedesco had an outstanding performance against the Cowboys on Saturday night as assisted a try, ran for 221 metres and broke a total of 10 tackles. That was the fourth time this season that the Roosters fullback had eclipsed 200 run metres and the first time he broke 10 tackles in a match this year. His opposite number Isaako, has had some defensive lapses this season but has been one of their more exciting players in attack. The former rookie of the year has scored five tries this year, including three in his last three and is averaging just shy of 150 run metres per game, a career high. Isaako has also assisted four tries and broke the line on seven occasions, whilst continuing to be a tackle breaking machine averaging 4.1 tackle breaks per game. This'll will be an exciting clash between two of the better tackle breakers in the game.

Favourite: The Roosters are the favourite for this fixture and rightly so. The Broncos are currently sitting in 15th spot on the ladder with only two wins to their name and that'll be unlikely to change this weekend. The Roosters have beaten the Broncos in three of their last four clashes including piling on 59 and 58 points respectively in their two fixture during the 2020 season.

My tip: The Roosters are hard to go past here, and I'd expect another big performance from skipper James Tedesco and backrower Angus Crichton. Despite their injuries, the Roosters are still elite all over the park and should get the job done convincingly against a struggling Brisbane side. **Sydney Roosters by 20.**

Saturday night Rugby League heads to the National capital as an undermanned Raiders side is set to take on the Melbourne Storm on Saturday night.

Last weekend at Magic Round, the Canberra Raiders were able to end a five-game losing streak when they were able to take an against the odds 20-18 victory over the Canterbury Bulldogs after spending a period down to eleven men at one stage.

The Raiders started the game last week strongly opening the scoring after just twelve minutes when Corey Harawira-Naera scored for the Green Machine. Their second half woes looked to continue as the Bulldogs began to dominate the second half and take the lead as Canberra couldn't match them. Things went from bad to worse for the Raiders as Jack Wighton was sent to the sin bin for a cannonball tackle before minutes later Josh Papalii was sent off for a high tackle. The reduction in players seemed to spark something in the Raiders as they scored two tries in three minutes to lead by eight. The Green machine held off a late fightback from the Bulldogs to win 20-18.

The Raiders this week have lost three key players through suspension with Jack Wighton, Josh Papalii and Josh Hodgson spending the weekend on the sideline. Ricky Stuart has recalled Sam Williams into the five-eighth role. The Raiders are also boosted with the return of Ryan Sutton whilst Brad Schneider is set for his NRL debut being named on the bench.

The Melbourne Storm have been at their clinical best over the past few weeks and last week it was the St George Illawarra Dragons that copped it after the 44-18 victory by the Melburnians on Sunday.

The Storm were dominant last week despite missing key players Cameron Munster, Brandon Smith and Harry Grant and losing Ryan Papenhuyzen early on in the contest. The Storm ran in three first half tries but could only manage a four-point goal with goal kicking struggles with just one conversion for the first half. The Storm turned on the quality in the second half as they ran in four tries in the space of 10 minutes in the early stages of the half. The Storm had a couple of defensive laps as Mikaele Ravalawa was able to cross for a hattrick though Craig Bellamy was smiling as Josh Addo-Carr also completed his hattrick to seal the 44-18 victory for the Storm.

It's been a mixed bag for Melbourne coach Craig Bellamy on the team front with Ryan Papenhuyzen ruled out after his severe concussion last weekend. Nicho Hynes has been named at fullback replacing Papenhuyzen whilst Melbourne have been boosted with the return of Brandon Smith in the number 9 jersey.

Who to watch: Entrusted by Ricky Stuart to take on the starting hooker role last weekend after Josh Hodgson was dropped, Tom Starling will need to be a key performer for an under-performing Raiders outfit. The service from dummy half will be very important for the Canberra halves to get their attack going.

One of the competitions in-form players, Nicho Hynes has starred for the Storm playing across a number of positions having spent the season coming off the bench, playing at fullback and in the five-eighth role for the Storm this season. Hynes ability to turn something into nothing is something that the Raiders will need to be wary of this weekend.

Favourite: The Storm are the heavy favourites due to a combination of the Raiders missing key players and the strong form of Melbourne over recent weeks including scoring 94 points in two games.

My tip: It's hard to go past Melbourne in the contest on Saturday night, the form of the Storm who have been under strength in the past few weeks but have still been super impressive. The loss of three key players for the Raiders is just too much of a hit to the under-performing side and it's hard to see them defeating the Storm this weekend. **Melbourne by 20.**

Dubbo may be treated to a potential grand final preview on Sunday as the Rabbitohs and Panthers face off.

South Sydney have just the two losses to their name in 2021 – both to the Melbourne Storm – and would only strengthen their premiership credentials here by snapping Penrith's winning run.

The Rabbitohs cruised to an early lead last week against Cronulla before faltering late, holding on for a 32-22 win.

Wayne Bennett bristled post-game at suggestions his team were struggling to put 80-minute performances together but it is not far from the truth.

The Panthers have conceded just 76 points this season – 124 fewer than the Rabbitohs and even restricted Melbourne to just 10 earlier in the season, proving just how difficult a task Souths have on Sunday.

The return of Latrell Mitchell does mean Bennett will have the first-choice spine at his disposal while former Panther Josh Mansour also returns on the wing.

Campbell Graham has been named on the extended bench and could make a comeback from injury but Cam Murray remains sidelined.

Penrith, meanwhile, welcome back Kurt Capewell with Liam Martin back to the bench and J'maine Hopgood dropping out in their only changes.

Nathan Cleary was at his devastating best in a 28-point individual haul against the Titans last week.

An 18-12 second half against the 12-man Gold Coast did not leave Ivan Cleary too impressed post-game – a concerning sign for the Rabbitohs.

Instead of hoping to play a Panthers side with little to prove, it is clear the coach still expects improvement and sustained intensity from the playing group, regardless of how many records they have broken along the way.

Who to watch: Damien Cook has the NSW No. 9 jersey wrapped up but Apisai Koroisau has certainly been putting the pressure on the incumbent the past year. Cook shapes as South Sydney's best chance of disrupting a Penrith defensive line that has so rarely cracked this season. While incredibly mobile and fit, the Panthers can get a bit loose at times in the middle around the ruck – Manly exposed it over a fortnight ago. If forwards can pop late offloads for Cook he has the pace to challenge Penrith. Meanwhile, Koroisau has been doing his job for the Panthers recently without being overly flashy but is primed for another big performance. Deception around the ruck is his greatest strength but has not been needed given Penrith's dominance in most games this year. The Rabbitohs though present stern opposition and Koroisau may need to draw on his bag of tricks to get Penrith over the line.

Favourite: Hard to back against the undefeated Panthers who are well backed here.

My tip: The Rabbitohs have the individual attacking threats to make this a tight affair but Penrith's edge in defence should prove the difference. **Penrith by 8.**

Long-standing foes clash in match of the round

Birthing a rivalry that began when both teams entered the New South Wales Rugby League back in 1947, the Parramatta Eels and the Manly Sea Eagles will renew hostilities once more on Sunday afternoon in a match that shapes as one of the best of the season so far.

Sitting in second position after their best start to a season in 44 years, the Parramatta Eels will be hoping to continue a strong run of form at Bankwest Stadium that has yielded 21 wins from 28 appearances.

Establishing a dominant lead in the opening quarter of Magic Round before weathering a comeback to win 34-18 against the Warriors last week, coach Brad Arthur will be looking to record six consecutive wins for only the second time in his coaching tenure.

Staring down the prospect of winning ten home-and-away matches prior to State of Origin for the first time since 1983, the Eels will have an added source of motivation with charismatic winger Blake Ferguson set to make his 50th appearance for the club on Sunday afternoon.

Keeping faith with the bulk of the squad that triumphed in Brisbane seven days earlier, Joey Lussick will make his club debut in place of Ray Stone off the bench. Lussick played one game for the Sea Eagles in 2017 before spending the past three years honing his craft with Salford in the English Super League.

Surging into the top eight after spending the first month of the premiership in last position, the Manly Sea Eagles will face their fiercest test against one of the heavyweights of the league.

Winning five of their past six matches against teams outside the top eight, the Sea Eagles will be out for redemption after falling well short against premiership front runners the Roosters (4-46), Rabbitohs (12-26) and Panthers (6-46) over the opening rounds before pushing the Panthers (16-28) in a narrow loss at the start of May.

Obliterating the Broncos 50-6 in an attacking tour de force last Friday, coach Des Hasler has named Cade Cust in place of Kieran Foran (broken hand) at five-eighth, with Indigenous All Stars' representative Zac Saddler filling the vacant bench position.

While his younger brother has garnered plenty of headlines since returning from injury, the focus will be on Jake Trbojevic as he plays his 150th game for the Sea Eagles after debuting for the club - incidentally alongside Eels captain Clint Gutherson - in 2013.

Recording an impressive victory over the Tigers at Bankwest Stadium on ANZAC Day, the Sea Eagles have yet to defeat the Eels at the Western Sydney rectangular venue.

Who to watch: Regarded as one of the best front-rowers in the world at various points of his career, Reagan Campbell-Gillard will be looking to impress representative selectors ahead of the opening State of Origin match next month. Scoring his first try double in the NRL last week, the 27-year-old Rooty Hill junior has averaged 150 metres and just under 28 tackles each week this season to rank among the best props in the league. Included in Brad Fittler's extended squad last season without adding to his lone appearance for the Blues back in 2018, look for Campbell-Gillard to lead from the front on Sunday afternoon.

After beginning the year as arguably the weakest starting hooker in the league, Lachlan Croker has grown to complement the strengths of the Sea Eagles' attack. Coming to prominence as an interchange utility with a preference for playing five-eighth, the 24-year-old one-time Raider has defended stoutly with 36 tackles each week while gaining confidence to pick and choose his moments to run with the ball. Knowing his role as a supporting player to superstar Tom Trbojevic and captain Daly Cherry-Evans, Croker has been a valuable contributor in the side's resurgence over the past six weeks.

Favourite: With both teams winning three matches apiece since 2018, the Eels are expected to prove too strong for their rivals from the Northern Beaches.

My tip: Gaining confidence with a run of wins against teams outside the top eight, the Sea Eagles will rate their chances of claiming a major scalp on Sunday afternoon. **Manly by 1.**
