

# ESEL PLAYING FIELD

NO EGOS THE KEY TO PANTHERS' REMARKABLE RUN

t seems quite remarkable the only match Penrith have lost in their last 29 starts was the one that mattered most.

But the Panthers haven't missed a beat in the opening 11 rounds of the 2021 Telstra Premiership suggesting there has been no grand final hangover.

Second-rower Viliame Kikau said the reason for their carefree style of play was due to the environment created by the players.

There are no egos.

"If you're the highest paid player or the lowest paid player, everyone treats each other the same," Kikau said.

"We have mutual respect for everyone and that's the kind of culture we're trying to build in this club and it shows in how we play.

"Everyone respects each other and everyone wants to work for each other."

Ruthless is often an adjective used to describe the Panthers performances on game day, but that is the

result of everyone buying in to what they want to achieve.

"One of the main things that the coaching staff brought up was being ruthless not just when game day comes, but being ruthless in our preparation as well in how we train and how we present ourselves around here," Kikau said.

"Come game day it's second nature to us so we go out there and do it."

The Panthers toughest challenge appears likely to come in the form of the Origin period in the next few months after they were largely unaffected in 2020.

But Kikau is confident their 'next man up' policy will reap the rewards.

"It's going to show how resilient this club is because we've always had that next man up mentality," he said.

"We lost some of our big players in the first few games, but the boys who took their place came in and gelled straight away.

"They've done the job."

One player who could feature in the Origin discussion is centre Matt Burton who has been a revelation so far this season.

Kikau has no doubt he has what it takes should Brad Fittler need him to do a job for the Blues.

"Burto is a natural footballer," he said.

"He's the type of player that comes into a team and does the job so it's a matter of time for him to get that mention of playing rep games."

### **Match Preview**

### with Emile El-Azar

The Melbourne Storm travel up to Brisbane (where our esteemed ARLC chair would prefer the Storm to be based, because - shortsighted), to play the Brisbane Broncos, in a Thursday Night mis-match at Suncorp Stadium.

I didn't think I would be saying this, but the Broncos come into this one on the back of a massive win over the Sydney Roosters. Honestly. A 34-16 carve up. Amazing.

The Storm continue on their merry way, with a clinical 2nd half against Canberra, turning a 12-10 halftime deficit into a 34-10 smashing. They just own this league. I've said it before, but sorry Penrith - you're not even in their postcode (and I write this as the Panthers prepare to put 500 points on my hapless Bulldogs this weekend, but my comment stands).

In team news, the Broncos "welcome" back Anthony Milford, who returns into the side at five-eighth, in a forced change to replace the suspended Tyson Gamble. Albert Kelly moves to halfback.

Who to watch: For the Broncos, it's more a perverse interest in seeing how Anthony Milford goes.

He will either turn it on, in an attempt to attract another team into signing him up, or put in the usual underwhelming performance that has seen him out of the side in recent times.

For the Storm, it's to watch how many points that lethal backline will be able to put on.

In a combination of talent, and the current rules in place, get your try-scorer multi's together, and stack it with Storm's 1-7 (gamble responsibly!).

### **Match Preview**

Top-eight berth beckons for the winner in the lands of the Wulgurukaba people.

In a season that continues to toss up surprises, the Cowboys and Warriors are set to face off for the second time this month.

Back in round 8 it was the Warriors who jumped 20 points clear before holding off a fast finishing North Queensland to win 24-20 in a Gosford heart stopper.

Speedy young gun Reece Walsh started in the halves that day, and alongside Kodi Nikorima the pair gave the Cowboys a first half lesson. Since then, the Warriors' attack has continued to prosper with Nathan Brown weaving Dally M Medal winner Roger Tuivasa-Sheck into the mix from the wing while starting Walsh at fullback.

In a blow for the Cowboys pack, prized lock Jason Taumalolo and forward Lachlan Burr have accepted one match suspensions, while Francis Molo has been ruled out. Coen Hess returns and with Jordan McLean and the improving Shane Wright and Tom Gilbert will be expected to do the bulk of the Cowboys' heavy lifting.

Upfront, the Warriors have no such problems where the only changes see Bunty Afoa and Ben Murdoch Massila drop back to the bench with Kane Evans and Jack Murchie named to start.

In what promises to be a high scoring Indigenous Round affair, if the Cowboys can land on the front foot, then the likes of the in-form Scott Drinkwater and the returning Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow are every chance of matching the threat posed by their New Zealand counterparts.

As frustrating as it must be for both coaches, the propensity for both these sides to concede and accumulate points in large clumps makes this compulsive viewing.

Last week, Todd Payten's side effortlessly put 16 unanswered points on the Knights. They then found themselves trailing after the break, but a timely second coming eventually eased them home.

So too the Warriors, their victory over the Tigers broke a two game losing streak but in conceding 26 points it was anything but a cruisy evening for Brown in the Warriors coaching box.

Who to watch: Despite crossing for only three tries this year, with 95 in 143 appearances, Kyle Feldt has one of the best strike rates in the NRL. Still to earn a Maroons jumper, the classy winger put on a show against the Knights in smashing his way through 10 tackles to make four line breaks. A season best 236 metres was the result, and is sure to have Queensland coach Paul Green screaming for more.

Reece Walsh hasn't had any trouble attracting favourable press across his first five outings. Last week the Tigers were clueless to his sparkling feet and mesmerizing passes. Just as valuable as the three try assists and one try was his last ditch try saving tackle to ice the match. Whether he's down back or in the halves, the 18-year-old is sure to catch the eye.

Favourite: The Warriors have had the wood on the Cowboys winning four of the past five and enter this week's clash as the narrow favourite.

My tip: In a fast and furious contest, this one points to an absolute try-fest where sin bins could ultimately decide the result. North Queensland's record of three wins from the past five against the Warriors in Townsville gives them a slight edge, and they should have enough to make it five straight wins on home turf this season. North Queensland by 4.

Meeting on the land of the Burramattagal people, Friday night football will see the Wests Tigers playing host to the St George Illawarra Dragons at Bankwest Stadium.

The Wests Tigers come into the contest sitting down in 14th position after a disappointing season to date with just three wins to date from their first 11 matches. The Tigers last weekend were just seconds away from snatching victory against the New Zealand Warriors as they fell to a 30-26 defeat in Gosford.

### **Match Preview**

Upset of the millennium? Unlikely.

Under more merciful circumstances Saturday's match-up between the unbeaten Penrith Panthers and the last-placed Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs would be called off.

Looking to become the first team since South Sydney in 1925 to open a season with 12 consecutive wins, the Penrith Panthers have stood above all else so far this season with a brand of football equally exhilarating in attack and defence.

Shaming the Rabbitohs into the category of premiership pretenders with a blistering 56-12 assault in Dubbo last Sunday, coach Ivan Cleary will be expecting no mercy from his players as they look to continue a strong 75 per cent record against the Bulldogs over their past eight meetings.

Ranked first in defence, post-contact metres, tackle breaks and second in attack and line breaks, the Panthers also hold the distinction of the fewest missed tackles over the first 11 rounds.

Resisting the temptation to rest a host of stars in the lead up to the opening Origin encounter, front-rower Moses Leota returns from a shoulder complaint, allowing Liam Martin to shift into his preferred second-row position after Kurt Capewell accepted a one-match ban for a crusher tackle.

Managing one win over the opening 11 rounds to rank as the worst side to wear the blue and white in the professional era, the Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs will need divine intervention to stand a chance of pulling off an upset as \$21.00 outsiders.

Showing courage only to falter at the death during last week's 30-20 loss to the Titans, coach Trent Barrett will be hoping his side can defy recent history on the lands of the Darug People following two wins from their past eight visits.

Holding the ignominy of the worst attack, defence, line breaks and tackle breaks, the few stats the Bulldogs thrive in - completion rates and errors - reveal an irrefutable truth that Trent Barrett - the man praised for invigorating Penrith's attack last year - has yet to deliver on expectations in his second coming as a head coach.

Welcoming back inspiration skipper Josh Jackson and impulsive front-rower Jack Hetherington from injury and suspension respectively, Jackson Topine will start at hooker, while Joe Stimson comes onto the bench in place of Corey Waddell.

Who to watch: Enjoying a breakout year on the left wing after making his name on the opposite side of the field, Brian To'o will be looking to make a final push on Saturday afternoon in his bid to earn a State of Origin debut. Leading the league in tackle breaks, running metres and post-contact metres, the 22-year-old pocket rocket may not have the height of other wingers, but what he lacks in size he more than compensates for with power and work rate. Contracted to the Panthers until the end of 2023, expect the Samoan international to be unrelenting in his bid to add a different shade of blue to his jersey collection.

In a team that has struggled to be competitive for a number of seasons, Nick Meaney has become a mainstay of the Bulldogs' backline. Willing with the ball in hand and capable of playing several positions, the 23-year-old has reached an intriguing juncture as a first-grader where a move away from Belmore may be in the best interests of advancing his career. Out of contract at the end of the year, look for Meaney to continue offering a rare attacking spark in the hopes of earning a deal at a club where losing hasn't become the norm.

Favourite: There's short-priced favourites and then there's this - for perhaps the first time in NRL history the Panthers are paying \$1.01 to come away with two premiership points on Saturday afternoon.

My tip: Every single Canterbury player could play beyond their potential and it wouldn't matter - the Panthers have so much confidence at the moment that they have made a mockery of the very concept of a two-horse race. **Penrith by**

Just 17 of the 34 who ran out in last year's semi-final between the Roosters and Raiders are set to take part in Saturday's rematch in Gosford, on the lands of the Darkinjung people.

However, while the Roosters are still thereabouts in premiership contention the same cannot be said for Canberra. Instead, pressure continues to build after a heavy defeat to an undermanned Storm line-up last week.

Sure, the Raiders themselves were missing Josh Papalii, Jack Wighton and Josh Hodgson but there was no reason why they could not have at least kept it competitive.

Ricky Stuart's post-game press conference perfectly illustrated the current situation at the nation's capital.

Raiders fans would have tuned in for answers but were only left with more questions after an ice-cold Stuart barely offered any form of explanation for the team's poor form.

Save for a 20-18 win over the lowly Bulldogs, Canberra have been on a dire losing skid recently and look more likely to miss the top eight at this point with the Titans, Sea Eagles and Warriors on the rise.

They do welcome back Wighton and Hodgson in a boost while Sam Williams replaces homesick halfback George Williams, who was released effective immediately.

The Roosters already presented enough of a challenge for Canberra but they loom as an even bigger threat coming off a shock loss. The Tricolours were outenthused by the Broncos last week and will look to bounce back quickly before the Origin period or risk losing touch with the top four.

Sam Walker was targeted in defence last week and failed to have his usual impact in attack but there is no real reason for concern there.

He is still perfecting his craft and adjusting to the weekly grind – you would also expect he may get even more protection this Saturday from his forwards.

In team changes Josh Morris returns while Victor Radley and Angus Crichton are suspended.

Who to watch: Canberra were torn apart in defence by Melbourne last week and if the Roosters win the battle up front this week it will relieve pressure to allow Sam Walker to bounce back. Walker's decision-making under pressure was exposed last Saturday as he threw too many cut-out passes that simply were not in. It is all a learning experience for the youngster but coach Robinson won't want him dropping his head. Instead, it will all be about continuing to back himself. Once again the key will be for Walker to make the right choices, particularly given the Raiders wingers like to rush out at times and that could cut off his long looping passes.

The Roosters have plenty of punch in the second row [although the loss of Crichton hurts there] and that is an area the Raiders have struggled this season. Only last year Canberra's edge forwards were both aggressive when they needed to be and subtle with their ball-playing close to the line. Without Josh Bateman though some of that intensity has faded and it is in desperate need of a return. As co-captain, Elliott Whitehead looms as the man to lead from the front in that respect. Whitehead is highly skilful but also at times needs to solely focus on running hard and direct before thinking offload or pass. His effort is there but with better decision-making he shapes as a genuine game-breaker for Canberra.

Favourite: The Roosters are well backed to win this one.

My tip: The Raiders desperately need a breakout win but it won't come here. Roosters too professional to drop two-straight. Sydney Roosters by 18.

Inconsistent sides look to continue winning ways at Coffs Harbour

The Sharks and Titans each started the season showing a lot of promise, although their recent performances have been marred by lacklustre defence that sees the Sharks sitting in 13th and the Titans only in the top 8 on for and against, with teams like the Warriors and Cowboys hot on their heels.

Last week, each enjoyed wins but in rather unconvincing displays. The Sharks only just snuck home against a Dragons side missing a host of regular starters, while the Titans conceded 20 points against the Bulldogs, the most any team has let in against the likely wooden-spooners.

While the Titans have struggled to score points against on occasion against quality opposition this year, their attack against teams who aren't as defensively well drilled remains extremely innovative and entertaining to watch. Their average winning score is 36, and they have scored 30 and 28 points in losses to the Rabbitohs and Broncos respectively.

It leaves little doubt to the fact that their problems lie largely on the other side of the ball.

The Sharks, on the other hand, had questionable defence going into 2021 and while initially showing promise, they have fallen significantly since about Round 5 or 6, conceding an average of 40 points against top 4 teams and being the only team to lose to the Bulldogs.

That being said, they are coming off a rare win last week against the Dragons and have a huge opportunity to make in two in a row with their strongest halves partnering of Moylan and Johnson being named, with Josh Hannay finally making the right decision and dropping Chad Townsend.

Who to watch: Shaun Johnson was among the best halves in the comp before injuring himself in the penultimate round of 2020. He led the league in try assists over the regular season and Cronulla have struggled without him since, going out in week 1 of the finals and not gaining any cogency in attack so far this year, bar one game against the Cowboys.

He has only played 3 games this year and is yet to chalk up a win, however this weekend will mark his 200th appearance in first grade, and if he can return to his good form the Titans will find it hard to stop the Sharks.

For the Titans, Moeaki Fotuaika has gone under the radar for most of his career despite making his origin debut last year. He has been a little quiet so far in 2021, however last week against the Bulldogs he showed what he can add to this Titans side when he is given more minutes.

He made 15 runs for a whopping 188 metres (including 57 post contact), while mustering 10 tackle breaks, a line break and a try assist, all while making 39 tackles at 90% efficiency. He is up against a relatively strong Sharks forward pack featuring Rudolf, Talakai and Fifita, and with another strong performance should solidify his Queensland origin credentials.

Favourite: The Titans are favoured by 2 and a half points against the Sharks on Sunday

My tip: If Chad Townsend had been named, I'd have the Titans winning in a landslide, however the inclusion of Moylan and Johnson will result in a high scoring game that the Sharks will come out on top in. **Cronulla by 6**.

### Sharks snap losing streak in Golden **Point thriller over Dragons**

Cronulla has snapped a six-game losing streak to defeat St George-Illawarra by 13-12 in a Golden Point thriller at Netstata Jubilee Stadium tonight.

Sharks halfback Chad Townsend was the hero, kicking a field goal following a see-sawing battle in the local derby, where the Sharks were extremely fortunate to get the win after St George failed to go away despite Cronulla dominating large periods of the match. Cronulla however gave the Red V not one but two unlikely opportunities to snatch a remarkable victory, however five-eighth Corey Norman failed to convert either of his field goal attempts.
