Tackling concussion head on

Concussion expert wants better attitudes from the media toward head injuries in NRL matches

a Trobe University Associate professor Alan Pearce is calling on sporting media to change the game and stop glorifying concussion.


The call comes after Wests Tigers forward Michael Chee-Kam was seen to be convulsing after a head knock. Earlier that night, media organisations had celebrated Parramatta Eels forward Ryan Matterson's failed Head Injury Assessment as a storyline to the rivalry.

Mr Pearce, who specialises in concussion, believes educating coaches, commentators and journalists would lead to safer outcomes in sport.

"On one hand you have people who say 'wow, that's amazing – he's been knocked into next week' while on the other hand we're seeing someone suffer a brain injury. That glorification could cause damage long term – players are in a culture where they ignore their own health," he said.

"[Some hits are still in the spirit and laws] of the game. But it is the commentary around it that needs to change. We don't want to glorify the act, we want to highlight the impact brain injuries can have.

"NFL, for example, no longer show big hits as highlights. They show plays – they focus on the skill and not the hits."



Tough pill to swallow

Is the Newcastle dummy-half jersey cursed? Connor Watson joins the Knights' casualty ward

T was the sight success-starved Newcastle fans had been dreading - Connor Watson being helped from McDonald Jones Stadium during last weekend's 18-12 loss to Canterbury.

Ten minutes earlier, mid-season signing and replacement hooker Andrew McCullough limped from the field after tearing his hamstring off the bone.

Before that, off-season signing Jayden Brailey ruptured his anterior cruciate ligament in late March and was gone for the year.

"It's one of those injuries where you don't know why it's happened and it's a pretty tough pill to swallow, but unfortunately that's footy," Watson said.

In the last four seasons, Newcastle have gone through five hooking options and Watson had a simple suggestion.



"Maybe retire the nine jersey and wear number 20 or something like that," Watson said on Monday when asked about the Knights' wretched run of hooker injuries.

So he wouldn't be human if his latest injury setback didn't stir up some unsettling thoughts.

"A non-contact injury like that is hard to take," he said.

"I can take getting crunched in a tackle and doing something, but moving from marker and it just going like that ... I'm not having much luck at the moment."

Prior to Sunday's snapped Achilles, Watson had only returned from an ankle injury a fortnight earlier.

"Injuries happen, but to miss six games, come back and feel like I was in good shape and ready to finish out the year strong and contend for a premiership with this team is really frustrating," he said.


Watson was scheduled to undergo surgery on Monday, then he hopes to settle his future in the red and blue.

"I don't want to leave, I've said before that we're building something special here and I know I'm going to come back bigger and better and stronger next year," he said.

"But I don't want to go anywhere else for the moment."

Electric Eels outclass gallant Tigers at slippery Bankwest

The Parramatta Eels are back in the NRL winners circle after beating a brave Wests Tigers outfit 26 points to 16 on Thursday night on a Bankwest surface not unlike a banana peel in terms of how easy it was for the players to run on.

Despite the result, it was the Tigers who got first blood in the opening 2 minutes of the match. Russell Packer got his team a penalty off his first touch and the Tigers rolled upfield. It was eventually off season recruit Luciano Leilua who crashed onto a peach of a pass from Harry Grant to score the opening try of the match. It would've been that much sweeter for Tigers fans given he was the direct replacement for the polarising Ryan Matterson, who himself was ruled out early due to an HIA.

It took the Eels just 8 minutes to strike back and there were no prizes for guessing who scored the try. Maika Sivo finished off a slick Eels backline movement and brushed pass would-be tackler Adam Doueihi on his way to his 8th try of season 2020. Scores were locked up at 4 apiece after 10 minutes.

For the next 10 minutes it was all the Wests Tigers. They extended their lead to 6 after Adam Doueihi had probably his best pass in the NRL to send David Nofoaluma over the line almost untouched and Moses Mbye iced a rare sideline

conversion. The new found momentum made the imminent decision to take the 2 points in the 20th minute all the more bizarre, and it was almost immediately followed by one of the best tries a big man can ever score.

Reagan Campbell-Gillard was on the receiving end of a Clint Gutherson short ball 50 metres out from the line and exhausted every last bit of pace he had in him to burn fullback Adam Doueihi and outrun winger Tommy Talau on his way to a memorable 4 pointer. 3 minutes later the Eels kicked a penalty goal and all of the sudden scores were level again.

The final scoring play of the half was just as brilliant as Mitchell Moses showed Parramatta exactly what they were missing over the last 3 weeks with a magical piece of eyes up play. It was the second tackle in attacking range and the former Tiger saw the fullback was out of position and performed a chip 'n' chase executed to perfection. It meant the Eels would go into the half time break up by 6 points in a remarkable turnaround.

It only took the Eels 4 minutes of the second half to post more points, with Shaun Lane chasing down a Gutherson grubber to further Parramatta's lead to 10. A period of arm wrestling would follow before the stalemate was broker off the back of another sweeping play finished off by Sivo.

Blake Ferguson produced the greatest no try in the history of Rugby League with 3 minutes left in the game. He had 10 metres to go and performed a move more commonly seen in high jump to go aerial and only just get the ball down in the field of play, however it all counted for naught as replays showed a knock on in the leadup.

Rookie winger Tommy Talau was able to score a consolation try in the final minute, finishing off some deft work from his side, in particular Moses Mbye who did well to sum up the situation and put Talau in a position to score.

Sea Eagles soar into top eight after Townsville tussle

Manly Sea Eagles recorded a 24-12 success against North Queensland Cowboys tonight to move into the top eight in Townsville.

The Sea Eagles followed up their ambush last weekend against the table-topping Eels, with a much sober outing. Manly kept the Cowboys at arms length with two tries in each half to move themselves into the top eight.

Curtis Sironen, Danny Levi, Daly Cherry-Evans and Cade Cust all crossed for the visitors while Reuben Garrick had a comfortable night with the boot, kicking four from four. Cowboys scored through Kyle Feldt and Francis Molo but couldn;t muster enough to challenge the Sea Eagles.

After their wobble in recent weeks, the Sea Eagles have found their rhythm again. Now they've won back-to-back games, sit inside the top eight and look to welcome back stars Dylan Walker and Tom Trbojevic in coming weeks. So, things are much brighter on the northern beaches.

Coming off their upset, the Sea Eagles started out with a bang. Sironen spun across in the 7th minute after back-to-back sets followed by Danny Levi, who continued to find his way to the stripe that made it 12-nil after a quarter of the contest.

Finding who to partner Cherry-Evans in the halves for the Sea Eagles has been a challenge for Des Hasler. Cade Cust put together a compelling audition tonight, scoring the final four-pointer and setting up DCE. Cust had the ball on the string with several dropouts which tired out the Cowboys pack.

Josh Hannay couldn't inspire his side to a result in his coaching debut, but the Cowboys showed slight signs of promise. Second-gamer Daejarn Asi looked comfortable in his halves role with Hamiso Tabuai-Fidlow was solid at fullback. Otherwise, the attack was clunky once again.

There was enough ball for the Cowboys to bridge the deficit but bar kicks to Feldt's wing and short balls to the forwards, there wasn;t much. Since their Grand Final success in 2015, the decline has been gradual from the Townsville side and this season might represent the nadir for their rebuild into how to become contenders again.

Kyle Feldt continued to show his aerial prowess with a leaping effort in the 39th minute to make it 12-6. Francis Molo nudged over late to give some false hope for the comeback at 24-12 but besides a gliding run from Tabuai-Fidow there wasn't much thrust to the attack.

Storm destroy the Broncos to keep the NRL on notice

Melbourne have thrashed the Broncos 46-8 in wet conditions at Suncorp Stadium tonight to send a reminder to the NRL competition that they are still contenders despite the Storm having the challenge of not being able to be based in Melbourne for the foreseeable future due to COVID-19 restrictions.

Melbourne held a narrow 18-4 lead against a seemingly rejuvenated Broncos at halftime, before the Storm went on the rampage, racing in for six second half tries to humiliate the Broncos on their home turf.

Jahrome Hughes and Cameron Smith were the orchestrators for the visitors, with Hughes scoring a crucial try before the break to swing the momentum in the visitors favour. Following Hughes' solo effort prior to halftime, Melbourne picked apart the hapless Broncos with Hughes, Josh Addo -Carr, Ryan Papenhuyzen and young gun Tino Fa'asuamaleaui all scoring 2 tries each in a dominant display.

For Brisbane, despite showing some vast improvement in effort in the first half, the pressure just continues to pile on under siege coach Anthony Seibold, after his side again capitulated in another horror display.

Coming into the match it was unprecedented that Melbourne had been such strong favourites during their fierce rivalry. However, that seemed perfectly justified when in just the first minute of the game Storm hooker Cameron Smith put in a deft grubber on the last. The ball then deflected off Broncos forward Pat Carrigan and was then toed ahead by Kenny Bromwich. Storm winger Josh

Addo-Carr then got to the ball ahead of Bromwich to open the scoring. Smith converted and it was 6-0.

The Broncos however responded with a seemingly rejuvenated Anthony Milford and Darius Boyd who combined on the left to have winger Herbie Farnworth denied a first try for the Broncos having slid a leg into touch. However de-ja-vu occurred minutes later and Farnworth got the ball down the left-hand side of the same duo and made no mistake this time, scoring in the corner to tie up the game following the conversion from Kotoni Staggs from the sideline.

Both sides then traded penalty goals through Staggs and Smith respectively to even the scores at 8 all. In what proved to be a crucial play just before the break, all Melbourne snatched the lead through half Jahrome Hughes who collected the ball inside his own 20 metres. The Storm number 7 then fended away from Broncos interchange forward Jamil Hopoate to score beside the posts in a superb solo effort to give his side the lead 14-8 at the break.

Melbourne again mirrored their first half with an early try, when Cameron Munster held up a beautiful ball at the line for his backrower Kenny Bromwich to crash over. Smith missed the conversion, however the Storm led 18-8 after the break

The Storm then marched downfield again, when lock Dale Finucane took the ball close to the line and hit young gun Tino Fa'asuamaleaui who ran a superb line to crashes over to score. Smith converted to make it 24-8.

Melbourne continued to flex their muscle, when Maroons five-eighth Cameron Munster was crunched close to the line, however managed to get away a terrific offload to Ryan Papenhuyzen who scored a great try to extend the visitors lead to 30-8

The dominance continued at the backend of the match with Hughes, Addo-Carr and Fa'asuamaleaui scoring doubles to extend the scoreline to a dominant 46-8 win

It wasn't the thrashing many expected but the Roosters did enough to triumph 18-10 against a spirited Warriors line-up this afternoon at Gosford.

At halftime, it looked like the upset was on. Warriors led 10-6, thanks to tries to the departing Ken Maumalo and Eliesa Katoa but it was the Roosters five-eighth Luke Keary that stepped up to snatch away a famous result. He scored himself and a late four-pointer to Joseph Manu gave the Roosters the eight-point win.

Losing four players after this contest, the Warriors set to their work early. Blake Green lifted a kick to the left wing which Katoa knocked into the path of Ken Maumalo, one of those leaving on Monday, to open the scoring at 6-nil. Warriors did spurn a series of chances following that to further their advantage.

The second half was more an arm wrestle between two sides which weren't at their fluid best tonight. Roosters probed through their stars - James Tedesco, Brett Morris - but it was five eighth Keary that broke the game open.

He peppered the Warriors with short kicks which trapped them behind the line then off a fortunate deflection gathered his own grubber to edge the Roosters ahead 12-10. From there, the Roosters ran downhill but until Manu crossed in the 70th minute, it was uncomfortable for them.

Despite not being at their best, the Premiers moved back into the winner's column and importantly the top four after the eight-point result. For the Warriors, now they lose four of their players who head home to understandably be with their families but it's a long road ahead for them.

Some positive news though, the loan deals of Daniel Alvaro and George Jennings from the Parramatta Eels will give them some depth.

Sharks snuff out Dragons in entertaining derby

Cronulla-Sutherland have taken bragging rights in the latest instalment of the Southern derby, downing the Dragons 28-24 at Netstrata Jubilee Stadium tonight.

In a nine-try contest with multiple momentum swings, it was the Sharks who held on despite a late St George Illawarra onslaught which very nearly netted them a second consecutive final-minute victory.

The Red V were the first side to trouble the Point Family in the famous Kogarah scoreboard, with Tyrell Fuimaono crossing in an unusual manner to open the scoring. The Dragons' second rower had the ball stripped as he surged over the goalline, only to reach out and ground it (as is permitted under the rules) and secure a four-pointer.

After Zac Lomax converted, the Sharks turned the tables and by the tenth minute things were locked up at 6-all with Jack Williams awarded a controversial try after seeming to beat Dragons fullback Matt Dufty to the ball.

Replays raised questions over the call, but the Bunker awarded it and the ledger was square.

Lomax put the Saints back in front soon after with a penalty goal and by the 20th minute had pushed the Saints further ahead with a try of his own, which he duly converted and the 'away team' led 14-6.

From there though, the pendulum swung dramatically in favour of the men from the Shire. Sione Katoa and Shaun Johnson both crossed within minutes of each other at the half-hour mark and put Cronulla back in the lead, then Will Kennedy's 33rd minute effort saw them surge ahead to 22-14, a lead they maintained til the halftime break.

That lead was extended just minutes after halftime when bustling prop Aaron Woods climbed over the chalk for his own four-pointer, and things looked bleak for the Saints at 28-14 down.

Before the hour mark though, the contest would become a lot closer, with Lomax bagging a second try and Ravalawa scoring in the corner. At 28-24 the Dragons seemed to have the ascendency, but unfortunately for them, they couldn't translate the possession and field position in the final quarter of the contest into any more points.

Their last valiant effort came in the final 20 seconds when Corey Norman sent a sailing kick across the field, finding a chasing Jason Saab near the dead ball line - he took it and grounded it... but not inside the line.

Resilient Raiders keep the Rabbitohs at bay

The Canberra Raiders have secured another gritty win, 18-12 over the South Sydney Rabbitohs, after once again losing a player from their 2019 Grand Final spine.

At 12-all in the 47th minute Charnze Nicoll-Klokstad left the field and did not return as he got what's been reported as a compound dislocation to his finger.

To create the match-winning try in the 54th minute, Elliott Whitehead went into dummy-half on the last tackle to deliver a short-side grubber kick that deflected up off the defence for Semi Valemi on the wing to score his first NRL try.

The Rabbitohs tested Canberra right up to full-time, pinning the home team within their own end of the field for most of the second half.

Tom Burgess came alive in the final 20 minutes with runs that bent the Raiders back. His best charge from a long goal-line dropout taking South Sydney up to 15 metres from the tryline on tackle one.

Canberra selected Jordan Rapana to replace Nicoll-Klokstad at fullback, but to make matters worse Rapana's diving effort to prevent a South Sydney try in the 70th minute required him to leave the field for a HIA.

The Rabbitohs had fullback concerns of their own, as Alex Johnston played 17 minutes before a head knock ended his night.

It was a 10-0 lead for the Raiders after 15 minutes as tries from kicks to Jarrod Croker and Bulldogs-bound Nick Cotric got them rolling.

By the 26th minute the Rabbitohs had laid on two tries of their own through Dane Gagai and Adam Reynolds.

A flick pass from Croker in his own half was a risky play that brought a Whitehead knock-on and Rabbitohs the momentum. They went through the hands with an outside shift through Cook, Walker and eventually Gagai to get in the corner.

On the restart the Raiders conceded three penalties which Jaydn Su'A used to hit a hole and pass back for Reynolds to scurry towards the posts. Reynolds converted his try to bring up 1500 career points in the NRL.

Tonight was the seventh-consecutive match the Raiders finished with a margin of eight points or less, of which they've now won four.

The injury list is ever growing for Canberra. With doubt on Nicoll-Klokstad and Rapana it's likely at least one of them will add to a casualty ward that already has Josh Hodgson, John Bateman, Curtis Scott, Sia Soliola, Corey Horsburgh, Emre Guler, Bailey Simonsson and Michael Oldfield.

NRL debutant and son of Matthew Johns, Jack Johns, was injected into the match earlier than anticipated when Johnston was forced from the field for a HIA.

In positive news for the Rabbitohs, Latrell Mitchell has served the last match of his two-game ban.

Sydney rivals push for a place in the top eight.

Sitting outside the top eight in 11th and 10th respectively, the St George Illawarra Dragons and the South Sydney Rabbitohs will be looking to remain in touch with the finals race when they clash at Kogarah on Thursday evening.

Falling just short 28-24 to Cronulla "away from home" last Saturday, the St George Illawarra Dragons will return to Kogarah determined to arrest a poor run of form against their opponents.

Managing just two wins from their past ten clashes against the Rabbitohs, coach Paul McGregor will be stressing the importance of Thursday's clash with his side sitting four points outside the top eight and matches against the high-flying Roosters and Eels to follow in the next fortnight.

Losing halfback Adam Clune and veteran forward Trent Merrin to concussion, Ben Hunt will revert to the number seven jersey while Tariq Sims returns to the starting side after serving a one-match ban. Tristain Sailor will make his first appearance of the season after being named on the bench.

Adding to the stakes of Thursday night's clash, playmaker Corey Norman will celebrate his 200th appearance in the NRL, while prop Blake Lawrie will play his 50th game for the club.

Squandering a halftime lead to go down 18-12 to the Raiders last Saturday, the South Sydney Rabbitohs will be looking to use Thursday night as the launch pad for a run towards the play-offs.

Sitting one win outside eighth position with a positive for-and-against differential in their favour, coach Wayne Bennett will be hoping his team can improve upon an underwhelming record at Kogarah that has seen the side manage two wins from their past six visits.

Gaining a welcome boost with Latrell Mitchell named at fullback following a two-match suspension, Liam Knight and Patrick Mago come onto the bench in place of Jack Johns and Hame Sele.

Who to watch: Bringing up 200 appearances in the top grade on Thursday night, Dragons playmaker Corey Norman will be out to cap his milestone match with a win. Earning rave reviews as a teenager on debut a decade ago, the 29-year-old has shown immense talent across stints with Brisbane, Parramatta and St George Illawarra throughout the 2010s culminating in an Origin debut for Queensland in last year's decider. Capable of nailing a clutch play as the clock winds down, Norman has revelled in the responsibility of being the side's dominant playmaker while retaining a potent running game that has yielded tries in two of his past three matches.

Returning to the Rabbitohs ranks after serving a two-match ban for striking, Latrell Mitchell will be out to make up for lost time during Indigenous round. Following in the footsteps of Greg Inglis, Nathan Merritt and Eric Simms as Indigenous greats of the club, the 23-year-old Biripi and Wiradjuri game-breaker has grown into the fullback role since coming under scrutiny for his involvement prior to the COVID-19 suspension. Averaging a try-assist and 100 metres per game since the season resumption, Mitchell looms as a key man for the Rabbitohs as they look to continue a strong run of form against the joint venture.

Favourite: With both teams sitting outside the top eight, the return of Latrell Mitchell has the Rabbitohs as slight favourites.

My tip: While both teams will be viewing Thursday night as a must-win for their finals hopes, the attacking flair shown by the Dragons in recent weeks should get them over the line. **Dragons by 6**.

Wests Tigers aim to re-enter the eight as they host the 13th-placed Warriors.

The Tigers will return to the SCG as hosts for the first time since 2013, but it's surprisingly set to be just the second time the Warriors have played at the iconic venue.

The home side are coming off a tough 10-point loss to rivals Parramatta, who proved just too much to handle for the joint venture. They did however, impress during periods of the match and even matched it with the Eels for the opening 30 minutes, until Mitchell Moses' brilliant chip and chase try. The loss to the Eels followed a trend for the Tigers with four of their six losses this season coming against sides that are in currently the top eight. They've found it difficult to score points against better sides, averaging a mere 15 points a game in those four losses in comparison to their 24 points scored per game over the course of the season. Having won five of their previous six encounters against the Warriors, a win over the New Zealand side on Friday night could propel the Tigers back into the top eight and take them out of that dreaded ninth position.

The Wests Tigers will be stoked to see Alex Twal and Luke Garner back in the starting 13 after recovering from their injuries with Matthew Eisenhuth dropping out of the 21 with injury and Sam McIntyre moving to the bench. Oliver Clark starts at prop for the suspended Russel Packer whilst Thomas Mikaele comes in for Michael Chee-Kam after his horrific head injury on Thursday night.

Meanwhile, the Warriors will remain in high spirits after putting together a solid performance against the premiership favourites, the Sydney Roosters. Hosting the Roosters on the Central Coast, the Warriors even led by four points heading into the half-time break but failed to come up with any points in the second half as the tri-colours came home with an eight point victory.

It's been a tough year for the Warriors who have won just three games this season but they have shown some positive signs since Todd Payten took over, despite having won one of their five matches under the former Tiger. They haven't beaten a side currently in the top 10 with their wins coming against the Dragons, Cowboys and the Broncos. They'll need something special from Roger Tuivasa-Sheck and his men if they are to cause an upset.

In good news for the Warriors, they do have two reinforcements arriving at the club this week with Eels pair George Jennings (wing) and forward Daniel Alvaro (bench) both named. They'll be without David Fusitu'a, Ken Maumalo, Agnatius Paasi and King Vuniyayawa who have all returned home to New Zealand to reunite with their families. The only other change is Wayde Egan returning from injury replacing Chanel Harris-Tavita on the bench.

Who to watch: Current Dally M leader Harry Grant, who leads his Melbourne counterpart by a single vote has been the best player in the Tigers outfit during the 2020 season. On loan from the Storm, the 22-year-old hooker has scored three tries, contributed four try assists and is responsible for two forced drop outs. Not only can he score and create tries, Grant also runs for 92 metres whilst making 50 tackles per game, highlighting the amount of work the 11-gamer gets through. He has created a great red zone combination with back rower Luciano Leilua who will be a lot to handle for the Warriors defence. Don't be surprised if young Grant breaks the Warriors defence wide open on multiple occasions this Friday night.

Despite having a quiet season by his standards, Warriors captain Roger Tuivasa-Sheck is bound to find the try line soon after having only scored a sole try so far this season. The fullback is still averaging a massive 211 run metres a game and still breaks 4.1 tackles per game. His tries scored and try assist numbers are down significantly but the Warriors could do more to get their captain involved in their red zone plays. He does a tremendous amount of work trying to bring the Warriors out of their own end, but they need to make the most of the limited time they spend in the opposition 20. The Tigers better keep a close eye on him, because if the former Dally M medallist can find himself in open space it could cause trouble.

Favourite: Both sides have only won one of their previous four games and funnily enough, each of their wins have come against the dreadful Brisbane Broncos. However, the Tigers have generally dominated when they come against the weaker sides having beaten, the Dragons, the Cowboys, the Bulldogs and the Broncos. Although they did lose to the Titans. The Tigers are the firm favourites for this clash at the Sydney Cricket Ground on Friday night.

My tip: Going off the past six weeks of the competition, the Tigers should win this convincingly. The Warriors did put in an 80 minute performance against the Roosters last week but have failed to string together two convincing performances this season. This Tigers outfit should be too strong for the depleted Warriors this week. Wests Tigers by 18.

Battling Broncos host surging Sharks

The Brisbane Broncos will be desperate for a win on Friday night when they host the Cronulla Sharks at Suncorp Stadium.

Producing a much-improved first half before capitulating to a 46-8 thumping at the hands of the Storm last week, the Brisbane Broncos will be hoping a good run of form over their opponents continues on Friday evening.

Winning their past six matches against the Sharks over the past three years - including their only win in Sydney during Anthony Seibold's tenure - a loss would see the 2020 team move within striking distance of equalling the club's worst ever run of form - one win from 11 matches held by the 2003 roster

Sitting two points clear of the last-placed Bulldogs in 15th position, Richie Kennar, Jake Turpin, Issac Luke and Ethan Bullemor come into the squad with Anthony Milford reverting to five-eighth and Darius Boyd starting at fullback for the first time in a year.

Defying early season form to sit in seventh position with five wins from their past six matches, the Cronulla Sharks will have their sights set on cementing a place in the top eight as the run towards the finals begins.

Holding off a late rally from the Dragons to claim a 28-24 victory at Kogarah last Saturday, coach John Morris will be out to reverse a poor record at Suncorp Stadium that has seen the Sharks manage five wins from 15 visits since the venue was redeveloped in the early 2000s.

Boosted by the inclusion of Josh Dugan in place of Bryson Goodwin at left centre, a hamstring injury to Chad Townsend will allow Connor Tracey to start in the halves for the first time this season.

Chasing victories at all three major Queensland venues for the first time following wins in Townsville and the Gold Coast earlier in the season, the match will mark 200 NRL appearances for Aaron Woods and Dugan, while Jesse Ramien will bring up 50 appearances as well.

Who to watch: In a season to forget for the league's former powerhouse club, the development of Herbie Farnworth has served as a rare bright spot. Beginning the season off the bench before earning his chance to start in the backline, the 20-year-old Englishman has held his own with and without the ball under difficult circumstances. Averaging just under 90 metres and a tackle break each week in his first full season in the top grade, Farnworth will be hoping to replicate the success enjoyed against the Sharks in his NRL debut just over a year ago.

Beginning his career at the Tigers back in 2011, Sharks prop Aaron Woods will become the latest player to bring up 200 NRL appearances on Friday evening. Enjoying a successful career at the joint venture before heading to the Sharks via a short stint with the Bulldogs, the 29-year-old has remained a valuable contributor with 145 metres and 28 tackles per game. Recognised as the best prop in the game twice along with representing New South Wales and Australia at the height of his powers, Woods will be determined to wind back the clock to help the Sharks record a rare victory at Suncorp Stadium.

Favourite: Despite last downing the Broncos at Suncorp Stadium six years ago, the Sharks are expected to account for their lowly opponents on Friday evening.

My tip: With the Broncos fielding a team boasting 11 players with fewer than 40 NRL games to their names, the experience of the Sharks milestone men should pave the way for a comfortable victory. Sharks by 16.

Depleted Roosters take on improving Titans

Battered Raiders welcome Townsville sun in pursuit of top four dream

They have an injury list that gets longer by the week, and yet somehow the Canberra Raiders continue to edge closer to the top four.

Charnze Nicoll-Klokstad's gruesome finger injury suffered in the gritty win over South Sydney sees him join a handful of Raiders from last year's decider on the sidelines.

Not that Ricky Stuart wants any sympathy. After 11 rounds the Raiders sit neck and neck with the fourth placed Sydney Roosters on 14 points. Officially in fifth spot, the 119 point for-and-against shortfall says as much about lost personnel as it does a modified style.

Waning creativity with diminished combinations has forged a blue-collar steel. With an average margin of 5.6 deciding their last seven games, the Green Machine are conditioned to go until the final whistle. Last week's accumulation of points all from kicks underlined the Raiders' clunky attack, but for Stuart, a stonewall resilience that kept the Rabbitohs scoreless after halftime brought the smiles And with back-to-back wins, the light at the end of the tunnel continues to brighten. In addition to the long awaited return of John Bateman and the arrival of Bulldogs recruit Corey Harawira-Naera, Canberra's final nine games include just three teams from the top half of the competition.

Up north, Josh Hannay can surely feel Stuart's pain. Having inherited a depleted roster the caretaker could do with a fit Michael Morgan, the difference between the sides when they last met.

In fact, North Queensland hold the wood over the Raiders winning six of the past 11 since 2014. And after a fortnight of improved defence and strong individual performances, Hannay needs a repeat but delivered with combination smarts..

In last week's loss the Cowboys out ran Manly, but apart from Kyle Feldt's leap they were clueless in attack. Even with Jason Taumalolo's midfield dominance the points won't flow until Jake Clifford and Reece Robson show their runners the way. Coen Hess is symptomatic of the Cowboys' plight. Even with running metres on par with previous seasons, the former Origin sensation is a shadow of the 2018 superstar. With only four tries from his last 32 outings, the Mount Isa junior's attacking nous has been frozen by muddled lines and sapped confidence.

Now needing seven wins from their last nine to be considered a finals smokey, the Cowboys' season looks cooked. And with inexperienced talent in key positions, Hannay's coaching credentials could flourish, simply by inviting his squad to chance their arm.

Who to watch: North Queensland diehards already know Francis Molo's capabilities. And now after a season high 205 metres, so does everyone else. Despite making his NRL debut with the Broncos as a 19-year-old in 2014, with just 48 games, the crash merchant is a late bloomer. Now with his tail up, watch him go in tandem with Taumalolo straight at the Raiders' heart.

By the 13th minute of the season, Jack Wighton had already powered over for two tries. Now tryless since round 5, expect the Clive Churchill Medalist to zero in on the Cowboys suspect goal-line defence to reignite his tally.

Favourite: With the Raiders chasing a hat-trick of wins and the Cowboys staring down the barrel of five straight defeats, there can only be one favourite in this one.

My tip: North Queensland won't get a better opportunity to knock over last season's runner-up. Depleted, bruised and jet-lagged, the Raiders are ripe for the picking if the Cowboys break their attacking shackles. Upset alert. Cowboys by 4.

Injury hit contenders face off match of the round

Manly were touted as having a decent chance to win the premiership before a ball was kicked this year while the Panthers have let the footy do the talking and are now sitting pretty at the top of the table and 1 point clear of any challengers.

Last week, both sides travelled up to Queensland and faced gallant opposition, but ended up having too much class for the Cowboys and Titans respectively. Manly got out to an early lead and despite the Cowboys piling on a couple of tries their eventual victory never really looked in doubt. The Panthers were up against the Gold Coast and had a real game on their hands at half time, leading 16-14. The upset wasn't to be however, and they ended up closing the match out and winning by 8 points.

Manly have made no changes to their 17 that travelled up to Townsville last week. Cade Cust had arguably his best 80-minute first grade game and he has retained the five-eighth spot, leaving Des Hasler with quite the headache when first choice for the position Dylan Walker returns from injury. Tom Trbojevic remains at least 3 weeks away from a return.

For the Panthers, they receive a boost in the form of star second rower Viliame returning after he missed last week with a minor injury.

His inclusion pushes Tyrone May back to the interchange bench and Matt Burton out of the side. They remain without key spine members Dylan Edwards and Api Koroisau as well as winger Brian To'o. Zane Tetevano is close to a return after being named on the extended bench.

Despite the high-profile personnel sitting this one out, the match shapes as an absolute belter. Manly have proven they're not all out at sea without Tom Trbojevic and are in with a huge chance to re-assert their top 4 credentials with a win over the benchmark side of the competition. The character of these two sides that's been shown in recent weeks sets this up as a very close game.

Who to watch: It'll be very interesting to see how Cade Cust backs up from his man of the match performance last week. The stand in five-eighth will be looking to impress Des Hasler in the hope of nailing down a permanent promotion. Last week he made 4 tackle breaks, 2-line breaks, a try assist as well as scoring a try of his own. A repeat of that showing will go a long way to Manly winning and Cust becoming a regular feature on team list Tuesday.

The improvement of Panthers lock Isaah Yeo in 2020 has been something to behold. Despite not receiving the same accolades as his forward teammates, Yeo has probably been one of the Panthers most vital players this year and it continued last week. He ran for 170 metres off 19 hit-ups and made 3 tackle breaks as well as a line break. He also made 33 tackles, the most of any Penrith player. After last season for him was riddled with concussions, it's great to see Yeo making a fist of regular first grade appearances.

Favourite: The Panthers are favourites to remain at the top of the ladder with a victory against the Sea Eagles.

My tip: In front of a TV with the game on or at the ground itself is simply the only place to be on Saturday night. Both sides are understrength, but that has only evened the ledger and the form of the Panthers and the Sea Eagles over the last two weeks has made this a mouth-watering matchup. Logically, the Panthers should come away with the points, however I'm concerned with how they'll cope with the absence of Api Koroisau against a stronger opponent and feel that Manly will be up for this one at home. Couple that with the fact that Penrith haven't lost for 5 weeks and are probably due for one, I can see this game ending in an upset. Sea Eagles by

Two Western Sydney rivals on opposite sides of the ladder battle it out

The Bulldogs finally broke through for their second win of the year last week against Newcastle. The wet weather in the Hunter perfectly suited the resilient Dogs, who played relatively low-percentage, direct footy on the way to a 18-12 victory.

Their ball handling in tough conditions was particularly impressive and proves that getting the fundamentals right can go a long way to winning games, even against more highly-rated opponents.

The Bulldogs will need to only get better this week though as Parramatta are an even sterner test.

They do welcome former teammate Tim Lafai into the side after he was released from the Dragons to move to his old stomping ground.

Meanwhile, the Eels made sure their brief speedbump against Manly was nothing but an off night after bouncing back with a solid win over the Tigers.

Mitchell Moses successfully made his return from injury and will only continue to build as Parramatta surge towards the finals.

The Eels are a far more cohesive unit in both attack and defence than the one that ran out in the opening round. Then, Parramatta scrapped their way to an 8-2 win over the Bulldogs.

Dylan Brown and Moses hadn't completely iced their combination by that point but the young five-eighth has upped his involvement since while both of Parramatta's edges have continued to also build stronger rapports.

It doesn't bode well for the Bulldogs, who will need to contain a mobile and dynamic Parramatta pack.

Who to watch: The battle in the middle may be dictated by the intensity projected by the two lock forwards. Luke Thompson was one of the Bulldogs' big signings for next season but they were handed a massive boost when he was able to instead come to Australia early. His passion and drive to compete has been on display already. The immediate example that springs to mind is the pressure he put on Newcastle's kickers last week as he raced out of the line.

For someone who has only just joined the club, his willingness to put his body on the line is great signs and he shapes as a strong leader moving forward.

On the other side, you have Nathan Brown who has consistently been one of Parramatta's best forwards when not sitting on the sidelines. Brown doesn't just carry the ball up. He sprints up to steam onto passes with an aggression that strikes fear into the opposition. The venom with which he takes hit-ups can literally change the momentum of games as was evidence in his role in their 16-10 comeback win over Penrith.

Look for Brown to make a statement early against the Bulldogs pack.

Favourite: Parramatta are well-backed to win this one.

My tip: The Bulldogs definitely won't outscore Parramatta so they need to defend their way to victory here if they're to be any chance. Even still, that won't be enough. **Eels by 14**.

Storm gunning for six in a row as Knights look to bounce back from shock loss.

In a year that has been like no other, one thing that hasn't changed is the Melbourne Storm's ability to adjust to all that is thrown at them and continue to hum along like the well-oiled machine they are. There were initial concerns in the early weeks of the comp restarting after a couple of losses, but they have since strung together five wins on the bounce including a couple of clinical attacking displays in downing the Titans and Broncos over the past fortnight. Calling the Sunshine Coast home for what looks to be the remainder of the season, the Storm will host their second match at Sunshine Coast Stadium when the Knights roll into town on Sunday afternoon.

Coach Craig Bellamy has been forced into a couple of changes following his sides drubbing of the Broncos last week with centre Brenko Lee (broken hand) and utility back Paul Momirovski (torn finger tendon) picking up injuries. Marion Seve will replace Lee in the starting side with Tom Eisenhuth returning from a hamstring injury on the bench. New Zealand test prop Jesse Bromwich has been named in the reserves as he looks to return from a knee injury.

Whilst on the subject of injuries, the Knights have been left reeling from the season-ending injuries to Andrew McCullough (hamstring) and Connor Watson (Achilles) during their shock loss at home to the Bulldogs last week. Rookie rake Chris Randall has been named to make his second appearance in the top grade after debuting against the Panthers in round three. Another second-gamer replaces Watson on the bench with young half Phoenix Crossland named in the utility position. In a further blow for Adam O'Brien's men, back-rower Sione Mata'utia has been ruled out after limping off with a knee injury late in last week's contest. Veteran Aidan Guerra will slot onto the right edge with Josh King earning his first game of the year on the bench.

After being favoured to break a win-loss sequence dating back to round four last week, the Knights will be desperately hoping that run now continues as they look to bounce back from one of their poorest performances of the year. If they are to be any chance against the Storm juggernaut, they will need to improve their kicking game substantially after another poor performance with the boot last week. Despite running for over 300 metres more than their opposition and breaking 20 more tackles, they failed to build any pressure on their opposition, an area of their game that has so far held them back from being a genuine top four team.

Who to watch: A victim of both his utility value and being stuck behind a couple of legends of the game at Melbourne, Jahrome Hughes looks to have nailed down his role in the Storm setup. Playing much of the year at fullback in 2019, Hughes was switched to halfback for the business end of the year and has made the number seven his own this year with some impressive performances. Despite not been a traditional half, Hughes has racked up 9 try assists for the year, but his footwork in and around tired defenders remains one of his greatest strengths resulting in a couple of nice individual tries in recent weeks.

Despite Knights fans being left shattered by the losses of McCullough and Watson, they were quickly given renewed hope as they remembered the cracking debut of Chris Randall against the Panthers in round three who broke the record for most tackles on debut with 71. Only given a train and trial contract when Coach O'Brien arrived in the Hunter for pre-season, Randall worked the joint down to earn a development contract for the season and now has the opportunity to make the number nine his own for the remainder of 2020.

Favourite: The Storm are heavily favoured to continue their winning ways against a Knights outfit struggling for consistency.

My tip: This looked an enticing contest before the Knights were rolled last weekend and perhaps the Novocastrians were guilty of having one eye on this contest. In their favour, they have done a good job of bouncing back from poor performances this year but even so, they will need a massive turnaround in some key areas of their game if they are to trouble one of the premiership contenders. Anatomy of a locked-down Super League double-header

RONG!" Huddersfield fan John Beaumont said on Facebook last Tuesday when he saw our historic cover.

"Huddersfield played Dewsbury behind closed doors in 1904 due to smallpox outbreak in Dewsbury."

What an amazing era we live in, one in which a member of the public can correct the cover of a publication before it is published and then I can write about the event in that very publication.

But the eminent rugby league historian Tony Collins says John is on half right. "Only Huddersfield club members were allowed in, but no general admission," Tony told me by, you guessed it, social media.

It's one of those amazing co-incidences that you get in sport - the last club to play (kind of) behind closed doors, 116 years ago, is involved again this time.

So our cover (for English print readers - there's a different one online) is right, depending on what your definition of "behind closed doors" might be. We decided to ask Leeds chief executive Gary Hetherington, who is hosting Sunday's St Helens-Catalans and Huddersfield-Leeds matches, exactly what that means for him.

The Front Row: Why Headingley, Gary?

Gary Hetherington: "We've just had this £43 million redevelopment, a brand new South Stand, with brand new facilities, a brand new main stand with all new facilities including six changing rooms in total. The thing that is really paramount is it becomes what they call a bio-centre. Every part that's going to be in use is actually sterilised and there's a strict protocol as to who can go in there and who can't go in and their movement. It's a huge undertaking. Headingley, in that respect because it's got so many new facilities, is a pretty easy stadium to manage. We have a management team who are used to ... not dealing with this because it's new to everybody .. but they are dealing with significant

events and events where security is required like international Test matches and so-on. We were quite well equipped to be able to be able to deal with it. It's proven to be a real military operation. With it being the first event, all eyes are on it and it's crucial that every part of it is dealt with properly."

TFR: What are some of the restrictions? How many people will be inside the ground on Sunday?

GH: "There's not a cap on the numbers but everyone at the ground on Sunday will have a role. There's something like 230-odd people in total. That's the players, the staff, there'll be a big presence from the media and particularly Sky Television. Everybody's actually got a role and even though it's two games one after the other, they're both dealt with separately so people in the first game come for the first game and leave within 15 minutes of it finishing. The people coming for the second game only arrive 10 or 15 minutes before it starts and then leave pretty much straight afterwards. Only the authorised people, which is the players and the coaching staff, are allowed in the changing room areas. Nobody else is allowed in there. It's all been very tightly managed security-wise. Everybody in the ground is accredited and there was quite a complicated accreditation process, a form to fill in to gain accreditation and everything will be under the microscope."

TRF: How many weeks do you expect Headingley to be hosting games like this?

GH: "We've got the first two weeks, Sunday and the following week week we've got all five games over Saturday and Sunday, all televised. Then, on the third week, the games are being held at St Helens. There's only three stadiums, which is Leeds, St Helens and Warrington have been chosen to host games. We're planning to be behind closed doors until the end of August and then, dependent on more government guidelines, we'll see what happens in September."

TRF: What happens if a player tests positive - at training or on game day? Does the comp shut down?

GH: "It's like a military procedure. There's no training at Headingley at all. I don't think so, anyway, in terms of warm-ups and so-on, there's a process. Literally there's a process for everything. There'll be nothing done randomly. (If there is a positive) they would be in isolation. There is a procedure for that but, no, that wouldn't close the competition. Once again, that's all been dealt with. All our players have been back in training now for three weeks. They get tested every week and they get temperature tested every day they're coming to training. I'm not aware that in rugby league there's been any positive cases at all. I don't think there has. But there is a process should there be one."

THE Lockdown has been extremely kind to St Helens - unless, of course, you include losing England's best player to the NRL.

But even there, Kristian Woolf's side has regain one of the club's favourite sons, James Graham, in exchange for Canterbury-domiciled Luke Thompson.

At times during the opening seven weeks of the season, the beaten World Club Championship finalists seemed to be floundering. Fullback Lachlan Coote was injured in the opening match of the season while international centre Mark Percival suffered a shoulder injury requiring surgery. Then there was the fact that hooker James Roby, winger Tommy Makinson and lock Morgan Knowles were already sidelined through injury.

In preparing for Sunday's clash with Catalans at Headingley Stadium, Woolf has his entire squad available for selection.

He told the St Helens Star: "Our biggest issue before lockdown was that we had a fair bit of carry-over fatigue.

"A number of guys played internationals and had a short lead into the season. I think we also underestimated the impact of the World Club Challenge.

"That is something that the COVID period has given us a chance to get rid of. There is no more of that underlying fatigue."

Nevertheless, the champions lie in eighth position on a table revamped by the removal of Toronto, having dropped three from seven matches.

Catalans had three consecutive wins, clocking up 100 points, before the lockdown. They have receive a pre-match boost for Sunday by announcing seven home games for the coming months.

The run starts on September 7 with Leeds Rhinos entertained and continues to September 5 against St Helens. The French government will allow a maximum of 5000 people inside Stade Gilbert Brutus but, of course, everything is subject to change.

The Dragons have recently agreed a new domestic TV deal with L'Equipe.

Winger Tom Davies seems set to make his debut after breaking an ankle against the same opponents 16 months ago.

Who to watch: James Graham's chief benefit, it could be argued, will come when crowds are allowed back into stadia. He's at the back end of his career now and the boots he is filling belonged to the finest current British player. But his statesmanship and competitiveness don't need a live audience. If Saints are to bounce back from a so-so start to the season, he'll be at the forefront

One man who may be grateful for the absence of a crowd is Catalans centre Israel Folau. His was the most controversial of signings this year and he often encountered jeers away from home for his much-publicised social media postings. But he was - if he's excuse the pun - a Hell of a player before COVID hit and if Catalans are to cause an upset he'll be at the forefront.

Favourites: Saints are favourites by virtue of the match being England and them having a clean bill of health.

My tip: This is a wonderful opportunity for Catalans to make a statement about the rest of the season and what they can achieve. St Helens were wobbly earlier and have lost their best player. Catalans should be on the rise, if form before the break counts for anything. But are their infamous wobblies away from home a thing of the past? Sadly, I think not. Saints in a tight one.

WHILE you were trying to avoid a ballooning midriff during Lockdown, one Huddersfield Giants star was training so hard he is out of Sunday's game against Leeds because of injury.

Paul Clough, the Giants' 32-year-old forward, took the training assignments set by the club's coaching staff seriously. Too seriously, as it turns out.

"Paul Clough's come back with a bit of an issue with the running load from the break," coach Simon Woolford tells The Front Row.

"He's in rehab at the moment. He had an issue about five or six weeks before we came back, some sort of issue with his ankle, with all the running he was doing.

"As far as I was aware he was given some programmes to do at home and it just hasn't responded as they would like."

Woolford says there's plenty of uncertainties regarding Sunday's clash - not least the rule changes which include a play-the-ball instead of a scrum and 'six again' for spoiling tactics in the ruck.

"I guess I'm pretty fortunate to have a few friends - coaches, assistant coaches, performance staff - involved in the NRL clubs so I've been a bit of a sponge with those sort of guys particularly over the last six weeks," the man nicknamed 'Germ' says.

"I think the boys have come back in reasonable shape but training on your own is no substitute for you team-based stuff. Their body weight is reasonable but to still only have two weeks to prepare and then your third week is going into a normal game-style week, there is no doubt the preparation has been a little bit limited.

"I just hope we don't see the injuries, the amount of injuries, the seriousness of the injuries we've seen in the NRL. It's hard to imagine we're not going to"

As for those rule changes, the absence of scrums means no-one gets a rest - potentially making the spectacle even more frantic than the NRL and fatigue an even bigger factor.

"There's not going to be the breaks in play where, particularly, middle forwards can reset and get their breath and go again," Woolford said. "So it's going to be really taxing on the teams to begin with.

"And I think you will see some blow-out scores in the beginning. You did in the NRL. It was a matter of some teams adjusting to the new rules quicker than others. Some have caught up, some are still lagging a little bit."

The coach said some training had been done around set pieces from the new play-the-ball - but not much.

"We've done a bit of work about trying to adapt to the new rules but it's a bit of an unknown," he said. "Playing against Leeds, if we go there and complete at 60 per cent, we're going to get our bums handed to us, aren't we?

"On the other side of the scale, if we go there and complete really high and kick well, maybe that team can take advantage of the new rule."

Another absentee for the Giants will be utility Joe Wardle with a calf strain.

Who to watch: Aiden Sezer v Luke Gale will go a long way towards deciding this clash. Huddersfield are up to fouth in the revamped table with Leeds just behind them having played and won one less game.

Favourites: Leeds survive as favourites in many matches based on the gravitas of the club. The Giants are probably real best things here.

My tip: While Woolford tips NRL-style blowouts for the restart of Super League, on paper both Sunday's matches should be tight. I'm going for **Huddersfield** by virtue of a late Sezer drop goal.
