AS ORIGIN MAKES IT'S TOWNSVILLE DEBUT, SPARE A THOUGHT FOR THE FANS SOUTH OF THE BORDER...

It is tough being an NRL fan in Melbourne.

Yes, there is a fiercely loyal and passionate group of Storm fans, and scatterings of other club fans down here, but overall NRL is dwarfed by the monolithic AFL club supporter bases. There are huge cross overs between the two of course, but in this town, AFL takes the hotseat. It is a rarer sight to see a Melbourne Storm scarf donned on a passenger during a work commute, and even seeing #RandomSouthsGuy is just about unheard of.

When State of Origin comes to town though, this all changes. It is like the carnival or the

circus arriving. Suddenly the 'other type of footy' is exciting, and becomes the main focus. 90,000 people pour into the home of AFL, the Melbourne Cricket Ground, to watch an entirely different game.

Yes, 10 minutes in, chances are you will have overheard people saying 'I just don't understand why they throw the ball backwards not forwards', and constant calls of 'BALLLL' every time there is a tackle - but for Victorians, the opportunity to witness this strange and deep rivalry between two other states is not to be missed.

From Melbourne's first Origin game in 1990, we have had countless moments of greatness, showing just how spectacular our great game can be to an... almost... foreign audience. Who could forget the brawl in *that* 1995 showdown? Or NSW being controversially denied a try by the video referee at Docklands in 2009? Michael Jennings' heroics in 2015 in front of 91,513 screaming Victorians (ok, there were a few interlopers as well)...?





It is tough being an NRL fan in Melbourne, with 2020 being no exception. The mighty Storm rolled out of town, first up to Southern NSW before heading to the Sunshine Coast. The AFL, Super Netball, and Super Rugby all followed suit – hell, it was even impossible to find #RandomSouthsGuy anymore. This sports obsessed city, this sports obsessed state, while handling a much greater crisis - and 140 days in lockdown - was left to grieve losing a small but significant part of its soul.

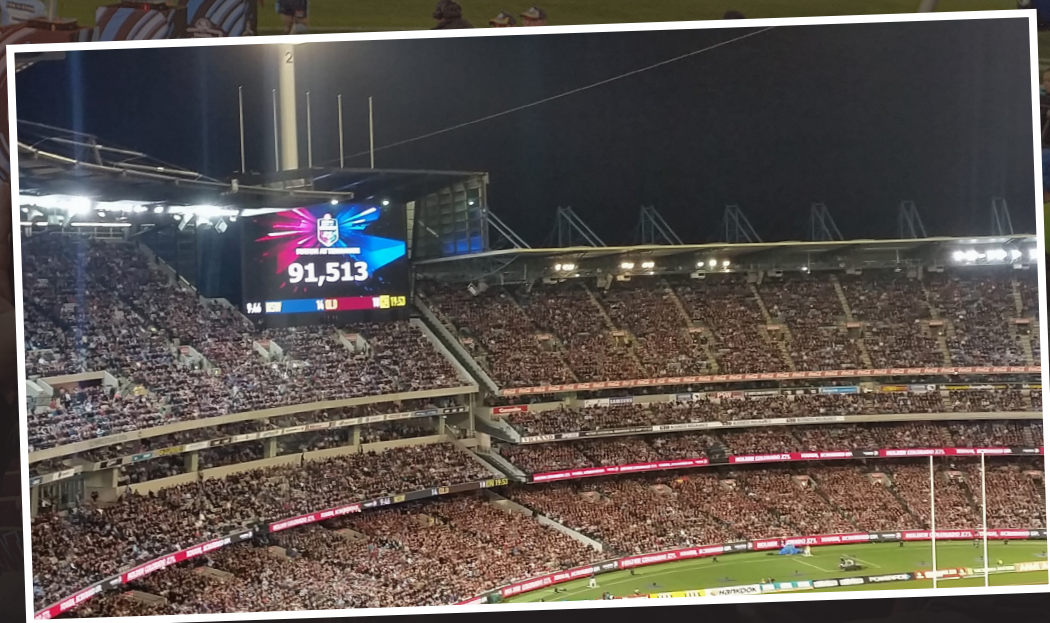

LEADING THE CHARGE

BARNETT WELCOMES THE CHALLENGE AS KNIGHTS LOOK TO MAKE OLD BOYS PROUD

There will be some familiar faces downing a few schooners in the crowd when Newcastle host Parramatta this Sunday.

The match will mark the 20th anniversary of the Knights' memorable premiership triumph in 2001 while it was also double as the club's annual Old Boys Day fixture.

Backrower Mitch Barnett has welcomed the challenge of being one of the leaders with forwards Daniel Saifiti (Origin), David Klemmer (suspension) and Tyson Frizell (injury) all unavailable.

The Knights were impressive in a gritty 18-10 win over Manly last Sunday, but Barnett knows the challenge now is to replicate it.

With the exception of round one and two, the Novocastrians have rarely backed up a strong performance with another one as evidenced by their standing on the NRL ladder.

But they do have added motivation this weekend knowing some of the club's legends are watching on from the stands.



"We've got to be at our best and it's definitely a good challenge and one we're embracing because it's Old Boys Day for us," he said.

"There's no better opportunity for us to put a good performance in."

Barnett said it was always special to play in the club's biggest home fixture of the regular season.

"It's an awesome feeling to run out there and to put the same jersey on as those guys – the legends of the club – all who have done it before," Barnett said.

"To go out there and make them proud ... there's no greater feeling when you come off

the field to know you've done that, so it's a big opportunity for us."

Knights' new signing Jake Clifford has been named in Adam O'Brien's 21-man squad and while a decision is yet to be made, it would come as a surprise if he didn't feature in the 17 on game day.

"It's good to meet him; he seems to be a cool, calm, collected bloke so very excited to have him on board that's for sure," Barnett said.

They know the Eels will be hungry to put an end to an unimpressive fortnight of results.

"They'll feel like they've got a real point to prove and the coach will have them up especially after two losses, so they're a good footy side," Barnett said.

"The challenge for us is backing up week to week and I take this as a challenge to step up as do many of the other boys.

"This week is a new challenge and Parramatta are going to be flying."

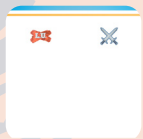

Dragons regain troops, Broncos name debutant in Origin effected matchup

After such a promising start to the year, the Dragons have lost 6 of their last 7 games, however they are still somehow clinging to a top 8 spot on for and against.

The Broncos sparked some hope within their fans after a blowout upset win against the Roosters two weeks ago, however it all came crashing back down to earth last week as they were unable to compete with a Storm side missing a host of regular starters.

It means that while this matchup may not be of the best quality, it will feature two teams desperate to get a win and their season back on track and increasing the potential for a close and exciting game of footy.

In team news, the Dragons receive a huge boost by welcoming back electric fullback Matt Dufty. His inclusion will see Cody Ramsey move back to the wing and Brayden Williams into the centres, while in a somewhat bizarre decision, Jack Bird has been named in the second row to cover for Tariq Sims, who was selected for origin. Mikaele Ravalawa returns from suspension, which sees Jordan Pereira drop out of the side. Josh Kerr moves into the back row to cover for the suspended Billy Burns, while Jack De Belin will make his return from the interchange bench.

For the Broncos, Selwyn Cobbo has been named to make his debut on the wing in place of Xavier Coates, who will be playing for Queensland on Wednesday night. Tyson Gamble returns from suspension forcing Anthony Milford out of the team, while Matt Lodge is also returning from a stint on the sidelines and is a direct swap for Payne Haas, who has been named for NSW. Alex Glenn's return from injury pushes Keenan Palasia to the bench and Dale Copley to the reserves.

The decline of the Dragons defence is one of the more confusing things to happen in 2021. After 5 rounds, they had conceded an average of under 3 converted tries per week and were sitting pretty in the top 4 and looked to be the surprise packets of the competition. Over the last 7 weeks, they have looked exactly like the team many thought they'd be prior to the commencement of the season. It remains a mystery which Dragons team will show up on Thursday, but one thing remains certain: they desperately need to get their defence in order if they are to maintain touch with the top 8.

Who to watch: The importance of Matt Dufty to the Dragons attack cannot be understated. So far in 2021, he's played 10 games and scored 8 tries and created a further 5, however it is perhaps in his absence that he has proved to be a vital cog in the Dragons ability to score points. In Round 10 against the Storm, the Dragons were within 4 points of taking the lead, with all of their points coming because of Dufty. He then went off injured in the second half and the Dragons struggled, only scoring 1 more try that came against the run of play. Against the Broncos - who have conceded the second most points so far this year - there is potential for Dufty to completely take control with ball in hand and win the Dragons the game by himself.

Tevita Pangai Junior is a polarising figure in Rugby League circles. There is no doubting the immense talent he possesses, however throughout his career he has shown a lack of effort in consistently meeting expectations, both on and off the field. Two weeks ago, against the Roosters, he was instrumental in causing perhaps the upset of the season, assisting a try and making 6 tackle breaks. He failed to have the same impact last week though, averaging just over 5 metres per run. After being snubbed from origin selection, Pangai will have a point to prove when he runs out on Thursday, however no-one, probably not even himself, knows which version of TPJ we will see.

Favourite: The Dragons are favoured by 7 and a half points over the Broncos.

My tip: There's no way the Dragons can continue to be as poor as they have been, and the return of Matt Dufty will see them score too many points for the Broncos to keep pace with. St George Illawarra by 14.

Origin presents opportunity for undermanned Storm, Titans

The Melbourne Storm will return 'home' to Sunshine Coast Stadium on Saturday evening to take on the Gold Coast Titans without their Origin stars.

Forced to relocate the match from AAMI Park, in part due to the Federal Government's 'Hare and the Tortoise' approach to rolling out the COVID-19 vaccine, the Melbourne Storm will have the people of Victoria in their minds as they strive to continue an unbeaten record at Sunshine Coast Stadium.

Winning all six matches at their makeshift home after taking up residence midway through last season, coach Craig Bellamy will be hoping his team can maintain a dominant record against the Titans that has yielded 16 wins from 22 previous clashes. Set to be without Josh Addo-Carr, Cameron Munster, Harry Grant, Christian Welch and Felise Kaufusi due to Origin, the revamped squad will see Dean Ieremia gain a rare opportunity in the top grade alongside returning forward Kenny Bromwich.

Holding a below average record of 13 wins from 29 Origin-affected fixtures during Bellamy's tenure as coach, the Storm will be aiming to post ten consecutive wins for the first time since surging to the premiership in 2017.

Coming off a disastrous showing during Indigenous Round, the Gold Coast Titans will need to put aside excuses if they hope to bounce back with an upset.

Suffering an embarrassing 38-10 defeat to the Sharks in Coffs Harbour last Sunday, coach Justin Holbrook has been forced to make a raft of changes due to a high representation in the Queensland Origin squad.

Unable to call upon AJ Brimson, Tino Fa'asuamaleaui, David Fifita and Moeaki Fotu'auka for the crucial encounter, Ashley Taylor, Sam Stone, Jai Whitbread and club debutant Joseph Vuna come into the side, while Jayden Campbell will create history by following in the footsteps of his father, Preston, in becoming the first legacy player with the club.

Winning two of their three previous meetings against the Storm in Origin-affected fixtures, the Titans last won a match impacted by Origin in 2016 despite holding an above average overall record of 10 wins from 19 matches.

Who to watch: Having developed into an international and premiership-winning halfback under the tutelage of Craig Bellamy, it can be easy to forget that Jahrome Hughes began his first grade career with the Titans. Playing one game with the Gold Coast as a teenager in 2013 before making his way south via an unremarkable stint in North Queensland, the 26-year-old has grown to become a focal point of Melbourne's attack with 10 try assists, seven forced drop outs and five tries in 11 appearances this season. Possessing the instinct to run the ball having come through the rank as a fullback, Hughes will need to step up in the absence of wounded and representative stars if the Storm hope to extend their unbeaten record on the Sunshine Coast.

Having shown themselves incapable of winning matches through their defence so far this season, the Titans will need Jamal Fogarty to play with an attacking mindset if they have any ambition of pulling off an upset. Standing as one of the few attacking sparks left in the Titans' ranks, the 27-year-old Beaudesert junior has performed confidently over the opening half of the season with six try assists, four forced drop outs and an 87 per cent conversion rate. Tasked with one of the biggest challenges of his well-travelled career, Fogarty's kicking game will also need to be on point in order to limit the Storm's ability with the ball.

Favourite: Despite missing a host of stars through Origin, injury and suspension, Melbourne's 'next man up' mentality has them installed as overwhelming favourites.

My tip: While the start to life after Cameron Smith presented teething problems, the Storm have been able to string together nine straight wins all while dealing the challenges of key players being unavailable. **Melbourne by 16.**

Match Preview

After a shock win on Sunday afternoon, the Knights host the third placed Parramatta Eels at McDonald Jones Stadium.

A surprising eight-point victory for the Newcastle Knights over arch rivals the Manly-Warringah Sea Eagles was the biggest upset of the weekend as it granted the club just their second win from their last six matches.

It was a sigh of relief for Adam O'Brien and his supporters as the Knights were able to keep the Sea Eagles to under 15 points, something which Newcastle had failed to achieve before the weekend, having conceded 36 points in each of the last two weekends. Conceding only 10 points and keeping Tom Trbojevic under wraps were key to the Knights victory as they looked defensively sound for the first time in a long time.

The injury-ravaged Knights have named a fairly weak side for their clash with the Eels as Jack Johns has been named to make his club debut. The Knights suffer big losses in both David Klemmer and Tyson Frizzel who are replaced with Sauaso Sue and Brodie Jones in the starting side. Jacob Saifiti has been promoted into the starting side for his brother who is on representative duties whilst Kurt Mann and Nathanael Sasagi come on the bench.

A tough task in Newcastle awaits them on Sunday afternoon and the travelling Parramatta Eels will be fired up after their defeat to the South Sydney Rabbitohs. Parramatta are still in third place having won nine of their 12 matches so far this season whilst maintaining both the fourth best attack and defence.

Their loss on the weekend probably came as a bit of a shock to the Eels but they couldn't contain the marching South Sydney attack. The Rabbitohs managed to run seven tries in against Parramatta, the most the Eels have conceded all season.

The top four side have named a fairly strong side with many of their key players missing Origin selection. The Eels have selected Reed Mahoney at Hooker after he was released from Queensland camp. The Eels have lost only Junior Paulo to State of Origin duties as former Origin winger Blake Ferguson is dropped from the side. Dylan Brown and Reagan Campbell-Gillard return from suspension, pushing Oregon Kaufusi to the bench and rookie Jakob Arthur to the reserves. Marata Niukore has been named to start in the front row for Paulo whilst Haze Dunster stars in Ferguson's place on the wing.

Who to watch: With Reed Mahoney being named to start, it's given the fans an opportunity to witness a battle between two up and coming hookers. First of all, the home captain Jayden Brailey has been ever so consistent for the Knights across his 12 appearances this season, scoring three tries whilst averaging a whopping 50 tackles per match. The former Shark is arguably playing the best football of his career and has assisted four tries throughout the year including one against Manly on Sunday. His opposing number and Queensland call-up Reed Mahoney has been having the best year of his career as he has been influential in Parramatta's season thus far. The little dummy-half has scored two tries and assisted an incredible 10 tries in his 12 games so far this year, whilst averaging a career high in run metres, 43 per game. The Queenslander gets through a mountain of work in defence as well averaging an impressive 44.5 tackles per game. This battle between two of the better up and coming hookers will be an intriguing match up to watch on Sunday afternoon.

Favourite: The Eels are the favourite for this clash in Newcastle and rightly so. The Eels currently sit in third place and fielding a side that is hardly affected by State of Origin will only help their cause. Their opponents are suffering several injuries and are required to field many second string players as they attempt to claw their way back into the top eight. The return of Dylan Brown and Reagan Campbell-Gillard are massive for the Eels.

My tip: Despite the Knights victory on the weekend, I find it hard to believe that they'll be able to keep another top six side to 10 points or less. Dylan Brown will be fresh and fired up as he returns from injury and the Eels just overall match up very well against this Knights side. The Eels forwards to cause too much damage in Newcastle on Sunday. **Parramatta by 12.**

Like clockwork, there is an injury crisis in Queensland camp while New South Wales are rubbishing suggestions they are favourites.

It can only mean one thing – Origin is upon us.

Already there has been the first of what will be many controversies – the decision to play the opener at Townsville after a COVID-19 outbreak forced it to be moved from the Melbourne Cricket Ground.

Advantage Queensland.

The Maroons have another advantage – a psychological one – having taken out last year's series despite being the overwhelming underdogs.

This year there is no Wayne Bennett though, having relinquished the coaching reins to focus on South Sydney's premiership tilt.

It leaves Paul Green as the man to motivate Queensland to glory while Brad Fittler will seek to right the wrongs of a failed 2020 campaign.

Fittler has capitalised on Penrith's resounding success over the past two seasons to name six Panthers with Apisai Koroisau 18th man and the seventh if you count him.

While Fittler said in the lead-up to selection that club combinations are not as important as they used to be, Nathan Cleary and Jarome Luai's almost telepathic understanding of each other's game was enough to see them get the nod.

If we look back in the history books, the Blues have ran out for 35 games with club halves combinations for 19 wins and 16 losses – so not much can be drawn from those numbers.

Luai's selection at five-eighth bumps Jack Wighton to the bench, where he could fill in if an injury strikes in the backline.

Otherwise, the only other surprise in the Blues line-up is the inclusion of Liam Martin for an injured Tyson Frizell on the bench.

For Queensland, all eyes will be on Cameron Munster (foot) and Harry Grant (hamstring) with Kalyn Ponga (groin) already ruled out.

Valentine Holmes shifts to fullback while Kyle Feldt is set for his Origin debut on the wing.

AJ Brimson (bone bruising on knee) is also one to monitor although unlikely to be in as much doubt.

Who to watch: In a series brimming with intriguing individual match-ups, the one between Harry Grant and Damien Cook looms as the most exciting. Both are natural ball runners who were tipped to thrive in a fast-paced game under the new rules. While Grant has made an immediate impact for the Storm, Cook's performances have been mixed and even saw his place in the squad questioned by some. Cook thrives playing behind a dominant forward pack and he has not always had that at Souths this year. In the Origin arena though he will have no excuse and will need to be at his scheming best to give the NSW halves plenty of space and time to work with. That is particularly important given the strike the Blues have out wide with Tom Trbojevic and Latrell Mitchell both ball-playing options in the centres. Grant meanwhile was a standout in his Origin debut last year and his combination with Munster (if fit) looms as the biggest threat to the Blues. His pass selection at club land has also been spot on this season. For Grant it will be a case of carefully choosing when to take the line on and when a crash ball to his forwards is the better bet closer to the line. Cook has the advantage there in experience but Grant has constantly stepped up to the occasion and shown he is not afraid to back himself.

Favourite: The Blues are backed by the punters to get the job done in the opener.

My tip: On paper the Blues do have enough strike in the outside backs to put points on the Maroons but whether they capitalise on it will come down to the work of the spine. Queensland will likely try to unsettle Cleary and Luai early and remind them Origin is a different beast to club land. Points won't come as easy and building pressure instead will be key. That is somewhere Daly Cherry-Evans and Munster excelled last year and it could be the difference here too. **Queensland by 4.**

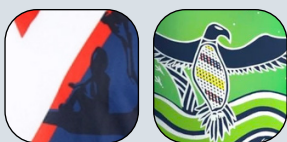
Gagai joined Johnston on two tries shortly after the resumption, the Rabbitohs' dominance extending to a

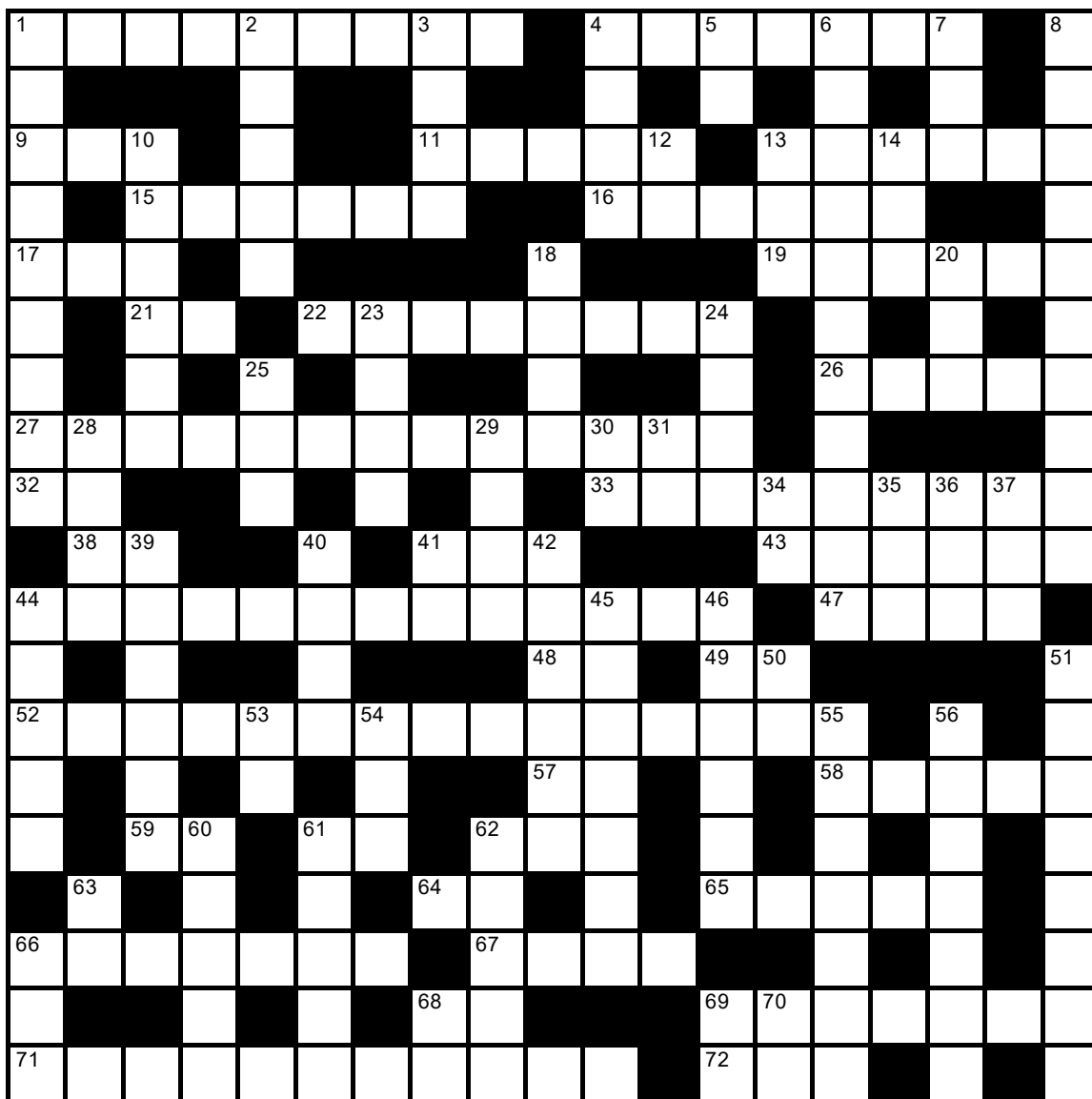
