

A mammoth win for New South Wales - and as we're finalising this edition of The Front Row, how it impacts this weekend's NRL round remains up in the air in terms of suspensions and injuries. And who knows if the Maroons can get up off the canvas in time to salvage the series in Brisbane at the end of the month?

Meanwhile, the NRL season does go on. Despite a shortened round last week, a fair bit happened. At the top, the reigning premiers Melbourne - currently second - extended their run of unbeaten games to ten with a barebones win over the Titans, while the ladder leaders Penrith had their winning streak cut short, their understrength outfit falling to the Tigers at Leichhardt.

There's good and bad news off the field as well. THE WAITING GAME

SON OF A GUN KNOWS HIS TIME IN THE SPOTLIGHT IS NEAR

Cooper Johns won't have to wait long until he gets another shot in first grade for the Melbourne Storm.

Johns was named in Craig Bellamy's 23-man squad for Sunday's trip to the Central Coast although he may yet receive a late call-up depending on the outcome of Wednesday night's Origin opener.

Regular halves Cameron Munster and Jarome Hughes have been reunited at the scrumbase, but Bellamy might resist the urge to push Munster too much as he returns from a foot injury.

The Storm have a ready-made replacement in the 21-year-old Novocastrian who hasn't looked out of place in the five NRL games he's played.

"It's really exciting to play with people like Dale (Finucane) and Jesse (Bromwich); I'd never played with them until this year so it's really exciting to play with them," he said.

"They bring a lot of confidence to the team and a lot of energy."

Johns, along with Nicho Hynes and Trent Loiero have received their opportunities largely due to injury and Origin commitments.

The 21-year-old admitted the secret to the Storm's success is because of players settling into the systems created by Bellamy.

They don't try to overplay their hand.

"We're just really coming in and trying to do the same job as the person before us," Johns said.

"We bring different strengths to players like Munster and Felise (Kaufusi), but overall we fall into a system and it makes our job really easy."

Johns has experienced playing on both sides of the field already this season and he had learned to be adaptable.

"I've always been someone who likes to play both sides of the field and when I was younger my dad was someone who encouraged me to do that," he said.

"You never know where you're going to get your chance (although) it is hard for a right-foot kicker on the left side, but it was a little adjustment."

The son of former Newcastle Knights great Matthew Johns said the Storm were looking forward to returning to AAMI Park when it was safe to do so.

But they are still getting the job done on the Sunshine Coast.

"We did it for a long period last year so we're definitely used to it," he said.

"Hopefully it's not the whole year this year; we really want to get back to Victoria and see our fans and play in front of our fans but for the time being we're happy to stay (in Queensland) and continue to do a job."

Blues run riot in Origin opener against muddled Maroons

New South Wales posted their biggest win against Queensland since 1963 in a 50-6 thrashing in the first Origin game to be played in Townsville in front of 27,355 fans tonight.

It was Tommy terrific show for New South Wales tonight. The Sea Eagles fullback scored a hat-trick in a Man of the Match performance which saw the Blues hand Queensland a 44-point defeat at Townsville. Latrell Mitchell and debutant Brian To'o also scored doubles in the mammoth win.

The Blues side was flush with the Panthers side that are top of the heap in the NRL, and the form continued tonight. Jarome Luai settled into his five-eighth role magnificently and directed traffic well getting ball to Latrell Mitchell and Tom Trbojevic in a fantastic back five performance from the visitors.

New South Wales were the first side to settle and opened the scoring through Trbojevic. He sliced through on the right to make it 8-nil after the early Nathan Cleary penalty goal then it was one-way traffic for the rest of the first half. Debutant Brian To'o showed off his finisher ability with a pair of wonderful finishes for 20-nil.

Queensland did give them a late fright when one of last year's winners Kurt Capewell getting one back on Trbojevic. He feigned to pass then regathered to brush off the Manly star to give the Maroons a sniff of the comeback only down 20-6 at the break.

Don't call it a comeback because the Blues ran riot in the second half. Mitchell who was dropped in 2019, was at his fearsome best tonight. He rumbled defenders then swooped on a Trbojevic kick to kickstart the second half rampage. The performances from Mitchell and Trbojevic showed the extra class the Blues had in their backline this year which helped them towards the half century.

Trbojevic got his second four-pointer on the hour mark, backing up well after Luai cut the defense to ribbons again. After the injury which cost him the start of the season, Trbojevic has been on another planet skills wise since his return and New South Wales have the luxury of picking him at centre.

Last year, Cleary was pinpointed as one of the architects of the Blues series defeat to the 'worst Maroons side' but the Panthers half was perfect tonight. He might carry a few scratches from an injury in the first half but the halfback nailed eight conversions in a typical display which has New South Wales up 1-nil.

Daniel Saifiti put the icing on the Blues victory cake with a bargeover from close range. From there, it was party time. Mitchell got his second from a Xavier Coates error then it was a deserved hat-trick for MOTM Trbojevic in a 50-6 romp tonight.

This leaves Queensland with more questions than answers after losing the opener. They face an uphill battle despite the second game also being in Queensland but tonight, none of their stars shone and it was rudderless performance which will worry coach Paul Green alongside judiciary issues for Moeaki Fotuika, Cameron Munster and Kyle Feldt coming out of the game tonight.

Warriors to return home to Mt Smart in Round 22

The Vodafone Warriors are coming home to play at Mount Smart Stadium for the first time in 716 days following confirmation they'll host the Canterbury Bankstown Bulldogs in their round 22 NRL clash on Sunday, August 15 (4.00pm kick-off).

The match will also double as a special farewell for captain Roger Tuivasa-Sheck who will be eyeing his last home game in Auckland before he finishes up with the Vodafone Warriors.

In announcing the much-anticipated homecoming, Vodafone Warriors CEO Cameron George said the occasion would reward not only the club's NRL players, staff and sponsors but especially the legion of long-suffering families, members and fans.

"This is going to be one of the biggest and certainly most emotional days in our great club's history," he said.

"We are all so excited knowing we are finally set to see the Vodafone Warriors, sponsors, families, members and fans coming together for a game day like no other on August 15.

"There's no doubt these will be the hottest tickets in town. What we want now is to see

Mount Smart Stadium packed to the rafters to support the team and to farewell Roger.

"The club as a whole has made huge sacrifices to keep the competition going during the Covid-19 pandemic but it's our families, members and fans back home in New Zealand who have suffered the most through not being able to connect with their team. Their continued support and patience has been incredible.

"Our special thanks go to the NRL for providing ongoing support. We can't say enough about what they've done for us over the last two seasons."

The match will end a drought of one year, 11 months and 16 days - 17,180 hours -

between games at Mount Smart Stadium, the Vodafone Warriors' last encounter at their home ground being against the South Sydney Rabbitohs on Friday, August 30, 2019.

By the time they meet Canterbury Bankstown on August 15, they would have played their last 20 home games in Australia.

It's yet to be confirmed when the Vodafone Warriors will travel home.

Tickets are now on presale for Vodafone Warriors members through Ticketmaster and will be on sale to the public from 3.00pm tomorrow (Thursday, June 10).

MELBOURNE STORM

Storm move Round 15 Tigers clash north

Melbourne Storm has announced today it will play its scheduled home fixture against Wests Tigers on June 19 at Sunshine Coast Stadium due to the ongoing COVID-19 situation in Melbourne.

The decision to move the game from AAMI Park was made following continued consultation with the NRL, Victorian Government representatives and Melbourne and Olympic Parks.

It follows on from the round 13 match against the Gold Coast Titans being played at Sunshine Coast Stadium in front of almost 8000 fans last weekend.

Tickets for the Tigers game will go on sale via Ticketek at 4pm today.

The work of Storm's major charity partner, the Starlight Children's Foundation, will be highlighted in the lead-up to the Tigers clash, as well as at the stadium on gameday.

For the past five years, Storm has worked with Starlight who are dedicated to brightening the lives of seriously ill children, adolescents and their families through a range of programs, including wish granting

and a Starlight Express Rooms in every major children's hospital in Australia.

To kick off the build-up to round 15, NRL squad members Cooper Johns and Nicho Hynes had a special online catch-up with some children currently in care on Starlight TV yesterday.

Storm CEO Justin Rodski said it was unavoidable for the Tigers game to be played away from Melbourne.

"I can understand the disappointment our members are feeling about missing out on seeing Storm at home over this current lockdown period," Rodski said.

"It is shared by our players and staff who love our games at AAMI Park and playing in front of the Purple Army.

"We are very thankful to Sunshine Coast Council and Sunshine Coast Stadium for partnering with us again for the round 15 clash.

"This week is also very special to our Club as it gives us a chance to highlight the outstanding work the Starlight Children's Foundation does for our community."

Storm will continue to monitor the COVID situation in Victoria and will take advice from the NRL and governments before making any decision on future games.

SYDNEY ROOSTERS

Brett Morris announces his retirement

Sydney Roosters winger Brett Morris has today announced his immediate retirement from rugby league.

In career-best form, Morris' 2021 season was cut short by an ACL injury, sustained in the final moments of the Roosters' match against the Newcastle Knights in early May.

As he looks to the future, Morris has made the decision that the Round 8 fixture, in which he also captained the Roosters, was his last after 16 seasons of top-grade football.

"Not everybody gets to go out on their own terms, but looking back over my career, I've been incredibly fortunate to have had the opportunities I've had, and I hang up the boots a very proud and content man, knowing that the time is right," said Morris.

"There are many people who have played an important role in helping me in my career throughout the years, and I'd like to extend my thanks to them all, right back to my junior club the Kiama Knights.

"In the NRL, I've been fortunate to be coached by and to play with some of the game's best, and I'm grateful to all the coaches and teammates I've had over the years.

"More recently, it's been an honour to wear the Sydney Roosters jersey and I will always be proud to have captained the side in what was my final match.

"To Trent and the coaching and performance staff, I found a new lease on life here at the Roosters. Since I first walked through the door in late 2018, I have been challenged every day, but because of that, I've also had some of my most enjoyable memories on and off the footy field.

"To my current teammates, we're a tight group and it was a privilege every time I got to run out with you. To one teammate in particular, it was awesome to be able to start and finish my career with my brother Josh, and the memories we made are some I'll cherish forever.

"Family is incredibly important to me, and I certainly wouldn't have been in the position to enjoy 16 seasons in the NRL without the unwavering support of my mother Karen, my siblings, and most of all, my wife Kate and our children Emily, Ellie and James."

34-year-old Morris retires in fourth position on the list of all-time try scorers and is a two-time Premiership winner (Sydney Roosters 2019, St George Illawarra Dragons 2010).

Morris made his NRL debut with the St George Illawarra Dragons in Round 9 of the 2006 season, amassing 169 games for the Club. He played 68 games for the Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs over four seasons (2015-2018), before linking with the Roosters in 2019 (39 games).

In the representative arena, Morris played 18 Tests for Australia (2009-2014) and made 15 appearances for New South Wales between 2010 and 2017. He also played for the NRL All Stars (2011), NSW Country (2012) and Prime Minister's XVIII (2013).

He also holds the feat of being a two-time World Club Challenge Man of the Match recipient (2012, 2019).

Player 1182, Morris made his Club debut with the Sydney Roosters in the opening round of the 2019 season, scoring seven tries in 15 appearances. He played an instrumental role on the wing in the Roosters' 2019 Grand Final victory and was named in the NRL Team of the Decade spanning 2010-2019.

Morris scored 12 tries in 17 appearances for

the Roosters in 2020. Incredibly, he scored 11 tries in just 7 appearances in 2021.

Sydney Roosters Head Coach, Trent Robinson, lauded Morris for his achievements throughout his career.

"The way Brett has gone about playing the game throughout his career is testament to the incredible athlete and character that he is, and it's been a true honour to coach him," said Robinson.

"Brett is one of the best, if not the best, finishers in the history of our game, and it is important we acknowledge his achievements over the years; not only at Club level but also in the representative arena.

"Brett's professional approach to his training, playing and recovery is testament to the man he is. He is a man of integrity and has been a great mentor to his teammates, making those around him better, both on and off the field.

"Fairy tales take shape in different forms, and while Brett didn't get the end to his career he so richly deserved, an exciting new chapter is about to begin for him, and on behalf of the playing group and everyone at the Club, we wish Brett, Kate, Emily, Ellie and James all the very best," he added.

2021's most-improved lock horns at Lottoland

After the opening month of football the Manly Sea Eagles and the North Queensland Cowboys appeared to be closer to the wooden spoon than the finals.

Fast-forward to the midway point of the season and the two teams have risen to become genuine top eight contenders.

Undergoing a radical transformation from the side that sat winless at the bottom of the ladder after four rounds, the Manly Sea Eagles can thank a fully fit and firing Tom Trbojevic for their resurgence.

Winning six of their past eight matches to sit in sixth position with a +1 points differential, the margin of the wins has been particularly impressive given the side's -122 for-and-against differential after four rounds.

Coming into the contest well-rested after a bye last weekend, coach Des Hasler will be determined for his side to continue a solid record against the Cowboys following three wins from their past four meetings.

In a boost to the side's chances, Tom Trbojevic, Jake Trbojevic and Daly Cherry-Evans are set to back up less than 48 hours after the opening State of Origin fixture, while Kieran Foran, Haumole Olakau'atu and Dylan Walker have been named to return after recovering from injury.

Growing in confidence after a rocky start to life under coach Todd Payten, the North Queensland Cowboys will be hoping a key change at halfback doesn't halt their momentum.

Naming Tom Dearden for his club debut after Jake Clifford was granted an early release to join the Knights, the one-time Brisbane wunderkind will be hoping a change in scenery helps to unearth the talent that saw the Broncos tout him as their long-term playmaker only two years ago.

Holding an eerily similar form line to their opponents with six wins from their past eight matches, the Cowboys will be out to extend a surprisingly strong record of five wins from their past six visits to Lottoland.

Banking on Valentine Holmes and Kyle Feldt making it through Wednesday night's Origin opener unscathed, forward trio Jason Taumalolo, Lachlan Burr and Francis Molo are set to return after missing the last-gasp win over the Warriors a fortnight ago.

Who to watch: The term 'revelation' is often overused to describe improving players, but in the case of Jason Saab the description is aptly fitting. Managing seven matches in two seasons with the Dragons before struggling to make an impact during the side's sluggish start to 2021, the 20-year-old has emerged as one of the game's genuine speedsters with 11 tries in his past eight matches. Forming a potent combination alongside Morgan Harper on the right edge, look for Saab to relish his personal battle opposite Murray Taulagi as the Sea Eagles look to consolidate a place in the top eight.

Earmarked as the man to return Brisbane to former glory as a teenager, Tom Dearden will be hoping for more measured expectations in his second coming as a first-grader. Managing 22 appearances for the Broncos having debuted just weeks after legally becoming an adult in 2019, the 20-year-old Mackay junior will be looking to regain his footing in the top grade after spending the past six weeks plying his trade in reserve grade. Possessing an underutilised running game and the ability to force repeat sets with the boot, expect Dearden to grow in confidence as spends more time with his new teammates.

Favourite: With the side primed to bounce back following a missed opportunity a fortnight ago, the Sea Eagles will be hoping to record only their third win at Lottoland since the start of last season.

My tip: While much will depend on the side's Origin contingent getting through Wednesday night unscathed, the Sea Eagles should have the strike power to get the job done on home soil. **Manly by 7.**

Match Preview

The Sharks will be looking to make it a shock two-straight defeats for the table-topping Panthers on Friday night.

Having looked unstoppable for so much of this season, Penrith were exposed without its Origin stars last week and Cronulla will take confidence from the Tigers' 26-6 victory.

The Sharks head into Friday's contest in stellar form having disposed of the Titans 38-10 before the bye.

While Penrith have major question marks over their fill-in halves, Shaun Johnson and Matt Moylan combined for their best performances of 2021 against the Gold Coast. The attack was crisp and executed to perfection – giving the outside backs early ball when needed or otherwise playing direct and through the middle when better suited.

Cronulla was embarrassed 48-0 by Penrith earlier this season and revenge will be on the cards when they face off again, this time with the Sharks eyeing a mid-season revival.

With no Origin representatives this period shapes as Cronulla's best chance to push up the ladder. Unlike Cronulla, Penrith has been hit hard by Origin with seven players selected and Apisai Koroisau the only one certain to back up after being selected as 18th man for the Blues. Otherwise, all six others (Nathan Cleary, Jarome Luai, Brian To'o, Liam Martin, Isaah Yeo and Kurt Capewell) have been named on an extended bench.

Panthers fans will be hopeful one of Cleary and Luai play after an unconvincing first outing from new pairing Matt Burton and Tyrone May. The latter was the more dominant playmaker, at least in the opening half, but lacked the tempo and variety in attack that had made Cleary the competition's best halfback. May was also heavily targeted in defence, forced into almost 40 tackles and tired easily as a result, unable to offer much in terms of generating genuine points-scoring opportunities.

Burton also had a mixed performance and coach Ivan Cleary said he "should be disappointed" with an inconsistent kicking game.

Penrith's last-tackle options exposed just how lost Burton and May looked leading the side around and will be a priority to fix in time for Friday.

The inclusion of Koroisau should help the Panthers play more direct and to their strengths.

Who to watch: Matt Moylan's last game against the Panthers did not go as planned, exposed in defence by Liam Martin as the Sharks fell to a 38-12 defeat. Before that Moylan had often been the one having the last laugh against his former teammates. The ex-Panther was 18th man in the earlier meeting between the two teams this season. Now though he shapes as Cronulla's likely halves partner for Nicho Hynes next year and instead of being on the outer is getting back to full fitness and thriving. Moylan was taking on the line with confidence against the Gold Coast a fortnight ago and has the attacking spark Penrith was craving last week with Cleary and Luai on Origin duty.

While Burton and May's performances warranted criticism last round, there is also something to be said about Viliame Kikau's inability to step up when the Panthers needed him most. In his defence, Penrith are overly-reliant on Kikau when looking for a back-up plan in attack. There is a reason for that though and at the moment Kikau just does not seem to take the ball up with the ferocity and intensity that a man of his size and skill should. If Penrith's Origin stars fail to back up again it will need Kikau to really stand tall and actually go after the ball instead of waiting for Burton to spread it his way. Burton himself will also need to better utilise Kikau, getting him running against the grain like Cleary does or using him as a decoy to give early ball to Stephen Crichton.

Favourite: Despite last week's loss the Panthers are favoured to win this one.

My tip: If one of Cleary and Luai play this week the Panthers will win. The inclusion of Koroisau softens the blow regardless but on the current line-ups alone it is the Sharks who would have too many points. **Cronulla by 8.**

Titans look to get back on track against unpredictable Roosters

The league's newest team will take on the only true foundation club when the Gold Coast Titans host the Sydney Roosters this Saturday.

After a promising start to the season the Gold Coast Titans have fallen out of the top eight due to a string of poor defensive showings.

Conceding 33 points on average in each of their past eight matches to rank standing as the third worst defensive team in the league, coach Justin Holbrook has been left to lament his side's standing after pre-season pundits envisioned big things for 2021.

Coming into the contest after narrowly going down 20-14 to the Storm last Saturday, the Titans will be hoping to break through for their first win over the Roosters in five years.

Welcoming back Queensland quartet of AJ Brimson, Moeaki Fotuauka, David Fifita and Tino Fa'asuamaleau three days after the opening State of Origin fixture, last week's try-scoring debutant Greg Marzhev has held his place in the backline alongside Brian Kelly, who will play his 50th match for the club.

Standing strong in the face of considerable adversity over the opening half of the season, the Sydney Roosters will be looking to remain in contention for an unlikely tilt at the title.

Benefitting from a weekend off in the lead-up to the opening Origin encounter, the Roosters have dominated the Titans with eight wins from ten clashes during Trent Robinson's coaching tenure.

Winning four of their six visits to CBUS Super Stadium over the years, the Roosters will welcome back established forward Angus Crichton (suspension) and teenage playmaker Sam Walker (rested).

Establishing a reputation as one of the premier front-rowers of the NRL era, New Zealand international Jared Waerea-Hargreaves will make his 250th first grade appearance 12 years after debuting with the Sea Eagles as a 20-year-old.

Who to watch: Overlooked for an Origin recall despite the Maroons missing a number of first-choice front-rowers, Jarrod Wallace will be looking to press his case with a strong showing on Saturday afternoon. Enjoying a fair season with 100 metres and 24 tackles on average, the 29-year-old has regained his place in the starting team after spending a large part of last year plying his trade off the bench. Set to oppose milestone man Jared Waerea-Hargreaves in a ferocious battle up front, a strong showing from Wallace will be sure to be noted by Queensland selectors ahead of Game II in just over a fortnight.

Earning rave reviews while still in the infancy of his first grade career, Sam Walker will be looking to make up for lost time in his home state. Rested from the side's big win over the Raiders a fortnight ago, the 18-year-old halfback has thrived in his first eight appearances with four tries, ten try-assists and an assuredness rarely seen in halfbacks of a similar vintage. Considered a top contender to be named Rookie of the Year based on his introduction to the NRL, Walker will be looking to enhance his reputation by guiding the Tricolours to back-to-back wins for the first time in a month.

Favourite: While their form has wavered in recent weeks, the ingrained class of the Roosters is expected to be too much for the Titans to contend with on Saturday afternoon.

My tip: In a match pitting a side ranked third in defence against another ranked third-last, you don't have to be a rugby league boffin to know how this match will play out. **Sydney Roosters by 16.**

Souths looking to Climb Higher as Knights season on life support

The South Sydney Rabbitohs and the Newcastle Knights will clash on Saturday evening in what could be a decisive game in the context of the season. Souths, whilst sitting in third on the ladder, have looked shaky at times having conceded 50 points or more twice already this season. South Sydney need to win these sorts of games against lower-ranked sides to stay in touch with the "big two" this year and prove that they still have what it takes to go all the way.

The Knights season could be on the line on Saturday. They are only two points outside of the top eight as it currently stands, but they have looked very lacklustre so far this year. My tip: South Sydney are coming off the bye, look better on paper and are at home. Seemingly, they have everything going their way to win this game. The Knights, you would think, have to be desperate to get the win and a rude shock could catch South Sydney out if the Knights can stand their ground against them. Still, in recent weeks there hasn't been a lot of desperation shown by the Knights and it's hard to see them suddenly turning it around. South Sydney should simply be too good for the Knights to handle. **South Sydney by 14.**

Former glamour clubs to thrash it out in the nation's capital

For former teammates Kevin Walters and Ricky Stuart, Canberra's breakthrough premiership in 1989 must seem like a world away. Back when the Raiders and Broncos dominated, Stuart would go on to finish with three titles in the lime green, while Walters returned home to win another five as a Bronco.

Now at the polar opposite of the halcyon days, the 13th placed Raiders host the 15th ranked Broncos in what promise to be icy conditions this Saturday. And with only seven wins between them from 25 starts, the loser wouldn't look out of place if they continued south for the upcoming ski season.

It was only three weeks ago when Walters sparked a Brisbane revival. But the forward punch that rolled the Roosters in the season's biggest upset vanished quicker than it appeared.

Last week's 52-24 humiliation to St George Illawarra in the absence of Origin stars Xavier Coates and Payne Haas saw a return of old habits. A six-point lead nearing the break quickly became a halftime deficit that rapidly escalated into 34 unanswered points.

The return of Karmichael Hunt for the first time since 2009 could lift the Broncos' spirits, but with Canberra's Josh Papalii back from suspension, the best of Matthew Lodge and Tom Flegler will be a non-negotiable for Brisbane to be a serious threat.

But if the Broncos need anything, it's confidence. And if Walters stumbles across some, then Stuart should join the same queue. If not for a narrow escape against the last placed Bulldogs during Magic Round, the Raiders would have dropped eight straight.

Talk of disharmony and uncertainty among the playing group has eroded the club's tenacity. A once proud defence has conceded an average of 30 points a week over the past two months including 20 after halftime.

At last season's midpoint the Raiders faced a similar predicament. Plagued by a mounting injury toll, Stuart continually backed his squad and the worm slowly turned in what proved to be a thrilling finals run.

Now with the Dragons and Titans to follow in the coming weeks with minimal Origin impact, a victory this week could position the Raiders for another finals tilt.

Who to watch: Despite an abundance of young playmakers on the rise, it'll be more a case of Back to the Future in Canberra on Saturday night.

Sam Williams will trot out for his third appearance this season. Now in his 11th season in the top grade, the Raiders' Mr Fix-it offers reliable cover for the homesick George Williams and will guide the team in what will be his 98th NRL match.

Since Ricky Stuart handed him his first NRL jumper at Cronulla back in 2010, Albert Kelly has lived the highs and lows. Now three games into his NRL revival following six seasons in the Super League, the 30-year-old continues to surprise. In an outfit screaming for direction, the classy half has straightened Brisbane's attack and alongside his four try assists continues to create doubt off the boot.

Favourite: The Raiders are short priced favourites to make it three straight against Brisbane in the nation's capital.

My tip: Just like night follows day, you can bet this one will be in the balance when the halftime hooter sounds. But given both sides' propensity for a collapse, what happens next is anyone's guess. I'm tipping the week off will do the Raiders the world of good, and they should bolt home. **Canberra by 22.**

The most unpredictable game of 2021 coming up?

A well-used Central Coast Stadium (playing host to an A-League soccer final just 18 hours prior to Sunday's contest) hosts Sunday's contest between the Warriors and Melbourne, and to be honest - who knows what to make of this one so far out from kickoff?

At the time of writing this preview - before Origin I - the Warriors of course were unaffected by any missing players and so will be largely able to go into this game settled. The only question hanging over their 21 man squad that was named this week will be whether Addin Fonua-Blake - named in the reserves - will make it back into the lineup on game day. All that remains to ponder after that is which Warriors side turns up - the surprise packet that challenges the premiership heavyweights, or the exhausted team that often shows signs of needing to go home?

Melbourne on the other hand, usually go into most games focused and settled. Post-Origin makes it that much harder - coach Craig Bellamy will have plenty to think about once Wednesday night's contest in Townsville is complete. He's named Addo-Carr, Munster, Kaufusi, Grant and Welch, along with an approved 6-man reserves list to help cover any losses.

In bad news though - he's already lost prop-forward Nelson Asofa-Solomona. He unsuccessfully challenged a Contrary Conduct charge and sits out this week's game. Thankfully, Reimis Smith (who challenged a Careless High Tackle charge) was cleared to play.

So the story here really is - this one is just an unpredictable mess. Form and class should dictate that Melbourne win, but ultimately it may just come down to how settled the lineup is going into this one.

Looking back at the Warriors - they might also be buoyed by some inspiring news, with the Auckland-based club announcing this week they're headed home for a one-off game at Mt Smart in Round 22, where they'll host the Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs. The news of their impending return to their long-missed home may just be the tonic they need to break what is an absurdly-long losing streak against their opponents, with their last win against the Storm coming way back in 2015.

Who to watch: After spending a month on the wing, 2019 Dally M medal winner Roger Tuivasa-Sheck returns to his favoured fullback position with a suspension sidelining break-out rookie Reece Walsh. Whether he takes time or adjust or just gets on with the job will no doubt have a significant impact on how the Warriors stand up to the might of the Storm.

With the return of Ryan Papenhuyzen imminent for Melbourne, this could be one of the last times we get to see Nicho Hynes play a full match in the custodian role. The Cronulla-bound fullback has attracted plenty of attention in recent weeks for some superb performances, and along with other members of the spine - namely Jahrome Hughes and Brandon Smith - will vital to keeping the Storm outfit stable heading into this one, regardless of which Origin stars back up on Sunday.

Favourite: Melbourne haven't lost to the Warriors in their last ten and the punters don't think that's going to change this week either.

My tip: While this definitely represents a danger game for the Storm, it's hard to tip against them. They'll win this, but the margin will depend on how many of their Origin cohort are able to back up. **Melbourne by 10.**

The resurgent Tigers head across town to face the top four Parramatta Eels in a crucial clash at Bankwest Stadium on Sunday afternoon.

Then there's the mystery of key off-season signing, halfback Kyle Flanagan. Not named in the NRL starting side, not named in NSW Cup again, and not on the injury list. I'll just leave it at that.

The Saints have named the exact same 17 as last week. For this Bulldogs fan, this is an extremely foreign concept, and I am supremely envious!

NSW utility Tariq Sims has been named on the extended bench, and should come into the 17 if he survives Origin. Poasa Faamausili will need to clear concussion protocols to take his spot on the bench.

Last time they met - just five rounds ago at Kogarah - saw an easy 32-12 victory for the Dragons. And if we're honest, where they very easily could have run in 50-plus.

It was also (seemingly) the beginning of the end for Kyle Flanagan, hooked by Barrett before half time, and not seen in Bulldogs (or Mounties) colours since.

St George Illawarra have now won 4 of the last 5 clashes between these two sides.

Who to watch: I'll be watching to see what the Dragons' backline is going to do to the Bulldogs' out of form, slow, and out of position fullbacks, wingers and centres. I'm expecting Mikaele Ravalawa and Matt Dufty in particular to have an absolute field day.

Canterbury's team selection is not rewarding form, or punishing a lack of it. All we have is Luke Thompson being the shining light in an otherwise depressing season. He is brilliant - and will lead from the front again.

Favourite: At the time of writing, the Dragons are \$1.20 favourites.

My tip: The Dragons should win this rather comfortably. **St George Illawarra by 20.**

COVID-19 update: fixture postponed

Tigers take advantage of Panther cubs

Establishing a 12-6 buffer with an Adam Doueihi penalty goal shortly after Mbye hobbled off with a knee injury, the home side were controversially awarded a penalty try to Luciano Leilua (65th minute) after the bunker ruled the ball had been dislodged from the second-rower's grasp as a result of high contact from Robert Jennings.

Securing the result with a second penalty goal to Doueihi after Burton put a line drop-out out on the full, a barge-over effort from Stefano Utoikamanu (77th minute) capped a memorable night for the joint venture.

Next week, the Tigers face the Eels on Sunday afternoon at Bankwest Stadium, while the Panthers travel to Kogarah on Friday evening to take on the Sharks.
