# END OF THE ROAD

*BOYD CORDNER BECOMES THE THIRD ROOSTER TO CALL TIME ON HIS CAREER IN 2021*

**L**et's be honest - we all saw this one coming a mile away. Roosters and NSW captain Boyd Cordner has chosen retirement this week after a fantastic rugby league career.

Battered by repeated concussion injuries, 29-year-old Cordner has made the difficult, gut-wrenching decision that he won't pull on the boots as a professional player again.

"For once in my life and my career I had to put my own health and happiness first," Cordner told the media this week announcing his decision.

"The easiest thing for me would've been to say nothing and play on. But I know now that this is the toughest thing that I've had to do.

"Deep down I knew I wasn't 100% fully recovered. I was at a stage where I was at full training with the guys and I was very close to 100%, but the feeling of going out... 'what does the next head knock look like for me?' ... I couldn't get that out of my head."

Cordner - Roosters player #1119 - made 181 appearances for the Tricolours since debuting mid-season in 2011.

His skill and courage in the back row earned him 16 caps for the NSW Origin team, including captaining the winning 2018-19 squad; and he represented Australia 20 times between 2013 and 2019.

"Boyd is one of the greatest leaders of men I have seen," said Trent Robinson, who coached Cordner from the 2013 premiership winning season through to his last game in the Tricolours in 2020.

"At any level of the game, I'm sure that every player who ever stood alongside Boyd would thank him for being the teammate and leader that he was."

Ever humble, the retiring captain was quick to throw focus onto those who made his journey possible - including Robinson.

"I'm so fortunate to have been coached by you for pretty much my whole career. You made me a better player and a better man," Cordner said of his mentor.

He also singled out assistants Travis Touma and Craig Fitzgibbon, as well as his teammates, who he said it was an honour to play alongside and captain.

Like any retiring player, Cordner was at pains to emphasise the support of his family.

"Most importantly, to my family, especially my partner Jemma and my dad Chris. You've always been there for me, been in my corner, and I'll never be able to thank you enough for what you've done for me over the years," said Cordner.

Boyd retires with three NRL premierships (2013, 2018 and 2019, the latter two as captain), three Origin shields with the Blues (2014, 2018 and 2019) and two Rugby League World Cup trophies (2013 and 2017).

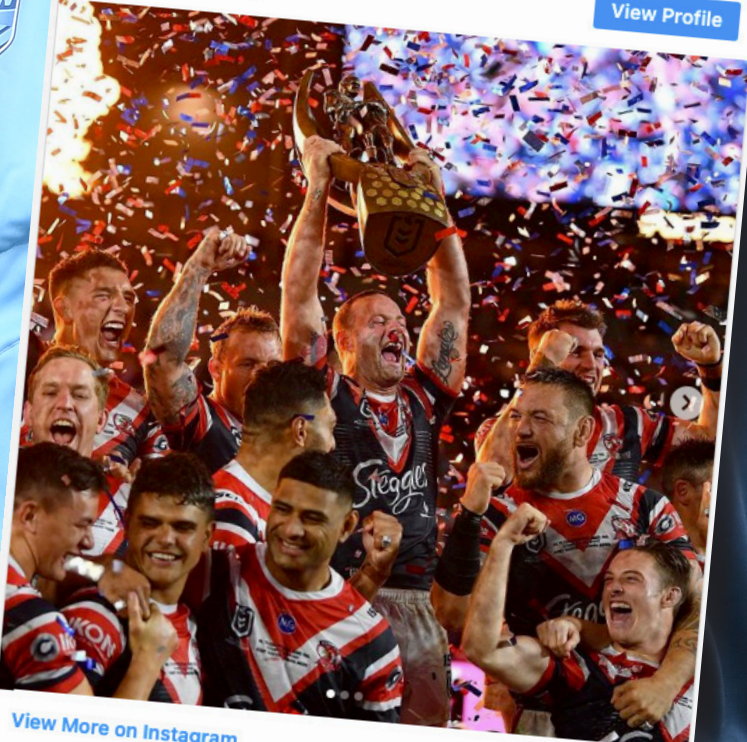

# POWER OF SIX

## NRLW EXPANSION CONFIRMED AS WARRIORS TAKE A BREAK

**T**he NRL Telstra Women's Premiership (NRLW) will expand to 6 teams in 2021 with the objective of expanding to 8 teams in 2022.

In 2021 the NRLW will see the Gold Coast Titans, Newcastle Knights and Parramatta Eels join the competition.

The Australian Rugby League Commission approved the expansion which will see the new clubs join the Brisbane Broncos, St George Illawarra Dragons and Sydney Roosters for NRLW 2021.

NRLW will commence alongside Round 23 of the Telstra Premiership, with each team playing each other once and the top four teams playing in semi-finals.

The Grand Final will continue to be played on the same day as the NRL Grand Final.

The number of games will increase from 7 to 18 this season and the number of playing weeks will increase from 4 to 7.

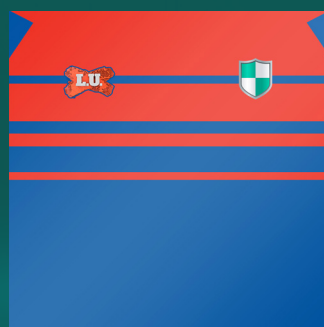
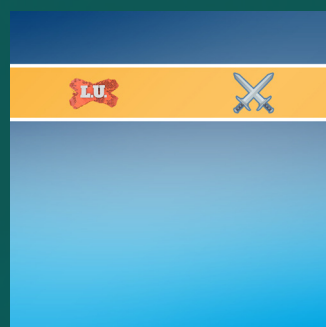
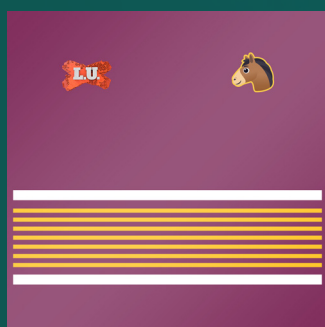
The majority of NRLW matches will be played as double headers on the same day as NRL Telstra Premiership matches to maximise exposure for the competition.

After being part of the foundation four clubs who entered the competition in 2018 the Warriors will not participate in the 2021 season because of uncertainty surrounding borders.

The club is committed to returning to the competition next year. With the framework established for the 2021 season the NRL will work with the playing group and clubs on a contracting model.

NRL Chief Executive Andrew Abdo said the expansion highlighted the success and growth of the women's game.

"Today is a really special day for the game. Women's rugby league is the fastest growing part of our sport and it's exciting to be in a position to expand the competition after the success of the last three seasons," he said.





“The NRLW competition has produced some of the best athletes in Australia, it’s captivated a new fan base and today’s expansion will give more players the opportunity to play in an elite competition.”

Mr Abdo said the Commission was prioritising investment in growing the women’s game at all levels.

“Now that we have a really solid base, thriving State competitions and investment in expanding the game from the bottom up, I cannot wait to see the NRLW go to a new level across 7 weeks and 18 games.

“I want to thank the Titans, Knights and Eels for their commitment to women’s rugby league. It’s an historic day for all clubs and an exciting day for their fans and of course the ongoing commitment of the Broncos, Dragons and Roosters.”

Naming Rights partner Telstra said the expansion of the competition would provide more opportunities for athletes.

“The continued expansion of the NRLW Telstra Premiership is something we are so excited to see as it provides greater opportunities for aspiring professional female athletes to forge a career and gives fans of the game more action to watch, and greater connection to the supporters in Newcastle, Gold Coast, and Parramatta,” said Genelle Sharples, Principal, Media Sponsorship & Awards at Telstra.

Mr Abdo thanked the Warriors for the participation in the NRLW competition.

“The Warriors were part of the first four clubs to join the NRLW competition and we are grateful for the commitment they made right from the start, particularly during the pandemic last year.

It’s been an incredibly challenging period for the club during COVID and I’m confident we will see the Warriors return to the competition in 2022 as part of our expansion plans.”

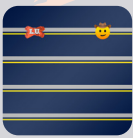

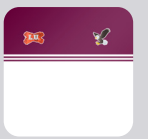

# Match Preview

## with Lachy MacCorquodale

Wayne Bennett looks for yet another win against his former Brisbane Broncos.

629 games at the helm of the Brisbane Broncos and the now current South Sydney Rabbitohs coach will aim for his second win against the six-time premiers this Thursday night.

The Rabbitohs will be gifted with the return of several Origin stars after Damien Cook, Cameron Murray, Dane Gagai and Jai Arrow were rested for their weekend's victory over the Newcastle Knights. This move has seen Benji Marshall and debutant Peter Mamouzelos drop out of the side whilst Jacob Host, Hame Sele and Braidon Burns slide back to the interchange. The third placed Rabbitohs will be hoping to keep their spot in the top four with a win over the Broncos at the hallowed turf of Suncorp Stadium. Fortunately for the Rabbitohs, the current Broncos side is a mere shell of its former self and their incredible record at Suncorp Stadium has slipped over the recent years.

Since the start of the 2020 season, the Broncos have only won four of the 15 matches they've played at Suncorp and the Rabbitohs will be looking to worsen the record. A fairly convincing win over the Knights on Saturday should give the side some confidence heading into a clash against an arguably worse side.

Souths' Origin stars are going to be firing after their rest, including those who played on the weekend, as they partake in their last hit out before the second Origin clash next weekend. They're going to be a tough side to stop up in Brisbane and in particular Latrell Mitchell, coming off a brilliant Origin performance and backing it up with a solid performance against the Knights. There's every chance the star fullback runs amok on Thursday night as he did for the Blues.

On the other hand, the Broncos rut continues after losing to Canberra by 22 points on Saturday night. That now leaves the Broncos with just one win from their past six fixtures and two wins in their last 11 games which includes a 29-point loss to the Rabbitohs earlier in the season. Whilst Brisbane's attack has improved this year from 13.4 points per game to 16.6 points scored per game this season, their defence is still the worst in the competition conceding on average 31.1 points per game, the same figure as last season. Kevin Walters' task was always going to be difficult but you start to wonder whether he thought it was going to be this tough as the Broncos sit in 15th spot with the Canterbury Bulldogs right on their heels after their second win of the season.

Youngster Tesi Niu will start at fullback for the second week running whilst Xavier Coates has been named to return after pulling out at the last minute against the Canberra Raiders, pushing Dale Copley to the extended bench. Thomas Flegler reclaims the number 13 jersey reverting John Asiata to the bench.

**Who to watch:** South Sydney fullback Latrell Mitchell has had a superb two weeks and he will be looking to continue his run of hot form as Origin II looms. Mitchell has had a stellar start to 2021 having scored five tries in his nine appearances for the Rabbitohs, resulting in seven wins. The New South Welshman has also recorded nine try assists, five line breaks and 144 run metres per game (career high). Mitchell seems to have found his footing in the role he stepped into when he joined South Sydney at the start of the 2020 season. Mitchell won't necessarily have many interactions with this particular opponent, but Tevita Pangai Junior could be the man to unsettle the South Sydney forward pack. The 25-year-old has scored three tries this season, his most since 2018 and an incredible 45 offloads in just 14 matches. The backrower is getting through a mountain of work, averaging 122 run metres and 28 tackles per game. Now, Pangai Junior is one of the more inconsistent players in the competition but if it's his night, it could cause trouble for the Rabbitohs. The tackle breaking machine has recorded four tackle breaks or more in five of his matches so far this season and has recorded three or more offloads in eight matches so far this season. If he's firing, he'll be a handful for the Rabbitohs defence.

**Favourite:** Souths are the favourite for the Thursday night clash and for good reason. They've only recorded three losses so far this season, twice against Melbourne and once against Penrith, but they've dealt with every other side that has stood in their path. The Broncos have once again struggled this year and that's highlighted by their embarrassing 31 points conceded per game.

**My tip:** South Sydney should be too strong for the Broncos, in the process giving Bennett another victory over the club that forced him out after the 2018 season. The Rabbitohs should comfortably deal with the Broncos just as they did earlier in the season. **South Sydney by 18.**

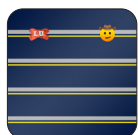

# Match Preview

Evenly matched sides to do battle in quest for top 8 position

The Cowboys and Sharks are coming off completely contrasting performances last week, with North Queensland looking promising early before succumbing to Manly and conceding 50 points.

The Sharks got out to an early lead against Penrith minus their origin stars and were able to hold off a Matt Burton inspired comeback to win by a point.

Both sides are amongst the group of 8 or so teams vying to get into the bottom of the top 8, and despite the results last week, the Cowboys remain two competition points ahead of the Sharks.

It means that a win could potentially see them go 4 points ahead of the next highest teams and put them in a comfortable position to continue their charge towards finals football, while a loss would put them even with the Sharks and make the race for the top 8 even more chaotic.

Both sides will be well aware of the high stakes, so expect the best versions of both the Cowboys and Sharks to be present in Townsville on Friday evening.

In team news, the Cowboys regain origin winger Kyle Feldt, who comes into the side for Justin O'Neill, who was poor defensively last week. The Cowboys have undergone a similar trajectory of improving as the season went on, however last week's performance was simply inexcusable. **Who to watch:** Despite consistently putting up performances matching that of a top 5 half in the competition, Shaun Johnson remains without a playing contract beyond this year in one of the most baffling scenarios in recent memory. Last year, he led the league in try assists, while this year he has also proven his ability to close out a close game, specifically last week where he not only made the line break to get the Sharks in field position to kick the drop goal, but also backed this up by kicking what would turn out to be the matchwinner a few tackles later. He will want to continue this impressive form to appeal to any potential suitors out there.

For the Cowboys, Murray Taulagi has seemingly come out of the woodwork to announce himself as one of the best wingers in the competition. He's scored 5 tries in his last 3 games and in a well beaten side last week still managed to run for 101 metres and make 4 tackle breaks and a line break. He will be keen to take advantage of the matchup against Will Chambers, who has only just returned to Rugby League, and Connor Tracey, who isn't a natural winger.

**Favourite:** The Cowboys are slight favourites to get the job done at home.

**My tip:** The Sharks absolutely put the Cowboys to the sword when they met earlier in the year, racing out to a 36-6 halftime lead. While this game will be much closer, I don't think the new Cowboys halves pairing of Dearden and Drinkwater will be able to close this one out. **Cronulla by 4.**

# Match Preview

## with Andrew Jackson

The cavalry has returned and Ivan Cleary has swung the axe too.

After dropping two-straight games, Penrith will aim to right the ship against a Roosters side that has constantly shown the pluck Cleary desperately needed in the past fortnight.

Fortunately for the Panthers they welcome back the full Origin contingent this week with Nathan Cleary, Jarome Luai and Isaah Yeo's returns particularly important.

Penrith were hardly threatening in the first half last week against Cronulla. Tyrone May only had a passing game at his disposal, refusing to take the line on or share the kicking duties with Matt Burton. This may have been the coaching call of Cleary or a reflection of May's limited skillset as a player better suited to being a ball-playing forward. Instead he was thrown into the No. 7 jersey and drifted across field, easy to defend given it was unlikely he would run or kick.

Burton too struggled in the first half with an inaccurate kicking game while he did not record a single run metre. It was the young five-eighth though that provided the much-needed spark to inspire a second-half fightback that just fell short when a poor fifth-tackle option exposed Penrith's lack of direction without Cleary and Luai.

May's poor performances in the past two weeks and the emergence of young gun Izack Tago has seen the utility dumped to the reserves. Cleary, Luai, Yeo and Kurt Capewell return after being rested while Viliame Kikau is out with a hamstring complaint, seeing Liam Martin start.

Penrith's opposition this week are the perfect example of what playing through adversity looks like.

Trent Robinson's men have had all the excuses to drop away this season but constantly turned up – doing the same last Saturday as they outlasted an epic fightback to pip the Titans 35-34. Everyone has been waiting for the Roosters to fall away as the injuries pile up but Robinson's ability to inspire continues to carry them forward. The Tricolours also are boosted by key inclusions with James Tedesco, Sam Verrills and Siosua Taukeiaho returning while Billy Smith has been named on the bench.

A victory over the Panthers on Friday will see the Roosters draw within two points of last year's ladder leaders – although with a bye already up their sleeve.

The Roosters were admittedly less than convincing last week in the one-point win over the Gold Coast and can expect a fired up Penrith unit bolstered by big inclusions.

**Who to watch:** So much was made about the loss of Cleary and Luai in the past fortnight but Isaah Yeo's absence was also telling. The Tigers and Sharks exposed Penrith's sloppy ruck defence without the tireless Yeo in the middle cleaning up for others. Not only that but Yeo also was key to NSW's dominant Origin I victory, linking with the halves on both sides of the field with quick passes. Yeo is crucial to the flow of Penrith's attack on both sides of the field and without that link in the chain the Panthers looked rudderless.

Meanwhile, the injury setback for Kikau sees Martin into the starting side for Penrith and he lines up against the man gunning to take his spot in the Blues side. A fellow Temora product, Angus Crichton missed the opener through suspension. Martin did not put a foot wrong as he physically imposed himself with an aggressive stint off the bench. Crichton though has proven himself a consistently strong performer at rep level so he will only strengthen his chances of selection by exposing his opposite man in Crichton.

**Favourite:** The stars are back for Penrith and it sees them firm as \$1.25 favourites.

**My tip:** The Roosters actually have the advantage in the back five while the battle of two heavyweight forward packs is also very close. The class of the spine though tips this in Penrith's favour. Add in their faltering form in the last fortnight and there is plenty of motivation for a big bounce back. **Penrith by 18.**

Desperation days as the cavalry arrives for Newcastle

The Newcastle Knights and the New Zealand Warriors will put their seasons on the line on Saturday afternoon when they face off at McDonald Jones Stadium.

Sitting outside the top eight with five wins apiece, the respective teams will be desperate to remain in finals contention after beginning the year with two wins from their opening three matches.

Falling from 4th to 14th over the past three months, the Newcastle Knights will be banking on the return of several established stars to snap a run of dispiriting performances.

Welcoming back Mitchell Pearce (bicep), Kalyn Ponga (groin), Hymel Hunt (hamstring) and David Klemmer (suspension), coach Adam O'Brien will be expecting a much-improved showing after an underwhelming 24-10 fade out against the Rabbitohs last Saturday.

Putting together a measly three wins since snatching a late victory against the Warriors back in Round 2, the Knights have been hugely disappointing in 2021; ranking 15th in attack and equal 11th in defence.

Coming into 2021 with a healthy level of optimism and a rejuvenated roster, the New Zealand Warriors have struggled to live up to expectations.

Slumping to 11th on the ladder in the wake of a morale sapping 42-16 defeat at the hands of the Storm last Sunday, the NRL nomads will be out to atone in a contest carrying plenty of feeling for coach Nathan Brown.

Returning to Newcastle for the first time since departing prior to the end of the 2019 season, Brown will be hoping his side can improve upon a 42 per cent success rate from 19 visits to McDonald Jones Stadium.

Fielding a revamped spine with Chanel Harris-Tavita (pectoral) and Wayne Egan (concussion) unavailable, Sean O'Sullivan and Jazz Tevaga will start at halfback and hooker respectively, while teen prodigy Reece Walsh will return at fullback with Roger Tuivasa-Sheck shifting to the wing.

**Who to watch:** Making a much-needed return from a pectoral injury sustained on Easter Sunday, Mitchell Pearce will need to make an immediate impression if the Knights hope to down the Warriors twice in a season for the first time since 2003. Beginning the year optimistically only to sustain the same injury that sidelined him for ten weeks back in 2018, the 32-year-old halfback will be sure to offer a calming influence on the side's attack which has struggled in his absence. Set to line up alongside mid-season acquisition Jake Clifford for the first time, look for Pearce to take the reins and allow the former Cowboy to play to his instincts.

Earning rave reviews that border on irresponsible given his standing as a teenager, Reece Walsh will be looking to make up for lost time after serving a one-match suspension. Heralded as the next big thing after an eye-catching introduction to first grade, the 18-year-old has been touted as a possible Origin bolter after six matches in the top grade. While his club coach has been swift in erring Queensland against selecting Walsh, the teenage sensation may force the Maroons to bet the house with a strong performance opposing Kalyn Ponga.

**Favourite:** While both teams have come away with four wins apiece since 2017, the returning cavalry has the Knights favoured to prevail on home soil.

**My tip:** If the Knights have any hope of remaining in touch with the top eight (or avoiding the prospect of a fourth wooden spoon in seven years), they should get the job done at home. **Newcastle by 6.**

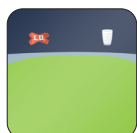

Crunch match for both teams as jostling for positions heats up in frantic top 8 race.

# Match Preview

Storm chase an unbroken dozen against the enigmatic Tigers

Last week's runaway victory over the Warriors was enough for Melbourne to edge past the Penrith Panthers at the top of the competition table.

While Ivan Cleary has nursed his stars through the Origin period, Craig Bellamy has kept the pedal on the floor amid an 11 game winning streak.

And with a host of Melbourne based Queenslanders still burning after last week's Blues onslaught, you can be sure the evolving Tigers will need to bring their best defence.

Still only two points clear of the fourth placed Rabbitohs, there is a sense Bellamy's strategy is to show the struggling teams no remorse in an attempt to skyrocket his side's for-and-against. So far this season, the premiers have scored an average of 39 points per match in their nine victories against sides placed outside the current top-six.

Even with Cameron Munster below his best and Ryan Papenhuyzen sidelined, the Storm haven't skipped a beat thanks to an endless supply of strike power fronted by Brandon Smith and the Cronulla bound Nicho Hynes.

And this week, the return of props Nelson Asofa-Solomona and Christian Welch will only add to the enormity of the Tigers' task.

Whether the Tigers have the firepower to combat Bellamy's purple haze remains to be seen. But to have any chance, they'll need to improve on last week's disjointed effort against the Eels at Bankwest Stadium.

Even though Parramatta used a one man advantage to blow Wests away after the break, the fact is, with only a 30 per cent share of first half possession the Tigers were always chasing their tail.

This week Maguire will bank on the return of Moses Mbye to stabilise the Tigers' halves. But any gain there is offset by the loss of the injured Adam Doueihi in a move that sees James Roberts shift off the wing to his more favoured position at centre.

In another quirk in a season of many, new Tigers winger Ken Maumalo will tackle the Storm for the second time within seven days. Fresh after scoring a hat-trick of tries in his Warriors swansong, a repeat performance will go a long way to securing the Tigers a fourth win from their last six starts.

**Who to watch:** With Harry Grant's return to Melbourne, all the talk at the start of the season was about an oversupply of No.9s. Now in tandem with the versatile Brandon Smith, Craig Bellamy has added to the Storm's potency. Having already crossed for seven tries this season, the affable Kiwi is now on a run of six from as many games where his wombat-like burrowing outside of Grant has proved unstoppable.

Jacob Little has no trouble crossing the stripe either. Having been forced to fight for his spot in Wests' lineup since 2016, the nippy hooker's speed has taken him across the line five times this season. Now injury free and with over 50 top grade appearances, Michael Maguire has seen enough to keep him on the books until at least the end of the 2023 season.

**Favourite:** Yet to taste defeat on the Sunshine Coast, Melbourne are short priced favourites to make it eight straight at their home away from home.

**My tip:** Apart from their upset victory over the undermanned Panthers two weeks ago, the Tigers have been torched by an average margin of 22 points in their five other clashes against top-6 opponents. **Melbourne by 22.**

#### Magic Johnson as Sharks snatch last minute win over Panthers

A last gasp Shaun Johnson field goal has secured the Cronulla Sharks a dramatic 19-18 victory over the Panthers at Netstrata Jubilee Stadium tonight.

Told he was unwanted in the Shire next year, the Kiwi halfback put himself in the shop window for other clubs looking for a proven match winner when he launched a 35-metre shot with a minute left on the clock to give his side their third win in a row. ## Walker wins it for rocky Roosters after holding off surging Titans

One of the most entertaining games of the 2021 NRL season has seen the Sydney Roosters triumph 35-34 over the Gold Coast Titans, courtesy of a late Sam Walker field goal at Cbus Super Stadium.

A solid start for the Titans wasn't enough as they failed to trouble the scorers in spite of a glut of early possession. After 14 minutes the Roosters made them pay - scoring through Matt Ikuvalu on the right flank in their first attacking foray into the Gold Coast's red zone.

Back-to-back tries for Angus Crichton and Daniel Tupou just after the 20-minute mark suddenly saw the Tricolours out by 18-0, with Adam Keighran's perfect goalkicking maximising the advantage for the away team.

Gold Coast wrestled back territorial and possession advantage for the remainder of the half, but wouldn't actually convert it into points until right on halftime, with Jamal Fogarty taking advantage of an overlap from a scrum play to get the home team on the board.

second half goalkicking was flawless and the margin had shrunk from 20 to just 2 in a short space of time.

Cbus Super Stadium then erupted with 8 minutes remaining when Kevin Proctor pounced on a Fogarty grubber to secure the lead for the home team.

The Roosters then got Marschke back from his ten minute sabbatical and set about righting the ship. With four left, Matt Ikuvalu took advantage of tired edge defence to score an acrobatic try in the corner to level the scores at 34-34. Walker took over kicking duties from Keighran and missed - but made up for it with a minute remaining, kicking the match-winning field goal in a memorable contest.

Gold Coast now lick their wounds and wait for Manly to visit next Sunday, while the Roosters have a huge clash with currently-first-placed Penrith at the foot of the mountains on Friday.

Eight minutes after halftime, Souths, after going right twice for no result in consecutive sets, switch back to the left

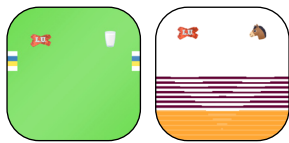
side with immediate success. Another catch and pass play creates the extra man and Johnston scored in the corner for his third try of the night. Reynolds again was flawless with his sideline conversion.

#### Storm go top after 11th straight win

## Electric Eels tame tepid Tigers

After a rough opening that saw Nathan Brown placed on report and commit a forward pass, the Eels' lock made amends with a terrific offload which allowed Clinton Gutherson (13th minute) to cross for first points of the afternoon.

Taking the score out to 8-0 via a Mitchell Moses penalty goal

minutes later, the home side left points on the table after Tom Opacic was unable to gather in a well-placed grubber from Dylan Brown.

Starting in place of injured hooker Reed Mahoney, former Manly and Salford rake Joey Lussick (31st minute) pushed the Eels out to 14-0 with a clever dummy half run close to the try line.

Appearing to go further in front with Gutherson sending Moses over with a grubber, subsequent replays from the bunker denied Moses his first try of the season for failing to ground the ball.

Next week, the Eels face the Bulldogs at Bankwest Stadium on Sunday afternoon, while the Tigers will travel to Sunshine Coast Stadium on Saturday evening to take on the Storm.

## Bulldogs bamboozle dreadful Dragons

**Canterbury have crushed the St George Illawarra Dragons in a Queen's Birthday bolover at Stadium Australia this afternoon, scoring a 28-6 victory in front of 17,382 fans.**

Jake Averillo led from the halves today - scoring two tries, with two line breaks and five tackle breaks - against what was a pretty shocking Dragons defensive line, and dominated all day.

The Bulldogs opened the scoring after ten minutes with a

penalty goal kicked by Averillo, but it would be the Red V who first crossed the stripe. Corey Norman (who it's been reported during the contest won't be at the club in 2022) found the Bulldogs defenders all up in the line so poked it in behind for Brayden Wiliame to get the first try of the day.

Shortly after, 'Dogs captain Josh Jackson was bizarrely sin-binned for what referee Gerard Sutton called "repeated infringements", despite both sides having the same number of set restarts at the time (and the Dragons not having someone binned for three in the same set six minutes later). It mattered little though - the Saints couldn't take advantage and somehow Averillo got his side's first try at the 29th minute when he stepped through a yawning gap.

Leading 8-6 at the break, Canterbury second half started in electric fashion. Averillo picked up his second after slicing

through some poor defensive reads from the Dragons defence.

That extended to 20-6 after the 50 minute mark when Jeremy Marshall-King through a dummy and dived over.

A penalty goal from Averillo at 61 minutes pushed the lead to 22-6, and around 68 minutes Adam Elliott danced over the line, right through some spectacular jumper-grabbing from the Red V, scoring a try that pushed the lead to 26-6.
