JOSHUA WELLS reflects on Cameron Smith's illustrious career

When Cameron Smith formally announced his retirement from professional rugby league, I didn't expect to feel quite this emotional.

I knew it was coming. The Storm had moved on. There was speculation he'd play on.

But he hung the boots up on his 430-game career and suddenly a lifetime's worth of memories flooded over me.

As I grew up, Cameron Smith, alongside Storm greats Billy Slater and Cooper Cronk, grew into their careers. As I got older, they simply got better and better.

No matter what I was going through, I could always turn on the tele and watch my heroes do what they did best – play football.

Since making his debut all the way back in 2002 – when I was 9 – Cameron Smith left his mark on every Storm fan – hell – every rugby league fan.

From the amazing highs of multiple premierships, a stack of grand finals, and countless wins to the lows of salary-cap enforced wooden spoon – Smith has been there through it all.

Through all the years, the ups and downs in my life, and for a lot of other people, the Smith-led Storm was a constant.

So when final confirmation came through that his playing days are over, it still stung.

The man with basically every record, every medal, and the most games in a demanding position finally called it quits.

No more will we see his unrivalled game management. His ability to win the unwinnable games or his amazing pep talks.

No matter what you think of Cam Smith – we are saying goodbye to an era of rugby league that now lives in the past, tales we'll tell our grandkids and talk about in the same way Vossy talks about the 80s.

Enjoy retirement, Cameron!

IN A LEAGUE OF HIS OWN

ROB CROSBY charts the incredible two decades over which Cameron Smith gave everything to the game of rugby league - the good, the bad and the ugly.

It will only be a matter of when, not if, Cameron Smith is acknowledged as an Immortal of the game.

Holding the records for most appearances and points in first grade, the 37-year-old hooker was instrumental in the successes of Melbourne, Queensland and Australia for almost two decades.

Making a much-anticipated decision to retire after 19 seasons at the highest level, his achievements have led many to regard him as the best to ever play rugby league.

For all the successes Smith achieved collectively and as an individual, it is dishonest to view his career as a perfect picture.

Coming under fire for a perceived influence over referees, using unnecessary wrestling techniques and being guilty by association during the Storm's salary cap scandal, most damningly, his on-field defence of the tackle that ended Alex McKinnon's career was a major error in judgement.

While his flaws are evident they should not define him as a player.

Right until the whistle sounded on his final game, Smith remained the most influential player in the game.

Rugby league is better for having had Cameron Smith be a part of it.

2002

- At age 18, Smith makes his first grade debut at halfback against the Bulldogs.

2003:

- The arrival of Craig Bellamy sees Smith take over from Richard Swain as the Storm's first choice hooker.
- After 18 NRL games, Smith makes his debut for Queensland in State of Origin III. Smith scores a try in the Maroon's 36-6 victory at Suncorp Stadium.

2004:

Smith appears in all three matches for Queensland.

2005:

Smith brings up 50 NRL games in the opening round of the season.

2006:

- Smith is named as part of a rotating captaincy arrangement alongside Scott Hill, Matt Geyer, David Kidwell and Michael Crocker.
- Smith win his first Origin series.
- Smith win his first Dally M Player of the Year medal as the Storm finish the regular season as minor premiers.
- Smith captains the Storm in the 15-8 grand final loss to Brisbane.
- Smith makes his debut for Australia in the post-season Tri Nations series.

2007:

- Smith brings up 100 NRL games.
- Smith leads the Storm to a 34-8 grand final win over Manly.
- Smith captains Australia for the first time in the post-season test match against New Zealand. The Kangaroos post a record 58-0 victory over the Kiwis with Smith scoring his first try in the green and gold.

2008:

- Smith accepts an early guilty plea for a grapple tackle in the opening round. Avoiding suspension, he accrues 93 carry-over points meaning any further charge will see him suspended.
- Smith captains Queensland, in the absence of Darren Lockyer, to a 2-1 series victory.
- During the Storm's epic semi final win against Brisbane, Smith is reported for a grapple tackle on Sam Thaiday. Due to carry-over points he receives a two-match ban after being found guilty at the judiciary. Subsequently, he is ruled out of the side's 40-0 grand final defeat to Manly.

2009:

- Smith brings up 150 NRL games.
- Smith captains the Storm to a 23-16 grand final win over Parramatta.

2010:

- Melbourne are stripped of their titles between 2006 to 2010 - including their two premierships - after being found to have systemically cheated the salary cap. In a further blow, the side is unable to accrue premiership points for the remainder of the season.
- An elbow injury sustained in the mid-year test against New Zealand sees Smith miss the opening State of Origin match. Matt Ballin becomes the only player to wear the number nine jersey for Queensland during Smith's representative career.

2011:

- Smith becomes the second Melbourne player after Matt Geyer to play 200 NRL games.
- With a roster made up of discards and emerging talent, Smith leads the Storm to the minor premiership a year after the salary cap scandal.

2012:

- Smith takes over from Darren Lockyer as captain of Australia and Queensland.
- Smith captains the Storm to a 14-4 grand final win over Canterbury-Bankstown.

2013:

- Smith brings up 250 NRL games.
- Smith captains Australia to victory in the World Cup.

2014:

- Smith kicks the first field goal of his career to defeat Manly in golden point during the opening round.
- Smith comes under fire for his immediate on-field response after Newcastle forward Alex McKinnon suffers a career-ending neck injury.

2015:

- Smith becomes the first Melbourne player to reach 300 NRL games. He becomes the 24th man in the game's history to achieve the feat.

2016:

- Smith makes 73 tackles in the 14-12 grand final loss to Cronulla.

2017:

- Smith wins his 11th - and final - State of Origin series for Queensland.
- Smith becomes only the second player to reach 350 NRL games.
- Smith surpasses Darren Lockyer's record of 355 NRL games to become the most-capped player in NRL history.
- Smith wins his second Dally M Player of the Year medal.
- Smith leads the Storm to a 34-6 grand final win over North Queensland.
- Smith captains Australia to victory in the World Cup on home soil.

2018:

- Smith is sin-binned for the first time in his career.
- Smith announces his representative retirement. He finishes with 42 Origins for Queensland and 56 tests for Australia.
- Smith captains the Storm in the 21-6 grand final loss to Sydney.

2019:

- Smith becomes the highest point-scorer in NRL history.
- Smith is lauded as the first player to achieve 400 NRL games.

2020:

- Smith unknowingly plays his final home match at AAMI Park. Following a COVID-19 outbreak in Victoria, the Storm relocate to the Sunshine Coast for the remainder of the season.
- Smith surpasses Craig Bellamy's try-scoring record. Bellamy humorously 'flips the bird' in response.
- Smith scores a crucial try to lead the Storm to a 26-20 grand final win over Penrith.

2021:

- A day before the season commences, Smith announces his retirement alongside Billy Slater as the pair are honoured with statues outside AAMI Park.

INSIDE KNOWLEDGE

Cleary unconcerned about Barrett's influence inside 'Dogs coaching box, writes PAUL JOBBER

THERE will be a subplot or two swirling around Bankwest Stadium on Saturday when Canterbury host Penrith.

Bulldogs coach Trent Barrett will hope to use some inside knowledge to his advantage as he aims to kick-start his tenure against the club he spent last season with as assistant coach.

However, it's not something Panthers halfback Nathan Cleary has spent – or will spend – a lot of time worrying about.

"It's a good challenge to come up against. I'm looking forward to it and it's something you've got to deal with," Cleary said.

"The way football is these days with everything on TV I think a lot of teams know a lot about the way you play anyway.

"Baz maybe more so than others, but it poses a challenge for myself and the rest of the boys playing."

Cleary admitted the best way to overcome the "Barrett factor" was to focus on themselves and how to improve on their 24-0 opening round victory over North Queensland.

"We played some pretty good footy at the weekend, but we left some points out there and missed a few opportunities, but we did create which was pleasing," he said.

Barrett will take an interest in the Panthers' decision to

name Matt Burton on an extended bench with the recently turned 21-year-old at the centre of a contract tug-of-war between the two clubs.

Despite having signed at Belmore for 2022, Cleary is adamant Burton's preference is to play out the season.

Penrith appear determined to keep him at the foot of the mountains until the end of 2021 as injury cover for their backline.

"He's not the one saying these things (in the media); his attitude has been outstanding so Burto is a knockabout kind of guy who doesn't say too much," the halfback said.

"He puts his head down, works hard and wants to get better so that's what I love about Burto and why he will be such a good player in the future.

"He's definitely not kicking stones or anything like that. He's been training really well and is a very valuable asset to the Penrith Panthers."

Cleary will also look to maintain his 100 percent winning record after he won both the toss and the match as captain last weekend.

"We've got a system going where if you win one then you keep going and if you lose then it swaps," he said of his co-captaincy duties with Isaah Yeo.

"So I got the first win so we keep it going."

The electric Eels host the superb Storm in a blockbuster Thursday night clash at Bankwest Stadium.

Parramatta will be determined to start this clash on the right note after falling behind by 16 points at the half to the Brisbane Broncos on Friday night. This is something they can't afford to do against a very strong Melbourne side who showcased their intentions this season by scoring four tries in the opening 30 minutes against premiers contenders the South Sydney Rabbitohs.

A strong second half performance by the Eels was much more pleasing for Brad Arthur to witness as his side secured the two points at Suncorp Stadium in a battle of attrition with Junior Paulo crossing in the 78th minute to put the result out of reach of Brisbane's hands.

The Eels will have a much tougher task this Thursday against the defending premiers, who blew the Rabbitohs off the park during the opening half of football. A tactic that the Storm are likely to repeat at Bankwest Stadium.

The Eel's middle forwards will be crucial in the arm wrestle for territory and will be expected to repeat their performances from Friday night, which saw Reagan Campbell-Gillard, Junior Paulo and Nathan Brown run for over 100 metres whilst all making over 20 tackles. Fellow middle forward, Isaiah Papali'i proved to be a handful in his club debut against Brisbane, racking up 200 run metres from just 18 carries as he terrorised the tiring Broncos' forward pack.

Parramatta have made one change to their side from round one, with back-rower Marata Niukore returning from suspension as he replaces Keegan Hipgrave on the bench. On the other hand, Craig Bellamy has named an unchanged line-up for Thursday night's fixture after he recorded his 17th straight round one victory.

The Storm will be confident heading into this clash after knocking off the Eels in the Qualifying Finals during their 2020 Premiership season. Melbourne picked up where they left off as they blitzed the Rabbitohs off the park during the opening half, just as they did to Penrith in last year's Grand Final.

Bellamy will be expecting a similar performance and more on Thursday night after highlighting that his team have many improvements to make after their eight-point victory over the Rabbitohs. One of these improvements may be to try and apply pressure to the opposition by scoring throughout the whole game rather than in small periods of time, just as the Roosters did to Manly on Saturday afternoon.

Star five-eighth Cameron Munster is the man who could provide that creativity all game as he showcased his talents once again on Thursday night as he toyed with the Rabbitohs during the first half and will be looking to do the same to the Eels' halves pairing of Mitchell Moses and Dylan Brown as he once again looks to assert himself as one of the best players in the competition.

Who to watch: The battle of the number one's will be an intriguing battle as both **Clinton Gutherson** and **Ryan Papenhuyzen** are vying for a spot in the New South Wales Origin squad as James Tedesco's understudy. Gutherson put in a typical 'workmanlike' performance on Friday as he ran for 193 run metres, scored a try and provided a try as he helped his side to a victory over the Brisbane Broncos. Gutherson was everywhere. His try was pivotal in the result as it was the Eel's second try during their three try stretch in just 11 minutes during the first 20 minutes of the second half. His opposite number, Papenhuyzen, had a blistering round one performance as he ran for 175 run metres, provided a try, scored two himself and kicked five from six in his first game as the number one goalkicker in the Storm squad. Papenhuyzen was always in the right place at the right time during their victory over the Rabbitohs' and he will prove to be a nuisance for Parramatta's forwards as he lurks around the ruck.

Favourite: The defending premiers enter this Round two clash as favourites after blowing the Rabbitohs off the park early at AAMI Park last Thursday night. They will be expecting to deal with the Eels just as they did during the 2020 Finals series. They possess some of the great starts of the game in Munster and Papenhuyzen and enough experience in the forwards to be a consistent team every time they walk onto the field.

My tip: Likewise, to South Sydney, Parramatta are likely to match it with Melbourne for periods of the match but after their slow start against Brisbane and Melbourne's blistering start against the Rabbitohs it's the Storm's game to lose. The defending premiers will once again show why they are the one of the favourites to win the competition. **Melbourne by 12.**

Two sides coming off opening round wins face off on Central Coast

The New Zealand Warriors will "host" the Newcastle Knights at Central Coast Stadium on Friday evening in a match that could end up being crucial in deciding the bottom part of the top 8 come the end of the year.

The Warriors were the closest thing to surprise packets in Round 1, convincingly beating a favoured Titans side by 13 points. It was a match that began as a slugfest, however the Warriors seemed to find their groove attacking wise as the game went on in what was a dream start for Nathan Brown in his tenure as head coach.

The size of the Warriors forward pack this year has been well documented, and they will need to be at their best once again if they want to match it with the likes of Daniel Saifiti and David Klemmer, who's efforts got the Knights on the front foot and on their way to what was ultimately an easy victory against the Bulldogs.

With both sides expected to be fighting it out for the last few finals spots come seasons end, this match up shapes as one of those games the loser may come back to and ask "what could have been" at an early mad Monday while the winner plays on in week 1 of the finals.

Getting the win will be critical for the Warriors, who in the next fortnight will shape up against two contenders in the Roosters and Raiders and will want to go into both of those games with as many points in the bank as possible. The Knights have a fixture consisting of the Tigers, Dragons, Titans and Sharks and are a very real possibility of starting the year 6-0 if they can get the job done on Friday.

In team news, the Warriors are unchanged aside from Adam Pompey coming into the centres to replace Euan Aitken, who unfortunately suffered an ankle injury against the Titans and will be out until at least Round 9.

The Knights have named the same 17 that beat the Bulldogs, with Connor Watson being promoted to start ahead of Sauaso Sue, however don't be surprised if Adam O'Brien elects to swap those two in a late change again. Kurt Mann has been named despite leaving the field early last week with an apparent leg injury.

Who to watch: Kodi Nikorima's performance last week was what will be required consistently if the Warriors want to go deep into this competition. Kodi enjoyed a period of good form to end the year in 2020 and built a solid foundation in Round 1, running for 81 metres and making a line break as well as crossing for a 4-pointer. For years at the Broncos, Nikorima was the younger, more inexperienced half who wasn't always tasked with taking control of the game. With Chanel Harris-Tavita at five-eighth, Nikorima will need to continue adapting his game to form a sustainable long-term partnership and is in a great position to do so behind a forward pack which is among the best in the competition.

After a 2020 season that was cruelly ended just 2 weeks in by an ACL injury, it was great to see **Jayden Brailey** playing good footy again in his first match as captain of the Knights. It was well documented the struggle Newcastle had in keeping a recognised hooker on the paddock last year, and if Brailey can stay fit and produce the kind of form he showed last week consistently, the Knights will go a long way to proving last year's finals appearance wasn't a fluke. Against the Bulldogs, Brailey has two-line break assists, a try assist, a tackle break all while making 50 tackles. He will look to capitalise this week against a Warriors forward pack that could end up tiring very easily as a result of their size.

Favourite: In what is one of the more even matchups of the round, the Knights are favoured by 1 and a half points over the Warriors.

My tip: The Warriors really surprised me last week not with the talent they showed, but their resilience as a group to hang in there against a Titans side that admittedly wasn't offering that much. The Knights also looked brilliant against the Bulldogs, however I think that against stronger opposition and with a lack of home ground advantage to pump them up, they will lose the battle of the forwards and the Warriors backline will take full advantage and close out a tight one. **Warriors by 4.**

South Queensland Rivals Battle for Big Brother Status

It has long been the given that the Brisbane Broncos have held the "big brother" tag over the heads of their rivals an hour down the highway in the Gold Coast Titans. Friday night's showdown at Cbus Super Stadium on the Gold Coast, however, could prove to be the changing of the guard.

The Gold Coast have won three of the past four encounters between the two sides and a third straight win over Brisbane could be the catalyst for the roles of the two South Queensland based clubs being reversed.

Despite the pre-season hype, the Titans will need to be far better than what they were last week, going down 19-6 in a lacklustre performance against the Warriors on the Central Coast. Justin Holbrook's men made 15 errors and never really looked like breaking the game open. They will need to be much improved this week against a seemingly improved Brisbane side.

Despite their round 1 loss to Parramatta, there were certainly some positive signs for the Broncos in their first competitive game under new coach Kevin Walters. The men from Red Hill ran up a 16-0 lead, before throwing it away in a second-half fadeout- something that was all too reminiscent of their 2020 season which eventuated in the club's first wooden spoon.

His only alteration to the 17 is also a forced one, with Matt Lodge out of contention with injury. Thomas Flegler has been promoted to the starting line-up, with Rhys Kennedy coming onto the bench.

Who to watch: Titans fans and rugby league fans in general will be hoping to see more out of star recruit **Tino Fa'asuamaleaui** on Friday night, after there appeared to be a bit of round 1 rust on the lock-forward. It's not that he did anything particularly wrong, but look for him to have a bit more of an impact this week, especially against a Broncos middle without both Payne Haas and Matt Lodge.

Tevita Pangai Junior will have a massive role to play if the Broncos are to come away with the win on Friday night. Without their usual two starting props available for the game against their rivals, Pangai Junior will need to take the challenge in the middle head-on and lead the Broncos' go-forward. This will be crucial in laying a platform so that Anthony Milford and Brodie Croft can create off the back of it.

Favourite: The Titans are the favoured side to take out the South Queensland derby.

My tip: This match should be a really tight one with plenty of desperation shown. Neither of these sides wants to begin their 2021 campaign's having lost their first two matches and with bragging rights on the line, it will only add to the spectacle. The Broncos just appear to be a little short in the middle with Payne Haas (suspension) and Matt Lodge (injury) both out. The Titans should be able to do enough to beat Brisbane in the middle of the park and ultimately that is where the game should be won and lost. **Titans by 4.**

Battered Bulldogs head west to host rusty Panthers

Having ushered in the Trent Barrett era on the wrong side of the scoreboard against Newcastle, the Bulldogs' quest for competition points doesn't get any easier this week when they tackle Penrith at Bankwest Stadium.

In what is the first of four Canterbury home games scheduled at the Parramatta venue, Barrett knows his astute acquisition of back-line talent will amount to nothing if his forwards fail to aim up in centre field.

With two early try assists against the Knights, Kyle Flanagan quickly eased doubts over his signing. Having kick started his Belmore career on the front foot, the Roosters reject showed fans that with ball in hand he's ready to guide Canterbury around the corner.

But on the back of a miserable 72 per cent completion rate, it wasn't long before all of Canterbury's good work turned to mud. Aside from solid contributions from Adam Elliott and new recruit Jack Hetherington, the Bulldogs were simply outmuscled and eventually overrun by a hungrier Knights pack.

This week Raymond Faitala-Mariner replaces Corey Waddell in the run on side while Jeremy Marshall-King has been listed to replace hooker Brad Deitz on the bench.

Meanwhile, the Panthers showed no signs of runner-up fatigue to easily account for a scoreless North Queensland Cowboys.

It was like Nathan Cleary and Jarome Luai never got off the bike. The cruisy-duo created enough opportunities to win several games before halftime, but with rusty finishing the Panthers had to wait until after the break before they skipped clear.

As Canterbury continue to harmonize new combinations, for Ivan Cleary, it's a matter of strengthening what already proved a success last season. With no changes to last week's 17 and the luxury of being able to field 13 members from last season's grand final, a repeat of last year's 42-0 drubbing isn't out of the question.

Winning five of the past seven, Penrith's stranglehold over the Bulldogs extends back to 2016. The positive for Canterbury is that the last four results are shared two apiece including victory in the only clash the sides have contested at Bankwest Stadium.

Who to watch: Last season **Raymond Faitala-Mariner** was among Canterbury's best every week. The Samoan and Kiwi international featured in all 20 matches and his weekly average of 107 metres proved enough to claim the Coaches Award. Coming off the bench with only four runs and a sluggish 42 metres against the Knights, look for the powerful 27-year-old to inspire his teammates from the get-go.

Just two rounds into his second full season in the top grade, **Stephen Crichton** has already cemented his position in one of the most lethal left edge combinations in the competition. In a sign he'll be heavily targeted by opposition coaches, the Cowboys not only held the sleek centre scoreless but restricted him to just one try assist and zero line breaks. On what could be a fast track, don't be surprised if the Origin hopeful breaks the shackles and has a day out.

Favourite: With the exception of Bulldogs diehards, the smart money in this one is stacked at the foot of the mountains.

My tip: Penrith's game plan may still be fresh in Trent Barrett's mind, but stopping his former colleagues with a patch work outfit is an entirely different story. With 17 wins from their past 18, it's difficult to see anything but a comfortable Penrith victory. And if the Bulldogs can't sustain their mongrel, expect the lights to be well and truly out before halftime. **Panthers by 22.**

Bounce back factor on the cards for underwhelming Sea Eagles and Rabbitohs

He may still force his way into the starting side but for the time being he has been named on the bench.

Although Souths also started slow against Melbourne, they pegged their way back to finish on the wrong end of a 26-18 scoreline.

Wayne Bennett though has been quick to take action, dropping Josh Mansour and Jacob Host for poor performances, setting clear standards as South Sydney look to bounce back.

Widely touted as strong premiership contenders, the Rabbitohs will be looking to go close to matching the Roosters' rout of Manly after last week's underwhelming opening.

Who to watch: Looking through both team's line-ups for this weekend, it is clear that the Sea Eagles will need more from **Dylan Walker and Lachlan Croker** in attack.

They face off with **Latrell Mitchell and Damien Cook**, who both possess a lethal running game off the back of South Sydney's forward pack.

Cook was uncharacteristically sloppy in his execution out of dummy-half last week and will be keen to rediscover his best against a Manly outfit that struggled to contain the Roosters' go-forward last week.

Last-start losers look to rebound in Townsville

After coming up empty in the opening round respectively, the North Queensland Cowboys and the St George Illawarra Dragons will be looking to bounce back on Saturday evening.

Coming off a dispiriting first up loss to last year's minor premiers, the North Queensland Cowboys will be aiming for a more confident display in their first home match of the season.

Failing to fire an attacking shot during last Saturday's 24-0 defeat to Penrith, new coach Todd Payten will be demanding greater accountability from his players after singling out co-captain Jason Taumalolo for his efforts in defence.

Holding an evenly matched record against the merged venture with four wins apiece since 2015, a Valentine Holmes' field goal in golden point proved the difference when the two sides met last September.

Resisting the urge to make sweeping changes after one poor performance, coach Payten has offered the same squad a chance at redemption on home soil.

Showing signs of resilience after a poor opening last Sunday, the St George Illawarra Dragons will have their sights set on overcoming a poor historical record in Townsville.

Trailing 14-0 at halftime before eventually going down 32-18 to the Sharks, coach Anthony Griffin will be buoyed by his side's ability to get within two points of their long-time rivals.

Managing just three victories from 13 visits to both of the Cowboys' home grounds in Townsville, the Dragons have been known to start slowly in recent times losing their opening two matches in four of the past six seasons.

Welcoming back enigmatic playmaker Corey Norman from suspension, Adam Clune has been relegated to the extended squad with Brayden Williame preferred as the interchange utility.

Who to watch: Set to face off against his former club for the first time in Cowboys colours, Murwillumbah junior **Reece Robson** will be determined to energise the side's lacklustre attack. Playing nine matches with the Dragons predominantly off the bench before moving north under the guise of establishing his credentials as a hooker, the 22-year-old made an assured return to first grade after a hamstring injury saw his 2020 season end prematurely. Boasting a knack for exposing opposition defences close to the try line, look for Robson to play a prominent role in a much improved performance on Saturday evening.

It feels like only yesterday that **Tariq Sims** was gearing up to make his first grade debut. In reality, Saturday evening will mark a decade since the 31-year-old second rower played his first game - incidentally for the Cowboys in Townsville. Enjoying a successful career, while not quite reaching the heights envisioned when he burst onto the scene, Sims' leadership and aggressive disposition will be invaluable as the Dragons look to reshape their roster under Anthony Griffin. Eyeing regular game time in 2021 after spending an extended stint sidelined with injury last year, look for Sims to make up for lost time in his anniversary match.

Favourite: Despite being only the sixth team in NRL era to fail to score a point in the opening round, the home ground advantage has the Cowboys favoured to prevail with two premiership points.

My tip: While both sides underperformed in the opening round, the attacking spark shown by the Dragons in the second half may be the difference on Saturday night. **Dragons by 6.**

Timid Tigers host red-hot Roosters in Sunday football

The Wests Tigers will be eyeing the first major upset of 2021 when they host the Sydney Roosters at Campbelltown Sports Stadium.

Coming into the new season with a host of new faces and the longest finals drought of any team in the NRL, the Wests Tigers left much to be desired with their opening round performance.

Unable to go the distance after heading to the sheds on level terms during last Sunday's 30-12 loss to the Raiders, coach Michael Maguire will be stressing the importance of defence given the blistering attack shown by their opponents during the opening round.

Returning to Campbelltown Stadium for the first time since Round 6 last year, a poor record over the past four years has seen the side manage a 33 per cent success rate from their last 12 appearances at the venue.

Naming Adam Doueihi in the number six jersey after missing last week due to a suspension carrying over from last season, former skipper Moses Mbye will revert to the bench at the expense of Russell Packer. Luke Brooks is set to play his 150th match for the club.

Sitting atop the premiership ladder after running rampant in the opening round, the Sydney Roosters will be readying themselves for fiercer opposition on Sunday afternoon.

Scoring nine tries in their 46-4 win over the Sea Eagles last Saturday, the foundation club will be hoping to continue a dominant record against the joint venture having won 12 out of 13 clashes during Trent Robinson's coaching tenure.

Holding a solid record at Campbelltown Stadium with four wins from their previous six visits, James Tedesco and Luke Keary will co-captain the side for the first time in response to Jake Friend suffering a head knock early in the second half last week.

Freddy Lussick has been named to replace Friend at hooker, while Drew Hutchison comes into the squad in place of Adam Keighran (dislocated wrist) to offer utility value off the bench. Fletcher Baker will make his NRL debut with Angus Crichton unavailable through suspension.

Who to watch: Making the move to Sydney after a career-worst season at Brisbane, front-rower **Joe Ofahengaue** will have a point to prove in his first home match for the joint venture. Producing vastly improved numbers in his club debut with 128 metres, 26 tackles and two offloads, the 25-year-old will have his sights set on recapturing the form that saw him represent Queensland and help Tonga upset the Kangaroos two years ago. Fronting up against an understrength, but nonetheless formidable, Roosters pack, a strong showing from Ofahengaue will go a long way in the Tigers' aspirations of pulling off an upset.

Making an emphatic statement with a hat-trick and eight tackle breaks in the first round of the competition, stand-in skipper **James Tedesco** will be hoping for more of the same in his Campbelltown homecoming. Growing up in Menangle, playing his junior football with Camden and attending high school at St Gregory's College, the 28-year-old fullback will return to Campbelltown Sports Stadium for the first time after departing the Tigers four years ago. Scoring seven tries in 13 appearances at the venue, the Roosters will be looking to Tedesco to stand up in the absence of several established leaders.

Favourite: Coming off their biggest ever opening round win, the Roosters have been heavily backed to account for the Tigers.

My tip: Even without several established stars unavailable through injury and suspension, the potency of the Roosters backline should be too much for the Tigers to overcome. **Roosters by 14.**

For the second week in a row, Kogarah plays host to Sunday night Football. Two opening round winners battle it out for the chance to go 2 from 2 as the Cronulla Sharks play host to the Canberra Raiders.

Although both sides on paper looked impressive winners, they each had their own struggles - with the Sharks starting fast and hitting a few speed bumps in the middle, whilst Canberra started slowly and found speed in the second half of their clash with the Tigers.

Cronulla were able to maintain a good start last week in tough conditions, as their ball security was able to help them to a 14-0 halftime lead against the Dragons. The issues came in the second half when the home side were able to hit back after some sloppy work that eventually saw them concede the lead to the Red 'V', only to be saved by the NRL Bunker.

The Shire side were then able to battle back and find their rhythm from that point and were able to keep their lead safe and eventually take a 32-16 victory. The fightback from the Dragons would be something that concerned coach John Morris given that the meekness of the Sharks from the point that the Dragons got onto the scoreboard - and that their opponents were considered one of the weaker teams this season.

Sharks coach John Morris has been forced into one change with centre Jesse Ramien taking an early guilty plea that will see him miss three matches after being charged with a Grade 1 Reckless High Tackle. The Sharks have elected to go for a straight swap with Mawene Hiroti coming into the centres to replace Ramien.

Canberra had the opposite problem to the Sharks last weekend, with a slow first half putting them up against it battling out against the Wests Tigers. Raiders youngster **Hudson Young** has always shown that he has had talent, however his on-field behaviour has somewhat tarnished his fledgling career with several long suspensions overshadowing on field efforts. Last weekend, Young was a shining light for the Raiders and their go forward running for 117 metres as well as picking up a four pointer. Canberra coach Ricky Stuart has asked for more effort from his pack this season and Hudson Young will be vital to the go-forward on Sunday and throughout the season.

Favourite: Canberra are the heavy favourites for this clash and it's not hard to see why, given the quality of the line up and the experience that the Raiders have as well as winning both clashes last season.

My tip: It's hard to go past the Raiders for the clash on Sunday night. The Green Machine look to have the edge all over the park compared to the Sharks especially in the backs and the halves. Although it's difficult to compare the performances due to the varying weather conditions, the Raiders did look a step above the level of the Sharks from last weekend. It's no doubt set to be another high scoring clash but the Raiders should be good enough for the win. **Raiders by 12.**



Mahoney sparks Eels comeback win over improved Broncos

Parramatta has survived a first-round shock by piling on 24 unanswered points in the second half to run down a much-improved Broncos side by 24-16 at Suncorp Stadium tonight.

The Eels simply didn't get off the bus in the first half, with last years wooden spooners racing out to a 16-0 lead in a stunning first half performance. Broncos five-eighth Anthony Milford responded to his nay-sayers creating two tries for Queensland winger Xavier Coates in a dynamic first half display.

However, Parramatta were a different side after the break, with Eels' hooker Reed Mahoney sparking his sides comeback. The Eels rake scored a crucial try after halftime that created the momentum for the Parramatta onslaught, which will give coach Brad Arthur a lot of confidence that his side have the attacking arsenal to again be a threat in this year's premiership race.

The loss for the Broncos was further soured by injuries to prop Matt Lodge with a hamstring strain, utility John Asiata with a serious shoulder concern, as well as winger Xavier Coates who failed his HIA after colliding with Clint Gutherson in scoring his second try. Having just one player left on the bench for the majority of the second half just proved far too difficult for the home side under the new NRL rules designed for a faster game.

Parramatta then took the lead for the first time in the match when Dylan Brown and Gutherson combined off a scrum play to unleash Blake Ferguson for the corner and the former NSW winger bulldozed his way over the cover defence to score. Moses converted and the Eels were ahead by 18-16.

Parramatta then continued to delay the knock out punch in the final quarter, before fittingly heavyweight prop Junior Paulo sealed the win when he crashed over for the match winner off a superb Reed Mahoney pass close to the line.

Roosters bash embarrassing Manly
